COMMANDERS DIARIES INSTRUCTIONS

AIM

1. The aim of a Commanders Diary is to provide data on which to base future improvements in Army training, equipment, organization and administration, and to furnish historians with a record of the activities of units and formations in operational and non-operational periods in peace and in war.

GENERAL

- 2. Entries are to be made daily on AF C 2118 (Adapted) each entry being initialled by the officer detailed to keep it.
- 3. Commanders Diaries will conform with the rules for drafting orders given in "Staff Duties (Australia)" Chapter 2, Section 12.

RESPONSIBILITY

During Non-operational Periods

4. A Commanders Diary is to be compiled by commanders of all formations.

During Operational Periods (1)

- 5. A Commanders Diary is to be compiled in duplicate by:
 - a. Commanders of all formations.
 - b. Each branch of the staff at formation headquarters commanded by a brigadier or above.
 - c. Heads of services not below the rank of lieutenant colonel.
 - d. Personal staffs and officers holding special appointments.
 - e. Unit commanders.
 - f. Commanders of a detachment of a unit when so ordered.

COMPILATION

- 6. Both original and duplicate copies are to consist of:
 - a. Cover (AF C 2119) (Adapted).
 - b. Index as printed on cover.
 - c. Narrative (AF C 2118) (Adapted).
 - d. Annexes as shown in the Index.
- 7. All details of the unit or formation (if a detachment is concerned, the name of the parent unit), period covered and enclosure numbers of the annexes are to be shown on the cover. If there has been a change of command since the last report, the date of assumption by the new commanding officer is to be included.
- 8. The annexes are to be assembled in the groups shown on the cover. If there are no enclosures for an annex NIL will be entered on the cover if additional annexes are convenient for a particular headquarters, tarting at B.





236. SUGGESTICUS. DIVINITICUS AID DIPROVISIEUTS TO MILITARY EQUIPMENT

Reference: A. HBI 243-1 dated 18 Nov 68. D. R980-405-2

- The reference HNI sets out the procedure to be followed when inventions or proposals for improvement to equipment, etc., are put forward by members of the Army or non-members.
- Mamber of AFV (Army Component) are to refer such proposals to FORS, He AFV, through the normal chain of exemand. It will assist those responsible for finally considering the proposal if, at each level of susmand, the proposal is considered and appropriate comments attached before forwarding to the next hondquarters. Included in these comments there should be a statement of the nembers qualifications in regard to the equipment under consideration.

237. PHILLITICAL OF FIRES OF SHOWERS RECEPTAGLES

To Containors used as ashtroys are not to be permitted to accumulate rubbish. In this regard, deep containers, such as shall cases do not allow rubbish to be readily seen and are not to be used as ashtroys. Ignition of inflormable natorial in such a container is suspected to be the cause of at least one fire in living accommodation.

236. MATHEMANDE OF RIALLARIS

- to Use of non outhorised cleaning and lubricating agents is to comes immediately. The following are outhorised for use in Wietnams
 - a. Rifla Mi6al. Semi finid lubricating oil (ISA)
 - be Other Scott Arms
 - (1) 0x-16 or US equivalent 0-190.
 - (2) RAMME armourers only may use 6850-00-281-1986 SOLVANT dry electing (squivalent to Range Fuel) to elean particularly dirity weapons, immediately the weapon is dry.
- In unite, small arms are to be eleaned and lubricated only with the authorised lubricant, and as follows:
 - Legical to limbors. These are to be alsoned and lightly oiled daily to provent corresion and reduce year to moving parts. Hon noving parts are to be kept dry.
 - be In Unit Starnes Metal parts are to be lightly sucared with oil and inspected, alouned and resolved at weekly intervals.
- 3. Unit Commanders are reminded of their responsibility to ensure that soldiers maintain their usepons in a clean, properly lubricated and operable condition. This can only be done by regular inspections and attention by unit amourers and workshops.
- As Disciplinary action is to be taken against members who use unauthorised cleaning agents or lubricants, or take inadequate care of their weapens:

239. AUTHORISED LEAVE PERIODS

- (a) Wing Tan Special Zone General: Local leave may be granted, by unit commanders, from 0800 hrs to 2100 hrs daily. Not more than 25% of the posted strength of a unit may be on local leave at any one time.
- (b) FMAF Establishments: Personnel may patronise FMAF establishments between 0800 hrs and 2045 hrs daily. However with the approval of their OC on each occasion, members may patronise FMAF Establishments which are quarded by FMAF personnel until a later time, providing the nembers travel between the establishment and the 1 ALSG Main Gate Military transport, by the most direct route, and arrive within the 1 ALSG Main Gate by 2330 hrs.

240. CURFEY

Curfew for all members, except those on official military duty, is from 2100 hrs to 0600 hrs daily. Members other than those on official duty or as defined in para 2b, are not to proceed from, or be absent from, the 1 ALSG area or their assigned billets at any time during the curfew hours.

241. DRESS

- (a) Unless on Offical duty personnel are not to wear uniform in Vung Tau.
- (b) Whilst on standown within the 1 ALSG area civilian clothes may be worm unless otherwise ordered. Whilst on local leave, outside the 1 ALSG area or the R & C Centre, civilian clothes are to be worm.

242 ALCOHOLIC LITTOR

Alcoholic liquor whether contained in a tin, coaket, or bottle, is not to be taken out of the 1 ALSG area or the R & C Centre unless the seal of the container is broken.

Alcohalic Liquor may only be carried outside of unit lines if it is concealed in a manner which conceals the contents.

Alcoholic Ligior is not to be consumed in:

- (a) Any private duelling or club or quarter without the approval of the owner or monager.
- (b) On any street or public thoroughfare, beach, garden or park.
- (c) In any vehicle.

245. AUSTRALIAI CIVILIAU SUPPORT FOR MILITARY CIVIC ACTION DI VISTUAM

1. Australian civilian support for military civic action in Vietnam is co-ordinated by ANQ (DNO and P). Therefore it is essential that organizations and individuals seeking to assist in military civic action deal with ANQ and not direct with members serving in Vietnam. To this end the following orders apply:

- A courteous admowledgement of receipt of the correspondence
- A statement that the matter has been referred to Alig for attention: and,
- (3) Advice that any further enquiries should be addressed to thes Secretary, Department of the Army, Conberre, ACT.
- All dotails of such offers of assistance are to be given by nembers to their units, which will in turn forward the details through normal channels to HO AFV.
- (c) Any member who may have already entered into correspondence with any organization or strenger on military civic action should now inform their correspondent that it is necessary for any further dealings to me made through Alle to ensure proper co-ordination of the applicance.
- further, details of any organization or stranger enquiring of member for details of military civic action are else to be referred to HQ AFV in the same way.
- This order is not intended to prevent members accepting donations from personal friends and relations, but such persons should be advised that any goods they send addressed to individual members in Vietnam must go through the postal system at the denor's expense. In the past, embarrassment has been conced to the AIF by well meaning persons collecting goods at the request of numbers and then expecting the AMF to accept the responsibility for forwarding the donations th Victor

246 TRANSILISSILL OF SPIRITUOUS LIQUORS THROUGH THE POST

(a)

- Commonwealth of Australia Postal Regulations prohibit the transmission of inflarmable substances (including liquors) having a flash point of less than 80 degrees F. through the post,
- Investigation has revealed that spirituous liquors having a proof rating in excess of 85 Proof US or 74 UK come within this category and are therefore not to be transmitted by members through the post to Australia.
- There is no objection, however, to member posting spirituous liquors to Australia provided:
 - (a) They have a proof rating below the stipulated figures
 - (b) They are packed safely and in such a manner that damage will not result to other posted items should the bottle/bottles break
 - The number is prepared to pay any duty imposed by the Department of Customs and Excise (Customs concessions on spirituous liquors only apply when members are physically arriving in Australia).
- It should be noted that most spiritness liquors available in SVII are 40 within the approved limits.
- The proof rating is displayed on the lable of nost spirituous liquors 50 sold in Victneme Whore any doubt exists it is to be checked against the PX catalogue held in PX and ASCO establishments.

247. TRUCKS & TOU TECHLICAL LOADING - CARRIAGE OF PERSONNEL

To les extremely dangerous to carry passengers on the tray of & ten vehicles with platform trays. The maximum number of personnel which may be carried in these vehicles is two, including the driver. Under no circumstances are passengers to be carried on the tray.

280. REPORTING OF FAULTS/COMPLAINTS - EMU SWITCHBOARD

- 1. All telephone faults are to be reported to the Switchboard Supervisor (MMU 234). Reports to other members of Det 110 Sig Sqn will not be acknowledged or actioned.
- 2. The member reporting the fault is to give his name and the location of the faulty telephone. Once repaired, the line will be checked and reported in order by the Switchboard Supervisor.
- 3. Complaints are to be directed to 1 ALSG Communications Officer (EMU 233) during duty hours and to the Signals Duty Officer (EMU 236) at other times.

281. DANGER FROM UNEXPLODED SHELLS AND BOMBS

- 1. All personnel are warned of the dangers of driving a vehicle off the road or formed tracks in the 600 metre extension, i.e, that area outside the NORTH and STEPTOE gates immediately north of the main perimeter. This area is thickly strewn with unexploded shells and bombs of various types, and many are in a very dangerous fuzed condition.
- 2. The area is to be used for authorised military purposes only. Any suspicious objects should not be touched, but are to be reported immediately to the ATO, (EMU 166).

282. 1 ALSG SURF LIFE SAVING CLUB

- 1. The primary purpose of the 1 ALSG SLSC is to provide life saving measures on the Australian Beach, Vung Tau, on Sundays and at other times as required by HQ 1 ALSG.
- 2. Units are to release members whose names are notified in a weekly 1 ALSG signal. Where members cannot be released, the Club Captain should be notified in time to produce a substitute.
- 3. Timings for Beach Patrols on Sundays are:
 - a. 0800 hrs 1200 hrs.
 - b. 1200 hrs 1600 hrs.
- 4. Members are to report to respective Patrol Captains at the boatshed fifteen minutes before commencement of their tour of duty.

283. DAMAGE TO WATCHES WRIST GP

- 1. These watches are designed to be moisture proof only, and immersion allows entry of water into the case. Technical examination of watches damaged internally shows cases where they have been affected by both salt and fresh water.
- 2. Members are not to wear these watches while swimming or showering. RAEME are to classify watches damged internally by water as Not Fair Wear.

284. VISITORS TO 1 ALSG AREA

- 1. For security reasons access to the 1 ALSG area must be controlled. Except on duty or by invitation entry to the area by other than Australian or New Zealand servicemen in prohibited. The exception to this is the access permitted to US servicemen to the PX and Concessionaire shops in accordance with a reciprocal agreement.
- 2. The requirement for controlled access applies to the Peter Badooe Club area (including swimming pool) and the beach within the 1 ALSG boundaries. Access to both areas is controlled for security reasons. In addition access to the Peter Badooe Club area is restricted to prevent overtaxing the limited amenities facilities which are provided to meet the requirements of the Australian Force Vietnam.
- There is no objection to American visitors being invited into the 1 ALSG area whether it be to the Peter Badcoe Club, beach or unit messes, but at all times visitors are to be accompanied by their host (s) Except in special cases no member is to invite more than two visitors to the Peter Badcoe Club, swimming pool or beach. If special cases arise the necessary authority can be issued by any CO/OC, senior HQ 1 ALSG staff officer or HQ 1 ALSG duty officer o permit access the Peter Badcoe Club/Beach area, but the OC Amerities and Welfare Unit is to be informed accordingly. Some standing invitations to individuals or groups with which HQ 1 ALSG or units work closely will be issued on the authority of the Comd 1 ALSG. In these cases there is no requirement for the visitors to be accompanied by an Australian or New Zealand servicemen.
- 4. No officers or sergeants mess, or unit club or canteen in the

 1 ALSG area is an open mess. Visitors to messes/clubs must be accompanied
 by their hosts. "Blanket" invitations are not to be issued as these can
 give the impression that the mess or club is an "open" mess. The
 restrictions and courtersies regarding informal visits by officers and senior
 NCOs to unit clubs/canteens and officers to sergeants messes also apply
 to visiting American officers and senior NCOs.
