PART 3**COMMANDERS DIARIES
INSTRUCTIONS****AIM**

1. The aim of a Commanders Diary is to provide data on which to base future improvements in Army training, equipment, organization and administration, and to furnish historians with a record of the activities of units and formations in operational and non-operational periods in peace and in war.

GENERAL

2. *Entries are to be made daily on AF C 2118 (Adapted) each entry being initialled by the officer detailed to keep it.*
3. Commanders Diaries will conform with the rules for drafting orders given in "Staff Duties (Australia)" Chapter 2, Section 12.

RESPONSIBILITY**During Non-operational Periods**

4. A Commanders Diary is to be compiled by commanders of all formations.

During Operational Periods (1)

5. A Commanders Diary is to be compiled in duplicate by:
- Commanders of all formations.
 - Each branch of the staff at formation headquarters commanded by a brigadier or above.
 - Heads of services not below the rank of lieutenant colonel.
 - Personal staffs and officers holding special appointments.
 - Unit commanders.
 - Commanders of a detachment of a unit when so ordered.

COMPILATION

6. Both original and duplicate copies are to consist of:
- Cover (AF C 2119) (Adapted).
 - Index as printed on cover.
 - Narrative (AF C 2118) (Adapted).
 - Annexes as shown in the Index.
7. All details of the unit or formation (if a detachment is concerned, the name of the parent unit), period covered and enclosure numbers of the annexes are to be shown on the cover. If there has been a change of command since the last report, the date of assumption by the new commanding officer is to be included.
8. The annexes are to be assembled in the groups shown on the cover. If there are no enclosures for an annex NIL will be entered on the cover. If additional annexes are convenient for a particular headquarters, starting at B.

COMBINED RECORDS
DISPOSAL

13. **Original Commander's Diary.** This is to be forwarded monthly, unless otherwise ordered, by the seventh day of the succeeding month direct to AHQ.

14. **Duplicate Commander's Diary.** This must be clearly marked as a duplicate. It is to be sent separately from the original to AHQ one month after the original has been despatched but not before the former has been acknowledged.

15. When overseas, both copies of diaries are to be sent through the Army Records organization in the overseas theatre but at different times.

16. **TOP SECRET Supplementary Diaries.**

a. The documents referred to in Paragraph 9 together with a list of them made out on AF C 2118 (Adapted) must be placed in separate cover (AF C 2119) (Adapted). All details must be filled in and the cover clearly marked in red: "ANNEX Z — OFFICER ONLY". It may be convenient to group the papers by appendices.

b. Supplementary diaries must be forwarded under the normal rules for TOP SECRET correspondence, to AHQ. The inner envelope must be plainly marked:

c. The duplicate supplementary diaries must be despatched as shown in Paragraph 14 as soon as receipt of the original has been acknowledged.

INTELLIGENCE REPORT FROM 4 RAR CP 231000H

1. A mortar base plate was found at grid reference 4166 west of NUI DAT 1. 10 rounds were fired and landed short behind NUI DAT 1 and set off several mines. No damage was done to 1 ATF.
2. The attack was described as a diversionary tactic for an attack of platoon size strength on BARIA. An ARVN fortified position/pill-box was damaged in the attack. The attack consisted of small arms and B40 rockets and RPG2s.
3. B Coy 9 RAR was sent to the assistance of the ARVN and contact was broken. A search was conducted which continued until daylight, when a more detailed search was carried out and the following casualties/equipment were the result:

 - b. An accidental explosion in the unserviceable ammunition bay of the ATF AP, causing damage to equipment from secondary fires and some minor casualties. Details of this event are covered in the Investigating Officers report which will be forwarded on arrival.

PART 1 - OPERATIONS

2. The deployment of a forward TFMA to support 1 ATF on OP FEDERAL occurred, on short notice, at 0645 hrs on 18 Feb 69. The TFMA was deployed initially at FSB KERRY and subsequently relocated in the PLANTATION sector of the LONG BINH complex. Whilst the logistic support of the TF has been maintained at a highly satisfying level, aspects in regard to organization and equipment for such operations. Details of the operation, together with the appropriate recommendations will be covered in the after action report.
3. It is of interest to note that after re-deployment to LONG BINH on 19 Feb 69, the forward TFMA complex was subjected to 107mm Rocket Attack on 22 and 24 Feb 69. No casualties or damage were sustained.
4. The 1 ATF base at NUI DAT was also subjected to light 82mm Mortar Fire on 24 Feb 69.

Transport

5. There has been a significant increase in the utilization of the TF second line transport in this reporting period. This can be attributed to both the lodgement and extraction of the combat elements of the TF on operations, together with the increased use of second line transport by unit echelons for forward replenishment.
6. It is apparent from the tasking statistics, together with the rejection of tasks, that there is a need to increase the number of cargo vehicles and reduce the number of dump vehicles in 85 Tpt P1 RAASC at NUI DAT. Initially an exchange of three dump for three cargo vehicles would be satisfactory. A submission will be made through normal channels.

7. The second Tank Transporter Prime Mover, to replace backloaded BER, has not yet been received. Early advice on its availability would be appreciated.

8. A submission has been made to provide an additional two alternative trailers, compatible with these prime movers for use with Engineer Plant which subjects the tank trailers to damage during each loading.

Forklifts

9. The AFV review of theatre forklifts, mentioned in the previous two reports has not been completed. The situation regarding these equipments and operators continues to deteriorate. Early advice would be appreciated.

/Supplies

Supplies

0. During this reporting period separate reconciliation of perishable and non-perishable supplies has been introduced into the accounting system.

11. The vacancies in Det 52 Sup Pl, created by an approved RVE have been filled, thereby allowing the detachment to split for a forward deployment of the TFMA.

12. The supply elements MHE continues to be used at an extremely high rate because of the shortage of equipment pending the review of theatre holdings by AFV.

13. In lieu issues of meats continued at a high level during this period.

14. Bread, produced under a new contract in VUNG TAU has been in good supply since 12 Feb 69. A shortfall in bread, available for issue at NUI DAT, has been experienced due to the heavy commitment of transport resources to support OP FEDERAL for higher priority cargo.

POL

15. During the reporting period the detachment was deployed as follows:

Operations 4 Pet Operators (2xNCOs and 2xPtes)

5 Coy RAASC 1 Pet Operator (For dvr trg/forklift course).

1 ATF Area 9 Pet Operators (8 Pet Operators and 1 Cpl RAE).

16. On 27 Jan 69 work was commenced on the kerbside refuelling area. The old earthwork bunds were demolished, revetted, and concrete floored bunds laid.

17. Four new bunds were constructed, two holding 2 x 10000 gallon tanks for MOGAS and DIESEL, and two more each containing 1 x 10000 gallon tank for JP4 and AVGAS. These have both been relocated within the area to conform with planned light aircraft refuelling by direct pipeline to Luscombe strip.

18. Temporary refuelling points were set up near Luscombe strip and B Sqn 1 Armd Regt areas for DIESEL and MOGAS to allow for uninterrupted refuelling whilst the kerbside area is remodelled.

19. Work is progressing slowly due to operational commitments of 1 ATF and the stage has now been reached where final grading, levelling and partial sealing of the area is required before further building work and final layout of pipeline can be completed.

20. There is no refuelling being carried out within the kerbside area at present, except for the issue of bulk AVGAS and packed products. However if required, fuelling facilities for all ground vehicles could be operating at one hour's notice.

Air

21. During the reporting period a total of 534879 lbs have been moved by this detachment. There were 81 sorties involved, details of which are set out below.

These sorties also included two (2) Bty moves and two (2) moves involving an "O" Type Dozer.

22. Assistance was given to 105 Bty (during their period of in country training) in methods of rigging loads, hooking up, and the general inspection of ADE. The bty deployed on 12 Feb 69 and returned 13 Feb 69. An NCO crew commander

/was deployed

was deployed to assist the bty in its first move by air.

3. There is an Air Despatcher currently deployed with each fd bty to assist in the various air operations, and these personnel have been deployed for the whole of the reporting period.

24. On 25 Jan 69 a test lift involving a locally made water tank, constructed of culverting welded together, was carried out at 9 RAR. The tank was lifted empty by UH1H and full by CH47, with pilots of both aircraft expressing satisfaction with the way the load both hung and flew.

25. An air dispatcher was also deployed with 9 RAR for a period of 24 hours to assess the quantity of AD required to move the unit into the field.

26. Three Air Dispatchers, including one NCO and one WSO, were deployed with the forward TFMA on OP FEDERAL.

27. Submissions have been made to 1 ATF regarding the use of AD support by units of 1 ATF, and the necessity for the units to draw on the AD knowledge. In some cases, units have been carrying out AD tasks beyond the true capabilities of their unit personnel.

Ammunition

28. On 19 Feb 69, the unserviceable Ammo bay of the TFMA AP exploded, distributing unexploded ammunition and debris over a wide area of 1 ATF base NUI DAT. The investigating officers report has been concluded and will be forwarded when available.

PART II - ADMINISTRATION

TAOR Patrols

TFMA has continued to provide TAOR patrols in accordance with the 1 ATF Patrol Programme. Despite the deployment of the Forward TFMA, patrols continue to be provided at the rate of approximately one patrol per five days. No significant incidents have occurred during the reporting period.

Training

Training during the period has been restricted due to preparation for the deployment to LONG BINH. One course of 5 days duration has been conducted by 85 Tpt Pl to train drivers in dump truck operation.

Visits

The TFMA received visits from:

- a. Brig P.L. Tancred, Comd 28 (COMVEL) Inf Bde.
- b. Maj F.P. Meek, RAASC (CMF).

Centralization of Domestic Transport

As outlined in the previous report, the centralized system was initiated for $\frac{3}{4}$ ton TFMA vehicles. This system has failed due to the lack of drivers to drive the vehicles, and the previous de-centralized system has been re-introduced.

Civil Affairs Project

The report on the Civil Affairs visit to XUYEN MOC, mentioned in the previous report, has been included as Annex I to this report.



10. It was observed whilst loading/unloading Caribou aircraft, that there is a reluctance on the part of the RAAF to use the ground loading ramp for emplaning and deplaning of troops. This matter has been taken up with the OC 176 AD Coy Vung Tau for further action.

1 ATF Area 9 Pet Operators (8 Pet Operators & 1 Cpl RAASC)


2. On Jan 27 69 work was commenced on the kerbside refuelling area. The old earthwork bunds were demolished, and revetted, and concrete floor'd bunds laid.

3. Four new bunds were constructed, two holding 2 x 10,000 gallon tanks for MOGAS and DIESEL, and two more each containing 1 x 10,000 gallon tank for JP4 and AVGAS. These have both been relocated within the area to conform with planned light aircraft refuelling by direct pipeline to Luscombe strip.

4. Temporary refuelling points were set up near Luscombe strip and R Sqn 1 Armd Regt areas for DIESEL and MOGAS to allow for uninterrupted refuelling whilst the kerbside area is remodelled.

5. Work is progressing slowly due to operational commitments of 1 ATF, and the stage has now been reached where final grading, levelling and partial sealing of the area is required before further building work and final layout of pipeline can be completed.

6. There is no refuelling being carried out within the kerbside area at present, except for the issue of bulk AVGAS and packed products. However if required, fuelling facilities for all ground vehicles could be operating at one hour's notice.

General.

4. The significant increase in the total mileage covered (20152 as compared with 14401 during the previous reporting period) is attributed to the higher proportion of tasks and the additional distances covered, particularly by the cargo vehicles, during insertion and extraction of units on operations and in road resupply.

5. HQ AFV EIS Inspection Team carried out an inspection of the majority of unit vehicles between 15 - 23 Feb 69. It is believed that the inspector will submit a good report and that vehicles are being serviced and maintained to their satisfaction.

6. A high average availability was again maintained - lowest 82% - average 86% (overall platoon vehicles). Tasks were similar to those covered in the previous reporting period.

7. A total of 7 X task vehicles (6 cargo and 1 dump) were detached to the fwd TFMA at FSPB KERRY and LONG BINH (OP FEDERAL).

TFMA CIVIL AFFAIRS ACTIVITIES
XUYEN MOC 29 JAN 69

1. Report compiled by: Capt B.G.H. Arbon and Lt C.Clues.
2. Description of Activity
 - a. About two tons of non-perishable rations had been accumulated from the unconsumed portion of rations out of the TFMA Kitchens and from rations unsuitable for issue by Det 52 Sup Pl RAASC over the past five weeks.
 - b. On the 29 Jan 69 these supplies were delivered to the village chief at XUYEN MOC by a road convoy.
 - c. A Sqn 3 Cav Regt contributed about half a ton of mice. They also gave 2 x 50 calibre MGs and 1 ton of ammunition to the local forces Sub Sectin HQ to assist in the local defence.
 - d. Three APCs of A Sqn did a circuit of the village to "Show the Flag" and clear an area of scrub to enable the villagers to construct a fence.
 - e. To assist the APCs in their scrub - clearing operation, 1 Fd Sqn provided a mini team of engineers.
3. Movement to XUYEN MOC
 - a. The composition of the convoy was as follows:
4 APCs and 2 Mortar carriers from A Sqn 3 Cav.
1 x $\frac{3}{4}$ Ton Landrover from TFMA.
1 x 5 Ton Cargo from 85 Tpt Pl RAASC.
1 Pl of Infantry.
 - b. The route in and out was NUI DAT, BRIA, DAT DO, XUYEN MOC via Route 23. The total distance travelled was about 50 miles.
 - c. Artillery support was on call over most of the journey.
 - d. There was no contact with or sighting of enemy troops.
4. Distribution of the Foodstuffs
 - a. On arrival at XUYEN MOC, all the foodstuffs were carried into a large storehouse. They were to be distributed just prior to TET on 16 Feb 69.
 - b. The method of distribution is to break all the rations down to family groups. The quantity for each family is then placed in a plastic bag and given to the family representative. It was estimated it would take about a week to do this.
 - c. The reason the rations are broken down into separate lots and distributed in plastic bags, is that it ensures that they cannot be stored for long periods but must be consumed reasonably quickly. This prevents the possibility of the food reaching the VIET CONG, and also prevents the villagers from selling the food at later dates on the local market.
5. Observations
 - a. The villagers of XUYEN MOC will gratefully accept any food stuffs which breaks the monotony of their regular diet of rice. The children are very keen on sweets, chocolates, etc but the distribution of these items to them must be carefully controlled so that no fights occur between them and there is no risk of smaller children being trampled in the rush.

5. b. The visit was one of the few occasions when the TFMA has been privileged to have a full Cav escort for its own exclusive convoy.

6. Recommendations

a. It is recommended that the unit grouping on future CA projects of this type should be the following:

- (1) Unit CA Officer or rep
- (2) Unit PR rep with unit camera
- (3) Unit observers
- (4) Drivers and protection party as required.


b. All members should carry long-barrelled weapons and wear flak jackets when necessary. Light vehicles should be gun-mounted. Water bottles shuld be worn as most roads are extremely dusty in the dry season.


c. The unit command vehicle should carry a radio enabling communications to be maintained with the convoy commander.

d. For the benefit of members, they should carry some local currency to enable them to purchase items from the villagers.

7. Conclusion

This was the first major CA activity undertaken by the TFMA this year. It is considered that as many members of the TFMA as possible should be phased through these activities.

1. The distribution of sweets directly to children should be discouraged as it degrades them to "beggars" in the eyes of their parents and local elders. If sweets are available, they should be distributed through the "family system" with the other foodstuffs.

2. A Civil Affairs Section is to be prepared for SOP's. It should include the following:

- a. Introduction to describe Xuyen Moc.
- b. Aims of the CA assistance.
- c. Instructions for CA parties, to include:
 - (1) dress
 - (2) carrying of currency
 - (3) water bottles to be worn
 - (4) purchase of local foodstuffs not allowed
 - (5) ice box to be carried to avoid purchase and consumption of local brews
 - (6) preparation of reports and photo-coverage
 - (7) method of collection and storage of foodstuffs
 - (8) co-ordination with CA units and escorts.
