(a) The undermentioned types of hard liquor available on the Japanese market are known to contain large quantities of methyl alcohol (otherwise wood spirit)

(b) As death results in about 20% of consumers and blindness in about 60% all personnel will be advised of the extreme danger of consuming these liquors.

(c) Severe disciplinary action will be taken against members found in possession of any of these abovementioned liquors.

15. MISUSE OF POSTAL FACILITIES

(a) Cases have recently occurred of personnel enclosing dutiable articles in packages of newspapers sent to Australia endorsed "newspapers only".

(b) Until such practices cease customs officials will make a detailed examination of every article.

(c) Articles found to contain dutiable contents and to be incorrectly described on cover will be confiscated.

16. CLOTHES RATION

BCOF CG/430.56/Maint of 17 Jan 49 is published hereunder:-

1. The issue of Clothing Ration coupons will cease with effect from 10 Jan 49.

2. Items in short supply, such as Wool, dress materials etc will continue to be controlled by the method outlined hereunder:-

(a) Each clothing selling point will maintain a register of all personnel entitled to purchase clothing from Canteens Civilian Shops.

(b) Registers will be kept for the following areas:-

- (i) KURE, HIRO at Gift Shop 44, HIRO
- (ii) IWAKUNI at Gift Shop 6, IWAKUNI
- (iii) KOBE, OSAKA at CIP 14, OSAKA
- (iv) TOKYO at Civilian Shop, TOKYO

(c) As a customer purchases her/his short supply item, it will be marked off against her/his name in the register.

(d) If a customer misses on one distribution she/he will be able to obtain that item on the next distribution as preference of supply will be based on records in the register.

(e) Entitled persons may purchase items, other than those in short supply, from any Canteens Civilian Shop.

(f) Items in short supply may be purchased only from the shop serving the area in which the entitled person resides.

3. The registers referred to above will be compiled by Group Supervisors or entitled personnel surrendering either unused coupon books or coupon book covers to the Canteens Service Group Supervisor of the area in which resident, vide para 2(b). On the surrender of coupon books, the customers name will be entered in the register.

4. Personnel entitled to purchase clothing from Canteens Service Civilian Shops, vide FRO 88/47, are defined as follows:-

- (a) Dependents of members of the BCOF, including their non-Japanese servants.
- (b) British Commonwealth civilian governmental representatives and employees, their dependents and non-Japanese servants.
- (c) All female BCOF Service personnel and all female members of welfare and philanthropic organisations of the BCOF.
- (d) British Commonwealth civilians employed by the BCOF.

- (e) Members of British Commonwealth Concert parties who are retained in Japan for an exceptionally long period. Each case will be treated on its merits, and no clothing may be purchased unless authorised as a special case by HQ RCOV.

1. The task of settling into the new area has progressed satisfactorily during the past month. 43 reinforcements have marched in during the month, duties have increased slightly and the personnel position will soon become more acute owing to the departure of 49 personnel via "WESTRALIA" to AUSTRALIA 2 Feb 49 for discharge.

PRESENT DUTIES

2. The permanent duties have been increased by the addition of the post at the C in C's office previously manned by 1 Aust Pro Coy. It is not yet possible to carry out the TOKYO commitment with one rifle company as the companies cannot be built up to sufficient strength.

TRAINING

3. The cadre company continues with its normal task of training reinforcements as they march in to the battalion. It has been found impracticable to allow reinforcements, with less than two months left to serve on arrival, to attend the course with the cadre company. Instead they are posted to B coy which at present holds short term personnel and handles local duties (Special Wing, camp security etc). In B coy they are given limited training between periods of duty in footdrill and elementary small arms, sufficient to allow them to carry out guard duties. In this way the maximum use is made of personnel awaiting movement to AUSTRALIA and they are kept physically fit.

REINFORCEMENT STATE

4. During the month a total of 43 reinforcements were received from eight different units. Of these 16 are ARA, 8 are personnel who have signed waivers and the remainder have very short periods to serve and some of these are already due for discharge.

5. From a study of the reinforcements it is apparent that insufficient care was exercised in the past in the selection of ARA and RASR personnel and particularly, those who have signed waivers of rights. In quite a few cases it is considered that rejection would have been the wiser course as some are morally unsuited for further service in JAPAN and are a bad influence in the unit.

DISCIPLINE

6. There is a steady increase in the amount of petty crime, the most prevalent offence is still short periods of AWL.

7. Over 90% of petty crime is attributed to reinforcements received in the past few months.

OFFICER POSTINGS

8. Three officers have marched in for attachment for a period of three months to ease the officer shortage in the battalion. They are:-

9. Two officers, Capt EMMETT and Lt CROFTS embark MV WESTRALIA ETD 2 Feb 49 for AUSTRALIA.

10. Capt CALLANDER, OC B coy is expected to return to JAPAN from AUSTRALIA 3 Feb 49.

QM RECORDS

11. As was stated in paragraph 16 of the monthly report for December Capt J S PATERSON was posted to QM in December. Considerable progress has been made in straightening out the chaotic Q records of the battalion and at the present time ledgers are being adjusted to the last stocktake in preparation for the six monthly stocktake to take place next month.

12. Concurrently with this work, with the assistance of USAS the 1947 WETs are being completed in order to complete the paper work connected with the change over from field accounting to ledger accounting.

HEALTH AND WELFARE

13. The general health of troops is good and the main complaint is dental trouble. Arrangements are being made to have all ARA and RASR personnel dentally examined.

14. There has been a bad rise in the VD figures of the unit and a new anti VD campaign is being carried out at present. There have been 15 cases since 28 Dec 48. Mostly in the reinforcement personnel.

15. The battalion is administering a leave chalet at DOGOYAMA and 7 men per week may take advantages of the skiing facilities available there.

16. It is now possible to send personnel, due for reengagement leave, to AUSTRALIA by air. It is hoped to arrange passages for upwards of twelve personnel per month in order to clear as soon as possible some fifty personnel due for leave in AUSTRALIA.

17. The unit theatre is operating on 35 mm equipment showing three films per week.

CONCLUSION

18. The officer position has been temporarily eased and should be rectified with the arrival of subalterns ex DUNTROON 1948 early in April.
19. The increase in crime and VD is directly attributed to the fact that the Battalion has received a fairly higher percentage of poor type personnel in recent reinforcement drafts thrown up as a result of the reorganisation of other BCOF units.
20. As at 29 Jan 49 the total strength of the unit is 22 offrs and 435 OR. The OR figure is made up of 104 ARA, 76 RASR, 139 personnel who have signed on for a further twelve months or more, and 117 who at present or within the next few months will be time expired and due for discharge.
21. The strength of the battalion after "WESTRALIA" sails on 3 Feb 49 will be 20 offrs and 387 OR.

7. The vast amount of troop housing and surrendered enemy furniture that has been accumulated since the Units arrival in JAPAN was found to be far in excess of requirements. The furniture was inspected and sentenced by a Board of Survey on 17 Jan and will be disposed of.

GENERAL

1. The standard of dress within the unit has reached a low level and the measures set out herein, which will apply to all ranks of the battalion, will be taken into immediate effect in order to raise the standard to the high level required in a unit with our pride and status.

ON DUTY

2. Whilst on duty all personnel will be correctly dressed and meticulous care will be paid to detail.

3. Uniforms will be well pressed, all buttons will be done up, webbing, equipment, boots, hats and other accessories will be perfectly clean and worn correctly.

4. "On duty" includes breakfast, morning tea, lunch and afternoon tea intervals except that the following points may be allowed if permitted by companies :-

- (a) belts need not be worn in the dining hall
- (b) hats need not be worn to and from the mess hall or in the mess hall.

OFF DUTY

5. Whilst off duty personnel may be permitted to wear any reasonable apparel provided that it is clean, neat, tidy and decent.

6. The attention of all personnel is drawn to the lowering in general standards and dignity experienced by the wearing of mixed disreputable apparel.

7. Personnel may wear civilian clothes whilst off duty in the barracks area.

8. Personnel attending sporting function as spectators will, when the match is played outside the unit lines conform with dress regulations for leave and when the match is played within unit lines conform to "off duty" regulations.

LEAVE

9. Personnel proceeding on leave will conform with the instructions set out in paragraphs 2, 3 and 4 with the following exception :- " a collar and tie may be worn with the service dress uniform and the top button of tunic may be left undone". When a tie is not worn the collar will be fastened.
10. Special attention will be paid to the dress of personnel proceeding on leave as every soldier is an example of the standards maintained by the unit.
11. Troops proceeding to a authorised dance may obtain from Company Commanders permission to wear shoes.

NCOs

12. The NCOs must at all times be a perfect example of the well dressed soldier and will, at all times, correct any breach of regulations seen by him.

CANTEEN SNACKBAR RECREATION CENTRE

13. The president of the mens' mess committee will, at all times, be responsible for the standard of dress in the canteen, snack bar and recreation centre, bearing in mind "the higher the standard of dress, the better the atmosphere and dignity of the facilities."

41. ALLIED FORCES TELEPHONE CALLS AF Calls

- Instructions on how to make AF calls over the Japanese telephone system are contained in the front pages of the current ROOF Telephone Directory.
- The use of AF call facilities is limited to authorized official business of the Occupation Force and accredited personnel.
- When booking a call, the caller will give the switchboard operator the name of the calling party as well as the calling and required telephone numbers. The caller must inform the switchboard operator that the call is authorized. If the call is not authorized, it cannot be handled as an AF call at Occupation Force expense.

42. TRUNK CALLS

The increased volume of trunk line calls indicates that a large number of these are of a private nature. It is also considered that unauthorized calls are being made by Japanese employees.

Heads of Branches, Services, O'sC and householders will supervise the use of the telephone system to ensure that official calls are not obstructed by unauthorized calls.

The supervisory staff at JMS TOLL will, from time to time, check back to responsible officers a percentage of trunk calls to ensure their authenticity.

43. DISCIPLINE - PRIVATELY OWNED VEHICLES

Orders of private vehicles registered with the SCOF are to be earned that traffic regulations governing Military Vehicles are applicable to privately owned vehicles and will be observed by them.

Registration Certificates and Driving licences will be in the possession of the Driver at all times and must be produced on demand to any officer or member of the Provost Corps.

BN AUST REGT ADMINISTRATIVE INSTRUCTION NO 20

GENERAL

1. As from 1 Mar 49 all vehicles used on "Non Duty" tasks as defined in this instruction will be paid for by the individual requisitioning for the vehicle.

DEFINITIONS

2. This instruction defines "Service Transport" and "Duty" and "Non Duty" use of Service transport and prescribes the condition under which Service transport may be used for non duty purposes.

SERVICE TRANSPORT

3. Service transport is all transport owned and operated by BCOF including philanthropic organizations, the Army Canteen Service, BCOF detachment and the Amenities Service and all procured transport.

"DUTY" AND "NON DUTY" IN RESPECT TO TRANSPORT

4. Transport is used for "Duty" purposes only when engaged on its normal service task, and when the passenger or passengers are engaged on official business necessary for the efficient performance of the duties allotted to them by virtue of their appointments. This includes travelling to and from place of work where BCOF bus and ferry services do not meet requirements.

5. Use of Service transport for all other purposes will be considered as "Non Duty" use.

USE OF SERVICE TRANSPORT FOR "NON DUTY" PURPOSES WITHOUT PAYMENT

6. The following service transport only may be used for "Non Duty" purposes without payment.

- (a) Regular bus and ferry services including special bus and ferry services run to official unit functions and approved by HQ BCOF.
- (b) Excursions arranged and conducted by the Amenities Services and promulgated by HQ BCOF.
- (c) Transport by truck or bus of unit teams and spectators to and from sporting activities and approved by the Commanding Officer in each specific case.
- (d) Special cases approved by the Commanding Officer after reference if necessary to HQ BCOF.

7. Categories (a) and (b) above may be used by all members of BCOF or organizations forming part of BCOF and by their dependants.

8. All service transport used for "Non-Duty" purposes, except as shown in paragraph 6, will be on payment.

Use of Unit Transport for "Non Duty" Purposes on Payment

9. Unit transport may be used for "Non-Duty" purposes, other than those described in paragraph 6 above, on payment under the following conditions :-

- (a) 3 Bn unit transport within these instructions may be used ONLY by members of the Bn and by their dependants.
- (b) Unit transport will only be made available for "Non Duty" use when transport for all service requirements is assured.
- (c) Dependants, if unaccompanied by service members, will be permitted to use ONLY mechanical transport and that ONLY within the urban areas of TOKYO, KURE, HIRO and between KURE and HIRO.
- (d) Transport for use by dependants will be booked through their service member with the unit tpt office.
- (e) Other ranks will only be permitted to use Unit mechanical transport on payment for travel OUTSIDE the urban areas of TOKYO, KURE, HIRO and between KURE and HIRO and use watercraft when so authorised by the Commanding Officer in writing.

- (f) Other ranks of the rank of corporal and above only will be permitted to use Unit mechanical transport on payment within the urban areas described in sub paragraph (e) above. This authority may be withheld from any individual at the discretion of the Commanding Officer.
- (g) The maximum permissible time for any single engagement of mechanical transport within the urban areas of TOKYO, KURE, HIRO and between KURE and HIRO is two hours providing that the vehicle is not required for another task within that two hours. In every case where more than one person is to travel in a vehicle or watercraft one individual will be nominated by the CO or tpt officer as being responsible.

Availability of Unit Transport for "Non Duty" use on Payment

10. Within the limits of paragraph 9 (b) above unit transport will be made available for "Non Duty" use on the following scale :-

Method of Requisitioning for Unit Transport on Payment

11. All requisitions for transport for use on payment will be made out on the correct pro forma (see appx "A") and will be lodged at the transport office at least 24 hours in advance.

12. Requisitions will be approved and filled on a "first come first served basis".

Charges for Unit Transport on Payment

13. Payment will be made at the following rates :-

- (a) Trucks $\geq$ 1 ton , 15 cwt :-
One shilling initial charge plus sixpence for each half hour or portion thereof for which the vehicle is to be at the disposal of the transport user.
- (b) Trucks 1 ton and over and buses passengers :-
One shilling initial charge plus one shilling for each half hour or portion thereof for which the vehicle is at the disposal of the user.
- (c) Watercraft (Single engine workboats and single engine FS boats) :-
Three shillings per half hour running time and one shilling per half hour waiting time while the vehicle is to be at the disposal of the user.
- (d) Watercraft other than specified in (c) above at a rate to be fixed by HQ BCOF for each case on application.

Method of Payment

14. Payment will be made in BCOF TRANSPORT coupons. These coupons will be held by Unit Transport officer and will only be sold to members of the Unit living in NIJI MURA.

15. The method of payment adopted by this unit is as follows :-

- (a) Personnel living in barracks will pay for the trip in BATSU at the transport office before the vehicle leaves the lines.
- (b) Personnel living in NIJI MURA will pay in advance as in (a) above where possible but may pay the necessary number of coupons to the driver when the vehicle reports and before the trip commences.
- (c) Where the time that a vehicle is at the disposal of a user exceeds the amount originally set the additional amount will be paid at the transport office immediately upon return to the unit lines.
- (d) Where the requisitions for transport exceed the vehicles available at any one time, the transport officer may co-ordinate parties within the limitations of the vehicle available, and divide cost between the individuals concerned.

- (e) Payment for watercraft will be made at the transport office for the journey for which the craft is engaged prior to boarding the craft. Payment for additional running time or waiting period will be made at the transport office immediately upon return.

16. Coupons will be cancelled as collected by the word "CANCELLED" printed plainly across the coupon.

Operation of Transport

17. Drivers at all times when operating transport being used on payment will be in possession of a written statement of their duties and responsibilities. In the case of Japanese drivers this statement will be written in English and Japanese (see appx "C").

18. The driver or coxwain is responsible at all times for the operation of his vehicle or watercraft and will disregard any instructions given to him by the transport user which contravene, or would in his opinion contravene, the service instructions given for his vehicle or watercraft or instructions which in his opinion would jeopardize the safety of the vehicle or watercraft or any other transport.

19. No person other than the driver or coxwain will be permitted to drive or operate any vehicle or watercraft.

Administration Procedure

20. BCOF Form T. . . which replaces AAF G2 for the purpose of travel in mechanical vehicles on payment will be entered by the transport office in duplicate on separately serial numbered forms.

21. BCOF Form T. . . will be accountable. Duplicate copies will be retained in the book by the transport office and will be subject to audit. The original copy will accompany the vehicle.

22. BCOF Form T.2 will be accountable and will be used for water transport and will be treated in the same manner as BCOF Form T1.

23. On the first day of each month the original copies of BCOF Form T.1 and T.2 for all journeys carried out during the preceding month will be summarized on the pro forma attached (see appx "B") together with the summary and coupons for the journeys concerned will be passed to Bn Hq by the third day of each month.

24. It must be very clearly understood and appreciated by all ranks that the use of unit transport on payment is a concession and any breach of regulations as set out herein will result in the limitation or cancellation of the above privileges.

25. At his own discretion the CO may refuse any member permission to use unit transport.

SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS FOR DRIVERS OF MECHANICAL
TRANSPORT AND WATERCRAFT ON PAYMENT

General

1. These instructions are intended to cover any special circumstances arising out of use of service transport on payment and in no way amends or cancels any existing instructions or standing orders for drivers or coxwains.

Responsibility of the Driver

2. Before commencement of trip you will ensure that the following action is complete :-

- (a) A Copy of 3 Bn Aust Regt Adm Instr No 20..... and these orders are with your Log book.
- (b) Check T.1 or T.2 to ensure that they are completely filled in.
- (c) In the case of a user living in NLWI MURA collect the necessary number of coupons before commencement of trip.
- (d) Cancel any coupons collected by writing the word "CANCELLED" neatly across the coupon in INK.
- (e) No JAPANESE nationals are included as passengers.
- (f) Enquire when your vehicle is required for its next trip.

3. While a vehicle is at the disposal of a USM the following instructions will apply :-

- (a) You will at all times be responsible for the operation and safety of your vehicle or craft and will disregard any instructions from a passenger which in your opinion contravene the service instructions for your vehicle or watercraft or which in your opinion would jeopardize the safety of your vehicle or watercraft or any other transport.

- (b) In cases when a USER requests a longer period of time than that shown on the T.1 or T.2 :
 - (i) Make the necessary corrections on the T.1 or T.2.
 - (ii) If the USER lives at NIJI MURA collect and cancel the additional coupons required.
 - (iii) If the USER lives in camp report the matter immediately upon return to the lines.
 - (iv) If granting extra time would prevent the filling of a previously ordered trip you will refuse the extra time.
- (c) No vehicle will be used for any illegal purpose (i.e. blackmarketing - a trip "into OUT OF BOUNDS" areas etc).

4. After being dismissed by a USER the following action will be carried out :-

- (a) If out of camp ring the transport office and find out if there are any further instructions.
- (b) Return to the transport lines immediately and by the shortest route.
- (c) Hand in T.1 or T.2 to transport office together with any coupons collected on trip.
- (d) Enquire when next trip will be .

5. Any breach of this instruction or any existing instruction or standing order for operation of transport will be reported to the transport officer upon return to unit lines.

GENERAL

1. During the month an increased number of reinforcements has been received including 22 from AUSTRALIA making the total Battalion strength 486 all ranks. A and B coys are now approaching full strength. With effect from 1 Mar 49 the composite Guard Coy in TONGA will be discontinued and relieved by A Coy while B Coy will meet all the RUMS and RIMO commitments.

C IN C's VISIT

2. The C in C visited the Battalion on 28th and as a result of his visit the scope of the immediate cadre training will be increased, particularly in so far as reinforcements from AUSTRALIA are concerned, to raise their general standard of basic training, posture, bearing and coordination up to the standard of reinforcements received from within BCOF.

TRAINING

3. There are 54 personnel under training in the cadre coy and it is anticipated that they will save then replace personnel due to report for discharge and leave during March. As further reinforcements are received (both officers and men) a third rifle coy will be formed, which will allow one coy at a time to undertake field training, and a school will be commenced to raise the standard of BCOs and train potential BCOs.

REINFORCEMENT STATE

4. During the month 22 reinforcements were received from AUSTRALIA and 22 from within the Force. Additional small drafts are expected from within the Force during the next few weeks and it is hoped that "Australia" due late in March will bring a further draft from AUSTRALIA.

During this month the standard of reinforcements from within the Force has been higher.

DISCIPLINE

5. The amount of petty crimes for the month has shown a marked decrease from the previous months and it is felt that the severe measures taken against offenders is having the desired effect. It is expected that there will be a decrease from now onward as action is proceeding to weed out those considered unfit for further service in Japan and they are being returned for discharge or retraining.

OFFICER POSTING

6. Lt C. D. G. (senior subaltern) has been posted T.C. and a recommendation for his promotion to T/Capt has been forwarded. Capt LAUREN who was T.C. has gone to Australia for leave and will be posted to a Coy on his return. Capt GILL has returned from Australia and now commands B Coy. Capt WATSON has returned to Australia for discharge and Lt G. has left by air to attend the S & T Wing at RAAF. Chaplain ROBERTSON has returned for discharge and has been replaced by Chaplain RUSSELL.

7. The most welcome advice that 14 subalterns would arrive by air beginning about the middle of next month was received during the week.

A MATTER

8. The Battalion is now on sub ledger accounting and 25 Feb 49 has been nominated as the cut off date for a 6 monthly stocktake. Action to complete old records in connection with the change from field accounting to ledger accounting is progressing satisfactorily.

HEALTH AND WELFARE

9. During the month there has been a slight increase in coughs and colds and minor sports injuries. The V figure is very bad with a total of 25 cases for the month. Of these 14 cases have been reinforcement personnel. With the weeding out of undesirable and the continuance of the Anti V campaign a marked decrease is expected.

10. A start has now been made on the back log of personnel over due for leave in Australia. During the last few weeks 7 have left by air and 6 by sea.

CONCLUSION

11. The strength of the Battalion as at 28 Feb 48 is 450 all ranks. Of the total 100 are AMs, 96 AMs, 100 waiver personnel and 50 are due for discharge. Several waiver personnel are awaiting medical to join area and a small number of applications are considered each week. A small number of waiver personnel will be returned for discharge as morally unsuited for further service in Japan on the next ship.

1. In the early part of last month, a film on venereal disease was shown to the troops on two separate occasions. The rate of V.D. remained high during the first three weeks of february but during the last 10 days no cases were admitted to hospital with a venereal diagnosis. The number of V.D. cases totalled 24 and the attendances at the P.A.C 49. A dawn bedside short arm inspection was carried out and as a result of this, two were admitted to hospital.
2. Total men seen on sick parades for the month 196 of this number 18 were injuries. The injuries were nearly all minor in nature with 4 cases of a bone fracture.
3. Rations and quarters were very satisfactory.
4. Hygiene of the camp area is in very good condition.
5. General health of the troops was good and the standard of re-inforcements received was of a much higher quality.

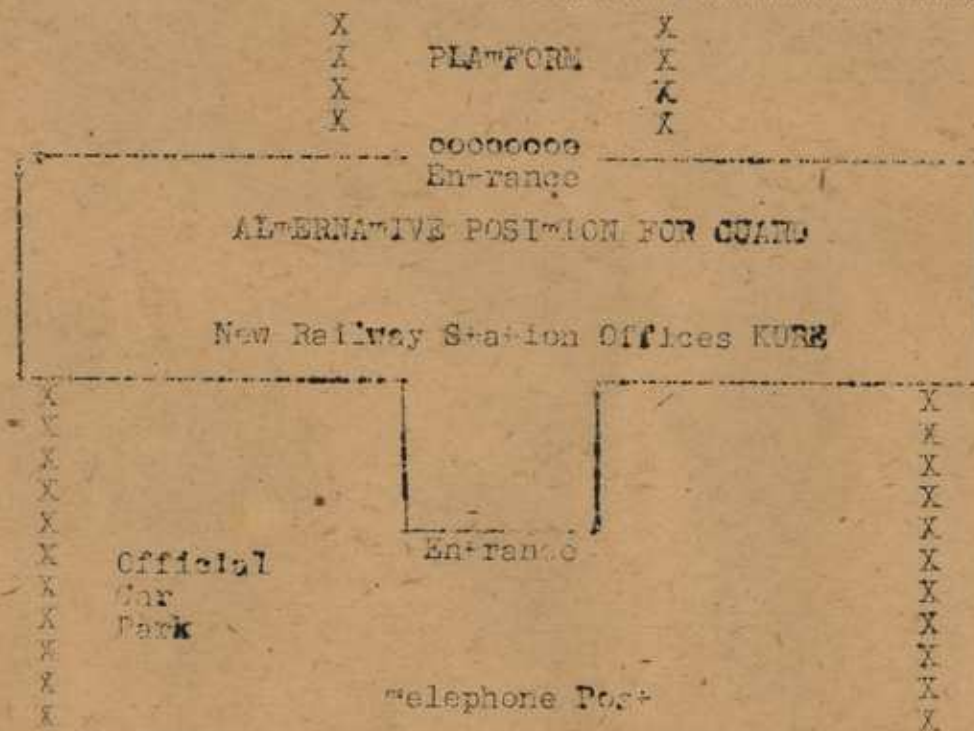

1. Sub Units will commence blacking all boots by universal on issue to personnel, on 19 Mar 49. Action will be completed by 20 Mar 49.
2. The following instructions are issued for the guidance of those required to blacken brown footwear :-

"Boots should be thoroughly cleaned with range fuel before applying the first coat of raven oil. One container of 2 fluid ozs of raven oil is sufficient to blacken one pair of boots. Apply each coat of oil with a rag or cotton wool ensuring that it is evenly spread over each boot. Before applying the second coat allow the first coat to dry thoroughly for at least 12 hours. In some instances boots may require a third coat. When each boot has dried, wipe off the bloom, and after the final coat of oil apply black boot polish. Laces brown leather will be similarly treated."
3. Range fuel will be issued to Sub Units in bulk on the basis of 2½ ozs per pair of boots.
4. Sub Units will arrange for members to clean footwear with range fuel at a central point in view of the fire risk. When cleaning rubber soled boots with range fuel extra care must be exercised to avoid contact with the rubber as the fuel acts as a solvent.
5. Raven oil and range fuel will be issued to Sub Units on a date to be notified later.
