



### 167. CONTAMINATION OF WATER SUPPLIES BY ARSENIC WEED KILLER

- The use of sodium arsenite for agricultural and horticultural purposes is legal and is practised in MALAYA:
  - (a) As a spray to kill lallang
  - (b) As a paint to kill rubber trees.
- 2. Warning notices are normally put up at the boundaries of treated areas. These should not be moved until the area has been cleansed by a heavy rainfall.
- 3. In dealing with any poisonous substance accidents can occur and recently contamination of water by arsenic due to spraying with sodium arsenite have been reported.

- 4. The following points should be noted:-
  - (a) Water will not be taken for drinking purposes inside an area where arsenic spraying is being carried out unless it has been certified as free from chemical poison by a Medical Officer.
  - (b) On estates where there is a normal bulk water supply ascertain from the manager of the estate where spraying is taking place and the possible danger to the water supply.
  - (c) If there is dead lallang on the banks of a stream or if labourers are spraying in the area the water from the stream should not be used for drinking purposes.
  - (d) To keep a look out for the notices which state that poisonous spraying is taking place.
  - (e) That boiling the water or treating by ordinary means will not remove poisons.
- 5. RO 147/61 is cancelled.

### 168. SECURITY OF ARMS AND AMMUNITION

- 1. Arms and ammunition once withdrawn from unit or sub unit central custody (eg., Arms Kote, armoury or Q Store) becomes the personal responsibility of the individual to whom they are issued from such central custody until properly returned.
- 2. Individuals drawing weapons and ammunition from central custody will acknowledge receipt by signature, first ensuring that they have actually drawn the identical weapon and the number of rounds for which they are to sign.
- Any member of 1 RAR discovering the loss of arms and/or ammunition on issue to him or to any other member of sub unit, will immediately report the loss by the quickest means to him Company Headquarters.
- 4. An individual who is responsible for the loss, through negligence, of arms will normally be tried by Court Martial. Loss of ammunition is a less serious offence, provided an immediate report is made. The most stringent action will be taken where unreported losses are subsequently discovered.
- 5. RO 148/61 is cancelled.

### 169. DISCIPLINE CARRYING OF FIRE ARMS OR EXPLOSIVES.

1. The civil law in the Federation of Malaya in respect of unauthorised carriage or possession of arms, explosives, etc., is as follows:-

Under Sections 4 and 5 of the Carrying of Arms Ordnance, 1947, the Death penalty or penal servitude for life may be imposed for carrying and using, or carrying and attempting to use, firearms in the commission of certain offences. It is also an offence, punishable with 10 years penal servitude for a person to be unlawfully in possession of a firearm.

- 2. All ranks are therefore forbidden:-
  - (a) To carry or to be in possession of any private firearm, ammunition or explosives whether serviceable or otherwise unless the possessor holds a current licence granted by the civil authorities for the said firearm, ammunition or explosive.
  - (b) To carry or to be in possession of any service firearm, ammunition or explosives or any kind except when on or in connection with a specific duty or when ordered by the appropriate service authority.

### 73. INCOME TAX, SPECIAL ALLOWANCE PAYABLE TO MEMBERS IN MALAYA.

- 1. The Department of the Preasury has advised that Malaya allowance is assessable income within the meaning of the Income and Social Services Contribution Act 1938-1959 and as such must be disclosed on income tax returns.
- 2. Although Malaya allowance must be included in Personal Returns of Incomes the Treasury has advised that under extra-statutory powers a special remission of tax will be authorised for the amount of Malaya allowance.
- For this purpose the Commissioner of Taxation requires that amounts received in the nature of Malaya allowance be shown on page 2 of Income Tax Returns, immediately below Item 4 as Item 4(a) "Malaya Allowance subject to special remission of tax". The amount so disclosed is to be carried into the column headed "Gross Income" and included in Total Income.
- 4. The amount received by way of Malaya allowance will appear in Column 3 of Members' Taxation Group Certificates.
- 5. To establish taxable income in these cases the Taxation Department will calculate, separately, tax payable with Malaya allowance included and excluded to determine the amount due for remission. With this in mind members so affected need not complete the "Calculation of Tax by Taxpayer" on page 1 of income tax returns.

### SPECIAL ORDER BY BRIGADIER F.G. HASSETT DSO MVO OBE

The following is a copy of Special Order by Brigadier F.G. HASSETT DSO MVO ORE.

" On 2 June 1961 I carried out a final inspection of the track built by the Brigade over the past nine months between KUALA RUI and KAMPONG DELTA and a few days later the last working party was withdrawn.

The task involved the clearance of 25 miles of track, the construction of some 60 timber bridges, culver's and fords and the establishment of a ferry over the SUNGEI PERAK. In the latter stages the effort spent in keeping the track in good repair was sonsiderable and the troops often worked under trying conditions far from water.

The task of building this track was originally planned to give support to OPERATION BAMBOO. At the same time the Government of the Federation became interested in the project as being likely to assist them in Rural Development and although the track has as yet not been used operationally it will be of considerable value in the development of the area.

The troops engaged on this task have been drawn from 1/3 E ANGLIAN, 1 RAR 2 NZ Regt and 11 Indep Fd Sqn RE, and assistance was given for a time by the Gurkha Engineers. I would like to thank and congratulate them all on a task well done".
