NARRATIVE 5. A Jap force estimated at approx 3000 all arms on 6 Nov attacked the allied perim along the line BURPENGARY - DAKABIN. After slight initial success the enemy was driven off and withdrew to a strongly def posn area 041270.

At 1600hrs 6 Nov Comd 29 Bde Gp was ordered to follow up and destroy the enemy and capture his base at UPPER CABOOLTURE 0432.

15 Aust Inf Bn was ordered to occupy area high grd 0525 and prevent any enemy mov to the EAST.

42 Aust Inf Bn was ordered to move to a posn in readiness area track junc 070225.

47 Aust Inf Bn was to move to Bde res area track junc 081242.

All tps to be in posn by 071600K.

SIT 1 42 Aust Inf Bn in present area.

SIT 2 Comd 29 Bde Gp orders 42 Aust Inf Bn to capture feature 041270.

SIT 3 Attack by 42 Aust Inf Bn successful. Action by 29 Bde Gp results in capture of base and destruction of enemy. 29 Bde Gp ordered into Div res CAMP area.

NOTES Problems, notes for umpires and DS are NOT issued. Problems for Junior Leaders will originate from orders issued by C.O. Time will be taken for criticism and conference at the end of each phase to allow all comds to pass on constructive criticisms of events.

1. GENERAL.

U.S.A.T. "SANTA MONICA" has been made available to load maintenance cargo, vehicles and personnel, as set out in -

Appendix A - ex Brisbane.
Appendix B - ex Cairns.

2. UNIT EQUIPMENT AND ACCOMMODATION STORES:-

H.Q. Q'land L. of C. Area will ensure that personnel move with sufficient stores, including tentage, to provide coverage at destination.

3. LIAISON:-

1 Officer appointed by H.Q. 29 Aust Inf Bde will report to Port M.C.O. at a time to be notified, in order to facilitate and expedite delivery of cargo and stores to wharf area.

4. SHIP'S STAFF:-

(a) Lt.Col J.H.Byrne 42 Aust Inf Bn, has been appointed O.C.Troops. Duties of O.C. Troops are laid down in Appx. "F" "STANDING ORDERS FOR MOV. IN AUST AND ITS TERRITORIES."

(b) The following are appointed as ship's staff -

Ships Adjt. - Lieut P.G. CRAN 42 Aust.Inf.Bn.
Ship's Quartermaster - Lieut J.G.GIRDHAM 42 Aust Inf.Bn.

(c) O.C. Troops will appoint the remainder of the Ship's Staff.

5. MARKING OF CARGO AND STORES:-

(a) Dangerous or Inflammable Cargo will be clearly marked in RED.

(b) Stores will be marked in accordance with "STANDING ORDERS FOR MOVEMENT WITHIN AUSTRALIA AND ITS TERRITORIES, SEC XI and XV."

6. PREPARATION OF VEHICLES:-

(a) Vehicles will be prepared in accordance with "STANDING ORDERS FOR MOVEMENT WITHIN AUSTRALIA AND ITS TERRITORIES SEC XV PART "B"

(b) Windscreens of Jeeps will be removed before shipment to obviate breakage.

7. CONCENTRATION AND LOADING OF VEHICLES AND STORES:-

- (a) Vehicles will be concentrated at CHERMSIDE, under arrangements H.Q. Q'land L. of C. Area.
- (b) Stores will remain in unit areas until called forward.
- (c) Vehicles and stores will be delivered to wharf, as called forward by Port M.C.O., represented by Lieut. GILLILAND.
- (d) C.T.O. will ensure that sufficient space is allowed to permit complete loading of stores and vehicles Serial 2, Appendix "B" ex CAIRNS, which is top priority this ship.
- (e) Before sailing, C.T.O. will inspect lashing and chocking of all vehicles.

8. CONCENTRATION OF PERSONNEL.

Personnel will remain in present camp areas.

9. BAGGAGE:

- (a) Stretchers and essential cooking equipment required on disembarkation will be loaded as deck cargo.
- (b) Baggage will be delivered to ship's side as arranged by Port M.C.O.

10. MOVEMENT TO WHARF.

- (a) Personnel will move from Staging Camps to wharf by M.T. under arrangement H.Q. Q'land L. of C. Area.
- (b) Time and date to be notified by Movement Control.

11. EMBARKATION.

- (a) Embarkation will take place under supervision of E.S.O. Lieut. YATES in accordance with "STANDING ORDERS FOR MOVEMENT WITHIN AUSTRALIA AND ITS TERRITORIES SEC XV AND XVI."
- (b) On arrival at Wharf, Os.C. of Units will form up personnel in Nominal Roll order to facilitate checking by Records Staff at the Ship's gangway.

12. RATIONS AND RESERVE SUPPLIES.

H.Q. Q'land L of C. Area is to arrange to supply all ranks embarking with the following:-

- (a) One (1) Emergency Rations (carried on the man).
- (b) Three (3) days' Landing Supplies (less P.O.L.) shipped in bulk.
- (c) Twenty-seven (27) days' initial supplies (less P.O.L.) to be loaded for discharge at destination.
- (d) Twenty-one (21) day's Voyage Rations, if required,
- (e) Two (2) 4 gal drums M.T. fuel and one petrol pourer per M.T. Vehicle will be drawn by Units and shipped with each vehicle.

13. MESSING EN ROUTE:

- (a) It will not be known until transport berths whether messing will be arranged by Ship's personnel or personnel embarking.
- (b) In the event of the latter, messing will be arranged by O.C. Troops, who will contact H.Q. Q'land L. of C. Area, regarding voyage rations.
- (c) Cooking utensils will be made available under arrangements of H.Q. Q'land L. of C. Area.
- (d) Quartermaster will be at the wharf to receive voyage rations.

14. MEDICAL:

- (a) Sufficient medical supplies for the voyage will be placed on board, under arrangements by H.Q. Q'land L. of C. Area.
- (b) Capt. V. Short is appointed S.M.O. for the voyage.

15. DOCUMENTATION:

Documentation will be in accordance with 3 Aust. M. C. Gps. "STANDING INSTRUCTIONS FOR EMBARKATION" and "SHIPPING PROCEDURE AS RELATING TO SERVICE CARGO."

16. CANTEEN SUPPLIES:

As canteen supplies will not be available on board, personnel embarking will ensure that they have sufficient tobacco and cigarettes for the voyage.

17. SECRECY:

The necessity for the strictest secrecy in connection with this movement must be impressed upon all concerned.

29 AUST INF BDE ADM ORDER NO.6

1. INTRODUCTION

- (a) Whereas it was originally intended that present Bde area would be handed over to incoming units, it is now advised that such a relief is NOT possible and accomodation stores will have to be returned.
- (b) The following tasks will accordingly have to be performed, in addition to general hygiene tasks through the area :
- (a) Return of accomodation stores on loan from Camp QM STRATHPINE
 - (b) Return to salvage of sandbags
 - (c) Return to RSD of blankets
 - (d) Hand over to Camp Staff offr of Scale "A" facilities
- (c) The following instructions are issued to implement action required.

2. RETURN OF ACCOMODATION STORES

- (a) Units will contact camp QM STRATHPINE and arrange a mutually suitable time for return of stores extraneous to actual basic needs.
- (b) When movement is advised arrange a time for return of the remainder of stores prior to movement.
- (c) In this regard the following points will be observed :
- (i) All one type of store will be returned together and NOT scattered over the trucks.
e.g. tents should not be returned complete, but all flys, tents, poles separate.
 - (ii) Lamps will be returned empty.
 - (iii) All unserviceable or repairable articles will be labelled accordingly.
 - (iv) An offr will be present at the check at camp QM stores.
- (d) Stores will be receipted on Fl (G1033's NOT required) A clearance will be obtained from the camp QM before marching out.
- (e) Shower buckets will be returned with these accomodation stores.

3. SALVAGE

- (a) Units will arrange forthwith to return to salvage depot ENOGGERA all salvage items NOT in essential use.
- (b) This will include the emptying of sandbags at present being used as tent walls and their return to salvage. Accordingly tents will be lowered to normal ground level.

4. BLANKETS

- (a) Units will return to RSD all blankets in excess of 4 per man. This 4 per man will be made up as follows :
- (i) 1 per man in unit bulk for embarkation purposes.
 - (ii) 1 per man on the man for embarkation purposes, and
 - (iii) 2 per man, in addition, for present requirements.
- (b) G1033's will be submitted to B00 for approval forthwith and blankets will be returned immediately on receipt of this approval.
- (c) On receipt of movement order, remaining blankets in excess of embarkation requirements will be similarly returned to RSD.

5. MARCH OUT CERTIFICATES

- (a) Units will prepare in duplicate march out certificates in accordance with pro forma below recording all items of Scale "A" facilities on loan, which will remain in Bde area:-





ENEMY STRENGTH

1. Latest reports, based on information to 1 Oct 44, estimate that enemy strength on BOUGAINVILLE is approximately 25000 ... of whom approximately 15000 could be regarded as fighting troops.

ENEMY SUPPLY SITUATION

2. A 17 Army Intendance Report for Mar 44 provides considerable information on the supply situation on BOUGAINVILLE.

The programme for the cultivation of gardens was begun about Sep 43. The TOROKINA attack in Mar 44 interrupted the programme and few units had under cultivation the total area allotted to them. The overall percentage in Southern BOUGAINVILLE was 50% of the allotted area.

Supply by surface vessels ceased in mid Oct 43. From Dec to Feb, nine submarines landed a total of approximately 160 tons of stores, the bulk of which was rice (100 tons). None arrived in Mar. From Apr to Sep a possible minimum total of ten submarines have been reported in the Northern SOLOMONS.

On 31 Mar, the total amount of rations on hand, including those already supplied to units, was as follows :

Assuming that ten submarines have arrived at BOUGAINVILLE since the beginning of Apr, the supply exhaustion date would be advanced approximately 20 days.

It is evident that enemy troops on BOUGAINVILLE have exhausted all significant quantities of army rations. Later reports indicated that army rations would last until Sep 44 and some PW state that the end of the year will see the last of issue rations on BOUGAINVILLE.

A temporary shortage of food was expected during Jul - Aug this year until the sweet potato crop was harvested; however, it is believed that the bulk of the enemy troops survived the lean period. The physical condition of the troops encountered recently in the TOROKINA area has been good with no signs of undernourishment.

TOPOGRAPHY - General

- 3 BOUGAINVILLE has a length of 115 miles and a maximum breadth of 32 miles; it is the largest island in the SOLOMONS GROUP.

BUKA ISLAND, separated by a narrow strait from the North end of BOUGAINVILLE, is 30 miles long by 10 miles broad.

Although the area is largely mountainous there is a considerable amount of rich volcanic soil well suited for plantations,

particularly along the Western coast of BUKA ISLAND and the East coast of BOUGAINVILLE. The Southern part is coastal plain rising gradually to the main mountain range.

VEGETATION

4 As a whole, both BOUGAINVILLE and BUKA are densely covered with heavy tropical forest; undergrowth is extremely dense in most areas, whilst open grassland is seldom encountered.

Native gardens of kau kau, taro, yams, native spinach, bananas, paw paw etc are situated in all village areas throughout the islands

WATER

5 Supplies are ample throughout the islands: in the immediate vicinity of BUKA PASSAGE the supply is slightly brackish from shallow wells.

NATIVES

6 Are MELANESIANS, those from BUKA and BOUGAINVILLE being dark skinned. Natives from the SHORTLAND District (South) are somewhat fairer. All are good types, with the BUKA people possibly the best.

CLIMATE and METEOROLOGICAL CONDITIONS

7 Copious rain is noted in the area, annual averages being in the vicinity of 100 inches, and maximum falls of 7 ins in 24 hrs are not unusual.

Rain occurs generally between 1400 - 1600 hrs, with some falls between 2000 - 2100 hrs.

PERIMETER INFORMATION

8 A network of approximately 90 miles of excellent roads (earth) exist within the perimeter, which is approximately 10 miles by 4 mls. Strict BT control is in force.

US Forces are at present in occupation of the perimeter, with some troops in contact in areas forward of the perimeter.

We have 100 % air superiority.

PORT FACILITIES

9. No wharves exist: all transportation between ship and shore is per barge.

Considerable swell is experienced on occasions and personnel will probably have to climb down landing nets to barges when disembarking.



 15. CONSERVATION OF WATER - Salt water for bathing is in abundance, but fresh water will be conserved as much as possible, as the supply is limited.
 16. OUT OF BOUNDS - Bridge, hospital area (except for Sick Parade) Ship's Officer's and crew's quarters, Army Officer's quarters, Galley food storage area, Storerooms etc. and any place guarded by sentry.
 17. BOAT DRILL - This will be as announced. Hatch Officers will instruct tps in procedure as attached as Appx 'A' to these orders. Hatch Offr will take charge of boat stations and will familiarize themselves with shortest approach to such stations. Tps will be instructed in the correct method of fitting life jackets. Hats will be worn. Water bottles and emergency rations carried.
 18. DRESS: - Tps may remove shirts whilst on deck between times to be announced but they will be carried at all times. Shirts will be worn on ALL parades (meal parades). Tps will wear boots, but will not carry lotion bottle in hip pocket.
 19. SHIP'S INSPECTION - This will take place at 1000 hrs daily. All tps (except Offr i/c Hatch) will be clear of sleeping quarters by 0945 hrs. O.C. Hatch will be responsible for general cleanliness of sleeping quarters and adjacent latrines. etc.,
 20. TROOP DECK OFFERS: - A certain number of offr's have been allotted to each Tp Hatch. O.C. Hatch will compile roster for voyage, ensuring that one offr is on duty in Hatch at all times (2 hrs per day). This roster will be submitted to Troop Office by 1200 hrs, 23 Nov 44, and will include one Sjt on duty with each offr.
 21. MAIL & SECURITY - Letters may be written on board and handed to respective Offrs, but mail will not be despatched until destination is reached. No mention may be made of voyage, route or general movement.
 22. MESSING: - Mess Cards will be issued to personnel and punched for each meal. All eating utensils are provided and tps are asked to return same in good order at the end of each meal.
 23. OFFICERS OF THE DAY :- O.O.D. will be in charge of all army personnel for tour of duty and will be responsible to O.C. Tps. He will accompany O.C. Tps on Ship's Inspection at 1000 hrs having previously ensured hatches are being made into inspection order. O.O.D. will ensure black-out regulations are carried out throughout ship.

24. PERSONAL EQUIPMENT: All equipment will be kept off deck floors in hatches, except when bunks are occupied. No clothing etc., will be hung on ventilator pipe or electrical fittings.

25. SUNBURN:- This is considered misconduct and if reported by RMO will be treated as such.

26. COURTESY:- Offrs and men will remember they are travelling on an Allied ship and the utmost courtesy will be extended to members of the ship's crew and compliments will be paid to the ship's Officers.

27. PUBLIC ADDRESS SYSTEM - Public address system in Troops Office will not be used by Aust personnel without permission of ships Adjt or Ships S.M.

INSTRUCTIONS TO PASSENGER PERSONNEL

1. It is imperative that military personnel keep out of the way of the ship's crew in the performance of their duties. No military personnel is to enter crew spaces or to go in the rigging or on life saving equipment of the vessel. Military personnel under no circumstances is to use or take any of the ship's equipment which is placed in the various parts of the ship. This property is sometimes irreplaceable and its disappearance or injury could endanger the lives of all.

2. The following places are out of bounds to all passenger personnel: the midship housing; in or on top of the potato locker on hatch four; the engine room; all hospital areas unless on duty there; the fan tail; forward of the breakwater on the bow of the ship; the bridge and deck houses.

3. Every effort must be made to keep decks and water ways on the ship free from trash. Throw cigarette butts in containers placed about the decks and latrines for that use. No cigarette butts or any other trash will be thrown into the urinals or toilet bowls. Nothing will be thrown overboard at any time by passengers. Trash and garbage will be thrown overboard during blackout hours at a time arranged by the Chief Mate.

4. While at sea life preservers will be worn or carried by all passengers at all times while on deck or messing. Life preservers will not be used for pillows or seats, and will be kept clean at all times.

5. Passengers will be permitted to smoke on open decks during daylight hours only. Passengers smoking on open decks will keep away from rope nets secured on deck rails. Smoking is prohibited in the hold and in all spaces occupied by troops, however smoking is permitted in the latrines. Smoking will be permitted in the mess halls while not in use for meals. There will positively be no smoking on the open decks from sunset until sunrise.

6. There will be a daily inspection of all troop areas each day at 1000 by the Transport Commander and the inspection party. All troops other than the cleaning details must clear all compartments and latrines from 0900 to 1000 each morning in order that the ship may be properly cleaned. All men quartered on the lower bunks raise your bunk to a forty five degree angle before leaving your quarters each morning. There will be no gear hung on the light or ventilation systems at any time. No gear will be left on the decks. Secure your excess gear to the sweat battons along the bulkheads.

7. The troop mess hall may be used as a recreational hall each night until 2200 at which time it will be vacated. Lights in all troop compartments are to be out from 2200 until 0600 the following morning.

8. All stoppages, breaks, etc. are to be reported to the troop office. All lost and found articles are handled by the Transport Chaplain's office.

1. (a) Warning of air raids is given by Fighter Control, telephone PACIFIC 125, which advises PACIFIC telephone exchange.
- (b) In turn PACIFIC exchange immediately advises HQ 3 Aust Div exchange.

ACTION ON RECEIPT OF AIR WARNING BY EXCHANGE2. Air raid warning YELLOW

- (a) Exchange will immediately call duty offr HQ 3 Aust Div on extension 14.
- (b) Duty offr will advise senior offr each branch and service and camp cmd, and will notify Bdes and Div Tps by telephone.
- (c) Alarms will NOT be sounded and work will NOT cease on this warning

3. Air raid warning RED

- (a) Alarm will be sounded

4. Air raid warning GREEN

- (b) All clear will be sounded

5. The following alarm sigs will be used :

- (a) Air attack alarm - succession of short blasts on whistle, siren or rattle.
- (b) All clear two long blasts on whistle siren or rattle at intervals of one minute.

ACTION ON RECEIPT OF AIR RAID WARNING RED

6. During daylight work will NOT cease, but sentries will be posted to give warning of immediate attack. Only when a sentry reports that a direct attack is imminent will personnel be ordered to take cover.

On order to "take cover" tps will disperse in an orderly fashion.

During the hours of darkness all visible lights will be extinguished on receipt of RED warning. Arrangements will be made to screen lights effectively in those offices etc where work must continue.

Exchanges, switchboards and essential comms will be manned continuously. An offr will be available at the telephone at each unit HQ during the continuance of the RED warning.

7. Fms and units will issue the necessary detailed instructions covering their respective comds and in conformity with the principles laid down herein.

Subject : MAINTENANCE AND MT DISCIPLINE

Ref GRO 79/44
DME Technical Instruction C19-22
AAB 20B - Vehicle Log Book - "B" vehicles
29 Aust Inf Bde Instruction - MT Discipline of 2 Apr 44

1. INTRODUCTION

- (a) Maintenance generally of new WE vehicles is far from satisfactory.
- (b) MT discipline is not being observed and must be policed by all units.

2. RESPONSIBILITY

- (a) A complete chain of control exists from the CO to the driver - the CO remaining responsible for care, maintenance and economic use of MT. This responsibility cannot be delegated.

3. MAINTENANCE PARADES

- (a) Before and after duty maintenance must be carried out as a parade by all units, when vehicles are detached or in the field drivers must be so trained, that they automatically carry out the correct procedure.
- (b) MAINTENANCE BEFORE OPERATION No vehicle will move from unit lines until it has been correctly maintained with particular care being paid to cleanliness.

4. CLEANING

- (a) The vehicle must be kept clean so that inspection is made easy, rapid and certain and so that all defects noticeable visually will be detected.
- (b) Cleaning also involves keeping all harmful matter away from components and out of bearing surfaces, and the prevention of rust or deterioration by the elements or by leakages.
- (c) All vehicles will be grounded at least one complete day per week.
- (d) All vehicles will be washed at least twice per week.
- (e) Exterior of vehicles will be kept polished with oil and kerosene mixture.

5. INSPECTIONS

- (a) Non technical inspections within the unit will be carried out daily by unit TO or NCO.
- (b) A complete weekly check will be carried out by TO and also on completion of each group maintenance mileage cycle.
- (c) Periodical inspection at irregular intervals by CO.
- (d) Technical inspections within the unit will be carried out by OC LAD or on his behalf monthly or every 1000 miles.

6. PERSONNEL TRAVELLING IN MT

- (a) All personnel while travelling in military vehicles will remain seated and correctly dressed.
- (b) Before moving off drivers are responsible to see that his vehicle is not overloaded.
- (c) Personnel will not ride in trailers.
- (d) No personnel will embuss or debuss until the tailboard of the vehicle is lowered by the driver.



3 AUST DIV ADMINISTRATIVE INSTRUCTION No. 27/44.

1. OBJECT

This instruction is a collation of certain administrative matters affecting units in this area under command 3 AUST DIV.

ADJUTANT GENERAL'S BRANCH

2. PAY

(i) 3 AUST DIV CASH OFFICE is established at HQ 3 AUST DIV.

(ii) Conservation of currency in this area:-

- (a) The acquisition of American currency with a view to its permanent retention by AMF personnel is prohibited.
- (b) The mailing of US or Aust currency is prohibited. Censors finding currency in letters will return it to the sender.
- (c) Members returning to the Mainland will not, except for special reasons, be paid more than £5.
- (d) The defacing of coinage for making souvenirs or for any reason is prohibited.

3. AMENITIES

(i) Requests for Amenities and any matters relating to Amenities will be made to Amenities Officer 3 AUST DIV.

(ii) A monthly Amenities Report will be rendered to this HQ by the first day of each month, on the pro forma shown as Appendix "A".

(iii) Attention is directed to A Circulars 31 and 32/44.

(iv) Swimming:-

- (a) 3rd AUST DIV swimming beach is situated immediately east of CAPE TOROKINA.
- (b) Swimming will be under unit arrangements and no individual bathing will be allowed. Competent swimmers have been detailed as look-outs and lifesavers.

4. EDUCATION

(i) Requests for information and matters relating to Education Service will be made to Education Officer 3 AUST DIV.

(ii) CO's will appoint unit Education Officers, and should ensure that such officer pursues an active policy in affording personnel every practicable educational facility, not only the better to fit them as soldiers but also to advise them as to post-war problems.

5. MEDICAL

(i) Admissions will be made by unit transport to 109 AUST CCS. If a motor ambulance is required, telephone 109 AUST CCS.

(ii) Scrub Typhus: Units will signal this HQ on 15 and 30th of each month certifying that anti-typhus fluid has been applied to the clothing of all personnel going outside the perimeter.

(iii) Malaria Precautions: Attention is directed to GRO A321/44. Units will advise 3 Branch3 AUST DIV through normal channels daily certifying that the proper malaria precautions have been taken.

(iv) Death or Injuries to Personnel

(a) In cases where permanent disability and/or compensation is likely to be involved, an Investigating Officer's Report will be submitted with AAF D11 in duplicate.

(b) In the event of death, Court of Inquiry will be held, and Investigating Officer's Report is not required. Death not due to enemy action will be advised by signal giving all relevant details.

(c) In cases of minor injury, Investigating Officer's Report may be dispensed with, vide GRO A348/44 para 36(2), but two copies of AAF D11 will be completed and forwarded to this HQ for comment by ADMS and transmission to Ech and Rec.

(vii) Latrines: A minimum number of 3 will be made immediately on the occupation of a site. They will be at least 10 feet deep, completely fly proof, and urine deflector and fly trap fitted. This number will be increased to Scale A Accommodation as soon as possible.

(viii) Garbage will be protected from flies and incinerated immediately. Pins will be burnt, crushed and buried.

(ix) Water: Water supplied from US water points is chlorinated but not detasted. Water from other sources must be superchlorinated or boiled.

(x) Sullage Water: Because of excellent soakage in this area standard grease traps are unnecessary. Sullage will be disposed of by sullage pits through strainers constructed from 44 gallon drums.

(xi) Unit Hygiene NOG and Weekly Return: Attention is directed to A CIRCULAR 30/44.

6. NUDE BATHING AND SCREENING OF LATRINES ETC.

(i) From time to time female entertainers visit this area.

(ii) Accordingly:-

(a) Bathers will at all times wear shorts or bathing trunks.

(b) All latrines, urinals, showers, etc., located in the vicinity of roads will be screened.

7. FIELD PUNISHMENT CENTRE

Until further advice, awards of Field Punishment will be carried out in unit lines.

8. DETENTION

Detention will also be carried out in unit lines until such time as a Detention Barracks is established.

9. PRISONERS OF WAR

A POW cage is maintained by HQ XIV US CORPS.

Units of 3 AUST DIV taking POW will transfer them to nearest Ede area, where 3 AUST DIV PRO COX will be responsible for their escort to POW cage.

10. TRAFFIC REGULATIONS

(i) Traffic on this Island is restricted at all times to that which is essential for operations, evacuations, and maintenance. Unit commanders will be responsible to ensure that no unnecessary use of vehicles is allowed.

(ii) Load Limits:

Maximum passenger load for trucks $\frac{1}{2}$ ton (Jeep) is one driver and three passengers. Loads of other type cargo on this vehicle are limited to 500 lbs.

(iii) Speed Limits:

Maximum speed limits of vehicles operating in this area are -

Staff Cars and Jeeps	25 mph
All other types	20 mph
Restricted Zones	10 mph

(iv) Use of Chains:

The use of chains is prohibited on improved roads and all airfields.

(v) Unit Signs:

All access roads and unit entrances will be appropriately signposted.

(vi) Pedestrian Traffic:

Pedestrian traffic will at all times walk on the right side of the road. This is particularly necessary at night.

(vii) Provoat TQPs:

(a) Pro personnel will be responsible for the control of traffic within this area. Any directions or signals given by such personnel will be carried out as directed.

(b) That portion of CRAIG RD between the bridge leading off PIVA RD and 2/8 AUST COMMANDO SQN turnoff is narrow and dangerous. Therefore one-way traffic rules will apply. Personnel are posted with phone communication to control the use of this stretch of the road.

11. DRESS

(i) A complete Australian pattern uniform will be worn, except as stated below in sub-para (ii).

(ii) Dress will at all times consist of:-

Hat,
Shirt, with sleeves rolled down and all buttons fastened less the neck button, between the hours of 1800 and 0630,
Trousers,
Waist Belt, Aust or US,
Gaiters, Aust or US,
Boots.

(iii) Shorts or bathing trunks will be worn when swimming.

(iv) For detail concerning the removal of shirts see ADM INSTN 28/44.

(v) Authorised sports wear issued by AA Amunition Service may be worn for organised sport.

12. SALE OR DISPOSAL OF LIQUOR

The sale or disposal of liquor, with or without any consideration, is expressly forbidden.

This does not apply to regular and official canteen sales or to the offering of normal hospitality in Officers' or Sergeants' Messes.

13. FERMENTATION AND DISTILLATION OF LIQUIDS

The preparation, fermentation or distillation of any liquid mixture from any fermentable combination of fruit, vegetables, herbs, plants, blossoms, raisins, sugar and/or yeast or any other fermentable materials, is prohibited.

The sale of or dealing in, or the personal use for beverage purposes of any Government or Commercial alcohol is prohibited.

14. GRAVES REGISTRATION AND BURIAL PROCEDURE

(i) Vide 3 AUST DIV ADM INST No. 25/44.

(ii) Special attention is directed to para 5(i) of that Inst, as it is imperative that this method of notification of casualties be strictly adhered to.

15. DENTAL

(i) So far as practicable Dental Secs will be allotted to units or groups of units.

(ii) Where a Dental Unit is not available to 3 AUST DIV, it will usually be possible only to have urgent dental treatment effected, in which case units will make their own arrangements through unit Medical Officer.

26. INVESTIGATIONS REGARDING LOSSES OF STORES, ETC.

- (i) Attention is directed to GRC's 592/43 and 348/44.
(ii) Where the loss is under £100 only one copy of the Report will be forwarded, where over £100 two copies.

27. LEGAL - Personnel or units requiring legal advice may obtain same by request through Unit HQ for appointment with Div or Bde Legal Officers.

28. HONOURS & AWARDS - Citations for Honours and Awards will be compiled in accordance with GRC MS 231/44.

29. BATTLE CASUALTIES - Will be advised to HQ ADV 2 ECH by signal, with copy to this HQ for information.

Demands for stores included on Scale "A" will be submitted direct to RAE 3 AUST DIV. Demands for additional stores will be submitted to HQ 3 AUST DIV.

In the latter case, the purpose for which the stores are required will be stated.

39. RATIONS, EXPENSE STORES and POL

Units will submit indents as directed by 3 Sup C AASC 3 AUST DIV in respect of rations, expense stores and POL.

30. TRANSPORT REQUIREMENTS

In the event of units requiring transport for any special task, a request may be made by telephone to HQ AASC 3 AUST DIV before 1700 hrs on the day prior to date required, stating the number of vehicles required and the duty for which required, place and time of reporting.

31. ORD

Unit representatives will not, without prior approval of ADCS 3 AUST DIV, approach or make inquiries of 16 AOD regarding supply or availability of stores. ORD matters will be referred to Div or Bde Ord Officer.

39. MOVEMENTS BY SEA AND AIR

Detailed instructions regarding movement of individuals by sea and air from this area will be issued separately.

40. MOVEMENT OF UNITS INTO THIS AREA

When advice is received of units arriving into this area, 3 AUST DIV will nominate a fostering unit. Fostering unit will arrange collection and erection of necessary tentage and accommodation stores, and provide the first three meals after arrival of the unit. All transport of incoming units from wharf to unit camp site will be effected by 2/1 AUST MOVEMENT CONTROL GROUP. Unit fostering will also, when instructed by 3 AUST DIV, despatch to MOVEMENT CONTROL guides to lead the vehicles to unit camp site.

32. PRESERVATION OF TENTAGE

Tentage when not in use will be stored in unit Q Store if the unit is authorised to hold same, otherwise it will be returned to ADOS 3 AUST DIV. Care will be taken with all tentage erected over frameworks to ensure that no sharp corners exist and adequate arrangements are made to secure the tent to the framework to prevent excessive wear.

33. MAINTENANCE OF UNIT EQUIPMENT

Maintenance of equipment is primarily a unit responsibility. Units will frequently inspect, clean, adjust, lubricate, paint, stop, and equipment in charge in accordance with current instructions. With proper maintenance more equipment will be available to units, workshop commitments and spare parts usage can be reduced very considerably.

34. VEHICLES

It is essential that Unit maintenance be of the highest order. Attention is directed to GFG's 339/43, 431/43, 79/44 and DMF Technical Instruction C 19-22, which details the responsibilities for maintenance of mechanical vehicles and the methods to be adopted.

The following points are to be noted -

- (a) Units are to provide vehicle ramps for the cleaning and greasing of vehicles.
- (b) Vehicles are to be washed at least once per week, particular care being taken to ensure that water does NOT enter the brake drums. When vehicles have been subjected to salt water they will be washed in fresh water immediately afterwards.
- (c) Vehicles, logbooks, and V.O.L. equipment are to be inspected at least once per week by Unit T.O.
- (d) Vehicles will be inspected monthly by OC LAD or ASC Workshops officer as a check on maintenance and a report submitted to the unit CO.
- (e) Periodical technical inspections will be carried out by OC LAD to assist in detection and rectification of faults. Any defects noted by drivers are to be reported immediately.

35. WIRELESS SETS

All wireless sets within the formation have been fungus proofed. Units will ensure by frequent inspection that fungus growth is removed immediately by careful brushing. Whenever possible all sets should be exposed to the sun for at least two hours each day to dry out any moisture.

When held in storage sets will be stored in a dry place on racks to enable the free circulation of air. They will NOT be stored in boxes, crates, etc.

36. OPTICAL INSTRUMENTS

To curtail fungus growth it is essential that air be allowed to circulate freely around all instruments. Any sign of fungus or mould on cases or containers must be

41. UNIT LOB DETAILS

(i) When a unit moves on a reduced scale of stores and equipment, LOB personnel and such equipment which remains in this area will be grouped in a sub-unit to be known as the LOB Details of that unit.

(ii) The functions of such sub-units are outlined below:-

- (a) To provide safe storage for unit stores and equipment remaining after the move of the main body, but which are not required to be returned to Ordnance.

It must be understood that the continuity of supplies of liquor and cordials is dependent on return of containers. 3 AUST DIV SAL UNIT will forward a weekly statement of receipts to HQ 3 AUST DIV.

43. CANTEEN ISSUING POINTS

Pending establishment of DIV CANTEEN ISSUING POINT, units will draw from BASE SUB-AREA ISSUING POINTS under arrangements Div Canteens Officer.

44. STATIONERY

Units will indent direct on 10 L of C STATIONERY DEPOT.

Requests for typewriter repairs and maintenance will be made to Div Typewriter Mechanic at CAMP COMD's OFFICE, HQ 3 AUST DIV. Machines will NOT be evacuated direct to 10 L of C STATIONERY DEPOT.

45. CATERING

Any matters affecting unit catering will be referred to Catering Adviser 3 AUST DIV.

46. RETURNS

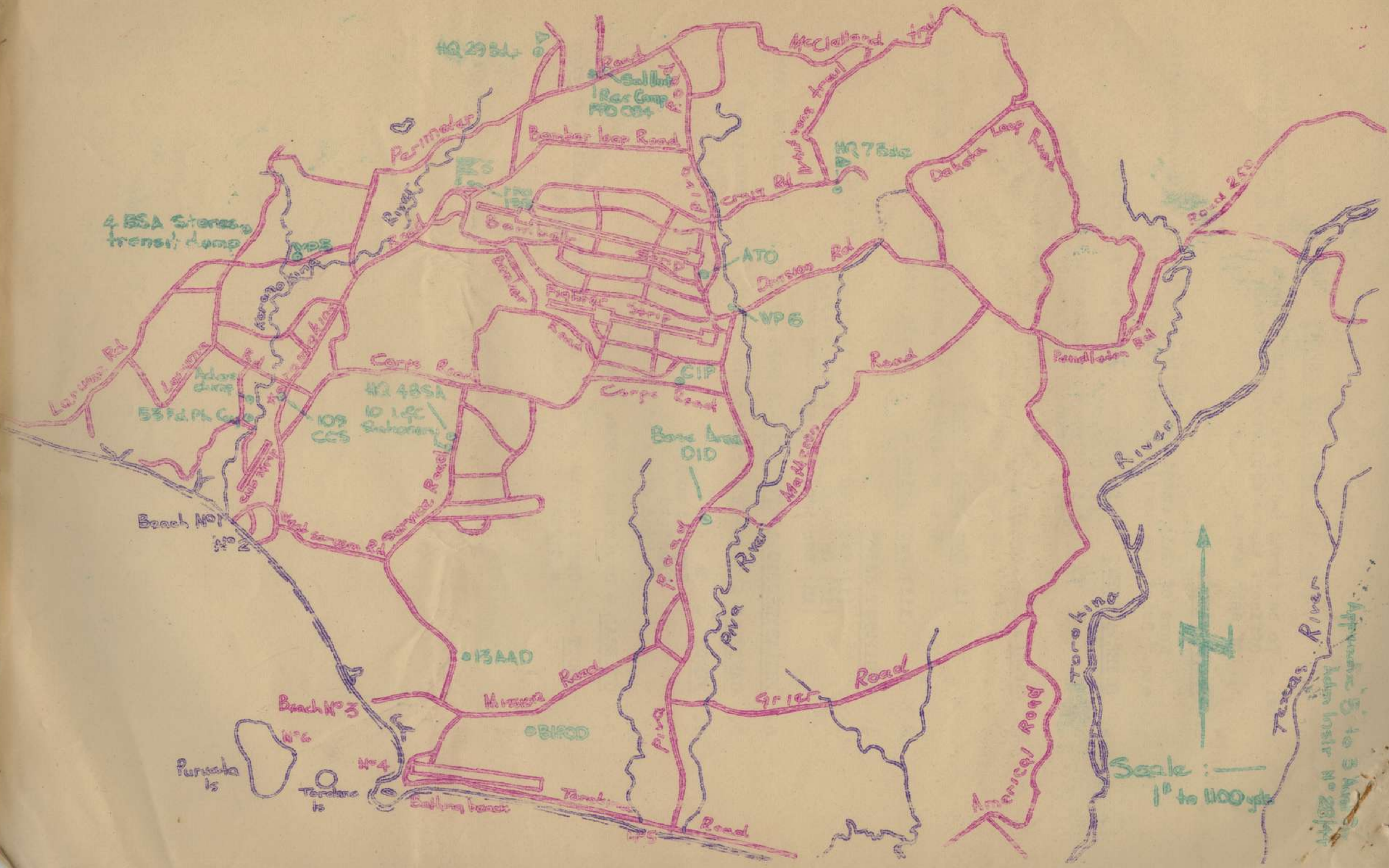


