A Commanders Diary is to be compiled by commanders of all formations.

### During Operational Periods (1)

- A Commanders Diary is to be compiled in duplicate by:
  - Commanders of all formations.
  - Each branch of the staff at formation headquarters commanded by a brigadier or above.
  - Heads of services not below the rank of lieutenant colonel.
  - Personal staffs and officers holding special appointments.
  - Unit commanders.
  - Commanders of a detachment of a unit when so ordered.

### COMPILATION

- Both original and duplicate copies are to consist of:
  - Cover (AF C 2119) (Adapted).
  - b. Index as printed on cover.
  - c. Narrative (AF C 2118) (Adapted).
  - d. Annexes as shown in the Index.
- 7. All details of the unit or formation (if a detachment is concerned, the name of the parent unit), period covered and enclosure numbers of the annexes are to be shown on the cover. If there has been a change of command since the last report, the date of assumption by the new commanding officer is to be included.

### 794. PAY ARRANGEMENT FOR RTA PERSONNEL AT MASCOT

- 1. Difficulties are being experienced in E Comd in that some members who have elected to draw pay on arrival at Mascot are leaving the reception area without doing so.
- 2. All members, once they have elected to draw pay, must accept the short delay in waiting for pay, or have the entry cancelled before leaving Mascot.

### 795. POSTAGE OF ARTICLES THROUGH THE AFPO

- 1. Members are reminded that articles such as rolls of film are not a free postage item. When it is desired for films to be posted, members are to bring it to the mail clerk for stamps to be placed on those articles.
- 2. Letters and cards to countries other than Australia also require postage. Rates are available upon enquiry at the Ord Room.

### 796. PAY

- 1. Effective immediatery, Members are not normally permitted to draw pay between pay days, except for the following reasons:
  - a. Members proceeding/returning from R&R
  - b. Members proceeding on R&C
  - c. Members proceeding to a locality where pay facilities are non-existant
  - d. Costly PX purchases
  - e. For any other circumstance which was not known at pay day, subject to approval by 00 Admin.

### 797. NEEDLE PARADES

Needle parades are held at 1 Fd Hosp every Monday and Saturday. Personnel nominated to attend a needle parade are to ensure that they report at 1530hrs on the nominated day. Non-attendance at the parade causes administrative difficulties to both 2 AOD and Hospital staff, and will result in disciplinary action being taken against the member concerned.

### 798. UNAUTHORISED DISCHARGE OF WEAPONS AND FIREARMS

- 1. Any member who negligently, or wilfully in breach of an order or his military duty, discharges or causes the disc harge of any weapon is to be charged irrespective of his rank. He is not to RTA until the charge has been heard and concluded.
- 2. Care is to be taken that the charge is laid properly according to the circumstances in each case. When necessary, charges are to be drafted by legal officers.
- 3. HQ AFV is to be advised of the result of disciplinary action in each case.
- 4. When an investigation is deemed necessary, the investigating Officer's report is to be submitted to HQ AFV within 5 days after the incident. An investigation is to be ordered in every case where any member is injured by an unauthorized discharge. A SIB investigation is to be made at once in any case where it is suspected that there is a possibility of any such injury having been inflicted wilfully.
- No disciplinary action or act which may amount to condonation is to be taken, or done, in respect of any member who, it is suspected, has wilfully wounded himself or another member by an unauthorized discharge, until the Investigating Officer's report has been considered by COMAFV and he has given his direction.

### 799. DRESS

1. Dress within 2 AOD is as follows.

Trousers or Shorts Mil Green Shirts Mil Green Boots Gp Socks Khaki Hats Utility Belts Pistol

- 2. At all times dress is to be clean and tidy.
- Members are forbidden to wear mixed dress of either Aust Army issue with civilian clothes or Aust Army issue with US Army clothing.

- 4. Civilian dress may be worn on Standown unless ordered otherwise, and must be worn whilst on leave in Vung Tau. Thongs are not to be worn outside the ALSG area or after 1900hrs.
- 5. Long trousers must be worn after 1900hrs.

### 800. RESTRICTIONS ON THE CONSUMPTION AND SALE OF ALCOHOLIC REVERAGES

- 1. Unless the prior approval of OC 2 AOD has been obtained, the consumption of alcoholic beverages is forbidden by 2 AOD members during working hours.
- 2. The sale of alcoholic beverages in any form, whether sealed, or by measure or glass is forbidden in 2 AOD during the following hours:

### a. Sundays

- (1) From close of Trading Saturday evening until 1330hrs on Sunday Sgt MESS.
- (2) From close of Trading Saturday evening until 1330hrs on Sunday.
- (3) From 1500hrs until 1700hrs.
- (4) From 1800hrs until 1900hrs.

### b. Monday to Saturday

- (1) From close of Trading on Sunday evening until 1700hrs Monday.
- (2) From close of trading each day, Monday to Friday until 1700hrs the following day.

### 801. R & R SINGAPORE

- 1. With effect from 1 Feb 70. Singapore is closed as an R & R Centre.
- 2. Members of 2 AOD who have nominated to take R & R in Singapore are to contact the Orderly Room as soon as possible:
- According to unit records the above effects Pte DUNGAN and Pte SEATH. These members should contact the Ord Room to make arrangements to have their dates altered.

### 802. R & C DEC 69

1. Members requiring R & C during the month of December are to contact Sgt POSTEMA immediately.

### 803. PROHIBITED ACTIVITIES

- 1. The reference prescribes a list of prohibited activities for US military personnel and other categories of persons located in SVN.
- 2. The following extracts are applicable to members of AFV. Non-compliance constitutes an offence and renders offenders liable to disciplinary action.
- 3. Members of AFV are not to:
  - a. Transfer by sale, gift, loan, exchange, or rental, any merchandise or article purchased in an exchange or canteen, to an individual not having similar privileges.

- b. Possess other than the one ration card issued to him (MACV Form 333 or 334) or possess a ration card which has been altered or modified.
- c. Transfer a ration card (MACV Form 333 or 334) to another by gift, loan, sale, exchange, or by any other means.
- d. Possess unreasonable or excessive quantites of exchange or canteen items. The possession of more than 12 cartons of cigarettes, 12 bottles of liquor/wine, or 6 cases of beer without appropriate authority is considered unreasonable and is prohibited.
- e. Transfer any personal identification or privilege card to any other person or permit any other person to use his identification or privilege card. The loss, theft, or disappearance of such as card will be reported: immediately to unit headquarters.
- f. Possess more than one identification or privilege card.
- g. Possess more MPC than authorized by AFV SOPs.
- h. Purchase or acquire piastres from any source other than an AFV Cash Office or an authorised United States facility.
- i. Transfer MPC to a person not authorized to possess MPC.
- j. Give MPC as a tip or gratuity to persons not authorised to possess MPC.
- k. Possess or use US currency in Vietnam.
- 1. Possess privately-owned firearms.
- 4. In addition to the foregoing prohibited acts, members of AFV, unless otherwise authorized, are to:
  - a. Occupy only their assigned billets.
  - b. Be in their billets or Australian controlled areas during curfew hours.
  - c. Not engage in business ventures in Vietnam. The prohibition includes participation in the ownership or management of any privately—owned activity conducted in Vietnam for the purpose of making a profit from the sale of goods or services.

## 821. PAY QUERIES

- 1. Pay queries, remittance of undrawn cash and changes in allotments etc., will only be dealt with on the Friday after pay.
- 2. It is the responsibility of the individual to submit his pay requirements to the Pay Rep by 1700 hrs on the Friday before payday if his section rep fails to do so:
- 3. Applications for members to draw pay on other than pay day will only be actioned by the Pay Rep between 0730-0830 hrs and 1330-1430 hrs.

#### 822. SAFETY

1. The area north of the fenced boundary formed by the fence 110 Sigs hill to 2 AOD Strong Point Delta is out of bounds unless specifically authorised by HQ 1 ALSG. There are many UXB in the area.

#### 823. MOVEMENTS - MFO BOXES

1. The aim of this instruction is to detail the procedures end entitlements for the despatch of personal effects through the Military Forwarding Organization (MFO).

- 2. The MFO is a service provided within the Army Movement Control organization by which unaccompanied baggage of members on reposting or discharge may be consigned.
- 3. The following consignments may be handled by the MFO:
  - a. Excess baggage of a member travelling by air.
  - b. Unaccompanied baggage.
- 4. The following items are NOT to be handled or included in packages despatch through the MFO:
  - a. Weapons.
  - b. Ammunition, explosives or any items of an inflammable nature.
  - c. Alcoholic beverages of every description.
  - d. Pornographic material.
  - e. Any item containing information of a security nature.
  - f. Soiled items.
  - g. Letters and parcels within the scope of the postal service.
- Each member is entitled to consign through the MFO a total of 334 lbs but no one package is to exceed 112 lbs or 5 cubic ft. (a truck cabin metal measures 5 cubic ft)
- No consignment under 22 pounds will be accepted, except deceased effects.
- 7. Normally items are not accepted until a posting order is received or the member has been warned for RTA.
- 8. Consignments are to be inspected by an officer or senior NCO to ensure the prohibited items as defined in para 4 are not included.
- 9. A certificate of Safety and Cheanliness is to be signed by the Inspecting Officer or NCO.
- 10. Consignments of MFO for Australia may be despatched by RAAF C130 if space is available or by chartered or Army shipping.
- 11. The consignment should be packed in a container of substantial strength. It is advisable to wrap the contents in some form of waterproof material.
- 12. Each package must be banded, wired or locked. If locked, one key should be forwarded to the receiving MFO in Aust to facilitate customs inspections.
- 13. For the members own convenience it is advisable to include an inventory in each package and retain a copy himself.
- 14. All consignments are received under bond into Australia.
- 15. When cleared by customs the consignments may be delivered under arrangements of 10 MC Gp or collected by the member.

- 16. Some delay in delivery of personal effects lodged for movement from SVN must be expected as:
  - a. MFO is low priority cargo on aircraft.
  - b. Shipping takes time.
  - c. Customs usually takes some time to clear consignments.
- 17. In the event of apparent loss of personal effects or delay in delivery the member should.
  - a. If in Aust

Request "tracer action" through his new unit or det of 10 MC Gp in his Comd.

b. If still in SVN

Request "tracer action" through the appropriate det of 11 MC Gp.

18. Any member who requires more information or who wishes to despatch an MFO box is to contact the Ord Room.

#### 824. GIFTS TO VIETNAMESE EMPLOYEES

- 1. The following restrictions apply to the giving of, gifts to Vietnamese employees:
  - a. The gift value must not exceed \$10.00 ..
  - b. The gift is not to include liquor or cigarettes.
  - c. Items of military stores/equipment are excluded.
- A member wishing to give unrestricted articles to civilian employees is to follow the procedure below:
  - a. Show the gift to the civilian, wrap it securely and endorse the parcel:
    - (1) ID Card no of civilian.
    - (2) Name of civilian.
    - (3) Value of gift.
    - (4) Donor's name.
  - b. Have the gift signed and cleared by the 00 Admin.
- Gifts will be transported to the West Gate by Depot HQ . unless the donor wishes to hand over the parcel himself. In the latter case, the member, with permission of his Group Officer, may proceed to the gate for this purpose.
- 4. Under no circumstances will gifts be handed to civilians inside the 1 ALSG area. This restriction is to avoid embarrassment to the civilian and the donor.

# 825. POSSESSION AND USE OF PRIVATELY OWNED AND OF CAPTURED WEAPONS

- 1. For the purpose of this RO:
  - a. "WEAPONS" shall mean and include:
    - (1) All firearms such as handguns, shotguns, rifles, carbines, light automatic weapons, and similar weapons which use an explosive force to propel a projectile.
    - (2) Knives with folding blades longer than three inches, swords, sabres, stilettos and spring release (switch blades) knives.
    - (3) Metal knuckles, blackjacks, saps, clubs and similar items.
    - (4) Instruments in which compressed air or a chemical propellant is used to fire a projectle.
  - b. "EXPLOSIVES" shall mean and include explosives or explosive devices such as hand grenades, smoke grenades, demolition charges, or explosive material such as TNT, C-3, primacord, or arming devices.
  - c. "AMMUNITION" shall mean and include any projectile having explosive force as a propellant.
  - d. Any part of, or any insert, or disarmed, or mutilated weapon, explosives, or ammunition of any kind, is to be deemed to be a weapon, explosive or ammunition as the case may be.
  - e. "POSSESSION" shall mean and include:
    - (1) Has any weapon, explosives or ammunition in his custody; or,
    - (2) Knowingly has any weapon, explosives or ammunition in the custody of another person corporation or entity; or,
    - (3) Knowingly has such weapon, explosive or ammunition in a house, building, lodging or open space whether belonging to him or occupied by him or not and whether such weapon, explosives or ammunition is had or placed there for his own use or the use of another.
- 2. Members serving in or attached for duty to, AFV(whether temporarily or not) are not to be in possession of weapons, explosives or ammunition unless they have been issued to them by or for, Australian Military sources, for the purpose of military duty, or are the property of the Commonwealth of Australia, or unless within the terms of para 5 or this RO their possession is specially permitted.
- 3. Units and sub-units commanders are to carry out periodic checks to ensure that personn I under their commands, or supervision, are not in possession of weapons, explosives and ammunition contrary to paragraph 2 of this RO.
- 4. All enemy weapons explosives and ammunition captured by members are to be regarded as follows:

- a. In the case of capture by members of AATTV whilst serving with or attached to ARVN units as the property of GVN; and,
- b. In every other case as the property of the Commonwealth of Australia, and are to be dealt with according to HQ AFV GS Instr 25 of 16 Apr 68.
- 5. A member is not to use a captured weapon, explosive or ammunition unless with special permission of HQ AFV or HQ 1 ATF.
- 6. All members in possession of weapons explosives or ammunition, contrary to this RO, are to deliver the same to the unit Q store at once.
- 7. The AHQ and other authorities on the subject of this RO are contained in DA 79, MBI 129-5, ARO 35/68 and HQ AFV GS Instr 25 of 16 Apr 68 to which reference should be made. Units, subunits or members are not to be in possession of any weapons, explosives or ammunition unless in accordance with this RO or the relevant authorities mentioned in this paragraph.
- 8. All previous ROs on this subject are cancelled.

#### 826. OUT OF BOUNDS

off the road or formed tracks in the 600 metre extension, that is, that area outside the North and Steptoe gates immediately North of the main perimeter. This area is thickly strewn with unexploded shells and bombs of varying types, and many are in a very dangerous fuzed condition. The area is to be used for authorized military purposes only. Any suspicious objects should not be touched but are to be reported immediately to the I. on EMU 166.

#### 827. PACEX MAIL ORDERS

- 1. US Department of Defence directives prohibit the use of US military postal services for transmission of goods purchased by members of Free World Countries through the PACEX order system.
- 2. Members of Australian Force VIETNAM therefore are not to place orders, for PX supplied items, using this system.
- 3. However, use may be made of the alternative Special Order system. This provides for orders to be placed at special order desks located within US PX Facilities and delivery to be arranged for the customer at the PX concerned.

#### 828. AUTHORISATION OF AAF-G2s

1. Sgt S. GOUS, group 1, is authorised to sign AAF-G2 Transport Work Tickets for Depot Stock Vehicles for refuelling and maintenance runs.

#### 829. SECURITY OF KEYS

1. All keys drawn from the key press are to be returned each night. Keys for the Arnold Club, keys 8,9 and 10 are to be handed to the Duty Officer who is to return them to the key press.

#### 830. MOVEMENT OF TELEPHONES

1. Reports have recently been received from the signals telephone system of interference in wiring of phone sets on the 1 ALSG net. No interference, incl movement of phones requiring wiring extensions, is permitted.

2. Requests ofr alteration of the existing phone system are to be submitted in writing to this HQ.

## 831. BUS SERVICE-WALLABY/MISSION COURIER

- 1. In accordance, with the current transport economy drive, 1 ALSG have provided a scheduled bus service, leaving from the YMCA hut and following a circuit within the ALSG area. This vehicle proceeds from the West gate to C Ramp and returns.
- 2. With the exception of RTA flights, all air passengers up to field rank are to use this service.
- 3. Attached as Annex A is a bus route plan and, as Annex B, a time table. Prospective passengers are warned that they are required to be at bus stops at least five minutes prior to estimated kickup time.

#### 832. TRIPS TO VUNG TAU AND THE AIR BASE


- 1. A bus from AFV Amenities unit currently leaves the Peter Badcoe Club at 0820, 0920, 1020, 1120, 1320, 1420, 1520 and 1620 hrs daily, travelling via beach Road, 8 Pet Pl, 2 AOD, 1 Pl AFCU and the West Gate. Priority for passengers is given to members accommodated at the Peter Badcoe Club or at the R and C centre; others may travel in the bus and space is normally available. Units are to make use of this bus to transport members to and from the R and C centre or who need to travel to the city area on personal tasks or unit tasks not involving large quantities of stores.
- 2. The bus leaving at 0820 hrs is normally filled by members accommodated at the Peter Badcoe Club and units should avoid using this bus.
- The buses leaving at 0920 and 1320 hrs will carry passengers to the US PX/Air Base are before leaving for the city area. The return buses at 1020 and 1420 hrs will collect passengers at the US PX. Units are to make use of these buses for members visiting the US PX or concessionaires and other units or activities close by. This service will start from Mon 8 Dec 69.
- 4. The route is as laid down from time to time in 1 ALSG Routine Orders.

### 833. AQUATIC SAFETY - TRAINING

12. Preparation of stores and vehicles for RTA were once again the main features for the month. Receipts from the JEPARIT and HMAS SYDNEY increased the overall workload and projects for recordanizing storehouses suffered.

#### Outscaling

13. Progress continued during the month. The outscaling team has now been posted to 2 AOD and will eventually be absorbed as re-inforcements.

In majority of instances it was found that the unit has either received the stores or received some advice regarding the action taken. Depot investigations revealed that most units are not progressing their demands as information comes to hand in the form of signals. The QMI has visited this depot and has been informed of these shortcomings. It is anticipated that corrective action will be taken in the near future.
