

GENERAL

THE OBJECT OF THIS SECTION IS:-

- 1. To give an indication of the scope of the operation and the tasks given to 2/5 Aust Inf Bn.
- 2. To present with the aid of attached maps and traces a pictorial of our own and enemy movements and own air activity.
- 3. To provide a close study of instructions which controlled the operation, by attaching copies of orders, instructions and memoranda both from and to 17 Aust Inf Ede.

NOTE: All orders issued by Bn in implementation of tasks set by Ede were verbal and are not recorded, fully.

- 2. At the commencement of the operation information regarding the enemy in the TONG area was vague. Small enemy parties consisting of elements of 41 Div were occupying villages EAST and SOUTH of TONG. These parties showed little aggressive spirit and were content to forage for food. Enemy dispositions are shown in Appx A which was issued with 6 Aust Div Int Review No.3.
- 2. Our own forces consisted of 2/7 Aust Cdo Sqn based on TONG with patrol bases EAST and SE of this area.
- 3. With the intention of conducting operations based on TONG 17 Aust Inf Ede in mid Dec 44 ordered the formation of a force comprising two rifle coys from 2/5 Aust Inf En and a composite HQ. This force was commanded by Maj I.H.McBRIDE, was named PIPER FORCE, consisted of A and C Coys, and came under direct command of HQ 17 Aust Inf Ede.
- 4. Tasks given to the force were :-
 - (a) Task in Gen

To relieve 2/7 Aust Cdo San at Told.

(b) Tasks in Particular

- (1) You will be responsible for patrolling WEST of NORTH-SOUTH line through MUSU v410071 and SOUTH of line incl NIALU V320207 excl AUN CREEK to junc with AMOK RIVER V350196 thence along AMOK RIVER to creek junc V391158 thence along creek to 41 grid line.
- (ii) You will patrol South to the area MIMBIOK V200070 YAUOTONG V268061 and destroy any enemy along the track between these places.
- (111) You will patrol South and est a base at MUSIMBE V350053.
 - (iv) When a base at MUSIMBE is established, patrol to the EAST and est a base at MUSU.
 - (v) When a base is established at MUSIMBE the main base may be moved to that area subject to the requirement of keeping TOMG as a staging post on the L of C. Before moving the main base fud, it will be ensured that the TOMG area is completely cleared of the enemy.
 - (vi) You will render sitreps daily (made up to 1000 I) at 1100 I and such special sitreps as considered necessary.
- (vii) Your patrolling programme and intentions will be signalled to this HQ by 1800 I on preceding day.
- 5. For further particulars see 17 Aust Inf Ede 0562 of 12 Dec 44 APPK C ; 0571 of 15 Dec 44 APPK D ; Op Instr No.7 of 15 Dec 44 APPK E.
- 6. PIPER FORCE moved from AITAPE via YAKAMUI, and relieved 2/7 aust cdo Sqn at TONG on 20 Dec. A base was established at TONG and aggressive patrolling commended on 21 Dec. The force continued operations until 31 Dec incl when it reverted to command 2/5 En.
- 7. For movement of force during period 21/31 Dec see Map B and trace P; enemy dispositions and movement are shown in Trace Q. Casualties were Own Nil, enemy 23 killed.
- 8. During this period 71 Wing RAAF provided close air support and eleven successful air strikes were made. For details see Trace P.

- 9. At 31 Dec PIPER FORCE had partly achieved its tasks by having established a base at TONG and progressidate DREKIKER, YAMBES and LAUING. See Trace P.
- 10. Upon assuming command at midnight 31 Dec/1 Jan Lt Col A. W. BUTTROSE carried on with tasks given in 17 pde Op Instr No. 7 and formed general outline plan as follows:-

"A coy will form base at MUSINAU and protect RIGHT flank by continuing pressure EASTWARD and by deep patrolling to SOUTH.

C Coy to secure in succession PEREMBIL - ASILING - MISIN - SAMASAI.

B Coy on arrival in area to move and secure OID SAHIK and adv in gen SE direction and clear in succession SUMUL, - WALENDE -MAHARINGA - SELNAU".

For implementation of this order see Traces T and V.

11. In reply to 17 Ede Signal 089 of 301100 I (appx F) 2/5 En signal 066 of 2 Jan (appx H), set out outline plan for future operation as follows:-

"When PEREMBIL clear main axis through ASILING MISIM to

SAMASAI D will watch RIGHT flank as suggested"

- 12. 17 Aust Inf Dde I 4/4 of 3 Jan gave a fairly reliable summary of the dispositions, strengths and com of enemy 41 Div Gp operating in the TONG PEREMBIL area. See appx I and Trace S.
- 13. On 3 Jan B Coy and MMG Pl arrived at YAMBES and joined Bn. To further the Bn plan B Coy was ordered to move to MEW SAHIK and thus protect C Coy's LEFT flank and rear.
- 14. 17 Aust Inf Ede G680 of 3 Jan (appx J) advised that Op Instr No.7 was still effective and therefore En objective continued to be MUSU. The plan was further implemented when C Coy occupied PEREMBIL on 3 Jan.
- 15. At this stage Bn's forward movement was retarded by receipt of 17 Aust inf Ede signal 0 157 of 050845 I (appx K) saying "until supplies improve adopt defensive attitude with aggressive patrols 0 verify existence of enemy localities at SUMUL and MALBUAIN 0 suggest you strengthen post at SAHIK".
- 16. At 061530 I 2/5 Bn 0 83 (appx L) advised "policy already implemented Q concur your suggestion Q str SaHIK now one coy less one Pl Q SUMUL being investigated Q MALBUAIN clear."
- 17. On 6 Jan 2/5 Bn 6 2/44 (appx M) gave CO's appreciation of the situation. The Bn outline plan was to make axis of advance EAST through PEREMBIL ASILING MISIM SAMISAI, covering flanks with one coy RIGHT doing deep patrolling and to have standing patrol at SAHIK.
- 18. Orders issued by Bn included :-

C Coy continue adv along main axis.

A Coy remain at MUSINAU DREMIKER.

B Coy remain SAHIK with immediate tasks to patrol SE SAMUL which, if clear to be occupied by one Pl. patrol NE to AMUK river.

D Coy who were en route from AITAPE to be used with C Coy along main axis upon arrival in area.

- 19. 17 Aust Inf pde G 701 of 8 Jan (appx N) gave permission to use ASILING as an objective in lieu of MUSU and suggested SAMISAI be made forward base for aggressive patrols further to SE. Limiting factor to forward move was still the supply problem.
- 20. By 11 Jan the Bn objective of ASILING MISIM and SAMISAI on main axis were gained by C Coy, while B Coy had reached SAMBUK. D Coy arrived

in the area and in accordance with Bn plan assumed the role of forward coy on main axis after relieving C coy at SAMISAI on 12 Jan. See Tracew

Further orders were issued by En for :-.

A Coy to move fud and secure PELNADU. B Coy to clear as far as MAHARINGA.

This task was completed by 16 Jan.

- 21. 17 Aust Inf Ede 0170 of 120715 I (appx 0) extended En objective to EAST 50 vertical grid and SOUTH 04 lateral grid. Patrols allowed to move to deep SOUTH.
- 22. Following this instruction 17 Aust Inf Bde G726 of 13 Jan (appx AA) gave an indication of the trend of future ops and set out proposals necessitating a slight variation in abovementioned signal. The instructions were :-
 - (a) You will be relieved of any responsibility for the area NORTH of the AMUK River after passing EAST of the 48 vertical grid line.
 - (b) You will est contact with the Cav in the HAMBINA village area.
 - (c) The mov of the left of your force will be SOUTH of the AMUK River and will be in the gen direction of SELNAUA V4408.

 AUANG V4906, BALAGA V5502. During this fwd move you will clear the enemy from the country between the AMUK and the NANU River.
 - (d) When the move in subpara (c) above is well under way and is approaching the 49 vertical grid, your right should move fwd of PELNANDU area and clear the enemy in succession from the following gen areas LUWAITE V4503, WAHUN M4799, AMUL A5598.
 - (e) Careful timing of the moves in subparas (c) and (d) will be essential to ensure that your flanks do not become too widely separated.

25. In implementation of these instructions an issued the following orders:-

A Coy will clear in succession the LUWAITE - WAHUN - AMUL areas.

Advance to be controlled by the centre.

With the occupation of WARINGHAM - BANA areas a dropping ground will be prepared and a firm base established in this area.

D and C Coys forward coys will then clear AUANG - BULMITA and secure a firm base with dropping ground in the WARANGAM area.

On the LEFT B Coy having secured SELNI area will clear YANA - BOMBISIMA and come into reserve AUANG, moving then to clear KUAINICIMA group. See appx BB - 2/5 Aust Inf Bn G2/45 of 18 Jan.

For implementation of these orders see Traces R.T.U.V.W.

24. 17 Aust Inf Ede 00 No.2 of 25 Jan (appx cc) set out Ede Intention "17 Aust Inf Ede will clear enemy from area WEST to NORTH - SOUTH line through incl AMI V602038 - BITIKA V5908," and gave 2/5 En the following tasks:-

- (a) To clear the enemy from the area along the gen line AUANG V4906, WARANGAM villages V5003, NUMANGO villages V6402 thence EAST to the line of the NINAB River.
- (b) To clear the enemy from the area along the gen line LUWAITE villages AMBUM villages A4797 ILAMOP A5698.
- (c) Patrol to the deep South as far as the 90 lateral grid line and clean up enemy pockets within striking distance of the

26. All coy objectives had been gained by 31 Jan.

27. Further verbal orders were them issued by Bn as follows:-

D Coy will clear the SALATA M'BRAS village area,

B Coy secure BALIF.

C Coy clear BALAGA-NUMANGO areas.

A Coy res.

- 28. While this operation was in progress a message was received from 17 Bde by R/T at 071015 I stating Bde comds instrs are to bog-down and return parachutes Q parachutes posn most acute Q comd desires that ops take second place until they are cleared even to extent of slowing right down.
- 29. 17 Aust Inf Bde G831 of 8 Feb (appx DD) gave a forecast of future operations and assuming objectives given in 17 Bde OO No. 2 were obtained attention was to be directed to MAPRIK as a preliminary to a move to the SOUTH. 2/5 Bn proposed task was to assist 2/7 Cav Cdo Sqn in securing MAPRIK area then clear SINAHU area leaving strong base at M'BRAS ILAHOP or other suitable area. The task being to kill the enemy whilst cleaning up the country with capture of ground no object.
- 30. In reply to above CO 2/5 Bn of 11 Feb (Appx EE) set out his appreciation of the situation and submitted an outline plan for future operations as follows:
 - (a) When the enemy is either destroyed or cleared from the NUMANGO-ILAHOP areas one coy to be left at ILAHOP to control NORTH_WEST from this base and to patrol SOUTH-EAST technique destroying the enemy to ILAHINKA 583950.
 - (b) The central axis of the two coys and HQs to move SOUTH-WEST from the BALIF to the M'BRAS area then SOUTH-EAST to ENDIPI.
 ILAHETA to SINAHU.
 - (c) One coy to move SOUTH-WEST from M. BRAS and destroy or drive the enemy from the APOS group SOUTH-EAST through ASANAKOR to YUBAN-AKUOR then EAST to SINAHU.
 - (d) The above would require the Cav Regt be given the extra task of destroying the enemy EAST of the AMUK to include WALAHUTA AUPIK 1-2 which are at present occupied by a least 100 enemy.
- 31. By 12 Feb all coy objectives given on para 27 had been gained and 2/5
 Bn issued the following orders to further 17 Bde plan of advance on
 MAPRIK:-

B Coy secure BARANGABANGI

C Coy secure MALAHUM

D Coy continue mopping up M. BRAS village area

- The implementation of these orders resulted in the capture of both 32. objectives by 17 Feb. Mopping up programme in M. BRAS area was continuing. Bn them ordered coys to establish firm bases in these localities and patrol aggressively to the SOTH and SOUTH-EAST with AMUK river as fwd boundary.
- These tasks were carried out until 2/5 Bn was relieved by 2/7 Bn. 33. Command passed to 2/7 Bn at 0800K 25 Feb.
- Air strikes during the complete operation were very successful. 34. Altogether 62 strikes were made in close support of advancing troops. Details are shown in Trace R.
- Casualties resulting from ground action during the operation were 35.

7 killed 18 wounded Cum 867 killed 42 wounded 12 PW.

The Bn advance over period 20 Dec 44 to 25 Feb 45 was 29000 yds while 36. at times frontage extended over 11000 yds.

Ref maps : SUAIN EAST 1 in to 1 ml SUAIN WEST NANU EAST NANU WESTZ Certain ops are pending in the near future which will be based on TONG. At present 2/7 Aust Cdo Son are at TONG with patrol bases EAST and SE of this area. I want you to command a force of not less than two coys plus a small HQ and to relieve 2/7 Aust Cdo Sqn in the TONG area. Mov will commence on Sun 17 Dec 44. You will answer directly to me for the tactical employment of this force. All available infm has been incl in the Div daily situation reviews and latest infm will be given to you by Bde IO. Recently, enemy activity in the TONG area has increased. Since Sat 9 Dec 44 our patrols have gained control of the immedate vicinity of TONG and are moving to the EAST. It is likely that the enemy will endeavour to delay our patrol movement in this area by standing patrols and mmbushes. An enemy party, str unknown, is reported at WALUM ref V579190. The latest infm regarding the disposas of our own tps will be given to you by Bde IO, but more up-to-date infm should be available on the return of Capt L A CAMERON. ANGAU are maintaining a permanent det in the TONG area under Capt COLE. Certain police boys are available as well as native carriers. You will be responsible for patrolling activity SOUTH of the TORRECILLI MOUNTAINS in the area WEST of a NORTH-SOUTH line through MUSU V410071. As 2/7 Aust Cdo son will be operating in the MANUIR area ref V420193, a dearer definition of your Northern boundary will be arranged and you will be advised. Your tasks will be -9. (a) To maintain a patrol base at TONG. To patrol SOUTH to the area MIMBICK ref V200070 - YAWATANG ref V268061 and (b) destroy any enemy along the track between those places. Patrol SE and est a base at MUSEMBE ref V350053. With a base at MUSIMBE established, patrol to the EAST and est a base at MUSU. 10. When a base is established at MUSIMBE, the main base may be moved to that area subject to the requirements of keeping TONG as a staging post on the L of C. Before moving the main base fwd, it will be ensured that the TONG area is completely cleared of enemy. 11. Direct air sp will be available to you on application through this HQ. The system of demanding is :-(a) Calls for strikes will be made through HQ 17 Aust Inf Bde. When a request for the following day is granted, it can NC be cancelled unless a message to that effect is received by this HQ NOT later than 2100 hrs on the day prior to the strike. Tac R aircraft may be communicated with daily by RT or panel agnals. Daily, a number of BEAUFORT aircraft will fly over your base to give close sp if required. The a rcraft may be communicated with by RT or ground panels. They will be informed where to bomb or told that no support is required, in which case they will bomb a secondary target pre-arranged with 6 Aust Div. AUSTRALIAN WAR MEMORIAL RCDIG1027197 Further instra will be issued regarding air.

12. Patrols

It is essential that we pass on to 6 Aust Div infm of the location of friendly natives and projected patrols so that 71 WING RAAF may be informed. It is essential that your sig units and sub unit comds the oughly understand ground panel system of air comm. In order that we may keep 6 Aust Div informed you will sig your daily patrol intentions to this HQ at 1200 hrs on the preceding day.

13. Adm - Separate adm instrs will be issued to you.

14. Intercomm

- (a) 17 Must Inf Bde Sig Sec will provide you with a det and two 22 sets, one for rear link and one for air.
- (b) A pigeon loft will move to TONG with the first subunit of your force and will be used for comm fwd to your patrols.
- 15. We will try and organise the L of C behind you on the lines of the WAU-SKINDEWAI track as early as possible.
- 16. Please let me have your appreciation of this problem and indicate the composition of the force you require, which should NOF exceed 300 personnel.
- 17. At a later stage, this force will be added to and the comd will then be taken over by CO 2/5 Aust Inf Bn.

- 1. In amplification of our conversation of yesterday morning:
 - 1. The posm of enemy forces in the TONG area is delightfully vague and your first consideration is to straighten this out.
 - 2. Generally, your attitude is to be aggressive. The present passive attitude in that area will not be followed.
 - 3. Keep all near enemy posts under constant observation so that he can NOT move without your knowledge.
 - 4. Prevent him from approaching your posts by aggressive patrolling.
 - 5. Don't become involved in set piece attacks when you can addieve your object by use of air strikes, harassing raids, embushes, mortar fire and the like.
 - 6. Make the fullest use of Capt COLE and his police boys for deep patrolling and the collection of infm. COLE is reported to be very dependable and co-operative.
 - 7. When you judge it expedient, you may lose ground if by so doing you cam entice the enemy on to better killing ground.
 - 8. Don't mink your roots too deeply into the ground keep your force mobile.
 - 9. When you contact the enemy in a posm which looks difficult, pull back at the right moment and hit him from the air.
 - 10. We can afford to lose ground in the fwd areas temporarily provided such lose does NOT jeopardise either your force or neighboring units or prevent you from addieving your ultimate object.
 - 11. Your proposals to hold the YAMBES area defensively (but u th offensive patrolling fwd of this area) while you first clean up the enemy pockets further WEST is considered sound.
 - 12. Accurately patrol located enemy pockets and clean them out one at a time. Remember the principle of concentration.
 - 13. Avoid anything savouring of bullheadedness and which might incur one unnecessary casualty.
 - 14. Infm and more infm is wanted here urgently of the situation EAST of the TONG area. PW will be invaliable. Expedite their move to AITAPE.

This force was patrolling from time to time in varying str to SARIK, YAMBES villages, DUMAN villages and MUSIMBILIM. This infm is considered accurate. Enemy parties mentioned in subpara (a) are considered to be part of this force.

(a) 2/7 Aust Cdo Sqn are occupying TONG area. Disposas are as follows :-

An OP has also been established at V347150. TONG and YAMBES are occupied as def localities. YASILE and KUMBUM are occupied only as patrol bases.

- 2: The actual str of the enemy is an uncertain quantity and the figures given should be treated with res. They may be regarded as a maximum figure.
- 3. Now that the poem in front of you is reasonably clarified, it should help you to make a sound appreciation:
- 4. The op instr number 7 still stands:
- 5. The following points are stressed:-
 - (a) forward bases at YAMBES and DREKIKER (and if you decide to put a base fwd in the new SAMIK area) must be secure and capable of solid def and that before relinquishing a base to move fwd you must in turn secure your fwd base.
 - (b) There is no hurryto wire set places like PEREMBIL. The maximum use of air strikes and your present harassing tactics by offensive patrols should achieve the required results. I expect you will use your mortars here as well. Look into the possibility of putting an ambush along his L of C EAST of PEREMBIL.
 - (c) No attempt at this stage should be made to move against MALBUAIN 3804 but this flank must be kept under observation and consideration given to the possible enemy approaches leading into MUSIMBILUM from the SOUTH and SE.
 - (d) While dispersion of your bm is unavoidable it should be arranged that you have at least local superiority opposite the forces in your immediate front e.g. the enemy str at PEREMBIL has been stated by your reports to be around 87. This is more than countered by your tps at YAMBES and LUAING and plus your ability to move the whole or portion of your tps from DREKIKER against any enemy conc in the PEREMBIL area. The strengthening of your posm opposite SUMBL 393110 will have to be considered.
 - (e) Any move you make must be carefully co-ordinated with the fwd mov of sups
 - (f) As you move further EAST and drive the JAP from his prepared defs you must expect to be counter-attacked and should prepare accordingly.
- 6. The sup situation is still not good. Only one aircraft is available but a second has been asked for so that we can build you up to 7 days sup, and with the uncertain flying weather to be expected this is considered a minimum.
- 7. If D Coy can be gainfully employed it will be moved fwd on your request but the difficulties of sup must be given due consideration.
- 8. The post of the comd of att tps in your area has been clarified by 6 Aust Div who have paced them under 17 Aust Inf Bde which authority is delegated to you.
- g. The med appreciation of Major PARSONS has been carefully examined and is approved. However the provision of 70 beds at YAMBES seems to be lavish in view of the nature of your ops and the methods employed which should keep casualties to the minimum. Major PARSONS will be told that any future comms of this nature will be submitted to you and a copy sent to ADMS for infm only. Please keep me in touch with the med situation continously.

MALBUAIN is reported clear and will be kept under close observation.

My present intention is to leave A Coy at MUSINAU DREKIKER. Tasks 2. patrolling EAST to NIGIRA area. WEST MUSIMBILIM NANAHAN SOUTH DUMAN GP. Setting ambushes on Map L of C ASILING SMMISAI.

PEREMBIL is the dominating feature of the ridge running SE to PELNANDU. 3. Enemy occupy ASILING feature. MISIM MUSU - SAMASAI are used for staging, MUSU is apparently a very small village of no importance.

The enemy fwd of PERLIMBIL main feature were in occupation of a lower 40 PEREMBIL village but this morning evac and have moved to the ASILING feature. The lower willage was approx 500 yds SE. I allowed Cameron to occupy this village with one Pl as it dominates ASILING.

Your paras 5 (b) (c) are fully appreciated and will be applied. Any 5. further movement along this main axis is controlled by the supply posm. D Goy will be used with C Coy along this axis.

The next move of this HQ is to PEREMBIL. A dropping ground is being 6. prepared. Maint within the unit should become easier where base is established. NO move is intended before the ASILING feature is clear.

Go beyond MUSU if you feel it necessary but DON'T be drawn too far to the SE. Suppose you stop at say SAMISAI and make this a forward base, and patrol aggressively from here further to the SE. Your patrols should soon establish complete ontrol of the country between the NANU River and the MIHAMBON River and progressively as far South as the 99 lateral grid line and maybe even further south.

- (b) TIME just does not enter into the problems. Go quietly and methodically as you are doing and you can't go wrong.
- (c) Takeadvantage of any opportunity the Jap gives you as you did at PEREMBIL. This was a good show. Ple ase convey my congratulations to Cameron and his men.
- (d) The limiting factor to all your forward moves will be supply. There appears to be no immediate possibility of improvement. No second plane has been made available but the Courier plane is sometimes persuaded to drop an odd load. Whatever happens you wont starve. In an emergency the Beauforts will assist. Hence your movements will of necessity be governed by your ability to maintain any troops you push forward of YAMBES.

In reply to your G726 of 13 JAN. Your intentions and information is quite clear and unless the Jap alters his present tactics will bring about his destruction or clearing of the area as desired.

- As far as I can ascertain any group of villages reported to be occupied has a maximum of about 100 Japs, with only a percentage armed with a few automatics. These concentrations do not appear firm and vary according to the ability of gardens in the vicinity to maintain them,
- 2. The situation at present and my outline plan is as follows.
- Any assistance required by the coy to be made available from the main force. The advance will be controlled by the centre.
- 4. With occupation of the WARINGAM-BANA areas a dropping ground will be prepared and a firm base and HQs will be established in this area. D and C Coys forward coys. The centre force will then clear AUANG-BULMITA and secure a firm base with dropping ground in the WARANGAM area (5003).
- 5. On the left B Coy having secured SELNI area will clear YANA.
 BOMBISIMA and come into reserve AUANG, moving then to clear the
 KUAINICIMA group.
- Looking shead if the Jap intends putting up any sort of resistance we should meet it in the BALIF area or at BALAGA. Here I feel two detachments of 4.2" mortars would be a worthwhile surprise for him. I have given due consideration to the maintenance of two dets but with the labor situation clarified and the topographical aspect in our favour I am sure these weapons will prove their effectiveness. The unit mortar personnel are trained in the use of the 4.2" mortars but if you wish otherwise I would be content. Unless we run into a field piece of the Jap to worry us the dropping of two mortars in the SULAMITA area should fill our requirements.
- 7. The Jap has shown apparent dislike for areas which we harass at night with mortar fire and in view of the fact that in many of the areas not even foxholes have been dug, it is quite understandable
- from the unit viewpoint very satisfactory and the troops are in very high and keen spirits. If ACF could augment the tobacco supply they would be without a complaint. The unit canteen from Regimental Funds is assisting.
- Diarrhoea amounting to an average of 30 cases per week with a five day treatment is a full-time duty. Pressure is being maintained in instructions and inspections by the MMO and myself. The clearing of Jap habitation destroys many flies there are many still in evidence. It is evident that the Japs as usual are suffering from dysentry pretty badly and this does not help in our task.
- Darling unfortunately has injured his leg and Parsons has ordered his return to AITAPE, which I am sorry about and it also must be most disappointing to him. He actually only saw the YAMBES SAHIK areas.
- I am awaiting the Staff Capt and party and expect their arrival within a day or so.

The present indications are that the Jap line of withdrawal 2. is to the South and that there are few if any Japs in the MAPRIK drome area. 3. The main enemy conc appears to be in the SINAHU area 8 to 10 miles South of ILAHOP A5698, between the NANU and AMUK Rivers. Our job is to kill as many Japs as we can as part of the process 4. of cleaning up the country. The actual capture of ground means nothing to us at this stage. 5. Assuming the objectives given you in 17 Bde 00 No.2 are obtained our next attention is on the MAPRIK area as a preliminary to a move to the South. Active patrolling to get str and disposus of enemy in MAPRIK area will be undertaken by both units and as many enemy as possible destroyed in the process. 7. The actual clearing of the MAPRIK area will mainly concern the Cav with such sp of 2/5 3n as may be considered necessary at the time. The line of approach to MAPRIK should generally be from the North and also (if possible) from the East. The SCREW River track (between 67 and 69 vertical grid) and the CHRMAN Creek (line of 67 vertical grid) appear to offer suitable approaches for 2/7 Sqn which should be rejoined by A and B Tps in say 14 days from now. This approach should bring 2/7 Sqn in a favourable posm to move fwd with 2/10 Sqn. 8. On clearing MAFRIK the Way will be required to gd the left and rear of 2/5 Bn and to mop up the Japs in the country within easy reach to the EAST of MAPRIK. 9. The 2/5 Bn (or 2/7 Bn on relief) will turn SOUTH and clear the SINAHU area leaving a strong base in either the M'BRAS villages, ILAMOP or other suitable area. 10. Subsequent moves of 2/5 Bn will depend on infm of enemy moves but the Bn may be required to continue to the SOUTH and/or to the EAST to WOSERA or they may move back to MAPRIK area and then proceed with the Cav EAST of MAPRIK towards the KABOIBUS GP. Please examine these proposals and let me have your views. ll. 12. At this stage the future policy of div activities has not been defined but a ruling is expected in the next few days. 13. 




> Ref your GS31 OPS MAPRIK area my wiews are forwarded for consideration.


- 1. From recent figures and information it would now appear that approximately 3000 Japs are in existence in the country SOUTH-WEST, SOUTH and SOUTHEAST of the present area ontrolled by this unit to the SEPIK river.
- 2+ Whilst a concentration appears to be in the SINAHU area there is also definite evidence of approximately 500 Japs to the SOUTH-WEST, SOUTH, and SOUTH-EAST of the APOS group SOUTH and SOUTH-EAST of ASANAKOR ENDIPI ILAHETA groups.
- 3. As the task is to kill the enemy whilst cleaning the country and the capture of ground no object if the tasks as given in 00 2 are to be completed with effect all enemy prokets SOUTH to the 90 grid line must be destroyed.
- It is suggested in your para 9 that a strong base be left in 4, the M'BRAS or ILAHOP areas with this apparent task, I am of the opinion that no force smaller than a battalion will successfully carry out this task for the following reasons.
- It is now quite evident that the enemy has no plans or ability 5. for resistance or protection of any particular area and has but one intention to survive by subsistence. He has made no determined effort to resist our movement through this country at any point and as the bulk of this country will supply his wants he is quite content with any area in which we show no interest.
- A force of one coy assuming this is a strong force would not have 6. the ability to deny the enemy any movement he may make in a NORTH -WEST direction and unless control is maintained in the area already cleared by this unit it is quite obvious that before very long the enemy will return to the gardens in this area from which he was ordered previously to secure his subsistence.
- 7. I respectfully submit that the task of destroying the enemy and cleaning the area could be carried out in the following manner.
- 8. When the enemy is either destroyed or cleared from the NOLUNGO-ILAHOP areas one coy be left at ILAHOP to control NOR TH-WEST from this base and to patrol SOUTH EAST destroying the enemy to ILAHINKA 583950.
- 9. The centrak axis of two coys and HQs to move SOUTH-WEST from the BALIF to the M'BRAS area then SOUTH-EAST to ENDIPI, ILAHETA to SINAHU.
- One coy to move SOUTH-WEST from M'BRAS and destroy or drive 10. the enemy from the APOS group SOUTH EAST through ASANAKOR, to YUSAN-AKUOR then EAST to SINAHU.
- The above would require the Cav Regt be given the extra task 11. of destroying the enemy EAST of the AMUK to include WALAHUTA AUPIK 1-2 which are at present occupied by at least 100 enemy.
- The task suggested for 2/5 Aust Inf Bn or relief 2/7 Aust Inf Bn 12. would involve considerable difficulties both for supply and maintenance one very important factor being the natives who are only under partial administrative control/ It is also very doubtful whether the present system of supply and responsibility of L of Cs imposed on the unit would alow this task to be completed in anything like a reasonable period.





