Six decomposed bodies were seen at intervals along track.

(b) Condition of track:

Fairly good condition, boggy in places. Up to 10 yds in width.

Although boggy in places track could be made jeepable with little work. No culverts or bridges considered necessary. Track and ground either side would allow use of ths.

2. PATROL SERIAL 2 (1 Offr 10 ORS, FOO to 822713) 18 Jan)

(a) Contact

Fwd scout made contact with enemy at 825715 at 181020L. A right flanking move by patrol drew fire from 2 to 3 LMGs and rifles from 15 yds range. Strength of enemy est at 20 to 25. One enemy killed on track, our fwd scout under covering fire captured rifle and haversack but was wounded. Patrol then withdrew to Arty phone at 814718. Arty fire brought down on enemy posn. Results unobserved.

(b) Condition of enemy

Jap killed was young, age est about 20 yrs, in good condition, clothing fair, and wearing boots and cap.

From 822715 track swung NORTH to 825715. Wide track ended and became narrow, boggy, footpad with hy jungle either side.

At 823715 a branch track running at 180° was reced for 500 K.

JANUARY 1945

- January 1. 3 Aust Div Athletic Meeting TOROKINA Perimeter opposite Memorial Park won by 61 Bn 71½ pts. Team won llpennants and 25 prizes.
- January 2. CO, 2 IC, Sig Offr and Mortar Offr left to visit A Coy in HANEMO Area.
- January 3. Issued Op Instr No 4 to extension of perimeter defences to include one Bn area of 164 US Regt and a Coy outpost posn on BLUE RIDGE near Hill 1000. D Coy moves from left to right flank and B Coy prepares outpost posn. Recce by Capt Hutchinson and Lt Gibson.

 Rang CO at JEEP HEAD and received Ok for my plan.
- January 4. CO returned from HANEMO area and at 1700 hrs left for 29

 Bde HQ at MODIONU. Change over of posns on TOROKINA perimeter

 Further recce by Capt Hutchinson.
 - January 5. Flame-throwing demonstration at WHITCOMB TRAIL RANGE at 1400 hrs Div and Bde Offrs present. 1600 hrs CO returned from 29 Bde 61 Bn to move to TAGESSI R-JABA R area.

- January 9. CO visited D Coy on MARIROPA R arrangements for their withdrawal less 17 Pl to area 500 yds South of BnHQ.

 Relief commenced. A Coy arrived from HANEMO area with JEEP HEAD Pers.
- January 10. Lecture 7 Bde HQ on Inf-Tk Co-op by Maj Arnott 2/4 Armd Sqn attended by "O"Group. CO and Adjt to tea at Bde HQ.
- January 11. Local patrols only, incl patrol along north bank of JABA R.
- January 12. Local patrols only. '
- January 13. CO, Adjt, Coy Comds and other offrs attend Tk Demonstration with 2/4 Aust Armd Regt at WEBB RD. Visited LOB. B Coy moved to biv area on EAST WEST Trail for tank trg. D Coy less 17 Pl took over B Coy's beach defs.
- January 14. Recce to 2/8 Cdo perimeters on JABA R at 793737. CO Addt

 IO Sig Offr and OC and Pl Comds of C Coy. Inspected Defs.
 Reported to 3 Div (CO And Adjt) for orders 1500 hrs.
 Issued Op Order No 1 for the relief of 2/8 Cdo Sqn by
 TWEMFORCE (OC Maj Twemlow) consisting of C Coy, D Coy less
 17 Pl, 2 dets mortars, 7 SBs, 1 Sub-sec MMG, 3 Int pers,
 7 Sigs. Lecture by BM to Offrs & NCOs on Inf Co-op with Tanks

- January 15. Relief of 2/8 Cdo by TWEMFORCE commenced. A. LCA fouled on second trip and held up mov. Stores transferred to outboard and ferried BLP No 6.

 2 IC visited LOB area and B Coy Tk Trg.
- January 16. No further mov of TWEMFORCE except stores.

 Local patrols (security) only.
- January 17. Patrol Lt Brinkley and 10 ORs along KUPON track to approx 817716. No contact. Reported track suitable for tanks except for fallen trees and one bomb crater approx 807725. Only positive sign of recent Jap occupation was freshly dug lily roots about 3 hrs old at 815718. Maze of faint tracks there running to SOUTH. Six enemy dead in vicinity of track. 2 IC teed up defs of arty tps near 10 Pl mear JABA R mouth. Remainder of TWEMFORCE sent on foot up south bank of JABA R. All in posn by 1200 hrs.

 A Coy moved to EAST-WEST Trail for Tk Trg B Coy returned.
- January 18. Patrol Lt McIntyre and 10 ORs with FOO contacted enemy at approx 824715. Shots exchanged. 1 enemy killed. own cas 1 wounded (Pte Davenport) Patrol withdrew owing to insufficient L/T intercomm and arty fire was brought down on Jap positions with unknown results. Captured eqpt one short Meji, 1 haversack containing dixies for lily roots and quantities, of rice and brown sugar.

 Bde Comd visited CO and discussed future ops and the relief of 29 Bde by 7 Bde.

 11 Pl relieved 17 Pl at outpost posn on MARIROPA R.

 2 IC teed up defs of Arty Tp with 10 Pl near BnHQ.
- January 19. Patrol Lt Plummer, 16 ORs, contacted enemy 825715.

 Position attacked without arty co-op and captured 1415L.

 Cas enemy total force 7 killed 1 enemy dead in trench apparently from malnutrition. Own Cas 2 wounded (Pte Anderson 6N and Cpl Woodward R.) Area captured was prepared def posn. Deserted Jap biv area approx 324713 with about 12 huts. Captured equipment includes 1 MMG 6 rifles 1 sword, documents and personal effects. Japs fairly well clothed and wearing boots.

 Patrol (standing) to Log Xing NMS (Lt Clarkson) six enemy dead seen by patrol.
- January 20. CO and Pnr Offr on recce re road South bank JABA R to TWEMFORCE. Padre O'Sullivan (former RC Missionary in this area) came to lumch and gave us information re MOSINA-MOSIGETTA area. Patrol (Lt McKellar and 16 ORs) to Log Sing NMS. Lt McIntyre and 17 ORs patrol to 829704. Destroyed Jap biv area of 18 huts at 821704 and moved along PAGANA R. Contacted 5 Japs enemy cas 1 Killed 1 Wounded. Own Cas Nil. Reported enemy dead at 825715 had been hurriedly buried and a quantity of arty sig wire removed. Captured 1 short rifle, 2 grenades, and persequent. Arty registered on Jap Biv area etc (BRINKBASE)
- January 21. Lt Brinkley and 25 ORs out to form outpost position and dig in at 822714 to be relieved next day. Firm base est. and patrols sent 1000 yds EAST to set ambush at 830704. NMS Patrol withdrew and found freshly constructed hut at 826714 Jap cart without wheels found infirm base area.
 - 1 NCO 12 ORs to Log Xing to stay overnight.
 - 7 Aust Inf Bde OP Order No 7 re relief of 29 Bde by 7 Bde.

- January 22. Area of responsibility extended to incl track junc 822693 and to 850704. Lt Brinkley's patrol returned after being relieved by patrol under Lt McKellar. Brinkley patrolled to 836699 and along south kand track to 822702-NMS. Lt McKellar's patrol reached general area south-west of track junc 822713. Sighted one unarmed Jap. Returned to BRINKBASE at track junc for night. Standing patrol to Log Xing relieved Sitnor. 11 Pl on MARIRGPA R report 7 natives from MAINUK.

 January 25. They report 5 Japs in village very exhausted.
- January 23. Bde Comd and BM walled 0815 hrs. Lt Charkson and fighting patrol left to relieve Lt McKellar. CLARKBASE est at 834703.

 16 platoon patrol 350 yds fwd of this posn. Wounded 1 Jap.

 A further Jap wounded South of track whilst carrying LMG on back.
- January 24. BnHQ, HQ Coy and A Coy moved fwd to JABA R area. BnHQ took over comd from TWEMFORCE at 1100 hrs. A Coy in posn at 812723 at 1100 hrs. A Coy in posn 812723 at 1500 hrs. Patrol from CLARKBASE (18 P1) fwd 350 yds wounded 1 Jap who used his own grenade on himself. Night 23/24 CLARKBASE Surrounded by enemy no casualties.
- January 25. Night 24/25 All sectors quiet night. B Coy HQ and 11 Pl arrived 790737. Co went fwd with IO and Mortar Offr to A Coy. Lt McKellar and 16 Pl left to relieve 18 Pl at CLARKBASE. Patrols (18 Pl) fwd of CLARKBASE 700 yds found Japs est 20 in posns. Killed one Jap carrying water. Patrol (15 Pl) relieved 13 Pl at BRINKBASE. 13 Pl reported 25 huts 830696. 15 Pl investigated saw 8 Japs one killed and captured rifle and papers. Arty ranging forward.

 Visitors. AQGSIII, "I" Corps and Div, DAGMG(L), Maj Millihen and Lt Stenlake.
- January 26. Quiet night. WOII Roberts (ANGAU) and natives on recce for track to MOSINA. at 843699 patrol was ambushed and one man (Pte Burke) wounded in forearm. Recce patrols of TUJU R area and area south east of BRINKBASE revealed nothing.

 17 P1 (Lt Dawes) relieved 15 P1 (Lt McIntyre) at BRINKBASE. First jeep through to BRINKBASE. Fnr bridges near B Ech completed. ADS (Maj Milligan) moved in. Bde Comd called 1500 hrs. 10 P1 moved fwd from JABA PT to 790737.

 Orders moved for fwd move of D Coy 1800 hrs.
 - January 27. 11 P1 relieved 17 P1 at BRINKBASE and 17 P1 relieved 16 P1 at CLARKBASE. 16 P1 made contact approx 841699 two enemy wounded own cas nil. D Coy moved through and occupied that posn. Arty registered squeals heard. 11 P1 moved forward to CLARKBASE. At BRINKBASE Pnr Offr and 2 Secs Pnrs, RSM and BnHQ digging party. BC (Maj Olsen) moved in to live at BnHQ. Jeep convoys of supplies, stores and ammunition through to CLARKBASE. BM had lunch this HQ. Fwd B Ech move in BP No 6.
- January 28. Stand down patrol from D Coy reced Jap biv area 300 yards in front of position and found Aust rifle (thought to be that of police boy who lost one recently) Patrol sighted one Jap, fired at him but Jap escaped. Fighting patrol sent fwd from D Coy with ANGAU pers. Track junc found at 841699 and D Coy moved forward. Harrassing fire from enemy (est 1 LMG 5 rifle Section encircled but found nothing. No cas. Artyand Mortar registration fwd of D Coy area. Track leading south showed signs of much use and fresh timber had been cut in area.

 Rations sent by outboard from BP6 to BRINKBASE. Tae/R flown KUPON-NIGITAN -MOSINA.
- January 29. BnHQ and HQ Gp moved fwd to BRINKBASE, opened 0900 hrs. Fighting patrol

BnHQ and HQ Gp moved fwd to BRINKBASE, opened 0900 hrs. Fighting patrol 18 Pl made contact 100 yds fwd of D Coy posn. Resistance overcome, patrol continued to 1000 yds. Enemy 7 killed 1 wounded. Patrol (12)(1) investigated track to south but found it turned westwards and was not track to MOSINA. Patrol B Coy (Lt Sloan) on recce of Jap biv area found 2 dead reported as wounded 27 Jan. Ambush set by 12 Pl 600 yds fwd D Coy sighted 2 Japs who escaped. Rained like hell during afternoon - dug outs swamped. 7 days res rations and amn at CLARKBASE.

January 30. Fighting patrol 18 Pl and 10 Pl (McKellar and Gibson)
moved along KUPON track to 856704 about 2000 yds from KUPON
Assault cable laid. NMS. Reported track to poss coy biv
at 848698 good then inclined to be swampy. On return found
track 18 Pl fought along 29 Jan, now MOSINA track identified by ANGAU.

Recce patrol from 11 Pl south from CLARKBASE to approx
676836. No tracks in area, rather swampy. Two Japs seen

Recce patrol from 11 Pl south from Character approx 676836. No tracks in area, rather swampy. Two Japs seen just fwd of D Coy at 1845 hrs. Engaged with MMG and Mortar. Result not known.

January 3.1. Two days fighting patrol 11 P1 (Lt Whybird) left for KUPON.

Three days recce patrol 8 P1 (Lt Tomlinson) left for NIGITAL

area. D Coy moved fwd and occupied track junc 843698 by

1245 hrs. Fighting patrol (18 P1)(Lt Clarkson) moved

approx 1600 yards down DAWES TRACK without contact. One

Jap body found evidently killed by patrol 29 Jan. Track

reported to be 2' to 3' wide. Small biv area 1500 yards,

where track corduroyed. Eqpt found rifles, bayonets, pers

eqpt. Evidence decomposed bodies in area. Old Jap gun

posn found near CLARKBASE (838699) large dug outs, at

least 50 shells (70 or 75 mm) spare parts for gun, sights

etc, 3 carts with spare parts, 2 pack saddles, and US

rifles. 2 unserviceable SCR 536 sets.

Gen Bridgeford and Brig Field visited fwd tps and this HQ.
