INSTRUCTIONS

AIM

1. The aim of a Commanders Diary is to provide data on which to base future improvements in Army training, equipment, organization and administration, and to furnish historians with a record of the activities of units and formations in operational and non-operational periods in peace and in war.

GENERAL

2. Entries are to be made daily on AF C 2118 (Adapted) each entry being initialled by the officer detailed to keep it.
3. Commanders Diaries will conform with the rules for drafting orders given in "Staff Duties (Australia)" Chapter 2, Section 12.

RESPONSIBILITY

During Non-operational Periods

4. A Commanders Diary is to be compiled by commanders of all formations.

During Operational Periods (1)

5. A Commanders Diary is to be compiled in duplicate by:
  - a. Commanders of all formations.
  - b. Each branch of the staff at formation headquarters commanded by a brigadier or above.
  - c. Heads of services not below the rank of lieutenant colonel.
  - d. Personal staffs and officers holding special appointments.
  - e. Unit commanders.
  - f. Commanders of a detachment of a unit when so ordered.

COMPILATION

6. Both original and duplicate copies are to consist of:
  - a. Cover (AF C 2119) (Adapted).
  - b. Index as printed on cover.
  - c. Narrative (AF C 2118) (Adapted).
  - d. Annexes as shown in the Index.
7. All details of the unit or formation (if a detachment is concerned, the name of the parent unit), period covered and enclosure numbers of the annexes are to be shown on the cover. If there has been a change of command since the last report, the date of assumption by the new commanding officer is to be included.
8. The annexes are to be assembled in the groups shown on the cover. If there are no enclosures for an annex NIL will be entered on the cover. If additional annexes are convenient for a particular headquarters, starting at B.

# DISPOSAL

13. **Original Commander's Diary.** This is to be forwarded monthly, unless otherwise ordered, by the seventh day of the succeeding month direct to AHQ.

14. **Duplicate Commander's Diary.** This must be clearly marked as a duplicate. It is to be sent separately from the original to AHQ one month after the original has been despatched but not before the former has been acknowledged.

15. When overseas, both copies of diaries are to be sent through the Army Records organization in the overseas theatre but at different times.

16. **TOP SECRET Supplementary Diaries.**

a. The documents referred to in Paragraph 9 together with a list of them made out on AF C 2118 (Adapted) must be placed in separate cover (AF C 2119) (Adapted). All details must be filled in and the cover clearly marked in red: "ANNEX Z — OFFICER ONLY". It may be convenient to group the papers by appendices.

b. Supplementary diaries must be forwarded under the normal rules for TOP SECRET correspondence, to AHQ. The inner envelope must be plainly marked:

c. The duplicate supplementary diaries must be despatched as shown in Paragraph 14 as soon as receipt of the original has been acknowledged.

437. REQUESTS FOR WORK BY UNIT CARPENTER

1. Numerous incidents have occurred recently wherein members of the unit have approached the carpenter with requests for either work or timber.
2. The ONLY authority who can approve either the issue of timber or work by the carpenter, of any type, is the SSO.
3. An approach direct to the carpenter is unfair to him as his only answer can be that the enquiry should go to the SSO. If work by the carpenter is required, the request is to be in the form of an AFG 1045, addressed to the SSO.

438. SHELL DRESSINGS

1. All 2 AOD Personnel are to carry a shell dressing at all times.
2. The dressing is to be attached to personal weapons or belts pistol.

439. CONTROL OF AMMUNITION AND EXPLOSIVES

1. The maximum amount to be held by an individual for self protection and defensive duties is:-
  - a. 7.62 40 rounds
  - b. 7.62 AR 120 rounds



- c. 7.62 M60 250 rounds
- d. 9mm F1 60 rounds
- e. 9mm Pistol 20 rounds

2. Members who are serving in, or attached to 2 AOD are not to have in their immediate control or possession any ammunition or explosive in excess of a quantity sufficient for self protection and defensive duties.
3. Any member who holds a quantity in excess of that authorised by this order is to be handed to the DSM who is to store it separately in a proper place.
4. Prior to RTA all members are to return all ammunition, explosives and other surplus equipment, and these things are to be disposed of according to current instructions.
5. When clothing and equipment is to be destroyed by fire, each item is to be examined by the Q staff who is to remove all ammunition and explosives and return such items to the DSM.

#### 440. BURNING OUT OF LATRINES

1. Deep pit latrines are to be burnt out within the 1 ALSG area.
2. The following procedure is to be adopted:-
  - a. Pour 1 quart of diesel into each hole of deep trench latrine.
  - b. Allow to soak for 20 minutes with lids open.
  - c. After 20 minutes insert burning piece of paper or waste into the latrine, using a long piece of wire, keeping the face away from the opening.
3. Latrines are to be burnt out at least three times per week.
4. NOTE: Do not use petrol or any other highly inflammable liquids.

#### 441. SECURITY OF WEAPONS

1. A weapon recently went missing from the weapon rack at a unit mess in this area and subsequent investigation revealed that the rack was not visible from the mess.
2. Section heads are to ensure that all weapons depositories in their areas are made as secure as possible by virtue of their location and by surveillance.

#### 442. VUNG TAU SURE LIFE SAVING CLUB

1. As you are no doubt aware this club was formed some months ago to provide trained patrols for the Australian Beach, but due to postings to other areas and RTA, the number of trained members of the club has been reduced considerably.
2. Any interested members of 2 AOD are encouraged to enroll. The only qualifications required are the ability to swim in surf and a willingness to learn basic R & R and boat drills.
3. Training is conducted from 0730 - 0930 hrs each Monday and Friday, and as members become qualified they are nominated for beach patrols. Obviously the greater the number of trained members available the less the number of patrols that they will be required to do.



4. You are requested to give this matter your personal attention and submit your nominations to the OO Admin.

#### 443. PAY QUERIES

1. Pay queries, remittance of undrawn cash and changes in allotments etc, will only be dealt with on the Friday after pay.
2. It is the responsibility of the individual to submit his pay requirements to the pay rep by 1700 hrs on the Friday before payday if his section rep fails to do so.
3. Applications for members to draw pay on other than pay day will only be actioned by the Pay Rep between 0730 - 0830 hrs and 1330 - 1430 hrs.

#### 444. SAFETY

1. The area north of the fenced boundary formed by the fence 110 Sigs hill to 2 AOD DP 1 is out of bounds unless specifically authorised by HQ 1 ALSG. There are many UXB in the area.

#### 445. CORRECT POSTAL ADDRESS

1. It is essential that members use the correct AFV address and inform correspondent that any omission of any part of the address can result in delays and possibly non delivery.
2. The correct address for members is:-
  - a. Number, Rank Name.
  - b. Unit/Sub Unit.

423. GENERAL MEETING - 2 AOD SGT'S MESS

1. A general meeting of the 2 AOD SGT's Mess will be held on 3 Jul 69 at 1700 hrs.
2. All members of the mess shall attend each general meeting of the mess unless excused by the PMC. (Rule 53 - Rules for Officer 'and Sergeants' messes (Prov) 1963).

424. APPROVED EATING PLACES

1. Following restaurant is the only approved eating place for Aust and NZ personnel:-

AU FAVORI

2. For health reasons members of 1 ALSG are advised not to eat at civilian restaurants or eating places in VUNG TAU other than the one listed above.

425. LOCAL LEAVE

General

1. This instruction defines all relevant orders which apply to Australian and New Zealand military personnel within the Vung Tau Special Zone. It is to be promulgated in Unit Routine Orders quarterly and is to be used in briefing all personnel taken on the ration strength of units of 1 ALSG located in the Vung Tau Special Zone. This requirement applies equally to personnel on R & C and on rest in the Beach Annex of the Peter Badcoe Club or visiting the Vung Tau Special Zone Area.

Local Leave

2. No Australian or New Zealand personnel, other than those on duty, are to proceed from or be absent from the 1 ALSG area or the Australian R & C Centres Vung Tau, without a duly authorised Local Leave Pass.

Authorised Leave Periods

3. Vung Tau Special Zone General. Local leave may be granted, by unit commanders, from 0800 to 2200 hrs daily. Not more than 25% of the posted strength of a unit may be on local leave at any one time.



a. FVMAF Establishments. Personnel may patronise FVMAF establishments between 0800 hrs and 2145 hrs daily. However, with the approval of their OC, on each occasion, members may patronise FVMAF establishments which are guarded by FVMAF personnel until a later time, providing the member travels between the establishment and the 1 ALSG Main Gate in military transport, by the most direct route, and arrives within 1 ALSG Main Gate by 2300 hrs.

#### Curfew

4. Curfew for all members, except those on official military duty, is from 2200 hrs to 0600 hrs daily. Members, other than those on official military duty or as defined in para 3 a, are not to proceed from or be absent from the 1 ALSG area or their assigned billets at any time during the curfew hours.

#### Restrictions to Billets

5. Between 2300 hrs and 0600 hrs members, other than duty personnel, are to be in their assigned billets.

#### Dress

6. Unless on official duty, personnel are not to wear uniform in Vung Tau.

7. Whilst on standown within the 1 ALSG area civilian clothes may be worn, unless otherwise ordered. Whilst on local leave outside the 1 ALSG area or the R & C Centre, civilian clothes are to be worn.

#### Footwear

8. When wearing civilian clothes outside the 1 ALSG area, or the R & C Centres, shoes are to be worn. ~~Thongs~~ are not to be worn.

#### Malarial Precautions

9. By 1900 hrs daily personnel must be dressed in long trousers, socks, shoes or boots, with shirts. Short sleeved shirts may be worn.

#### Carriage of Weapons/Explosives

10. Army members proceeding on leave in Vung Tau Special Zone may NOT have, in their possession, any of the following items:

a. Weapons. Weapons shall mean and include:

(1) All firearms such as handguns, shotguns, rifles, carbines, light automatic weapons, and similiar weapons which use an explosive force to propel a projectile.



- (2) Knives with folding blades longer than three inches, swords, sabres, stilettos and spring release (switch blades) knives.
- (3) Metal knuckles, blackjacks, saps, clubs and similar items.
- (4) Instruments on which compressed air or a chemical propellant is used to fire a projectile.
- b. Explosives. Any item such as explosive or explosive devices such as hand grenades, smoke grenades, demolition charges, or explosive material such as TNT, C3 primacord, or arming devices.
- c. Ammunition. Any item or projectile having explosive for use as a projectile.

#### ID Cards and Discs

- 11. All personnel are to be in possession of their ID Cards and are to wear identification discs at all times.

#### Alcoholic Liquor

- 12. Alcoholic liquor, whether contained in a tin, casket or bottle is not to be taken out of the 1 ALSG area or the RAC Centres unless the seal of the container is broken.
- 13. Alcoholic liquor may only be carried outside unit lines if it is wrapped in a manner which conceals the contents.
- 14. Alcoholic liquor is not to be consumed in:
  - a. Any private dwelling or club or quarter, without the approval of the owner or manager.
  - b. On any street or public throughfare, beach, garden or park.
  - c. In any vehicle.

#### Discipline on Leave

- 15. All personnel are to safeguard the image of Australian and New Zealand Servicemen in the eyes of other nations: they are to avoid attracting attention by loud, rude or unusual behavior or by brawling.

#### Entry into US Service Clubs/Messes

- 16. Personnel are to treat all US Service Clubs/Canteens or Messes as if they were Australian or New Zealand establishments. Entry to any establishment is only to be made at the invitation of a US Service member of the establishment, and if the rank of the Australian or New Zealand member entering that establishment is in keeping with the US regulation governing entry to the particular club. The exception to this rule is that, within VTSZ, Australian and New Zealand Warrant Officers are not to use facilities established for US Army Officers and Commissioned Warrant Officers.

#### Unit Reports

- 17. By 1800 hrs daily, unit are to advise the 1 ALSG Duty Officer of:
  - a. The number of their members who are on local leave in each of the following categories:
    - (1) Officers
    - (2) WOs and Sergeants
    - (3) Junior ranks



- b. The names of all their unit members who have been granted late leave under authority of para 3 a above, together with details of the host unit, establishment, etc.

#### Leave Transport

18. 5 Coy RAASC is to provide leave vehicles departing:
  - a. HQ 1 ALSG car park for the "flags" are Vung Tau at 1745 hrs and 1845 hrs and 1915 hrs.
  - b. "Flags" area Vung Tau for 1 ALSG at 1815 hrs, 1915 hrs, 2015 hrs and 2145. Up to four (4) vehicles are to be provided for the 2145 hrs run.
19. When the number of personnel on leave exceeds 80, 1 ALSG Duty Officer is to call on the ALSG Det Amenities and Welfare Unit to take part in the 2045 hrs run. Amenities are to use both of their buses if required. When the leave figures are in excess of 160, 1 ALSG Duty Officer is to call on other units for support.
20. Officer and senior NCO's are not to travel on the above scheduled leave runs. Unit vehicles are to be used, but leave personnel are not to drive themselves.

#### Civilian Vehicles

21. Personnel are not to drive civilian vehicles, bicycles, motor cycles, motor scooters etc, under any circumstances.

#### 426. OUT OF BOUNDS

1. All personnel are warned of the danger of driving a vehicle off the road or formed tracks in the 600 metre extension, that is that area outside the north and Steptoe gates immediately north of the main perimeter. This area is thickly strewn with unexploded shells and bombs of varying types, and many are in a very dangerous fused condition. The area is to be used for authorized military purposes only. Any suspicious objects should not be touched but are to be reported immediately to the ATO, EMU 166.

#### 427. PACEX MAIL ORDERS

1. US Department of Defence directives prohibit the use of US military postal services for transmission of goods purchased by members of Free World Countries through the PACEX order system.
2. Members of Australian Force VIETNAM therefore are not to place orders, for PX supplied items, using this system.
3. However, use may be made of the alternative Special Order system. This provides for orders to be placed at special order desks located within US PX Facilities and delivery to be arranged for the customer at the PX concerned.

#### 428. EXTENSION OF TOUR OF DUTY IN SVN

1. Soldiers wishing to extend tour of duty must apply before nine months of their initial tour has expired.
2. Replacement action commences at this stage, and applications received after nine months of service allow insufficient time for CARO to defer replacement action.
3. Application forms are obtainable at the Ord Room.



429. RIFLE CHECKS

1. A weapons check will be held in conjunction with pay parades.
2. Members who do not desire to draw pay are to attend the parade for the weapon check only.



408. LANGUAGE TRAINING

1. Any member who wishes to apply for Language Training are to submit their application to 00 Admin by 19 Jun 69.

409. BOUNDS - FEMALE OFFICERS QUARTERS

1. The Womens' Services Officers' quarters located at 1 Aust Field Hospital is out of bounds to all male ranks, excepting those personnel authorised on official military duties.

410. DRUGS

1. Members are not to buy, to sell, to be in possession of, or to partake of any drug unless:

a. They are authorised to be in possession of, and to partake of the drug by a duly qualified Medical Officer.

b. The purchase, sale, or possession of any drug is within the course of a member's normal duties.

411. DRESS: UNAUTHORISED CLOTHING

1. Only items of clothing of Australian issue are to be worn by Australian personnel in 1 ALSG.

2. US Items of clothing are not to be worn.

3. The practice of cutting down the brim of hats utility drill green (Jungle hat) is to cease immediately.

4. Hats with cut down brims are not to be worn.

412. VIETNAMESE LABOUR

1. All sections will ensure that the hours of work for Vietnamese employees are adhered to. Hours of work are 0800 hrs to 1700 hrs six days a week.

2. Instances of early release of civil labour is taken as an indication that the unit has too many labourers and may be the cause of a redistribution of labour within 1 ALSG.



#### 413. AMERICAN PX FACILITIES

1. The use of American PX Facilities is controlled as follows:
  - a. The facilities of the American PX (Post Exchange) establishments system are available only to members of the American Forces and certain other privileged persons.
  - b. Whether any particular person or class of persons may use the facilities of the system will depend upon the decision of the American authorities, and usually will be signified by the issue of an official ration card of one kind or another.
  - c. Members of Australian Force Vietnam are, by virtue of a decision of the American authorities entitled to use the facilities of the American PX establishments upon the same condition as an American serviceman, subject to certain obvious differences as to ordering, etc. A brief summary of the main conditions of use of the facilities is endorsed on every ration card.
  - d. Vietnamese nationals and other persons who do not hold ration cards, properly issued to them by the American authorities, are not entitled to use the facilities of the American PX establishments. They are not entitled to receive or have the benefits of the use of such facilities by any other person or persons.
2. Members are not to sell, barter, exchange, loan, or transfer the ownership or possession of any item imported directly for, or purchased from an American PX facility to any person or persons not entitled to use such facilities, except as is provided by this Routine Order.
3. Bona fide gifts are a gift to a person not entitled to the use of PX facilities. The value of the gift is not to exceed ten dollars (\$10) and is not to be an item of limited purchase (rationed item). The ultimate disposition of bona fide gifts is the responsibility of the member making such gift.

#### 414. ASCO FACILITIES

1. The privilege of using retail outlets operated by ASCO personnel is confined to:
  - a. Members of the AFV, for all items whether they are provided by ASCO (Australia) or by VRE.
  - b. Members of other Free World forces and civilians granted PX privileges and holding PX ration cards, for only those items provided by VRE and non-rationed items provided by ASCO.
  - c. Certain other Australian civilians approved by the Australian Embassy and holding a special ration card issued by HQ Coy AFV for only those items provided by ASCO.
2. Members are not to sell, barter, exchange, loan or transfer possession of any item imported, directly for or purchased from ASCO, to persons not entitled to the privilege of using ASCO.

381. PAY QUERIES

Pay queries, remittance of undrawn cash and changes in allotments etc, will only be dealt with on the Friday after payday.

Applications for members to draw pay on other than pay day will only be actioned by the Pay Rep between 0730-0830 hrs and 1330 - 1430 hrs.

382. LOCAL LEAVE

No Australian or New Zealand personnel, other than those on duty, are to proceed from or be absent from the 1 ALSG area or the Australian R & C Centres Vung Tau, without a duly authorised Local Leave Pass.

383. AUTHORISED LEAVE PERIODS

a. Vung Tau Special Zone General. Local Leave may be granted, by unit commanders, from 0800 to 2200 hrs daily. Not more than 25% of the posted strength of a unit may be on local leave at any one time.

b. FWMAF Establishments. Personnel may patronise FWMAF establishments between 0800 hrs and 2045 hrs daily. However, with the approval of their OC, on each occasion, members may patronise FWMAF establishments which are guarded by FWMAF personnel until a later time, providing the members travel between the establishment and the 1 ALSG Main Gate in military transport, by the most direct route, and arrives within 1 ALSG Main Gate by 2300 hrs.

384. CURFEW

Curfew for all members, except those on official military duty, is from 2200 hrs to 0600 hrs daily. Members, other than those on official military duty or as defined in para 3 b, are not to proceed from or be absent from the 1 ALSG area or their assigned billets at any time during the curfew hours.

385. RESTRICTIONS TO BILLETS

Between 2300 hrs and 0600 hrs members, other than duty personnel, are to be in their assigned billets.



386. DRESS

Unless on official duty personnel are not to wear uniform in Vung Tau.

Whilst on standown within the 1 ALSG area civilian clothes may be worn, unless otherwise ordered. Whilst on local leave, outside the 1 ALSG area or the R & C Centre, civilian clothes are to be worn.

387. FOOTWEAR

When wearing civilian clothes outside the 1 ALSG area, or the R & C Centres, shoes are to be worn. Thongs are not to be worn.

388. CARRIAGE OF WEAPONS/EXPLOSIVES

Army members proceeding on leave in Vung Tau Special Zone may NOT have, in their possession, any of the following items:

a. Weapons. Weapons shall mean and include:

- (1) All firearms such as handguns, shotguns, rifles, carbines, light automatic weapons, and similiar weapons which use an explosive force to propel a projectile.
- (2) Knives with folding blades longer than three inches, swords, sabres, stilettes and spring releases (switch blades) knives.
- (3) Metal knuckles, blackjacks, saps, clubs and similar items.
- (4) Instruments on which compressed air or a chemical propellant is used to fire a projectile.

b. Explosives. Any item such as **explosive** or explosive devises subh as hand grenades, smoke grenades, demolition charges, or explosive material such as TNT, C3 primacord, or arming devises.

c. Ammunition. Any item or projectile having explosive for use as a projectile.

389. ID CARDS AND DISCS

All personnel are to be in possession of their ID Cards and are to wear identification discs at all times.

390. ALCOHOLIC LIQUOR

Alcoholic liquor, whether contained in a tin, casket or bottle is not to be taken out of the 1 ALSG area or the R & C Centres unless the seal of the container is broken.

Alcoholic liquor may only be carried outside unit lines if it is wrapped in a manner which conceals the contents.



Alcoholic liquor is not to be consumed in:

- a. Any private dwelling or club or quarter, without the approval of the owner or manager.
- b. On any street or public thoroughfare, beach, garden or park.
- c. In any vehicle.

391. DISCIPLINE ON LEAVE

All personnel are to safe guard the image of Australian and New Zealand Servicemen in the eyes of other nations: they are to avoid attracting attention by loud, rude or unusual behaviour or by brawling.

392. ENTRY INTO US SERVICE CLUBS/MESSES

Personnel are to treat all US Service Clubs/Canteens or Messes as if they were Australian or New Zealand establishments. Entry to any establishment is only to be made at the invitation of a US service member of the establishment, and if the rank of the Australian or New Zealand member entering that establishment is in keeping with the US regulation governing entry to the particular club. The exception to this rule is that, within VTSZ, Australian and New Zealand Warrant Officers are not to use facilities established for US Army Officers and Commissioned Warrant Officers.

393. UNIT REPORTS

By 1800 hrs daily, units are to advise the 1 ALSG Duty Officer of:

- a. The number of their members who are on local leave in each of the following categories:

- (1) Officers
- (2) WOs and Sergeants
- (3) Junior ranks

- b. The names of all their unit members who have been granted late leave under authority of para 3b above, together with details of the host unit, establishment etc.

394. LEAVE TRANSPORT

5 Coy RAASC is to provide leave vehicles departing:

- a. HQ 1 ALSG car park for the "flags" are Vung Tau at 1745 hrs and 1845 hrs, and 1915 hrs.
- b. "Flags" area Vung Tau for 1 ALSG at 1815 hrs, 1915 hrs, 2015 hrs and 2145. Up to four (4) vehicles are to be provided for the 2145 hrs run.

When the number of personnel on leave exceeds 80, 1 ALSG Duty Officer is to call on the ALSG Det Amenities and Welfare Unit to take part in the 2045 hrs run. Amenities are to use both of their buses if required. When the leave figures are in excess of 160, 1 ALSG Duty Officer is to call on other units for support.

Officer and senior NCO's are not to travel on the above scheduled leave runs. Unit vehicles are to be used, but leave personnel are not to drive themselves.



### 395. CIVILIAN VEHICLES

Personnel are not to drive civilian vehicles, bicycles, motor cycles, motor scooters etc, under any circumstances.

### 396. BOUNDS

1. The following places are out of bounds to all members of the Australian and New Zealand Military Forces at all time:

- a. The area inside the triangle formed by Trieu Au St on the South, Le Loi St on the West, and the line formed partly by Le Lai St to where it would join Le Loi St.
- b. All establishments and places on the road which runs SW from the 1 ALSG Main Gate to "Fiveways", excluding the Nguyen Hue Laundry, 30/3 Nguyen Tri Phuong Rd.
- c. All establishments and places on the back road past the old French fort, from Nguyen Tri Phuong Rd to the entrance to Vung Tau airfield.
- d. All establishments and places on the road which runs SW from the 1 ALSG Main Gate (Duong Nha Binh So 7) to the intersection of the Back Beach Rd.
- e. The ARVN Training Centre for revolutionary development bounded by an imaginary line joining GR 323494, GR 328502, GR 340508, GR 367503.
- f. The area known as the Front Beach and Duong Thanh Thai, on the side of the road nearest the beach, between Duong Quang Trung to the North, and the harbour area to the south.
- g. The ice works on Le Loi St and Duong Ly Truong Kiet, except to those members on authorised duty for the purchase of non-potable ice for their unit.
- h. The area known as Rach Dua, bounded on the North By Cat Lo village, on the east by the RIDGE CAMP and on the west by the Cau Rach Bar river.
- i. The ARVN housing area adjacent to the back gate of the 2nd Maint Bn compound, south along Nguyen Tri Phuong St from its intersection with Co Giang St to the US leased housing facility and west for a distance of 100 metres.

2. No member of the Australian or New Zealand Military Forces is to enter any establishment or be in any area described in para 16 above, except in the performance of his military duty.

3. In the area known as Back Beach, south of the Beachcomber Club, all bars are out of bounds to all members of the Australian and New Zealand Military Forces between 1800 hrs and 0800 hrs daily; members are not to visit or be in the back Beach area between those times.

### 397. RESTAURANTS

1. The following restaurants in Vung Tau have been declared suitable eating place, and are in bounds to members of 1 ALSG:

GRAND HOTEL

AU FAVORI

GARDEN OF EDEN

LY LY No 2

RENDEVOUS

2. Members of 1 ALSG are not to eat at civilian restaurants or eating places in Vung Tau other than those named in para 1 above.



398. TENNIS PLAYERS REQUIRED

Could anyone wishing to play in the summer tennis competition please contact Pte AITKEN, the Arnold Club manager as soon as possible.

399. R & C LEAVE

1. A member is entitled to 5 days Rest & Convalescent leave during a normal tour of Duty.
2. Normally a member returns to the unit the morning of the 6th day he is to report to work immediately after lunch the day of his return.
3. The practice of members taking off the remainder of the day of return is to cease immediately.
4. Supervisors are to report any members who have not returned to work after lunch to the OO Admin.

400. 1 ALSG BEACH AREA

Members of 2 AOD, who use the 1 ALSG Beach, are forbidden to leave the 1 ALSG area by means of the beach, and proceed to the American Beach or Beach Comber Club, dressed in swimming trunks.

Members are reminded that to leave the 1 ALSG Area they must be correctly dressed and in possession of an authorised leave pass.

401. DEGREES OF READINESS FOR PERSONAL WEAPONS

a. "Empty"

- (1) No magazine or rounds on the weapon.
- (2) Breech empty.
- (3) Working parts forward.
- (4) Safety device ON.

b. "Loaded"

- (1) Breech empty.
- (2) Working parts forward.
- (3) Safety device ON.
- (4) Magazine with rounds or belt on the weapon.

c. "Action"

- (1) Round in chamber.
- (2) Sights up.
- (3) Safety device ON.
- (4) Finger outside the trigger guard - NOT on the trigger.



d. "Instant"

- (1) Round in chamber.
- (2) Sights up.
- (3) Safety device OFF.
- (4) Finger outside the trigger guard - NOT on the trigger.

**402. 25 METER RANGE PRACTICE**

The following members are to report to 25 meter range at 0615 hrs 10 Jun 69.


