

TRAINING REPORT FOR MONTH OF SEPTEMBER

Reference HQ Australian Army Force unregistered memo dated 20 Jul 64-A 111 IAA Bty RAA 234-4-4 dated 30 Aug 64 -B

- 1. No training has taken place this month apart from that which was integral to the road move of part of the battery to and from CHINA ROCK. There was no chance to conduct firing at CHINA ROCK as that part of the battery there, was recalled to the station before firing any rounds.
- It was necessary that the troop, left behind at BUTTERWORTH to man eight guns, remaining deployed during the absence of the main part of the strength of the battery at CHINA ROCK. These guns were put at four hours notice and the troop would not have been able to cope with the number of tasks involved in the time given.

ADMINISTRATION

- There are two problems which have become evident this month that of cell batteries and the resupply of spares for guns, vehicles and radios.
- From the experience gained this month it is considered necessary, particularly now the battery may be staying for an indefinite period, that we hold one month's supply of batteries for the AN/PRC 9A sets purely for operational use. These could be turned over as training and maintenance supplies arrive. Indents to put this into effect are being submitted.
- The battery has now, to all intents and purposes, exhausted the 60 days holdings of spares brought with it. To date, in so far as is known, the items for spares backing have not arrived at SINGAPORE. Any spares required in order to keep guns operational have had to be flown in from AUSTRALIA. It is recommended that action be taken to expedite the arrival of our spares backing in the theatre.
