**COMMANDERS DIARIES
INSTRUCTIONS**

AIM

1. The aim of a Commanders Diary is to provide data on which to base future improvements in Army training, equipment, organization and administration, and to furnish historians with a record of the activities of units and formations in operational and non-operational periods in peace and in war.

GENERAL

2. Entries are to be made daily on AF C 2118 (Adapted) each entry being initialled by the officer detailed to keep it.

3. Commanders Diaries will conform with the rules for drafting orders given in "Staff Duties (Australia)", Chapter 2, Section 12.

RESPONSIBILITY

During Non-operational Periods

4. A Commanders Diary is to be compiled by commanders of all formations.

During Operational Periods (1)

- 5. A Commanders Diary is to be compiled in duplicate by:
 - a. Commanders of all formations.
 - b. Each branch of the staff at formation headquarters commanded by a brigadier or above.
 - c. Heads of services not below the rank of lieutenant colonel.
 - d. Personal staffs and officers holding special appointments.
 - e. Unit commanders.
 - f. Commanders of a detachment of a unit when so ordered.

COMPILATION

- 6. Both original and duplicate copies are to consist of:
 - a. Cover (AF C 2119) (Adapted).
 - b. Index as printed on cover.
 - c. Narrative (AF C 2118) (Adapted).
 - d. Annexes as shown in the Index.

7. All details of the unit or formation (if a detachment is concerned, the name of the parent unit), period covered and enclosure numbers of the annexes are to be shown on the cover. If there has been a change of command since the last report, the date of assumption by the new commanding officer is to be included.

8. The annexes are to be assembled in the groups shown on the cover. If there are no enclosures for an annex NIL will be entered on the cover. If additional annexes are convenient for a particular headquarters, starting at B.

DISPOSAL

13. Original Commander's Diary. This is to be forwarded monthly, unless otherwise ordered, by the seventh day of the succeeding month direct to AHQ.

14. Duplicate Commander's Diary. This must be clearly marked as a duplicate. It is to be sent separately from the original to AHQ one month after the original has been despatched but not before the former has been acknowledged.

15. When overseas, both copies of diaries are to be sent through the Army Records organization in the overseas theatre but at different times.

16. TOP SECRET Supplementary Diaries.

a. The documents referred to in Paragraph 9 together with a list of them made out on AF C 2118 (Adapted) must be placed in separate cover (AF C 2119) (Adapted). All details must be filled in and the cover clearly marked in red: "ANNEX Z — OFFICER ONLY". It may be convenient to group the papers by appendices.

b. Supplementary diaries must be forwarded under the normal rules for TOP SECRET correspondence, to AHQ. The inner envelope must be plainly marked:

HMAS ALBATROSS	7 Mar 66		<p>(1) Ex GALBA began as planned - the exercise involved the operational airlift of the Regiment less 107 Fd Bty but including the Task Force Arty Int Sec of 131 Div Loc Bty. The Arty Int Sec normally accompanies the Regt Tac HQ - 102 Fd Bty was the first to fly out; men, vehicles and equipment being called forward from our staging camp - about 4 miles from HMAS ALBATROSS - at two hourly intervals. Four RAAF Caribou aircraft were involved in the lift.</p> <p>(2) The award of the Stanhope Gold Medal to Lt B J CAMPBELL was published today. HOLSWORTHY	8 Mar 66		<p>(2) Some 40 minutes after the Commanding Officer had returned to KOKODA BARRACKS he was summoned to HQ 1 TF where he was informed by Brig D VINCENT OBE, the TF Comd, that the TF was to go to VIETNAM for service, and that a warning order was expected - the Regiment is to consider itself fortunate that we have been able to anticipate these developments and do so with limited assistance from the Staff - indeed, at times in opposition to the Staff; we were not as unprepared as would otherwise have been the case. As instances of our fortunate "guessing" we had prepared a mounting instruction; prepared written indents for all stores required; instituted a thorough and comprehensive dental and inoculation programme in Oct 65; reposted eligible soldiers into the jobs they might expect to do in an operational theatre and, above all, fought to get the Regiment away from time wasting and fruitless barracks commitments in order to carry out some battery and regimental training. Psychologically we were prepared; the Commanding Officer had publically warned every soldier in Jan 66 that it was his opinion that we would be in VIETNAM in May.</p>

HOLSWORTHY	11-15 Mar 66		<p>Staff College Demonstration Period: In the teeth of great difficulties (restrictions to shooting, last minute restrictions to gun locations and last minute changes in plan), intensified by shortage of time and the consequences of our pending operational commitment, preparations were made for the Staff College Demonstration. Thanks to the excellent work of Major D QUINN (BC 107 Fd Bty) whom the Commanding Officer had entrusted with the direction of the demonstration, preparation was most efficiently and economically carried out. Stage management, rehearsals, preparation of stands, survey, catering arrangements, sign posting, printing of programmes and registration, all proceeded as planned by Maj QUINN. The demonstration itself went off well on 15th Mar in the usual drizzling rain which accompanies demonstrations by 1 Fd Regt. The only incident to mar proceedings was a slightly swinging round from 102 Fd Bty (which resulted from a slight defect). This was speedily detected and corrected. The Commanding Officer wishes to be recorded in this diary his opinion, that most Staff College Students at demonstrations attend in boredom and look forward only to a calamity or nonsense (as unfortunately attended the Infantry Centre demonstration on 14 Mar).</p>

1. The following omissions from Table No Q31 are noted:-
 - a. Automotive Repair Shop, Truck Mounted $\frac{3}{4}$ ton GS garage (Code No 6043A) and associated trailer (Code No 6017).
 - b. Trailer $\frac{1}{2}$ ton binned (associated with truck utility $\frac{3}{4}$ ton GS Cargo).
2. The absence of the repair shop vehicle means that there is no welding capacity at all with the Headquarters element (HQ 1 Fd Regt LAD, RHQ and HQ Bty 1 Fd Regt). Furthermore, its absence will require the separate and alternate provision of power tools, a power source (Generator etc) and welding equipment. The provision of this vehicle was anticipated on the LAD TWET and, in consequence, the LAD has been holding such a vehicle.
3. The binned trailer (for which provision is made on the TWET and a similar trailer to which accompanied the LAD section of 105 Fd Bty in Sep 65) is necessary for the carriage of Cat B1 and B2 stores. Without it, carriage capacity is minimal.
4. It is requested that the above equipments be authorized on Table Q31.
5. In addition, confirmation is requested that there is, in fact, both a shop equipment truck and trailer already in the theatre as stated. Our private information is that this is not the case although we believe that there may be an automotive repair truck (mounted) and a $\frac{1}{2}$ ton binned trailer there.

1. It is understood that consideration is being given to posting Capt R S BUCHAN of this Regiment to AATTV. Capt BUCHAN is at present posted as Battery Captain of 103 Fd Bty now preparing for service in VIETNAM.

2. CO 1 Fd Regt feels it his duty to point out that the reposting of Capt BUCHAN at this stage will seriously impair the operational efficiency of 103 Bty for the following reasons:

a. Capt BUCHAN is one of the three substantive captains (against the establishment of 11) in this Regiment (apart from two T/Majs who are battery commanders). He is a key officer in 103 Bty and will continue to be so until a suitable replacement is available to the Regiment.

b. Capt BUCHAN is an experienced and capable officer who is currently engaged in the detailed administrative preparation of his battery for operational service.

c. He is highly skilled in air staff duties, helicopter deployment and air movement generally. Although this Regiment has had considerable experience in tactical air operations there is no officer available within the Regiment of his experience and knowledge who could replace him at short notice. Further, it would take some six months or so from the time a suitable officer was available to prepare a successor to a similar level. Capt BUCHAN is also a UEO.

d. As Battery Captain, he will be obliged, in war, to exercise most of the BC's practical command functions while the latter is serving with his affiliated infantry. This calls for an officer of experience.

3. The CO appreciates well that no officer ought ever to be regarded as indispensable but owing to the shortage of suitable officers in this Regiment, Capt BUCHAN is virtually indispensable and will remain so until a successor is available and can be trained. It is relevant to observe that Capt BUCHAN, personally, would prefer not to serve with AATTV and has never wished to do so.

4. The CO would be grateful if his views could be presented to the appropriate authorities.

1. This Regiment understands that it is to have a number of $\frac{3}{4}$ ton FFR vehicles replaced by $\frac{3}{4}$ ton GS vehicles for service in VIETNAM, and, also, that PRC 25 radios are to be issued in lieu of the WSC 45 presently carried in FFRs.
2. In order to meet our early movement date for vehicles it will be necessary for new $\frac{3}{4}$ ton GS vehicles be on hand. In view of reference A it is requested this matter be treated urgently.
3. Similarly, but for different reasons, this Regiment requests the earliest possible issue of PRC 25 radio sets. These will be required for training.
4. Also, advice would be appreciated as to whether there is a set method of harnessing the PRC 25 for vehicular movement. These harnesses, if available, would also need to be available at an early date. If no harness is available then this Regiment will require both vehicles and radios in order to develop a satisfactory mounting.

TWET 222 TET (P)

1. This Regiment has been issued recently with its TWET. On a first inspection of the document, there are a number of items which cause concern.

2. A battery has an entitlement to 40 water cans. At the most a battery deploys:

- a. Three separate OP parties needing at least 2 cans each, making a total of 6.
- b. One BC's party needing at least 2 cans.
- c. Soldiers in 'B' Ech area who would need no less than 4 cans.

This would then leave for the gun area some 28 cans for about 95 men. This is considered insufficient.

3. The TWET proposes that each battery be issued with a 4 speaker tannoy. This equipment cannot be modified satisfactorily to meet the needs of a 6 gun battery. A 6 speaker tannoy has undergone user trials, but we know nothing of the fate of this equipment. Presently we use a loud hailer for communications CP/Guns but this has obvious and bad failings.

3. In the TWET there is an allowance for line laying equipment. Unfortunately, there is no provision for reels on which to recover and relay line. Unless the policy as regards the recovery of line has changed, there is certainly a need for reels. The TWET shows an entitlement for 31 Apparatus Cable Laying No 3 (Aust).

4. It is stressed that the above observations come from a 'reading' of the TWET. Doubtless there will be other shortcomings when exercises, based on the TWET, have been conducted.

5. It is recommended that:

- a. The Regimental holdings of plastic water cans be increased to 280. This would allow a distribution of 70 per gun battery and 70 to HQ Battery.

b. That 6 speaker tannoys be made available. If these are not available, then it is recommended that sets of communications based on the closed loop principle be made available to gun batteries.

c. That for line laying equipment provision be made for 31 reels.

HARDIHOOD - ELIGIBILITY OF MEMBERS OF 102 FD BTY RAA
FOR VIETNAM SERVICE

1. 102 Fd Bty RAA returned from operational service in BORNEO and MALAYSIA during Oct/Nov 65. All members, now serving in AUSTRALIA, will have had six months home service by May 66. Policy decisions are requested on the following matters.

a. Are members of this Battery eligible to accompany 1st Field Regiment to VIETNAM on its departure.

b. Whether distinction is to be afforded between those members of 102 Bty who volunteer for VIETNAMESE service and those who do not, and

c. Whether distinction is to be afforded between those members of 102 Bty who are married and those who are single.

2. It is relevant to observe that it will be necessary to post members of 102 Bty to make up deficiencies for VIETNAMESE service unless these deficiencies are made good from outside the Regiment.

3. The earliest possible decision is requested so that members concerned are available to begin training at JTC from 26 Mar 66.

Q ACCOUNTING : HARDIHOOD

1. With only part of this regiment going to VIETNAM, there arise a number of problems as regards KOKODA BARRACKS and our two Q accounts. Further, taking over the command of 105 Fd Bty in the theatre raises additional problems.
2. When formed units have gone overseas in the past, it has been the policy that the unit's part II account be wound up by the Barracks Q Staff, with outside assistance. We would like this policy to apply to the regiment in all Q matters.
3. Subsequent to the departure of the regiment there would be need to
 - a. Check the Register of Assets and transfer it to another controlling authority.
 - b. Stocktake the part II account of the regiment and transfer the stores to the senior or major unit in KOKODA BARRACKS.
 - c. Stocktake the part 1 stores of the sub-units which will be left in the barracks and transfer those stores to another account.
 - d. Close the ration account.
 - e. Close the POL account.
4. On arrival in VIETNAM, there will be a need to take over the stores of 105 Fd Bty. We consider it to be unthinkable that, in the one unit, there should be two Q accounts operating. The most obvious solution is that a stocktake be conducted, on 105 Fd Bty stores, shortly after the arrival of the regiment. However, any number of things could happen which might preclude a stocktake. In this event we would probably need to take over 105 Fd Bty stores "on faith".
5. A direction is requested on the above matters.

1. The immediate replacement of WO2 DAVIES as WO Caterer is requested. While it is often to be expected that a person newly joined a unit should make the odd error, the frequency with which WO DAVIES has rendered unsatisfactory work is such that the Commanding Officer is not prepared to have WO DAVIES accompany 1 Fd Regt RAA to VIET NAM.
2. The following instances of unsatisfactory performance of duties are brought to your attention:
 - a. WO DAVIES joined this unit while engaged in extensive exercises in TIANJARA. On the first weekend, WO DAVIES left the unit without permission, on a flimsy excuse, and spent the week-end in SYDNEY.
 - b. He consistently failed to move around and supervise cooks during the defensive exercise (Ex "OTHO").
 - c. During the Staff College Demonstration on 15 Mar, morning tea for visitors would not have been available but for a timely intervention by a junior officer.
 - d. After having received specific instructions from the 2IC to talk to Battery Captains regarding the employment of cooks and certain arrangements for the late exercise period he failed to do so until checked three days afterwards.
 - e. No lunch was provided for a section of the personnel taking part in the Staff College Demonstration.
3. It is regretted that this should need to be brought to your attention but the CO cannot tolerate such inadequate performance of duties in the WO Caterer.

FOSTERING OF 1 FD REGT RAA AND ADMINISTRATION
OF KOKODA BARRACKS

1. With the pending employment of this Regiment to VIETNAM early action will need to be taken to relieve the unit of its peacetime "housekeeping" obligations in KOKODA Barracks and prepare itself for overseas service. In addition, on the departure of this Regiment there will be remaining the following units and sub-units:-

a. Sub-units of 1 Fd Regt RAA

102 Fd Bty RAA
107 Fd Bty RAA

b. Independent Units

104 Med Bty RAA
131 Div Loc Bty RAA

While the independent units do have the capacity to administer themselves, the batteries are not capable of assuming the housekeeping roles of KOKODA Barracks, either separately or collectively.

2. The best practical answer to solve both problems is the creation of a small barracks headquarters to take over the Part II Account and foster 1 Fd Regt on its departure. With the exception of QM, who would need to be appointed or borrowed, no major staff commitment is seen, at this stage, which cannot be met from within the resources of the units here.

3. It is recommended that authority be given for the establishment of a Regimental Headquarters to assume provisional command of 102 and 107 Fd Btys and to take over 1 Fd Regt's Part 2 Account and similar housekeeping responsibilities. The RHQ need not be at full strength, at this time, but the appointment or temporary attachment of a QM will be essential.
