# COMMANDERS DIARIES INSTRUCTIONS

### AIM

1. The aim of a Commanders Diary is to provide data on which to base future improvements in Army training, equipment, organization and administration, and to furnish historians with a record of the activities of units and formations in operational and non-operational periods in peace and in war.

### GENERAL

- 2. Entries are to be made daily on AF C 2118 (Adapted) each entry being initialled by the officer detailed to keep it.
- 3. Commanders Diaries will conform with the rules for drafting orders given in "Staff Duties (Australia)", Chapter 2, Section 12.

### RESPONSIBILITY

### **During Non-operational Periods**

4. A Commanders Diary is to be compiled by commanders of all formations.

### During Operational Periods (1)

- 5. A Commanders Diary is to be compiled in duplicate by:
  - a. Commanders of all formations.
  - b. Each branch of the staff at formation headquarters commanded by a brigadier or above.
  - c. Heads of services not below the rank of lieutenant colonel.
  - d. Personal staffs and officers holding special appointments.
  - e. Unit commanders.
  - f. Commanders of a detachment of a unit when so ordered.

### COMPILATION

- 6. Both original and duplicate copies are to consist of:
  - a. Cover (AF C 2119) (Adapted).
  - b. Index as printed on cover.
  - c. Narrative (AF C 2118) (Adapted).
  - d. Annexes as shown in the Index.
- 7. All details of the unit or formation (if a detachment is concerned, the name of the parent unit), period covered and enclosure numbers of the annexes are to be shown on the cover. If there has been a change of command since the last report, the date of assumption by the new commanding officer is to be included.
- 8. The annexes are to be assembled in the groups shown on the cover. If there are no enclosures for an annex NII will be entered on the cover. If additional annexes are convenient for a particular headquarters.

### DISPOSAL

- 13. Original Commander's Diary. This is to be forwarded monthly, unless otherwise ordered, be seventh day of the succeeding month direct to AHQ.
- 14. Duplicate Commander's Diary. This must be clearly marked as a duplicate. It is to be sent separately from the original to AHQ one month after the original has been despatched but not before the former has been acknowledged.
- 15. When overseas, both copies of diaries are to be sent through the Army Records organization in the overseas theatre but at different times.
- 16. TOP SECRET Supplementary Diaries.
  - a. The documents referred to in Paragraph 9 together with a list of them made out on AF C 2118 (Adapted) must be placed in separate cover (AF C 2119) (Adapted). All details must be filled in and the cover clearly marked in red: "ANNEX Z OFFICER ONLY". It may be convenient to group the papers by appendices.
  - b. Supplementary diaries must be forwarded under the normal rules for TOP SECRET correspondence, to AHQ. The inner envelope must be plainly marked:

# 89. TRANSMISSION OF ALCOHOLIC LIQUORS THROUGH THE POST

- 1. Commonwealth of Australia Postal Regulations prohibit the transmission of inflammable substances (including liquids) having a flash point of less than 80 degrees F through the post.
- 2. Spirituous licuors having a proof rating in excess of 85 Proof or 74 Proof UK come within this category, and are not to be transmitted through the post to Australia.
- 3. The importation of spirituous licuors into Australia under provision of the special defence force concession is strictly prohibited. Spirituous liquor may only be awarded a custom concession when a member brings it with his other effects on RTA.
- 4. However there is no objection to members posting spirituous liquors to Australia provided:
  - a. The member understands duty may be imposed by the Department of Customs and Excise. (Duty on one bottle of Scotch is about \$A1.85).
  - b. The liquors have a proof rating below the stipulated figure at paragraph 2.
  - c. The bottles are packed safely and in such a manner that damage will not result to other items should the bottles break in the mail.
- 5. If members send spirituous liquor through the post, they are to pack the bottles as follows:
  - a. Each bottle is to be wrapped in a material which must protect the bottle against shock and absorb the liquor if the bottle breaks.
  - b. The bottle is then to be sealed in a heavy guage waterproof bag.

- c. The bottle is then to be placed in an outer container, which is to be securely made of strong and rigid material such as a 105mm cartridge container.
- d. The outer container is to be clearly branded "BOTTLES HANDLE WITH CARE".
- 6. If a bottle breaks and the contents leak and damage other articles, the member is liable to fully compensate the PMG for the damage so caused.
- 7. The proof rating is normally displayed on the label of most spirituous liquors sold in Vietnam. Where doubt exists, the liquor is not to be sent.
- 8. Before signing the Certificate of Inspection, Inspecting Officers are to:
  - a. Check that the proof rating is not in excess of 85 Proof US or 74 Proof UK.
  - b. Ensure that the bottle is packed in accordance with para 5 above.
  - C. Delete the works "or essence of wines or spirituous liquor" from the face of the Certificate of Inspection.
- 9. Members of TFMA are not to send alcoholic liquors through the AFPOs to destinations within South Vietnam.
- 10. RO Part 1 No 12/70 is hereby cancelled.

# 90. WEARING OF WATCH WRIST GP

1. Members of TFMA are not to wear issue wrist watches whilst swimming or washing under showers. Failure to remove watches prior to these activities will result in disciplinary action being taken.

# 91. PREVENTION CONTROL OF MALARIA

- 1. All members of TFMA are to take two Paludrine tablets daily. These tablets should be taken during unit/sub unit antimalarial parades held twice daily. However, in any case, a minimum interval of ten hours between tablets is mandatory.
- 2. All members of TFMA are to sleep under serviceable mosquito nets at all times permitted by operation conditions.
- 3. Whilst on R & R, R & C, or any other form of leave, or duty away from TFMA, all members are to ensure two paludrine tablets are taken daily as detailed in paragraph 1 above. Failure to do so may result in the onset of malaria.
- 4. TFMA RO Part 1 No 24/70 is hereby cancelled.

# 92. PROHIBITED ACTIVITY - DRUGS

Reference: A. AFV RO Part 1 No 66/70.

# Members of TFMA are not to:

- Produce, partake or possess any Prescription Drug or Dangerous Drug except those issued to him on the order of a Medical Officer or legally purchased in Australia or an Australian Canteen or US PX facility.
- Sell, trade, distribute or administer any Prescription Drug or Dangerous Drug except in the course of his military duties.
- Knowingly permit the production, partaking, possession, sale, trade, distribution or administration of Prescription Drugs or Dangerous Drugs, except as provided in sub paras 1( and 12 b, by any member of the Australian Force Vietnam.
- Any member of TFMA having knowledge of infringments of this order is to report the matter by the quickest possible means to the OC TFMA.

### 94 WEARING OF RIBBONS

<sup>1.</sup> It has come to the attention of HQ TFMA that member processing on R & R are wearing the service ribbons for which they have no entitlement.

- 2. The conditions of service for the award of ribbons for service in Vietnam are:
  - a. <u>Vietnam Medal</u> Service of one day or more on the posted strength of a unit or formation on land in Vietnam.

# b. Vietnam Campaign Medal

- (1) Members must serve in Vietnam for a minimum period, either continuous or aggregated, of 181 days from 31 Jul 62 inclusive to a future date, or
- (2) have served in Vietnam for a period less than 181 days from 31 Jul 62 inclusive, to a future date if;
  - (a) Killed on active service,
  - (b) Wounded in action (classified as a Battle Casualty),
  - (c) Captured and later released or escaped
- 3. Any member who is not sure if he is entitled to wear ribbons, is to enquire at the TFMA Orderly Room.
- 4. Disciplinary action shall be taken against personnel who wear service ribbons when not entitled to do so.

# 95. DRESS

- 1. Hats are to be worn by all members when moving around the area within 1 ATF. Hats may be removed upon leaving 1 ATF if there is a strong possibility of losing them from open vehicles.
- 2. Flying suits may be worn during relaxation periods only during night hours i.e. in tents and picture theatre, but not in messes or on duty.
- 3. ID discs are to be worn at all times.
- Shirts are to be worn with sleeves down and correctly buttoned between 1830 hrs and 0630 hrs. Shirts designed for we ring outside the trousers (Coats man t will green combat) may be worn accordingly; however the normal issue shirt (Shirts Man Military Green) is to be worn tucked inside the trousers at all times.
- 5. Boots modified with zippers may be worn only by off-duty personnel during night hours.
- 6. Embellishments and badges, not approved for wearing with AMF uniform are not to be worn by members of the TFMA. Approval to wear badges of rank and other insignia may only be granted upon written application.
- 7. Shorts are not to be worn before 0630 or after 1830 hrs. Members are not to wear shorts outside 1 ATF base nor are they to boll up the trouser legs or modify them in any other way. When wearing shorts, boots GP are to be worn with socks rolled down over the boot top

- The cost of posting films to Australia for processing is 10 cents payable to the TFMA postal orderly.

### Registration

The fee charged for registered mail is 25 cents plus normal postage. If the article is lost or damaged, compensation up to Aust 100.00 is available.

### Telegrams

Members should allow 48 hours for telegrams to reach their destination in Australia. Telegrams must be sent using the EFM code which is available from the TFMA Orderly Room. No more than 3 codes may be sent at any one time. The cost is 40 cents per telegram.

### Warehousing
