



TRANSPORTATION OF PERSONNEL IN TRAILERS - 8 CWT

1. The carrying of personnel in trailers 8 cwt is forbidden except in cases of operational necessity.
2. Coy's requiring extra transport for the carriage of personnel will requisition for same through Bn HQ.

SALUTING

Officers of field rank and above.-

1. (a) Officers of field rank and above will salute their superiors in rank at all times, whether on duty or parade or not, before and after addressing or being addressed by them and when passing or being passed by them.

(b) While on duty or parade, officers of field rank and above will salute their equals in rank who are senior to them before and after addressing or being addressed by them.

Officers below field rank.-

2. (a) Officers below field rank will salute all officers of field rank and above at all times, whether on duty or parade or not, before and after addressing or being addressed by them and when passing or being passed by them.

(b) Before and after addressing them or being addressed by them when on duty or parade, lieutenants will salute captains, and both lieutenants and captains will salute their equals in rank who are senior to them.

Other ranks.-

3. W.Os, NCO's and private soldiers will salute officers at all times before and after addressing them or being addressed by them and when passing or being passed by them, except -

- (i) in a crowded thoroughfare or assembly; or
- (ii) during an exercise in the field; or
- (iii) when on parade or performing duty under the immediate control of a superior; or
- (iv) when precluded by the nature of their duties from so doing.

- 4. A salute made to an officer will be returned by him; when made to two or more officers together, it will be returned by the senior officer only.
- 5. Members will salute officers of His Majesty's Naval and Air Forces and of Allied Naval, Military and Air Forces in accordance with the principles set out above.
- 6. The attention of all members will be directed to AMR & O's 1153 and 1154 with regard to saluting when the National Anthem is played.

DRESS

- 1. The following instructions will be promulgated to all ranks IMMEDIATELY and personnel informed that strict disciplinary action will be taken against offenders.
- 2. Shirts will only be discarded when doing manual labour or washing in Coy lines or at discretion of Coy Comds.

MISC IDENTITY

- (a) Units will ensure that identity discs are worn by all ranks at all times. Pro pers have been instructed to check pers at irregular intervals.
- (b) The necessity for the wearing of identity discs was recently apparent in the WIDE BAY area when two seriously wounded soldiers required a blood transfusion which could NOT be given until blood tests had been taken.

WASH OUT SKIN DISEASES

The following extract from a circular issued to all ranks of 1st Aust Corps is promulgated for the information of pers in this Bde.

- (a) Skin diseases are obstinate, unpleasant and sometimes lead to fatal complications.
- (b) Most can be prevented by:-
 - (i) Clean dry skin
 - (ii) Clean dry clothing
- (c) Tips to remember for your skin:-
 - (i) Bathe once daily
 - (ii) If you have more than one bath a day use soap only once. Excessive soap destroys the natural oil in the skin.
 - (iii) Do not have more than two hot baths each week.
 - (iv) Soaps impregnated with chemicals may weaken the skin's resistance to disease. Use plain non-impregnated soap.
 - (v) Dry skin THOROUGHLY, especially in crotch, armpits and between toes.
 - (vi) Use powder after a bath - plenty of it.
- (d) Tips to remember for your clothing:-
 - (i) Boil as often as possible
 - (ii) Wash with soap and water other times - not too much soap - not strong caustic soap mixtures
 - (iii) Rinse soap out in plenty of water. This is important
 - (iv) Turn clothes inside out to dry - let the sun kill disease fungi.
- (e) Sea bathing helps - when you can get it.
- (f) Regular sun-baking helps to beat skin diseases but this is not essential. Avoid exposure to sun when a rash is actually present.
- (g) If you get skin disease, even a little bit, don't fool with it yourself - consult the RMO - immediately.

SLIT TRENCHES

1. All slit trenches which retain water are to be filled in to prevent mosquito breeding.

101.

MALARIA CONTROL

- (a) AMCU has brought to the attention of this HQ that with the advent of the wet weather the control of mosquito breeding is more difficult and that the adult mosquito population can be expected to increase during coming weeks.
- (b) Attention is also drawn to the fact that several cases of MT Malaria have been reported from units in neighbouring areas during recent weeks. This dispels all doubts about the mosquito in this area being infected.
- (c) The Bde Comd directs that units will review their anti-malaria precautions with particular reference to such items as:-
- (i) Regular inspection of Mosquito Nets and repair or replacement of those defective.
 - (ii) Atebrin administration
 - (iii) Application of mosquito repellent
 - (iv) Spraying of tents
 - (v) Dress
 - (vi) Erection of mosquito nets prior to sundown.
 - (vii) Filling in of slit trenches which retain water after rain.
- (d) Any relaxation of precautions within this bde must be tightened up if our record of nil cases is to be maintained.

DRESS

(a) Hats will be worn turned down with regulation dent. "Pork Pie" and other unauthorised dents will NOT be tolerated. A number of extremely soiled and US hats have been observed. Coys will inspect hats and arrange replacement of those US.

(a) Picture screenings and other entertainments conducted in 5 Aust Base Sub Area are out of bounds to all personnel who are camped WEST of the KALUMALAGE RIVER.

BEACH FOR USE OF AANS

- (a) The area within 100 yards of dressing shed erected on South side of mouth of WUNYONG RIVER. Ref DRINA 1 inch to 1 mile 026851 is out of bounds to all personnel except members of Women's Services and their guests.
- (b) Personnel will not proceed past the sign posts erected on access road to area and on the beach. Except in the event of operational necessity.

Particulars of Loan

- (a) Loan applications may be made for an amount of £10 or a multiple of £10.
- (b) Treasury Bonds are payable to bearer and are issued at par for £10, £50, £100, £500 and £1,000.
- (c) Inscribed Stock may be purchased at par for amounts of £100 or multiples of £10 above £100.
- (d) Interest is payable at 2½% per annum if invested for five years and at 3½% per annum if invested for sixteen years, and will be credited half-yearly to a member's savings bank account or current account, if desired.
- (e) Interest will be subject to Commonwealth taxation but not to any income tax under the law of a State. During the period of uniform taxation, a rebate of 2/- in the pound on interest will be allowed to cover freedom from State taxation.
- (f) Any bank nominated by a member will, if requested, hold the Bonds in safe custody.
- (g) Application forms will be available from Coy Loan Office and are required to be completed in duplicate. An applicant's signature will be witnessed by an officer.
- (h) Sufficient credit must be available in the member's pay book to cover the amount he or she desires to invest in loan. The amount subscribed will be debited in the pay book.
- (i) Cash may be accepted in payment of a loan subscription, in which case the amount tendered will be entered in the pay book to establish the necessary credit and a pay sergeant's or cash office receipt issued and pasted in the pay book.
- (j) The Commonwealth Bank will forward to a member an interim receipt for the amount subscribed.
- (k) Both Treasury Bonds and Inscribed Stock are readily realisable and may be sold at any time. Any bank will arrange this for a member, if desired.

Duration of patrol — 1 1/2 days.

Duties commenced immediately on arrival, a guard of 1 N.C.O. and 12 men being mounted which was maintained for the duration of the patrol. For the purposes of patrolling and guards the patrol was organised into 3 sections of 1 N.C.O. and 12 men. The remainder formed patrol H.Q.

after two patrols had camped at BAIRIMAN it was reported that four or five cases of dysentery had occurred amongst the natives there. It was rather a dirty village. All following patrols camped at BINITPOON over night which is on the track to BAIRIMAN.

The DRINA & KAITON patrols embodied a piece of the Dring plantation, plantation owners deserted buildings, Drina aerodrome and KAITON village. A native guide was necessary as the plantation is very overgrown and the tracks obscured.

The track to TUAPOONA No. 1. followed dry creek beds and rather difficult to follow without a native guide.

TUAPOONA No. 2. was a new village discovered by previous patrol. No tracks led to the village, the only way to reach there was by native canal of the DRINA river.

a contact was maintained with Patrol Post No. 2 on the track beyond PUPPAL. The mail for the patrol was picked up at that post.

A three day patrol was made south to the TORLU River by Lt. Reynolds and 2/6pl Bunter constituting a round trip of approximately 40 miles. An amount of useful information was gained and passed on to the "1" Sec. No other troops apart from A.N.C.F.V. had been as far down and a funny incident occurred on entering the village of L.H.U. The "Luhai" was a man with a very guilty conscience for when he was approached he was so nervous that he couldn't speak for fully four minutes. He was literally knocking at the knees and had to clutch hold of the doorway of his hut for support. He apparently thought that the patrol was there to look into his misdeeds. When he came to it was very hard to stop him from talking.

NATIVES

The natives from all villages contacted were of a very friendly nature. There was never any trouble to obtain a guide or a canoe to cross any of the rivers.

DUTIES.

- One M.C. patrolling.
- One M.C. camp guard.
- One M.C. camp duties.

These duties rotated daily.

The post stood to each day at 0530 hrs and 1800 hrs. A patrol from the M.C. on guard would clear the front before "stand down". A sentry post was maintained by day on the track at the northern entrance to the camp also one at the southern entrance to the camp. At night the two sentries came together as a prowler patrol within the perimeter. They also performed the duties of the mosquito flying squad.

RATIONS

Rations were quite good. There was no fresh food but the situation was relieved by Sgt. Baultier baking an occasional batch of bread in a mud oven and also one or two hauls of fish that were caught with the assistance of the natives.

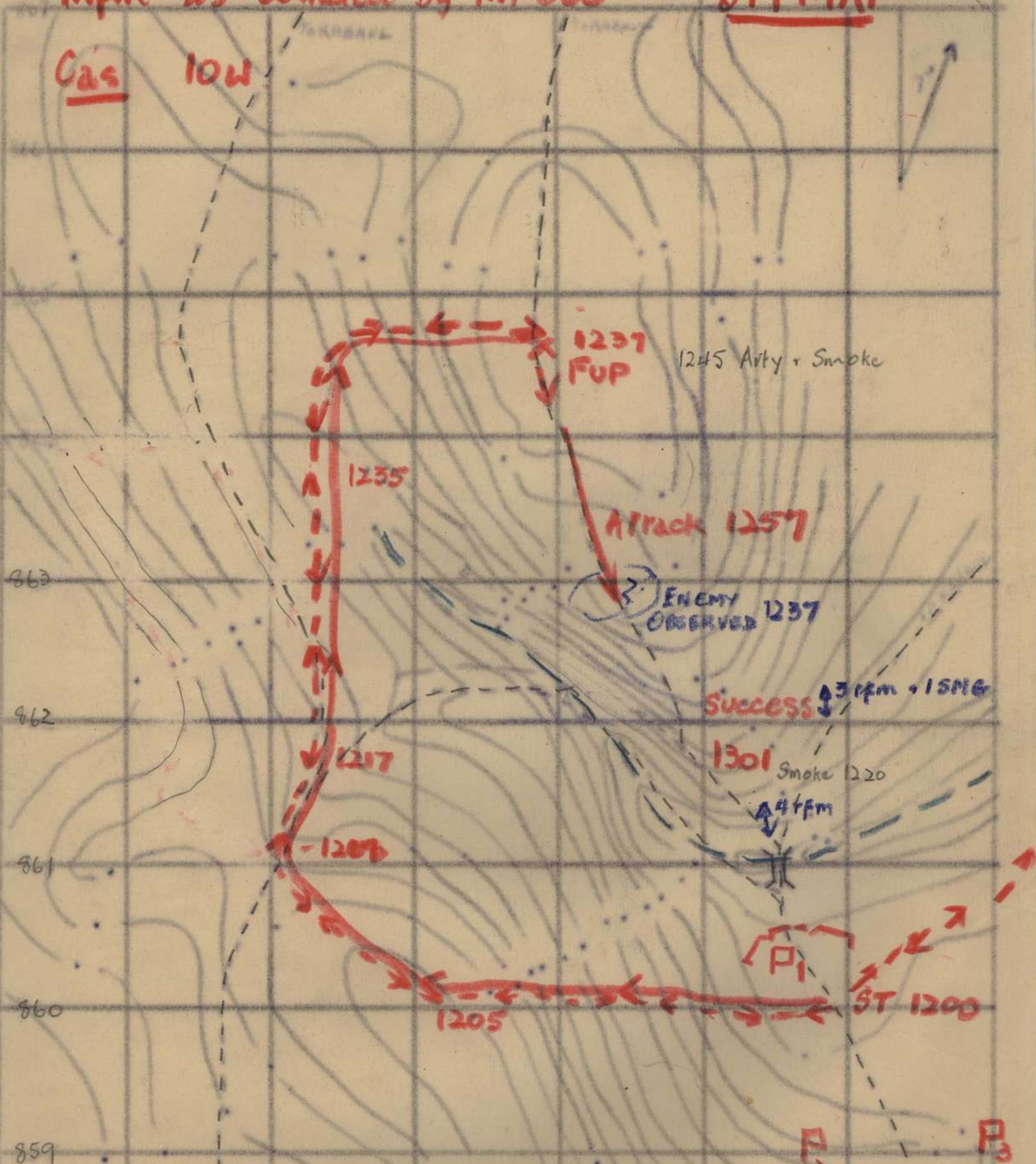

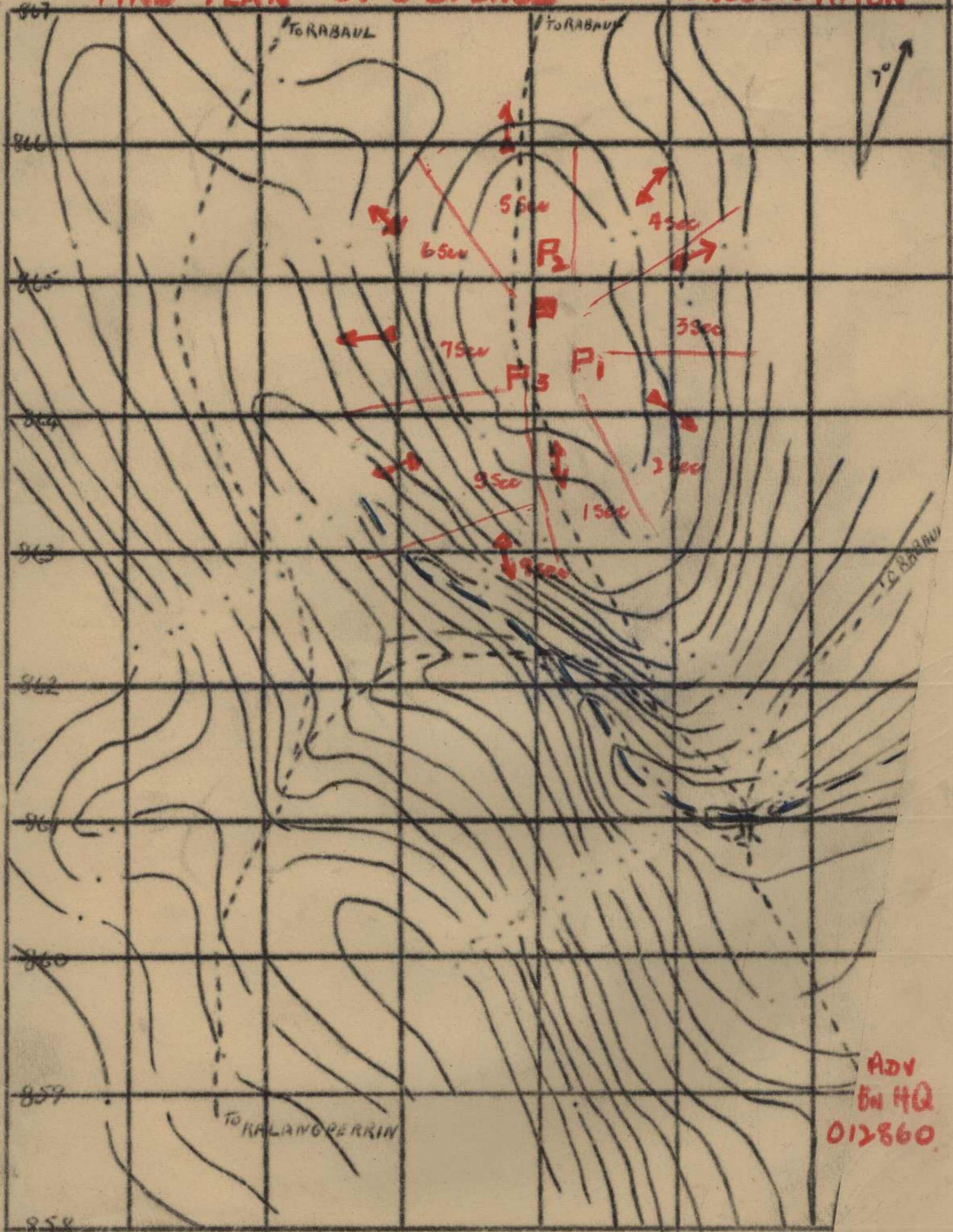
