INSTRUCTIONS**

**AIM**

1. The aim of a Commanders Diary is to provide data on which to base future improvements in Army training, equipment, organization and administration, and to furnish historians with a record of the activities of units and formations in operational and non-operational periods in peace and in war.

**GENERAL**

2. *Entries are to be made daily on AF C 2118 (Adapted)* each entry being initialled by the officer detailed to keep it.
3. Commanders Diaries will conform with the rules for drafting orders given in "Staff Duties (Australia)" Chapter 2, Section 12.

**RESPONSIBILITY****During Non-operational Periods**

4. A Commanders Diary is to be compiled by commanders of all formations.

**During Operational Periods (1)**

5. A Commanders Diary is to be compiled in duplicate by:
  - a. Commanders of all formations.
  - b. Each branch of the staff at formation headquarters commanded by a brigadier or above.
  - c. Heads of services not below the rank of lieutenant colonel.
  - d. Personal staffs and officers holding special appointments.
  - e. Unit commanders.
  - f. Commanders of a detachment of a unit when so ordered.
6. Both original and duplicate copies are to consist of:
  - a. Cover (AF C 2119) (Adapted).
  - b. Index as printed on cover.
  - c. Narrative (AF C 2118) (Adapted).
  - d. Annexes as shown in the Index.

7. All details of the unit or formation (if a detachment is concerned, the name of the parent unit), period covered and enclosure numbers of the annexes are to be shown on the cover. If there has been a change of command since the last report, the date of assumption by the new commanding officer is to be included.

8. The annexes are to be assembled in the groups shown on the cover. If there are no enclosures for an annex NIL will be entered on the cover. If additional annexes are convenient for a particular headquarters, starting at B.

DISPOSAL

13. **Original Commander's Diary.** This is to be forwarded monthly, unless otherwise ordered, on the seventh day of the succeeding month direct to AHQ.

14. **Duplicate Commander's Diary.** This must be clearly marked as a duplicate. It is to be sent separately from the original to AHQ one month after the original has been despatched but not before the former has been acknowledged.

15. When overseas, both copies of diaries are to be sent through the Army Records organization in the overseas theatre but at different times.

16. **TOP SECRET Supplementary Diaries.**

a. The documents referred to in Paragraph 9 together with a list of them made out on AF C 2118 (Adapted) each entry being headed by the name of the unit or formation concerned.

b. Supplementary diaries must be forwarded under the normal rules for TOP SECRET correspondence, to AHQ. The inner envelope must be plainly marked:

MONTHLY REPORT - 2 AOD

FEBRUARY 1968

PART 1 - GENERAL STAFF

Enemy

1. A considerable number of reports on VC activity were received during February particularly in the first 2 weeks. Some reports indicated that the VC were going to sweep down from Baria, destroy the bridges between Baria and Vung Tau and 'liberate' the Vung Tau peninsula.
2. The situation was a little confused during the attack on Baria and the VC did attempt to destroy two bridges but the expected attacks on this area were not mounted.

Own Troops

3. During this period the depot was required to double the number of guards and sentries and maintain a 24 hour alert. Only essential movement was permitted outside the ALSG area, all leave was cancelled, minimum lights at night and all ALSG personnel worked without breaks for most of the month. In addition the indigenous employees were stood down until the end of the first week as a precaution against possible sabotage.
4. Martial law is still in force and a curfew is still operating. Whilst this is not affecting our day labour, it has prevented the shift workers (kitchen hands etc) from carrying out their normal tasks and troops have had to be rostered for these purposes.

Establishment (EST IV/127/1(TW))

5. The Capt, OC 15 ORD AMMO PL is now a restricted appointment. The Capt ATO previously filling this position was transferred to the strength of HQ AFV but will still be responsible for the technical efficiency of the AMMO PL. This transfer was effected to provide the ATO with greater freedom of movement throughout the theatre as and when technical service and advice is required.
6. A submission was forwarded to increase the current entitlement of Trucks Ute  $\frac{3}{4}$  ton Cargo from Qty 7 to Qty 9. One of these vehicles is required by the Ammo Pl (who will modify it by the fitting of sandbags and warning signs) for the transportation of UXBS from sites where they cannot be destroyed in situ. The second vehicle is required by RAEME attached personnel to carry out inspection unit repair and maintenance of technical stores and vehicles in the depot.

Equipment Table

7. No RVE's were submitted during the month.

PART 2 - ADMINISTRATION

Military

8. One member did not RTU as planned and remains in Australia on Emergency Leave. One member after being granted an Extension of Tour was posted from the unit. Two members of AACC attached to the unit have also had extontions to their tours of duty approved.

9./

9. During the period, 2 Offrs and 25 OR's marched out RTA and 2 members marched out RTNZ.

10. The Individual Relief Programme is not yet functioning as planned. At the end of the month approx 23% of the unit has served only 6 months or more in the unit.

#### Local Labour

11. Because of the VC 'TET' Offensive, many Vietnamese employees were unable to return to work after the New Year Holiday period and attendances were again down during the early part of the month causing more manpower problems. Attendances out of 129 employed are shown below:

- a. 1 Feb 17
- b. 2-3-4th (Under Martial Law no Vietnamese allowed into the area)
- c. 5 Feb 72
- d. 6 Feb 90
- e. 7 Feb 92
- f. 8 Feb 97
- g. It was not until late in the month that attendances were back to normal.

12. During the period there has been an increase in the number of resignations, mainly due to the lowering of the military callup age.

#### Health and Hygiene

13. The member wounded in the incident on 6 Dec 67 was finally MEDEVACED together with a member suffering from MURINE Typhoid. One officer and 5 OR's were hospitalised for varying complaints none of which were tropical ailments.

14. Hygiene inspections of kitchen and other areas of the unit received excellent reports.

#### Morale

15. There was a slight decrease in Unit morale during the period because of the following reasons:-

- a. During the month the RTA of some members was delayed owing to replacements not arriving in time.
- b. During the early part of the month the RTA of some other members was delayed and they were absent from the unit for some time as they were required as witnesses in the GCM arising out of the incident on 6 Dec 67.
- c. With the absence of civilian labour many members were required to do hygiene, kitchen and other duties normally performed by the Vietnamese.
- d. Due to the current situation, there was no R&C Leave granted and no local leave. In addition there were lighting restrictions and restrictions on canteen trading hours.

#### Discipline

16. During February 3 personnel were charged with:-

- a. Failing to appear at a place of parade. (2)
- b. Conduct to the Prejudice (1)

Accommodation

19. a. Living Accommodation. No change since January report.

b. Warehousing Accommodation. The concrete floor in the tenth 200' x 45' storehouse is nearing completion.

c. Office Accommodation. No change since January report.

d. Other Accommodation. Contractors have commenced the foundations for the 150'x20' servicing/workshop building. Unit labour completed a small laundry room near the OR's quarters.

PART 3 - TECHNICAL

Statistics

20. Stores transactions for issues, DOR's and receipts were 8778, a decrease of 4164 on the January figures. However more bulk issues were handled this month (eg 3 RAR stores and the arrival of the Armd Sqn) and out tonnage to 1 ATF was 495.

Workload

21. Personnel are still working on stock relocation which now includes Groups 1,3,4 and 5 Sub-Depot. It is estimated that this task should be basically completed by the end of Apr 68.

Groups 2,3,4,5,6 and Sub-Depots 4 and 5

23. Gp 2 has now completed the relocation of stores except for 2 runs of shelving to be erected to hold body panels. This is to be completed when the shelving arrives from Australia.

24. Gp 3 is still in the process of relocating. The plan, to share the tenth storehouse to be completed, with 5 Sub-Depot has now been changed because of the quantity of stores held by Gp 3. This Group has now been allocated 2 of the 200'x45' storehouses.

25. Gp 4 relocation is still in progress and half the area of the fourth storehouse allocated to this Group will now be shared with 5 Sub-Depot.

26. No change in 4 Sub-Depot since the January Report.

27. 5 Sub-Depot stock relocation will depend on the progress made in Group 4 but is expected to be completed early Mar 68.

Ammunition

28. The construction of the ammunition repair workshops was completed in time for the repacking and inspection of ammunition received on the 'Jeparit' last. /

last voyage.

29. The ammunition platoon issued 314,705 rounds of gun and rocket ammunition, 2,008,864 rounds of small arms ammunition and 107,558 lbs of demolition explosives and accessories during the month.

#### Traffic

30. A total of 495 tons were dispatched to 1 ATF by road convoys in February. This represents a daily average of approx 19 tons a day, an increase on the January figure and greater than the December 67 record of 335 tons by 160 tons.

#### Shipping

31. Separate reports were submitted on the 'HMAS SYDNEY' January and 'JEPARIT' February voyages.

#### Packaging and Preservation

32. a. Items received from Australia. No change since January report.  
b. Items in Storage. It is becoming more evident as the relocation programme progresses that large quantities of items in Gps 3 and 4 have been damaged by water during the period these stores were located in tank shelters and under pavilins. Box liners were not sufficiently waterproof for the tropical conditions encountered here. However it will be some time before sufficient manpower resources are available to conduct a complete inspection.  
c. Packaging to Units. No significant variation.

#### Control and Provision

#### Control

35. February machine postings were 13,933, this was the lowest level since Apr 67 when the postings totalled 13,342. This situation resulted from the relative decrease in the flow of receipt and issues vouchers through the Depot.

#### Transaction Tapes

36. During the month under revision delivery of tapes to EDP was, to some Degree,/

degree, interrupted due to the disruption of the RAAF Courier Service. The service has now returned to normal.


Provision

PART 4 - CONCLUSION

39. The depot has now reached the stage where the bulk of the stock relocation programme has been completed and it is estimated that by the end of Apr 68 some manpower should be able to be diverted to a stock inspection programme which is particularly necessary in Gps 3,4,5 and 6.
