COMMANDERS DIARIES
INSTRUCTIONS

AIM

1. The aim of a Commanders Diary is to provide data on which to base future improvements in Army training, equipment, organization and administration, and to furnish historians with a record of the activities of units and formations in operational and non-operational periods in peace and in war.

GENERAL

2. Entries are to be made daily on AF C 2118 (Adapted) each entry being initialled by the officer detailed to keep it.

3. Commanders Diaries will conform with the rules for drafting orders given in "Staff Duties (Australia)" Chapter 2, Section 12.

RESPONSIBILITY

During Non-operational Periods

4. A Commanders Diary is to be compiled by commanders of all formations.

During Operational Periods (1)

- 5. A Commanders Diary is to be compiled in duplicate by:
 - a. Commanders of all formations.
 - b. Each branch of the staff at formation headquarters commanded by a brigadier or above.
 - c. Heads of services not below the rank of lieutenant colonel.
 - d. Personal staffs and officers holding special appointments.
 - e. Unit commanders.
 - f. Commanders of a detachment of a unit when so ordered.

COMPILATION

- 6. Both original and duplicate copies are to consist of:
 - a. Cover (AF C 2119) (Adapted).
 - b. Index as printed on cover.
 - c. Narrative (AF C 2118) (Adapted).
 - d. Annexes as shown in the Index.
- 7. All details of the unit or formation (if a detachment is concerned, the name of the parent unit), period covered and enclosure numbers of the annexes are to be shown on the cover. If there has been a change of command since the last report, the date of assumption by the new commanding officer is to be included.
- 8. The annexes are to be assembled in the groups shown on the cover. If there are no enclosures for an annex NIL will be entered on the cover. If additional annexes are convenient for a particular headquarters, annexes starting at B.

DISPOSAL

- 13. **Original Commander's Diary.** This is to be forwarded monthly, unless otherwise ordered, to the seventh day of the succeeding month direct to AHQ.
- 14. **Duplicate Commander's Diary.** This must be clearly marked as a duplicate. It is to be sent separately from the original to AHQ one month after the original has been despatched but not before the former has been acknowledged.
- 15. When overseas, both copies of diaries are to be sent through the Army Records organization in the overseas theatre but at different times.

16. TOP SECRET Supplementary Diaries.

a. The documents referred to in Paragraph 9 together with a list of them made out on AF C 2118 (Adapted) must be placed in separate cover (AF C 2119) (Adapted). All details must be filled in and the cover clearly marked in red: "ANNEX Z — OFFICER ONLY". It may be convenient to group the papers by appendices.

b. Supplementary diaries must be forwarded under the normal rules for TOP SECRET correspondence, to AHQ. The inner envelope must be plainly marked:

c. The duplicate supplementary diaries must be despatched as shown in Paragraph 14 as soon as receipt of the original has been acknowledged.

If the unit or formation has changed since the last report, the date of changeover by the new commanding officer is to be shown.
- 8. The annexes are to be assembled in the groups shown in the Index. If there are no annexes for an annex NIL will be entered on the cover. If photographs are enclosed they are to be numbered in the order shown in the Index.

PROPOSED NEW ESTABLISHMENT FOR 2 AOD

- References: A. DOS AHQ (M) memo 334/1460/2 dated 2 Apr 68.
B. Establishments No. N/123/2 (TW), IV/125/1 (TW), IV/126/1 (TW), IV/127/1 (TW), IV/128/1 (TW), IV/131/1 (TW).

General

1. The title of this establishment is, 2nd Advanced Ordnance Depot. (Tropical Warfare Establishment). The establishment number is NOT known.
2. The establishments to be superseded and if necessary cancelled are shown as ref B and are separately listed at Annex D to this submission.
3. Seven copies of this proposed establishment have been prepared each with this covering memo for submission through normal channels to AHQ. The detailed establishment and footnotes are attached as annex A. Annex B shows the proposed working organization of the depot.
4. A copy of this memo has been prepared as covering each of the sets of annexes which comprise the submission. The covering memo constitutes the required explanation in detail.

Background to the Proposal

5. This proposed establishment is the joint result of two separate requirements;
 - a. Comments on ref A were required to be submitted to DADOS AFV. (Those comments were separately forwarded.)
 - b. A review of the current establishments of 2 AOD was undertaken for submission through normal command channels. This submission was being prepared because of imbalance in the existing workload and establishments.

Criteria.

6. The criteria for the examination of ref A and the review per para 5b above were;
 - a. The need to develop a depot establishment which directly reflects the working groupings of the personnel employed at the depot.
 - b. The need to relate the organization of the depot to the functional type of ordnance installation which in fact it is. With some minor differences 2 AOD in fact operates in exactly the same manner and to the same accounting requirements as do the Australian mainland BOD's. The effect of the Service Demand System and the influence of in theatre US Supply is minimal regarding organization.

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- c. The need to have experienced Warrant Officers and NCO's, for both close supervision of and concurrent technical training of the Vietnamese civilian employees and the lightly trained soldiers.
- d. The need to employ wherever practicable, Vietnamese personnel in labouring duties and in the lower grades of warehousing and clerical duties.
- e. The need to meet a defence commitment within 1 ALSG.
- f. The need to have an element of the depot HQ to direct the training of the soldiers both in military skills and technical skills and the training of the civilian employees in their duties. This requirement has been coupled with the need to plan the further development of the depot and planning and coordination of all requirements with that of defence.

Differences between the AHQ and 2 AOD Proposals

7. The attached proposal differs in general terms from the AHQ proposal (ref A) as follows:

- a. Groupings. The 2 AOD proposal shows the traditional working groups of a BOD as they exist in 2 AOD.
- b. Supervision and Training. Because of the need for supervision and training, officer positions have NOT been restricted and the warrant officer and senior NCO positions have been increased from 33 to 38. At the same time the Cpl positions have been increased from 38 to 46.
- c. Terminology. The terms Supply Control Platoon, Vehicle Platoon etc have been abandoned as very little of the operations of 2 AOD could really be said to relate to the platoon system. Replacement soldiers and young NCO's who have been employed in mainland depots prior to posting into this depot find the disorientation caused by reference to platoon titles to be confusing. Additionally the defence groupings in 2 AOD are not in anyway related to the platoon or company organizations.
- d. Administration Influence. Experience has shown that by comparison with the mainland depots there is a much greater emphasis on speedy reaction to the unit administrative requirements such as welfare, compassionate matters, pay, R & R leave and repostings. The senior administrative officer of the depot needs to have the breadth and depth of experience usually found only in the rank of captain and higher. For that reason the OO admin has been retained and the organization of the 'A' administration elements has been strengthened.
- e. Planning, Defence and Training. The OO Planning, Defence and Training and the WO Work study operator are considered to be essential and it is very strongly recommended that those positions NOT be restricted because:

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(1) Up to Apr 68 the depot has developed in the following general stages:

Stage 1. Deployment at Vung Tau and operation of stocks from beneath tents and paulins.

Stage 2. The building programme for ten 200 ft by 45 ft concrete and galvanized iron clad storehouses and ancillary buildings with concurrent operation of Stage 1.

Stage 3. The present stage of operations from the above buildings and a Group 1 service station.

(2) The transition from stage 2 to stage 3 was in many respects simply a transfer of stocks "inside from the effects of the weather and sand." At present the depot is plagued with issue inabilities and delays of up to three weeks for the issue of items known to be in stock. Some CRS's have been taking five weeks to reach the "stores put to stock" stage of receipts operations.

(3) At this time, other than RSG, no storehouse has yet been laid out in the established formal receipts, issues, suspense etc areas and neither are the bulk and detail stores well placed in relation to each other. Consequently very poor warehousing practices have developed and been adopted simply as an expedient to keep the depot functioning. Considering the role and history of 2 AOD no other approach to the problems were previously practicable.

(4) Therefore there is now a need here for a very experienced WSO who has spent at least four years in a BOD to conduct a programme of studies considered essential to further development of 2 AOD. The WSO would work directly under the OC Planning Defence and Training who should be a Captain free from the more directly productive day by day activities of the depot. At present both the work studies and the planning are carried out by the OC to the detriment of his other commitments.

Restriction of Officer Positions.

8. Attached as annex C are statistics which reflect something of the density of operation and the rate of production of the warehousing elements of the depot. Bearing in mind the work which still must be done, see para 7e(3) and the workload evident from the statistics it seems obvious to HQ 2 AOD that it would be unwise to restrict any officer position particularly in the warehousing field.

9. Of the three lieutenants provide in ref A for warehousing roles, AHQ proposes to restrict two. Thus the four officers which AHQ considers necessary to assist the SSO (ie 1 Capt and 3 Lts) it has restricted to two. For approximately three weeks in every six, one of the warehousing officers is virtually continually involved in the clearance of the M'Jeparit' and co-ordination of cargo for backloading. Whilst the Vessel is in port one officer is required to direct the operations of each of the two twelve hour shifts worked by warehousing personnel.

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10. From annex C it will be seen that the level of activity in vehicle transactions has reached the stage where an officer is required to devote a high proportion of his supervisory time to Group 1. Accordingly the position of OO 1 Sub Depot should NOT be restricted. Annex B sheets 1 and 5 of 5 show the proposed distribution of Lt's. The OO 1 Sub Depot will direct the activities of Groups 1 and 2.

Civilian Employees

11. Annex G shows the proposed distribution of Vietnamese employees throughout the organization. This annex has been produced only to show the requirement for the supervision mentioned in para 7b. It is NOT meant to infer that the personnel are other than a pool of labour of specific trades.

12. No further general comments are offered. Detailed summaries are given in the various annexes attached.

CRS FOR JEPARIT 15

1. One of the biggest warehousing problems has been the length of time previously taken to put all discharged stores to stock and bring the items to account whilst concurrently releasing dues out. In the past CRS's have been cleared as late as 4-5 weeks after being raised. Of course one result has been signal/service demands or and raising of dues out when stock has in fact been physically in the depot but NOT brought to account.

2. On this occasion (Voyage 15) greater emphasis was placed on accurate and speedy receipt procedure. That so much was achieved is a tribute to the storeholders and storemen in the stores groups. As at 10 Jun only 66 Jeparit CRS are uncleared.

3. For Jeparit voyage 15 discharge the following was adopted:

a. Traffic to work two twelve hours shifts. Staff of traffic increased by personnel of the groups.

b. The groups to work from first light to last light, to solve the problem of inadequate lighting in the storehouses and also to keep within the tactical restrictions on lighting in the area. (a work day of twelve hours).
