INSTRUCTIONS

AIM

1. The aim of a Commanders Diary is to provide data on which to base future improvements in Army training, equipment, organization and administration, and to furnish historians with a record of the activities of units and formations in operational and non-operational periods in peace and in war.

GENERAL

2. *Entries are to be made daily on AF C 2118 (Adapted) each entry being initialled by the officer detailed to keep it.*
3. Commanders Diaries will conform with the rules for drafting orders given in "Staff Duties (Australia)", Chapter 2, Section 12.

RESPONSIBILITY

During Non-operational Periods

4. A Commanders Diary is to be compiled by commanders of all formations.

During Operational Periods (1)

5. A Commanders Diary is to be compiled in duplicate by:
 - a. Commanders of all formations.
 - b. Each branch of the staff at formation headquarters commanded by a brigadier or above.
 - c. Heads of services not below the rank of lieutenant colonel.
 - d. Personal staffs and officers holding special appointments.
 - e. Unit commanders.
 - f. Commanders of a detachment of a unit when so ordered.

COMPILATION

6. Both original and duplicate copies are to consist of:
 - a. Cover (AF C 2119) (Adapted).
 - b. Index as printed on cover.
 - c. Narrative (AF C 2118) (Adapted).
 - d. Annexes as shown in the Index.
7. All details of the unit or formation (if a detachment is concerned, the name of the parent unit), period covered and enclosure numbers of the annexes are to be shown on the cover. If there has been a change of command since the last report, the date of assumption by the new commanding officer is to be included.
8. The annexes are to be assembled in the groups shown on the cover. If there are no enclosures for an annex NIL will be entered on the cover. If additional annexes are convenient for a particular headquarters, starting at B.

DISPOSAL

13. **Original Commander's Diary.** This is to be forwarded monthly, unless otherwise ordered, on the seventh day of the succeeding month direct to AHQ.

14. Duplicate Commander's Diary. This must be clearly marked as a duplicate. It is to be sent separately from the original to AHQ one month after the original has been despatched but not before the former has been acknowledged.

15. When overseas, both copies of diaries are to be sent through the Army Records organization in the overseas theatre but at different times.

16. TOP SECRET Supplementary Diaries.

- a. The documents referred to in Paragraph 9 together with a list of them made out on AF C 2118 (Adapted) must be placed in separate cover (AF C 2119) (Adapted). All details must be filled in and the cover clearly marked in red: "ANNEX Z — OFFICER ONLY". It may be convenient to group the papers by appendices.
 - b. Supplementary diaries must be forwarded under the normal rules for TOP SECRET correspondence, to AHQ. The inner envelope must be plainly marked:

3. Operational Tasks:

- a. 5 Aug 66. Ground recce of feasibility of constructing bypass route to WEST of 1 ATF during wet season to permit local traffic from BINH BA and points NORTH, to BARIA. Not practical in wet season, and extensive construction project even in dry season.
- b. 9 Aug 66. 3 Fd Tp in support of Operation HOLSWORTHY, Combat Operations after action Report Annex A.
- c. 17 Aug 66. Destruction of one blind 75mm mountain gun shell, check of reported blind 82mm mors after mör attack on TF HQ. Mor blinds proved to be tail fins embedded in ground.
- d. 18 Aug 66. Supplied vehicles, forklift and work party to unload 66,000 lbs arty ammo flown forward 2045 hrs to resupply arty sp to 6 RAR - Op SMITHFIELD.
- e. 19 Aug 66. Warned to move Massey Ferguson backhoe and Oliver dozer by Chinook to battlefield to bury 308 VC dead from Op SMITHFIELD. Task cancelled, done by Infantry with shovels.
- f. Neutralized several grenades recovered from VC bodies.
- g. 24 Aug 66. Recce party cleared two lanes through old protective minefield at DUC THAN village (YS 4677) to enable ARVN garrison force to recover two loads of 105mm ammo paratropped into minefield. One M16 mine in poor condition was located, pulled, (mine fell to pieces during pulling) and blown in situ. Densely overgrown grass was such as to make prodding almost useless, and the mine was located by use of the mine detector.
- h. 26 Aug 66. Installed 40 ft SS US M2 bridge (Bailey) at Ap An Phu (YS 437692) over top of improvised bridge installed in July. This bridge was required to ensure that Route 2 could support the fast move of a large reaction force to the NORTH if required. The improvised bridge was retained in situ in case the Bailey should ever have to be pulled out at short notice for use elsewhere. The improvised bridge is satisfactory for local traffic using Rte 2 (C1 12) but is subject to erosion damage and could not support APC's and SP 155mm. howitzers. Bypass is difficult in the wet and can not be implemented until the dry season.
- i. 30 Aug 66. Sent four two man demo teams and Mighty Mite team to join 5RAR in LONG THAN village (YS 4965) on report of tunnels being encountered - Op DARLINGHURST. Report Annex B.
- l. 31 Aug 66. Warned for Recce at YS 286633 and YS 263671 to advise ARVN on installation of protective minefields - recce organised for 1 Sep 66.
1. Daily clearance Rte 2 for mines and booby traps 2 sappers with mine detectors

- m. Op engrs stores supply.

5. CIVIL AFFAIRS.

- a. Site preparation work was done for construction of new market place in HOA LONG.
- b. Assigned responsibility for supervision of contractor for market place const.
- c. Rd maint Rte 2 through HOA LONG village.

6. VISITS AND CONFERENCES :-

- a. 5 Aug 66. Maj MARKHAM, S2 Engr of PP V II visited to discuss engr reports to his HQ. Requested to be included on distribution list of E- in - C Monthly Tech Report.
- b. 6 Aug 66. Visit by VUNG TAU area comd, Col Church and discussed possible use of Binh Ba airfd to resupply 1 ATF by C130. Requested USAF to check airfd for use by C130's.
- c. 22 Aug 66. Visit by Lt Col Rogers, CO 2 Fd Amb to discuss engr requirements to improve TF hygiene particularly the garbage dump. The restricted site available, plus shortage of drivers makes normal sanitary cut an fill undesirable. It was decided to attempt to construct a large scale inclined plane incinerator for installation at the edge of the pit to permit partial incineration of garbage prior to dumping in pit.
- d. 23 Aug 66. Rocco Officer attended conference at PPV II Engr Sect to discuss responsibilities and methods of classification and marking of bridges throughout Corps area.
- e. 23 Aug 66. Lt N LEATHERWOOD (C.E. US Army) arrived from 65 Engr Bn (25 Inf Div, US) for 30 day exchange period. Tp Ofcr 3 Fd Tp Lt.G. STEWART departed to CU CHI on exchange tour. It is intended not to post American officer into the appointment vacated by the Australian officer, but to use him as an additional rocco offr. and detach him to tps for interesting tasks.
- f. 24 Aug 66. Visit by Col Grace (Engr PP V II) with other officers, to inspect engr works and discuss problems. Promised to provide 2 sets of 40 ft of DS Bailey Br, one set for use at An Phu Village, the other for ready reserve on the ground. Promised to produce some 18" or 24" culvert material, which had been not available for some weeks. Discussed proposed use of 300,000 sq ft WPAI solid steel planking and same quantity T 17 membrane ordered by 1 ATF for use in airfd const, helipads, and hard stands.
- g. 25 Aug 66.
 - (1) OC visited 1st Inf Div (US) to discuss use of CS powder dropped from aircraft to provide a barrier. Americans have used this with unknown success. They drop 30 x 55 gal drums from a Chinook with a time fuse designed to detonate the drum just before impact. However, the resulting gas has been known to shift as much as 9 KM in a light breeze. The residual effect is only 2 or 3 days in wet weather or a week in dry, and it is considered that there is no application for this procedure in 1 ATF TAOR.

6.
(2) Spoke to 1 Div Chemical Officer on use of improvised incendiary devices in perimeter defence, particularly "Phacugasse" and "HUSCH Flares". At some later date, 1 Div will send team to 1 Pd Sqn to install some of these devices and instruct sappers in their const and use.

- h. Visited by Col RAYNEY, XG 18 Engr Bde to discuss 1 Pd Sqn combat engr op of 1 ATF.

INTELLIGENCE.

7. Airfield. During Op HOLSWORTHY, Binh Ba airfd was reconnoitred and it appears to be satisfactory for use by C130. The surface is grass covered laterite with some craters in the North Eastern 100 yards. Length approx 5000 ft and width of 300 ft. Appears well drained.

8. 1 En copt

- a. Several grenades which were recovered during Op SMITHFIELD were neutralised. None of these were new types. Unfortunately, Infantry destroyed many en grenades in situ before engrs could arrange to recover them. This should not happen in future.

- b. Some VC gas masks were recovered. These consist of plastic bags with elasticised head holes and cotton gauze filter pads incorporated to give crude protection from gases.

9. Weather. Rainfall report indicated Annex E.

10. Bridges.

- a. Egpt bridges installed and held by unit are included in Anx F which is a monthly report requirement for FP V II, Engr.

- b. On 24 Aug 66 part of C1 9 Br No 40A at YS 370540 was destroyed when a US recovery vehicle with dumper truck in tow exceeded the classification. Intended repair or replacement action is not yet known. This decision will no doubt be made by FP V II.

PART 3 ENGR STORES.

11. Until 4 Aug 66, DAA and QMG had been controlling allocation of all engr stores except for Fd Bef stores which were allocated by O Ops. On 4 Aug 66, OC 1 Pd Sqn took over full responsibility for ordering, receipt, allocation, and issue of all engr stores to TF units. DAA and QMG still provides allocation basis, but 21 Engr Sq Tp checks issue against allocation and releases items as they arrive in response to engr initiated requests. Bef stores are issued as required to units, and such items as flooring timbers, CP timbers, are allocated on population or functional basis.

12. On taking over con of engr stores completely, 21 Engr Sq Sp initiated staff action to obtain shipping to move large quantities of engr stores fwd by LSM and US LCU. These craft bypass the low classification bridges between Ban Me and Vung Tau and have enabled large tonnages of engr stores to be brought forward.

PART 4 GENERAL COMMENTS.

13. Spare Parts. Despite expressed concern at all levels about lack of spare parts for vehicles and engr plant, and despite some improvement in the supply of spare parts the resupply system still leaves much to be desired as is indicated in the status report shown in Annex G, which amplifies para 2 of this report.
14. Reinforcements. The following list of deficiencies in personnel shows that a large number of reinforcements are required. Work output is suffering from the lack of personnel.

15. Medical. Apart from declared deficiencies, a large proportion of the unit is not medically Class 1. Much work time is being lost by the necessity to provide medication and group therapy to the large number of people suffering from skin rashes and diseases. Owing to the prevalence of the day biting encephalitis mosquito, it has become necessary for all personnel to wear shirts and long trousers at all times, and this, with the hot and humid conditions encountered by sappers on most of their tasks, has aggravated skin rashes.

1. Name and Type of Operation: Operation HOLSWORTHY. The operation incorporated village search, and search and blocking operations.
2. Dates of operation: 9 Aug to 18 Aug 66
3. Location: Vicinity BINH BA, BGAI GIAO (DUC TRUNG), DUC MY hamlets, vic YS 480715.
4. Command HQ : 5 RAR
5. Reporting Officer: Major W W LENNON.
6. Task organisation:
 - a. Clearance BINH BA village 9-10 Aug. 1 x 2 man demo team with each section of search coy, B Coy. Engr tp comd and 3 ORs on Coy HQ. Four engrs under comd aslt prns at WP.
 - b. Clearance DUC TRUNG 9 Aug, 3 demo teams with each of 2 sections of 1 Pl, A Coy. Tp offr and radio op with pl HQ.
 - c. Clearance DUC MY, 10 Aug. 2 Demo teams with each pl of D Coy. Engr tp offr and op on Coy HQ. Same engr gp used for this task as for b.
 - d. Pacification of villages and opening Rte 2, 11-13 Aug. 3 demo teams with each coy (one per pl) and 10 engr on BHQ.
 - e. Area search vic YS 480715 14-18 Aug 66. 4 demo teams per pl with each pl of A Coy, 10 engrs on Coy HQ. Lead search pls each had one demo team per section and one on pl HQ. Engr storeman det to assist prns.
 - f. On 14 Aug 66, engrs no longer required for WP. returned to base area.
7. Intelligence: At commencement if ops, no intelligence was aval on presence of tunnels or caches in villages. Intelligence obtained during early stages indicated there was a provincial VC HQ in concrete bunkers loc in vic of YS 480715. When this info was received, Mighty Mite was moved fwd to engrs, and gas turbine team placed on standby.
8. Mission: Engrs were to assist with Op of WP and to support 5 RAR as required with regard to booby traps and tunnels and rd clearance.

9. Concept of Op :


- a. Simultaneous cordon of BINH BA and DUC TRUNG by first light 9 Aug followed by detail search of each hamlet to apprehend and interrogate VCS.
- b. Hand over security BINH BA to 1 Cdo Coy ARVN.
- c. Open and secure Rte 2.
- d. Search area of suspected VC HQ (1500 metres square) using one search coy and remainder as blocking forces.
- e. Two coys of 6 RAR supported 5 RAR in each phase.

10. Execution:

During village search, dwellings were secured by infantry and searched by engr demp teams. 90% of houses had small local protection tunnels, seldom exceeding 20 feet in length, all of which were searched throughout. Generally the village search was fruitless. Events of engineer interest are documented below:

II. Results ; 20 VCS apprehended in BINH BA.

12. Commanders Analysis:

- a. Village search technique was most satisfactory, but could have been speeded up considerably if more interpreters had been available. In several cases engr search parties had to wait for interpreters before they could commence house search.
- b. Provision of water was assigned to En assault pioneers, with four sappers and a Patterson tlr under cond. For operations extending over several days and operating from a static base, it is desirable to assign water supply responsibility to engrs. On this op, the engr Tp cond had to assist with technical difficulties with water supply.
- c. During the area search for the VC provincial HQ, it was found that wherever old weapon pits were found, there were mounds of spoil heaped around the bases of trees. Although these sometimes look very natural, they should be considered by searchers as a warning sign that there may be VC diggings nearby.

- d. When engrs were regrouped at BHQ they were assigned 60 yds of perimeter. However, in the initial concept, this had not been anticipated. Owing to the lack of M60s on Sqn org (although two have been borrowed) it was not possible to send an M60 with the engr group. Since engrs did not have an M60, they were redistributed in groups of 3 throughout BHQ and rostered to man infantry guns. This situation re-affirms the requirement for M60 machine guns in the Fd Sqn.
