 Each bde gp will appoint 20 offrs as loading offrs. These offrs will be trained during the forthcoming trg period in the detailed arrangements for loading LSEs and smaller craft. P LO 2 Just Hil Idg Gp will advise bdes in this connection. Records of offrs trained will be retained by bdes.
 - (c) Materproofing of Vehs:

 (i) Due to wksp commitments it is most desirable that the number of vehs brought into contact with salt water be kept to a minimum, although it is essential that all dwrs be trained in crossing a water-gap. Each bde gp will arrange for the complete waterproofing of approx 25% operational type vehs on a basis proportionate to arms and services. No other operational type vehs will be brought into contact with salt water and, consistent with the thorough trg of dwrs, the number of vehs used will be kept to a minimum. Non-operational types, water-proofed as far as practicable, may be used during trg, but, if a ldg is involved, ldg pts will be selected so that deep wading is obviated. All vehs which come in contact with salt water will be washed in fresh water and necessary de-water-proofing carried out as soon as possible.

- (ii) Trg in the waterproofing of wehs will be carried out under the direction of bde HQ, Beach Gp, AMME and the ATU specialist in waterproofing. The elementary trg of dwrs and the testing of waterproofed wehs will be carried out in the fresh water reaches of BAMMON River.
- (iii) All webs driven through water will have a towing-rope previously affixed, with the free end of the rope att in an accessible posn well clear of the possible water line.

 Particular attention will be paid to driving instr. All dvrs will be trained in driving their vehs in circumstances lively to be encountered in amphibious ops. AMPHIBIOUS OPERATIONS AND OPEN WARFARE

- 1. Training period for the Div- 11 Oct to 2 Dec 44.
- 2. As the next stage in operations will undoubtedly be amphibious initially, all officers must study the various capacities and loading combinations of all types of Landing Ships and Craft thus facilitating the quick preparation of Loading Tables etc.
- Scales of unit equipment are being prepared and when these are finally settled BHQ and Coys will practice moves to ensure that the minimum amount of time is spent when preparing for operations.
- 4. It is emphasised that the absolute minimum of essential gear and equipment for each Scale will be carried. Non observance of this will be treated as a most serious offence. Personnel and sub units must train with this object in mind.
- 5. One officer will be trained as a Ship's Adjt. Three officers will be trained as Landing Officers.
- 6. Lectures for officers and N.C.Os on amphibious planning will be started forthwith.
- 7. Praining in open and semi open country will be undertaken and sand madel exercises will be run in conjunction.
- 8. In all exercises the question of transport in relation to mobility will be carefully considered-strict inspections will be made from time to time to ensure that none other than essential stores etc are carried. Best use of transport for carriage of equipment and stores will be studied and recommendations submitted.
- 9. The/A training will receive careful attention the use of The Hunting Playari the PITA will form a substancial part of the training.
- 10. A.A. training- P.A.D. measures, incl. concealment and camouflage.

 Engagement of low flying aircraft with S.A. should also be considered.
- Il. It appears obvious that future operations in which we may be involved are going to be waitly different from our recent ones and it is therefore assential that all officers and N.C.Os menu of whom have known nothing but jungle training and fighting, must be throughly trained in open werfare. Particular study must be given to FSR II and the FSPB.

TRAINING INSTRUCTION NO 13 Tropical Diseases and Hygiene - It is most important that all ranks should be 15. thoroughly familiar with all phases of control and prevention of Tropical Diseases and be Hygiene minded. Hygiene does not only team Camp and Bivoure sanitation but also Personal Hygiene and it is the junior Officers' job to ensure that all men under his commend practice personal hygiene in all its phases and will make inspections to ensure that they do so - Teeth and feet are two of the greatest causes for lack of physical fitness in the Army. Transport Officers and NCOs are to consider and study all phases of tpt -16. NOT only MT - they may have to organise "Boong" teams or even mules for tpt over difficult country. They are to regard themselves as being "Q Movements" of the Unit and Sub-Units. Sigs - Officers and Senior NCOs are to make themselves thoroughly convers-17. ant with me all procedure - especially R/T - Sig Officer will organise classes of instruction along those lines, also elementary practice in signalling with Morse and Flags. ROUGHNESS IN TRAINING

Bn H.Q. 25 Sep 44 (Ref: G 906/80/1)

OBJECT

To ensure that all Coys within the Unit are thoroughly trained in all aspects of open warfare.

THOROUGHNESS IN TRAINING

- It must be borne in mind that future battles will be fought against a more numerous and better armed enemy who in all probability will be efficient in open warfare and able to use his artillery and machine guns effectively at long ranges. His air force will be relatively stronger than it has been both for recce, strafing and bombing. Our training must therefore be of the highest standard down to every detail.
- Owing to so much jungle training where cover from view is largely automatic, many of our experienced officers and ORs, and also reinforcement officers and ORs, through lack of training, are neglecting the first principles of concealment of movement in action. In order to obtain surprise, to save casualties and to prevent the enemy estimating our strength or learning the direction of our movement, covered lines of approach or movement to a flank will be used wherever possible.
- Bushcraft and patrolling must be retaught in open country and all proper methods insisted upon. Mo ement on skylines is to be avoided. Movement should take place below and behind the crest whenever possible.
- Camouflage and concealment in all its forms and priorities will be practised.

 In particular the following will be insisted upon:-
 - (a) The use of sh for concealment from air observation.
 (b) Track consciouses and discipline.

(c) Dispersal of vehicles at all times of the move, at rest and in action.

Strict attention to convoy discipling VTM and MTH.

(d) The concealment and camouflage of vehicles at rest and in action.

- At all times during training exercises, fieldworks will be constructed by all arms as if in action against a real and up to date enemy. Weapon pits and trenches will be dug to proper dimensions and designs, to accommodate all personnel and weapons. This includes comi posts and gun emplacements for MMGs.
- HQ, B echelons including cookhouses, and all administrative installations will likewise be properly laid out and constructed. All necessary tooks will be carried to enable this to be done.
- of great importance. Coordination of Tk A arrangements will be necessary at all times to achieve the maximum security and efficiency.
- 9. Because we will have tanks and possibly carriers of our own, all signal line
 - (a) Poled sufficiently high in the air for tanks to pass underneath, or (b) Be buried so that they are protected from damage by tracked vehicles.
- O. Signals must always arrange with engineers and engineers ensure that comnunications are not broken by bulldozers and other mechanical equipment.
- Every officer and OR is to be made to understand clearly that the good conduct and direction of operations depends on unfailing communications which include line teleraphy and telephony. All ranks will be made "signal line conscious". Any break in a

line will be immediately repaired if possible. Failing this the location of the break will be reported to the nearest HQ whose duty it will be to pass the information to signals. If the line is down or uncovered, action will be taken in the same way to pole it up again or rebury it securely as soon as possible.

- 12. The principle of security will be observed at all times, i.e. protection on the move and at rest, including AA defence and PAD measures. AA defence for defiles will always be given consideration.
- 13. Attention will be given to the efficiency of field cooking and the provision of good hot meals to the troops.
- 14. Coy commanders will ensure that all the latest information and methods from schools and courses is disserinated at once throughout their command.

- Discipline must be tightened up throughout the whole Unit. Officers of all ranks must realise that they are there to command men, to train them, to discipline them, and to lead them into battle. bey must ensure strict discipline including smartness, cleanliness, respectfulness and he immediate proper carrying out of all orders. NCOs and men will be made to stand to attention whilst addressing officers, and men when
- Minor points of dress will be strictly enforced. Hats will be properly 16. creased and chin straps will be worn under the chin uniformly in Coys. Chin straps will not be allowed to hang down at the back of the head.

MAN MANAGEMENT

The first care of every officer must be his men and their welfare. Slackness or dissatisfaction in a sub unit is invariably due to lack of command or ineptness on the part of officers. Officers will accordingly be held responsible.

2/2 AUST MG BN TRAINING INSTRUCTIONS NO. 5

TRAINING IN OPEN AND CLOSE COUNTRY AND NATURE OF TRAINING

TYPE OF COUNTRY

Until the probable theatre of operations is known the bulk of the training will be carried out in open and semi-open country. Wherever possible, the longer exercises will be held in country varying from quite open to thickly timbered and rough ground. Training in jungle warfare will, however, be continued generally throughout the training period. Commanders of all grades must become accustomed to adapting their organisation, formations and procedure to suit whatever type of ground they may be required to fight through.

NATURE OF TRAINING

2. As well as amphibious operations which have been dealt with separately, the following phases of operations will be studied:-

Protection: Advanced Guards
Flanks Guards

Rear Guards including extrication from close contact

Outposts.

Attack

Defence

Night Operations

Deliberate Withdrawal

3. Detailed attention will be given to:-

(a) Study of and practice in battle procedure for each phase; in particular the composition and duties of reconnaissance, order, fighting and transport groups in formations, units and sub units and simultaneous action where possible to save time, consistent with proper preparation.

(b) Teaching the baric principles and sequence in planning, organising and executing each phase. It is important that ALL RANKS understand the stages and sequence of stages in each phase.

When dealing with planning, every commender must be taught:

(1) To recognise a phase when confronted with it;

(11) To recognise each stage in a phase whether its occurrence is planned or is unexpected, and to know when it has been completed and what the next stage should be.

(iii) To know by heart those constant and recurring points on which in each phase of operations he has to make a decision - and to know the sequence of decisions - in order to form a plan.

In teaching it will generally be best to treat subjects by discussion rather than by lecture.

4. Matters for particular attention.

Advance Guards (FSR II 41 - 44)

- (a) The principal faults to be eradicated are:-
 - (i) hesitancy at first contact;
 - (ii) a tendency of forward troops to make a wide outflanking move, thereby uncovering the units in rear.

At first contact the forward troops must press on, locate and if possible overcome the opposition, while still not exposing rear units to surprise.

If the opposition is strong, the forward troops must still press on and locate and pin it, try to find the extent of the position and assess,

its strength, seize all points of tac ical importance and in particular those which full assist the next or more senior commander to execute his plan; but, throughout, the primary duty is the protection of the echelons in rear.

Flank Guards (FSR II 46)

- (a) It must be made clear that a flank guard role is essentially a protective one. The methods of using flank guards in moving and stationary roles should be explained.
- (b) Special exercises in flank guard work need not be held, but opportunity should be taken to include flank guards in exercises which lend themselves to it.

Rear Guards (FSR II 47 - 49, 81 - MTP 4/1943) including Extrication from close contact.

Exercises will be held both for daylight and night withdrawals of this nature.

Outposts (FSR II 51 - 53, 69 para 9)

Outpost exercises will be held in conjunction with exercises in defence or in approach marches.

Attack (MSR II Chapter VI)

- (a) Organisation and procedure are the main points for attention. Ref FSR II 59 (1) together with tactical principles.
- (b) Any misunderstanding of exploitation should be removed. On arrival at the objective, in all cases local exploitation whether to the front or the flanks will be undertaken to:-
 - (i) provide local security and cover any reorganisation; (ii) assist flanking units.

This should be automatic. It is redundant to order it. It applies whether or not consolidation has been ordered. When, however, ground beyond the objective can be occupied with little or no resistance, whether or not any (spontaneous or planned) exploitation should be carried out depends on matters discussed in the following extract from FSR II 59 (1):-

"There is often a period after a successful attack when ground beyond the allotted objective can be occupied with little or no resistance, while the enemy is still surprised and disorganised. Whether or not a subordinate commander should push forward beyond the line given him as his final objective must depend on the instructions which he has received, his knowledge of the superior commander's intentions, the situation to his right and left and his tactical judgment as to the value of the ground in front. Generally speaking, a bold decision should be taken, unless it will lead to dangerous isolation. In any event, information of the opportunity and of his action should be sent back at once to the next higher commander."

- (c) The two stages of pursuit should be brought out FSR II (44) (1).
- (d) During training the following will be covered:-

Advance Guards - employment of main body after contact - consolidation dexploitation - pursuit.

(e) Opposed river crossings. Those requiring special engineer bridging equipment are difficult to arrange in this at a, and should be studied whencut troops for the time being.

Defence (FBR II Chapter VII and MIP 3/1943)

(a) Roles of reserves in -

Holding ground Supporting other localities by fire

- (a) (Contd) Counter attack, immediate for coys and deliberate for bns will be studied and practised.
- (b) Field defences ref MTP 3/1943. Protective works including clearing fields of fire, and obstacles.
- (c) Anti-tank defences ref MTP 3/1943 and tank attack will receive consideration on all levels.
- (d) MTP 3/19451 para 141 and 142 (a) should be referred to for the variation which may be necessary in reconnaissance and order procedure, particularly when time is short.
- (e) Exercises will cover the three phases shown in MTP 3/1943, viz

Preparatory Phase (Enemy) Assault Phase Counter Attack Phase.

Night Operations (FSR II Chapter VIII)

(a) Notes on night attacks are being issued separately.
(b) Exercises will cover -

Night marches
Night advances) care must be taken to choose suitable ground
Night attacks) for these.
Night withdrawals.

Deliberate Withdrawals.

(a) It will be noted that separate headings have been used for

"A" - Rear Guards and Extrication from Close contact.
"B" - Deliberate Withdrawal.

- (b) (i) "A" is to cover the action of rearguards or the last portion of a force to withdraw and which for the time being at least acts as a rearguard.
 - (ii) The differentiation between "A" and "B" is shown in following extracts from FSR III 28 (4):-

"The tactics of a force withdrawing in the face of an active pursuit may be; in fact to pursue similar tactics to those of a rearguard, only on a much larger scale.

"As in a rearguard action, before one position is left, parties should be sent back to reconnoitre the next position in rear. But, whereas with a rearguard it may be only a matter of a few officers going back two or three miles, with a large force the numbers involved may be considerable; it may be necessary to send them back a distance of 10 or 12 miles; and they may be separated from their units, or formations for 24 hrs or more."

(iii) An example illustrating "A" and "B" is:-

A division has been advancing and has met opposition so superior that it is forced to withdraw to a suitable defensive position a considerable distance to the rear. There is sufficient time for making a deliberate withdrawal. One boo.

gp/

(iii) (Contd) is left holding the front making as great a display of strength as possible, while the remainder of the division withdraws unhampered to the rear defensive position the division is to occupy. This deliberate withdrawal is then followed by a withdrawal of the bde gp left in contact with the enemy. This bde's withdrawal will be one of extrication from close contact, and, during withdrawal, it will probably have to fight on a number of subsidiary defensive positions.

The same principles apply in a bde gp when it withdraws in similar circumstances, covered by a bn rearguard; and so on.

- (c) The organisation and procedure for "B" should be studied first. Once commanders have a grasp of that they will be better able to cope with "A" which often calls for speedy action and improvisation.
- 5. Training programme of bdes will be so arranged that they deal at some time with each of subjects discussed above. It will often be possible to cover two or three items in the one exercise. If certain items will not fit into any of the longer exercises then special short exercises will be held to obtain practice in the particular subject.

6. Bde exercises set by division will cover some of the subjects referred to above.

1. ANTI-GAS TRAINING

Specialist personnel in the Unit are Lt. W. TIPPETT, Unit Gas Offr., Sjt. RENDALL, G.A., Spl BIRRELL, C.A.D. (Unit Gas N.C.O's), who will be available to train instructional cadres. All other personnel will be trained to TOET standard.

2. CAMOUBLAGE TRAINING

Will be on the same lines as for anti-gas.

- 3. To permit further training of specialists in the above subjects it can be anticipated that schools will be available in the near future.
- 4. ESSETTIAL HYGIENE

The demands of 'Essential Hygiene' on the individual are not one rous, but they do entail constant compliance with the few simple rules of individual conduct.

- Every individual in a force has a dual responsibility in regard to hygiene firstly that he takes the measures necessary to safeguard himself from disease and secondly that he ensures that he does whatever lies in his pow'r to protect the remaining members of the force from disease.
- The rules given in Appx "A" attached summarise the responsibility of every individual in each grade in regard to hygiene for tropical theatres of operations. By constant training and supervision, these responsibilities must be impressed on officers and men, until they are accepted as customary and carried out instinctively by all ranks.
- 7. CONCLUSIONS ARRIVED AT IN OTHER THEATRES IN WARFARE AGAINST THE JAPANESE.

 A precis of Notes on recent operation in the ARAKAN by the commander of 36 Indian Div is attached at Appx "B".
- 8. These notes are of particular interest in that they show clearly that, in all essentials, the conclusions arrived at in recent campaigns in NEW GUINEA, are the same as those arrived at in fighting Japanese in the ARAKAN.

PRIXIS ON NOTES ON RECENT OPERATIONS IN THE ARAKAN BY COMD 36 INDIAN DIV.

- In accountry where it is difficult to pick on objectives, useful rule is always to go to the highest ground, because if you do not the Jan undoubtedly will.

 It is not enough, however, just to hold dominant points, but as in other types of will-fare, mobile and readily accessible counter attack parties are necessary.
- 2. We have experienced extremely tough infantry resistance from men of its sorts of unexpected units divisional transport, ordnance, gunners, etc. This is because every soldier, whatever branch of the service he belongs to, appears to have a sound basic grasp of infantry tactics and a determination to 'stay put' in the position he has been told to defend, in spite of shelling, d we bombing, mortaring and machine gunning. The main effect of this Jap characteristic is that Jap units and formations are singularly free of 'soft tails' and are therefore able to operate more vigorously and with greater impunity in enemy infested areas than we are.
- Supply by sea or by air is imperative for the future, not only here, but in most operations against the Japanese. Sea transport will undoubtedly earry the greater weight of supplies, but it is of course dependent upon harbours with proper facilities. These do not exist in BURA with the exception of the PORT OF RANGOON. One is the season of the fore thrown back on air supply. For future campaigns in ARAKAN, or indeed approach in SEA command, air supply should be regarded as normal, and not an eleventh hour improvisation.
- The Jap is a courageous and most tenacious infantry-man, and normal methods must be adjusted to deal with him when he occupies positions on the topmost peaks of mazorback hills in the middle of jungle country. Under such conditions whatever the force, the ultimate assault is invariably carried out by, at the most, a score of men advancing along a narrow tract.
 - To deal with such a position, three things it is suggested are necessary:
 - (a) Intimate knowledge of the ownet enemy dispositions which can only be o'tained by active and courageous patrolling by small patrols of two or three men and later by fighting patrols.
 - (b) A co-ordinated plan based on knowledge gained by patrols, and on consi-
 - (c) The use in the plan of every appropriate type of fire. I am of the ognion that the two past useful weapons we have are the medium gun, and the
 SHRIM tank. The former is first eless for 'Bunker Busting' when used
 in the infantry in the finel stages of a track.

Whatever the actual fire plan for dealing with a particular position, it must include provision for counter battery and counter mortar fire, as the Jap almost invariably reacts by bringing down his defensive fire oute, own positions when they are captured.

One of the features of fighting in the ARAKAN is that anybody may find hims of confronted by a Japanese at short range at any time, and almost in any place. This means that all ranks must be armed with personal weapons at all times, and be ready in use them, and also means that an active and enquiring state of mind is necessary. This is not easy, especially when climbing on a very hot day, up a very steep path. Unless such conditions there have been a number of cases where either one or the other side word been caught napping through unpreparedness.

- The Jap meltes a specialty of beating up HQs., gun lines and administrative areas. Every individual soldier must of course be trained and be prepared to gig his own defence in the dren. It will usually be necessary, however, in addition, to detail infantry for the special protection of important HQs and administrative areas.
- I have been struck most forcibly by and point in this type of fighting and that is the large dividend paid to those who prepare, for the worst and do not rely on hoping for the best. The Jap is most shrevel judge of the unit's proparedness to give him a rousing reception, and if positions are made really strong, it is more than probable that he will leave them alone.
- 8. The importance of active patrolling cannot be overstressed. Good patrol-Ting produces a sense of superiority over the energy, and acclimatises the soldier to the uncongenial atmosphere of the jungle. Secondly, it guards against being surprised, and is an insurance, though notion infallible one, against Jap methods of infiltration. Thirdly, it keeps troops fit and a considerable amount of keenness can be engendered by it.

Patrolling should be organised probably on a battalion basis, and co-ordihated by brigade. A patrol map for every 24 hours should be prepared in advance, and onch days work be co-ordinated throughout the formation.

- The importance of physical fitness in all ranks cannot be over emphasised. This is particularly necessary in the case of Senior Commanders who must get round the place and who can only white successful plans-if they have been to see for themselves.
- The distance and the second of 10. We have heard a great deal about anti-malarial measures. It is a truism to say that their importance cannot be overestimated. There are two types of en ho swell the unlaria total - The "Foolish" and the "Bloody Minded". The first forgets to take his Mepacrine, and never knows the time for putting down his sleeve. He must be treated and protected from himself very much like a child; this is a task for the plateon and section commander. The second type are those who do not approve of, and do not like taking doses, and who take every opportunity not to use their mosquito nets and cream. A great deal has been written on how to defeat the Jap, and I sometimes feel a ridiculous atmosphere has been created by suggesting that particularly subtle or new methods are required. Good troops well trained and well equipped will defeat the Jap every time; but, there is no Bargain Basement where second rate troops and equipment may be bought that will defeat this extremely stout-hearted and sturdy soldier.

Regarding the methods to be employed against them, I think they may be summarised briefly under two headings:-

- (a) Make full use of the superiority of individual intelligence, fire lower, and modern equipment. Do not descend, unless it is absolutely necessary, to his own level to fight him in country of his choice.
- (b) Pay him back in his own coin by infiltration, encirclement, and spreading clarm by the use of noise. The state of the s to the television of the state of the



GENERAL

- OUTLINE TRAINING SYLLABUR Present syllabus will end 9 Sep 44, and it is appreciated that, owing to various intercuptions, the syllabus will not be completed on time. Coys will care on with their training as laid down and notify Bn HQ when syllabus is completed. Depending on efficiency of reinforcements absorbed and other factors. Coy standard of training values considerably, therefore the next 14 days syllabus will be prepared by Coys to will concentrate on subjects which are not up to the required standard. Priority will be given to MG or ming, so that on completion of this fourteen days syllabus, Coys are definitely efficient to carry out Coy training. Should this be found impossible in any degree, report will be submitted immediately.
- 2. DAILY TRAINING HOURS The minimum time to be spent daily on training, exclusive of rests & time taken for assembly, will be five hours.
- DISCIPLINE & SALUTING. This is of very poor standard and it is felt that, because of an "old soldier complex, that the new members of the En are not being taught when, whom and where to salute. This is very apparent in En guards, who are to be instructed by Coys in their duties before mounting. This procedure in no way excuses the old members of the En and all officers and CO's will set an example when moving about training areas or reporting to one another. Officers and FOO's will again be informed of their responsibilities in policing such elementary discipline.
- 4. DICENTRALISATION OF COMMAND NITHIN PLATFORMS. Some platforn commanders have a tendency to deal with the men in the platforn rather than with the section commanders. This fault must be cured. It can only result in the men becoming dependent on the platforn commander and in loss of prestige by the section commanders: and it prevents the section commanders from developing into reliable and self-reliant subordinate commanders. In the platforn, as in the army, command can only be exercised through the delegation of author by to a strictly limited number of subordinate commanders. A platforn commander cannot in battle control every man in his platforn except through subordinate commanders who assume a proper share of responsibility. The training period, therefore, should be used to train section commanders to accept and discharge their responsibilities.
- FRAINING IN OPEN COUNTRY AD JUNCIE. Any training in the open or semi-open will be done with the object of teaching principles or of demonstratin phases of jungle fighting. Generally it will be considered as preparatory work to training in the jungle. Training in any phase of platoen or company tactics likely to be met in the jungle will culminate in exercises in the jungle. For longer exercises with troops, most value can be obtained if the ground chosen is jungle interspersed with clearings. Such ground will not only provide relief from jungle atmosphere but will make it difficult for commanders of all grades to apply any stereotyped factical drill without due consideration of all the factors.

2/2 AUSTRALIAN MACHINE GUN BATTALION WAR DIARY - FEBRUARY, 1945

Thursday Feb 1 Heavy rain continues throughout the day. The bridge over the MILLSTREAM has been washed away. Flood warnings is-sued.

- 1400 NCOs march out to attend Section Leader's Course at WONGABEL, but owing to washaways they are returned to unit.
- 1500 Syllabus for unit F.U.C.C. school to start on Monday 5 Feb is drawn up. LT. H. J. C. COCKRAM is to be Chief Instructor, with Sjts BOUGHTON, GANNON, WARREN and BROWN.

Friday 2 Feb

- 0830 7 NCOs march out again to attend school at WONGABEL. Div engineers have erected a pontoon bridge across the MILISTREAM.

It must be realised that the manpower situation in Australia is not improving, and consequently a further reduction in the amount of these items available for purchase by personnel through AACS may be anticipated.
- 2. It is intended that the full distribution of tobacco and cigarettes by / CS in forward operational areas and by the ACF in their periodical distribution of parcels and in embarkation kits will continue.
- 3. The ration scale which is at present operative is as follows:

22 ozs tobacco and 15 cigarettes per man per week, less 10% for non-smokers.
