INSTRUCTIONS

AIM

1. The aim of a Commanders Diary is to provide data on which to base future improvements in Army training, equipment, organization and administration, and to furnish historians with a record of the activities of units and formations in operational and non-operational periods in peace and in war.

GENERAL

- 2. Entries are to be made daily on AF C 2118 (Adapted) each entry being initialled by the officer detailed to keep it.
- 3. Commanders Diaries will conform with the rules for drafting orders given in "Staff Duties (Australia)" Chapter 2, Section 12.

RESPONSIBILITY

During Non-operational Periods

4. A Commanders Diary is to be compiled by commanders of all formations.

During Operational Periods (1)

- 5. A Commanders Diary is to be compiled in duplicate by:
 - a. Commanders of all formations.
 - b. Each branch of the staff at formation headquarters commanded by a brigadier or above.
 - c. Heads of services not below the rank of lieutenant colonel.
 - d. Personal staffs and officers holding special appointments.
 - e. Unit commanders.
 - f. Commanders of a detachment of a unit when so ordered.

COMPILATION

- 6. Both original and duplicate copies are to consist of:
 - a. Cover (AF C 2119) (Adapted).
 - b. Index as printed on cover.
 - c. Narrative (AF C 2118) (Adapted).
 - d. Annexes as shown in the Index.
- 7. All details of the unit or formation (if a detachment is concerned, the name of the parent unit), period covered and enclosure numbers of the annexes are to be shown on the cover. If there has been a change of command since the last report, the date of assumption by the new commanding officer is to be included.
- 8. The annexes are to be assembled in the groups shown on the cover. If there are no enclosures for an annex NIL will be entered on the cover. If additional annexes are convenient for a particular headquarters, they should be grouped as annexes starting at B.

DISPOSAL

13. **Original Commander's Diary.** This is to be forwarded monthly, unless otherwise ordered, by the seventh day of the succeeding month direct to AHQ.

14. **Duplicate Commander's Diary.** This must be clearly marked as a duplicate. It is to be sent separately from the original to AHQ one month after the original has been despatched but not before the former has been acknowledged.

15. When overseas, both copies of diaries are to be sent through the Army Records organization in the overseas theatre but at different times.

16. **TOP SECRET Supplementary Diaries.**

a. The documents referred to in Paragraph 9 together with a list of them made out on AF C 2118 (Adapted) must be placed in separate cover (AF C 2119) (Adapted). All details must be filled in and the cover clearly marked in red: "ANNEX Z — OFFICER ONLY". It may be convenient to group the papers by appendices.

b. Supplementary diaries must be forwarded under the normal rules for TOP SECRET correspondence, to AHQ. The inner envelope must be plainly marked:

c. The duplicate supplementary diaries must be despatched as shown in Paragraph 14 as soon as receipt of the original has been acknowledged.

8. The narrative is to be written in the present tense. It is to be written in the first person plural. It is to be written in the past tense if the diary is written during a period of leave or absence.

350. MARKING OF BLINDS

1. During training activities all blinds are to be destroyed as early as practicable. Blinds are to be marked with a pyramid of three stakes whose vertex is directly above the blind. The base of each stick is to be at least three feet from the blind. The pyramid is to be secured with white tape and an AAF 21C sign bearing the words "Warning unexploded Projectiles" is to be fixed to one of the stakes. The pyramid is to be constructed at a safe distance from the blind and then placed in position.

351. THEFT OF LUGGAGE AT MASCOT

1. Provost Eastern Comd have recently reported thefts of luggage at Mascot Airport belonging to members returning to Australia from overseas. Commonwealth police and airlines advise that incidents of this nature are increasing and it is thought that an organised group may be operating in the Mascot Air Terminal area. It is also thought that persons may be masquerading as servicemen to facilitate the theft of pieces of luggage from servicemen returning from overseas.

2. This is apparently occurring after personnel have been cleared from customs and are still in the overseas terminal being processed by ECPD representatives, greeting relatives, etc. It is stressed that baggage at this stage is the responsibility of the member and that he should take care of it.

3. Needle parades are held Mondays and Saturdays at 1600 hrs.

4. The members are required to draw their IHC from the Ord Room and report to the hospital at the above timings on either of these days.

5. When innoculations are completed, members are to report to the Ord Room to have names checked off nominal rolls.

356. MISUSE OF FIRE FIGHTING EQUIPMENT

1. It has been noted that fire equipment, particularly fire buckets, are being misused throughout the depot. If this practice does not cease forthwith, section heads will be held responsible.

2. The 44 gallon drums used for water throughout the depot are being used for waste. These are to be emptied of waste immediately. They are to be painted red and clearly mark with "FIRE" on the outside.

3. In the event of any fire this ~~means~~ ~~of~~ ~~fire~~ ~~equipment~~ ~~would~~ ~~impair~~ capability of extinguishing the fire.

357. OUT OF BOUNDS

1. From the date of promulgation of this order all Storehouses and offices together with the area Clothing Store, Self Service Store and Q Store are out of bounds to all unauthorised personnel.

358. CLEANING AND ADJUSTMENT OF PERSONAL WEAPONS

1. It is a soldiers duty to clean his own weapon with the cleaning kit provided, and the QM holds replacement items such as Flannelette and Oil at the Q Store.
2. The cleaning facilities in the Armoury may be used to clean weapons, provided permission is obtained from the Storeholder R.S.G. or the Armourer.
3. The practice of taking personal weapons to the 2 AOB Armourer's Assistant for the purpose of cleaning is to cease immediately.
4. LOADED MAGAZINES will not be taken into the Armoury work area but placed on the Armoury office table until the tasks on the weapon have been completed.
5. If the weapon requires repairs of any nature the Armourer should be notified and he will assess and correct the fault. The Armourer's Vietnamese Assistant is not to be asked to assess and correct faults in weapons.

359. LOCAL LEAVE/CURFEW

1. With effect from 23 May 69:-
- a. Local leave may be granted from 0800 hrs to 2200 hrs daily.
- b. Late leave to FWMAF Establishments may only be granted by OC's to 2300 hrs. Personnel are to arrive within the 1 ALSG main gate by 2300 hrs.
- c. Curfew is now from 2300 hrs to 0600 hrs daily.
- d. This extension of LOCAL LEAVE/CURFEW will be subject to constant review, and in the main will depend in the main on the discipline/Venereal Disease problem.

360. AMATEUR RADIO OPERATION IN RVN

1. Amateur (Ham) radio operation by Australian personnel in RVN is prohibited. Unauthorised operation of a radio transmitter is a serious breach of communications discipline and will not be condoned.

361. OLD SCOTCH COLLEGIANS (MELBOURNE)

1. Scotch College Melbourne are compiling a roll of old boys who have taken part in the war in Vietnam and have requested assistance in this task.
2. Any old members are asked to contact the Orderly Room by 5 June 69.

362. SOCCER

1. Starting Mon 26 May 69, training sessions will be run on Mondays and Wednesdays. Transport will depart from the Arnold Club at 1710 hrs.
2. A scratch match with 17 Const Sqn is scheduled for Sunday 1st June. A team for this game will be selected in the coming week.
3. Anyone unable to attend training is to contact 2Lt Buick on EMU 224.

363. UNIT STAND DOWN DAY

1. Sunday 1st June 69, has been declared a total stand down day.

331. R & R CARRIAGE OF MEDICINES AND TABLETS

1. Advice has been received from HQ AFV that cases have occurred where US Customs Military Police at Camp Alpha have confiscated medicines, tablets, etc., which had been issued to soldiers to continue treatment whilst on R&R.
2. Any soldier who is required to take any medicines, tablets, etc., on R & R should be warned to obtain a medical certificate authorising this prior to departure from unit area.

332. APPROVED EATING PLACES

1. Following restaurants are declared suitable eating places for Australian and N.Z. personnel:-

Anberge Des Roches Voures - French Restaurant (French Beach)

Garden of Eden (Light House Hill)

Ly Ly Bar No.2

Au Favori

2. For health reasons members of 1 ALSG are advised not to eat at civilian restaurants in Vung Tau other than those named above.

333. MARRIAGE BETWEEN SERVICE PERSONNEL AND ASIAN NATIONALS

1. Any member of 2 AOD or attached person who is contemplating marriage to an Asian National is to consult the OC 2 AOD before proceeding with such a marriage.
2. The above consultation is necessary to ensure that service personnel are made fully aware of the administrative procedures involved in processing such a marriage.

334. SECURITY OF WEAPONS

1. A weapon recently went missing from the weapon rack at a unit mess in this area and subsequent investigation revealed that the rack was not visible from within the mess.

2. Section Heads are to ensure that all weapons depositories in their areas are made as secure as possible by virtue of their locations, and by surveillance.

335. AFV DENTENTION BARRACKS

Location

1. The AFV Dentention Barracks, which was officially opened on 26 May 67 is located in the 1 ALSG area, Vung Tau.

Bounds

2. The area of the AFV Dentention Barracks is out of bounds to all personnel unless permission for entry has been granted by the Commandant.

336. "FIVE WAY" TRAFFIC CIRCLE

1. Vietnamese traffic laws require that vehicles turning at, or by-passing a traffic circle must keep to the right of the circle.

2. Drivers of AMF vehicles are to abide by Vietnamese traffic laws when driving past the "five ways" traffic circle.

337. TRANSPORT-CIVILIAN LABOUR

1. All civilian employees working on the late shift are to be transported by vehicle from their place of work or unit orderly room, to the main gate guard room on completion of their shift.

2. No civilian employee is to move outside 2 AOD after 1900 hrs unless travelling in an army vehicle, or else with a soldier.

338. MOVEMENTS - MFO BOXES

1. The aim of this instruction is to detail the procedures and entitlements for the despatch of personal effects through the Military Forwarding Organization (MFO).

2. The MFO is a service provided within the Army Movement Control organization by which unaccompanied baggage of members on reposting or discharge may be consigned.

3. The following consignments may be handled by the MFO.

- a. Excess baggage of a member travelling by air.

- b. Unaccompanied baggage.

4. The following items are NOT to be handled or included in packages despatch through the MFO.

- a. Weapons

- b. Ammunition, explosives or any items of an inflammable nature.

- c. Alcoholic beverages of every description.

- d. Pornographic material

- e. Any item containing information of a security nature.

- f. Soiled items.

- g. Letters and parcels within the scope of the postal service.

5. Each member is entitled to consign through the MFO a total of 334 lbs but no one package is to exceed 112 lbs or 5 cubic ft. (a truck cabin metal measures 5 cubic ft)

6. No consignment under 22 pounds will be accepted, except deceased effects.
7. Normally items are not accepted until a posting order is received or the member has been warned for RTA.
8. Consignments are to be inspected by an officer or senior NCO to ensure the prohibited items as defined in para 4.
9. A certificate of Safety and Cleanliness is to be signed by the Inspecting Officer or NCO.
10. Consignments of MFO for Australia may be despatched by RAAF C130 if space is available or by chartered or Army shipping.
11. The consignment should be packed in a container of substantial strength. It is advisable to wrap the contents in some form of waterproof material.
12. Each package must be banded, wired or locked. If locked, one key should be forwarded to the receiving MFO in Aust to facilitate customs inspections.
13. For the members own convenience it is advisable to include an inventory in each package and retain a copy himself.
14. All consignments are received under bond into Australia.
15. When cleared by customs the consignments may be delivered under arrangements of 10 MC Gp or collected by the member.
16. Some delay in delivery of personnel effects lodged for movement from SVN must be expected as:-
 - a. MFO is low priority cargo on aircraft.
 - b. Shipping takes time.
 - c. Customs usually takes some time to clear consignments.
17. In the event of apparent loss of personal effects or delay in delivery the member should:
 - a. If in Aust
Request "tracer action" through his new unit or det of 10 MC Gp in his Comd.
 - b. If still in SVN
Request "tracer action" through the appropriate det of 11 MC Gp.
18. Any member who requires more information or who wishes to despatch an MFO box is to contact the Ord Room.

339. NATIONAL SERVICE OBLIGATION ON DISCHARGE FROM FULL TIME DUTY

1. Any NSM who is not fully aware of his obligations for service in the RAR, RAER or CMF on completion of 2 years effective service is to see 2Lt BUICK.

340. CURRENCY EXCHANGE FOR PERSONNEL PROCEEDING ON RTA OR R AND R TO AUSTRALIA

1. The current policy on currency exchanges for personnel proceeding on RTA or R & R to Australia, and arrangements for pay on arrival in Australia are:

- a. Currency issued in theatre prior to departure is not to exceed \$9 Australian.
- b. "US Green" currency is not to be issued to supplement the issue of Australian Dollars.
- c. Excess MPC held by the member is to be deposited to the members paybook prior to departure from the unit.
- d. Comd Paymaster E-Comd will provide pay facilities at Sydney Airport.

341. CORRECT POSTAL ADDRESS

1. It is essential that members use the correct AFV address and inform correspondent that any omission of any part of the address can result in delays and possibly non delivery.
2. The correct address for members is:
 - a. Number, Rank, Name.
 - b. Unit/Sub Unit
 - c. AUST FPO (1, 3 or 4 as appropriate).
 - d. C/O GPO SYDNEY
 - e. NSW 2890

342. BOUNDS - REGISTRY

1. The 2 AOD Registry is a RESTRICTED area and is OUT OF BOUNDS at all times to all personnel other than those employed in that section. All queries and transactions to be carried out with the Registry staff will be conducted from the window space provided.
2. Disciplinary action will be taken against offenders who violate this order.

343. UNAUTHORISED DISCHARGE OF WEAPONS AND FIREARMS

1. Any member who negligently, or wilfully in breach of an order or his military duty, discharges or causes the discharge of any weapon is to be charged irrespective of his rank. He is not to RTA until the charge has been heard and concluded.
2. Care is to be taken that the charge is laid properly according to the circumstances in each case. When necessary charges are to be drafted by legal officers.
3. HQ AFV is to be advised of the result of disciplinary action in each case.
4. When an investigation is deemed necessary, the Investigating Officer's report is to be submitted to HQ AFV within 5 days after the incident. An investigation is to be ordered in every case where any member is injured by an unauthorized discharge. An SIB investigation is to be made at once any case where it is suspected that there is a possibility of any such injury having been inflicted wilfully.
5. No disciplinary action or act which may amount to condonation is to be taken, or done, in respect of any member who, it is suspected, has wilfully wounded himself or another member by an unauthorized discharge, until the Investigating Officer's report has been considered by COMAFV and he has given his direction.



312. USE OF DUTY VEHICLE

314. GAMBLING

1. Gambling in a camp, or other military premises, or on any ship, aircraft or vehicle carrying troops is forbidden. Gambling includes bookmaking and acting as an agent for a bookmaker.

315. REPORTING OF VEHICLE ACCIDENTS

1. From the date of promulgation of this order any vehicle accident involving vehicles or personnel of 2 AOD are to be reported immediately to the person authorising the use of the vehicle, ie, NCO I/C Cpl or Tpt Sgt.
2. All cases of accidents involving Local Nationals or personnel of other nations are to be immediately reported to the OO Admin.

316. SECURITY

1. At 1715 hrs each day the Duty Sgt is to lock all external doors of the Headquarter and Control Office building.

2. The practice of using the HQ Building as a thoroughfare is forbidden.
3. Personnel entering the HQ Building after 1700 hrs daily for any reason are to use the Duty Room entrance.
4. Entry into Control Office is to be made by door opposite Duty Room.

317. HAIRCUTS

1. It has become apparent that hair is being cut too infrequently. Section Commanders are to ensure that all members have their hair cut often enough to maintain a neat and tidy appearance.

1. The YMCA are seeking persons who:-
 - a. Can play a musical instrument/s.
 - b. Who have played a musical instrument.
 - c. Those who would like to learn to play a musical instrument.

319. VOLLEY BALL

1. A new competition commences 18 May 69.
2. Any person wishing to play is to contact Cpl DAY on EMU 22 by 12 May 69.

320. SAFETY - MT OPERATION

1. Prior to moving off after a prolonged halt, all drivers are to check around and under their vehicle to ensure that the vehicle may proceed without injury to persons or animals or damage to property.
2. Members of 1 ALSG are not to position themselves, for shade or shelter, under any vehicle.

321. WEARING OF MEDAL RIBBONS

References: MBIs 102-2, 3, 4 and 5.

1. It was noted on Anzac Day that not all members of the Force are cognizant of the correct sequence in which medal ribbons should be worn. They are to be worn in the following order:
 - a. British Commonwealth honours and awards in order of seniority;
 - b. British Commonwealth campaign stars and medals in order of receipt;
 - c. Medals for long service and good conduct, for example MSM, LS and GCM, ED; and
 - d. Foreign awards.
2. The United Nations Medal for Korea is not classified as a foreign award but all other UN medals are. The Vietnamese Campaign Medal is a foreign award.
3. An example of the above would be a soldier who had served in Korea and Vietnam and who had been awarded the LS and GCM. He would wear his ribbons in the following order;

Korea Medal
United Nations Medal
Vietnam Medal
Long Service and Good Conduct Medal
Vietnamese Campaign Medal

322. COUNTERFEIT MPC

Counterfeit ten dollar military payment certificate (MPC) notes have appeared in the Tan Son Nhut, Saigon area. All personnel are cautioned to be alert for these notes:

a. Distinctive features of the note are as follows:

(1) Front (face) of note.

(a) The letter "B" at the beginning of the serial number as it appears in the lower right hand corner of the bill is approximately 1/16 of an inch above the numbers. Series 661, serial No. B033137358.

(b) In the center of a ten dollar MPC note there is a design resembling arrow heads pointing toward the right margin of the note. On the legitimate MPC note the four center designs are bright red, on the counterfeit note they are pale orange.

(2) Reverse (back) of note.

(a) On the reverse side approximately 1/3 of the way from the left margin there are eight flower type designs approximately 3/8 of an inch wide. The center three designs on a legitimate note are bright red. On the counterfeit note they are pale orange.

(b) On the reverse side there also appears a female profile. On a legitimate note her colour is orange; on the counterfeit notes the color is very pale.

(3) The MPC notes in question are new and with the exception of the above, the coloring, design and quality of paper is good.


