



3. SECURITY OF INFORMATION.

Due to this unit's close proximity to a large city, leakage of information in uncensored mail posted in civilian boxes and by personal contact with civilians could be possible on a large scale. It is also possible by personal contact and through voluntary service canteens. No specific cases of this nature however, have been reported during the last two months.

4. SECURITY OF PERSONNEL.

There have been no attempts to spread disaffection among troops. No soldier or civilian is suspected of being connected with any subversive organisation.

5. SECURITY OF MATERIALS :

Stores and dumps are kept locked when not in use. Carrier and M.F. Lines including petrol dump, are picqueted by night - one Sgt, one Cpl, 6 ORs Picquet is inspected twice by night (once before midnight and once after midnight) by Orderly Officer. These methods are considered effective. No ~~instances~~ instances have occurred during the past two months of pilfering, theft, or wilful destruction of materials.

6. SECURITY OF OPERATIONS :

There is no evidence that information regarding secret training has become known to the public. It would be impracticable, due to the large number of personnel involved for picqueting purposes and also for safety reasons, to prevent an unauthorised person observing methods employed on the Jungle Range.

During manoeuvres, normal guards and sentries are posted. Most manoeuvres are carried out in uninhabited areas.

Regarding security observed during movements, this is ensured by :-
(a) Administration - restriction in the number of orders committed to writing. Orders marked "Exercise Secret"
(b) Troops - necessity of security is emphasised to them, and they are warned of the effect of breaches.

7. SECURITY OF HQ AND CAMP

No marked maps are kept outside C O's office and "I" office, current Cipher key is kept under lock and key by Sig Officer, in Sig Office, which is constantly manned by night as well as by day. All other Cipher documents are kept by Intelligence Sec.

By night orderly offr sleeps in En HQ.

Documents are destroyed in the presence of either the Security Offr or the Intelligence Offr.

8. CENSORSHIP

Censorship stamps have been issued on the basis of one per 120 men and become the personal property responsibility of 2 1/3 of each coy. As the unit is below normal strength, surplus stamps are kept under lock and key in "I" office

On application for additional copies of A.F.C. ISS, advice has been received that amended copies will be shortly be available to units.

Contents of A.F.C. ISS have previously been made the subject of lectures to troops but not during the past two months.

All outward mails are forwarded dily through U.P.S. B 104. This system is very satisfactory and ensures a minimum delay in transmission.

No serious breaches of A.F.C. ISS have been evident during the past two months.

9. ALIENS :

Nil - There are no suspects.

10. MORALE :

- (a) Internal : Excellent, though personnel are ~~disappointed~~ disappointed at lack of tps and opportunity to serve in an operational area. Camp conditions are good (the men have effected considerable improvements to the camp area), food is excellent, leave satisfactory, there are no subversive influences, political situations have not been commented upon beyond expressions of disgust that strikes are permitted to continue whilst their mates are away fighting ; there are no sufferers from war nerves.
- (b) External : Relations with other tps, allied tps and civilians are excellent.
- (c) Educational : Five lectures by F.S. personnel proved valuable and very interesting. Posters have been obtained and displayed. No films have been displayed during the last two months. Security training has resulted in the tps becoming more security minded.

11. GENERAL : Suggestions:

more lectures by F.S. personnel - these have proved interesting and most valuable.
 A lecture explaining in detail to the tps how an enemy deduce (say) an order of battle, from miscellaneous information gleaned from various sources. Examples of information would have to be given and the deductions from them and the aggregating of these deductions explained.

3. LEAKAGE OF MILITARY INFORMATION IN PROCEEDINGS BEFORE CIVIL COURT

(Ref GRO G.42 7 of 4 Jun 43)

1. When giving evidence in civil court, a soldier will merely give his number, rank and name and state that he is a member of the A MF, without mentioning the name of his unit.

2. In no circumstances will a soldier divulge in open court the location of his unit, unless the bench rules that a full answer is essential to the case, in which event he will offer to write the information on a slip of paper to be handed to the bench.

3. The danger to security in disclosing the location of units cannot be too strongly impressed on all ranks.

(Contd Over)

ENGINEERING CADETSHIPS : (Ref GRO G.424 of 4 Jun 43)

(1) The provision of engineering cadetships (both Civil Engineering and Mechanical Engineering) for a limited number of cadets, who may be drawn either from serving personnel or from civilian sources, is under consideration.

(2) Although the scheme has not yet been finally settled or approved, applications will be invited forthwith for cadetships on the following basis.

- (A) Cadets will be selected only from candidates between the ages of 17 years and 20 years, who are medically class A1, who are or become members of the AIF, and who have reached Leaving Certificate standard in English, Mathematics and Science or have equivalent qualifications. Parental consent to join the AIF will be required in the respect of any cadet who is not already a member of the AIF.
- (B) Cadets selected from civilian sources will be enlisted in the AIF and all cadets will, during their cadetships, remain serving soldiers in the rank of private or sapper, with pay and allowances accordingly. Text books will be provided by cadets at their own expense.
- (C) Engineering cadetship will cover a course of Military training courses at approved educational establishments and a final course at OCTU, over a period of approximately 3 years. Successful cadets will receive commissions subject to vacancies existing. Pending appointment to commissioned rank, such cadets will be allotted to RAE or AEME units in the ranks.
- (D) Cadetships as such will terminate on the cessation of the war, but it is hoped to make arrangements for the completion of the courses which have been commenced, as part of a Repatriation scheme of vocational training.
- (E) Cadets who prove unsatisfactory or become medically unfit or who are unsuccessful may have their cadetships terminated and be returned to normal army service.

3. (i) Applications will be made by serving personnel to their COs, who will forward all applications direct to LHQ (E in C), to reach LHQ not later than 5 July 1943. (This is essential to allow sufficient time for selection in time for assembly of selected cadets for the first course expected to commence on the 1 September 1943).

(ii) Cos will, with each application, furnish a report on the candidate as to his character, ability and suitability.

(iii) Copies of applications and reports will be sent by COs through normal channels to HQ L of C Area in which the unit is serving.

Applications to reach 41 Aust Inf Bn HQ not later than 15 Jun 43.

5. BELTS : SAM BROWNE : (Ref GRO A.429 of 4 Jun 43)

When not otherwise ordered, the following items of dress may be worn at the option of the member.

(a) The Sam Browne belt (without shoulder strap) may be worn by officers and warrant officers, class 1.

3. CLOTHES LINES

It is noticed in the camp area that wires and clothes lines have been erected so as to be dangerous, particularly in respect of personnel moving about the camp area in the darkness. In future any lines erected will be at least 7 feet above the ground.

4. LEAVE TRAVEL - BLANKETS

Untill the end of August all pers onnel proceeding on leave involving overnight travel will carry one blanket. Units will be responsible for accounting for such blankets.

Issues may be made bt LTD's in special circumstances, but only on signature and against subsequent unit acquittance.

5. MOTOR VEHICLE MAINTENANCE (Ref 1 Aus t Div R.O Ser 0 309)

Recent inspections carried out by inspecting Officers, Second Aus t Army, reveal that a relatively large percentage of vehicles have the following defects in unit maintenance:---

(a) Spring 'U' Bolts Loose - Neglect in this respect by Unit pers onnel inevitably results in the shearing of spring centre bolts.

(b) Tyre Pressure Low - Tyre inflation pressures must, at all time, be kept at pressures set down in Mechanisation Circular No 324, which has been reprinted in Mechanical Vehicle Training Pamphlet No 3 (Page 246, etseq ui). Inthe interests of conversation of rubber, requirements of this Mechanisation Circular must be observed by all personnel responsible for the care and maintenance of M.T. Vehs.

(c) Batteries - Low in Water. - Negligence in kepping the electrolite of Seconfry batteries at the correct level results in rapid deterioration of battery components, causing sulphating of the plates and disintegration of separators.

(d) Oil Levels. - It has also been observed that oil levels of the power unit, gear box and differential have, in some cases, not been maintained at their correct levels, which may result in a complete breakdown of the equipment.

The attention of all personnel responsible for operation of M.T. should be drawn to the above 4 points.

6. ACCIDENTS INVOLVING CIVILIAN VEHICLES. (Ref GRO Q56, para 4).

The following procedure will be adopted in the happening of an accident in which an Army Vehicle is involved.

1. The driver of the Army Vehicle will enquire of the other party or parties concerned the name of his or their insurance company or companies and will include this information on AAF G13.
2. If the other party or parties refuse to disclose the name of his or their insurance company or companies, the driver of the a rmy vehicle will record such refusal on the AAF G13.

7. BN DUTIES.



7. SMOKING WITHIN BULK OR OTHER PETROL INSTALLATIONS. (Ref GRO Q. 463/43)

1. Attention is drawn to Standing orders for Army Fire Services, paras 37 and 199(b).
2. Smoking and the carrying of matches or smoking materials in any petrol depot, dump or installation are absolutely prohibited. Severe disciplinary action will be taken against offenders.
3. Before a working party enters such an establishment, the offr or NCO in charge will ensure that the members of it give up all matches and smoking materials in their possession.

8. RELEASE OF SERVING PERSONNEL (Ref Second Aust Army Order A.178/43)

- 1/ Cases have been brought to notice where action is being taken contrary to GRO A. 108 /42 para 2.
2. Cases of serving personnel on leave making application to the Directorate of Manpower or business firms are still being brought to notice.
3. The attention of all ranks will be drawn to the correct procedure of making applications for discharge or release, and disciplinary action will be taken in all cases where this order is not obeyed.

9. PAPER (Toilet) - CONSERVATION OF.

"Paper (Toilet)" is in short supply and every endeavour must be made to prevent waste. The attention of all ranks will be drawn to this shortage and the necessity for conserving the supply by promulgation in Unit Routine Orders.

10. TRAFFIC OFFENCES : BUILT UP AREAS.

There appears to be some doubt on the part of transport personnel as to method of recognition of built-up areas.

Motor Traffic Regs provide that speed restrictions in built-up areas apply :-

- (a) To any length of street or road NOT provided with street lamps, where restricting sign (30 on yellow disc) is displayed, and
- (b) To any length of street or road provided with street lamps, unless de-restricting sign (transverse bar on disc) is displayed.

The main difficulty seems to be in respect of para 2 (b) above, which

for practical purposes means that all streets or roads provided with street lamps must be considered built-up areas. Some drivers appear to be under the erroneous impression that constitution of built-up areas is governed solely by the presence of restricting signs.

12. WEARING OF RESPIRATORS.

MONTHLY REVIEW OF M.T. FOR MONTH ENDED 31 JULY '43.

1. Vehicle strength has altered somewhat during this month. Vehicles now held by this Unit are as follows :- 1 Recce car, 6 x 15 cwt vans, 11 x 1 ton vans, 5 x 30 cwt lorries, 2 W/Tanks, 6 x 3 Ton GS lorries, 1 x 3 ton WD lorry, 1 Tk/A Portee, 20 M/Cycles and 14 carriers MG, making a total strength of 67 vehicles. This is an increase of 5 vehicles on last month's strength.
2. Personnel strength has not varied to any extent, but a number of drivers have been detailed for wharf duties and film acting, while seven were acting as instructors in an Officers' M.T.School within the Unit. Thus a shortage of drivers resulted.
3. Maintenance has been successfully carried out but this has only been made possible by grouping of vehicles and keeping a RESERVE LINE of vehicles which were only used when emergency demanded. Vehicles that required W/Shop attention have been sent to LAD in groups of three, same being accompanied by Unit drivers who carried out all necessary maintenance and minor repairs under the supervision of LAD personnel. AEME personnel attached to this Unit are being sent to LAD one at a time to assist in repairs for a period of three weeks each. This scheme will be of great benefit to all concerned as these personnel will receive valuable experience in mechanical work and at the same time get a thorough knowledge of just what work they are required to do and what they may not attempt.
4. A carrier school was in progress for the greater part of the month but was discontinued when its personnel were sent to the wharf etc. An M.T.School for Officers was also ~~conducted~~ conducted of two weeks duration. Regular personnel did very little training owing to the shortage of drivers for normal duties.
5. One accident occurred this month but same was only of a minor nature, no personnel being injured and very little damage was done to either of the vehicles involved.
6. Conservation of Petrol and Rubber is being closely watched in this Unit. No unnecessary running is being undertaken as all trips have to be countersigned by the C.O. 2 i/c or Adjt. before a vehicle may leave the Transport Lines. POL consumption remained at much the same level as for the previous month.
7. One fact was observed in regard to the receiving and transferring of vehicles. This Unit had to bring all vehicles up to Class 1 standard before transfer while vehicles received were not class 1.

Pro reports indicate that an unduly large proportion of drivers in this and other formations, are extremely lax in carrying G11 on duty.

It is essential that all such cases are reported to Unit concerned, so that check may be kept on the use of military vehs. by unlicensed drivers.

In almost every case, it is reported by the unit that the offender is in fact a licensed driver, and failure to carry G11 is due to carelessness. The result is that considerable correspondence with Bdes and Units is entailed, all of which could be avoided.

Drivers will carry G11's at all times when driving vehicles.

7. NATIVE LABOUR OVERSEERS A N G A U. (Ref Second Aust Army RO
Ser 26 No A192).

1. Units will call for volunteers from personnel of and below the rank of Captain with the following qualifications for appointment as Native Labour Overseers :

3. Particulars of personnel volunteering together with CO's recommendation will be submitted through normal channels to reach Second Aust Army not later than 20 July 43.

8. LODGEMENT OF INCOME TAX RETURNS FOR THE YEAR ENDING 30th JUN 43.
(Ref GRO F.486/43, para 5).

Any member of the forces whose total income from both military and private sources exceeds £250 for the year ending 30th Jun 43, must lodge a return to the Deputy Commissioner of Taxation in the state of which the member enlisted. It should be noted that taxable military income includes pay at the active rate before deducting allotment or tax deductions, field allowance, any amount paid to the member for subsistence whilst not rationed and quartered and an amount of 2/5d per day for the period when the member is rationed and quartered by the Army, but does not include deferred pay and dependents allowance. Income tax return forms will be made available by the pay representatives.

The franking officers signature will appear in the lower left hand corner of the form (above the direction "This space should not be used") Censorable matter will be obliterated and not excised. The unit censor stamp will be affixed in the space between the address panel and the single printed line directly thereunder; it will be placed as far to the left as practicable.

(5) Detailed instructions covering preparation of the letters by senders are set out on the backs of the forms, which will, however, in every case following censorship be passed through unit channels by postal orderlies for onward transmission.

(6) If one form be insufficient for the whole of the letter, two or more separate forms may be used, but in such cases each form will be treated as a separate letter and a separate fee must be paid for each. Writing must be plain and preferably in black ink, to secure satisfactory photographic reproductions. Use of pencil is not recommended but, if used, it will be a soft black lead pencil; indelible pencil will not be used.

(7) Names and addresses of addressees of airgraph letters will be written by hand in prominent black lettering (as large as practicable) and will be kept wholly within the panel provided on the form. The full address of the sender and the date of writing will be written at the top of the "Letter" portion of the form and at the foot of the letter the senders full name will be written in block letters followed by his signature.

(8) The airgraph letter as delivered to the addressee overseas will be less than one quarter of the size of the original lodged by the sender. The need for block lettering as above described and clear writing generally will therefore be readily understood.

6. SAFETY FIRST IN MT REPAIRS AND MAINTENANCE.

(a) Serious accidents have occurred recently due to sufficient care not being taken when repair or maintenance work is being carried out on vehicles, carriers etc. This applies particularly to cases where it was necessary for personnel to work underneath a vehicle. Inspecting AEME officers have also sighted and corrected many other instances where insufficient safety precautions were being adopted and where serious injury to personnel may have resulted.

(b) The following are some of the most important points to observe in insuring safety of personnel carrying out maintenance and repair work :---

Reliance should not be placed on jacks to support the load of vehicles under which personnel are to work but blocks of adequate proportions or Stands, Auto, Safety, should be used for the purpose.

Handbrakes are useless when either or both rear wheels are jacked up, and hence wheels must be checked to prevent movement of the vehicle. This applies also if work is being carried out on the transmission as the disconnection of the propeller shaft for instance renders the handbrake ineffective.

Whenever repair or maintenance work is being carried out the officer or senior NCO supervising the work must satisfy himself that all necessary safety precautions are being taken.

(c) COs of all units in the formation will ensure personally that this matter is brought to the notice of all personnel whom it concerns.
