

81. POST-DISCHARGE MALARIA.

1. (a) The Repatriation Commission will accept responsibility for providing any treatment necessary in respect of the first attack of malaria suffered by an ex-member of the AMF after his discharge from the Army.

(b) During such treatment, the Commission will institute inquiries as to eligibility or otherwise for the treatment of any subsequent attacks of malaria.
2. On the first occasion after his discharge that an ex-member becomes ill with malaria, he should -
 - (i) if resident in a capital city - report to the Repatriation Departments branch office or general hospital, either in person or by telephone when immediate examination and treatment will be arranged;
 - (ii) if resident in the country - report to and request treatment from the nearest Repatriation local medical officer, who will send a report to the Repatriation Department. It will be necessary for the ex-member to identify himself by production of his discharge certificate.
3. (a) If it is not possible so to report, the ex-member should consult and request treatment from his local civilian doctor, and, provided that prompt advice is sent by the doctor or the ex-member to the Repatriation Department the Commission will assume full responsibility for the payment of medical fees, hospital fees and the cost of drugs.

(b) Arrangements for any further treatment will be notified to the ex-member by the Repatriation Commission as soon as possible.
4. Information regarding the treatment of malaria, with particular reference to ex-service personnel, has been sent by the Commonwealth Department of Health to civil, medical practitioners.
5. In view of the foregoing, it is unnecessary for any member to be examined by a final medical board at the time of his discharge merely on account of a history of malaria. If the member has had an attack during his service it will be on record in his medical history. Whether or not the member has had an attack during his service, he will be cared for by the Repatriation Commission should he develop an attack of malaria after his discharge.

82. DEMOBILISATION.

Members permitted to live out will be informed of the date and time of their return but will be warned that this is subject to alteration, notification of which will be forwarded to them.

The period of living out will NOT be debited against any credits of leave. CAB Vol 7 No 13 pages 12 & 13 will be suitably amended to conform to revised para 169 demobilisation orders.

63. ENTITLEMENT TO SERVICE BENEFITS ON DISCHARGE.

Attention is directed to GRO 46/45, which provides in effect that, if the employment of a member (whether offr or OR) is terminated on disciplinary grounds or by reason of his conduct or discreditable service, the reason for such termination is entered in the member's records, and he is NOT entitled on discharge or termination of employment to various service benefits, such as:-

- (a) Leave prior to discharge or termination of employment.
- (b) Pay in lieu of such leave.
- (c) War Service Leave
- (d) Supply of certain civilian clothing.
- (e) Retention of certain issue clothing.
- (f) Returned from Active Service Badge.
- (g) General Service Badge.

85. WAR SOUVENIRS.

1. The policy governing the retention of items of Japanese equipment as war souvenirs laid down by First Aust Army is outlined hereunder.

Authorised Items:

2. Items specified in GRO 209/45 para 31 (republished in unit R.O. 22 Aug 45) plus any other items which are of no military or commercial value may be authorised for retention by troops as souvenirs.
3. Troops are NOT permitted to render items valueless by removing parts or portions of the items as souvenirs or for their own use.
4. Troops are not permitted to remove souvenirs from stores or dumps guarded by Aust, Allied or Jap guards.
5. All souvenirs held by troops must be accompanied by a certificate stating that the item is not required by the army - certificates will be in accordance with the pro-forma contained in GRO 209/45 and signed by the Unit intelligence officer. (Certificates are held at Int office)
6. When souvenirs are despatched through postal channels they must be accompanied by the certificate as well as a slip showing number name and unit of sender.

Unauthorised Items.

7. A list of items personnel are not permitted to possess as laid down under GRO 209/45 was published in unit R.O's of 22 Aug 45. In addition items of military or commercial value and which were NOT specified in GRO 209/45 will NOT be retained by troops. Swords, dirks and daggers will NOT be authorised as souvenirs.
8. Disciplinary action against all ranks will be taken without exception in any case of theft, tampering with, failing to report possession of, or holding in unauthorised possession of captured enemy material. The Term "enemy material" includes every store and article of equipment, maps diaries, documents, food etc known to have been in possession of the enemy at any time. It thus includes recaptured material of British and Allied Forces.

Boys will be notified by the unit Int officer when troops desirous of sending souvenirs to the mainland will bring their souvenirs to the Int office for certificate and despatch.

To be promulgated to all ranks.

86. NOTIFICATION OF CHANGES OF NEXT OF KIN.

1. A great amount of inconvenience is being caused by personnel failing to notify this Headquarters of change of Next of Kin and change of address of Next of Kin.
It is important that all ranks realise that it is an order that this be done and failure to obey this order will result in disciplinary action.

87. DAMAGE TO SIGNAL COMMUNICATIONS,

Instances have occurred recently where extensive damage has been caused to signal communications in this area due mainly to :-

- (a) Working parties carrying out camp construction.
- (b) Lack of supervision by persons in charge of the construction of roads culverts etc.

Attention is drawn to First Aust Army Order A261 of 4 Nov 44 which states :

"No member will without authority, destroy, remove, or otherwise interfere with, (whether by cutting, discharging firearms at, or otherwise) any insulators or Sig Cable".

Application will be made for the trial of offenders by Court Martial.

Unit commanders are requested to ensure that all ranks under their command are warned to exercise the greatest care when coming into contact with signal cables whether they be on the ground or air@line.

83. FINAL MEDICAL BOARDS.

Applications for final medical boards (AAF D2) are being made on wholly inadequate grounds in the belief that failure to make a claim for repatriation now will invalidate any further claim, in the future.

As an excessive number of such applications will slow down demob procedure the following facts will be brought to the general notice.

- (a) There is no time limit within which a claim for repatriation must be lodged.
- (b) Such claim may be lodged at any time after discharge.
- (c) A negative answer to para 7 of AAF D2(a) does NOT prejudice any future claim for a war pension by the member.

84. TRAFFIC CONTROL.

The following are the maximum speeds permissible in the Div area :-

In certain areas reduced speeds will be ordered by the appropriate roadside notices. These notices will be obeyed.

85. DESPATCH OF SOUVENIRS ETC THROUGH POSTAL CHANNELS.

Instances have recently been reported of tps in NEW BRITAIN despatching souvenirs through postal channels without the certificate required by GPO 209/45. Such certificate must be attached to the souvenir and is the owners authority for possessing the article.

In addition all parcels must contain a slip showing the number name and unit of sender.

The attention of all tps is to be drawn to GPO 383/44 which prohibits the despatch of ammunition etc through postal or other channels.

Failure to comply with the above instructions may render parcels liable to confiscation.

91. WRECKED JAP SHIPS.

Wrecked Japanese ships or crafts are out of bounds to all troops. No such craft to be boarded without prior permission of NOIG RABAUL.

92. OUT OF BOUNDS.

All islands off the coast of NEW BRITAIN are out of bounds to all troops except persons authorised to proceed to such islands on duty.

93. TRUCKS, 3 TON, TIPPING, 2½ CUBIC YARDS - OPERATION OF HOIST CONTROL.

1. Accidents have occurred during the maintenance of trucks, 3 ton, tipping 2½ cubic yards, due to the unintentional operation of the hoist control mechanism when the tipping body is in the elevated position.

2. Immediate action will be taken by coys to ensure that personnel engaged on the operation or maintenance of this equipment are warned that danger exists.

3. The following notice will be prepared by T.O. and posted in a conspicuous position inside the vehicle's cab in close proximity of the hoist control lever :-

(c) Musical appreciation



1. During this month there has been little sickness. There have only been 12 evacuations in all. Once again Major Hodge has been to hospital but has now rejoined the unit.
2. The main medical activity lately is the examination of troops for demobilisation. Now over 150 have been examined. This process gives a fair indication of the health of the unit, as, except in three cases no disability was found. The skin of the men was remarkably free from rashes.
3. Now that we have Japanese labour in the camp there is little for the troops to do. Consequently there is less sweating and less skin disease. The frequent sea bathing also helps to eliminate lesions.
4. Mental activity, in the form of army education services, has replaced physical activity. Casualties are at a minimum and sick parades are small. The average number attending during the week is approx 70.
5. Otitis Externa, as ever, keeps the medical orderlies busy. This has been so since we have been in the islands. In nearly every case the cause has been fungus. The disease, although painful, has run a short course and has always responded to treatment.
6. There has been no malaria since arriving in Rabaul and very few cases of P.U.O.
7. The hygiene is continually improving and not a single case of Dysentery has been reported.
8. The health of the unit is good. We are expecting reinforcements. As the latter will not have been long in the islands I expect they will be healthy.
9. During our stay here we are ~~to~~ sure to have a record low in the sick rate. There is little risk of infection and as the camp becomes more comfortable and the tempo of army education increased the morale should be extremely good.



95. TERRITORY OCCUPIED BY JAPANESE - UNAUTHORISED ENTRY.

1. It is to be made clear to all ranks that, except in the strict course of duty, it is an offence in itself to enter or be found in territory occupied by the Japanese.



MEDICAL REPORT - NOV 45

HQ 29/46 Inf Bn(AIF)
3 Dec 45.

This is the wet season . The dust has settled and with it have gone the associated medical conditions - conjunctivitis and U.R.T.I. The humidity has increased and with it skin conditions and Otitis Externa have increased .

There have been ten evacuations this month and half of these were skin cases :-

- 1 - Impetigo
- 3 - Dermatitis
- 1 - cellulitis
- 1 - Burns
- 1 - Cheiropompholyx
- 1 - Cut face
- 1 - P.U.O.
- 1 - Appendicitis

This is the largest number of skin evacuations we have had for some months. The total evacuations (10) however is not excessive.

The general condition of the troops is good as shown by small sick parades. These have averaged about 55 per week. The greatest single factor causing sickness in the Bn is Otitis Externa. This is never severe enough to warrant evacuation but does somewhat lessen the strength of the Unit. The position is aggravated by the fact that medical stores for the treatment of ears are in short supply. The supply of medical stores has become unsatisfactory until the end of this month. Nearly all our reserve stock has been used.

The hygiene of the Unit is good and improvements are continually being made by L/Cpl Hockham. In spite of this there have been four cases of mild diarrhoea during the month. Next month I expect sick parades to become larger as training is to recommence. It would be advisable to impress on troops the necessity for care of the skin and platoon commanders should watch carefully to see that towels and clothes are washed regularly.

Early next month reinforcements are due. Innoculations will have to be checked and a skin parade should be held. Meanwhile the health of the Unit is still satisfactory and living conditions are comfortable.



Period 1st to 23rd Dec was devoted weekly to 16 Hrs Trg 10 Hrs Education 10 Hrs Sport. 23 to 31 Dec Incl Weapon Trg and Camp maintenance and sport.

2. TRAINING COMPRISED.

- (a) Route marches of 3 Hrs duration. This revealed foot and skin complaints not evident during inspections and enabled corrective action to be taken.
- (b) Weapon Trg consisted of Rifle Bren and Owen. Trg gave both NCO's and ~~OR~~a refresher. Instruction in most cases was good.
- (c) Range Practices. 95% persons put through Rifle, Bren and Owen Courses. Results 70%. More practice required on Rifles. Rifles have been zeroed.
- (d) Section and Pl Trg collective to Sec and Pl in advance, ^{Trg} attack and Defence. Sand Model followed by exercise in area rear of Bn.
- (e) NCO Centre. 23 students Keen interest displayed Instrs Keen. 60% only suitable for NCO Rank.

3. EDUCATION.

10 Hrs per week allotted. 40% of Unit attending academic and pre vocational trg. 60% awaiting Dand M, Carpentering and metal work. 96% attended CAB and AES lectures.

4. SPORT.


10 Hrs per week. Football, Softball, Volley Ball, Circlos, Basket ball and water polo conducted on inter coy basis. Sport proved good for morale.

5. AMENENETIES.

New Rec Hut popular. Coy Wireless Sets and amplifiers well patronised. Picture attendance approx 80%. Library Books in demand. Band recitals appreciated.

6. MORALE.

Very Fair. Demob drafts have good effect. Trg program at first not appreciated but interest maintained by careful preparation. "Shirts on" unpopular but carried out. Mail regular save over Christmas period. New Years Eve Mail appreciated. Reinforcement Nco's and ~~OR~~settling in.

MEDICAL REPORT FOR DECEMBER 45

- (1). Captain W.R. Spring has been reposted to Vic L of C and left for the mainland 5 December 45. Captain A.C. Salwin was posted RMO to this unit 10 August 45 and assumed that position on 12 December 45.
- (2). Hygiene of the unit has been satisfactory but lack of materials has made it impractical to have latrines as neat as is desired. DDT is in ample supply at this unit and flies are not in evidence about the area. Movement to a new camp site is anticipated in the near future. This camp at present occupied by the 28 Inf, Bn. will be inspected by RMO in the near future.
- (3). Anti-malaria precautions are being adequately observed. One case of B.T. malaria evacuated 14 Dec 45 admitted that he had avoided taking atabrin. General measures adopted throughout the area include drainage and filling of likely breeding places, inversion of all tins on racks when not in use, emptying of all water containers without lids once per week and cleanliness of the camp area.
- (4). Reinforcements have been received from various other units. During the last month 300 have arrived and more are to come. Strength of the unit will then be over one thousand.
Standard of health and physique of the reinforcements is good.
- (5). During the last three weeks new sick per week has averaged 100. This is possibly attributable to the presence of a new RMO. Total treated for each week has averaged 1100, but this is decreasing.
Evacuations totalled 18 for the month and included several Dengue Fever & two proven malaria. 16
Others : Fractured left radius, ? arthritis, papillomata, ? right renal calculus, Headache, urethritis, colitis, appendicitis, otitis media, haemorrhoids, inclusion cyst finger, traumatic arthritis
General health of the unit is good as most of the complaints are minor.
- (6). Skin inspection of the whole unit was carried out from 17 - 22 Dec 45. revealing the following :

Effective strength of unit at 16 Dec 45 was 791. All the skin diseases noted were mild and measures have been taken to combat the excess tinea of feet.
- (7). Training was suspended over the Xmas and New Year period. Training is now continuing each morning; the afternoons are devoted to sports.
