"Australia" means the Commonwealth of Australia, the Territory of Papua and the Mandated Territory of New Guinea;

"communication" means any letter, registered letter, letter-card field service postcard, green envelope, newspaper, parcel, packet or telegram;

"member" means any member of the Australian Military Forces;

"prohibited information" means any naval, military or air force information which has not been published and which may be directly or indirectly of use to the enemy if received by him.

(b) The provisions of this order will not apply to any communication prepared or despatched by a member in the course of his duty.

(c) Part B of this order deals with security and will be observed by all members at all times.

Part C sets out the type of information which must not be written and the type of article which must not be enclosed in communications and will be observed by all members at all times.

Part D contains the orders which will be followed when members are subject to unit censorship and only affects those members to whom the provisions of paras 7 and 8 apply.

PART B - SECURITY.

2. Security of information.-

A member will not communicate any prohibited information except for the purpose of carrying out his duty. A breach of this provision is also an offence under the Defence Act 1903-1941, punishable by a fine or imprisonment or both.

3. Diaries and notebooks.-

(a) A member will not send through the post any diary or notebook.

(b) The CO of each unit will ensure that all diaries and notebooks are collected by an officer appointed for the purpose -

(i) before any movement by sea or (except within the Commonwealth of Australia) by air;

(ii) whenever contact with the enemy is imminent;

(iii) on the 31st December in each year and at such other times as are notified in formation or L of C area routine orders.

3. Diaries and notebooks. (Contd.)

(c) Diaries and notebooks will be sent by units to the nearest detachment of 1 Aust Fd Censorship Coy or to the nearest Base Censor. All such diaries and notebooks will be clearly marked as such and will show the regimental number, name, rank and unit of the owner.

After examination, they will be sent by Det 1 Aust Fd Censorship Coy or Base Censor to Echelon and Records of the L of C area of enlistment of the owner of the diary or notebook for storage and safe custody.

(d) A similar procedure will be followed for disposal of official notebooks kept by officers and other ranks containing technical notes or records of details connected with their duties, notes of army schools etc (except to the extent to which other official unit arrangements for the safe custody of such notebooks are made with the approval of the formation concerned.)

(e) Diaries and notebooks may be returned to the owner on application to the Echelon and Records of the L of C area of the member's enlistment after return to Australia, provided that such diaries and note books have been approved by the OC Det 1 Aust Fd Censorship Coy or base Censor for release, ^{if such diaries and notebooks are not approved for release} they shall not be returned until after the termination of hostilities.

(f) No member will carry with him when returning to the Commonwealth of Australia, or send, deal with or dispose of any diary or note book except in accordance with the provisions of this order.

PART C - CENSORSHIP.

4. Prohibited information.

A member will not post or send any communication containing any prohibited information. In particular, reference shall not be made to any of the following matters :-

- (a) strength of any organizations of our own or allied forces (including navy and air forces) or reference to their morale;
- (b) location of any naval, military or air force unit or detachment except -
 - (i) to the extent to which the official address of the unit includes the name of the location;
 - (ii) that, in a communication to an address in Australia, a member in the Commonwealth of Australia may, subject to any restriction imposed by a formation or IL of C area, say that he is in a State of the Commonwealth or in the Northern Territory, but he may not give any indication of his actual location in that State or territory;
 - (iii) that, in a communication to an address outside Australia, a member may, subject to any restriction imposed by a formation or L of C area, say that he is in Australia, or a Pacific Island, but he may not give any indication of the State in Australia or which island in the Pacific;
 - (iv) that, in a communication to an address in Australia, a member in the Territory of Papua or the Mandated Territory of New Guinea or Dutch New Guinea may, subject to any restrictions imposed by a formation or L of C area, say that he is in such territory or country, but he may not give any indication of his actual location in such territory or country;

4. Prohibited information (Contd.)

- (c) movements of any naval, military or air force units or detachments (including reference to reinforcements);
- (d) armament or equipment of any kind;
- (e) distinguishings signs used for the identification of formations, units and their transport;
- (f) plans or forecasts of orders for current, future or cancelled operations or movements, whether known, rumoured or surmised;
- (g) communications, such as the use, condition or probable extensions or roads, railways or other transportation facilities, bridging operations etc;
- (h) state of the maintenance services (including any reference to reserves);
- (i) positions or description of billets, bivouacs or camps;
- (j) casualty figures before official publication;
- (k) the effect of any action by the enemy. This includes any remark that may tend, if published, to encourage the enemy, to cause despondency in our own forces or people or to prejudice good relations between our own people and people of neutral or allied countries;
- (l) criticism and statements which may bring into disrepute our forces or those of our allies.

5. Prohibited articles.-

A member will not, save in the course of duty, include in a communication -

- (a) any document or equipment captured from the enemy or found in places occupied by the enemy, or any document containing information about the enemy, other than documents or equipment stamped with a War Souvenir Stamp, signed by an authorised officer certifying that the article is not required by Intelligence. In this regard, the attention of all members is directed to GRC G.473/1943;
- (b) official documents, including Intelligence summaries, orders, maps etc;
- (c) official documents belonging to the civil authorities in allied or enemy territory;
- (d) propaganda leaflets, whether issued by the enemy or by Australian or allied forces or authorities.

6. Codes and ciphers.-

A member will not post or send any communication containing-

- (a) any writing which bears any meaning other than that contained on the face of it;
- (b) any instructions or request to use any means of secretly conveying, receiving or recording any information or to use any form of code, cipher or shorthand;
- (c) any writing, mark, sign or thing secretly conveying or recording information;
- (d) any code, cipher, shorthand or any writing, marker sign in any form of code, cipher or shorthand.

PART D - UNIT CENSORSHIP

7. Areas where unit censorship applies.-

All communications (other than green envelopes and field service post cards) from members ^{in any area outside Australia} and from members ^{within Australia} are subject to unit censorship :-

- (a) That part of Western Australia north of 20 deg south latitude;
- (b) the Northern Territory of Australia;
- (c) that part of Queensland north of the northern boundaries of the shires of Barkly Tableland, Cloncurry, McKinley, Wyangarie, Flinders, Dalrymple and Thuringowa;
- (d) the shires of Barkly Tableland, and the districts of Haslington, Heywood and Mount Isa in the State of Queensland;
- (e) the Territory of Papua and the Mandated Territory of New Guinea.

8. Special circumstances in which unit censorship applies.-

The following communications (other than green envelopes and field service post cards) from members outside the areas specified in para 7 of this order shall also be subject to unit censorship :-

- (a) communications from members of any formation or unit when so directed by LHQ;
- (b) communications from a member who is rationed and quartered by the Army when his unit is under orders to move outside Australia or to any of the areas mentioned in para 7 of this order;
- (c) at the discretion of his unit commander, any communications from a member who has been guilty of a breach of security or censorship.

9. Attached personnel.

Unit censorship extends to all accredited war correspondents, members of philanthropic organizations and naval, airforce or allied personnel attached to a unit.

A commissioned naval, air force or allied officer, an accredited war correspondent or an accredited member of a philanthropic organization with officer status and entitled to wear uniform may frank letters written by his assistants or other ranks who are not members.

10. Only officers to censor.-

No member other than a commissioned officer to whom a communication has been submitted in the course of unit censorship will censor or frank or purport to censor or frank a communication from any member of any of the forces

11. Officer responsibility.-

The signature of an officer will imply a certificate by that officer that the communication does not contain any matter or article which would be a breach of this order. An officer who franks a communication containing any matter or thing, the despatch of which is prohibited by this order, shall be guilty of an offence. The franking of a communication containing such matter will not in any way absolve the member who wrote, made or sent the communication from being proceeded against for his breach.

12. Secrecy of censorship.-

An officer will not disclose to, or discuss with, any person whatever the contents of a communication submitted to him for franking or censoring or permit any other person to examine such a communication, provided, however, that -

12. Secrecy of censorship. (Contd.)

(a) in any case of doubt, an officer may refer a communication to another officer of his unit for franking or may send the same to a Base Censor or to a Det 1 Aust Fd Censorship Coy; and

(b) an officer may refer a communication or make an official report disclosing the contents of a communication if, in his opinion, such communication contains any prohibited matter or article.

13. Official address.-

All communications from a member subject to unit censorship shall contain the full name of the member and his official address. This shall be written, in the case of a telegram, on the back; in the case of a letter or letter-card, on the top right-hand corner of the first page; and, in the case of a packet, parcel or newspaper, on a slip of paper enclosed therein. A member shall not use any official address or receive any communication except through that address or request any person to send to him any communication except through that address: Provided, however, that in writing to a prisoner of war or neutral country, the addresses as provided by Appendix E to LHQ Field Censorship Instruction No. 4 shall be used.

14. Despatch of communications. -

A communication, other than a telegram from a member who is rationed and quartered by the Army, will not be despatched until it bears a unit censor stamp or a Department of the Army concession stamp. Every communication from a member whose communications are subject to unit censorship will bear, in addition to the unit censor stamp, the signature of a franking officer.

15. When civil posting prohibited.-

A member, whose communications are subject to unit censorship, will submit to unit censorship all communications made subject thereto by this order. He will not despatch or attempt to despatch any communication through civil postal channels.

16. Carrying communications for others.-

A member will not carry, convey, send or post any communication from a member whose communications are subject to unit censorship.

17. Green envelopes.- :

A member may use a green envelope to send letters which contain private or family matters.

Green envelopes will be issued on the scale of one per ten days for each member whose communications are subject to unit censorship.

A member who is guilty of a breach of security may have the privilege of using green envelopes withdrawn by his CO.

As a disciplinary or security measure, LHQ may direct that the issue of green envelopes to formations or units be stopped.

18. Newspapers.

A member in any of the areas specified in para 7 of this order will not post or send any newspaper unless authority so to do has been given by the GOC formation. Other members whose communications are subject to unit censorship may send newspapers under unit censorship arrangements, subject to any restrictions imposed by the formation or L of C area.

No unit newspaper will be sent by post unless the issue of such newspaper has been passed for publication by an Assistant or Deputy Assistant Director of Public Relations.

20. Penalties.-

Penalties imposed for a breach of security or censorship will be notified in formation routine orders and, whenever practicable, such notifications will be read out on parade to troops within formation.

21. Cancellations.-

GRCS G.466/1942, G.561/1942, G.296/1943, G.835/1943 and G.27/1944 are cancelled.

IHQ Field Censorship Instructions No 4 is cancelled, but the procedure for franking and unit censorship detailed in Appendices A and B thereof will continue to be followed pending the issue of a new field censorship instruction.

1. GENERAL

During training the country will not be treated as jungle. Fundamental tactical principles remain the same but are applied differently to suit conditions.

Pl Comds will prepare all exercises 24 hours in advance of day set for training. Coy Comds will check Pl Comd's notes on exercise.

Nos 2, 3 & 5 Pls will carry out same training as Rifle Coys. No 1 Pl will do specialist training.

2. TRAINING 13 NOV

Vaccinations and inoculations will be conducted under same arrangements as previously, commencing at 1000 hours with 'A' Coy.

Coy Comds will allot remainder of day to periods named. During the discussion on Malaria and Hygiene control, personnel will be asked to express their views. The following points will be stressed :-

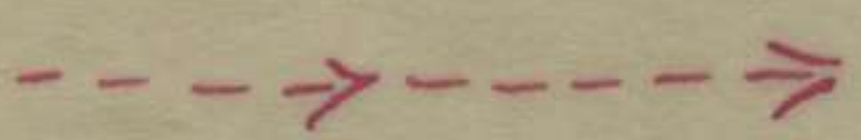
ROUTE OF MARCH







METEO ROLOGICAL SUMMARY

The weather for the month was particularly dry, and very many hot days were recorded. The average temperature was 87 degrees with nine days over the 90 degree mark, and one reading of 102. As a result of vehicles passing along the roads, clouds of dust were sent up, and this made conditions most unpleasant in the camp area.

The total rainfall for the month was little over five inches and practically all fell in sharp storms. These storms, mostly electrical, were very severe but not long sustained. Generally they were accompanied by strong winds which were responsible for the breaking down of trees, and damage to building roofs.

65. LEAVE.

Periods of absence without leave will be debited against authorised recreation leave, provided that the maximum debit in respect of any one period of absence without leave will not exceed 24 days. Such debit is not part of the penalty imposed for absence without leave, but is an administrative act and is made on the basis that the member, by absenting himself without leave, has to the extent of his absence used up his eligibility for leave.

This debit can only be ordered by the Commanding Officer and, when such a debit is ordered, appropriate entries will be made in MAF A63 and the member's MAB 83.

66. LIFE ASSURANCE POLICIES TAKEN OUT BY MEMBERS OF THE FORCES.

GRO F412/44 is published for information:-

1. Life assurance policies taken out by members of the forces on their own lives after September 1939, usually contain a war clause which imposes upon the member assured, if he wishes to remain covered under his policy for the full sum assured while serving outside the Commonwealth, the obligation of -

- (a) informing the life assurance office concerned of his departure from Australia and of the date thereof; and
- (b) payment to that office of an extra war loading premium.

2. Certain life assurance offices regard the Territories of Papua and New Guinea as being, for this purpose, outside the Commonwealth, and there are variations in the rate of war loading premiums charged by different offices, while, in some circumstances, an office may not be prepared to cover the additional risk and may, therefore, refuse to quote any extra premium. A member who desires to remain covered while serving outside the Commonwealth should ascertain from the office

concerned to what areas the existing cover extends and what rates of war loading premiums are required should he serve outside Australia.

3. If the member subsequently embarks for service outside the Commonwealth, he may arrange through army channels -

(a) for payment of the amount of extra war loading premium (as previously ascertained by him) to the office concerned, by means of a remittance of undrawn pay; and

(b) for notice of the date of embarkation to be given to that office by the DFO when paying the remittance.

4. For security reasons, direct notification by members to life assurance offices of their impending or actual embarkation is strictly prohibited.

67. INCOME TAX - MEMBERS WITH DEPENDENTS RESIDENT OVERSEAS.

1. The Income Tax Assessment Act provides for rebates of tax in respect of a tax payers dependents resident in Australia.

2. Where a member of the AMF has married while serving overseas, rebates may be claimed in respect of his wife, and of any children of the marriage, even if they are residing overseas. Such persons are, for this purpose deemed to be domiciled in Australia.

3. No rebate will be allowed in respect of other dependents residing outside Australia.

68. AWARDS BY COMMANDING OFFICERS AND COMPANY COMMANDERS.

Amendments to AMR & O have been notified in Statutory Rule 154 of 18 Oct 44.

1. Without giving an accused the right of election for trial by Court Martial, a CO may award a deduction from ordinary pay allowed to be made by a CO by A 138 (4) to make good any loss or damage occasioned by an offence:-

(a) On private soldiers - not exceeding £3.

(b) On NCO's - not exceeding £5.

A CO may still award against a private soldier such a deduction from ordinary pay between £3 and £5 after first having given him the right of election for trial by Court Martial.

2. A Coy Comd may award, against a private soldier only a deduction from ordinary pay not exceeding £3 to make good any loss or damage occasioned by an offence.

3. Serial amendments to AMR & O 418 and 423 may be anticipated, but the above powers may be exercised as from 18 Oct 44.

69. RECREATION HUT - OUT OF BOUNDS.

Unit recreation hut is out of bounds to all ranks during working hours with the exception of batmen, cooks and personnel observing rest day.

73. INJURIES CAUSED BY ACCIDENTS WITH EXPLOSIVES AND LIVE AMMUNITION.

1. Members of the public have been killed or seriously injured recently as the result of handling explosives and live ammunition which either -

- (a) have been taken or sent home by members of the forces as souvenirs;
- (b) have been negligently left in places to which the public has access.

2. To prevent a recurrence of such accidents the following instructions will be observed strictly.

3. (a) Unless acting in the course of his military duties or unless so authorised by or under the National Security (Firearms and Explosives) Regulations, a member of the AMF will not have in his possession or deliver or transmit or attempt to deliver or transmit to any other person any bomb, shell or other explosive or live ammunition of any kind.

(b) All sub-units will take vigorous action to ensure that members comply with the terms of this paragraph.

4. (a) When any member serving outside Australia and Tasmania is to return to Australia or Tasmania, his kit and baggage will be inspected thoroughly, prior to his embarkation or emplaning, to ensure that he is not in possession of any explosives or live ammunition of any kind other than such as may be necessary in the course of his military duties.

73. INJURIES CAUSED BY ACCIDENTS WITH EXPLOSIVES AND LIVE AMMUNITION. (CONTD.)

4. (b) His kit will again be inspected thoroughly at any LFD from which he is to be released on leave, prior to his being so released.

5. (a) Sub-Units will ensure that all prescribed safety precautions for the handling of explosives and live ammunition are carefully observed.

(b) Explosives and live ammunition used for training purposes will be carefully safeguarded.

(c) Under no circumstances will explosives or live ammunition be carried out, the utmost care will be exercised to ensure that all blinds are searched for and destroyed in accordance with the prescribed safety regulations.

6. If a member is charged with an offence against this order, a summary of evidence will be taken and an application submitted to superior authority for trial by court-martial.

74. PRIVATE COMMUNICATIONS CONCERNING CASUALTIES.

1. Private cables and telegrams reporting battle or other casualties are prohibited. In letters, no reference is to be made to any such casualties until after a period of one month from the date of its occurrence.

2. The prohibition and restriction imposed by para 1 hereof are not applicable to communications sent by member relative to a casualty sustained by himself.

3. This order has been dictated by motives of consideration for the feelings of the relatives of members of the forces who, in many instances, have been caused unnecessary suffering and suspense through information contained in private correspondence from operational areas and which, in some cases, have proved to be inaccurate.

75. ISSUES OF CLOTHING AND EQUIPMENT TO PERSONNEL - RECORDS OF.

1. Personal equipment cards (AAF F204) are being introduced as records of personal equipment on issue to all members of the AMF on full time duty, and will be issued whether personal equipment is on issue to them or not.

2. Members will carry AMF F204 at all times, subject to the same conditions as if it were a part of AAB83. F204 will be carried in the cover provided for AAB83.

3. Members will be required to sign in the column provided on unit's "Statement of Clothing and Necessaries" or "Statement of Personal Equipment", respectively, for all issues of clothing or personal equipment made to them, except where the issues are made in exchange for articles withdrawn, i.e. on a one for one basis. Before the member signs for the articles, he will ensure that the blank squares on the appropriate line of the statement are ruled through.

4. Whenever an article which has been entered in a member's AAB83 or AMF F204 is withdrawn from him, and no article is being issued in replacement, it is the duty of the unit QM to issue and the duty of the member to obtain a receipt on AMF F25A for the article handed over. Members are required to keep these receipts and to produce them when called upon to do so.

5. Members will take reasonable care to prevent loss, destruction or undue wear of personal and unit equipment and clothing on issue to them. Failure to take such care will be regarded as an offence. Disciplinary action will be taken, in accordance with GRO A727/1943, in all cases where loss, destruction or unfair wear of an article appears to be due to culpable neglect on the part of the member.

76. TRAINS AND TRAMS - MILITARY PERSONNEL ALIGHTING FROM.

1. Complaints have been received of soldiers alighting from suburban trains and trams on the wrong side.

77. HITCH HIKING.

1. Many personnel of this Brigade Group have been observed attempting to hitch-hike to city areas.
2. All ranks will be informed that this practice is strictly forbidden and that any infringement will result in disciplinary action.

78. CARE OF COOKING UTENSILS. TINS MESS.

1. Greater care will be exercised by personnel in the cleaning of cooking utensils and tins mess.
2. Sand and other coarse abrasives will NOT be used for this purpose, as the tin coating on the utensils is easily removed, thereby rendering utensils unfit for the preparation of foodstuffs.
3. The practice of placing cooking utensils on hot stoves for drying purposes will cease, as this tends to destroy tin coating.

NOTICES.

GIFT PARCELS FOR UNITED KINGDOM ADDRESSEES - DUTY FREE CONCESSION.

1. The conditions of the concession announced in the Notice appearing in GROs dated 3rd September, 1943, pages 18 and 19, under which members of the AMF and of the British Army serving in Australia and in other places within the SWPA are permitted to send to their relatives and friends in the United Kingdom a maximum of four gift parcels per year, duty free, have been amended. The Notice is, therefore cancelled.
2. The following are the conditions applicable as from 20th October 1944:-
 - (i) The usual postage rates are payable.
 - (ii) Parcels must not weigh more than 5 lbs each and must not include-
 - (a) any drinkable spirits;
 - (b) more than $\frac{1}{2}$ lb total weight of tobacco, including cigars and cigarettes (200 cigarettes or 50 cigars) or any tobacco goods marked "HM Ships only";
 - (c) more than $\frac{1}{2}$ pint of any scent;
 - (d) more than 2 lbs of any one foodstuff.
 - (iii) The maximum value of the contents of parcels which can now be sent by one individual sender in any one year is £8, and this value may be made up as follows:-
 - (a) one parcel of £8 value, or
 - (b) two or more parcels up to a maximum of four parcels aggregating £8 value.
 - (iv) Special Customs declarations (AF W5192) must be affixed to all parcels in order to secure the duty free concession. These declarations, where not already in possession of units, are obtainable through normal stationery channels.
 - (v) Issues to personnel will be under unit arrangements, on the basis of a maximum of four AFs W5192 per year to any one sender. A comparatively few forms should, therefore, suffice for the needs of any unit.
 - (vi) Each AF W5192 issued will have entered upon it the sender's number and name and be signed by the issuing officer in the space provided.
 - (vii) Where the value of the contents in any one parcel exceeds £2, a further declaration for each additional £2 (or fraction thereof), up to the maximum of £8, must be attached, e.g., a parcel containing goods to the declared value of £6 would require three labels attached.

GIFT PARCELS FOR UNITED KINGDOM ADDRESSEES -- DUTY FREE CONCESSION. (CONTD.)

3. It is stressed that full duty will be levied in the United Kingdom (for collection from the addressees) in respect of any contents of parcels which infringe the restrictions contained in para 2(i) above. In addition to these duty charges, the contents of any parcel not bearing a Customs declaration, received into the United Kingdom, are subject to purchase tax amounting in many cases to 100 per cent of the value of such contents. This tax is chargeable on most manufactured articles, but tobacco and foodstuffs are excluded.
