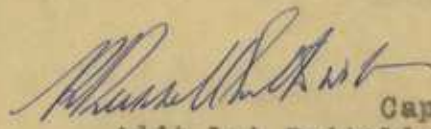

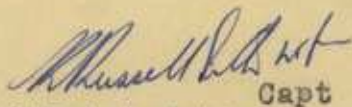

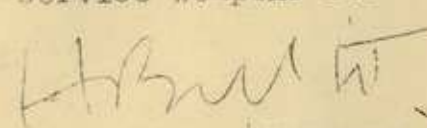

1. A recent check of leave applications shows that a number of members have been granted leave to which they are not entitled.
2. The principles governing leave in this theatre are as follows:-

5. Members who do not desire to take R&R leave when due are required to sign the form of forfeiture attached as Appx A to this order. These forfeitures are processed by 6 Aust Adv 2 Ech and are the subject of a Part 11 Routine Orders.

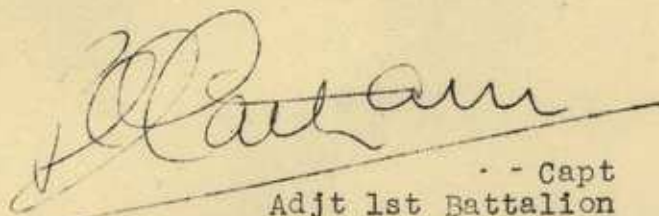
DEALS WITH JAPANESE NATIONALS

235. DISCIPLINE

All members below the rank of sergeant will be in their sleeping quarters by "TATTOO".

236. DISCIPLINE - GOODS INTENDED FOR EXCLUSIVE USE OF UNITED NATIONS PERSONNEL

1. The sale, exchange or presentation as a gift by individuals to non-Service personnel of articles issued or sold by the Services, including NAAFI and Service Canteens is strictly forbidden.

2. The purchase by individuals at NAAFI and Service Canteens of articles in excess of reasonable personal requirements is also forbidden.

3. This order applies in particular to foodstuffs, liquor and cigarettes.

237. SALE OR DISPOSAL OF GOODS OBTAINED FROM NAAFI/RASC EFI ARMY CANTEENS OF ANY OTHER SOURCE INTENDED FOR THE EXCLUSIVE USE OF UNITED NATIONS PERSONNEL.

1. (a) It is forbidden to sell, offer for sale or barter to any person not entitled to purchase from NAAFI/RASC EFI Army Canteen Services or any other source intended for the exclusive use of United Nations personnel any article (including liquor or foodstuffs) which has been originally obtained in JAPAN or KOREA from NAAFI/RASC EFI Army Canteens services or any other source intended for the exclusive use of United Nations personnel.

(b) No article (including liquor and foodstuffs) which has been originally obtained in JAPAN or KOREA from NAAFI/RASC EFI, Army Canteen Services or any other source intended for the exclusive use of United Nations personnel may be resold to any person entitled to purchase from NAAFI/RASC EFI, Army Canteen Services or other organizations retail price (less discount) at the time of re-sale. Prices in unit messes and canteens may be adjusted to cover breakages etc in accordance with component regulations but increase will be kept to the minimum.

(c) It is forbidden for any person to purchase from NAAFI/RASC EFI Army Canteen Services or any other source intended for the exclusive use of United Nations personnel any article (including liquor and foodstuffs) in excess of his reasonable requirements at the time of such purchase.

238. CURRENCY EXCHANGE

1. Members are notified that there are NO facilities (LATCOM (inhead KL4) for the exchange of BAFSV to MPC.

239 JAPANESE MARRIAGES - DIVORCE.

1. As Australian law is that a member of the Australian Military Forces is domiciled in the State where his permanent home is, and that on marriage his wife acquires that domicile, Japanese Courts have NO JURISDICTION to dissolve a marriage contracted between a member of the Australian Military Forces and a Japanese national.

EFFECT of a "Japanese Decree" of Dissolution of Marriage

2. A Japanese decree for dissolution of a marriage between a member of the Australian Military Forces and a Japanese National is not recognised under Australian Law. Under Australian Law that decree has no effect whatever on the marriage. The member is still married and during the lifetime of his wife and failing any decree by an Australian Court, any attempt to go through the form of marriage with another woman would amount to a crime of bigamy. Such an attempt could not confer upon that woman the status of wife, and would render the member, if convicted, liable to imprisonment with hard labour for seven years.

3. If such a decree is recognised by the Japanese Courts the effect under Japanese law would be to free the Japanese national so that she could remarry in Japan but under Australian law she would still remain the wife of the member.

4. It is pointed out that costs of litigation are high. The onus of the party seeking a divorce under Australian law is a very heavy one and approximates the criminal standard of proof beyond a reasonable doubt. The difficulties of obtaining evidence confronting a member seeking a divorce in Australia are very great and might well demand the bringing of witnesses from Japan to Australia. This might not apply to divorce on the grounds of desertion but then the petitioning party would have to wait three years and also prove that he was deserted by his wife without just cause.

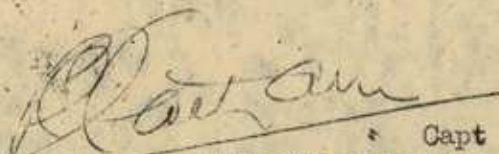
5. The same rules apply to a Japanese wife. If she wants relief then she will have to sue in the Court of the domicile, namely the court of the relevant Australian state. If she be deserted and left in Japan unless she has considerable finance her position is extremely difficult. The position of the deserting husband is equally difficult because as he is the guilty party he has no grounds on which to petition and unless his deserted wife can obtain a divorce recognised by Australian law he will remain married to her for as long as she lives.

6. If the wife be successful in obtaining a decree in an Australian Court the normal rule is for costs to be awarded against the husband.

The Canteen will be closed for all business on Friday 21 Oct 55. The Gift Shop will also be closed on Saturday 22 Oct and Sunday 23 Oct 55. Coys and Messes may draw beer and dry goods on Saturday only. Normal week-day trading hours will operate on Monday 24 Oct 55. These changes in timings are necessary due to Stocktaking and Audit.

A change in policy will take effect from the reopening on Monday 24 Oct 55. In future, all goods will be sold to you at Cost Price.

This means reductions in price on all Japanese gift items of approximately 10%. For instance, Music Boxes which now sell at 1.8.9, will in future sell at 26/-, and so on.

You will not notice any reduction in NAAFI gift or dry goods items, because these are already sold to you at the same price as they are bought from NAAFI, except where odd pennies are involved.

However, the general effect will be quite considerable savings to you on most items. Remember though, that it is only possible for the Canteen to do this because we have virtually no running expenses - wages to staff, rent of buildings, shipping expenses, etc. So, if you see the same or similar things at higher prices elsewhere, don't criticise the other place, particularly in the case of NAAFI, who have to pay wages, rent and freight on a much bigger business than we could possibly run.

A large consignment of goods, including most of the Christmas Toys we mentioned before, is arriving next week, and we can promise quite a good selection at lower prices, when we open on Monday 24 Oct.
