G.91 INSTRUCTIONS ON MESSAGE WRITING. USING AF C2136

The following instructions on message writing, covering the major points of difference between AFs C2136 and C2128, are issued for the guidance of all concerned :-

1. The message form.- The two types of AF C2136 will be used for all formal (written) messages.
2. For signals use.- Nothing will be written by the originator outside the heavy ruled lines.
3. Address from - Originator.- The identity of the originating headquarters will be entered in the appropriate space.
4. Date - Time of origin.- A single group of six figures will be entered here, followed by the time-zone suffix letter or letters. The first two figures represent the date (where the date is a single digit, it is preceded by the digit O), the last four figures give the time of origin, in hours and minutes. Thus, "0930 hours K time 4th August" will be represented by the "040930K". The year and month are not indicated.
5. Address to.- The addresses "For Action" and "For Information" will be written in the appropriate spaces in a straight horizontal line or lines. Where the addresses in any space cannot be accommodated in a single line, they may be continued as subsequent lines in the same space. The word "tpid" will not be used to separate "For Action" and "For Information" addresses.
6. Originator's number.- The originator's number will be written, as indicated, as the first group of the text. Reference to any previous message (e.g., "In reply to number") will form part of the text of the message, will take the form of the originator's number and date-time group of the message referred to, and will be preceded by "your" or "our" as appropriate.

The text of a typical message might, therefore, begin as follows:-

"A53 your A91 of 280112K".

7. Text.- Care will be taken to ensure that words and other "groups" are adequately separated to avoid any possibility of confusion.
8. Signature.- If the message may be sent as written by any means, including wireless, the originator will sign the form in the left hand space, delete "except" and insert "incl".
9. THI. TOR and Time cleared.- The originator will not make any entry in these spaces, which are for Signals use only.

(vide GRO G.159/44).

G.92 MESSAGES - PRIORITY OF

1. It is apparent that some members are not yet acquainted with the proper use of priorities in signal messages.
2. Priorities may be used as follows :-
 - (a) EMERGENCY OPS - by GOC or DA&QMG only, except in urgent operational necessity when it may be used by a subordinate Officer.
 - (b) IMMEDIATE - by GOC or DA & QMG only.
 - (c) IMPORTANT - by all Staff Officers and Heads of Services. To be used only on messages which require priority above the ordinary.
 - (d) In an emergency any officer may frank a message IMMEDIATE or IMPORTANT but if his name is not on the authorised list he will be held responsible that the urgency is sufficient to justify the action.

2. The new clothes rationing year commences on 5th June, 1944.
3. Clothes ration coupons will be made available to all ranks through Finance Office ANGAU.

A.94 REMITTANCES FROM MEMBERS.

1. Attention is directed to GRO F176:44
2. A member may remit cash, or undrawn pay up to the extent of the credit balance shown in his pay book, in accordance with the provisions of the GRO.
3. A member may make a remittance through army channels to-
 - (a) any person in Australia, or for the credit of any bank account in Australia, including the member's own account;
 - (b) any other member of the AMF wherever serving; and
 - (c) subject to the conditions set out in para 7 of the order, to any person residing overseas, not being a member of the AMF.

Q.95 ROAD DISCIPLINE

1. To obviate the danger of injuries to pedestrians, all ranks, not being part of a formed body, will:
 - (a) walk on the right hand side of road facing on-coming vehicular traffic;
 - (b) ensure that NOT more than two (2) persons walk abreast;
 - (c) keep as far to right hand side of road as possible.
2. An officer or soldier in command of a formed body of troops moving on a road is not bound by the provisions of para 1 but he will take such precautions for the safety of his troops as the circumstances warrant.

Q.96 SUPPLIES: TROPICAL SPREAD RECONSTITUTING TO APPROXIMATE NORMAL FRESH BUTTER

Tropical Spread can be greatly improved in flavour by the addition of water and salt. As far as practicable the following method shall be adopted:--

Ingredients

- 1lb tin Tropical Spread
- 1 heaped-teaspoon Salt
- 5 tablespoons Water (4ozs. or 1/2 ordinary cup).

5lb. tins Tropical Spread
2 tablespoons Salt
¾ of a pint of Water

Directions

Place Spread in larger container. Dissolve salt in water and add slowly to Spread, beating briskly until all moisture is absorbed.

The Spread absorbs cold water quite readily. It is not necessary to warm water or Spread.

The butter will be soft after mixing, but will harden if allowed to stand. (Where possible allow to stand overnight.)

Water

As for drinking purposes — all water must be treated before adding to Spread.

MINUTE OF PUBLICATION

A D.C.M. convened by Lieutenant-General G. S. Savige, Commanding New Guinea Force, was held in the Field on the nineteenth day of May 1944 for the trial of QX8199 Cpl Ralph Joseph POLLOCK, AAMC att., 2/2 Aust Docks Operating Coy RAE. (The accused elected to be tried by Court Martial).

The accused was charged with :-

W.O.A.S. using insubordinate language to his superior officer, in that he, in the Field, on 9 Apr 1944, when on active service, said to VX59147 WOII L C Cooper of 2/2 Aust Docks Operating Coy RAE "You are just a little pig" or words to that effect.

The Court found the accused guilty of the charge.

Sentence : To be severely reprimanded.

The accused was in open arrest awaiting trial for forty days. The finding and sentence were duly confirmed on the twenty-second day of May 1944 by GOC, NEW GUINEA FORCE and promulgated to the accused in the Field on the Second day of June 1944.

DISCIPLINARY POWERS OF REGIONAL COMMANDERS

The disciplinary powers of a Regional Commander are defined as follows:-

- (a) Regional Commanders are not "Commanding Officers" within the meaning of A.M.R. & O. 508, and cannot, accordingly, deal summarily with offences committed by personnel in general, within their regions.
- (b) They are, however, Commanding Officers of personnel on their HQ and as such may exercise the disciplinary powers prescribed by A.M.R. & O., with regards to offences committed by such personnel.
- (c) As regards the remainder of the personnel in any region, the District Officers of the respective Districts within that region will continue to be regarded as Officers in Command of detachments and will still exercise the summary disciplinary powers of a Commanding Officer forwarding however, all offence reports etc through Regional Commanders.

HONOURS AND AWARDS (NATIVES)

GOLPAK Lulua of SALL

It is recommended that the abovenamed native be granted the immediate award of the Loyal Service Medal.

2. Despite considerable personal risk GOLPAK rendered valuable assistance to crashed Allied airmen in the Jacquinot Bay area of New Britain. The following act of loyalty is reported by Lt J A Migliacci of 545th C.S. Bomb Group.

"On 19 Oct 43 I came to the little village of Pul Pul. When I had been about fifty yards distant from the village a boy had seen me and all the natives had gone bush except GOLPAK, the paramount lulua of the Mengen tribe, who just happened to be resting in the village at that time. GOLPAK came up to me and seeing that I was a white man held out his hand and greeted me with a salute. He said to me in Pidgin "Yu polia English". I told him that I was American and as he seemed to know what I meant I quickly asked for food and drink.

At this time two Jap Zekes headed north east were coming near the village, GOLPAK brought me into a hut to be out of sight. He then gave me several coconuts, Kan Kan and taro, and told me that there was a white man nearby. GOLPAK was on his way there and promised to take me.

As soon as we had finished back over the road in the opposite direction from which I had come. We walked all that day until seven o'clock at night and slept in a little native village. He aided me and took care of me, and at daybreak we again proceeded along the road until 1100 hours on 20 Oct 43 when we reached the white party."

REMARKS AND ACHIEVEMENT (Continued)

It is recommended that the undermentioned natives be awarded the Royal Service Medal.

1. KOMALOU of Pak Island, JAPAN

On 10 Mar 44 enemy forces were in occupation of Pak Island and the natives of the island were still living there. It was decided to try and evacuate the native population, leaving the island free for our operations against the enemy. A sea patrol under Major J. E. McCarthy of ANZAC visited the island and after cruising off shore, KOMALOU swam out to the vessel. He at once volunteered to gather the people of Pak Island together and bring them out to the waiting vessel. A heavy sea was running at the time, and KOMALOU at risk of his life negotiated the dangerous rocks and surf for the second time, successfully evaded the enemy garrison on the island and led the native population to a point where all were picked up by the waiting patrol vessel. The natives were evacuated to Tong Island. KOMALOU ordered that all native canoes be destroyed or removed from Pak Island to prevent the enemy's escape, and as a result of his work Allied forces bombarded the island without danger to native inhabitants.

On 24 Mar 44 KOMALOU acted as guide to a party of natives led by WOJ Bookar of Alotau to Tong Island where four enemy soldiers were contacted and captured. Whilst at Tong Island, KOMALOU had kept a careful count of enemy escapees proceeding from Tong and Pak Islands to Kamutyo Island. As a result of his observations, KOMALOU was able to give information which afterwards proved substantially correct and was of value in assessing enemy strength at Kamutyo Island previous to the Allied landing.

2. MEKAT (Alotau) of Pak Island, JAPAN

3. WONA (Alotau) of Tong Island, JAPAN

4. SPATI of Pak Island, JAPAN

MEKAT, WONA and SPATI accompanied WOJ Bookar of Alotau to Tong Island on 24 Mar 44. It was the intention of the patrol to take enemy prisoners to gain intelligence information. On instructions from their leader they approached four Japs who were armed with rifles and grenades, and allayed their suspicions by giving them food and performing other "friendly" acts. They remained with them until at a given signal they rushed the four enemy troops, holding them until they surrendered at rifle point. The plan was carried out at great risk to their own personal safety but the deception proved successful and as a result four valuable prisoners were handed over to the US authorities.

On 3 Apr 44 MEKAT volunteered to accompany the Allied landing on Pak Island. On arrival there he acted as a guide and showed Allied troops where Japanese were hiding in dugouts and was of great assistance to that operation.

5. LAJKA of Adicelli Village, ALBANY

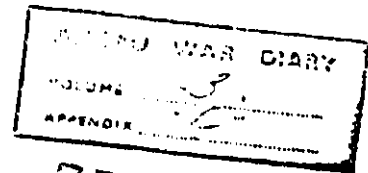
LAJKA was formerly personal servant to WOJ Bookar of Alotau and was left at Alotau Island when the enemy occupied the Admiralty Group in Apr 44.

He again reported to his former duty as a guide to forward patrols at the time of the Allied landing; at the end of Feb 44, rendered valuable assistance, and succeeded in tracking enemy forces over very difficult terrain.

On 2 Apr 44 he was accompanying a patrol led by WOJ Bookar to Kamutyo Island when an unseen party of Japanese was met and in the ensuing fight LAJKA killed two of the enemy; and on this occasion as throughout the operation he showed commendable courage and coolness. His services have proved of great value to the Allied forces.

NAME of Pitivila Villiam, LALU

During Jan, Feb and Mar of 1943 LALU was working at TALALA New Britain. He volunteered to assist in the evacuation of civilians and troops of 5/12 Aust Inf Bn who remained at New Britain after the enemy had occupied Rabaul on 25 Jan 43.

LALU was given responsible duties by the evacuation (Sgt J K McCarthy) during the most difficult periods. Employed as guide, carrier, canoe paddler and crew of launch LALU performed his duties in a determined and meritorious manner despite hunger, hardship and danger. His work was a great encouragement to other natives.

After some 340 civilians and troops had been evacuated from New Britain on 21 Mar 43, LALU continued to serve a coast watching party on the Island under Lt E Olander (since killed in action). During this service LALU proceeded to Witu Group, TALALA where he was fired on by a hostile party.

About Oct 43 LALU went to Rabaul and was put to work by the Japanese at KERAFAI and later assaulted a Japanese soldier at Rabaul and was imprisoned by the enemy. Upon his release from prison about Sep 43 he stole a cutter and sails and with nine other natives of Manus who were at Rabaul set out for Manus. With a stolen chart and an alarm clock as navigating instruments the party sailed for New Ireland and successfully negotiated the long voyage to Manus, a distance of about 400 miles which they reached about Oct 43.

After the Allied landing at Manus Feb-Mar 44 LALU met Major J K McCarthy and volunteered as guide on operations against the enemy. He was in the vessel that landed troops in the landing at Pitivila on 30 Mar 44 and his information regarding off-shore reefs, landing beaches and enemy installations were of value because of their accuracy. He also gave information regarding enemy installations at Rabaul.

By his initiative and consistent devotion to duty LALU has set an example to other natives besides of being of great value to the Allied cause.

OBJECT.

1. The object of this instruction is to define and clarify certain aspects of the maintenance and administration of MAMBARE District.

ROADS.

2. DOBADURA - HIGATURU.

31 US Div Engrs are now working on this section and District Officer will continue his liaison with CG 31 US Div in respect to these works.

3. HIGATURU - KOKODA.

- (a) Authority is given for the construction of an MT road from HIGATURU to KOKODA.
- (b) District Officer will confer with CG 31 US Div with a view to obtaining technical advice on the line to be followed and with regard to the construction of essential bridges.
- (c) As native labour is released by Aust Forces it will, subject to repatriation, be transferred for work on this road.

4. JEOP TRACK IOMA - DEAGARI.

Authority is given for DO to continue construction of a Jeep track from IOMA to DEAGARI.

MAINTENANCE.

5. DO will arrange with USASOS to draw rations ex S & S, DOBADURA for native labour camps used by US Forces.

6. TUEI District will be maintained from S & S, DOBADURA, in lieu of the present system from MILNE BAY. Pending the allocation of a vessel to the DO, he will arrange with USASOS to continue with the present use of US Smaller craft.

7. Until the road to KOKODA is completed, KOKODA will be maintained by air from Port MORESBY under arrangements made by HQ ANGAU.

8. SEO will arrange -

- (a) for S & S, DOBADURA, to take over the reserve of native rations held by USASOS in that area and
- (b) to take over such other rations as may be agreed upon with HQ NGF.

NATIVE LABOUR.

9. As native labour is released by Aust Forces, it will not be allocated to US Forces without the prior authority of HQ Southern Region.

10. Subject to provisions of ANGAU Adm Instr No. 29, the native

labour released by Aust Forces will be utilised in the construction of the KOKODA - HIGATURU road.

NATIVE HOSPITAL.

11. The main native hospital for the District will be established at POPONDETTA at the site already selected by the DO.

G. 98 CENSORSHIP, SOUVENIRS OF ENEMY ORIGIN - DANGEROUS DRUGS AND EXPLOSIVES

1. Censorship reports have shown that large numbers of parcels contain explosives and/or dangerous drugs. The despatch of such material is forbidden.
2. Where it is desired to include specimens of enemy ammunition in parcels, such ammunition must be :
 - (a) Rendered harmless by qualified personnel by removal of all explosive and the firing of all detonators.
 - (b) Certified as being of no further use for Intelligence purposes, by the holder of a War Souvenir Stamp.
3. War Souvenir Stamps are held by GS of formations.
4. Drugs of enemy origin are not permissible souvenirs.
5. It is the duty of every franking officer to ensure that no articles of these types are included in parcels.

**A.101 ABSENCE WITHOUT LEAVE -- SUSPENSION OF ALLOTMENTS and
DEPENDANTS ALLOWANCES.**

1. Amendments have been made to War Financial (Military Forces) Regulations providing for the shortening of the period upon the expiration of which a member's allotment and dependants allowance will be suspended in the event of his absence without leave. These amendments have effect on and from 1st June 1944.
2. Where a member has been declared an illegal absentee, the District Finance Officer will, under the regulations as now amended, take the action outlined in paras 3 and 4 of this order.
3. Where no dependants allowance is payable in respect of the member's allotment, the District Finance Officer will suspend payment of the allotment as from the earliest possible date.
4. Where the member has made an allotment in respect of which dependants allowance is payable, the District Finance Officer will at once forward a notice to the member's allottee. This notice will inform the allottee that the allotment and dependants allowance will be suspended after payment of two more fortnightly instalments, including any instalment which may be payable on the date of the notice.
5. In addition to the forfeiture of all active and deferred pay (including the amount paid as allotment) for the whole period of the member's absence without leave, the total amount of the dependant's allowance paid in respect of any day after the date of the notice mentioned in para 4 of this order will be debited to the member and will be recovered from his future pay.
6. Any allotment and related dependants allowance which has been suspended on account of the member's absence without leave will not be re-instated until the District Finance Officer has been advised of the members apprehension or return to duty.
