- iv. RATIONS

ix. CARE OF WEAPONS.

All pers weapons, Rifle, Bren & Owen guns will be thoroughly greased inside of barrel and outside by the soldier and handed to CQMS, correctly marked with Tag showing No. Rank, Name & Coy of individual.

Steel helmets and Respirators will also be collected (properly labelled) by CQMS and stored. A receipt covering all articles will be given by CQMS to each soldier.

x. HUTS.

All huts will be left thoroughly clean and no property of the soldier will be left therein.

xi. SURPLUS CLOTHING.

A soldier is NOT entitled to be carrying any clothing or equipment other than that on issue to him. Therefore any surplus U.S. clothing will be burnt and private clothing will be taken home or otherwise disposed of.

Coy Comds will make a thorough kit inspection before any pty under their comd moves out on leave.

Soldiers are to be instructed to leave private clothing home and NOT to bring any back with them.

xii. BAGGAGE OFFR & TRAIN ADJT.

Each O/C Tps will appoint a Baggage Offr & Train Adjt. The Baggage Offr will not be concerned with any duty other than the responsibility and safe keeping of baggage. He will be directly responsible for any losses.

xiii. AMMUNITION.

All amm from coys will be returned to the E.S.M. and be placed in Bn Reserve dumps. Trg Amm will be requisitioned for as usual and stored by O.C. Rear Pty.

xiv. TRANSPORT

All tpt incl Wiles Cookers will be put on blocks excepting those vch as shown below. Cars will be checked, so that short run can be given at intervals. Maintenance will be carried out on all tpt as usual.

The follg tpt will be kept for use of Rear Pty:

1 x Car D.S. 3 x 1 Ton Vans, 1 x 30 cwt, 1 x 3 Ton.

xv. KITCHENS.

All kitchens except No. 1 Hq Coy kitchen will be closed from the date respective coys evacuate sites. WO Caterer will ensure that kitchens are in a clean state.

Kitchens will receive Bi-weekly cleaning by Rear Pty.

xvi. PETROL.

To avoid evaporation and other wastage, petrol other than that required for Rear Pty will be returned to AASC. TO will liaise direct with B.T.O.

xvii. OFFR'S & SGT'S MESS.

Both messes will be closed as from 31 Jan & Offrs and Sgts will eat with their coys. Books of accounts will be closed on that day and usual Audit carried out.

xviii. CANTEEN.

Bn canteen will be closed 31 Jan and accounts audited. Arrangements have been made whereby the Rear Pty will be able to purchase supplies from 13 Bde Canteen.

ixx. INSTRS TO TPS.

Coy Comds will personally instruct troops on leaving this area on their conduct etc during transit to their home town and whilst on leave. Both offrs and O.R's will also be reminded that until evacuation from their nearest L.T.D. they are on duty. ESPIRIT DE CORPS & pride in their colours will be stressed.

xx. REAR PTY.

HQ Rear Pty will be established at Bn HQ. The complete Rear Pty will be accommodated in Bn HQ & 1 Pl HQ Coy Huts less 3 pers to each Rifle Coy who will sleep in own coy Q. Stores and be directly responsible for the safe keeping and daily maintenance of all Coy Stores in their present areas. Spec maintenance ptys will live in own Pl areas.

xxi. DUTIES OF REAR PTY.

The main duties of the Rear Pty will be the maintenance of Camp area, stores and equipment. O.C. Rear Pty will make an inspection of area at least twice weekly.

xxii GENERAL

Ttg syllabus to be adhered to by Rear Pty will be issued prior to last elements leaving this area.

Spec instrns effecting groups time of mvt etc will be promulgated from time to time.

xxiii POSTAL.

All mail that arrives the night prior to tps moving on leave will be distributed. Mail arriving on the day follg the departure of tps will be sorted, bundled and fwded by Air to ALICE SPRINGS. 326. "Q" PROCEDURE CLOTHING.

1. Use of AAB 83 - Record Of Personal Issues. In the near future items of clothing and necessaries will be recorded on AAB 83 and such items now appearing on AAF 200 will be transcribed to this form. AAF 200 will then be ruled off and the Q.M. will certify on the face of the AAF 200 that such transcription has taken place. AAF 200 will be forwarded to the L. of C. Records Office of the State of the Soldier's enlistment.

2. Issues. On completion of transcription the following procedure with regard to the issue of clothing will be adopted.

(a) Initial Issues. Initial issues will be entered in AAB 83 in black ink, all entries will be initialled by members concerned and signed by C.Q.M.S. in black ink. The issue will also be recorded on AAF F 201 and soldier's signature obtained in the "Remarks" column. As well as the recording of the individual articles the COMS will also write in words the number of articles being issued to the individual. All entries on AAF F 201 will be made in black ink.

(b) Replacement of US Clothing. Serviceable clothing may be issued to replace U.S. clothing by the COMS on the approval of the Coy Comd or some officer appointed by him. In this case the same procedure with regard to AAB 83 and AAF F 201 as in para (a) will be adopted.

(c) Replacement of Issues on C.O.'s Authority. Issues made to replace lost or destroyed articles of clothing etc. will be entered in record of personal issues in AAB 83 at the same time and in the same square in red and black ink respectively and will be initialled by the soldier concerned and signed by the COMS in red ink. A similar entry will be made on AAF F 201. Each COMS will prepare an AAF F 201 in duplicate and retain both copies in their possession. An AAF F 201 will also be kept by the QM., but this will only record bulk issues to COMS's. On the 30th of each month CQ's will attend QM for purpose of checking Coy 201's with Bn.

3. Procedure on Loss of Clothing or Necessaries. As from the date of this order the following procedure regarding the loss of clothing or necessaries which may or may not result in a stoppage in the paybook of the soldier concerned, will be adopted:-

- (a) Written report by member to platoon commander.
- (b) Pl Comd will enter soldier's name, army number, rank and the article of clothing lost on AAF F203 and parade soldier to Coy Comd for investigation of the loss.
- (c) Coy Comd will on conclusion of investigation make his recommendation as to stoppage or otherwise in column provided.
- (d) AAF F203 will then be forwarded to C.O. for approval. The C.O. may re-open the investigation if he deems fit.
- (e) AAF F203 will then be forwarded to QM as his authority for reissue.
- (f) In the event of a stoppage being ordered by the C.O., Q.M. will then prepare WF 23 which will be forwarded to Coy clerk for signing by the member concerned and then handed to Pay Sgt for the necessary debit to be placed in the member's Paybook.

Attention is drawn to the fact that under no circumstances will clothing be issued to replace losses until the above procedure has been complied with and action completed, unless the C.O. considers that the exigencies of the service are such that an issue should be made immediately.

327. MONTHLY CENSUS OF MECHANICAL VEHICLES.

1. As from 20 Dec 43, T.O. will render to AIOS or ord representative, an additional copy of all forms appertaining to Monthly Census of Mechanical Vehicles.

2. The forms concerned are :-
E5-9 (a), G51, G52, and G54.

328. COURT MARTIAL PROMULGATION.

The following sentence awarded by Courts Martial in NE L of C Area are notified.

Charge - AWL

WX 36370 Pte ALLEN, H.C. 11 Aust Inf Bn, AWL from 22 Feb 43 until 27 Mar 43, Detn for 130 days.

329. ISSUES OF AMENITIES.

- 1) In order to control the distribution and maintenance of Amenities supplies in this area, it is ordered that each unit will institute an accounting system for such supplies.
- 2) So that the accounting system of this unit can be controlled, and the correct returns forwarded when required, the following procedure will be adopted forthwith:
 - a) All amenities issues at present held by the Bn will be taken on charge, and those issued to Coys charged against the Coys concerned. A Coy Comd will be involved in the same responsibility for these issues as with any ordn. issue.
 - b) All future amenities issues to the Bn will be received by the RQM and not, as in some previous instances issued direct to Coys. Issues will be allocated to Coys as same are available.
 - c) Where Amenities goods, are lost or become unserviceable, application will be made to RQM to have the article struck off charge. Where possible, the US article will be returned with the application for write off. When writeoff is approved, new articles in lieu will be issued where practical.
Where loss or damage is attributable to neglect, the Company concerned will make good the loss and further issues in lieu may be withheld.
- 5) For the purpose of this instruction, Amenities Goods refer to all free issues from Amenities, and all goods purchased through Regt Funds.

330. LEAVE - MEMBERS OF NF FORCE.

1. All personnel, prior to proceeding on leave, are warned that any soldier who goes absent without leave will automatically debar another member of this unit from being granted leave until the soldier absent without leave is returned to duty.
The above procedure will be strictly enforced and the names of defaulters responsible for delaying the departure of their comrades will be promulgated in unit orders.
2. Every effort is being made to implement a leave programme that, subject to the exigencies of the Service, will permit of the granting to each man annually his leave entitlement.
As will be appreciated such a programme entails large numbers of troops being absent from the Northern Territory at one time, and unless action as indicated above is taken any soldier going AWL would add to the already large commitment.
3. All personnel are also informed, when proceeding on leave that, should the exigencies of the Service demand it, they may be recalled from home at any time.

331. OUTWARD PARCELS - CANTEEN GOODS.

1. It has come to notice that goods purchased from Canteens Service are being sent out of the Territory by means of enclosure in parcels sent by post.
2. This practice will cease forthwith, and any breaches of this order will be made an offence calling for disciplinary action.
3. It must be realised by all concerned that canteen stores are brought into NF under extreme difficulties of transportation, for the sole use of members of the Forces, and the above misuse of the facilities thus provided is entirely wrong in principle.

332. CARRIAGE OF PISTOL AND CASE ON BELT WE.

1. Cases have recently occurred whereby pistols have been lost when carried below and attached to the ammunition pouch.
2. To obviate this, lanyards will always be worn attached to the pistol, and securely fastened to the waist belt or the person.

333. ANTI-MALARIAL PRECAUTIONS.

1. Mosquito Nets will be used by all ranks on their beds or bunks at night. Nets will be unfolded and placed in position at sunset. Coy duty officers will check on Coy personnel each night at or immediately after 'lights out'.

334. ADDRESSES OF PROPHYLACTIC ABLUTION CENTRES.

1. Analysis of admissions to Australian Special Hospitals has shown that the following percentages of those who contracted venereal disease neglected to make use of P.A.C. facilities with consequent disastrous results:

(a) Lack of effective promulgation of addresses of prophylactic centres.

336. VEH MAINTENANCE - BATTERIES.

Owing to rapid evaporation of electrolyte in storage batteries due to climatic conditions, all batteries in vehs will be inspected by drs daily and topped up if necessary in accordance with procedure laid down in Mech Veh Trg Pamphlet No.1.

337. DAMAGE TO BITUMINOUS SURFACE OF RDS.

Unless operational reasons demand it carrs and other tracked vehs will NOT run on bituminous surfaced rds without permission of this HQ.

Under supervision of an offr carrs may cross a bitumin rd at right angles at a speed NOT exceeding 5 mph.

338. ABORIGINAL TERMS.

It is the custom to refer to male and female natives as "boongs" and "gins" respectively.

This practice is to cease. The former word, in aboriginal language, is an approbrious term corresponding to our "bastard" and its use is much resented by the natives.

The correct terms to use are "Native and Lubra".

339. JACKETS AND TROUSERS SD -- ISSUE TO PERS PROCEEDING ON LEAVE.

Stocks of SD uniforms and Greatcoats for issue to pers proceeding on leave, are available at LTDs BRISBANE and ADELAIDE.

Replacement of Shorts KD and Shirts MK for wear in States where such dress is authorised as Summer Dress, can also be obtained at these LTDs.

340. LOSS OF ARMS - DISCIPLINARY ACTION.

The loss of arms (pistols and rifles) has become prevalent and hereafter severe disciplinary action will be taken against any person losing his arms by neglect.

The degree of care required in respect of arms is extremely high and, accordingly, a small amount of carelessness will be regarded as deserving of punishment.

341. FOOD POISONING FROM TONGUE.

Two small outbreaks of food poisoning occurred recently due to eating fresh tongue.

In order to prevent any further outbreaks, the following procedure will be adopted.

Fresh Tongue will be cooked as soon as possible after delivery. It will be served at the next meal after cooking. Under no circumstances will it be reheated and served again at a subsequent meal or used up in the form of sandwiches or in rissoles or pies. Any tongue remaining after a meal will be discarded.

342. ESCAPES OF AUSTRALIAN PRISONERS OF WAR FROM ENEMY HANDS.

1. It is the duty of any soldier, if captured by the enemy, to effect his escape at the earliest possible moment.

2. It is also his duty - any breach of which is a serious offence - not to communicate to unauthorized persons any information about the means employed by him or his companions to escape from enemy hands.

3. The disclosure of such information :-

(a) prejudices the chances of other escapees;

(b) prevents other members of Australian or Allied forces from using the same or similar means of escape;

(c) endangers the lives of those who may have assisted the escapees at any stage of their escape;

therefore, except as provided in paras.4 and 5 below, an escaped prisoner of war is forbidden to disclose particulars of his escape directly or indirectly to any person whatever, either by word of mouth or in writing.

4. An escaped prisoner of war will disclose full particulars of his escape only to officers authorized by the Director of

348. LEAVE WITHOUT PAY.

1. Cases are still occurring in which members who have been granted leave without pay afterwards claim that they were not aware of the full effect of the grant of such leave.
In order to reduce the possibilities of misunderstandings to a minimum the following action will be taken:
2. The Officer who first receives an application for leave without pay will, before dealing with the application satisfy himself by personal interview with the member concerned that the member understands the full effect of a grant of such leave.
3. Pay & allowances cease in respect of any period for which a member is granted leave without pay.
When a member is granted leave without pay the following will not be payable during the period of such leave:
 - a. Pay (incl deferred pay)
 - b. Field allowance.
 - c. Command allowance.
 - d. Spec. allowance.
 - e. Exchange allowance.
 - f. Dependents allowance.
 - g. Travelling allowance.
 - h. Subsistence allowance
 - i. Any allowance payable under Reg 9 of the War financial regulations.

349. MAINTENANCE INSTRUCTIONS.-

Maintenance of combat tyres on vehicles is prescribed as follows :-

- (a) Tyre inflation pressures will be kept inflated to correct pressures prescribed in appropriate Mechanization Circulars.
- (b) After an emergency deflation, a combat tyre will be re-inflated to its correct pressure at the earliest possible moment.
- (c) Any combat tyre that has been deflated and run for more than -
 - (i) twenty consecutive miles, or
 - (ii) seventy-five miles in the aggregate,will be removed and inspected by skilled AIFM personnel to see if it is fit for further use. When it is necessary to remove a tyre from the wheel, the rim nuts or cap screws will not be unscrewed unless the tyre is completely deflated; otherwise, an inflated tyre may easily blow the wheel apart, causing severe injury or death. Rim nuts or cap screws will be painted red to denote danger.
- (d) When replacement of a combat tyre becomes necessary, care will be taken to see that the casing and the tube of the replacement tyre are of the correct size and marked COMBAT, as in para. 3 above.
- (e) A rubber flap of correct size and type will be fitted in combat tyres using the segmental type of beadlock.

350. CORRECT USE OF LIGHTS WHEN APPROACHING ONCOMING TRAFFIC.

1. Accidents involving army vehicles have occurred due to lack of road courtesy of drivers who fail to dim their headlamps when approaching oncoming traffic.
2. In order that personnel in control of vehicles may appreciate their responsibility in this regard, the action to be taken is set out hereunder:-

(Cont'd over)

RppxD

(a) When approaching oncoming traffic, the driver of a vehicle will ensure that his headlights are dipped and will keep as near as practicable, having regard to all the circumstances, to the left hand edge of the roadway.

(b) If the headlights cannot be dipped they will be dimmed, if they cannot be dipped or dimmed, the driver will switch to his parking lights. In either case he will reduce the speed of the vehicle so that he can stop within his lessened limits of vision.

3. The driver is responsible for checking the correct operation of all lights and for reporting immediately (on AAF.G.17) all defects which he is not permitted to rectify.

351. GREEN ENVELOPES.

In view of the numerous queries raised and the uncertainty which still appears to exist in reference to the use of Green envelopes the following is promulgated :-

- (1) All Unit orders covering the issue and or use of Green envelopes issued prior to the date of this order are cancelled.
- (2) The issue of Green envelopes is a privilege which may be restricted individually or collectively by order of the Commanding Officer.
- (3) A Green envelope may be issued to any soldier upon request from that soldier who will NOT be required to give any explanation as to why he required the envelope or what he intends to write about.
- (4) The Green envelopes will be strictly controlled.
- (5) Green envelopes may be used for the transmission of letters relating to only private and family affairs.
- (6) The certificate as to the contents printed on the face of the envelope must be signed by the sender.
- (7) A soldier may use one (1) Green envelope every ten days. More than one but NOT more than three letters may be sent in one Green envelope (see paras 8 & 9.)
- (8) A Green envelope will NOT be retained by the soldier to whom it is issued for any period exceeding 10 days. If NOT used within that period it will be returned to the person who issued it.
- (9) A Green envelope is NOT transferrable under any consideration and will NOT be used by any person other than the person to whom it was issued.
- (10) All ranks will be informed that letters posted in Green envelopes though not subject to examination or franking within the unit are liable to censorship by the Field Censorship Coy or the Base Censor, which may cause slight delay in the transmission of the letter.
- (11) Green Envelopes cannot be registered. Money or valuables will NOT be enclosed therein, nor will photographic films or prints which do not relate solely to private and family affairs.
- (12) Green Envelopes may be sent by Air Mail. The ordinary rates of air or surface postage are payable on Green Envelopes to any destination.
- (13) When the Green Envelope is used to despatch one letter to one addressee the address will be written in the space provided and the necessary postage stamps affixed in the top right hand corner.
- (14) When the Green Envelope is used to despatch two or three letters each to separate addressees, each letter will be enclosed in a separate ordinary envelope. These envelopes will be properly addressed and stamped and left unsealed. They will then be placed in the Green envelope which will be addressed to the "Base Censor." No postage stamps will be required to be placed on the Green Envelope, but the certificate will be signed as set out in para (v)

352. COLOUR PATCHES.

As an amendment to previous instructions, miniature Colour Patches will not be worn on headclothes.



5. DUTIES.

- a) O.C. Rear Party.
 - i. General responsibility, supervision and administration.
 - ii. Daily inspection of entire Bn area.
 - iii. Inspection of weapons, vehicles & stores twice weekly.

DUTIES CONT'D.

b) Rifle Coy Parties.

- i. Will remain in Coy lines unless otherwise ordered.
- ii. At least one member of each of these parties will sleep in the building where the Coy weapons etc. are stored. The remainder will sleep in the store or in the nearest suitable available building.
- iii. This weapon etc. store will never be left unattended day or night.
- iv. Coy parties will inspect the Coy area - buildings, latrines etc. twice daily and will immediately report any discrepancy to Rear Party HQ. Any suspicious or unusual occurrence in the Coy area will be immediately investigated and reported.
- v. The senior member of each rifle coy rear party will be responsible for the discipline of his party and for the security of all weapons, buildings etc. in the coy area.
- vi. A complete check of all articles in store will be made daily and any discrepancy immediately reported.
- vii. Maintenance of weapons etc. will be carried out daily.

Note: i. Before moving on leave Rifle Coy Q.M. Sgts will supply a complete list in duplicate of all weapons etc in store: One copy to Senior member of coy party and one copy to Rear Party HQ.

c) Bn HQ and HQ Coy parties.

1. Remarks as for Rifle coy parties apply where relevant
- ii. Acting P.O. will supervise maintenance of all vehicles in charge of rear party.

Daily duties.

- i. A duty officer and a duty NCO will be appointed daily. Tour of duty - retreat to retreat.
- ii. The duty NCO will supervise the picquet.
- iii. Strength of picquet - 3 Ptes. Picquet will maintain a sentry at the amn store at Rear Party HQ. Tour of duty - Retreat to Retreat. At 0700 hrs. one member of picquet will take over duties of orderly at Rear Party HQ. The other two members of the picquet will be fallen out for normal daily duties.

6. ADM MATTERS GENERALLY.

A ssistant Adj't will supervise Rear Party HQ. and will ensure that all returns etc. are submitted on due dates.

7. Q. MATTERS GENERALLY.

- a) Supervised by Q.M.
- b) Messing. - All personnel except one storeman per outlying rifle coy, will eat at central mess at Rear Party HQ., (No. 1 HQ Coy Kitchen). Meals for these storemen will be delivered to Coy Q. Store by M.T.
- c) Canteen Goods. - will be obtained from Bde canteen.

Method:-

- i. Up-to-date price list of canteen goods available will be exhibited permanently at HQ Coy Q.M. Store.
 - ii. personnel desiring goods will submit written order to member in charge of HQ Coy Q.M. Store together with cash for purchases.
 - iii. COMS will consolidate order and purchase bulk supply from Bde canteen.
 - iv. Bulk purchases will be made on Mondays and Thursdays only.
 - v. Personnel may obtain their purchases from HQ Coy Q.M. store between 0945 and 1000 hrs daily except Sundays.
- d) Beer.

An accurate Ration strength will be submitted to Bde Canteen by 1800 hrs each Monday night. Tpt Sgt will supply a 30 cwt veh each Tues afternoon to collect Beer from above canteen and distribute to coys under instructions from O.C. Rear Party.

8. COMMUNICATIONS.

- a) Bn switchboard will be attended at all times.
- b) At night members of picket who are off duty will rest near sig office and will act as orderlies at discretion of switchboard attendant.
- c) Coy telephone sets will be moved from Coy Orderly rooms to Coy weapons etc. stores.

9. PROTECTION

- a) Air Passive.
- b) Ground
 - i) All members of rear party will retain their personal weapons and ammunition.
 - ii) At each Coy weapons etc. store, one IMG Bren will be kept ready for action together with twelve filled magazines, (20 rds per mag)
 - iii) Member in charge of each Rifle Coy party will formulate plan for protection of coy weapon etc. stores and will rehearse personnel in their duties in connection therewith.
 - iv) Defence of rear party HQ., plan prepared by and rehearsed under supervision of Lieut G.C. REMONDS.

10. FIRE PRECAUTIONS.

- a) No smoking will be permitted inside the buildings where weapons etc are stored.
- b) No intoxicating liquor will be taken into or consumed in these stores.
- c) Three four-gallon cans of water will be kept at the door to each store for use in case of fire.
- d) Each store must have a lightning conductor fitted.
- e) Only hurricane lamps will be used for illumination in these stores.
- f) No highly inflammable liquid or material will be kept in weapons etc. stores.

11. HYGIENE.

- a) All sub-unit areas must be kept perfectly clean and tidy.
- b) All personnel will take two showers daily.
- c) Coy parties will liaise with mosquito squad in the location and make safe any standing water.

12. POSTAL

Incoming mails will be delivered to outlying parties by mail vehicle.
 Outgoing will be delivered to Rear Party HQ., censored there, and despatched. Rear party Post Office will be at present Bn HQ.


13. R.A.P.

Present location and routine.

14. GENERAL

Under no circumstances will any member of the Rear Party proceed on leave until sufficient personnel have returned to relieve them.

No soldier will leave the Bn area under any pretext whatsoever unless with express permission of O.C. rear party or some officer acting in his stead.

355. ESCAPED LEPERS.

All ranks are warned that numerous leper patients (natives and half castes) have absconded from CHANNEL ISLAND.

They are expected to endeavour to reach their former homes in all parts of the NT.

A sharp look out will be kept for any strange natives. If found, nearest Tro Unit or Civil Police will be informed immediately.

356. AUTHORITY - RAAF PRO PERS.

RAAF Pro Pers are authorised to stop all army vehs and RAAF vehs may be stopped by Army Pro pers.

All Army vehs will therefore stop when ordered to do so by RAAF Pro Pers and drivers will give such infm as is asked for.

Evidence by RAAF Pro pers will be admitted in all army proceedings in the same way as is evidence by Aust Army Pro Pers.

357. PRIVATE TELEGRAMS.

It is brought to the notice of all ranks that owing to special conditions obtaining in NT, deliveries of private telegrams cannot approach the degree of rapid transmission from the sender to the addressee which obtained in city and suburban areas in pre-war days.

Outgoing Telegrams - (whether paid for at urgent or ordinary rates) after being unit censored, are taken to the nearest Fd PO for recording then passed to the local Sig office for despatch from the nearest Sig Tele Transmitting Office by line direct to the appropriate PMG Tele Office. From then onwards telegrams traverse the normal PMG channels to the addressees.

Incoming Telegrams - are received via PMG channels at the appropriate Sig Tele Transmitting Office, details are recorded, and telegrams then passed over to the nearest APO for delivery to units of destination. As the Army Postal Service has insufficient facilities for making special deliveries of telegrams direct to many units which are located over widely dispersed areas, prompt delivery of telegrams in accordance with civilian standards is impracticable. In many cases the final stage of delivery is made by DRIS or MT, although special action is taken in the case of telegrams which from their text are obviously of an urgent nature.

All telegrams are therefore subject to certain unavoidable delays. Added to this there is the factor of heavy war-time traffic being handled over Army Sigs and Civil PMG lines.

In order to assure a reasonably rapid degree of transmission for telegrams of a really urgent nature, all ranks should refrain from sending greetings or matters of non-urgent nature by telegram, and should request their correspondents to observe the same discrimination. Correspondence of this nature should be forwarded by air mail.

358. INCLUSION OF CENSORABLE MATTER IN CORRESPONDENCE.

"All ranks are forbidden to include in their correspondence information classed as censorable matter under current Field Censorship Instructions, notwithstanding that such correspondence is to be submitted to a franking officer or a censorship authority."

359. VENEREAL DISEASE - EFFECT ON PAY.
Preliminary.

1. Approval has been given for the amendment of War Financial (Military Forces) Regulation 25 to provide that no forfeiture of pay will be incurred by a member -

- (a) for the first thirty-five days of his absence after the 31st January, 1944, as the result of venereal disease acquired by him on the first occasion as defined in para 3 hereof and including any days of absence as a result of a relapse from a disease acquired on any such first occasion, provided that the total number of days of absence as a result of such first occasion and any such relapse does not exceed thirty-five days;
- (b) acquiring venereal disease while acting in the course of his duty; or
- (c) who is suffering from a congenital form of venereal disease.

Commencement.

2. The approval so far as it relates to sub-para (a) of para 1 of this order will take effect on and from the 1st February, 1944, and so far as it relates to sub-paras (b) and (c) of that paragraph will operate as from 6th October, 1939.

Interpretation.

3. For the purpose of this order, the term "first occasion" when used in connection with venereal disease will mean -

- (a) the first occasion on which a venereal disease is diagnosed after 31st January, 1944;
- (b) in the case of a member who was on 1st February, 1944, absent from duty by reason of the disease diagnosed prior to that date - the venereal disease for which he is being treated; or
- (c) in the case of a member who, subsequent to the 31st January, 1944, is absent from duty through a relapse from the venereal disease diagnosed prior to the 1st February, 1944 - the relapse from which he is then suffering

whichever first occurs.



361. QUALIFYING EXAMINATIONS FOR PROFICIENCY PAY.

Further to previous instructions regarding the above a soldier will be deemed to have passed the prescribed examination if he is certified by his Coy Comd as being in all respects proficient in his duties.

The pers concerned will be tested at the first available opportunity after date of issue of the certificate of proficiency which will be fwded to this HQ no later than 30 April 44.

If a soldier fails to pass the prescribed examination, his proficiency pay will cease as from the date of such failure and it will not be restored until he qualifies.

The same provisions as previously advised concerning good conduct etc will apply.

The certificate to be fwded by Coy Comds will state the date on and from which the soldier will be entitled to proficiency pay, which will be such date not prior to 1 July 1943 as the C considers just in the circumstances.

362. TRAFFIC CONTROL - HIGHWAY REGULATIONS.

All vehicles about to enter NS Road from any access road or track or from any unit lines, will stop at least five (5) feet before the front of the vehicle arrives at the Highway.

He will look both to his right and left whilst halted, and before moving on, will ensure that there is no vehicle approaching him from either direction along the N S Road within 50 yards of his vehicle.

All vehicles passing in either direction along the N S Road have the right of way over vehicles entering that road.

Disciplinary action will be taken against any driver who commits a breach of this order.

363. REPORTING OF ACCIDENTS

Where the driver of an army vehicle is concerned in an accident, he will forthwith report particulars of the accident to his unit by the most expeditious means available. This report will be made in all cases, irrespective of the amount of damage either to the army vehicle or to the other vehicle, person or property concerned in the accident.

364. CLEANING OF VEHICLES.

Two cases have recently occurred of engines catching fire when being cleaned by the use of petrol, in each case due to a spark from the electrical system.

Petrol will not be used in future for cleaning engines or other parts of vehicles. Kerosene may be drawn for this purpose.

365.

Many pers are failing to observe the instructions embodied in previous Orders, with resultant inconvenience to hospital and convalescent depot staffs.

in force Order No. 155 is reprinted hereunder and from henceforth will be adhered to by all units:-

1. Personnel evacuated to hospital will take the following:- Respirator, helmet steel, messing gear, web equipment, ground sheet, blankets, all personal gear reasonably required (including changes of clothing) toilet necessities, AAF P. 200, paybook.

2. If a soldier is admitted without the above articles the hospital will notify the soldier's unit. The unit will immediately make every endeavour to deliver the necessary clothing or equipment to the hospital. Failure on the part of a unit to do so will be viewed most seriously.

3. Members admitted to the hospital will also be in possession of AAB 83.

366. FIRST VICTORY LOAN.

The First Victory Loan of \$150,000,000. will open for subscription on 28 March 1944, and close not later than 9 May 1944.

Arrangements have been made for the Pay Sgt to accept applications for Commonwealth Government Inscribed Stock or Treasury Bonds from members of the forces serving in Australia or New Guinea who desire to invest their savings in the loan. All pers interested in above can obtain further particulars from Pay Sgt at HQ.

ADVANCES OR OVERDRAWS OF PAY.

Coys paying officers or pay representatives will not make any payment that will cause the overdrawing of a member's pay book, except as set out hereunder :-

- (a) A member whose paybook is overdrawn may be paid within the limit of the restricted drawing rate which has been endorsed in the pay book by a member of the AAPC.
- (b) A formation paymaster or a depot paymaster may overpay a member to the extent of 75% of any estimated claim for travelling allowance on the written authority of the CO., and such overpayment will be adjusted by the member on payment of his claim for travelling allowance.
- (c) A member proceeding on leave of more than 72 hours may be paid in advance against his credit earnings calculated to the date of expiration of such leave.
- (d) A member may be paid in advance in special circumstances (for example, prior to embarkation or upon disembarkation) where such payment is authorized by instructions issued by HQ. In exceptional circumstances, an advance against the security of deferred pay may be made where the necessary approval has been obtained in accordance with instructions issued by the Chief Finance Officer.

368 APPLICATION OF CLOTHES RATIONING TO THE ARMY.

Reports from the Director of Rationing indicate that his Deputy Directors in the various States are still receiving applications for clothing coupons direct from individual members of the AMF. Such applications are contrary to GRC 1422/1943, and will cease. Personnel placed in circumstances of extreme necessity will follow the procedure laid down in that order.

369. OVERUN JUICES - PEELING OF LACQUER IN TINS.

In the manufacture of canned lemon, orange, grapefruit juices, various amounts of oil from the peel are introduced into the juices.

When the proportion of peel oil is unduly high, it may soften the internal lacquer of the cans and cause it to strip off.

If any canned juices are found containing pieces of lacquer, such juice should NOT be discarded but should be strained and can be consumed (providing it is otherwise wholesome) as the lacquer is not toxic and does not affect the flavour and nutritional properties of the juice.

360. GRC 1422 INVENTIONS APPROVED TO UNIT EQUIP T/O.

(a) Proposals of inventions by serving personnel may be submitted direct through normal unit censorship channels by proposer or inventor to the Army Inventions Directorate at:-

Censoring officers will be responsible that security is not infringed and, if considered necessary in interests of security, will arrange for communications to be forwarded through official instead of normal post channels.

(b) The "User" personnel in the Army are often the ones best fitted to think of requirements in regard to new equipment or development of existing equipments.

It is the duty of every soldier to put forward his ideas in this respect. Whilst in many cases the "User" or other soldier can only think of the idea and has not the solution, one of the express purposes of the Army Inventions Directorate is to endeavour to provide the means of development if such idea appears a suitable army requirement.

All submissions will be made to the Army Inventions Directorate as above.

THEFTING OF EQUIP FROM ORS CLUBS.

Incidents have occurred of wgmt and furniture being stolen from ORS Clubs. In Club 15 alone, 27 canvas chairs have been stolen. Coys will cause an examination of accommodation stores to be made forthwith, and return furniture belonging to Canteens Service to AACS. Disciplinary action will be taken against offenders.

371. GRO A20/44. PUBLICATIONS BY MEMBERS OF THE AMF.

No member of this unit shall, save in pursuance of his military duty, write for publication in any form any matter dealing with or referring to any military subject, whether fact or fictional, unless preparation and publication thereof have been approved by the Director General of Public Relations.

372. GRO G78/44. 1945 ARMY XMAS BOOK.

1. As the demand for the 1945 Army Xmas Book (Khaki And Green) has reached the maximum number that can be produced, further orders will not be placed by members of this unit.

2. Orders which have been received by the Officer-in-Charge Military History Section, or which are now in transit will be delivered in their turn as quickly as supplies can be obtained from the printer.

3. After orders now in transit have been received by the Officer-in-Charge Military History Section, will furnish a forecast of the dates of delivery of orders which have not yet been despatched.

373. GRO G79/44. REVISED SYSTEM OF DRIVERS ROUTINE MAINTENANCE FOR CARRIERS (ALL TYPES) AND "B" VEHICLES.

1. The system of Drivers Routine Maintenance of carriers of all types and of "B" vehicles, prescribed by GRO G.70/1943 and by Mechanical Vehicle Training Pamphlet No.1 - "Drivers Routine Maintenance - 1942, has been revised but will remain in operation until 31 March, 1944.

TO and Carr Offrs will, at an early date make a point of reading GRO at HQ.

374. SEA BATHING: DARWIN: DANGER OF.

cases have occurred recently of men suffering injuries from Portugese Men-of-War (Blue Bottles) and from ear trouble probably due to impure water. Sea Bathing will cease in the Darwin Area for the current wet season.

375. MOSQUITO CONTROL: EMPTY BOTTLES.

Empty bottles carelessly left lying about become a breeding ground for mosquitos.

All pers will have impressed upon them the danger of such carelessness and will be instructed to stack empties where they can be collected and removed. Empty bottles have a value for collection and should be used for this purpose.

376. RD TRAFFIC ON RY BRs & LOAD LIMITS.

During the wet season it may sometimes be necessary to divert rd traffic over ry brs.

Ry brs are class 40 excepting ADELAIDE RIVER and ELIZABETH RIVER ry brs which are class 24, but owing to the incidence of high rear axle loads the following restrictions relating to hy vehs are to be observed.

(a) Loaded Tank Tptrs and vehs whose axle or bogey loads exceed 12 tons will not cross any ry br.

(b) Loaded Mack Diesel trucks and vehs whose axle or bogey loads exceed 7 tons will not cross Adelaide River or Elizabeth River ry brs.

All Drs to take special note of this instruction.

377. DRINKING WATER FROM TERNE IRON ROOFS.

It has been noticed that troops are placing water barrels to catch the rain water from huts which are roofed with Terne Iron. In some cases this water is being used for drinking purposes. This practice will cease forthwith as the danger of lead poisoning is very real.

378. DAMAGE TO MANTON PIPE LINE.

An instance occurred recently whereby a vehicle collided with the Manton pipe line, displacing several concrete cradles and damaging a 3" connector to the main.

This damage was not reported to the appropriate authority and repairs were accordingly not made for some hours after the occurrence, resulting in a considerable loss of water thereby seriously affecting the storage requirements at Darwin.

The vital importance of the Manton pipe line is brought to the notice of all ranks who are instructed to report to the nearest RAE officer particulars of any similar mishap or damage to the pipe line from any cause whatsoever so that emergency repairs can be carried out and thereby obviate a breakdown in the supply.

379. WARRANT OFFICERS- MANNER OF ADDRESSING

As it would appear that some uncertainty exists as to the correct manner of addressing Warrant Officers of the Australian Military Forces, attention is drawn to the principles laid down in AMR&O 1165 (2) viz; - "NCO's and men are to address WO's in the same manner as they do Officers, but not salute them." Similar principles also govern the method of address of WO's by Officers and other WO's.

In applying these principles, in the instances where an officer would be addressed as "sir" or as "Mr" or by his rank, a Warrant Officer will be addressed as "sir" or by the title of his appointment that is "Sgt-Major", etc with such abbreviation, if any as is in accordance with the custom of the Service. A Warrant Officer will not be addressed as "Warrant Officer", "WO", or "Mr".

380. RECORD OF SERVICE BOOK AAB 83.

It is reported that many patients not in possession of AAB 83 are being admitted to hospital.

O'sCOys will ensure that personnel admitted to hospital are in possession of AAB 83.

381. GRO 026. WO UND STRIPES.

The wearing of wound stripes by members of the AMF, in accordance with this order, is authorized.

For the purpose of this order, a member will be deemed to be wounded only if he is listed as wounded in unit routine orders, Part 11, in a classification establishing the wound as a battle casualty.

One red stripe may be worn to denote a wound or wounds received during previous wars. Only one such red stripe may be worn, irrespective of the number of occasions on which the member was wounded.

One gold stripe may be worn to denote each occasion on which a member is wounded during the present war.

O'ys will advise this HQ of any member entitled to above, giving particulars.

382. GRO 087/44. DISCS IDENTITY. STAINLESS STEEL.

1. (a) Stainless steel identity discs will be issued to and worn by all ranks of the AMF, instead of identity discs made of compressed fibre. QM will immediately submit indents for the number required
(b) Compressed fibre identity discs will be attached to respirators.

2. Compressed fibre identity discs will be withdrawn from members at the time of issue of stainless steel identity discs and will then be burnt under the supervision of an officer.

3. Identity discs will be worn only on the cord provided or on a leather lace. Beads or chains used for identity discs and are likely to be souvenired by the enemy, resulting in complete loss of identity discs.

383. GRO 089/44. MECHANICAL VEHICLES - USE OF GEARS AS BRAKES.

The practice of approaching at high speed and then changing down to a lower gear, while still at comparatively high speed, in order to obtain the necessary deceleration when slowing down for any purpose, eg., stopping, entering gateways, negotiating corners etc is still prevalent.

This practice which is forbidden, produces excessive engine speeds causes unnecessary strain on the vehicle transmission system and is a contributing factor to rapid tyre wear.

The attention of all drivers will be drawn to Amendment No 1 to Standing Orders for Drivers of Mechanical Vehicles.

384. 107 AGH ADELAIDE RIVER.

AMNS and AAMWS Messes - 1930 hrs to 2230 hrs

- (1) No visitors to the above messes will be permitted on Tuesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays.
- (ii) Visitors to the above messes must leave at 2230 hrs.
- (iii) AAMWS Mess is out of bounds to all pers unless special permission is obtained from CO of mess.

All vehs must leave veh pk by 2300 hrs. This rule will be rigidly enforced.

ENTERTAINMENTS 107 AGH.

(1) These entertainments are for the good of all pers and patients of 107 AGH.

- (ii) Owing to the lack of seating accommodation, the mess area is out of bounds to all pers on Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday nights, except such as have been specifically invited by a member of the staff to the particular entertainment.

335. GRO 098/44. PREVENTION OF RT ACCIDENTS.

Statistics of traffic accidents in built up areas on the mainland show that an unduly proportion of army vehicles is involved.

An examination of the cause of accidents indicates that the drivers of the army vehicles were frequently to blame for the accidents. If such drivers had exercised proper care and observed orders regarding speeds in the areas where they were operating, most of these accidents would have been avoided.

It is the duty of every officer to look for and report breaches of road discipline and careless driving regardless of the formation or unit to which the vehicle or driver belongs.

336. GRO 099/44. BADGES OF RANK AND TITLES EMBROIDERED.

Approval is given for the wearing of embroidered badges of rank by officers and embroidered titles by all ranks, in lieu of metal badges and titles, on shirts, and on jackets.

The wearing of embroidered badges and titles is optional and these items will not be included in scales of issue.

336. GRO 173/44. ENLISTMENT OF AIF PERSONNEL IN RAAF.

Personnel for air crew duties.

1. The discharge of personnel of the AIF for enlistment in the RAAF for air crew duties will be permitted, except as specified below.

2. Discharge will not be approved -

(a) for personnel on the posted strength of units -

(i) Serving outside the mainland of Australia or Tasmania or

(ii) Serving on the mainland under the command of 1 Aust Corps

2 Aust Corps and 4 Aust Arm'd Bde Gp; or -

(iii) Returned to the mainland after service overseas irrespective of which formation under command; or

(iv) Originally raised as AIF units.

(b) Where it is considered that the release of the member would seriously affect the efficiency of the unit.

Release of officers for air crew duties.

Officers who are accepted by the RAAF for enlistment for air crew duties, except those serving with units specified in para 2 may be released subject to HQ approval.

The names of personnel so elected will be immediately submitted to the CO for his approval and if approved for publication in Routine Orders. Mess funds will be controlled by mess committee and administered in accordance with G.R.O. F 819/43. "Control of Unit Trust Accounts."

389. WESTERN AUSTRALIAN LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL ELECTIONS.

1. The above elections will be held on Sat 29 Apr 44.
2. Polling place will be the YMCA Hut at Bn HQ from 0900hrs. Personnel of this unit qualified to vote and desirous of doing so may lodge their votes there.
3. Following is a list of qualifications required for voting for Legislative Council.

(a) The Legislative Council (War Time) Electoral Act, 1945 provides that a qualified member of the forces serving with any unit within Australia or outside Australia but within the South Western Pacific Zone, and whose name appears on the electoral roll of a Province as an elector, is entitled to vote.

(b) To have qualified for enrolment a member must have been a natural born or naturalized British subject of the age of 21 years who has resided in Western Australia for six months and -

- (1) has a legal or equitable freehold estate in possession situate in the Electoral Province, of the clear value of £50 sterling; or
- (ii) is a householder, within the Province, occupying any dwelling house of the clear annual value of £17 sterling
- (iii) has a leasehold estate in possession, situate within the Province, of the clear annual value of £17 sterling; or
- (iv) holds a lease or licence from the Crown to depasture, occupy, cultivate, or mine upon Crown lands, within the Province, at a rental of not less than £10 per annum; or has his or her name on -
- (v) the Electoral List of any municipality in respect of property within the Province of the annual rateable value of not less than £17; or
- (vi) The Electoral List of any Road Board District in respect of property within the Province of the annual rateable value of not less than £17.

4. Details of electoral provinces and candidates will be available at the polling place on election day.

390. SHAVING AND HAIR CUTTING.

1. A male member will keep the hair of his head tidy and short, and will shave his chin, under lip and the cheeks of his face. He may wear a moustache, but will not wear side whiskers.

391. REMOVAL OF COAL FROM N.A. RYS COAL STACKS -

Coal is being removed by unauthorised pers from NA Rys Coal Stacks. These Coal Stacks are held as reserves for NA Rys and must not be removed. Disciplinary action is to be taken against any offenders.

392. POSTAL.

No matter how thorough the Postal Service Organisation may be the efficiency of the whole Postal system will be seriously impaired if any laxity is permitted to occur in the treatment of mail matter within Coys.

The distribution of all letters, newspapers, and parcels addressed to a Coy becomes a Coy responsibility upon delivery of the mails to the Orderly Room Cpl and suitable arrangements must be made for the safe custody of mail matter, particularly registered articles and parcels pending delivery to the addressee.

Coys are all so responsible for seeing that proper redirection arrangements are maintained, and that mail matter received for personnel who have left the unit is correctly redirected to their new units of address.

All mail bags received will be returned to the Postal Service without delay and Officers will ensure mail bags are on no account used purposes other than the conveyance of mails.

393. INCINERATING TYPE LATRINES - INSTRUCTIONS FOR BURNING OF.

(a) Engt Pastora -

Before use - Place in one or two light logs, roughly length of latrine.

After use - Throw in several chips.

To burn - Light each opening using newspaper or small quantity old oil.

While burning keep all lids closed except one farthest from flue, into this one place down draught cone, add more wood if burn is incomplete.

(b) Single 44 gal drum type.

As above except before use make a substantial "crows nest" of short pieces of wood.

(c) On no account must paper bark or sawdust be used.
