244. FLY CONTROL

The danger of fly-borne disease owing to the large number of flies in the area is stressed. All coys will pay particular attention to the eradication of fly breeding grounds in unit areas. These consist largely of night-soil dumps left by the Japanese. The method of disposal of these will be by spraying the drum with Distillate or heavy oil, burying the drum and contents under 4 feet or rammed down earth, and spraying the burial area and surroundings again with oil.

245. POST-DISCHARGE MALARIA.

1. (a) The Repatriation Commission will accept responsibility for providing any treatment necessary in respect of the first attack of malaria suffered by an ex-member of the AMF after his discharge from the Army.
(b) During such treatment, the Commission will institute inquiries as to eligibility or otherwise for the treatment of any subsequent attacks of malaria.
2. On the first occasion after his discharge that an ex-member becomes ill with malaria, he should -
 - (i) if resident in a capital city - report to the Repatriation Department's branch office or general hospital, either in person or by telephone, when immediate examination and treatment will be arranged;
 - (ii) if resident in the country - report to and request treatment from the nearest Repatriation local medical officer, who will send a report to the Repatriation Department. It will be necessary for the ex-member to identify himself by production of his discharge certificate.
3. (a) If it is not possible so to report, the ex-member should consult and request treatment from his local civilian doctor, and provided prompt advice is sent by the doctor or the ex-member to the Repatriation Department, the Commission will assume full responsibility for the payment of medical fees, hospital fees and the cost of drugs.
(b) Arrangements for any further treatment will be notified to the ex-member by the Repatriation Commission as soon as possible.
4. Information regarding the treatment of malaria, with particular reference to ex-service personnel, has been sent by the Commonwealth Department of Health to civil medical practitioners.

5. In view of the foregoing, it is unnecessary for any member to be examined by a final medical board at the time of his discharge merely on account of a history of malaria. If the member has had an attack during his service, it will be on record in his medical history. Whether or not the member has had an attack during his service, he will be cared for by the Repatriation Commission should he develop an attack of malaria after his discharge.

246. DAMAGE TO SIGNAL COMMUNICATIONS

Instances have occurred recently where extensive damage has been caused to signal communications in this area due mainly to -

- (a) Working parties carrying out camp construction
- (b) Lack of supervision by persons in charge of the construction of roads, culverts etc.

Attention is drawn to First Aust Army Order A261 of 4 Nov 44 which states:

"No member will without authority, destroy, remove, or otherwise interfere with, (whether by cutting, discharging firearms at, or otherwise) any insulators or Sig Cable."

Application will be made for the trial of offenders by Court Martial.

Coy Commanders will ensure that all ranks under their command are warned to exercise the greatest care when coming into contact with signal cables whether they be on the ground or air-line.

246. NATIVES IN VEHICLES

Natives will NOT be carried in Service vehicles except when being transported in organised parties in the course of military duty.

The practice of giving "lifts" to wandering natives will cease.

247. CONSERVATION OF ATEBRIN

1. The supply of atebirin has become a matter of difficulty throughout the world. Unless the strictest economy is exercised it will not be possible to supply urgent requirements to Australian personnel serving in malarious areas. The following instructions will be promulgated immediately:-

- a) No member will consume more than one tablet per day.
- b) Issues to individuals will not exceed requirements for 14 days, except in the case of those proceeding on leave, when the provisions of GRO, 321/44, para 28, will be observed.
- c) No tablets in excess of requirements for consumption to next date of issue will be retained by individuals.

2. Officers will be responsible for policing the above instructions.

248. BATHING

During the past few weeks there have been several cases of tps sustaining badly cut feet, lacerations to the face and in one case fatal injuries through carelessness when bathing and diving in the sea. Tps will be warned of this danger and care will be exercised to prevent any recurrence.

249. SHORTS

The wearing of shorts within the Bn area is strictly forbidden except during organised sports. Swimming is NOT an organised sport for the purposes of this order and NO pers will wear shorts in and around coy lines or going to and from the beach.

250. DESPATCH OF SOUVENIRS ETC. THROUGH POSTAL CHANNELS

Instances have recently been reported of tps in NEW BRITAIN despatching souvenirs through postal channels without the certificate required by GRO 209/45. Such certificate must be att to the souvenir and is the owner's authority for possessing the article.

In addition all parcels must contain a slip showing the number name and unit of sender.

The attention of all tps is to be drawn to GRO 383/44 which prohibits the despatch of ammunition etc through postal or other channels.

Failure to comply with the above instructions may render parcels liable to confiscation. Certificates are available from I.O.

251. SECURITY OF STORES OF AN ATTRACTIVE NATURE

Officers and other ranks entrusted with stores of an attractive nature are personally responsible for any loss occurring by reason of their own negligence.

Coy Comds will ensure that this responsibility is clearly made known to all such personnel.

Pistols will be carried in accordance with instructions issued by competent authority. When not being carried in the course of duty, pistols will be handed to unit "Q" store for custody or kept in a locked box.

Where by reason of constant usage it is not practicable for the holder of a pistol to hand it in to unit "Q" Store, and no other locking facilities are available, he will take the utmost care to avoid the possibility of theft. In particular pistols will not be left lying on tables or in other places where they are readily visible.

Watches will be kept in the immediate personal possession of the personnel to whom they are on issue. They will not be left lying on tables or in other places where they are readily visible.

Other stores of an attractive nature, such as compasses and binoculars, will be handed into unit "Q" store for custody when not in actual use.

252. ANGAU AREA - RABAU. OUT OF BOUNDS

The ANGAU Area RABAU is out of bounds to all ranks except when on official business.

253. ATTENDANCE OF NATIVES AT PICTURE SHOWS.

Natives will NOT be admitted picture shows. RPC will police area when tpt available. Meanwhile pro and gds refuse all natives admittance picture show areas.

254. CONSERVATION OF CURRENCY

1. A recent article in "Guinea Gold" dated 10 Aug 45 under the heading "Veterans Not to 'Blow' Deferred Pay" stated, inter alia, that members on being discharged would be permitted to draw a maximum amount of £30 from their pay account irrespective of the credit then appearing in their pay books.
2. Inquiries were immediately instituted by HQ First Army to ascertain whether this statement correctly set out the policy adopted in the Discharge Depots on the mainland.
3. LHQ now advises that an instruction has been issued providing that Paymaster at an LTD or AMF Discharge Depot may pay to any member about to be discharged, such amount as the member desires to draw up to the extent of credit in his pay book.

255. OUT OF BOUNDS.

1. All islands off the coast of NEW BRITAIN are out of bounds to all troops except persons authorised to proceed to such islands on duty.
2. This order will be promulgated to all ranks.

256. BEACHHEAD - OUT OF BOUNDS

MALAGUNA beachhead is out of bounds at all times to all personnel except those on authorised duty.

257. CONTROL OF RD BLOCKS

1. No member of the Aust Forces and no civilian or merchant seaman will be allowed to pass Rd Blocks except as provided herein.
2. Persons whose military duty or civilian business requires them to enter the area in which Japanese forces are located may pass the Rd Blocks on production of a current pass issued by this HQ (GS Int)
3. Provost patrols are being instituted outside the Rd Blocks. Personnel in the area without proper authority will be taken into custody

258. WAR GRATUITY

1. Permission has been granted for the payment of a War Gratuity in recognition of honourable service during the war.

8. Any period during which a member was NOT eligible to receive the full rate of pay prescribed for his rank or appointment will NOT contribute to either his general or overseas qualifying service.

9. Date of Entitlement The date of which a member is entitled to be credited with war gratuity will be six months after the cessation of hostilities or if a member is still serving -

- i) upon termination of service; or
- ii) 12 months after the cessation of hostilities whichever is the earlier date.

10. Date of Payment Payment will be made 5 years 6 months after cessation of hostilities unless the amount is under £10 or is made to -

- i) widow of a member
- ii) widowed mother of an unmarried deceased member
- iii) mother of a deceased member if totally dependant on the deceased member or in necessitous circumstances
- iv) a member who is blind or totally and permanently incapacitated.

11. The whole or portion of a War Gratuity may be made available, upon the request of a member and recommendation of prescribed authority, for the purpose of being used towards the cost of erection or purchase of a dwelling.

12. Compound Interest at $3\frac{1}{2}\%$ per annum will be credited unless the gratuity is paid within 3 months of entitlement

13. The War Gratuity and Interest will NOT be liable to income tax

259. OUT OF BOUNDS

Bde HQ area is out of bounds to all ranks unless proceeding through the main entrance on business. Pers will NOT take short cuts across the area for any purpose.

260. RADIOGRAMS SERVICE FROM AUSTRALIA AND OTHER COUNTRIES

Radiogram service is now available from Australia and other places within the permissible British communication system.

261. EXPEDITIONARY FORCES MESSAGE SERVICE TO AND FROM AUSTRALIA

1. An EFM service to and from AUSTRALIA has been introduced for members of the services.
2. Messages, which may consist of three standard texts taken from lists available at all Army Post Offices, will be transmitted at a flat rate of 2/6.
3. Messages lodged at any Army Post Office will be forwarded by air to LAE or PT MORESBY, from whence they will be transmitted by AWA radio telegraph to SYDNEY, and delivered to addressees by mail.

262. WEARING OF RIBANDS OF MEDALS AND DECORATIONS.

1. Ribands will be worn by -
male members on jackets (all types);
2. Ribands may be worn by -
male members on shirts (all types)
3. When ribands are worn, the following will be observed:-
 - (a) The ribands will be $\frac{3}{8}$ -inch in length
 - (b) Rows will be conveniently spaced not more than $\frac{1}{2}$ -inch apart, and the centre of the lowest row will be immediately above the centre of the left breast pocket or, if there is no such pocket, in a corresponding position.
 - (c) Rows will not project beyond the lapel or the shoulder seam.

263. FINAL MEDICAL BOARDS

Applications for final medical boards (AAF D2) are being made on wholly inadequate grounds in the belief that failure to make a claim for repatriation now will invalidate any future claim.

As an excessive number of such applications will slow down demob procedure, the following facts will be brought to general notice -

- (a) There is no time limit within which a claim for repatriation must be lodged
- (b) Such claim may be lodged at any time after discharge.
- (c) A negative answer to para 7 of AAF D2(a) does NOT prejudice any future claim for a war pension by the member.



264. ACCEPTANCE OF PRIVATE CABLEGRAMS ON ARMY WIRELESS CIRCUITS

1. To enable more rapid clearing of cables lodged by AMF personnel at RABAU who desire to use the AWA service from LAE to the mainland, Signals will accept from the Army Postal Service at RABAU cables for transmission by Army wireless circuits to LAE.

2. Signals will accept the traffic and transmit to LAE daily on a deferred category after all army traffic.

265. OUT OF BOUNDS

All wrecked Japanese ships or craft are out of bounds to all troops. No such craft will be boarded or articles removed without prior permission of NOIC RABAU.

266. ENTRY INTO GUARDED TUNNELS

Recently attempts have been made to force entry into tunnels guarded by Aust, Allied or Japanese guards.

Guarded tunnels are OUT OF BOUNDS to all ranks unless in possession of an authorised pass which must be presented to the guard.

All ranks are to be warned that entering or attempting to enter a guarded tunnel without authority is an offence and will be treated as such.

267. BOUNDS - HOSPITAL AREAS

Beach areas within the boundaries of 118 Gen Hosp and 105 CCS are out of bounds to all ranks other than unit personnel.

268. HOOKWORM

Several cases of Hookworm are being admitted to medical units each week from troops under command. Troops will not walk about barefooted except when actually on beaches.

269. VOLUNTEERS AA TRANSPORTATION CORPS

Applications are invited from members with low priority points, or members who have volunteered to serve on during the demobilization period, for transfer to the Australian Transportation Corps.

Applications will be forwarded to Bn HQ on 9 Nov 45.

270. SCRUB TYPHUS

Contrary to general opinion amongst troops it has been conclusively proved that scrub typhus does occur in this area. Sub Unit comds will ensure that all clothes are treated with mite repellent and that all precautions are taken against this disease.

271. PERMITS TO LEAVE CAMP AREA

It is once again brought to the notice of all tps that the areas North of Bde HQ and South of the 28 Bn are out of bounds to all pers unless -

- a) they are travelling on duty; or
- b) they are in possession of a pass issued by the Coy Comd showing their destination and reason for journey.

Disciplinary action will be taken against offenders.

272. LOSS OF COMBINED LEAVE PASS AND RAIL TICKETS.

1. Members will exercise a high standard of care in safeguarding tickets issued to them.
2. A rail warrant to replace a lost ticket will be issued by the CO or if time will not permit of the CO dealing with the matter and the RTO is satisfied as to the identity of the member and of his being on duly authorised movement, by a RTO.
3. (a) A CO or RTO, before issuing a rail warrant in replacement of a lost ticket, under para 3 of this order, will ask the member if he consents to a deduction from his pay of the cost of the rail warrant to the Commonwealth
(b) No influence will be used to induce the member to give his consent. It will be clearly explained to the member that he is not bound to consent and that, if he does so, such consent will not exempt him from disciplinary action for any offence he may have committed in losing his ticket.
4. Any member losing a ticket will be charged with an offence, unless his CO is satisfied -
 - (i) that the loss was not due to blameworthy neglect on the part of the member, or
 - (ii) where the member has consented to a deduction from pay under para 4 of this order, that any offence which may have occasioned the loss of the ticket would not merit any other punishment than a deduction from pay.
5. The cost to the Commonwealth of rail warrants issued to members to replace lost tickets will be included in any charges laid against members in respect of the loss, if evidence of such cost is available

273. DAZZLING HEADLIGHTS ON MT VEHICLES

1. With the lifting of war-time blackout restrictions on the lighting of road vehicles and the increasing volume of road traffic, complaints are being made regarding the inconvenience and danger occasioned by glaring and dazzling lights on motor vehicles.
The adjustment and operation of headlights so that, as far as practicable, all avoidable dazzle to oncoming traffic is eliminated is only part of common road courtesy.
2. The following action in regard to army MT vehicles will, therefore, be taken by all concerned:-
 - (i) The headlamps of all MT vehicles required to operate on public highways will be checked and adjusted in accordance with the relevant law of the State in which the vehicle is operating.
 - (ii) The driver of an army vehicle, when approaching oncoming traffic (including trams) at night, will -
 - (a) dip his headlights, if the vehicle is equipped with a dipping device, when at a distance of not less than 300 feet from the oncoming vehicle and keep them dipped until he has passed it, even if the oncoming vehicle does not reciprocate;
 - (b) keep as near as practicable, having regard to all the circumstances, to the left-hand side of the road;

(c) so reduce the speed of his vehicle that, if it becomes necessary, he can stop it within the lessened limits of vision provided by the depressed beam.

(iii) Drivers will immediately report any defects in the lighting system of their vehicles, including incorrect focusing and aiming of the headlights and functioning of the dipping device, which they are not qualified or authorised to rectify.

277. TERRITORY OCCUPIED BY JAPANESE - UNAUTHORISED ENTRY

It is to be made clear to all ranks that, except in the strict course of duty, it is an offence in itself to enter or be found in territory occupied by the Japanese.

For the purpose of this order "Territory occupied by the Japanese" shall mean all territory south and west of a line drawn through map refs 750330 770350 776340 775330 780325 (Ref map RABAUL and BLANCHE BAY 1:20000 series).

Breaches of this order will be charged under AA 11 for infringement of a unit order.

278. PROHIBITED BATHING AREAS

Reference Map RABAUL 1 inch.

AIF personnel prohibited from bathing between NORDUP I 844377 and OBAL MISSION 866354.

279. UNLAWFUL POSSESSION OR DISPOSAL OF ARMS, EQUIPMENT AND EXPLOSIVES.

1. Attention is directed to -

- (i) the number of AIF, Allied and enemy arms which are passing into the hands of civilians, particularly of the criminal class;
- (ii) the fact that instances of unauthorized disposal and receipt, by barter and otherwise, of AIF and Allied arms and equipment by and to members of the AIF and Allied forces have been detected;
- (iii) the fact that members of the public have been killed or seriously injured as the result of the handling of explosives which have been taken or sent home as souvenirs by members or which have negligently been left in places to which the public has access.

2. Arms, equipment and explosives captured from the enemy are Commonwealth property and their possession by any member is unlawful unless authorised under paras 29 and 30 of GRC 209/1945.

3. A high degree of care will be exercised by members in respect of arms, equipment and explosives in their possession.

4. OC's will ensure that -

- (i) all prescribed safety precautions for the handling and storing of explosives are strictly observed;
- (ii) explosives used for training purposes are carefully safeguarded;

- (iii) no explosives are left unguarded in any place to which members of the public have access;
- (iv) in areas in which training with explosives is carried out, the utmost care is exercised to ensure that all blinds are searched for and destroyed in accordance with the prescribed safety regulations.

5. Except when acting in the course of his military duty or when authorised under paras 29 and 30 of GRO 209/1945, a member will not have in his possession, or deliver or transmit to, or acquire in any way from, or attempt to deliver or transmit to, or acquire in any way from, any other person (whether a civilian or a member of another Australian or Allied service) any arms or explosives.

6. (a) A member will not take his arms or equipment to his home unless it is impracticable to deposit them at an Aust Army cloakroom.

(b) A member will not deposit his arms or equipment in any cloakroom or establishment other than an Aust Army cloakroom, nor will he leave them unattended in an hotel, restaurant, cafe, theatre or any other such place.

7. When any member is charged with an offence in respect of any act, conduct or omission forbidden by this order, the CO will direct that a summary of evidence be taken and will make application to superior authority for direction whether the member will be tried by court-martial

280. PAYMENT OF PERSONNEL PRIOR TO MOVEMENT

Coys will ensure that action is taken for the payment of personnel prior to movement to NGDD.

Members staging at NGDD will NOT be paid on other than ordinary pay days whilst staging.

In order to conserve currency in this area, members on movement will NOT be paid any amount in excess of ten pounds.

Pay facilities are provided at LTD's on the mainland for the payment of personnel in transit.

281. PROHIBITION OF ENTRY OF ANIMALS INTO AUSTRALIA.

It is believed that troops returning to the mainland are taking with them small animals and birds.

This practice constitutes a grave menace to public and livestock health on the mainland and is in direct contravention to the provisions of GRO 53/45.

Attention of all personnel will be drawn to the danger of introducing prohibited animals, birds, reptiles and plants into AUSTRALIA, and rigid inspections will be made to prevent the evasion of the Quarantine Regulations.

282. STEALING AND UNLAWFUL POSSESSION OF JAPANESE EQUIPMENT

1. No member shall, except in the course of his duty, have in his possession or under his control any article whatsoever of enemy origin or which has been taken or recovered from the enemy or from any area which has been occupied by the enemy.

2. Provided that this order shall not apply in the case of any such article in respect of which the member is in possession of a certificate in the form prescribed by para 30 of GRO 209/45".

283. USE OF SMALL CRAFT IN SIMPSON HARBOUR

NOIC RABAUl advises that owing to uncertain weather and difficulty of locating craft in distress it is unsafe for small craft to be away from moorings after dark (.) all small craft operating for local trips in adjacent waters will return to their moorings in SIMPSON HARBOUR NOT later than sunset.

284. MOVEMENT OF INDIVIDUALS AND DEPARTS

1. No member of the AMF will leave the area except on the specific written authority of HQ, 11 Div or HQ, 5 Base Sub area.
2. Members who have equal priority for movement will take priority amongst themselves in accordance with the date of their arrival in NGDD RABAU.
3. It will be an offence for any member to approach Movement Control, NOIC or the Master of any ship or aircraft to endeavour to arrange a passage for himself or anyone else except in the course of ordinary military duty.
4. NGDD RABAU will not accept any member other than X List, unallotted personnel or members entering the area except with the written approval of HQ, 11 Div or HQ, 5 Base Sub Area.

285. CARE OF HAND TOOLS

1. As a shortage of certain types of hand tools, especially woodworkers' tools not manufactured locally, still exists, it is essential to impress upon all ranks the necessity of ensuring that wastage is reduced to a minimum and that tools are not misused.
2. Care will be taken that tools are used only for the purpose for which they are supplied.
3. Coys will make every effort to reduce wastage and misuse and to ensure the safe keeping of all hand tools on issue.

1. Carrying of Arms

- a) All personnel moving outside the Bn area will carry the arms on personal issue to them.
- b) Within the bn area arms will NOT be carried by pers with the following exceptions:-
 - (i) Personnel guarding JAP parties will carry an OSMG and two loaded magazines.
 - (ii) The Bn Duty Offr will carry a pistol.
 - (iii) The R.P. on duty at the Bn HQ area will carry a pistol.

Note: The bn area is the area enclosed by the following boundaries:

2. Safeguarding of Pistols

- a) All pistols will be withdrawn and held in COMS store.
- b) When it is necessary for any person, for whom a pistol is personal issue, to carry a pistol in accordance with para 1 (a) above the following procedure will be adopted -
 - (i) The person withdrawing a pistol from a COMS store will sign for receipt of it in a book which will be kept in the form laid down in Appx A to these orders.
 - (ii) Upon returning the pistol to the COMS store, the person returning same will ensure that the receipt previously given by him is cancelled by the COMS signing in the column marked "RETURNED".
- c) Whilst a pistol is in the possession of a member he is personally responsible for its safe keeping.
- d) Whilst pistols are in the COMS store the coy comd is personally responsible for the safe keeping of these weapons.
 - i) To comply with para 2(d) above coy comds will hold pistols left in COMS store in a strong box under lock and key. Coy comds will take necessary action to prevent unauthorised pers from obtaining access to either the key or box.
- e) Pistols will NOT be issued from COMS store to any pers NOT entitled to carry a pistol as a personal weapon under the W.E.
- f) Under NO circumstances will any pers entitled to carry a pistol as a personal issue be permitted to have in his possession or be issued with any pistol other than the one which is his personal issue. The COMS will check the number of any pistol issued to ensure that the member is entitled to possession of it.
- g) When any personnel withdraws a pistol to comply with para 1 (a) of these orders he will return the weapon to the COMS store as soon as he returns to the bn area.

3. Maintenance of Pistols

- a) It is the responsibility of the member issued with a pistol to maintain it whilst in his possession and when returning it to COMS store to ensure that it is properly greased to prevent deterioration due to rust.
- b) It is the responsibility of the COMS to ensure that any pistol handed to him for safe keeping is in good order and sufficiently greased to prevent rusting etc.




