(4) VINEYARDS & ORCHARDS. OUT OF BOUNDS.

The following is an extract from E. Comd. R.O. No. 9 Pt. 1 of 21-3-40.

All vineyards and orchards are out of bounds and must be avoided when troops are manoeuvring.

(5) WET CANTEEN:—Since tables and forms have been provided for the benefit of troops patronising the wet canteen, there has been a considerable increase in the number of missing and broken glasses.

As the canteen staff is not large enough to cope with the extra work of collecting glasses from the tables, all glasses must be returned to the bar counter after use and Not left on the tables or forms. Unless full co-operation from all ranks is received in this matter, the providing of seating facilities will be discontinued. In regard to missing or broken glasses, disciplinary action will be taken against any member of this unit found (1) removing glasses from the canteen or (2) of causing any breakages either wilfully or through failure to exercise reasonable care, and the cost of such breakages will be deducted from the pay of the offender, in addition to any other punishment that may be awarded. A duty Cpl. will be detailed by Duty Coy. daily for attendance at Wet Canteen to exercise supervision during its trading hours.

The set square is ruled with the following graduations: -  
from C to A - angles of 0° to 30° from B.  
from B to D - distance in inches and tenths of an inch.  
triangle BDE - in half-inch squares.  
The celluloid strip is ruled in inches and tenths of an inch from hole F (corresponding to hole B in set square) to hole G (front sight).

Uses of the Instrument: -

- A. as a clinometer for measuring angles of elevation, grades, etc.
- B. for use in the field to obtain spot heights after H.E. is fixed by intersection with prismatic compass.
- C. for fixing form lines and contours.
- D. to show hypotenuse (distance along grade), V.I. and H.E., provided one of these three can be obtained from the map, prismatic compass or any other method.
- E. where map references are given and the map is not available, to show the bearing of one point from another and the distance between them.

in the field quickly and accurately to give, not only the angle of elevation, but also the hypotenuse, V.I. and H.E. It is also useful for fixing road gradients, form lines and contours.

It is comparatively easy to make and to handle.

#### Method of Using.

A sight is taken on the two pins (back sight - holes B and F and front sight - hole G), care being taken to see that the spirit bubble is level.

The swinging arm is then held in place while the angle is read. The markings on the celluloid strip represent the hypotenuse, and the markings on the base show the H.E. These are proportionate. A vertical is dropped from the hypotenuse.

To translate into actual distance, any scale may be used, the most convenient usually being 1" = 100 yards. The horizontal lines in the triangle BDE show the V.I. in half inches only, but by the use of a romer, both the H.E. and the V.I. can be fixed very accurately. The V.I., of course, will then be multiplied by three to give the height in feet.

For example, it was required to find the height of a hill where the angle of elevation was  $11\frac{1}{2}^\circ$ . The H.E. was found by intersection to be 6.25 yards. This was shown on the clinometer as 6.25 inches. With the swinging arm sighted correctly at  $11\frac{1}{2}^\circ$ , the V.I. was shown on the clinometer as 1.26 inches = 126 yards = 378 feet the height of the hill. The line of sight (hypotenuse) was shown as 6.4 inches = 640 yards.

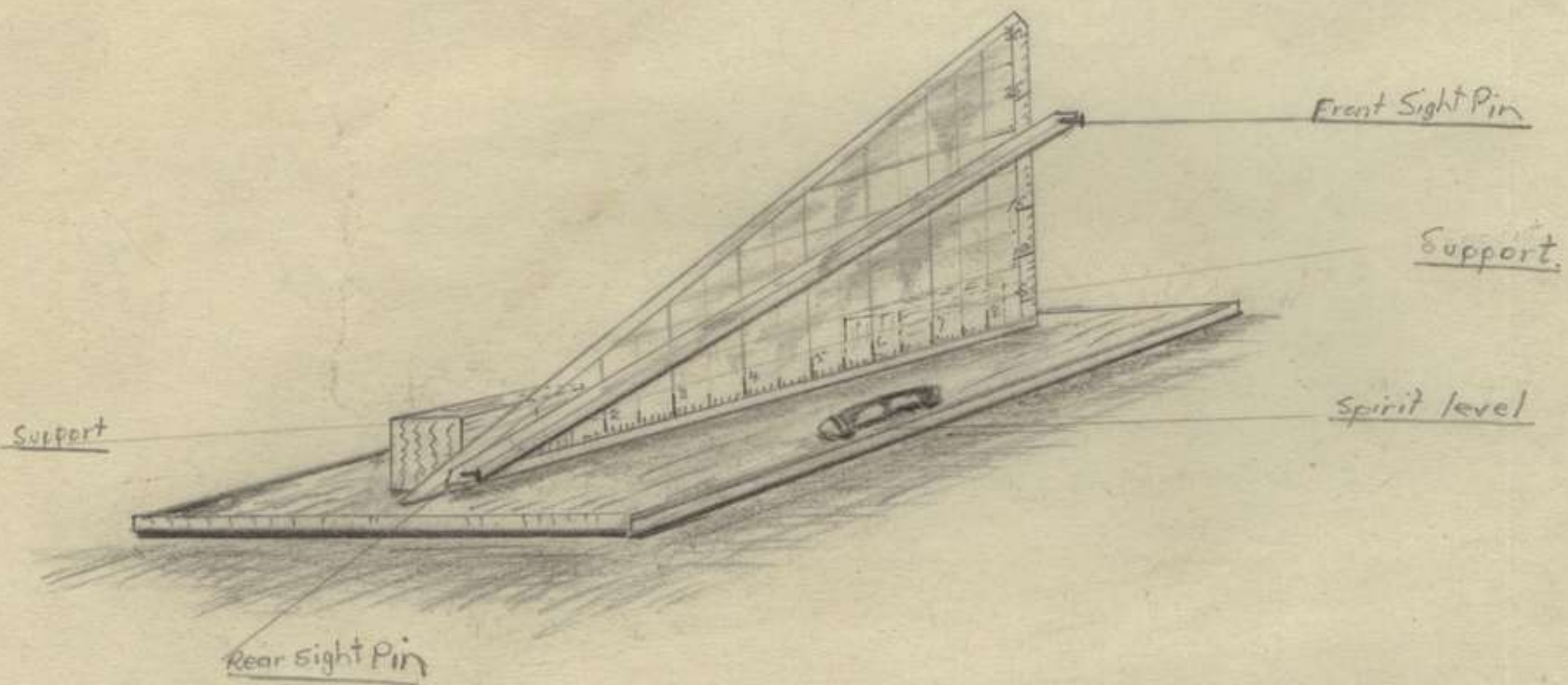

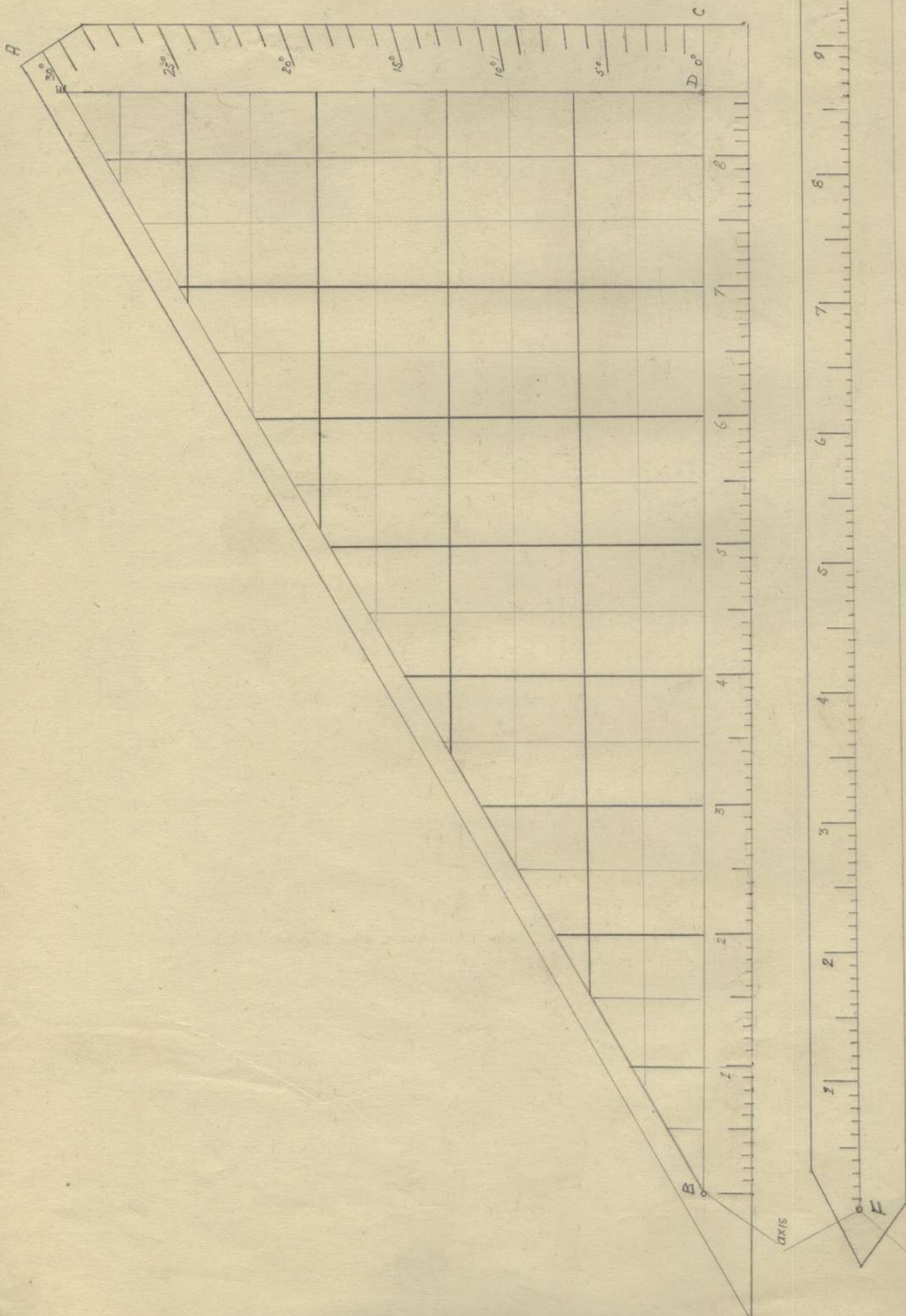

It is also desired that all persons in charge of troops operating over grassed country be reminded of the need for the utmost care, to prevent outbreaks of fire.
