COMMANDERS DIARIES
INSTRUCTIONS

AIM

1. The aim of a Commanders Diary is to provide data on which to base future improvements in Army training, equipment, organization and administration, and to furnish historians with a record of the activities of units and formations in operational and non-operational periods in peace and in war.

GENERAL

2. Entries are to be made daily on AF C 2118 (Adapted) each entry being initialled by the officer detailed to keep it.

3. Commanders Diaries will conform with the rules for drafting orders given in "Staff Duties (Australia)", Chapter 2, Section 12.

RESPONSIBILITY

During Non-operational Periods

4. A Commanders Diary is to be compiled by commanders of all formations.

During Operational Periods (1)

- 5. A Commanders Diary is to be compiled in duplicate by:
 - a. Commanders of all formations.
 - b. Each branch of the staff at formation headquarters commanded by a brigadier or above.
 - c. Heads of services not below the rank of lieutenant colonel.
 - d. Personal staffs and officers holding special appointments.
 - e. Unit commanders.
 - f. Commanders of a detachment of a unit when so ordered.

COMPILATION

- 6. Both original and duplicate copies are to consist of:
 - a. Cover (AF C 2119) (Adapted).
 - b. Index as printed on cover.
 - c. Narrative (AF C 2118) (Adapted).
 - d. Annexes as shown in the Index.
- 7. All details of the unit or formation (if a detachment is concerned, the name of the parent unit), period covered and enclosure numbers of the annexes are to be shown on the cover. If there has been a change of command since the last report, the date of assumption by the new commanding officer is to be included.
- 8. The annexes are to be assembled in the groups shown on the cover. If there are no enclosures for an annex NIL will be entered on the cover. If additional annexes are convenient for a particular headquarters, they should be grouped as annexes starting at B.

DISPOSAL

13. **Original Commander's Diary.** This is to be forwarded monthly, unless otherwise ordered, by the seventh day of the succeeding month direct to AHQ.

14. **Duplicate Commander's Diary.** This must be clearly marked as a duplicate. It is to be sent separately from the original to AHQ one month after the original has been despatched but not before the former has been acknowledged.

15. When overseas, both copies of diaries are to be sent through the Army Records organization in the overseas theatre but at different times.

16. **TOP SECRET Supplementary Diaries.**

a. The documents referred to in Paragraph 9 together with a list of them made out on AF C 2118 (Adapted) must be placed in separate cover (AF C 2119) (Adapted). All details must be filled in and the cover clearly marked in red: "ANNEX Z — OFFICER ONLY". It may be convenient to group the papers by appendices.

b. Supplementary diaries must be forwarded under the normal rules for TOP SECRET correspondence, to AHQ. The inner envelope must be plainly marked:



HQ 1 ALSG Administrative Instruction 4/66

HYGIENE OF 1 ALSG AREAGeneral

1. Units of 1 ALSG are to maintain a high standard of hygiene in their areas. In achieving and maintaining this standard, the recommendations of the 1 ALSG Hygiene Warrant Officer are to be implemented without question or hesitation. In this regard all matters of hygiene policy are to be referred by the Hygiene Warrant Officer to the DAA & QMG HQ 1 ALSG.

Dumping of Rubbish

2. All units, with the exception of 17 Const Sqn, will dump rubbish during specified hours in one central rubbish dump or tip established and located as directed by HQ 1 ALSG. Any changes in location of this tip will be notified to units separately. 17 Const Sqn may establish and maintain its own tip, because of its particular location, as long as its standard of hygiene is to the satisfaction of HQ 1 ALSG.

Hours of Operation of Rubbish Tip

3. Units may dump rubbish in the 1 ALSG tip between 0730 hrs and 1530 hrs each day. The dumping of rubbish outside these hours is strictly prohibited.

Operation of Rubbish Tip

4. The supervision of the operation of the tips is the responsibility of the 1 ALSG Hygiene Warrant Officer assisted by any qualified Hygiene NCO of 2 Fd Amb who may be made available by that unit from time to time.

5. 17 Const Sqn is responsible for the construction and maintenance of any 1 ALSG Rubbish Tip which is established. In this regard, in particular, this unit is to provide a bulldozer for a short period on a daily basis to smash or grind flat the contents of the tip. This "daily grind" by this piece of equipment is to be performed prior to the opening of the rubbish tip each morning before 0730 hrs. This operation is essential as it not only ensures a far longer useage period of the tip by reducing the space occupied by rubbish, but offers less enticement to local "tipsters" as they find it far more difficult to extract charred but dainty morsals from flattened tins than unblemished cylindrical ones.

Duties of 1 ALSG Hygiene Warrant Officer

6. The duties of this Warrant Officer are attached as Annex "A" to this instruction.

Unit Hygiene Diaries

7. Each unit is to maintain a Unit Hygiene Diary. The area Hygiene Warrant Officer is to carry out a hygiene inspection of each unit of 1 ALSG at least once weekly. He is to record this inspection in the unit diary together with comments resulting from his inspection. The results of these inspections are also to be recorded by the Hygiene Warrant Officer and passed to the DAA & QMG HQ 1 ALSG, together with comments regarding the maintenance of Hygiene Diaries by units.

Area Hygiene Duties

8. Units of 1 ALSG are to provide personnel for area hygiene duties on a roster basis to report to the Hygiene Warrant Officer at the 1 ALSG Rubbish Tip daily at 0730 hrs. These personnel are to remain on duty each day until 1630 hrs or until released by the Hygiene Warrant Officer. The Hygiene Warrant Officer is to ensure that these duty personnel "stagger"

their meal times during the lunch period so that the Rubbish Tip is not left unattended between 0730 hrs and 1630 hrs.

Roster of units

9. Units are rostered and grouped in the following manner to provide personnel for area hygiene duties:

x 10. The tour of duty of each groups of units/dets is from 0730 hrs each Monday until 1630 hrs approximately on the following Sunday. Units are to make every endeavour to provide the same personnel on each occasion that they are rostered to provide these duties. A roster of units on the above basis is to be published regularly in 1 ALSG RO's Part 1.

Security of Rubbish Tip

11. Local Vietnamese inhabitants are not permitted to enter the 1 ALSG area at or adjacent to the tip. One of the duties of the rostered unit hygiene personnel is to ensure that local inhabitants do not enter this area and gain access to the tip. The Hygiene Warrant Officer is to ensure that all rostered hygiene personnel at the rubbish tip are aware of this fact and any laxity in this regards will be considered an offence.

Provision of Fuel


12. 1 Coy RAASC is responsible to ensure that sufficient DIESO is available at the rubbish tip as requested by the Hygiene Warrant Officer and that empty drums are removed from the immediate vicinity.

Safety

13. The Hygiene Warrant Officer is to ensure that all unit hygiene personnel under his supervision are warned of the dangers of injury when handling POL products in the discharge of their duties and will instruct them in the use of these products.

Conclusion

14. All unit and detachment commanders are reminded that it is their responsibility and the responsibility of all officers and NCO's to maintain the highest possible standards of hygiene both personal and communal.

DUTIES OF THE HYGIENE WARRANT OFFICER

The duties of the 1 ALSG Hygiene Warrant Officer are listed as follows:

He is

- a. Responsible to the DAA & QMG and SMO for all matters relating to unit hygiene in ALSG units.
- b. To carry out periodic inspections of all units in the area and to record such inspections in Unit Hygiene Diaries.
- c. To supervise water purification arrangements.
- d. To advise on and supervise the construction of improvised field sanitary appliances.
- e. To inspect the area for actual or potential fly and mosquito breeding sites and arrange for these to be appropriately dealt with.
- f. To supervise the area garbage disposal tip.
- g. To supervise insecticidal spraying and ensure that all necessary safety precautions are observed.
- h. To inspect foodstuffs to ensure that they are suitable for consumption and do not present a danger to health, and that the arrangements for food preparation, cooking and serving comply with Army Health requirements.
- i. To carry out such other duties relating to Army Health matters as may be delegated to him by the DAA & QMG or SMO.

REST AND RECREATIONAL LEAVE (R AND R)General

1. All members of the Australian Military Forces serving in SOUTH VIETNAM are entitled to one five day Rest and Recreational period out of country. Units are informed that no circumstances will interfere with this entitlement.
2. Destinations are at present HONG KONG, BANGKOK, and, after 1 Sep 66, SINGAPORE. It is expected that other destinations will be added to the list later. These, as they come to hand, will be notified in 1 ALSG ROs.

Allocation of Vacancies

3. The allocation of vacancies is handled by HQ AFV, and will be notified to units by this HQ as they come to hand.

Unit Action on Receipt of Allocation

4. On receipt of an allocation for R and R, units are to offer vacancies to unit members in order of priority as decided by the unit CO/OC.
5. Units will then complete the pro forma shown at Annex A in quadruplicate, and submit three copies to HQ 1 ALSG. The fourth copy is to be retained for unit records. The pro forma is to be submitted to HQ 1 ALSG as soon as possible after receipt of the R and R allocation.
6. A separate pro forma is to be submitted for:
 - a. Each month.
 - b. Each R and R Centre.
7. Units are to ensure that allotted vacancies are filled.
8. If for any reason units are unable to fulfil their allocation, details of same should be advised as soon as possible so that alternative arrangements can be made to ensure allotted seats are filled.

Documentation

9. Members proceeding on R and R are to be in possession of:
 - a. Identity Card.
 - b. Current International Health Certificate.
10. The Identity Card is to be carried at all times whilst the member is on R and R leave, but is not to be carried in the member's wallet, or in the same pocket as the wallet.
11. The International Health Certificate must be correctly maintained, and is to be checked by a Medical Officer at least one week before departure. The member is to ensure that he carries his International Health Certificate with him whilst proceeding on R and R.
12. Personnel who report to SAIGON Airport without their Identity Card and/or International Health Certificate will be returned to their units.

Currency

13. Personnel for R and R from 1 ATF and 1 ALSG are to change their MPC
/ to US..

to US dollars (US "GREEN") at 1 Div Cash Office, 1 ALSG area.

14. Units are to note on each members WF 226 (Application to Draw Pay) that:

- a. The member is proceeding on R and R leave.
- b. Date of departure from SAIGON.
- c. R and R destination.
- d. the following "PAYMENT TO BE MADE IN US DOLLARS".

15. The WF 226 is to be signed by the members OC or unit Adjt only.

16. On return from R and R leave, personnel will change their US dollars to MPC at 1 Div Cash Office.

17. It is noted that members will not be permitted to board the R and R aircraft at SAIGON with less than one hundred dollars US (\$100 US).

Dress

18. All members are to travel on R and R flights in uniform. Hat: utility green is not acceptable headgear.

19. At their destinations, members are to wear civilian clothes on R and R, carrying Identity Cards at all times in accordance with para 10.

Movement

20. Movement from VUNG TAU to SAIGON will be on the morning of the date of departure from SAIGON.

21. Movement instructions will be notified, as required, from this HQ.

Procedure on Arrival SAIGON

22. Personnel on R and R are to report to the Australian R and R Warrant Officer (at present WO2 J. COTTER, of HQ AFV) at the Civilian Terminal, Tan Son Nhut for travel orders, a check of International Health Certificates, Identity Cards and briefing.

23. The R and R WO will feed personnel into the US R and R system for movement to their leave destinations.

24. On return from R and R, members are to report to the Aust R and R WO for details of their movement to 1 ALSG area.

Procedure on Arrival R and R Destination


25. On arrival at R and R destinations, United States R and R authorities will:

- a. Change US dollars to local currency.
- b. Give full local briefings, including a medical and hygiene brief.
- c. Distribute detailed local brochures.
- d. Arrange accommodation in the US R and R Centre, and/or recommended hotels.

26. Members may stay in accommodation other than that recommended, provided they report to the US R and R authorities at the correct time for return movement to VIETNAM

118. FORECAST REINFORCEMENT DEMANDS

- a. Forecast Reinforcement Demands for OR due for RTA during the month of October 66 are due HQ 1 ALSG by 15 Jul 66.
- b. Forecast Reinforcement Demands for officers due for RTA during the month of December 66 are due HQ 1 ALSG by 15 Jul 66.

119. GENERATORS AND ELECTRICAL DISTRIBUTION SYSTEMS

- a. The installation of generators and electrical distribution systems is the responsibility of RAE.
- b. The manning of power houses and generator sheds is not an engineer task and engineer tradesman will not be used for these tasks.
- c. The repair of generators is a unit or area matter to be undertaken by the appropriate EME workshop. RAE will make any necessary repairs to the lines.

120. REFRIGERATION

- a. RAE are responsible for the repair of refrigerators but NOT the fuel motors that drive them.
- b. The repair of engines driving 1000, 300 and 100 cubic foot refrigerators is an EME responsibility and the normal process of EME repair should be followed.

121. DRAWING OF WATER FROM 1 ALSG WATER POINT

Water may be drawn daily from the 1 ALSG Water Point at the following times:

0700 - 1000 hrs
1400 - 1700 hrs

122. POSTAL TIMINGS

- a. Closing times for outgoing mail from AFPO 3 are:
 - (1) Class 1 mail (letters etc)
0800 hrs Mon to Sat (there is no clearance on Sundays).
 - (2) Class 2 mail (parcels)
1000 hrs each Sat.
- b. All members are reminded of the importance of correct packaging of parcels. It is better to sacrifice weight for security. Advice maybe obtained from AFPO 3 on this matter.

123. POSTAL FACILITIES - EXPLOSIVES

- a. It is both a civil and military offence to dispatch explosives through the mail.
- b. The PMG have been requested to advise AFPO 3 of the names and units of all offenders.
- c. All ranks are to be made aware of the repercussions if this practice continues. The postal and customs authorities will be forced to open all packages from Australian service men overseas, with a resultant heavy delay on the delivery of such packets and parcels. This delay could be up to 1 or 2 months.
- d. There is also the associated danger of such explosives detonating in transit of at the recipients home.

124. R AND C LEAVE

- a. R & C leave (in country) has been reduced from 7 to 5 days with effect from 17 Jul 66.
- b. The ALSG allocation of vacancies has also been reduced to 5 per week.
- c. It is anticipated that the capacity of the R & C Centre will be increased to 90 beds. When this eventuates, the ALSG weekly allocation is to be 13.

125. MOVEMENT OF PERSONNEL VUNG TAU - TAN SON NHUT

- a. Commencing 11 Jul, units are required to submit bids for movement VUNG TAU - TAN SON NHUT to det 11 MC Gp 48 hours prior to the time the flight is required on the proforma shown at Annex A.
- b. Det 11 MC Gp, will inform units as soon as flight details have been confirmed.
- c. Members will report to 8 Aerial Port Det USAF, in accordance with reporting instructions.

127. REMITTANCE OF MONEY TO AUSTRALIAa. Cash remittance

- (1) Members may remit monies, not exceeding \$100 (Aust) per month, to civilians or serving members in AUSTRALIA.
- (2) Monies in excess of this amount require the permission of the CO/OC of the member's unit.
- (3) Method - the member is to submit an "Application for Remittance of Cash" (WF 131A) in duplicate with the cash to his unit pay representative or serving paymaster.

(4) Average time for the monies to be paid out in AUSTRALIA is 6 to 14 days.

b. Remittance of undrawn pay

(1) Any portion up to four fifths of the balance of undrawn pay showing in a member's paybook may be remitted by the member to a civilian, or another serving member or to a bank account in AUSTRALIA.

(2) Method - the member is to submit an 'Application for Remittance of Undrawn Pay' (WF 131) in duplicate to his CO/OC for signature through the unit pay representative.

(3) Average time for the monies to be paid in AUSTRALIA is 21 days.

c. For unit pay representatives

(1) FIs for the PMF, Part 5, Para 233 - 235 refers.

(2) All applications may be forwarded daily, repeat daily, to the Cash Office

128. MAGNIFYING GLASSES AND MIRRORS

The use of privately owned magnifying glasses (not spectacles) and magnifying mirrors (eg concave shaving mirrors) is prohibited due to the associated fire risk and are to be disposed of immediately.

129. REGLIGION

All units are to submit to the Chaplains C/- Chapel a list of all HEBREW members in their units by 1600 hrs on the 13 Jul 66. Nil returns are required.

130. LOCAL LEAVE

a. Local leave may be granted by COs/OCs units/dets from 1800 hrs to 2359 hrs Mon - Fri and Sun, and 1800 hrs to 0100 hrs Sat.

b. Local leave may also be granted in particular cases by COs/OCs units/dets during daylight hours to soldiers on night shift work. Leave is to cease at least 2 hours prior to resumption of duty.

c. A Leave Pass proforma will be issued by HQ 1 ALSG to all personnel proceeding on normal leave. This pass will be handed in to the unit Orderly Room on return from leave. Any person found on leave without a pass in his possession may anticipate disciplinary action.

d. It is the responsibility of COs/OCs of units/dets granting daylight leave to ensure that members are issued with a leave pass stating times and date leave is granted from and to.


131. CURFEW

11502 Capt W.WEIR, Chief Instructor of the Linguist Course currently being conducted in the 1 ALSG area is granted the powers of a Company Commander for purposes of discipline.

134. CLEANLINESS OF DRINKING CONTAINERS

a. Drinking containers that are cooled on unpotable ice are to be washed in potable water before the contents are consumed.

b. Units with Messes/Canteens are to ensure this practice is commenced immediately.

135. ACCOUNTING FOR LOST AND REPLACEMENT IDENTITY CARDS (AAF A129) (MBI 212-5)

a. All losses of Identity Cards are to be investigated at unit level in accordance with MBI 212-5, para 12 (a), and reports submitted to HQ 1 ALSG. Where necessary, disciplinary action is to be taken by unit COs/OCs.

b. When losses are reported by units, replacements cards are to be issued by HQ 1 ALSG. The issue of these cards will be controlled by the SC"A", HQ 1 ALSG.

c. When lost Identity Cards are found, they are to be delivered to the SC"A", HQ 1 ALSG. If replacement cards have already been issued, the old cards are to be destroyed in accordance with para 11 of the MBI.

136. LAYING OF RAT POISON

a. It is intended to lay rat bait in unit areas with rodent infestation. The bait is to be laid in containers to be manufactured by 2 Fd Amb. The Area Hygiene representative will supervise the use of the bait.

b. The laying of rat bait is a second line of defence only in rodent control, and units should be aware that proper garbage disposal and kitchen sanitation will minimize rodent immigration and breeding.



b. VIETNAMESE postage stamps can not be used on postal articles lodged with AFPO 3. If it is desired to have VIETNAMESE postage stamps cancelled by AFPO 3, this may be done provided the correct postage in Aust stamps is also affixed.

c. There is still a quantity of incorrectly addressed mail being received at AFPO 3 for members of the AUSTRALIAN Force. The result is a delay in delivery to the addressee, and in some cases this mail has to be returned to the dead letter office in AUSTRALIA. Units should ensure that all members know their correct address, including the correct name of the unit. This particularly applies to reinforcements.


