COMMANDERS DIARIES
INSTRUCTIONS

AIM

1. The aim of a Commanders Diary is to provide data on which to base future improvements in Army training, equipment, organization and administration, and to furnish historians with a record of the activities of units and formations in operational and non-operational periods in peace and in war.

GENERAL

2. Entries are to be made daily on AF C 2118 (Adapted) each entry being initialled by the officer detailed to keep it.
3. Commanders Diaries will conform with the rules for drafting orders given in "Staff Duties (Australia)" Chapter 2, Section 12.

RESPONSIBILITY

During Non-operational Periods

4. A Commanders Diary is to be compiled by commanders of all formations.

During Operational Periods (1)

5. A Commanders Diary is to be compiled in duplicate by:
 - a. Commanders of all formations.
 - b. Each branch of the staff at formation headquarters commanded by a brigadier or above.
 - c. Heads of services not below the rank of lieutenant colonel.
 - d. Personal staffs and officers holding special appointments.
 - e. Unit commanders.
 - f. Commanders of a detachment of a unit when so ordered.

COMPILATION

6. Both original and duplicate copies are to consist of:
 - a. Cover (AF C 2119) (Adapted).
 - b. Index as printed on cover.
 - c. Narrative (AF C 2118) (Adapted).
 - d. Annexes as shown in the Index.
7. All details of the unit or formation (if a detachment is concerned, the name of the parent unit), period covered and enclosure numbers of the annexes are to be shown on the cover. If there has been a change of command since the last report, the date of assumption by the new commanding officer is to be included.
8. The annexes are to be assembled in the groups shown on the cover. If there are no enclosures for an annex NII, will be entered on the cover. If additional annexes are convenient for a particular headquarters, starting at B.

DISPOSAL

13. **Original Commander's Diary.** This is to be forwarded monthly, unless otherwise ordered, the seventh day of the succeeding month direct to AHQ.

14. **Duplicate Commander's Diary.** This must be clearly marked as a duplicate. It is to be sent separately from the original to AHQ one month after the original has been despatched but not before the former has been acknowledged.

15. When overseas, both copies of diaries are to be sent through the Army Records organization in the overseas theatre but at different times.

16. **TOP SECRET Supplementary Diaries.**

a. The documents referred to in Paragraph 9 together with a list of them made out on AF C 2118 (Adapted) must be placed in separate cover (AF C 2119) (Adapted). All details must be filled in and the cover clearly marked in red: "ANNEX Z — OFFICER ONLY". It may be convenient to group the papers by appendices.

b. Supplementary diaries must be forwarded under the normal rules for TOP SECRET correspondence, to AHQ. The inner envelope must be plainly marked:

321. SAFETY

322. EXPEDITIONARY FORCES MESSAGE (EFM) TELEGRAM SERVICE

1. The Expeditionary Forces Message (EFM) Telegram service is available between members of AFV and persons in Australia and New Zealand.
2. Copies of the EFM code are held in all Australian FPOs. Only the prescribed standard phrases may be used in the composition of the text of the message.
3. A flat rate of 40C MPC will be charged for all EFM telegrams originated in the theatre.
4. EFM telegrams may be sent to members of the AFV from all post offices in Australia and New Zealand. Members are advised to tell their relatives and friends of this service which is available for them to use when sending telegrams from Australia to members in Vietnam.
5. Some of the smaller post offices and agency post offices in Australia may not be aware of this service and, in these cases, the attention of the Post Office staff should be drawn to Section 9 of the Post Office Guide.
6. If members of AFV wish to send telegrams to places other than Australia or NZ, the South Vietnamese Postal system is to be used. This service may be arranged through AFPOs.

323. SAFETY - FILLING OF M1937 FIELD RANGE BURNERS

1. Burner units for M1937 Ranges are not to be filled inside kitchens.

324. TRANSMISSION OF SPIRITUOUS LIQUORS THROUGH THE POST

1. Commonwealth of Australia Postal Regulations prohibit the transmission of inflammable substances (including liquids) having a flash point less than 80 degrees F through the post.
2. Spirituous liquors having a proof rating in excess of 85 Proof or 74 Proof UK come within this category, and are not to be transmitted through the post to Australia. Current rating of spirits available are shown at para 9.
3. The importation of spirituous liquors into Australia under provision of the special defence force concession is strictly prohibited. Spirituous liquor may only be awarded a custom concession when a member brings it with his other effects on RTA.
4. However, there is no objection to members posting spirituous liquors to Australia provided:
 - a. The member understands duty may be imposed by the Department of Customs and Excise. (Duty on one bottle of Scotch is about A\$1.85).
 - b. The liquors have a proof rating below the stipulated figure at paragraph 2.
 - c. The bottles are packed safely and in such a manner that damage will not result to other items should the bottles break in the mail. (See next paragraph).

5. If members send spirituous liquor through the post, they are to pack the bottles as follows:

- a. Each bottle is to be wrapped in a material which must protect the bottle against shock and absorb the liquor if the bottle breaks. Plastic foam sheeting is a suitable material for this purpose.
- b. The bottle is then to be sealed in a heavy guage waterproof bag.
- c. The bottle is then to be placed in an outer container, which is to be securely made of strong and rigid material such as a 105mm cartridge container.
- d. The outer container is to be clearly branded "BOTTLES - HANDLE WITH CARE".

6. If a bottle breaks and the contents leak and damage other articles the member is liable to pay full compensation to the PMG for the damage so caused.

7. The proof rating is normally displayed on the label of most spirituous liquors sold in Vietnam. Where doubt exists, the liquor is not to be sent.

8. Before signing the Certificate of Inspections, Inspecting Officers are to:

- a. Check that the proof rating is not in excess of 85 Proof US or 74 Proof UK.
- b. Ensure that the bottle is packed in accordance with para 5 above.
- c. Delete the words "or essence of wines or spirituous liquor" from the face of the Certificate of Inspection.





339. MARRIAGE SERVICE PERSONNEL AND ASIAN NATIONALS

1. Any member of 2 AOD or attached personnel who is contemplating marriage to an Asian is to consult the OC 2 AOD before proceeding with such a marriage.

2. The above consultation is necessary to ensure that the serviceman is made fully aware of the administrative procedures involved in processing such a marriage.

340. TRANSPORT CIVILIAN LABOUR

342. R & R

343. CLEANING AND ADJUSTMENT OF PERSONAL WEAPONS

1. It is a soldiers duty to clean his own weapon with the cleaning kit provided, and the QM holds replacement items such as Flannelette and Oil at the Q Store.

2. The cleaning facilities in the RAEME attached armourer's workshop may be used to clean weapons, provided permission is obtained from the Storeholder RSG or the Armourer.

3. The practice of taking personal weapons to the 2 AOD Armourer's Assistant for the purpose of cleaning is to cease immediately.

4. Loaded Magazines will not be taken into the Workshop.
5. If the weapon requires repairs of any nature the Armourer should be notified and he will assess and correct the fault. The Armourer's Vietnamese assistant is not to be asked to assess and correct faults in weapons.

344. AMATEUR RADIO OPERATION

1. The operation of amateur radios within the Republic of South Vietnam is prohibited by civil law. Members of 1 ALSG are not to operate, or be parties to, the operation of, amateur radio stations.

345. KNOWLEDGE OF ORDERS

1. Every soldier be responsible to acquaint himself with the orders of his unit. Ignorance of an order will not be accepted for non-observance. (AMR and O 1462)

346. DANGER OF PREMATURE EXPLOSION BY ELECTRICAL DETONATION

1. An accident with a Claymore Mine at 1 ATF may have been caused by induced current from powerful radio transmitters setting off the detonator as soon as it was inserted in the explosive charge.
2. A similar accident could occur with any electrical initiator brought within 300 feet of some of the transmitters in 110 Sig Sqn's area, unless it is enclosed in a metal container.
3. All individuals are therefore warned that no electrical detonating apparatus is to be brought within 300 feet of any part of the 110 Sig Sqn perimeter or the aerial farm just outside the northern perimeter unless shielded by a metal container.


349. INCIDENCE OF VEHICLE ACCIDENTS

1. The incidence of vehicle accidents within the Force is of serious concern. A total of 310 accidents were investigated by AFV Provost Unit in 1969. There were five fatal accidents in the month of December 1969 alone.

The difficulties in driving through built-up areas are especially appreciated but every effort must be made to reduce the toll of persons killed or maimed through vehicle accidents. Careless, impatient and reckless driving particularly when it results in an injury or death to Vietnamese nationals, is inhumane, hampers our pacification efforts and lowers our standing with the Vietnamese people.
3. Disciplinary action will be taken promptly when evidence is available that drivers have, through negligence, been instrumental in causing accidents.

IMPORTATION OF CAPTURED ENEMY WEAPONS INTO AUSTRALIA

1. Several incidents have recently occurred where members, having the necessary authority to import a captured enemy weapon into Australia as a personal souvenir, have had the weapon confiscated by NSW Customs Dept officials at Mascot. The NSW officials, although apparently aware that the members' final destination was to a state other than NSW, have insisted on confiscating the souvenirs.

2. To avoid the inconvenience of confiscation of souvenir weapons, members holding authority to import the souvenir are to advise the NSW Customs Dept before returning to Australia, to a state other than NSW, of the following facts:

a. That police and customs permission to import the weapon has been given, for the member's destination state.





 - a. Currency issued in theatre prior to departure is not to exceed \$9 Australian.
 - b. "US Green" currency is not to be issued to supplement the issue of Australian Dollars.
 - c. Excess MPC held by the member is to be deposited to the members' paybook prior to departure from the unit. No more than \$1 MPC or 500 piasters is to be taken out of country.
 - d. Comd Paymaster E Comd will provide pay facilities at Sydney Airport.

366. MOVEMENTS - MFO BOXES

1. The aim of this instruction is to detail the procedures and entitlements for the despatch of personal effects through the Military Forwarding Organization (MFO).
2. The MFO is a service provided within the Army Movement Control organization by which unaccompanied baggage of members on reposting or discharge may be consigned.
3. The following consignments may be handled by the MFO.
 - a. Excess baggage of a member travelling by air.
 - b. Unaccompanied baggage.
4. The following items are NOT to be handled or included in packages despatched through the MFO.
 - a. Weapons
 - b. Ammunition, explosives or any items of an inflammable nature
 - c. Alcoholic beverages of every description
 - d. Pornographic material
 - e. Any item containing information of a security nature
 - f. Soiled items
 - g. Letters and parcels within the scope of the postal service.

367. DRIVING LICENCE

1. Unit personnel are forbidden to drive military vehicles or plant without a current AAF-G11 registered with the unit Tpt NCO and endorsed as having passed an SVN Road Law test.

368. HONORARY MEMBERSHIP OF RSL

1. All members of 1 ALSG, who qualify for the grant of the South VIETNAM medal, are also eligible for honorary membership of the RSL for the balance of the year that they RTA.
2. Honorary membership is granted by the issue of "Honorary Membership Cards". These cards are available from unit headquarters.

369. ARNOLD CLUB VISITORS

1. Other Rank members of 2 AOD are permitted the privileges of the 2 AOD Other Rank canteen (The Arnold Club) except when on CB, FP or when denied the privileges by a superior authority.
2. Other Rank members of 1 ALSG other than 2 AOD, are permitted the use of the 2 AOD canteen provided they have been invited and signed in the Visitors Book by a 2 AOD member.
3. Members are responsible for the actions of their guests and are to ensure their visitors comply with 2 AOD orders.
4. Sgts' Mess members except when on duty are forbidden to enter the ORs canteen unless approval has been given by the 2 AOD Officer Commanding.

3 SECURITY LIGHTING - STOREHOUSES

1. Interior lighting in storehouses is to be switched off during daylight hours when not required for illumination of working areas within the storehouse.
2. Storeholders are to switch on exterior security lighting, prior to standdown except on Sundays. The roving picquet is to switch the lights on at dusk on Sundays.

371. REMOVAL OF FOOD FROM REFRIGERATORS

1. During and immediately prior to meal periods, it is necessary for the refrigerators at 2 AOD kitchen to be unlocked to enable the cooks to readily obtain prepared foods and table requirements.
2. Incidents have been reported of members of the unit removing foodstuffs from the refrigerators without the authority of the catering staff.
3. Unless he has been directed to do so by the senior cook present, members using the 2 AOD mess are forbidden to remove any item from the 2 AOD kitchen refrigerators.

372. REPORTING OF VEHICLE ACCIDENTS

1. Any accident involving vehicles or personnel of 2 AOD is to be reported immediately to the person authorising the use of the vehicle, ie. NCO I/C Tpt or Duty Officer.
2. All cases of accidents involving local nationals or personnel of other nations are to be immediately reported to the Admin Offr.



- a. Maximum of 8 in X 14 in X 21 in for total cubic volume for all items.
 - b. Maximum weight of 10 lbs for all items carried.
 - c. Only hats, coats carried on hat rack.
2. This limitation which is imposed on all civil carriers by the IATA (of which Qantas is a member) applies irrespective whether the aircraft is chartered or not. Safety precautions apply in all instances.
3. Personnel travelling RTA are grossly exceeding these limitations. Common occurrences are portable TV sets, large wooden forks/spoons, travelling bags of a tartan material printed with Vietnam (exceed 8 in when fully packed) radios, musical instruments etc.
4. To assist in policing this problem, Qantas have positioned a traffic officer at Saigon who will apply the civil regulation in consultation with the aircraft captain and Services movements staffs to ensure the limitations are not exceeded.





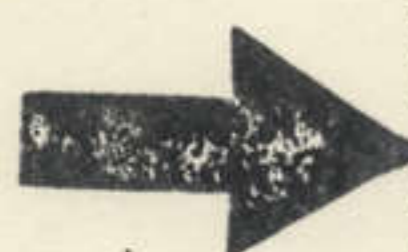

All members of the 2 AOD Sgts' Mess not rostered for duty, are to report to the PMC or his representative at the Sgts' Mess at 1705 hrs each Wednesday and Friday.

387. WEARING OF WATCH WRIST GP

Reference: A. AFV 6645-1-4

1. Members have been observed wearing issue wrist watches whilst swimming for recreational purposes. Although a new watch is sealed against entry of moisture, water will enter once the seal has eroded through wear.
2. Members are not to wear wrist watches whilst swimming for recreation or when washing under showers.

388. POSSESSION OF FLICK KNIVES

1. The possession of flick knives is forbidden.

389. SECURITY OF WEAPONS

1. Weapons have disappeared from weapon racks at unit messes in this area and subsequent investigations revealed that the racks were not visible from the messes.
2. Section heads are to ensure that all weapon depositories in their areas are made as secure as possible by virtue of their location and by being under surveillance.

390. CORRECT POSTAL ADDRESS

1. It is essential that members use the correct AFV address and inform correspondent that any omission of any part of the address can result in delays and possibly non delivery.

391. UNAUTHORISED DISCHARGE OF WEAPONS AND FIREARMS

1. Any member who negligently, or wilfully in breach of an order or his military duty, discharges or causes the discharge of any weapon will be charged irrespective of his rank. He will not RTA until the charge has been heard and concluded.

392. DRESS

1. Orders of dress worn by members of 2 AOD are:

- a. Normal daytime duty - Shorts Mil Green
Shirts Mil Green
Boots GP
Sox Khaki
Hats Utility
Belts Pistol with pouch FAD
 - b. Normal evening duty (1900 hrs-0700 hrs) stand to - As for "a" except Trousers
- Mil Green are to be worn
 - c. Standdown - Civilian clothes may be worn unless advised to the contrary
2. Dress is to be clean, tidy and in good repair at all times.
 3. Members are forbidden to wear mixed dress in any combination of Australian Uniform/US Uniform/ARVN Uniform/Civilian clothes.
 4. Civilian clothes are to be worn while on local leave in Vung Tau, however, thongs are not to be worn outside the 1 ALSG area.
 5. After 1900 hrs long trousers are to be worn and thongs are not to be worn except in billets.

393. USE OF 102 FD WKSP STEAM CLEANER

1. The procedure for using the above equipment is as follows:
 - a. Bookings. Phone EMU 96. No opportunity tasks are accepted.
 - b. Drivers are to accompany vehicles. All other equipment is to be delivered and collected as required by the Wksp.
 - c. Vehicles and equipment are to arrive at the Wksp at the appointed time and may be removed from the work point on expiry of the booking time.

394. HANDLING OF OPDEM AND MAINTDEM

1. Operational Demands (OPDEM) and Priority Maintenance Demands (PRIMAINTDEM) are requests for very urgent supply of stores or ammunition. These requests are received in signal form from 1 ATF NUI DAT. No controlled Stores (GS or Theatre) are to be issued before approval from ADOS HQ AFV is received.
2. It is essential that 2 AOD provides a rapid and efficient reaction to these demands. Frequently these items are to be delivered by helicopter very soon after the demand is received.
3. The system to be followed on receipt of an OPDEM or PRIMAINTDEM is as follows:
 - a. The Control Office (which ever officer receives the particular demand) is to telephone firstly the storeholder of the group concerned and then the WO Traffic.
 - b. The voucher is then to be hand delivered to the storeholder.
 - c. When the stores are ready for issue the storeholder is to advise Traffic. If, however, Traffic cannot be rapidly contacted the storeholder is to deliver the items to Traffic.

d. All such consignments MUST be marked clearly in red on 3 sides with the words "PRIMAINTDEM" or "OPDEM" and the reference number.

e. The principle to be observed is that nothing can delay the issue. If difficulty is experienced in contacting the required person, the next senior person should be advised immediately. If any doubt arises and delay is caused the SSO should be advised promptly.

4. Duty staff will from time to time be required to action issues of this nature. Whilst the detail actions may differ from those carried out during the day the principle expressed in para 3 will always apply.

395. INTERFERENCE TO WEAPONS SITUATED IN OR AT THE WEST GATE GUARD ROOM

1. It is an offence for any unauthorised person to interfere with weapons situated in or at the 1 ALSG West Gate Guard Room. Commander, West Gate Guard, will immediately place in close arrest any unauthorised person found contravening this order.



399. PROMULGATION OF UNIT ORDERS

1. The attention of all ranks is drawn to their responsibility to acquaint themselves with the orders of this unit.
2. Relevant extracts of the Army Law Manual, Vol 1, are subtended:
 - a. AMR & O 1462 " Every officer will be responsible for acquainting himself with regulations and orders. Every soldier will be responsible for acquainting himself with the orders of his unit. Ignorance of a published order will not be accepted as an excuse for its non - observance."
 - b. Note 4, S 11, Army Act "4. Ignorance of the order is no excuse if the order is one which the accused ought in the ordinary course to know. In accordance with AMR & O 1462 every officer and soldier is responsible for acquainting himself with the orders of his unit. However, before these principles may be relied on the prosecution must prove that the order was published and either brought to the notice of the accused or published in such a way that the accused had reasonable access to it and was in a position to be acquainted with its contents. If it is proved that the order was published and placed on the company notice board and remained there at a time when the accused was a member of the company, this, in the absence of any evidence to suggest the contrary is sufficient to establish that the order was one of which the accused ought to have been aware".
3. It is the responsibility of all ranks to acquaint themselves with all orders placed on the unit notice board which is situated opposite the western entrance to the Administrative Headquarters building (Building No A303)
4. The Administrative Officer, Adjutant and DSM are the only members authorised to place orders on, or remove them from, the unit notice board.
5. Authorised members are to maintain a record of all orders and amendments to orders placed on, or removed from, the unit notice board.
6. This order is to be read to all ranks once a month.
7. Unit Routine Order No 345 dated 9 May 70 is cancelled.



400. AMENDMENTS - 2 AOD STANDING ORDERS 1969 - AMDT NO 8

1. Leave Transport. Para 160 (as Amdt 7) Delete

Insert new para below

"160. Officers of the rank of captain and below, WOs and Senior NCOs' are to travel to Vung Tau on the scheduled leave buses shown above (para 159) until 1830 hours daily. A special Officers/WOs/Senior NCOs bus departs Bus Stop 1 at 1900 hours daily and follows the internal bus route. One trip may be made by the unit duty vehicle for transport of the above members to leave destinations and when used this vehicle is to leave at 1830 hours or as notified by the OC. All Officers, WOs and senior NCOs may return from leave on the unit duty vehicle. (Note: The special leave bus travels via the air base, Vol 4 and the R & C Centre)".

2. Unit Routine Order No 398 dated (Amdt 8) is cancelled.

3. Cancellation of Annexes. Annex L "Handling of Classified Matter" and Annex M "Duties of the Unit Security Officer" are cancelled.

4. Bounds. Para 146, 147 - Delete

Insert new paras as follows:

"146. Certain areas and premises are permanently out-of-bounds in Vung Tau and other premises are temporarily placed out-of-bounds. To facilitate dissemination of this information to members, two maps are to be maintained and mounted in the corridor outside the Duty Room as follows:

a. Survey Map-Vung Tau YS 1:12500 showing permanently out-of-bounds areas outlined in black.

b. Enlarged Vung Tau City map showing permanently out-of-bounds areas shaded, permanently out-of-bounds establishments shaded in red and temporarily out-of-bounds establishments shown by red map pin. All establishments are key numbered to a chart mounted on the walls".

"147. Unit members and visitors are to acquaint themselves with current out-of-bounds areas and establishments before proceeding on leave. No member of the Australian or New Zealand Military Force posted to, attached to or visiting this unit is to enter any establishment or area classed as out-of-bounds, except in the course of his Military duty."

5. Restaurants. Paras 149, 150 - Delete

Insert new paras below

"149. Not all restaurants in Vung Tau, while in-bounds, are suitable eating places. However, the establishments listed below are recommended, with reservations, as being suitable:

a. Auberge Des Roches Noires - Expensive.

b. Auberge Le Petit Chalet (TUDO) - near RC Church.

c. Cyrnos - Front Beach .

d. Grand Hotel - Front Beach. Expensive, particularly for drinks.

e. Thu Huong (Chinese Restaurant)- next to Pacific Hotel.

"150. Members of 2AOD should only eat at civilian restaurants showing the "approved establishment" sign and not at roadside stalls. From time to time, restaurants may be placed out-of-bounds by the hygiene inspector."

6. Alcoholic Liquor. Paras 156, 157, 158 - Delete

Insert new paras below

"156A. Alcoholic Liquor, whether contained in a tin, casket or bottle, is not to be taken out of the unit areas where drinking is permitted,

or the R & C Centres unless the OC or OC AFV Amenities Unit (for R & C Centres) has given permission. This permission will normally be restricted to dinner wines when dining in Vung Tau.

"156B. In certain instances such as a unit party or wedding involving a unit member as groom, beer may also with permission, be removed from unit drinking areas. Spirituous liquor (e.g. Whisky, Brandy, etc) is not to be removed from the unit drinking areas for consumption in RVN for any reason whatsoever.

"156C. In all allowable cases, written permission of the OC is required prior to purchase of liquor for removal from unit drinking areas. Annex A to 2 AOD Standing Order 1969 refers.

"157. Alcoholic liquor may only be carried outside Messes, Clubs or Canteens if it is wrapped in a manner that conceals the contents.

"158. While on leave in Vung Tau, alcoholic liquor is not to be consumed in:

- a. Any private dwelling or club or quarter, without the approval of the owner or manager.
- b. On any street or public thoroughfare, beach, garden or park.
- c. In any vehicle
- d. In any place for which written permission is not held, if the liquor originates from 1 ALSG units."

7. Leave Passes. Paras 166/167 - Delete
Insert new paras below

"166A. The orderly room is to prepare AAF-F95 Local Leave Card and Identification Cards (Leave Pass) for all members applying for Local leave in accordance with para 139-143 and details entered on the reverse of the proforma No 115/70 "Local Leave Register - 2 AOD". Approved Leave Passes are to be handed to the Duty Officer.

"166B. By 1800 hours daily the DO or Duty Sgt is to advise the 1 ALSG Duty Officer, of the details shown on the face of the proforma, i.e. Numbers of Officers, WOs/Sgts and Junior Ranks (individually) and Rank/Name/Destination of all ranks for whom late leave has been approved under the terms of para 138.

"166C. Personnel proceeding on leave are to report to the Duty Room to collect their Leave Passes before departing and are to report to the Duty Room on return from leave to surrender their Leave Passes.

"167. Personnel visiting another 1 ALSG unit are to report to the Duty Room prior to leaving 2 AOD area and advise the Duty Officer/Duty Sgt of their destination and estimated time of return. Officers, WOs and Sergeants are to advise the duty staff of the telephone number through which they can be contacted.

8. Canteens and Messes, Sect 34

a. Alcoholic Liquor. Paras 225/226 (amdt 5)

- (1) Delete existing paras
- (2) Insert new paras below

225A. Alcoholic liquor is not to be consumed or possessed in the 2 AOD area other than in the following locations:

- a. Officers' Annexe, comprising building numbered A344 and A345.
- b. Sergeants' Mess (Building A349)
- c. Rank and File (Arnold) Club (Building A348) including the patio/barbecue-area.


