DEFENCE FORCES RETIREMENT BENEFITS REGULATIONS

Increase in Prescribed Amount - Section 4A of DFRB act 1948-65

Following a recent review of the formula laid down in Section 4A of the Defence Forces Retirement Benefits Act 1948-65 for determining the category numbers of contributors, action has been taken by Statutory Rule No 97 of 1966 to vary the "prescribed amount" used in the formula from \$5,460 to \$6,240.

GENERAL

2. The immediate effect of the variation in the "prescribed amount" is to increase the category number of those officers whose prescribed daily rate of pay exceeds \$15.67. The amendment is effective on and from 23rd June 1966, and varied contributions where applicable will be payable from and including payday 23 June 1966.

3. Attached are:-

- (1) Appendix A - the new category scale based on the amendment to the prescribed amount;
- (2) Appendix B - a schedule showing old and new category numbers for officers whose daily rate of pay exceeds \$15.67.

EXISTING (POST 1959 ACT) CONTRIBUTORS

4. The application of the new prescribed amount in the formula for calculation of contribution rates payable by post 1959 Act contributors results in a reduction in contribution rates for category 42 above. The new tables of contribution rates for contributors under 30 years of age on entry, attached as Appendices C and D, are effective from and including payday 23rd June 1966. Rates payable by all members whose Category is 42 or above should be examined and varied, where necessary, from payday 23rd June 1966.

5. Tables of contribution rates for contributors 30 years of age and over on entry will be issued shortly.

PRESCRIBED (PRE 1959 ACT) CONTRIBUTORS

6. Where the category number changes, the increase in contributions will be determined in the normal manner for change in category without change in retiring age, i.e., Factor 1 from the appropriate table, multiplied by the difference between old and new category, multiplied by two.

- (b) of election to contribute for previously rejected pension where applicable (Form 119 - election to be made within four months after 23rd June 1966;
- (c) to apply for deferment of contributions on the grounds of financial hardship (Form 121).

Advice to D.F.R.B. Board

8. A list of prescribed contributors who had attained their retiring age for rank at 23rd June 1966, is to be forwarded to the Board for determination of additional contribution.

9. The increase in nominal category numbers for members who have previously elected not to increase contributions is to be reported by Variation Return entry.

ADJUSTMENT OF CONTRIBUTIONS

10. Adjustment of contributions for both existing and prescribed contributors should be reported by Variation Return entry as early as possible with a suitable notation, e.g. S.R. 97/66, identifying the entry.

PROPOSED MILITARY CORRECTIVE ESTABLISHMENT - VIETNAM

Reference: A. AHQ Confidential A15862 dated 30 May 66.
 B. AFV Confidential A8399 dated 17 Jul 66.
 C. Plan, dated 1 Aug 66, of proposed MCE VUNG TAU.

1. Feasibility of Establishing MCE in Vietnam.

a. As advised in Reference B, in reply to your first enquiry in Reference A, the question of the feasibility of establishing an MCE in this theatre involves the further question of whether the accommodation that could be constructed in a reasonable time and within engineer capacity having regard to priority tasks, would be of a sufficient standard to justify the Governor-General appointing the same as a Military Corrective Establishment.

b. It is envisaged, (see Reference C for detail), that the MCE will:

(1) Be sited in 1 ALSC area at Vung Tau.

(2) Accommodate a maximum of 10 detainees.

(3) Be combined with the existing security building at the main entrance to 1 ALSC area, the two buildings to be linked by a security fence, the area between accommodating toilets, latrines and a small exercise yard.

c. It is inherent in the proposal that:

(1) The MCE personnel will also provide a security guard to the 1 ALSC entrance.

(2) Detainees, during daylight working hours will undergo useful corrective training away from the confines of the MCE buildings.

(3) If, as proposed, the maximum period of detention served would NOT exceed 90 days, the worst kind of offender would not be held in the MCE. Therefore the MCE would be used to accommodate not only persons sentenced to detention by Court Martial, but also those undergoing detention under CO's awards.

d. Subject to other priorities the proposed MCE could be ready to function within six weeks of approval to commence the additional works.

e. The type of construction proposed is considered suitable to the climate and is within engineer capacity, using types of material presently available in the theatre.

2. It is requested that your views on the proposals, and advice as to their acceptability as an MCE, or otherwise, be forwarded to this HQ as soon as possible.
