COMMANDERS DIARIES INSTRUCTIONS

AIM

1. The aim of a Commanders Diary is to provide data on which to base future improvements in Army training, equipment, organization and administration, and to furnish historians with a record of the activities of units and formations in operational and non-operational periods in peace and in war.

GENERAL

2. Entries are to be made daily on AF C 2118 (Adapted) each entry being initialled by the officer detailed to keep it.
3. Commanders Diaries will conform with the rules for drafting orders given in "Staff Duties (Australia)" Chapter 2, Section 12.

RESPONSIBILITY

During Non-operational Periods

4. A Commanders Diary is to be compiled by commanders of all formations.

During Operational Periods (1)

5. A Commanders Diary is to be compiled in duplicate by:
 - a. Commanders of all formations.
 - b. Each branch of the staff at formation headquarters commanded by a brigadier or above.
 - c. Heads of services not below the rank of lieutenant colonel.
 - d. Personal staffs and officers holding special appointments.
 - e. Unit commanders.
 - f. Commanders of a detachment of a unit when so ordered.

COMPILATION

6. Both original and duplicate copies are to consist of:
 - a. Cover (AF C 2119) (Adapted).
 - b. Index as printed on cover.
 - c. Narrative (AF C 2118) (Adapted).
 - d. Annexes as shown in the Index.
7. All details of the unit or formation (if a detachment is concerned, the name of the parent unit), period covered and enclosure numbers of the annexes are to be shown on the cover. If there has been a change of command since the last report, the date of assumption by the new commanding officer is to be included.
8. The annexes are to be assembled in the groups shown on the cover. If there are no enclosures for an annex NIL will be entered on the cover. If additional annexes are convenient for a particular headquarters, starting at B.

DISPOSAL

13. **Original Commander's Diary.** This is to be forwarded monthly, unless otherwise ordered, by the seventh day of the succeeding month direct to AHQ.

14. **Duplicate Commander's Diary.** This must be clearly marked as a duplicate. It is to be sent separately from the original to AHQ one month after the original has been despatched but not before the former has been acknowledged.

15. When overseas, both copies of diaries are to be sent through the Army Records organization in the overseas theatre but at different times.

16. **TOP SECRET Supplementary Diaries.**

a. The documents referred to in Paragraph 9 together with a list of them made out on AF C 2118 (Adapted) must be placed in separate cover (AF C 2119) (Adapted). All details must be filled in and the cover clearly marked in red: "ANNEX Z — OFFICER ONLY". It may be convenient to group the papers by appendices.

b. Supplementary diaries must be forwarded under the normal rules for TOP SECRET correspondence, to AHQ. The inner envelope must be plainly marked:

1. Personnel attending the 2 AOD theatre will place all refuse in the receptacle provided. Failure to comply with the above will result in prohibition of cans being taken from the Arnold Club premises.

27. WEARING OF PERSONNEL IDENTIFICATION TAGS

1. All Australian Army personnel serving in Vietnam are to wear personnel identification tags, formerly identity disc, at all times.

2. Failure to observe this order can result in disciplinary action being taken against the individual concerned. It can also result in unnecessary distress to NOK in cases where a member becomes a casualty under circumstances where positive identification is not possible.

28. SAFETY

1. The area north of the fenced boundary formed by the fence 110 Sigs hill to 2 AOD Strong Point DELTA is out of bounds unless specifically authorised by HQ 1 ALSG. There are many UXB in the area.

29. VEHICLE PASSENGERS

1. Personnel who are being conveyed in military vehicles are forbidden to:

- a. Sit on the tailboards.
- b. Sit on the running board or guards.
- c. Occupy any position on the vehicle in transit which is likely to interfere with the safe control of the vehicle or which is unsafe for the passengers.

30. HANDLING OF MAIL

1. Instances are re-occurring within the unit where unauthorised personnel are handling personal mail not belonging to them. This practice will cease immediately.

31. HONORARY MEMBERSHIP OF RSL

1. All members of 1 ALSG, who qualify for the grant of the South Vietnam medal, are also eligible for honorary membership of the RSL for the balance of the year that they RTA.
2. Honorary membership is granted by the issue of "Honorary Membership Cards". These cards are available from unit headquarters.

32. UNAUTHORISED REMOVAL/POSSESSION OF STOCK IN 2 AOD

1. A burden of responsibility rests on each member of 2 AOD to ensure that stock is NOT under any circumstance removed without authority by members for their own personal use.
2. The taking of any item of stock from storehouse and warehouse areas, unless in possession of a properly authorised voucher or with permission of the OC or SSO is forbidden.
3. Any member found in unauthorised possession of any item of depot stock will be immediately disciplined.

33. DUTY CONCESSIONS TO SERVICEMEN

1. Department of Customs and Excise have indicated their willingness to liberally interpret the officially stated customs concessions, to favour servicemen in South Vietnam. This they will continue to do, provided no flagrant violations are brought to their attention.
2. The Department has advised that a member of AFV forwarded the 2 AFCU Availability list for Jeparit 16 to at least one person in Australia, together with an offer to set up a "mail order" system. It is obvious that some of the items listed could hardly be included under the heading of personal effects and that others, judging by the prices quoted, would not be admissable within the \$50 allowance.
3. The attention of all personnel is to be drawn to the need the refrain from making any offers of this nature which may eventually lead to the curtailment of present concessions.

34. OPENING OF OFFICIAL MAIL

1. There have been many instances where the duty staff have been opening official mail, particularly that which contains magazines and books. This practice will cease immediately.
2. HQ staff are the only personnel authorised to open official mail.

COMMONWEALTH - Army First Class Certificate or Army First Class Technical Certificate.

d. AGE LIMITS

(1) Normal Entry: must have reached the age of 19 and be under the age of 23 before December 1970.

(2) Special Entry: must have reached the age of 19 and be under 25 before December 1970



48. RANGE PRACTICE - GRENADES

1. On Weds 14 Jan 70 and Thurs 15 Jan 70 the Depot is to carry out a Grenade throwing practice. Co-inciding with the practice will be refresher training in certain aspects of handling the M62 grenade.
2. The supervising/conducting officer is to station himself in the observation trench on the hill immediatley WEST of the throwing bays, and is to wear a sheel helmet during the practice.
3. No personnel are to move from this area without authority of the supervising officer.
4. Personnel waiting their turn are to take shelter to the rear of the hill below the observation trench, and are to be controlled by the supervising officer. All personnel in this area must wear sheel helmts.
5. Each bay will be occupied by one soldier and his instructor. All personnel in the throwing bays are to wear steel helmets.
6. In particular the supervising officer is to ensure the following:
 - a. Sentries, Flags and Radios. All sentries are to display a red flag at their post.
 - (1) Sentries will be positioned at:
 - (a) Sentry No. 1. The NORTH GATE, to control movement through this gate.
 - (b) Sentry No. 2. On the beach, SOUTH EAST at the NORTH GATE, behind the cover of the old bunker in that vicinity. The task of this sentry is to prevent movement into the 600 metre extension from the direction of 1 ALSG.
 - (c) Sentry No 3. In the lee of the hill on the NORTH WEST of the road leading from the 600 metre extension to the RD Centre. Task is to observe the road junction in the vicinity of YS 308451 and to control access to the 600 metre extension from the NORTH along the beach or through the road junction.

All sentries listed above are to wear sheel helmets.

 - (2) Flags. In addition to the sentries displaying flags the supervising officer will ensure that a red flag is placed on the STEPTOE Gate for the duration of the practice.
 - (3) Radios. Sentries No 1 and No 3 are to be in radio contact with the Supervising Officer.
 - (a) Grenades awaiting use are to be stored outside the throwing bays, directly in rear of the bays and protected from any hazard such as fire or flying fragments.
 - (b) Grenades are not to be thrown from the bays simultaneously.
 - (c) Grenades are not to be thrown if any low flying aircraft enter the area.
 - (d) The range must be clear of all unexploded grenades and litter before he leaves.
7. In the event of a grenade failing to explode, the supervising officer is to warn all personnel to remain under cover. After 15 minutes have elapsed he will contact Sgt GREAVES, who is authorised to dispose of blinds, to dispose of the grenade. Warning flags are to remain in position until after firning or disposal of the blind has been completed.



56. BREACHES OF CUSTOMS REGULATIONS

1. The Department of Customs and Excise has brought notice of a number of declaration irregularities when examining servicemen's parcels forwarded through the post.
2. Irregularities detected include:-
 - a. Fictitious use of names by senders;
 - b. Fraudulent certification of parcels using the names of non-existent officers;
 - c. Use of other member's concessions when senders have utilized their own; and
 - d. The obvious undervaluation of goods declared.
3. Members are warned
 - a. Full duty and sales tax is assessed where ever irregular circumstances are detected.
 - b. Details of irregularities brought to notice can render offenders liable to disciplinary action under AA 25(3).
 - c. Violations can be detected, and continued violation by a few soldiers is likely to cause customs officers to take a harder line with the force as a whole.

4. AHQ Admin Instr No 8, which details customs procedure, is available at the Orderly Room for perusal.

57. WEARING OF FINGER RINGS

Reference: A. Dress Manual 1963, paragraphs 23 and 24.

1. Although approval exists for rings to be worn, soldiers who do so should be aware of the safety hazard involved. There are constant occurrences of injuries caused by rings catching on some protrusion - particularly when handling stores and when mounting/dismounting vehicles. At the best this results in a sore finger, at the worst - no finger.
2. When members are engaged on duties where such hazards exist, they should ~~bind~~ the ring and finger with sticky tape.
3. This order is to be republished in Unit Routine Orders every three calendar months. Routine Order No 123/69 is cancelled.

58. TRANSMISSION OF SPIRITUOUS LIQUORS THROUGH THE POST

1. Commonwealth of Australia Postal Regulations prohibit the transmission of inflammable substances (including liquids) having a flash point less than 80 degrees F through the post.
2. Spirituous liquors having a proof rating in excess of 85 Proof or 74 Proof UK come within this category, and are not to be transmitted through the post to Australia. Current rating of spirits available at 2 AFCU is shown at Annex A.
3. The importation of spirituous liquors into Australia under provision of the special defence force concession is strictly prohibited. Spirituous liquor may only be awarded a custom concession when a member brings it with his other effects on RTA.
4. However there is no objection to member posting spirituous liquor to Australia provided.
 - a. The member understands duty may be imposed by the Department of Customs and Excise. (Duty on one bottle of Scotch is about A\$1.85)
 - b. The liquors have a proof rating below the stipulated figure at paragraph 2.
 - c. The bottles are packed safely and in such a manner that damage will not result to other items should be bottles break in the mail.
5. If members send spirituous liquor through the post, they are to pack the bottles as follows:
 - a. Each bottle is to be wrapped in a material which must protect the bottle against shock and absorb the liquor if the bottle breaks. Plastic foam sheeting is a suitable material for this purpose.
 - b. The bottle is then to be sealed in a heavy gauge waterproof bag.
 - c. The bottle is then to be placed in an outer container, which is to be securely made of strong and rigid material such as a 105 mm cartridge container.
 - d. The outer container is to be clearly branded "BOTTLES - HANDLE WITH CARE".

6. If a bottle breaks and the contents leak and damage other articles, the members is liable to pay full compensation to the FMG for the damage so caused.

7. The proof rating is normally displayed on the label of most spirituous liquors sold in Vietnam. Where doubt exists, the liquor is not to be sent.

8. Before signing the Certificate of Inspection, Inspecting Officers are to:

a. Check that the proof rating is not in excess of 85 Proof US or 74 Proof UK.

b. Ensure that the bottle is packed in accordance with para 5 above.

c. Delete the words "or essence of wines or spirituous liquor" from the face of the Certificate of Inspection.

9. The contents of paragraphs 1 to 8 of this Routine Order are to be published immediately in all Routine Orders, and are to be republished every three calendar months.

10. 1 ALSG Routine Order No 110/69 is cancelled.

59. BREACHES OF CUSTOMS REGULATIONS

Reference: A. AHF (Army Component) SOPs Part 3 Chap 1. Section 6.

B. AHQ Administrative Instruction No 8.

1. Department of Customs advises that an increasing number of parcels are being sent to Australia through the postal system with misleading declarations attached. A common example is a toy animal with a built in transistor radio being described and valued as a toy and not a radio.

2. A substantial number of parcels are being opened by customs. Members are warned of the implications of making false customs declarations. In addition, certifying officers are to rigidly enforce the provisions of Reference B paras 1131 - 1133.

3. This order is to be promulgated in unit ROs at three monthly intervals. Routine Order No 92/69 is cancelled.

60. SALE OF SPIRITUOUS LIQUORS

1. Spirituous liquors are not to be sold by the bottle in OR Clubs/ Canteens in 1 ALSG.

2. If a soldier or junior NCO wishes to purchase a bottle of spirit from 2 AFCU to post or take to Australia he must have a written authority from his unit to do so. This authority is to include the type of liquor. Care must be taken by units to ensure that liquors to be posted are those allowed by 2 AOD RO 5/58. Officers and Sergeants Messes should also be aware of these provisions.

61. PREVALENT OFFENCES

Offences relating to disturbances in the City of Vung Tau are hereby classified as prevalent offences.

62. R & C LEAVE

1. During a tour of duty in SVN, a member is entitled to five days rest and convalescent leave. This leave may be applied for through Group or Section Officers. Groups or Sections are to direct recommended applications to:

- a. Stores area - SSO
- b. Supply/Control - SOSCO
- c. HQ - OO Admin

2. Applications not initialled by either the SSO or SOSCO will not be approved.

3. Where five days are taken at the one time, the member is to return to the unit on the morning of the sixth day and report for work immediately after lunch.

4. The practice of personnel standing down for the balance of the day on which they return is to cease.

63. TRAFFIC REGULATIONS

1. Recently a number of members, particularly in Saigon, have found the Vietnamese equivalent of parking tickets on their vehicles. The Australian vehicles were apparently, in each case, parked in breach of local road laws.

2. Drivers of vehicles are to ensure that they are familiar with Vietnamese road traffic signs. All Vietnamese road signs including "NO PARKING" and like signs are to be obeyed by all Australia drivers of service vehicles.

3. If a member find what appears to be the Vietnamese equivalent of a parking ticket attached to his vehicle, he is not to acknowledge any responsibility for the alleged offence nor is he to acknowledge the validity of that document. If a summons is received or served, no member is to appear in the local court under the jurisdiction of the Vietnamese authorities.

4. All drivers who receive parking tickets or traffic summonses are to report the matter immediately to the unit orderly room which in turn will advise HQ AFV by signal through normal channels. HQ AFV will take the necessary action with the Vietnamese authority involved. If disciplinary action is warranted for a traffic offence this unit will take appropriate action against the member.

64. NATIONAL SERVICE OBLIGATION ON DISCHARGE FROM FULL TIME DUTY

1. Any NSM who is not fully aware of his obligations for service in the RAR, RAER or CMF on completion of 2 years service is to see Lt ELLIS.

65. WEARING OF THE VIETNAMESE CAMPAIGN MEDAL

1. The Vietnamese Campaign Medal or the ribbon brooch of the medal is to be worn after all British Honours, Decorations and Medals or the ribbon of those medals.

2. The medal is awarded after 181 days service in the Vietnam Theatre. Dress Manual 1963 annex C refers.

66. MOVEMENTS - MFO BOXES

1. The aim of this instruction is to detail the procedures and entitlements for the despatch of personal effects through the Military Forwarding Organization (MFO).

2. The MFO is a service provided within the Army Movement Control organization by which unaccompanied baggage of members on reposting or discharge may be consigned.

3. The following consignments may be handled by the MFO.
 - a. Excess baggage of a member travelling by air.
 - b. Unaccompanied baggage.
4. The following items are NOT to be handled or included in packages despatched through the MFO.
 - a. Weapons.
 - b. Ammunition, explosives or any items of an inflammable nature.
 - c. Alcoholic beverages of every description.
 - d. Pornographic material.
 - e. Any item containing information of a security nature.
 - f. Soiled items.
 - g. Letters and parcels within the scope of the postal service.
5. Each member is entitled to consign through the MFO a total of 334 lbs but no one package is to exceed 112 lbs or 5 cubic ft. (a truck cabin metal measures 5 cubic ft)
6. No consignment under 22 pounds will be accepted, except deceased effects. (Notes 221b is the upper limit for mailed parcels)
7. Normally items are not accepted until a posting order is received or the member has been warned for RTA.
8. Consignments are to be inspected by the Admin O or, in his absence, the OM to ensure that prohibited items, as defined in para 4, are not included.
9. A Certificate of Safety and Cleanliness is to be signed by the Inspecting Officer.
10. Consignments of MFO for Australia may be despatched by RAAF C130, if space is available, or by chartered or Army shipping.
11. The consignment should be packed in a container of substantial strength. It is advisable to wrap the contents in some form of waterproof material.
12. Each package must be banded, wired or locked. If locked, one key should be forwarded to the receiving MFO in Aust. to facilitate Customs inspections.
13. For the members own convenience it is advisable to include an inventory in each package and retain a copy himself.
14. All consignments are received under bond into Australia.
15. When cleared by Customs the consignments may be delivered under arrangements of 10 MC Gp or collected by the member.
16. Some delay in delivery of personal effects lodged for movement from SVN must be expected as:
 - a. MFO is low priority cargo on aircraft.
 - b. Shipping takes time.
 - c. Customs usually takes some time to clear consignments.

17. In the event of apparent loss of personal effects or delay in delivery the member should.

a. If in Aust - request "tracer action" through his new unit or det of 10 MC Gp in his Comd.

b. If still in SVN - request "tracer action" through the appropriate det of 11 MC Gp.

18. Any member who requires more information or who wishes to despatch an MFO box is to contact the Ord Room.

67.
68. CURRENCY EXCHANGE FOR PERSONNEL PROCEEDING ON RTA OR R AND R TO AUSTRALIA

1. The current policy on currency exchanges for personnel proceeding on RTA or R & R to Australia, and arrangements for pay on arrival in Australia are:

a. Currency issued in theatre prior to departure is not to exceed \$9 Australian.

b. "US Green" currency is not to be issued to supplement the issue of Australian Dollars.

c. Excess MPC held by the member is to be deposited to the members paybook prior to departure from the unit.

d. Comd Paymaster E Comd will provide pay facilities at Sydney Airport.

68-
69. FIREARMS

1. Import restrictions on all types of firearms and ammunition are severe. In addition to the permission of the Minister for Customs and Excise, a State Police permit is required before importation is allowed. All items likely to be included in this category, such as air rifles or pistols, are to be declared.

69-
70. DRIVING LICENCE

1. Unit personnel are forbidden to drive military vehicles or plant without a current AAF-G11 registered with the unit Tpt NCO.

70-
71. ARNOLD CLUB VISITORS

1. Other rank members of 2 AOD are permitted the privileges of the 2 AOD Other Rank canteen (The Arnold Club) except when on CB, FP or when denied the privileges by a superior authority.

2. Other Rank members of 1 ALSG other than 2 AOD, are permitted the use of the 2 AOD canteen provide they have been invited and signed in in the visitors book by a 2 AOD member.

3. Members are responsible for the actions of their guests and are to ensure their visitors comply with 2 AOD orders.

4. Sgt Mess members except when on duty are forbidden to enter the ORs canteen unless approval has been given by the 2 AOD Office Commanding.

71-
72. BOUNDS - DEPOT HQ BUILDING

1. The following places in the 2 AOD HQ Building have been placed out of bounds, wef, 18 Jan 70:

a. Totally:

- (1) Registry:- past the Registry Cpl's table
- (2) Typing Pool:- incl passage
- (3) OC's Office:- incl passage
- (4) Orderly Room:- behind counter.

b. Partially

(1) Duty Room: out of bounds to all except duty pers.

c. Other

(1) Admin Offr/Ord Room Sgt: entry may be gained by enquiry at Ord Room Counter

2. The out-of-bounds area are shown diagrammatically on Annex A to this RO.

72. MAIL CLEARANCE

1. Outgoing Mail will be cleared daily from the 2 AOD Duty Room at 0900 hrs daily by the SDS duty veh Mon-Sat, and by the Duty Driver at 0900 hrs Sunday.

73. DRESS FOR MEMBERS IN AUSTRALIA WHILE ON ROUTE TO AND FROM SVN

1. Summer dress in E Comd and for movement interstate in Australia, includes wearing of ties and shirt sleeves rolled down.

2. All members of AFV returning to Australia by air, for any reason are to wear summer dress as detailed in paragraph one above, at the time of deplaning and during subsequent movement in Australia whilst in uniform.

74. VEHICLE SAFETY

1. An accident occurred recently where a vehicle was being driven by a member wearing thongs. The members foot slipped from the pedal and he lost control of the vehicle.

2. Vehicles are not to be driven in the 1 ALSG area by drivers wearing thongs or similar footwear which may be the cause of feet slipping from the pedal.

75. DANANG COURIER

1. 2 AOD personnel eligible to carry out duties as courier are:

a. Officers

b. Warrant Officers.



3. Preference is given to those members who have served in SVN the longest.

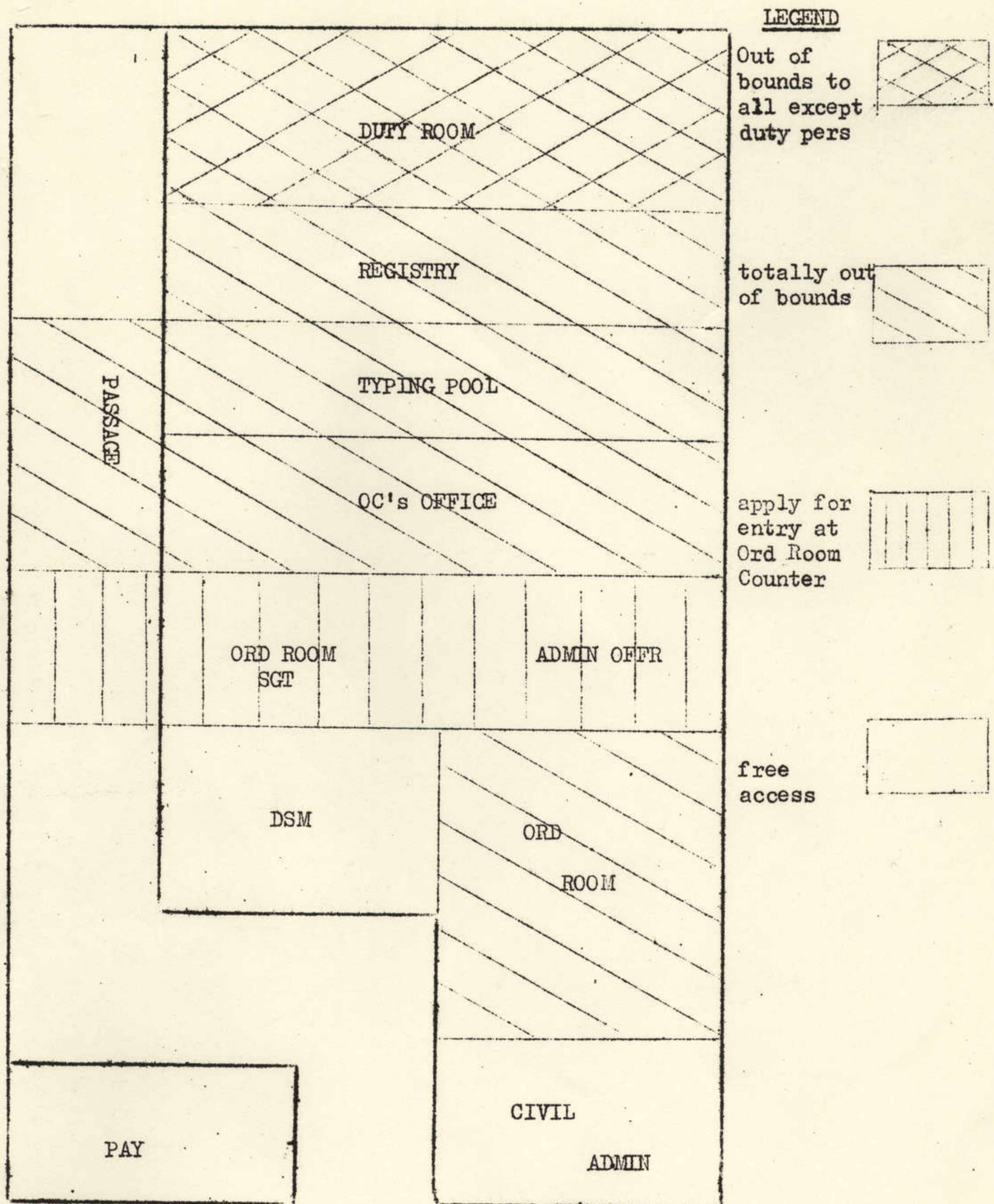
76. LOCAL LEAVE




