COMD OFFICER'S REPORT FOR WAR DIARY AUG 51

General

1. This being my first month in command of 1 Battalion The Royal Australian Regiment, most of the period was spent in becoming accustomed to the local picture and getting to know the personnel.
2. For some considerable time the battalion has been supplying a large proportion of the reinforcement personnel required to keep our sister battalion in KOREA up to strength.
3. The direct effect of this has been that the battalion has rather lost its individuality and become a sort of staging camp with its attendant problems and lack of esprit-de-corps.
4. In an effort to raise the esprit-de-corps, a number of new ideas have been introduced and these include -
  - (a) The purchase or presentation of a shetland pony for use as a unit mascot.
  - (b) A large scale birthday celebration on the sixth anniversary of the formation of the unit on 12 Oct 51.
  - (c) A roll of honour erected to the memory of chaps of the battalion who have paid the supreme sacrifice in KOREA.
5. The morale of the unit was boosted by the decision to raise the unit to Higher Establishment which is to be implemented by Christmas 1951.
6. A recce has been made of the route between INGLEBURN and SINGLETON with a view to conducting a continuous two weeks exercise to culminate in a battalion attack at SINGLETON.
7. The question of quarters for married personnel is constantly cropping up and I have asked EASTERN COMMAND to issue some type of directive on the subject so that we may promulgate the position to these personnel. The Battalion quarters have been abuilding for over a year and this fact has caused quite a few heartburns.
8. On the question of the Recruit Training Companies two of which are administered by the battalion, the issue of moving the companies out of the bn area has been discussed with EASTERN COMMAND and efforts are being made to effect this, but the difficulty of suitable accn is holding up any definite move on their part.
9. The bn is still very poor accommodated and the Dept of Works and Housing do not appear to be making much progress with our requirements. EASTERN COMD do however, know of this situation and the GOC has taken a personal interest in the matter.
10. I have introduced a weekly battalion parade and an amazing number of people were rooted out from under rocks and hollow logs. This parade forms part of a weekly inspection of the unit, the first of which was held last week.
11. We have a long way to go before this unit could be considered efficient either tactically or administratively, but this will come slowly.
12. Morale of the unit is reasonable but it still requires something along the lines of a fortnight's exercise to give it backbone.

INTRO

1. As no diary of events was maintained until 27 AUG within the Coy, no detailed account of coy activities can be given for this month. Major events, mainly connected with training, are entered as fully as possible.

GEN

2. The Coy maintained its dual role during the month, of a rifle company within the framework of an inf bn, and a drafting and holding coy for KOREAN replacements.

3. At one stage company strength reached 241 all ranks, of which approx 40% of them were draft personnel.

HIGHER ESTABLISHMENT

4. On 15 Aug the coy was ordered to scale down to HE (50 effrs 132 ORs). By 22 Aug this was completed except for officers and NCOs, and personnel were settled in huts in sec, pl and HQ sub units.

5. The Aug draft of replacements were based at GLENFIELDS CAMP carrying out training and undergoing documentation.

TRAINING

6. Coy NCOs under Lt D'ARCY operated a training cadre from GLENFIELD during AUG and ran a series of short courses. These courses catered for

AUSTRALIAN MILITARY FORCES RELIEF TRUST FUND

1. This notice is promulgated to bring to the attention of all serving members of the Australian Military Forces the establishment of the above Fund and the nature and functions thereof.
2. The Fund has been constituted under the provisions of the Services Trust Funds Act 1947, and is administered by three Trustees. The Fund is not a Service institution nor subject to Service control, but is a Charitable Fund under the control of the Trustees who are bound by the provisions of the Act.
3. The purpose of the Fund is to provide assistance to eligible persons who are in needful and deserving circumstances and who are suffering serious financial hardship.
4. Persons eligible for assistance are:-
  - (a) Serving member of the Australian Military Forces;
  - (b) Former member of the Australian Military Forces who served after 3rd September, 1939
  - (c) Dependants of (a) and (b).
5. Under the Act the Trustees are debarred from granting any benefit to persons mentioned in (a) to (c) above who are eligible to benefit from the Services Canteens Trust Fund providing a benefit of the type sought is actually available from that Fund. A person eligible for assistance from the Services Canteens Trust Fund is any person (still serving or demobilised) who at any time between 3rd September, 1939 and 30th June, 1947, was a member of the Forces and his or her dependants.
6. The Trustees have decided to provide assistance as follows:-
  - (1) Assistance by means of a monetary grant to eligible persons
  - (2) Assistance by means of a loan to serving members only of the Australian Regular Army and the Regular Army Special Reserve.
7. Whilst no specific directions have been given or can be given as to the types of assistance for which grants or loans will be approved, assistance will only be given for such items or services as are essential to provide a basic living scale. Furthermore, the Trustees must establish by the fullest enquiry that the applicant is suffering serious financial hardship.
8. Loans are interest free and repayable by means of allotment from the member's pay.
9. As persons desiring to build or buy homes can obtain assistance from building societies and similar institutions, loans will not be granted for these purposes.
10. In order to avoid unnecessary administrative work and investigation members of the Australian Military Forces are requested not to lodge applications for non-essential items or services.

3. It is further forbidden for members of the Forces to publish anonymously or otherwise, an opinion on any question of Military Policy or on any matter under consideration by any Military authority.
4. All members are forbidden in all circumstances, to make any communication to publicity media on matters concerning or relating to the Long Range Weapons Project.
