1. CORRECT CHANNELS OF COMMAND

Several instances have arisen of units and sub-units of arms and services operating in an area of responsibility of a formation or unit, receiving orders direct from parent HQ, on matters calling for action by the HQ of the formation or unit responsible for the area.

This is a direct contravention of principles of command laid down in FSRs Vol I and the expressed policy of GOC 9 Aust Div, and will cease immediately.

Comds of Arms and Heads of Services will take necessary implementing action on this instruction, and formations or units responsible for specific areas as detailed by this HQ, will report by signal any future breaches of this instruction giving brief relevant details.

2. DRAINS

1. CONSERVATION OF RUBBER - CRUDE AND SYNTHETIC TYRES

- (i) This order will be read in conjunction with GRO O 167/44
- (ii) Tyres in use in the field are now both of crude and synthetic construction and, as tyres of synthetic construction are far more susceptible to failure through abuse than tyres constructed from natural rubber, their introduction into the service has made it more imperative than ever that all instructions for care and maintenance of pneumatic tyres be strictly observed.
- (iii) All concerned will, therefore -
- (a) exercise the utmost care to avoid all forms of tyre abuse the principal of which are -
- overloading
 - under inflation
 - incorrect fitting of tyres
 - harsh braking
 - fierce acceleration
 - speeds exceeding those laid down in GRO Q340/44
 - driving over obstructions and other causes of severe impact;
- (b) check wheel alignment frequently and correct irregularities promptly;
- (c) ensure that tyres are "changed around" periodically in accordance with current instructions;
- (d) remove stones and flint from tyres during unit maintenance;
- (e) submit tyres for replacement at the correct stage for recapping, and
- (f) submit damaged tyres for repair without delay.
- (iv) Formations and units will ensure that prompt disciplinary action is taken where breaches of this order occur
- (v) Clauses (a) and (f) of para 3 above may be waived on the special authority of formation commanders in the assault and early developmental stages in new operational areas, during the period in which replacement or repair is not practicable nor expedient or in which replacement tyres and repair facilities are not immediately available. In such cases, worn or damaged tyres

may if considered necessary, be run to destruction.

1. JAPANESE PERSONNEL

1. Disarmed Japanese personnel will be referred to merely as "Japanese" of the appropriate category e.g. Japanese soldiers, Japanese civilians etc, and NOT as PW.
2. In the same way, camps and compounds in which Japanese are, will be known as Surrender and NOT PW camps and compounds.
(9 Div RO Serial 76 No 394 of 9 Oct 45)

2. VENEREAL DISEASE (This order will be read out on two parades)

1. Many cases of venereal disease contracted in BORNEO have proved very resistant to treatment, and others have developed complications several weeks after infection. Complete cure of certain types of VD contracted in this area cannot be guaranteed even after prolonged treatment. Every case of venereal disease will be kept under observation for at least four weeks after cessation of active treatment, and will have a blood test at the end of that period.
2. In NO circumstances will personnel who have contracted venereal disease be permitted to leave this area until their four weeks' observation is completed and their blood test is clear.
3. Concealment of venereal disease is a punishable offence. Personnel about to return to Australia will be subject to medical inspection and if found to be suffering from venereal disease disciplinary action will be taken against them and they will NOT be allowed to leave BORNEO until their treatment and four weeks' observation are completed and their blood test is clear.

1. TOBACCO RATION

1. 9 Div Routine Order 391 of 2 Oct is cancelled.
2. As from 15 Oct 45 the weekly ration of tobacco which may be purchased through AACs will be as follows.
2 ozs tobacco and 35 cigarettes. (9 Div RO Ser 78 No 409)

2. VENEREAL DISEASE

1. Reference 9 Div RO 400 para 1.
2. On return to units from hospital of personnel who have been suffering from VD, action will be taken by units to confine all such personnel to unit lines for a period of four weeks. The object of this order is to prevent possibility of further sexual intercourse by these personnel during their period of observation. (9 Div RO Ser 79 No 411)

3. DEMOBILISATION OF THE AMF

1. Advice has been received from HQ AMF that many members are applying for medical boards upon totally inadequate grounds, in the belief that failure to record a repatriation claim during process of release from the AMF, will jeopardise any future claims.
2. The Repatriation Department has stated that there is no time limit within which a repatriation claim must be made, whether the claim be made for pension or treatment or both. Such an application may be made at any time after discharge.
3. Excessive numbers of unnecessary claims will delay demobilization procedure and to prevent such an occurrence it is essential that all personnel be fully informed of the situation. (Extract 9 Div RO Ser 79 No 413)

4. PURCHASE OF FOOD FROM NATIVES BY AMF AND RAAF

1. 9 Div RO 178 of 20 Jun 45 and references to this order appearing in 9 Div RO ser 292 and 406 are cancelled.
2. An official price list for all foodstuffs which are sold by civilians will be produced by BECAU to the Force Comd in each area who will give such price list wide circulation.
3. It will be an offence for any unit or person to purchase any foodstuffs from any civilian at any price other than that stipulated in the official price list for the area in which the purchase is made.

4. Straits Settlements currency will be used in making purchase from civilians. Barter of goods with civilians is prohibited.

5. SPEED LIMIT - BEAUFORT -PAPAR

The speed limit on all rds in the BEAUFORT and PAPAR areas is 15 mph. Disciplinary action will be taken against drivers disobeying this order.

All guards on duty at surrender and prison compounds or in charge of Japanese working parties will be correctly dressed, smart and soldierly in their bearing. Compliments will be paid to all AMF officers.

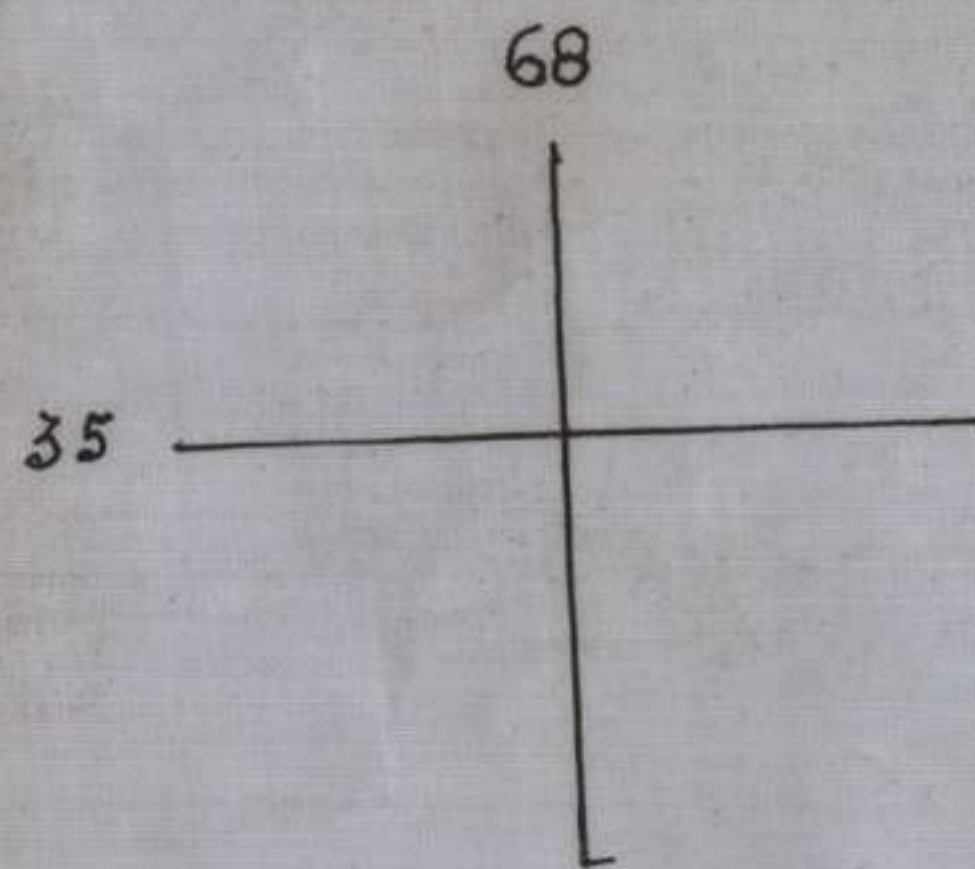

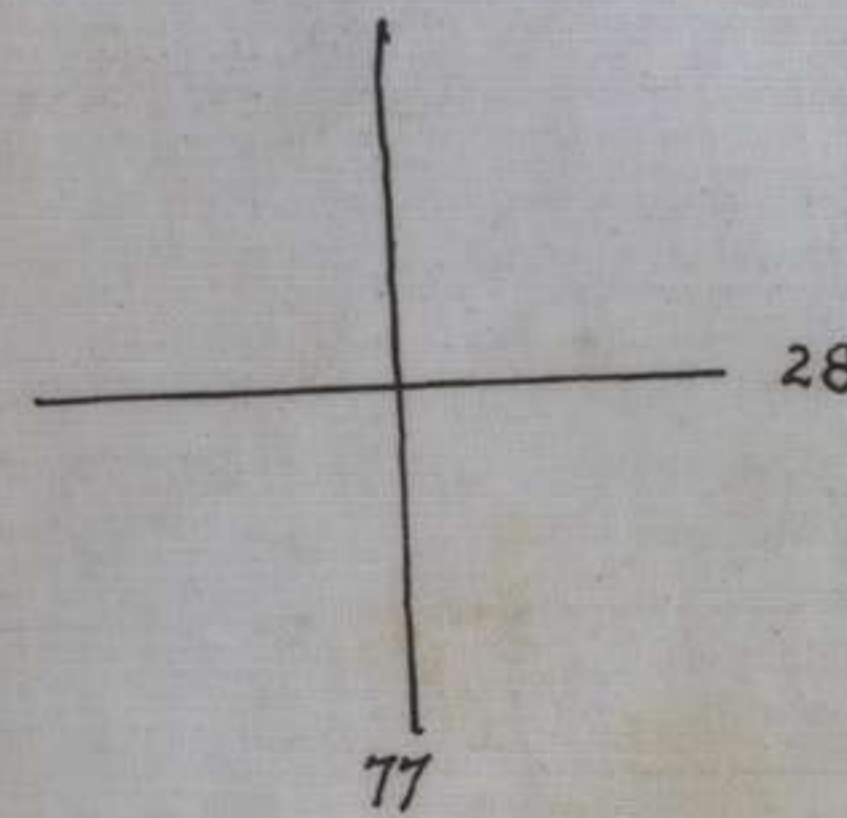
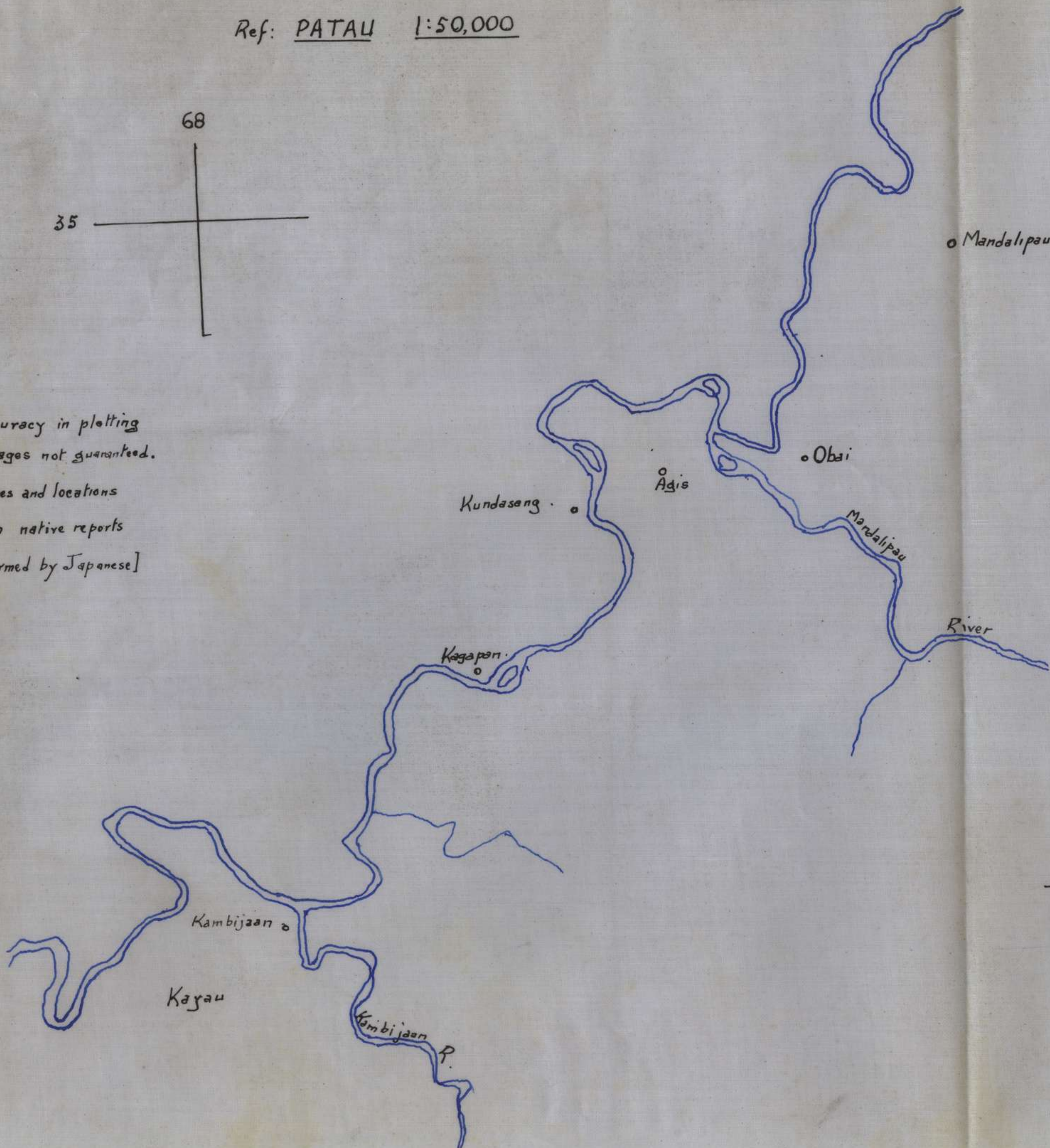

Mr Bladwell

This will be handed to you by Kurupon, headman of Kg KIEDOAN. He arrived here 81500 via KINARUT. He states that on the 7th 9 Japs (3 armed with rifles) entered his village, stole food, shot some buffaloes and fired on a villager without effect. The Japs were still in the village at midday 7 th.

From questioning through an interpreter, it appears that KIEDOAN is half a days journey from MANDALAPAU and further up the PAPAR River. As he has never heard of PATAU this seems a bit vague. Apparently he does not know the track from MANDALAPAU to his village.

The CO has been informed and ordered the infm to be sent you in this manner. Kurupon agreed with reluctance. (His idea was to give him rifles to do over the Japs).

Possibly the Jap officer in charge can give you infm re stray Japs.

1. EXTERNAL QUARANTINE - ANIMALS - TROOPS RETURNING TO AUSTRALIA

1. Subtended is a copy of LHQ memo 136004 of 15 Oct 45 relating to the abovementioned matter for infm and necessary action -

" GPO53/45 and LHQ 110865 of 27 Aug 45 have been issued on the above and I require strict compliance with the orders in these two publications.

Articles have appeared in "Salt" explaining the reasons for these orders and the booklet entitled "Mascot Menace" is in course of publication for distribution to troops outside the mainland to impress on them the necessity for strict compliance with orders and instructions regarding animal etc. quarantine.

I cannot stress too highly the danger to Australian agriculture and to Australian health of disregard of these orders. The following diseases which do not occur in Australia exist in the Indies and Asiatic territories and as there was no quarantine restrictions observed by the Japanese during occupation of New Guinea and the Solomons, it must be assumed that such diseases are likely to exist there also. In some cases the recurrence of the diseases have been known in Australia. These have in most cases been traced to disregard of quarantine regulations and their spread has been obviated by action taken by the Health Department.

Anthrax	Most Mammals	Transmitted by direct infection. A few cases have occurred in Australia.
Glanders	Horses, donkeys etc	Method of transmission by direct infection. No cases known in Australia.
Psittacosis	Wild birds, chiefly parrots	Method of transmission by direct infection. Few cases have occurred in Australia.

Rabies	Dogs, monkeys and other mammals	Known also as hydrophobia. Has not occurred in Australia. Method of transmission direct infection.
Tularemia	Squirrels	Method of transmission direct infection. Not known in Aust.
Equine Enceph- alomyelitis	Horses, donkeys etc	Transmitted by mosquitoes and ticks. Not known in Aust.
Distomiasis	Cats, dogs and pigs.	Not known in Aust. Transmitted by medium of crabs and snails.
Leptospirosis (Weil's disease)	Dogs and cats.	Transmitted per medium of bats. Some cases have occurred in Aust.

All the above diseases are transmissible to human beings.

Foot and mouth disease and Rinderpest	Sattle	Transmitted by direct infection. Has not occurred in Australia.
Dourine	Horses, donkeys etc	Mode of transmission by Coitus. Has not occurred in Australia.
Swine fever	Pigs	Direct infection. Has not occurred in Australia.
Fowl Pest	Birds	By direct infection. Has not occurred in Australia.

Where the term "Direct Infection" is used in the Remarks column it means disease is transmitted only by direct contact, but also by contamination material such as horns, hides, meat, droppings etc.

In addition to the above diseases which do not present a complete list, there are numerous ticks, insects, plant diseases and noxious weeds in the territories concerned which do not exist in Australia and against which Australian plants, animals and human beings have not acquired immunity.

The spread of the Rabbit, Lantana, Gorse, Briar and Prickly Pear in Aust are instances of what can happen after the introduction of animal or vegetable pests even in small quantities.

All ranks are to be informed of the dangers involved in bringing back to Australia as curios or mascots any of the articles mentioned in the GRO and I desire that you impress on all officers the necessity for the strictest policing of this GRO whenever embarkation or disembarkation of personnel under their control or command takes place.

1. Indiscriminate dumping of refuse of all types is increasing rapidly particularly along FOX Rd and McARTHUR Rd LABUAN.

3. Attention is drawn to the great increase of rats in the area. Apart from their destructive action on food and equipt, rats are carriers of diseases such as Murine Typhus, Weil's Disease and intestinal diseases etc.
4. Continuous supervision will be exercised by all concerned.
5. Incinerated garbage will only be dumped at rubbish dump in FOX Rd which is clearly signposted.

1. VENERAL DISEASE

1. Experience in BORNEO leaves no doubt that non-specific urethritis is acquired in the same manner as gonorrhoea and other venereal diseases.
2. For this reason all instrs concerning venereal disease published in 9 Aust Div ROs 400 and 411 will be taken to apply to cases of non-specific urethritis.

2. AAF G2

1. In future where AAF G2s that do not correctly and fully state the nature of the duty on which the vehicle is engaged are issued to drivers, the officer or NCO issuing the AAF G2 will be charged under AA Sec 40 with neglect of duty.

3. PROHIBITED AREA - TANK FIRM INSTALLATIONS AND FUEL JETTY (FRANKLIN WHARF)

1. Despite notices prominently displayed that this area is "OUT OF BOUNDS" to all ranks, the practice of using this area as a short cut to and from unit lines is becoming increasingly prevalent. In addition many personnel disregard the order prohibiting smoking thereby increasing the already high fire risk.
2. COs and OCs units will instruct personnel under their command that this area is out of bounds to all ranks, except those on duty. Personnel so engaged will observe at all times the fire precautions laid down.

3. Severe disciplinary action will be taken against offenders.

4. VENERAL DISEASE

1. Medical inspection of all personnel will be carried out as under and all personnel found suffering from venereal disease or non-specific

- (a) Prior to mov from units either direct to ship or through LABUAN Details Depot - as directed by CO or OC unit as late as practicable prior to mov.
- (b) Prior to mov from LABUAN Details Depot - as directed by OC LABUAN Details Depot as late as practicable prior to mov.
- (c) En route to Australia by ship - as directed by OC Troops as late as practicable prior to arrival at first port of call in Australia. When personnel are found to be suffering from VD or non-specific urethritis at this inspection, action will be taken by OC Troops to notify Embarkation Med Offr at port of disembarkation in order that personnel concerned may be sent direct to a Special Hosp.

5. SOUVENIRS

1. A physical check of the kits of all personnel and unit stores will be made as under prior to shipment out of this area to ensure lethal weapons and souvenirs other than those specified as legitimate are not being concealed.

(a) Unit Stores - Under direction of CO or OC unit or unit cadre as late as practicable prior to movement.

(b) Personal Kits of AMF Personnel -

(i) Where units or portion thereof are moving direct from unit lines - under direction CO or OC unit.

(ii) Where personnel are to move through LABUAN Details Depot - under direction OC LABUAN Details Depot as late as is practicable prior to movement.

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ROUTINE ORDERSNO 487PART 1ABY CAPT J. M. HEADADM CMD 2/28 INF BN1. VENEREAL DISEASE

1. On discharge from hospital for RTU of a soldier who has been treated for VD or non-specific urethritis the CO of the hospital will notify direct the CO of the unit of which the soldier is a member the date on which such soldier is discharged from hospital and the disease for which he has been treated.
2. CO of the unit of which the soldier is a member will be responsible for keeping such records as are necessary and for ensuring :
 - (a) The soldier is NOT marched out from unit for return to Australia within one month from date on which he was discharged from hospital
 - (b) That necessary action is taken within the unit to ensure the soldier is kept within the unit camp area under observation for a period of one month from the date on which such soldier was discharged from hospital.

2. MAINTENANCE OF CLOTHING AND EQUIPMENT

1. No clothing, necessaries or equipment will be issued to any soldier except on the return to unit by the soldier of the article being replaced i.e. clothing, necessaries and equipment will only be issued on "one for one" basis. All US clothing and equipment so returned to unit will be passed to Salvage for disposal.
2. Weekly kit inspections will be carried out to ensure all personnel are correctly and fully clothed and equipped.
3. Any soldier found to be deficient any article of clothing, necessaries or equipment on such inspections will be charged with an offence under the appropriate section of AA.

4. Units will ensure that duplicate AAFs A102 are completed for all AACC personnel attached as soon as forms are available and duplicates forwarded to Catering Supervisor 9 Div.

5. PERSONNEL FAILING TO REPORT FOR MOVEMENT

1. Considerable difficulty is being experienced in tracing personnel who fail to report to LABUAN Details Depot after being granted authority for movement back to Australia or outside BRUNEI Bay Area.
2. In future, units will ensure that when authorities for movement are received from HQ 9 Div, personnel report in to LABUAN Details Depot within 7 days unless otherwise ordered. If the personnel concerned are no longer with the unit a signal will be sent to HQ 9 Div, repeated to all addressees shown in the original authority, stating date and reason for member's marching out.
3. When personnel for whom PASSAIR has been approved fail to report to LABUAN Details Depot within 7 days the authority for air movement will be automatically cancelled and personnel will be granted a new authority, with correspondingly delayed priority, on reporting in to the depot.

CAMP FIRE ORDERS1. ALARM

Any soldier detecting a fire in any building or tent will immediately give the alarm by shouting and take any steps possible to put out the fire and remove any records, stores, equipment etc, endangered, to a place of safety.

2. METHOD OF SOUNDING FIRE ALARM

(a) Coys will ensure that a gong and striker are set up outside each orderly room and all ranks are to be informed of the fire signal to be given thereby.

(b) Coys will ensure that the Adjt is notified by phone of the outbreak of fire as soon as it is discovered.

3. FIRE FIGHTING EQUIPMENT

Fire fighting equipment will be situated as follows -

(a) Fire buckets containing water and sand outside all stores, orderly rooms and in transport lines,

(b) Fire extinguishers - all vehicles.

4. FIRE PICQUET

On the fire alarm sounding, the fire picquet will proceed immediately to the scene of the fire. The NCO in charge of the fire picquet will take charge of fire fighting operations until the arrival of the OO.

5. ORDERLY OFFER

The OO on duty, on the fire alarm sounding, will proceed immediately to the scene of the fire and will take charge of fire fighting operations. The OO will inspect all fire fighting equipment during his tour of duty and will certify to that effect on his report.

6. PERSONNEL NOT ON DUTY

On fire alarm sounding all personnel not on duty will parade under coy arrangements. Parade will not be dismissed without authority of the OO.

7. MAINTENANCE OF FIRE FIGHTING EQUIPMENT

The NCO in charge of each office, store, tent etc, in the immediate vicinity of which fire fighting equipment is situated, is responsible for the daily inspection of water and sand buckets, fire extinguishers etc, and will ensure that they are properly filled and in their correct place at all times.. He will also, where provided, ensure that the fire gong is complete with striker.

8. USE OF FIRE FIGHTING EQUIPMENT

Fire alarm gongs, buckets, extinguishers etc, will not be used except for fire fighting purposes or removed from their proper location.

9. STORES, OFFICES AND TENTS

The NCO in charge of each store, office or tent will ensure that all personnel employed or billeted therein are conversant with fire orders and the position of fire fighting equipment.

10. LIGHTS

Unattended lighted lamps, lanterns or primus stoves will NOT be left in tents or buildings.

11. MATCHES AND CIGARETTE BUTTS

Owing to the inflammable nature of the tropic-proofing on tents etc, strict care must be taken in the disposal of lighted matches and cigarette butts.

12. OILED RAGS, COTTON WASTE ETC

Oiled rags, cotton waste etc will, under no circumstances, be allowed to remain lying about in tents or buildings but must be collected and burnt immediately after use.

13. PETROL, OILS, PAINTS ETC

Separate storage will be provided for these and will be marked, prohibiting the use of naked lights and smoking.

14. PROMULGATION

- (a) These orders will be promulgated to all ranks at regular intervals.
- (b) Each NCO in charge of picquet will read and promulgate these orders to his picquet and will ensure that they know the location of the fire fighting equipment.
- (c) Failure to obey these orders resulting in damage to Govt property renders the individual responsible liable to disciplinary action and payment for damage to Govt property.

1. DEMOBILIZATION - MOVEMENT TO AUST

1. The following points will be explained to all ranks :-

(a) Priority of mov of pers to Aust by air or sea is as follows :-

- (i) Pers on duty
- (ii) Compassionate and emergency leave
- (iii) Medical cases (subject to suitability of aircraft)
- (iv) Compassionate discharges, transfers and Occ Releases
- (v) Long service releases
- (vi) Pers for normal demob.

(b) Pers will be moved strictly in accordance with the above priority of categories, and in their individual priorities within each category.

(c) The calling forward of a draft into LABUAN Details Depot by this HQ does not necessarily mean that pers moved into the Depot will move out on the next ship.

(d) All pers, if any, except officers, for discharge on long service grounds in terms of our AG14/1/1239 of 25 Jul 45 will be moved by units into LABUAN Details Depot immediately they become available for mov. The names of any officers awaiting mov for discharge on long service grounds will be notified to this HQ by signal forthwith.

2. DEMOBILIZATION - BROKEN PERIODS OF FULL TIME WAR SERVICE

1. DO 46 (d) provides that members who rejoin the AMF after having been discharged in respect of a previous full time war service engagement or join the AMF after discharge in respect of a similar engagement in another service, will be credited with both periods of service provided that such previous service was acknowledged when the member entered into the latter engagement.

2. It is NOT necessary for members to have enlisted in AMF immediately on discharge from another service in order to have both periods of service taken into account.

3. MOV OF PERS INTO LABUAN DETAILS DEPOT

DISPOSAL OF SURPLUS STORES AND EQUIPMENT

INTRODUCTION

1 In the area controlled by Adv HQ AMF, there are large quantities of surplus military material, the disposal of which required urgent action. Material includes stores, supplies, equipment, plant, installations and other Army assets.

OBJECT

2 The object of this instruction is to define the policy for disposal of surplus material and to prescribe the procedure of disposal by formations and services.

AMF REQUIREMENTS

- 3 The AMF overall requirements in material will consist of :
- (a) Stores required for the AUST Forces for JAPAN
 - (b) Stores to be returned to AUSTRALIA for interim Army or post war Army use. These will be notified to formations through staff or service channels as they become known to Adv HQ AMF.
 - (c) Stores required by formations for maintenance in their respective areas up to the time of complete evacuation of the AMF from the area controlled by Adv HQ AMF.

AMF SURPLUSES

4 AMF surpluses will be all AUST Army material in the area controlled by Adv HQ AMF over and above the AMF requirements vide para 3 above.

PRIORITIES FOR DISPOSAL OF SURPLUSES

- 5 (a) Priority of disposals will be :-
- (i) ALFSEA
 - (ii) BBKAU
 - (iii) RNIA
 - (iv) BRITISH civil business organisations and private individuals through BBKAU.
 - (v) NICA
 - (vi) Dutch civil business organisations and private individuals through NICA.
- (b) The requirements of ALFSEA will at all times take first priority irrespective of the demands of other organisations.
- (c) In considering priorities due consideration will be given to the following facts :-
- (i) ALFSEA intends to restrict the taking over of stores to the LABUAN, BALIKPAPAN and MAKASSAR areas although circumstances may arise in which SEAC may require stores at present located in other areas.

- (ii) RNIA and NICA will most probably be the only buyers at TARAKAN and will also be interested in material in other areas in DUTCH BORNEO and NEI.

RESPONSIBILITY FOR DISPOSALS

- 6 (a) Disposal of surplus material as defined in para 4 above will commence immediately in all areas controlled by Adv HQ AMF, subject to the restrictions set out in para 9 below on the disposal of certain items of lend lease material, and in para 12(b) below relative to sales to civil business organisations and private individuals.
- (b) A Regional Manager of the Commonwealth Disposals Commission is being appointed at MOROTAI.
- (c) General supervision of disposals will be exercised by Adv HQ AMF per medium of a Disposals Committee which will consist of the following permanent members :-

Chairman - Col "Q" or in his absence AQMG (Maint)

Members - Reps of SD
Q (Maint)
Q (Mov)
CPM SWPA

Heads of services at Adv HQ AMF will act on the Disposals Committee as required.
The Disposals Committee will consider when necessary all queries raised by formations and services.

7. (a) Arms and Services will take immediate action to ascertain the requirements of the authorities listed in para 5(a) above and arrange issues on later repayment within the priorities laid down and within the restrictions imposed by paras 8, 9 and 12(b) below.
Issues on later repayment to BBCAU will be subject to approval of SEAC. ALFSEA requirements will be notified to formations by Adv HQ AMF.
- (b) Where the requirements of ALFSEA have not yet been notified to this HQ and/or services every care will be exercised that issues on later repayment are not made to other organisations without reference to Adv HQ AMF, except in cases where no doubt exists that ALFSEA will not require the material in question.
- (c) Prospective buyers of material may make application direct to this HQ and/or Heads of Arms and Services in their respective areas. In all cases applications will be made in writing.
- (d) Items of captured enemy equipment will not be sold or transferred without the approval of Adv HQ AMF.

APPLICATIONS FROM CIVIL BUSINESS ORGANISATIONS AND PRIVATE INDIVIDUALS

8. If applications are received from civil business organisations and private individuals they will be referred to BBCAU who will purchase from AMF on behalf of the prospective purchaser and effect resale to him within their own financial organisation.

In these cases it will be necessary to reach agreement on price before transfer is made. When doubt exists or in event of failure to reach agreement on price full details of the offer will be referred to Adv HQ AMF.

LEND LEASE MATERIAL

- 9 (a) Issues on later repayment of items of lend lease origin will be limited to ALFSEA and BBKAU.
- the transfer, disposal or sale of lend lease goods to DUTCH forces, NICA or other DUTCH purchasers is NOT authorised except by agreement and consent of US authorities
- (b) Should lend lease material be required by the DUTCH forces and DUTCH organisations mentioned in (a) above full particulars of the material will be forwarded to Adv HQ AMF who will take action through HQ AMF to obtain the necessary agreement of US authorities. Should the matter be one of operational urgency it will be clearly stated.
- (c) All issues on later repayment of lend lease material will be carefully documented in accordance with instructions contained in para 11 below and attached appendices.

10
after :-

To facilitate disposal of lend lease material remaining

- (a) Requirements of AMF, ALFSEA and BBKAU have been met, and
- (b) sales to DUTCH forces and other DUTCH organisations have been made under para 9(b) above, arms and services will forward schedules of remaining surpluses to Adv HQ AMF through service channels. These schedules will give the fullest possible description of the material but when dealing with small items the principle outlined in para 11(f) below may be followed.

DOCUMENTATION

- 11 (a) Issues on later repayment will be made on the transfer vouchers normally used by the respective services, in accordance with the procedure set out in Appendices "A" to "F" attached.
- (b) In all cases the designation of the transferee unit or organisation will be plainly entered on the voucher in block letters.
- (c) When stores of lend-lease origin are concerned in the transaction these will always be separately documented. In all cases two additional copies of the issue or transfer voucher will be prepared and forwarded, duly acquitted, to Adv HQ AMF who will pass one copy to AFWESPAC, and the other to HQ AMF.
- (d) It is appreciated that the origin or source (lend-lease or otherwise) may not be apparent in all cases but the principle will hold in general that, when lend-lease stores can be identified as such they must be dealt with as provided in this para.
- In the case of stores of dual origin the following rule will determine the procedure to be followed:
- When the main component is lend lease and accessories or attachments are of non-lend lease origin - Treat the store as a whole as lend lease.
- When the main component is non-lend lease - Treat the store as a whole as non-lend lease.
- (e) A list setting out the items of Ordnance stores, vehicles and ammunition of lend lease origin will be issued separately by Adv HQ AMF at an early date. The list will be applied in conjunction with the principle enumerated in para

11(d) above.

(f) When seeking authority to dispose of stores of lend lease origin, spare parts, and hand tools, small fittings and other similar items need not be itemised, but the quantities concerned will be indicated in terms of dead weight or measurement tonnages as may be appropriate.

(g) In all cases where equipment etc is sold to BBCAU for resale to business firms one additional copy of all transfer documents will be prepared. Where equipment is physically handed over direct to business firms at request of BBCAU transfer documents will be signed by the duly authorised representative of BBCAU as receiving the equipment etc on transfer and countersigned by the duly authorised representative of the business firm concerned. All documents will be passed through BBCAU and NOT direct to any business firm.

COSTING

12

(a) Costing of surpluses documented in accordance with para 11 above will NOT be done except as provided in sub para (b) to this para. Where the prospective purchaser organisation places any limitation on price or seeks a discount to cover expected wastage e.g. blown tins of foodstuffs, all documents will be endorsed accordingly and a statement by the service rep attached to the documents.

(b) Issues in later repayment will be effected without agreement as to price except in those cases where the buyer is a civil business organisation or private individual including cases where the sale is effected through BBCAU or NICA as provided in para 8 above.

(c) In respect of installations and major engr works, services will, in conjunction with CDC Regional Manager where practicable, estimate the approximate value as a basis for negotiation with the prospective purchasers. Issues on later repayment will then be effected as prescribed in para 11 above and the suggested price and offer of the purchasing organisation will be forwarded with vouchers to Adv HQ AMF.

DETAILED SERVICE PROCEDURE

13

(a) The following Appendices attached hereto set out the detailed procedure applicable to the respective services in order to effect issues on later repayment to the organisations listed in para 5(a) above. Formations will ensure that the detailed procedure as laid down in these Appendices is followed:

- Appendix "A" - Engrs
- Appendix "B" - Sigs
- Appendix "C" - Med
- Appendix "D" - ST
- Appendix "E" - Ord
- Appendix "F" - Print

(b) The following services will take special action as follows:

- (i) Canteen service - In areas which are being taken over

- (ii) by ALFSEA the Canteen Service will deal direct with NAAFI.
- (ii) Red Cross - Transactions will be effected only by Aust Red Cross reps in accordance with instructions from their HQ.

TRANSFER OF UNIT EQUIPMENT

14 In order to avoid delay in transfer which would be caused by the return to Ord etc depots of material available for inter unit transfer, action may be taken to effect transfers of material except supplies from units of AMF to units of BRITISH forces and also to units of other Allied forces provided such transfers come within the provisions of this instruction. The documentation for such direct inter-unit transfers will be as laid down in the appropriate appendix attached. Inter unit transfers will not be effected unless directed by this HQ or heads of arms and services.

REMAINING SURPLUSES

- 15 (a) When the requirements of the organisations listed in para 5(a) above have been satisfied heads of arms and services will advise Adv HQ AMF through service channels of all the remaining surpluses in their areas giving the fullest possible particulars of all items including DW and tons measurement.
- (b) In those cases where disposal of these remaining surpluses is a matter of urgency this HQ, on recommendation of heads of arms and services will appoint Boards of Survey and signal their recommendations to Adv HQ AMF who will signal authority for disposal.
- 16 (a) All remaining surpluses notified to Adv HQ AMF by heads of arms and services in accordance with para 15(a) above and not disposed of on the authority of that HQ, will be declared to CDC Regional Manager by Adv HQ AMF on the prescribed form for declaration of surpluses.
- (b) When a decision has been reached and communicated to this HQ that some or all of the remaining surpluses have no sales value in area and are not worth the cost of freight to other areas for disposal heads of arms and services will ensure that the following action is carried out :
 - (i) prior notification of intention to destroy will be given to the Commonwealth Audit Representative attached to this Formation.
 - (ii) stores will be destroyed in the presence of the local Service Finance Representative.
 - (iii) Stores will be written off charge from certificate of destruction signed by the officers in whose presence the stores were destroyed, such certificates to show reference to direction for destruction issued by CDC Regional Manager or Adv HQ AMF.
 - (iv) Copies of certificate of destruction will be dealt with in accordance with the service instructions in the attached appendices "A", "B", "C", "D" and "F" and DDOS Adv HQ AMF Instr 35 of 4 Dec issued separately.

SURPLUS RAE MATERIAL

1. RESPONSIBILITY

CRE 9 Aust Div will be responsible for the disposal of all RAE material surplus to the requirements of the AMF, in accordance with methods laid down herein.

2. AMF REQUIREMENTS AND SURPLUSES

(a) Requirements

AMF requirements are:-

- (i) Stores required for Aust Forces for JAPAN to be moved to MOROTAI, in accordance with instructions already issued through engineer channels.
- (ii) Stores required in each area until AMF are completely evacuated.
- (iii) Nil for post war army in Australia.

(b) Surpluses

(i) Engineer Stores incl Mech Eqpt

The quantities available for disposal will be the total holdings in each area, less requirements as in (a) above.

(ii) Works Installations

All installations, such as wharves, buildings, bulk oil depots, water supply, electric supply, roads etc will become surplus to AMF requirements and will be available for disposal.

3. PRIORITIES

(a) Priorities for disposal are as in para 5 (a) of the instr to which this appendix is attached. In making transfers, the CRE 9 Aust Div will ensure that these priorities are observed.

(b) ALFSEA requirements 9 Div area are being notified separately through service channels. These will comprise both material for local consumption, and material which may be shipped to SINGAPORE.

4. NEGOTIATIONS FOR TRANSFER

CRE 9 Div will deal with the requirements of the various organisations in accordance with para 3 (a) above. He should approach in order, the authorised representative of each organisation and explain to him what material is available for transfer. In any area where there is no representative of a particular organisation, it will be assumed that that organisation has a nil requirement, unless otherwise informed by this HQ.

5.

METHOD OF TRANSFER AND DOCUMENTATION

- (a) CRE 9 Div will be responsible that the RAE Depot prepares and distributes the forms AAF S27 as set out below, for all stores transferred. Each transaction will be made on the form AAF S27. Ten legible copies are normally required but in the case of transfer of items of lend lease origin, twelve legible copies will be required. In both cases two typings will be necessary. Attention is drawn to para 11 (g) of this instr.
- (b) Preparation of Form AAF S27
- (i) All copies of the form AAF S27, except No 10, or in case of lend lease items No 12, will be signed by the authorised representatives of both transferor and transferee.
- (ii) On the forms AAF S27, under the signature of the authorised officer signing for the receiving organisation, will be inserted, in BLOCK or type, the name of the officer and his appointment.
- (iii) In the space on the AAF S27, showing to whom consigned or transferred, will be put the full title of the organisation to which the transfer is made.
- (iv) Forms AAF S27 will be endorsed "Issued on Repayment".
- (v) On the form AAF S27, the wording under heading "RECEIPT FOR STORES" will be amended by the deletion of the words:-
 "Consignee to sign and return one (1) copy to consignor Dump" (for form revised Aug 44)
 and the words:-
 "On AAF S28 No....attached and have been taken on Ledger Charge". (for the forms as revised both in Aug 44 and Mar 45)
- (vi) The AAF S27 covering each transaction will be given a serial number prefixed by the letter "P", eg, P178, P179, P180 etc, to indicate that the transferee is an organisation outside the AMF. This serial number will be shown on all pages and all copies of the transfer voucher (AAF S27)
- (vii) The description of mech eqpt plant and machines will where applicable show make, model, serial number of machine and/or components.
- (viii) The condition of each item will be specified following its description on form AAF S27, as either "NEW" or if part worn the percentage of original life remaining as "...% OLR". Before a transfer is made, transferror and transferer will agree on this percentage of remaining (ix) life.
- (ix) Para 9 of the instructions refers to items of lend lease origin ie, items made in USA. For RAE this will apply only to mech eqpt and items of plant such as generators, pumps, engines, air compressors etc, and in some cases hand tools. Where a machine is of American origin or of composite Aust and American origin, the components of the machine which are of American origin will be shown on the AAF S27. Forexample description entries might read
 Autopatrol CATERPILLAR D12 Ser No.....Eng only made in USA
 Tractor Allis Chalmers HD7, Ser No..... with B/dozer blade and hydraulic power control unit. All made in USA.

Air compressor Ingersoll Rand Model 100A, Ser No....
 Engine only made in USA

5. METHOD OF TRANSFER AND DOCUMENTATION (Contd)

(c) Distribution of Form AAF S27

- i. Issuing Depot will distribute copies of forms AAF S27 as follows :-
 Forward three (3) copies to transferee including one (1) for forwarding by transferee to his paying authority and one (1) to be returned to transferor for Depot records.
 Forward six (6) copies to senior RAE officer in the area.
 Retain one (1) copy in depot as spare.
 For items of lend lease origin, the two (2) additional copies of Form AAF S27, mentioned in sub para 5 (a) above, will be forwarded to the senior RAE officer in the area.
- ii. The senior RAE officer will deal with the copies received as follows :-
 Forward immediately five (5), and in the case of lend lease items seven (7), copies to CE Adv HQ AMF.
 Retain one (1) copy for his records.
- iii. The senior RAE officer will send to CE, Adv HQ AMF, a monthly summary of Forms AAF S27 which were forwarded. This summary will show separately, the serial numbers of the forms AAF S27 for transfers to each organization, and will cover all transactions up to the 10th day of each month.
- iv. The CE, Adv HQ AMF, will deal with the copies received as follows :-

For items NOT of Lend Lease Origin

- Forward three (3) copies to CPM, Adv HQ AMF, incl one (1) copy for the Regional Manager, Commonwealth Disposals Commission, Adv HQ AMF.
 Forward one (1) copy to DGAD, HQ AMF.
 Retain one (1) copy for records and offsetting against ES STOCKS 62 return.

For items of Lend Lease Origin

- Forward three (3) copies to CPM, Adv HQ AMF incl one (1) copy for Regional Manager, Commonwealth Disposals Commission, Adv HQ AMF.
 Forward two (2) copies to DGAD, HQ AMF.
 Forward one (1) copy to AFWESPAC in accordance with para 9 (c) of this instruction.
 Retain one (1) copy for records and offsetting against ES STOCKS 62 return.

(d) Direct Transfers of Unit War Eqpt.

- i. In cases where items of unit war equipment are of engineer origin, it may be desirable, to expedite disposal, for the holding unit to transfer the item of equipment direct to the British, RNIA, or other unit requiring it. This will apply in particular to mechanical equipment and possibly other minor items, when the interim army AMF units are being relieved by the British or other forces.
- ii. If such transfers are effected the transferor unit will prepare and distribute forms AAF S27 as the issuing depot does in accordance with para 5, sub paras (a), (b) and (c) of this appendix.

6. MECHANICAL EQUIPMENT

Items of mechanical equipment transferred to an organization outside the AMF will be so recorded on the subsequent Mechanical Equipment Census Return. Items ear marked for transfer will be indicated on the appropriate Census Return.

7. REMAINING SURPLUSES

Surplus stores which cannot be transferred to one of the approved organizations, will be listed on a schedule, which will be forwarded to CE, Adv HQ AMF in accordance with para 15 of the instruction to which this is an appendix. CE will advise those concerned what to do with these remaining surpluses.

8. WRITE OFF PROCEDURE FOR STORES DESTROYED

(a) If destruction of the surplus stores referred to in para 7 above is approved, six copies of a certificate of destruction will be prepared, serially numbered in a special series commencing DD1, DD2 etc., and dealt with as follows :-

i. By Holding Depot

Forward five (5) copies to senior RAE officer in the area.

Retain one (1) copy at Depot for record purposes.

ii. By the senior RAE officer :-

Forward four (4) copies immediately to CE, Adv HQ AMF.

Retain one (1) copy for his records.

iii. By CE Adv HQ AMF - distribute as follows :-

Two (2) copies to CPM, Adv HQ AMF, incl one (1) copy for the Regional Manager, CDC, Adv HQ AMF.

One (1) copy to Det Army Audit Staff, Adv HQ AMF.

Retain one (1) copy for record purposes.

(b) The senior RAE officer will send to CE, Adv HQ AMF, a monthly summary of the serial numbers of the certificates forwarded, for all items of stores destroyed up to the 10th day of each month.

9. CLOSING OF DEPOTS

To close the depot when all stores have been disposed of, the following action will be taken by the depot operating unit :-

(a) Pack and despatch all essential records to CE, Adv HQ AMF.

(b) Prepare six copies of a certificate stating that all stores have been accounted for, records adjusted and the records forwarded to CE, Adv HQ AMF. The copies of this certificate will be distributed as follows :-

i. By Holding Depot -

Five (5) copies to senior RAE officer in the area.

Retain one (1) copy for unit records.

9. CLOSING OF DEPOTS (contd)

(b) (ii) By Senior R/AE Officer:-

Four (4) copies to CE, Adv HQ AMF.
Retain one (1) copy for record purposes.

(iii) By CE, Adv HQ AMF:-

One (1) copy to CPM, ADV HQ AMF.
One (1) copy to Det Army Audit Staff Adv HQ AMF
One (1) copy to E in C HQ AMF.
Retain one (1) copy for record purposes.

10. OTHER APPLICABLE INSTRUCTIONS

This appendix will supersede any other service instructions where they differ from it.

This appendix may be added to or amended in detail by subsequent service instructions.

DISPOSAL OF SURPLUS SIGNAL PROJECT STORES

RESPONSIBILITY

1. CO Sigs 9 Div will be responsible for disposal of all signal project stores surplus to the requirements of the AMF in accordance with the methods laid down herein.

2. AMF requirements and surpluses.

(a) Requirements

AMF requirements are :-

(i) MOROTAI - Stores required for issue to 26 Aust L of C Signals for shipment to JAPAN and maintenance requirements for Adv HQ AMF Sigs.

(ii) 9 DIV AREA - Maintenance requirements until the area is completely evacuated by AMF.

(b) Surpluses

(i) Total holdings of all Signal Project Stores held in Dumps or by Signal Units, less requirements vide (a) above.

(ii) Fixed Installations. All fixed telephone installations in areas under Command Adv HQ AMF.

3. PRIORITIES

Priorities for disposal are as in para 5 (a) of the Instruction to which this is an Appendix. These priorities must be observed.

4. NEGOTIATIONS FOR TRANSFER.

CO Sigs 9 Div will deal with requirements of the various organisations in accordance with para 3 above. He should approach in order, the authorised representative of each organisation and explain to him what material is available for transfer. In an area where there is no representative of a particular organisation, it will be assumed that that organisation has a nil requirement, unless otherwise informed by the headquarters.

5. METHOD OF TRANSFER AND DOCUMENTATION.

(a) CO Sigs 9 Div will be responsible for preparation and distribution of forms AAF S27 as set out below for all stores transferred. Each transaction will be made on form AAF S27. Ten legible copies are required, which will involve two typings. Attention is drawn to para 11(g) of this instruction.

(b) Preparation of Form AAF S27

(i) All copies of the form AAF S27, except No. 9, will be signed by the authorised representatives of both transferrer and transferee.

(ii) On the forms AAF S27, under the signature of the authorised officer signing for the receiving organisation, will be inserted, in BLOCK or type the name of the officer and his appointment.

(2)

- (iii) In the space on the AAF S27 showing to whom consigned or transferred, will be put the full title of the organisation to which the transfer is made.
- (iv) Forms AAF S27 will be headed "Signal Project Stores" and endorsed "Issued on Repayment".
- (v) On the Form AAF S27 the wording under heading "Receipt for Stores" will be amended by the deletion of the words:-
'Consignee to sign and return one (1) copy to
Consignor Dump'
and the words:-
'On AAF S27 ... attached and have been taken on
Ledger Charge'
- (vi) The AAF S27 covering each transaction will be given a serial number prefixed by the letter "P" to indicate that the transferee is an organisation outside the AMF, viz P178, P179, P180, etc. This serial number will be shown on all pages and all copies of the transfer voucher (AAF S27).
- (vii) The condition of each item will be specified following its description on form AAF S27 as either "NEW", or if part worn, the percentage of original life remaining as "...% OLR". The percentage of remaining life will be assessed by a panel consisting of the transferor, the transferee and an AEME representative.

(c) Distribution of Form AAF S27

- (i) Issuing Unit or Dump will distribute copies of forms AAF S27 as follows:-

Two copies to transferee, one for retention and one for forwarding by transferee to his paying authority.

One copy to transferor for Unit or Dump records.

Six copies to A/SO in C, Adv HQ AMF.

One copy (No. 9) to be retained as a spare.

- (ii) A/SO in C, Adv HQ AMF will distribute the six copies as follows:-

One copy to be retained for records and offsetting against stock returns.

Two copies to CPM, Ad HQ AMF.

One copy to CPM for Regional Manager, Commonwealth Disposals Commission, Adv HQ AMF.

One copy to DGAD.

One copy to Signal Officer in Chief, HQ AMF for information.

6. REMAINING SURPLUSES

Surplus stores which cannot be transferred to one of the approved organisations will be listed on a schedule which will be forwarded to A/SO in C, Adv HQ AMF, in accordance with para 15 of the Instruction to which this is an Appendix. A/SO in C will advise those concerned re disposal of these remainders.

7. WRITE-OFF PROCEDURE FOR STORES DESTROYED

- (a) The procedure for the disposal of surplus stores that cannot be disposed of in the area, and are not worth while shipping to AUSTRALIA, is set out in para 10 of the Instruction to which this is an Appendix.

(3)

(b) If destruction of these surplus stores is approved, five copies of a certificate of destruction will be prepared, serially numbered in a special series commencing DDL, DD2, etc, and will be dealt with as follows:-

(i) By holding Unit or Dump

Four copies to A/SO in C, Adv HQ AMF.

One copy to be held at Depot for record purposes.

(ii) By A/SO in C, Adv HQ AMF - distribute as follows:-

One copy to CPM for Regional Manager, CDC, Adv HQ AMF.

One copy to CPM, Adv HQ AMF.

One copy to Det Army Audit Staff, Adv HQ AMF.

One copy to be held for record purposes.

8. CLOSING OF DEPOTS

When all surplus stores have been disposed of, the following action will be taken by the Unit or Dump concerned:-

(a) Pack and despatch all essential records to A/SO in C, Adv HQ AMF.

(b) Prepare five copies of a certificate, stating that all stores have been accounted for, records adjusted, and the records forwarded to A/SO in C, Adv HQ AMF. The copies of this certificate will be distributed as follows:-

(i) By the Unit or Dump concerned:

Four copies to A/SO in C, Adv HQ, AMF.

One copy to be held for Unit or Dump records.

(ii) By A/SO in C, Adv HQ AMF:

One copy to CPM, Adv HQ AMF.

One copy to Det Army Audit Staff, Adv HQ AMF.

One copy to SO in C, HQ AMF.

One copy to be held for record purposes.

9. No attempt will be made to cost stores or installations locally but any relative data which will assist subsequent costing will be included on form AAF S27.

10. Any request by an approved organisation for Signal Project Stores in excess of local surpluses will be notified to A/SO in C, Adv HQ AMF.

11. The procedure detailed in this Appendix applies to Signal Project Stores and Fixed Signal installation only. Ordnance items of signal equipment will be dealt with by ADOS in accordance with the Appendix for Ordnance Stores.

12. AMENDMENTS

This Appendix may be amended in detail by subsequent service instructions.

SURPLUS
DISPOSAL OF MEDICAL EQUIPMENT

1. Responsibility

The ADMS 9 Aust Div will be responsible for the disposal of all surplus medical equipment and stores held by Depots and Med Units as follows:-

2. AMF requirements locally will be:-

(a) Stores for Aust Forces in each area will personnel are completely evacuated.

(b) WOV Medical Stores for all ships carrying troops inter island and to the mainland.

3. Disposals by repayment voucher to ALFSEA, BBCAU, NICA etc will be as follows:-

LABUAN. ALFSEA will take all stocks held by 109 Adv Dep Med Stores and medical equipment of 2/4 and 2/6 Gen Hosps (2/6 Gen Hosp equipment is held by the depot as a separately packed scale).

4. AMF requirements as outlined in para 2 above will be strictly enforced. Disposal of stores not covered in para 3 will be in accordance with priorities set down in the Adm Instrn to which this is an appendix. ADMS 9 Aust Div will be responsible that these instructions are carried out.

5. All unserviceable stores are to be written off as directed in earlier service instructions.

6. Should ALFSEA advise at a later date that certain items now held at LABUAN are not required by them such items are to be listed to DDGMS Adv HQ AMF provided that they cannot be disposed of to BBCAU, NICA etc in order of priority.

7. Method of Documentation of Transfers

(a) "Issue on Repayment Vouchers" are to be used in all cases as in the past except that 10 copies will be made in future, for distribution as follows:-

one copy retained by issuing depot
two copies to transferee unit, organisation or service (one for forwarding to its superior authority),
three copies to SMO formation (who forwards two to Adv HQ AMF),
three copies to Chief Paymaster (one for CDC),
one copy to DDGMS Adv HQ AMF (for DGAD)
Attention is drawn to para 11(g) of this instrn.

(b) Where a unit other than AMF desires to obtain medical stores and/or equipment held by an adjacent AMF unit, the AMF unit after completion of inventories will obtain an acquittance from the local Depot Med Stores which will issue repayment vouchers in the normal manner to cover the items transferred.

8. Should it become necessary to destroy surplus medical stores which are not required by ALFSEA or any other service or organisation, the following procedure will be adopted:-

(2)

(a) A Board of Survey will be convened and will consist of a President and two other members one of which will be a representative of Finance Branch.

(b) Stores for destruction will be listed on AAF 27 and after authority has been obtained from Adv HQ AMF, write-off vouchers AAF D51 will be prepared, each copy signed by members of the Board and distributed as follows:-

2 copies to Chief Paymaster Adv HQ AMF
1 copy to Chief Audit Staff.

(c) Destruction of stores will be carried out in the presence of a member of Finance Branch.

9. Difficulties or queries which might arise in relation to procedure etc will be referred to Adv HQ AMF if they cannot be solved locally.

10. These instructions will supersede previous service instructions should they conflict.

AASC SUPPLIES : DISPOSALS

1. In consequence of the withdrawal of AMF troops from various areas, it has become necessary to dispose of AASC Supplies/POL which become surplus. In addition there are certain items now held in areas which are in excess of future AMF requirements.

2. The order of priority of the various organisations and administrations to whom declared surpluses may be disposed of, subject to DDST Adv HQ AMF approval, is as follows:-

3. As supplies/POL become surplus to requirements from time to time, the senior AASC representative in the area will contact the local HQ of the above organisation and administrations, where they exist, with a view to ascertaining whether such organisations/administrations are prepared to take over the surpluses. Applications must be made in writing as no verbal offers can be entertained.

The information thus obtained will be forwarded to DDST, Adv HQ AMF, together with a schedule of commodities and quantities which have become surplus. To assist in disposal, in accordance with priority, it is requested that information regarding prospective purchasers be furnished as per the following example -

Where local HQ of the above organisations are prepared to take over portion only of the surpluses, details of the commodities and quantities required will be shown on the schedule.

Supplies will not be handed over without prior approval of DDST Adv HQ AMF.

4. Adv HQ AMF will decide to whom the surpluses may be disposed of and instructions will be issued accordingly through Service Channels.

5. Where it becomes evident that portion or all of the supplies etc remaining on charge at the date of withdrawal of the AMF, cannot be disposed of to other administrations/organisations (as above) CASC 9 Div will advise DDST Adv HQ AMF of the commodities and quantities concerned.

On receipt of this information, DDST will arrange to:

- (a) Transfer the surpluses elsewhere
- or
- (b) Obtain approval for the destruction of the supplies from CDC.

In respect to (b), the CDC authority for destruction will be advised to CASC 9 Div with the necessary direction.

It will be ensured that the local Chief Paymaster's representative will be present at and witness the destruction. The CPM's representative and the Supply Officer will sign the certificate of destruction on a Condemnation Certificate (AAF 735) which will be prepared in the normal manner. Adjustment of ledgers will be made per medium of Discrepancy Voucher (AAF F 44), which will be dealt with in accordance with current instructions.

6. All issues will be made on a repayment basis and AAFs F 79 will be prepared and endorsed "DISPOSALS", as well as the authority for issue. A separate register of AAFs F79 will be opened for the specific purpose of recording F 79's covering Disposals.

Costing of AAFs F79 will be the responsibility of the chief Finance Officer, who will raise the necessary debits from information supplied.

Distribution of AAFs F79 will be made as under and all copies will be receipted by the purchaser.

- 1 Transferee - This copy to be receipted and returned to Supply Officer
- 2 Transferee - For retention
- 3 Transfer ee - This copy to be endorsed - For forwarding to Transferee's Finance and Accounting HQ responsible for payment.

- 6 " (For DGAD)
- 7 " (For DST)
- 8 " (For Chief Paymaster for transmission to CDC Regional Manager)
- 9 " (DDST File)
- 10 " (For Chief Auditor)

It will be ensured that the signature, rank and appointment of the receiving officer is clear and legible, as well as the name of the purchasing authority. These details, will be inserted in block letter below the signature.

Attention is drawn to para 11(g) of this matter.

7. When information is received to the effect that all AMF troops will be withdrawn from an area, Supply Officers concerned will calculate the ration commodities and quantities required to complete the rationing of the Force up to and including the date of embarkation, plus any voyage and/or landing rations required.

Supplies (incl POL) in excess of requirements will be subject to the same procedure as in para 2, 3, 4, and 5 above. Details of excesses will be advised to DDST, Adv HQ AMF as early as possible.

8. It will be clearly understood that the foregoing does not in any way prejudice the responsibilities of the AMF in rationing certain Allied Forces etc.

AASC Supplies disposed of as surplus to requirements are separate and distinct from the normal issues on repayment, which will continue to be accounted for, in accordance with current procedure.

DISPOSAL OF SURPLUS ORDNANCE STORES

1. Ordnance stores may be disposed of to purchasers in two distinct ways, which are :

- (a) By issues on repayment from Ordnance Depot, Veh Pk, etc stocks to purchasing organisations.
- (b) By transfers on repayment direct from units to purchasing organisations.

2. The procedure detailed hereunder will apply in each case and those procedures already in operation will be modified accordingly. Current procedures are set out in the following Ordnance Service Instructions :

(Any other Ordnance Service Instructions which have been issued from HQ of Subordinate Formations in implementation of the DDOS Instructions referred to will be adjusted in conformity).

3. Initiation of Requests for Sales of Stores and Approval for Action.

Requests for sale of stores may take either of the following forms :

- (a) A formally prepared indent.
- (b) A bid, or expression of desire to purchase stores made in writing.

4. In either case the requirement is to be clearly stated in unequivocal language, and the document concerned will be duly authenticated and signed by a responsible officer of the organisation desiring to make the purchase. This officer will be referred to as an Ordering Officer.

5. ADOS 9 Div will arrange with each of the organisations with whom the Ordnance service is authorised to transact business for the appointment or designation of mutually recognised Ordering Officers. Requests for stores emanating from other than these Ordering Officers will be acted upon only after their authenticity has been established beyond question by specific enquiry.

6. ADOS 9 Div will arrange with Ordering Officers that their requests whether submitted as formal indents or not, are made in triplicate.

7. All requests for Ordnance stores will be passed direct to the senior OS representative in the formation area concerned.

8. ADOS 9 Div will scrutinise all requests, and decide the extent to which they can be met from the resources under his control taking into consideration any local requirements and any service instructions he may have received on the subject. If he is in doubt as to whether he should make the stores concerned available he will refer the matter by fastest means to DDOS Adv HQ AMF for decision.

9. ADOS 9 Div will decide the source from which the stores are to be provided. He will arrange for stores in unit hands to be disposed of in preference to depot stocks, in the absence of any factor rendering this course undesirable. He will obtain 'Q' approval for transfer of stores from units, but will control sales from depot stocks without the necessity of Staff approval.

10. Where requests are made for stores available in limited quantities only, ADOS 9 Div will be guided in his allocation by the general priorities laid down in the main Adm Instr to which this is an Appendix.

11. Approval of DDOS Adv HQ AMF must be obtained for the sale of articles obviously of Lend Lease origin. Such sales must be documented separately and the documents will be clearly enfacéd "LEND LEASE ORIGIN".

PROCEDURE

Procedure to be followed in case of issue on repayment from stocks held in Ordnance depots and Veh Pks (other THAN RSDs)

12. ADOS 9 Div will pass the duly approved indent (or equivalent) to the Ordnance installation for issue action.

13. The installation concerned will take normal action, as for an issue on repayment except that four extra copies of the issue voucher (on AF G982D) will be prepared. These will be clearly numbered '7', '8', '9' and '10', the existing numbers being clearly barred out in coloured pencil. All ten copies must be legible.

14. The depot will hand over the goods to the purchaser only in accordance with arrangements made by the senior Ordnance representative concerned. Receipts for the stores will be secured on the spot at time of delivery on copies 3,5,7,8,9 and 10.

15. All receipts will be in the form of an acquittal of the copies of the vouchers specified, by an officer mutually recognised by the senior OS representative concerned and the organisation purchasing as empowered to sign receipts.

16. It is vitally important that this officer be required to sign clearly, and that details of his appointment and authority should be shown in BLOCK LETTERS or by an official stamp. It is upon the due authentication of the receipted issue voucher that settlement will depend in the last analysis.

17. The issuing depot will NEVER hand over stores without simultaneously securing the receipts referred to and the receipts will be countersigned by the person giving delivery. Discrepancies will be adjusted on the spot, any necessary alterations to vouchers being initialled on all copies by the representative of the depot and of the purchaser.

18. To enable the foregoing to be implemented in a regular and systematic manner all installations concerned will organise and operate a separate transit shed as part of their outward traffic organisation, and will arrange for this to be used solely in connection with the disposals made in accordance with this instruction.

19. Staff assigned for duties in this transit organisation and in documentation of issues on repayment will be changed as little as possible and will operate as a disposals cell, independent of other installation activities.

20. Documentation and Raising of Debits

This will be in general as laid down in DOS circular No 86/45 but the following action will be taken in respect of the ultimate disposal of acquitted vouchers :-

- (a) No 6 copy - will be passed to ADOS 9 Div as usual, en faced by the depot with the reference to the AAF F34 serial number. ADOS 9 Div will file with the original indent etc. He will despatch both indent and Nos 6 copies finalized, under cover of a schedule of control and serial numbers, to DDOS Adv HQ AMF weekly.
- (b) Nos 7, 8 and 10 copies - will be passed to Chief Paymaster AIF SWPA or to his local representative together with the AAFs F34 covering the transaction. Copies will be noted clearly with the serial number of the AAFs F34 concerned.
The Chief Paymaster AIF SWPA will accept responsibility for the forwarding of financial documents and the No 7 copy to HQ AMF for final pricing and raising of debit, and will also pass the No 8 copy to the Regional Manager CDC concerned for his records.
- (c) The receipted No 9 copy countersigned by a depot representative certifying delivery will be despatched via ADOS 9 Div to the Ordering Officer of the organisation purchasing stores.

21. Final distribution of AFs G982D will then be

- No 1 Retained depot - normal use
- 2 " " " "
- 3 " " accounting copy
- 4 Accompanies stores as usual - retained by purchaser
- 5 Traffic receipt copy - retained by depot
- 6 To DDOS Adv HQ AMF via ~~senior~~ OS representative
- 7 To HQ AMF with AAFs F34 via Chief Paymaster AIF SWPA
- 8 To Regional Manager CDC " " " " "
- 9 To purchaser via senior OS representative. Purchaser is expected to notify his superior HQ of this transaction by onforwarding this copy.
- 10 To Adv HQ AMF for Chief Paymaster AIF SWPA.

Attention is drawn to para 11 (g) of this Instr.

22. ADOS 9 Div is responsible for ensuring that all transactions are finalized with as little delay as possible. For this purpose he will communicate direct with the OO or NCO i/c disposals cell.

23. DDOS Adv HQ AMF will in the case of sales to RNIA forward the No 6 copies of issue vouchers received by him to HQ RNIA in accordance with DOS circular 103/45. He will retain a record of indent, control and AAFs F34 Nos in respect of all transactions so dealt with.

Procedure to be followed in the case of transfer on repayment direct from units of the AMF to purchasing organisations

24. Transfers will be effected by use of AFs G1033 used in accordance with GRO 232/44 but with the procedure set out therein modified as set out below.

25. When ADOS 9 Div, with Staff concurrence decides that stores are to be transferred on repayment from unit holdings, he will inform the unit concerned of the stores required to be prepared for transfer by forwarding one copy of the original indent etc or an extract thereof under cover of a memo giving details of the place and time at which the equipment will be required to be ready for inspection and transfer.

26. Units upon receipt of this advice will at once take action as follows :-

(a) Prepare AFs G1033, (ten clearly numbered legible copies) in respect of the stores concerned.

(b) In the case of technical stores and vehicles, arrange with EME for inspection of stores etc concerned and the furnishing of sufficient copies of the appropriate inspection certificates to provide 3 copies for use as set out below.

(c) Advise ADOS 9 Div without delay of any inabilities.

27. Units concerned will pass copies 1,2,3,4,6,7,8,9 and 10 to senior OS representative.

28. ADOS 9 Div will register, scrutinise and approve the AFs G1033 and will dispose of them as follows :-

Copies Nos 1,2,3,6,7,8,9,10 - return to transferor unit
Copy No 4 - retained by senior OS representative as his 'Watch' copy.

29. When the transfer is carried out the vouchers will be treated as follows :-

Copies Nos 1 and 9 - (with one copy of the inspection certificate attached) will be retained by the transferee organisation (which is expected to pass the No 9 copy, together with the inspection certificate, when applicable, to its superior HQ, as an advice of the transaction).

Copy No 2 - will be retained by transferor unit to support its account.

Copies 3,6,7,8 and 10 with two copies of the inspection certificate (when applicable) will be passed to senior OS representative.

30. ADOS 9 Div will -

(a) Retain copy No 7 for adjustment of unit accounts.

(b) Pass copies 3,6,8 and 10 and both copies of the inspection certificate (when applicable) to the local Ordnance depot for action to complete the documentation necessary to raise the appropriate debit.

31. The Ordnance depot will complete the documentation, noting on all four copies of the AF G1033 the serial number of the corresponding AAF F34, and will then

(a) Pass copy Nos 3,8 and 10 with the corresponding AAFs F34 and both copies of the inspection certificates (when applicable) to the Chief Paymaster or his appointed representative.

(b) Pass No 6 copy back to OS representative. The latter will note on his 'watch' copy the AAF F34 Nos and will then transfer the 'watch' copy to a 'completed' file. He will then initial, and onforward the No 6 copy to DDOS Adv HQ AMF.

32. The Chief Paymaster will accept action to

- (a) Raise the debit on the basis of the AAF F34 and supporting documents received from the depot.
- (b) Pass the No 8 copy together with one copy of the inspection certificate (when applicable) to the Regional Manager, CDC as advice of the transaction.

33. DDOS Adv HQ AMF will, in the case of transfers to RNIA, transmit to HQ RNIA the No 6 copy received by him from ADOS 9 Div. He will keep a record of the registered number of the AAF G1033 concerned and of the corresponding AAF F34 serial number.

34. When part worn equipment, vehicles etc are being transferred the percentage of new price to be charged will be assessed by a panel consisting of at least the following :-

- (1) ADOS 9 Div or an officer delegated to act for him.
- (2) An Ordnance officer having knowledge of the stores concerned.
- (3) A representative of the Chief Paymaster.
- (4) A duly empowered representative of the organisation desiring to purchase stores.

(When an inspection certificate is furnished this will always be taken into consideration in assessing the percentage price).

35. In the case of transfer of part worn equipment, the AAF G1033 will be clearly enfac'd 'PART WORN' and will be endorsed (on the back) as follows :-

" Stores assessed and accepted on the basis shown.

.....(Sig) (Appointment) for purchaser

.....(Sig) (Appointment) for AMF

.....(Sig) (Appointment) for Chief Paymaster. "

ADOS 9 Div or his delegate will sign for the AMF.

36. The above procedure will also be followed in respect of issues of part worn stores on repayment from RSDs.

37. Separate vouchers will always be used for NEW and PART WORN stores.

Preparation of AAFs F34 and Pricing

38. AAFs F34 need not list the stores concerned in detail. It will suffice if AAFs F34 are made out on the basis of one set per transaction, providing that the registered numbers, control numbers etc of all vouchers concerned are shown on the AAFs F34.

39. Ordnance depots will price vouchers to the extent that they are in possession of the necessary data. They will not carry out any extensions. However they will not hold up submission of the papers to Chief Paymaster because of non-availability of information. The Chief Paymaster is accepting action to secure completion of pricing and extensions at HQ AMF. It is imperative that paper work be kept moving.

40. When new equipment is being transferred the price to be entered will be the cost price, as advised by HQ AMF. In this case all copies of the AAFs G1033 will be clearly enfaced "NEW STORES".

Stores of Lend Lease Origin

41. Lists of Ordnance stores, vehicles and ammunition of lend lease origin likely to be held in the area under command of Adv HQ AMF are being forwarded under separate cover. This list, and the principle laid down in para 11(d) of the main Adm Instr, will be applied in determining whether or not an item is of lend lease origin.

42. In every case of disposal of stores of Lend Lease origin the procedure detailed in the foregoing para will be varied as follows :-

(a) All documents concerned will be clearly enfaced "STORES OF LEND LEASE ORIGIN".

(b) Two extra copies numbered 11 and 12 of the issue or transfer voucher, as the case may be, will be prepared and treated in the same way as the No 6 copy of the AF G982D or AF G1033 concerned.

43. DDOS Adv HQ AMF will then pass the Nos 11 and 12 copies to AFWESPAC and to HQ AMF in accordance with the requirements of para 11 (c) of the main Adm Instr.

DISPOSAL OF SURPLUS STATIONERY STORES

1. The only Stationery stores available for disposal in Adv HQ AMF area after all AMF requirements have been met will be surplus stocks of typewriters, duplicators, attache cases and document folders, these items will be disposed of as an "Issue on Repayment". Before these items are handed over to transferee units they will be returned by the transferor unit to stationery depots for examination.

In order that the value of part worn office machinery may be fairly assessed, it will be necessary for an independent valuer to be appointed by formation HQ, in addition to the OC stationery depot or detachment and the transferee.

2. Documentation will be as follows:-

AAF L9 or L10 - 9 copies - will be used for requisitioning by the various services or civilian bodies, at the foot of which will be made a Pro-forma receipt as under :-
