COMMANDERS DIARIES INSTRUCTIONS

AIM

1. The aim of a Commanders Diary is to provide data on which to base future improvements in Army training, equipment, organization and administration, and to furnish historians with a record of the activities of units and formations in operational and non-operational periods in peace and in war.

GENERAL

2. Entries are to be made daily on AF C 2118 (Adapted) each entry being initialled by the officer detailed to keep it.
3. Commanders Diaries will conform with the rules for drafting orders given in "Staff Duties (Australia)", Chapter 2, Section 12.

RESPONSIBILITY

During Non-operational Periods

4. A Commanders Diary is to be compiled by commanders of all formations.

During Operational Periods (1)

5. A Commanders Diary is to be compiled in duplicate by:
 - a. Commanders of all formations.
 - b. Each branch of the staff at formation headquarters commanded by a brigadier or above.
 - c. Heads of services not below the rank of lieutenant colonel.
 - d. Personal staffs and officers holding special appointments.
 - e. Unit commanders.
 - f. Commanders of a detachment of a unit when so ordered.

COMPILATION

6. Both original and duplicate copies are to consist of:
 - a. Cover (AF C 2119) (Adapted).
 - b. Index as printed on cover.
 - c. Narrative (AF C 2118) (Adapted).
 - d. Annexes as shown in the Index.
7. All details of the unit or formation (if a detachment is concerned, the name of the parent unit), period covered and enclosure numbers of the annexes are to be shown on the cover. If there has been a change of command since the last report, the date of assumption by the new commanding officer is to be included.
8. The annexes are to be assembled in the groups shown on the cover. If there are no enclosures for an annex NIL will be entered on the cover. If additional annexes are convenient for a particular headquarters, starting at B.

DISPOSAL

13. **Original Commander's Diary.** This is to be forwarded monthly, unless otherwise ordered, by the seventh day of the succeeding month direct to AHQ.

14. **Duplicate Commander's Diary.** This must be clearly marked as a duplicate. It is to be sent separately from the original to AHQ one month after the original has been despatched but not before the former has been acknowledged.

15. When overseas, both copies of diaries are to be sent through the Army Records organization in the overseas theatre but at different times.

16. **TOP SECRET Supplementary Diaries.**

a. The documents referred to in Paragraph 9 together with a list of them made out on AF C 2118 (Adapted) must be placed in separate cover (AF C 2119) (Adapted). All details must be filled in and the cover clearly marked in red: "ANNEX Z — OFFICER ONLY". It may be convenient to group the papers by appendices.

b. Supplementary diaries must be forwarded under the normal rules for TOP SECRET correspondence, to AHQ. The inner envelope must be plainly marked:

1 ATF TAOR

General

1. During a week of moderate activity 1 ATF elements had 8 contacts with the enemy, 6 of which were in the TRAC Special AO north of Phouc Tuy (P) (4RAR). Most of the contacts were very small and occurred early in the week. The largest contact occurred on the 29 Jul at YS 398913 when 7 Pl C Coy 4 RAR engaged an estimated 20 plus VC in a bunker system. Cas were 3 VC KIA (Poss) and 3 Aust WIA. 124 RF Coy on 25 Jul engaged an unk number of VC at YS 446577 resulting in 2 VC KIA (BC) and nil friendly cas. There was one mine incident on the 25 Jul when an APC detonated an est 15 Lb Chicom mine at YS 358949 resulting in slight damage to one track and nil cas.

En Unit Ids and Locs

2. 274 VC Regt. HQ 274 VC Regt was identified as being in the area YS 3793 last week however it now appears to have moved to the NW of this area following contacts with 4 RAR. Elms 1 Bn 271 VC Regt are thought to be located in the area YS 3992, which has probably been burnt-out by the contact on 29 Jul (above). Elms 2 Bn 274 VC Regt have been tentatively identified in the area YS 3800.

3. D445 Bn. Elms of C1 and C5 (Recce) Coys have been reported to the West of Xuyen Moc, however the bulk of C1 is thought to be still located in the southern Long Hai Hills. The remainder of the Bn is still located in the Nui Be/Nui May Tao area.

4. Long Dat. Elms of C25, Long Dat District Conc Coy have been reported in the western end of the Long Green (YS 5359) and resupplying from Lang Phuoc Hai (YS 5153) and Dat Do (YS 4858). This unit still maintains its main base in the Long Hai Hills.

5. Chau Duc. There has once again been no firm Ids of HQ Chau Duc District during the past week, however they are thought to be located North of the Nui Thi Vai complex (YS 3074)

6. 33NVA Regt. 3 Bn is still operating E of Cam My (area YS 5094) although no positive ID's were made during the week.

EN CAPABILITIES AND INTENTIONS

7. During the week it is anticipated that D445 will commence its move back into province from its present base area, with the probable intention of attacking RF/PF outposts in the Xuyen Moc and Duc Thanh Districts. 274 Regt will stand and fight if pressed, but appear to be concentrating on resupply and retraining rather than offensive operations at present. C25 is continuing with its policy of forced recruiting, proselyting and resupply in the VC Long Dat District.

VTSZ

8. Once again there has been no significant enemy activity in the zone during the past week. There are no indications that major moves will be made against Vung Tau during the coming week.

General

1. Enemy activity remained at a low level in MR 3 during the past week. Resistance to allied operations is stiffening, indicating an increase in enemy strength and morale. RF operations met stiff resistance in the PINEAPPLE SW of Saigon where enemy bn-sized units were suspected to have infiltrated from CAMBODIA. In MR 7, the 3rd Bde, 1st Cav Div (AM) reports troops of the 33 NVA Regt are well supplied with munitions and are standing their ground when contacted. The enemy has not yet offered serious opposition to Rome Flow operations in the BOI LOI Woods, although he is capable of effectively opposing the operations. Agent reports, thought to have merit, state that MR 7 has been restructured and that a large force totaling 7,000 men will be based in the DINH QUAN forests in preparation for action prior to the October elections. Enemy restructuring of political/military boundaries is a logical step in keeping with US troop withdrawal, Gvn elections, and anticipated attempt to return major enemy forces to MR 3 during the coming dry season.

MR 3

2. Eight major incidents were reported during the period. There were no enemy initiated incidents. Results were, 247 En KIA, 37 POW, 15 Hoi Chanh, 1 60 mm Mor, 5 B40 RL, 29 SMG, 39 AK 47, 3 M16, 1 AK 50, 50 60 mm Mor rds, 33 B40 rds, 3 mines, 32 Hand Grenades, 310 HMG rds, 512,380 SA rds and 442 lb explosives.

Forecast

3. Enemy initiated activity is likely to increase during the next two weeks. Activity in the PINEAPPLE region of LASR will be targeted against RF outposts in an attempt to show that Vietnamisation is failing. In SR 1, Rome Flow operations in the BOI LOI Woods will meet increasing resistance, probably from ABF and sappers at night, and from mines and booby traps during the daylight operations. The enemy will try and make his influence known as elections approach. He will begin to target installations of political value with sapper and rockets. It is expected that he will target US airfields, fuel and storage areas and Gvn offices during the pre-election period.

General

1. Another week of exceptionally light activity was noted. Only small and sporadic contacts were reported. Unseasonably poor weather probably hindered enemy operations in northern Quang Tri. The disposition of major enemy units throughout the country remained unchanged. Reports of infiltration into Svn from the Parrot's Beak continued.

MR 1

2. There were 12 incidents reported in the MR during the week, 4 of these were enemy initiated. Total results, Frd; 22 KIA, 11 WIA, and one M113 destroyed. En; 97 KIA, 6 POW, 27 I/wpns, 18 CSW, 2.5 ton rice cap, 200 lb rice destroyed, 2 122 mm Rkt, 1 PRC 25 radio, 12 82 mm Mod rds, 5 hand grenades, 2 ton corn and 1.5 ton ammo captured.

MR 2

3. Five incidents were reported during the week. Four were enemy initiated. Total results, Frd; 21 KIA, 19 WIA, 2 MIA. En; 32 KIA, 8 I/wpns and 1,000 AK 47 rds captured.

MR 3

4. There were no major incidents reported during the week.

MR 4

5. There were 13 incidents reported during the week, 3 of these were enemy initiated. Total results, Frd; 33 KIA, 41 WIA, 6 MIA, 14 I/wpns 2 radios lost and one OH-6A destroyed. En; 63 KIA, 14 POW, 14 I/wpns, 4 CSW, 3 ton rice, 3.5 ton cooking oil and 70 gals kerosene captured.

Forecast

6. Next week scattered increases are likely, but overall enemy activity will probably remain light. Enemy units may be prepared to resume tactical operations in northern Quang Tri (P), although continued adverse weather could retard their plans. Light and scattered initiatives are most likely in the remainder of MR 1 and in MR 2, with targets in Quang Nam and Pleiku Provinces most frequently mentioned. 20 July is the anniversary of the 1954 Geneva Accords and reports from western MR 3 and the Delta have referred to increased activity around that day. Any such increase however, would most likely be limited to economy-of-force actions.

1 ATF TAOR

General

1. During a week of increased activity 1 ATF elements had 13 contacts with the VC. 7 of these were in the NUI NHON area where 3 RAR is operating and 5 to the NW of the province where 4 RAR is operating. The total results from these contacts were 9 VC KIA (BC), 1 VC WIA (BT); 6 wpns, 3 radios and a quantity of signals and personal eqpt captured. Friendly casualties were 4 WIA, 2 of these remained on duty. There were no mine incidents during the period.

En Unit Id's and Loc's.

2. 274 VC Regt. Contacts on 20 Jul at YS 388929 (1 VC KIA), 21 Jul at YS 380943 (1 VC KIA, 1 VC WIA) and on 22 Jul at YS 378942 (2 VC KIA) and YS 369946 (3 VC KIA) identified elements of HQ 274 VC Regt. 1/274 VC Regt appears to be located in the area YS 3090.

3. D445 LF Bn. A contact on the 20 Jul at YS 585654 (1 VC KIA) identified an element of the Recce Pl, D445. The main body of D445 still remains in the May Tao/Nui Be complex. C1 coy D445 still remains in the Minh Dam Secret Zone, southern Long Hai hills.

4. Long Dat District. No positive ID's were made but C25, the Long Dat Conc Coy, is still operating in and around the Long Hai Hills.

5. Xuyen Moc District. A contact on the 19 Jul at YS 625676 (1 VC KIA) identified the Xuyen Moc district unit.

6. Chau Duc District. No positive ID's were made of the Chau Duc District Unit during the past week and it is thought that they are currently located North of the Nui Thi Vai complex, approx area YS 2875.

7. 33 NVA Regt. This unit appears to be currently located in the general area YS 5093.

En Capabilities and Intentions.

8. D445 appears to be ready to move back into the SE portion of Phuoc Tuy (P) at any moment, as evidenced by the appearance of elements of the Recce Pl in the Xuyen Moc area. Other units appear to be concentrating on avoiding contact, resupplying and retraining in preparation for a pre-election offensive in several months time.

VTSR.

9. There has been no significant enemy activity reported in Vung Tau during the past week.



General

1. Last week was one of very low enemy activity as most major enemy units remained out of contact. The most significant incident during the week was a seven round rocket attack on Da Nang AFB, killing 5 and wounding 37. The enemy's campaign in Northern Quang Tri (P) has entered what probably will be a temporary lull, and the campaign in the B-3 Front appears to have concluded. 1st Cav operations in VC MR 7 probably have kept the 33 NVA Regt and VC MR 7 Headquarters off balance. Reports of continuing logistical and personnel infiltration were received from southern MR 3 and MR 4, but activity there was at a very low level.

MR 1

2. There were 6 incidents reported during the week, 2 of these were enemy initiated. Total results were; Frd; 5 KIA, 48 WIA, En; 34 KIA, 37 KBA, 8 I/wpns, 3 CSW, 2 12.7mm MG, 3 2.5 ton trucks dest, 1200 litres oil, 21 drums fuel, 200 cases of Mor charges, 100 lb rice, 100 bags rice captured.

MR 2

3. Five incidents were reported during the week, 3 of these were enemy initiated. Total results, Frd; 6 KIA, 32 WIA, 1 I/wpn and 1 CSW lost. En; 28 KIA, 1.3 ton rice, 9 I/wpn and 2 CSW cap.

MR 3

4. There were 5 incidents in the MR during the week, 2 were enemy initiated. Total results, Frd; 6 KIA, 17 WIA, 1 OH-6A (helicopter), 1 M-113 (APC), and 1 106mm RR destroyed. En; 4 KIA and 8.8 ton of rice captured.

MR 4

5. There were 12 incidents reported during the week 4 were enemy initiated. Total results, Frd; 24 KIA, 47 WIA, 5 MIA. En; 76 KIA, 6 POW, 48 I/wpn, 6 CSW, 20 hand grenades, and 2 ton explosives captured.

Forecast

6. Local increases in enemy activity are likely next week. Although the enemy possesses strong forces in Quang Tri (P), and his campaign there probably will last for several more months, most intelligence indicates that the current lull will continue through the week. Economy-of-force incidents are expected to increase in the southern three provinces of MR 1, if the enemy reacts to ARVN operations. The principal units of the B-3 Front most likely will avoid contact, however, LOC and hamlets in Pleiku (P) reportedly have been targeted by local force units. The enemy appears to be preparing for increased activity in the LASR and has strong forces in SR 1. 1st Cav operations in western VC MR 7 are expected to pre-empt most enemy plans there. Activity in the Delta is likely to increase somewhat from last week's very low level. An estimated 7,000 main force and local force troops in the U Minh Forest have the capability to initiate heavy fighting at any time, but most reports indicate they are presently training and reorganizing.

1 ATF TAOR

General

1. Last week was a very quiet one for enemy initiated activity, there being only three contacts with 1 ATF elms. These resulted in 2 VC KIA while a further 3 VC bodies were found resulting from earlier contacts. There were no friendly casualties. One anti-vehicle mine was located and destroyed at YS644822 on 13 Jul.

En Unit Id's and Loc's.

2. There were no positive Id's made during the week and all major units remained in the general areas as detailed in last weeks report.

En Capabilities and Intentions.

3. D445 is now capable of moving back into province and attacking friendly installations and such a move could be anticipated at any time.

1 Bn 274 VC Regt appears to have withdrawn to its normal AO well clear of Huac Tuy (P) and at present is not showing any indications of moving back into the province.

C25 should continue with its program of forced recruiting in the Dat Do area.

VTSZ

4. There has been no significant enemy activity in VTSZ during the week and no indications of planned activity in the immediate future.



General

1. Last week the enemy continued to maintain pressure on RVNAF forces in northern QUANG TRI (P), while scattered attacks occurred throughout the rest of the country. Enemy artillery units in the B-5 Front continued to shell targets south of the EMZ. In MR 2, major units of the B-3 Front continued to avoid contact. To the east however, mortar fire and satchel charges caused heavy material loss at the ARVN ASP in QUI NHON and sappers dropped two spans of a newly constructed bridge on QL 1 south of TUY HOA, both incidents attest to the potential of economy-of-force tactics. Enemy initiated contacts in MR 3 were light and scattered; however, the 33 NVA Regt offered stiff resistance to 1st Cav operations northeast of XUAN LOC. Activity in the Delta decreased.

MR 1

2. There were 21 incidents reported during the week, 7 of these were enemy initiated. Total results, Frd; 33 KIA, 82 WIA, 10,000 gals diesel fuel dest. En; 213 KIA, 102 KBA, 9 POW, 24 CSW, 75 I/wpns, 43 hand grenades, 132 RPG rds, 17 claymore mines, 1 flamethrower, 570 blocks TNT, 16,500 SA rds, 3,000 metres communication wire and 1.5 tons rice captured.

MR 2

3. There were 10 incidents reported during the week, 8 were enemy initiated. Total results, Frd; 22 KIA, 31 WIA, 5 MIA, 5 M16 rifles, 1 grenade launcher, 1 radio lost, 2,707 tons 105mm HE and illumination rds and 293 ton various ammo destroyed. En; 20 KIA, 4 I/wpns, 5 Hand grenades and 3.3 tons of rice captured.

MR 3

4. 11 incidents were reported during the week, 5 were enemy initiated. Total results, Frd; 16 KIA, 77 WIA, 3 MIA, 7 I/wpns and 2 UH-1H (helicopters), and 1 truck destroyed. En; 26 KIA, 8 I/wpns, 231 SA rds, 1 B-40 RL, 18 hand grenades 300 feet electrical wire, 250 lbs rice, 200 lbs salt, 200 lbs yeast, 280 lbs cloth, 100 pairs pants, 20 lb med supplies, 75 bags flour, 3080 lbs flour and 4.1 ton flour.

MR 4

5. There were 4 incidents reported during the week, 3 were enemy initiated. Results, Frd; 36 KIA, 13 WIA, 9 MIA, 69 I/wpns, 3 CSW, 3 radios, 5000 SA rds and 20 60 mm Mor rds lost. En; 3 KIA.

Forecast

6. Little change in the pattern of enemy activity is indicated next week. A PW from the 304 NVA Div recently captured south of FSB SARGE stated that the current campaign in QUANG TRI would last until October. The strong enemy forces in the area have the capability to launch large coordinated ground attacks and heavy ABF at any time. Economy-of-force tactics probably will prevail elsewhere in the country. Such actions in VC MR-5 have recently been very successful. The four infantry regts of the B-3 Front most likely will continue to resupply and refit. Intelligence reports have frequently mentioned a July high point in TAY NINH (P) and a "Big Operation" in LONG AN (P). However, these are not likely to materialise next week. Activity in the Delta probably will continue to fluctuate, although the enemy now has a strong concentration of troops in the U MINH Forest.

Information

7. During the past month there have been wide spread rumors around SAIGON and many press articles on the subject of kidnapping rings preying upon the children of the city. Police say they have received reports that over 275 children have disappeared in the past month and have arrested several suspects. Vietnamese language newspapers speculate that the children are being sold to Cambodians to use as human sacrifices; others believe they will be used as slaves or prostitutes. Several women suspected of kidnapping have been beaten by suspicious crowds, one killed. The major of SAIGON has appealed to residents to remain calm and refrain from acts of violence against suspects. Also in VUNG TAU 2 weeks ago there was a rumour (unfounded) of 40 children being kidnapped.

Comment This is probably a good example of mass hysteria, with its most serious possible consequence further unfounded distrust of Cambodians.

1 ATF TAOR

General

1. Activity returned to a very low level during the past week when there were only 3 contacts with 1 ATF elements resulting in 1 VC KIA and nil frd cas. On 2 Jul at YS356811 D Coy 4 RAR contacted approx 10 en. Docs found in area identified Chau Duc. There were two mines located and destroyed. Both were near FSB MAUREEN (area YS440765) and had been in position at least 6 months.

En Unit Id's and Locs D445

2. No positive Id's were made during the week and it is thought that the bulk of this unit is still located in the NUI MAY TAO/NUI BE area. C1/D445 still remains in the southern LONG HAI hills.

3. LONG DAT C25 (Long Dat Concentrated Coy) is still based in the Long Hai hills, although no positive Id's were made last week.

4. CHAU DUC On 2 Jul at YS356811 docs found in a very recently occupied bunkers identified elems of CHAU DUC District unit. (Also see contact report in para 1 above).

5. 1 Bn 274 VC Regt No further contact was made with this unit during the week and it has apparently withdrawn West to the area YS3590.

6. 3 Bn 33 NVA Regt This unit still remains well North of the province in the approx area YS5298.

7. HQ BA LONG (P) This unit is still located approx 10,000 met NW of the NUI MAY TAO complex.

En Intentions and Capabilities.

8. D445 LF Bn is now capable of moving back into the province and launching attacks on GVN outposts at any time, although no movement has yet been detected by VR or ptls. C25 appears to be still concentrating on recruiting and retraining. This unit was probably responsible for the abduction of 2 youths and one 14 year old girl from YS522567 on 4 Jul. 1 Bn 274 Regt still poses a major threat to the GVN and Allied outposts in the N and W of the province. 3 Bn 33 NVA Regt is still being harassed by 3 Bde (US) troops and does not pose an immediate threat to PHOUC TUY (P). CHAU DUC District Unit appears to be primarily concerned with avoiding contact and reestablishing itself in the W and SW of the province.

VTSZ

8. There was no significant enemy activity in or around VTSZ last week.


1. On 24 Jun 71 The Administrator of the Territory of Papua and New Guinea assented to the National Identity Ordinance 1971. The publication of the Papua New Guinea Government Gazette Extraordinary of 1 July, 1971 brings the legislation into force.

2. As from 1 Jul 71 the National Name is now to be "Papua New Guinea" consequently certain titles and forms of address have been altered, and will apply to both new material and to material being reprinted. For all official purposes the following provision should be observed:

- a. The Administrator should be referred to in that form, not as "the Administrator of the Territory of Papua and New Guinea".
- b. "The House of Assembly for the Territory of Papua and New Guinea" should be replaced by "The House of Assembly".
- c. "The Territory" or "The Territory of Papua and New Guinea" should be replaced by "Papua New Guinea".

At the moment, statutory instrumentalities etc, whose titles include the words "Papua and New Guinea" are not affected.

3. The form of address and terminology in paragraph 2 is to be used in the preparation of all correspondence and other papers where appropriate with effect from 1 Jul 71.

ORDERS FOR THE WEST GATE GUARD

General

1. The West Gate is to be manned at all times by a Guard consisting of at least one NCO and 6 ORs.
2. Pl Comd, D&E Pl is responsible to GSO2 HQ 1 ALSG for the provision and conduct of the Guard.
3. HQ Coy is responsible for:
 - a. Provision and maintenance of accommodation and equipment allocated to the Guard.
 - b. Provision of bedding and meals required by the Guard and if necessary prisoners.

Duties

4. The Guard is to:
 - a. Control the movement of personnel and vehicles entering or leaving the 1 ALSG area through the West Gate in accordance with the instruction below.
 - b. Provide immediate assistance, only, to 1 Pl 2 AFCU piquet, or any other person in an emergency, except that under no circumstances is the Guard to be reduced to less than four persons on duty at the West Gate.
 - c. Receive into custody persons duly committed by Australian/New Zealand Officers, WOs and NCOs.
 - d. To man one GPMG mounted at the West Gate.

Vehicle Control

5. Aust/NZ Service Vehicles

a. 0600-1900 hrs

The Guard is to check Aust/NZ Service vehicles passing through the West Gate and ensure:

- (1) That drivers are in possession of a valid Transport Work Ticket (AAF G2).
- (2) That drivers of single running vehicle proceeding beyond the Vung Tau Special Zone are in possession of a valid Free Running Pass and that condition of the pass are complied with.
- (3) Vehicle loads are to be checked to ensure that no unauthorised stores including liquor, are taken from 1 ALSG.

b. 1900-2300 hrs

As for sub para (a) above except that the Guard is to ensure that vehicles proceeding to Vung Tau have a person on duty as shot gun and two long barrellled weapons.

c. 2300-0600 hrs

As for sub paras (a) and (b) above except that the Guard is also to ensure that all vehicles are recorded in the Veh/Pers Log attached at Appendix 1.

- d. In the case of a convoy, the Convoy commander is to declare the number of vehicles in the Convoy, destination and details os any non Aust/NZ service personnel.

6. US Vehicles and Aust/NZ Civilians Vehicles

- a. These vehicles are only to be permitted to enter the 1 ALSG area if:

- (1) All persons in the vehicle are identified as US/Aust/NZ.
- (2) US persons and Aust/NZ Civilians have specific invitations to visit a Unit or persons in 1ALSG or are proceeding to the 1 Pl 2 AFCU area only.

- b. Any person other than a US national or Aust/NZ civilian is not to proceed into the 1 ALSG area without an escort who is a member of 1 ALSG.
- c. All vehicles are to be logged in and out of the area and the loads are to be checked for unauthorized stores.
- d. A vehicle visiting 1 Pl 2 AFCU are to be parked in the special parking area provided.
- e. Where a vehicle is permitted to visit 1 Pl 2 AFCU and proceeds beyond that point into the area the Guard is to contact the AFV Pro Unit (EMU 128) and give details of the offending vehicle.

7. Non Aust/NZ/US Vehicles

- a. All vehicles other than Aust/NZ/US entering or leaving the 1 ALSG area through the West Gate are to be stopped and searched for illegal goods and are to be recorded in the Veh/Pers Log.
- b. Vehicles with a 1 ALSG vehicle pass may be permitted to enter the area if:
 - (1) The vehicle is not carrying any illegal goods.
 - (2) All persons have exchanged their civilian ID Card for valid AMF passes.
 - (3) A member of 1 ALSG accompanies the party as escorts.
- c. Vehicles without a 1 ALSG vehicle pass are not to be permitted to enter the 1 ALSG area without clearance from HQ 1 ALSG (GS Branch) and are to be escorted by a member of 1 ALSG who shall be responsible for the conduct of the party.
- d. Vehicles found to be carrying illegal goods are to be held at the West Gate and reported to HQ 1 ALSG as follows:
 - (1) During normal working hours: To IO HQ 1 ALSG (EMU 51).
 - (2) Outside normal working hours: To Duty Officer HQ 1 ALSG (EMU 11/31).

Personnel Control

8. Aust/NZ Service Personnel

a. 0600-2300 hours

Aust/NZ Service Personnel are to be given free access to and from the 1 ALSG area provided they are:

- (1) In possession of a valid ID Card and ID Discs.
- (2) Properly dressed in accordance with 1 ALSG Standing Orders Chap 2 Sect 2.
- (3) On duty or in possession of a valid leave pass, officers of 1 ALSG do not require a leave pass.
- (4) All persons leaving the area in civilian clothes are to be checked to ensure that they are not taking unauthorized liquor from 1 ALSG.

b. 2300-2400 hours

As above except that persons not on duty are to have late leave and their names recorded at the West Gate Guard Room.

c. 2400-0600 hours

Service personnel entering or leaving 1 ALSG outside the hours 0600-2400 hrs or in contravention of these requirements are to be reported to parent units with a copy of the report to HQ 1 ALSG. The report form is attached as Appendix 2.

9. US Personnel and Aust/NZ Civilians

- a. US Personnel and Aust/NZ Civilians may be permitted to enter the 1 ALSG area underscorted once their identities and destination within 1 ALSG are established and details have been recorded in the Veh/Pers Log.
- b. The departure of all such persons is also to be recorded in the Veh/Pers Log. All US personnel and Aust/NZ Civilians are to be cleared by 2400 hrs unless staying in authorised mess.
- c. The departure of all such persons is to be included in the Veh/Pers Log.

10. Civilian Employees

Civilian Employees with a valid AMF Pass may be permitted to enter the 1 ALSG area under escort. Civil employees leaving the 1 ALSG are to be searched under Civil Labour Office arrangements, however the West Gate Guard may be required to assist the Civil Labour Office in searching male civilians employees. Entry/exit of civil employees is to be recorded by Civil Labour Office.

11. Other Persons

Other personnel are not to be permitted to enter or leave the 1 ALSG area unless they are accompanied by a member of 1 ALSG who shall be responsible for the conduct of the party and the visit has been cleared by HQ 1 ALSG (GS Branch). Such persons are to be logged in and out of the 1 ALSG area, all persons are to be clear of the 1 ALSG area by 2200 hrs.

Escorts

12. Escorts for civil contractors vehicles, 1 ALSG buses between 1900 and 0600 hrs and for visitors to HQ 1 ALSG are to be provided from the escorts allocated to the West Gate Guard.

13. Escorts for visitors to units are to be provided by the unit being visited.

Personnel Placed in Custody

14. General The West Gate Guard Commander is to take into custody any Australian/NZ Service personnel who are duly committed by an Australian or New Zealand Officer, Warrant Officer or NCO, provided always that the persons committing a serviceman into custody gives verbal advice at the time of the committal of the charge (s) which is/are to be preferred and a written Charge Report is prepared as soon as practicable after the committal.

15. Searching Persons committed into custody of the West Gate Guard are to be searched and knives or other weapons, matches, cigarettes lighters or any dangerous objects taken from them.

16. Reception Book The Guard is to maintain a Reception Book in which is to be recorded the following details of persons being received into custody.

- a. Regimental number, rank and full name.
- b. Unit.
- c. Date/time person received into custody.
- d. The alleged offence (s).
- e. The rank, name and unit of person committing the member into custody.

17. Property Book The Guard Commander is also to maintain the Property Book in which he will enter the number, rank and name of every member committed into custody. All articles taken from the prisoner are to be recorded in the Property Book. Care is to be taken to ensure that sufficient description is made of all articles to assist in subsequent identification. Where no articles have been removed from the prisoner, a NIL entry will be recorded. Entries are to be verified by the prisoner signing his name or by counter signature by the NCO receiving the articles, should the prisoner refuse or be unable to sign. When the prisoner is transferred to someone else's custody or when he is released, he is to sign the Property Book for the property returned to him. When a prisoner is unable to sign, the person receiving the prisoner is to sign as having received the property.

18. Accommodation As far as possible prisoners are to be placed in separate cells. Where this is impracticable by reason of the numbers of persons in custody up to three prisoner may be placed in one cell. When a prisoner is drunk or violent he is not to be placed in a cell with a person who is in a similar condition.

19. Treatment

- a. Each prisoner is to be provided with clean bedding and meals are to be served to him in his cell during normal meal times.
- b. A prisoner is to be allowed to visit the toilet on request but is to be escorted to and from the toilet. The guard is to remain outside the toilet.
- c. Drunken or violent persons committed into custody are to be deprived of their boots.
- d. Prisoners are to be visited at least once every two hours to ascertain their condition.

20. Letters Whilst in custody a prisoner may receive any letter that is addressed to him, and is to be provided with paper and pen to write letters unless he is drunk or violent or, in the opinion of the guard comd, to give the prisoner a pen could be dangerous to the prisoner or others.

21. Prohibited Items A prisoner is not to be given books, cigarettes or other luxury items whilst he is in custody.

22. Visits Prisoners may be visited by the following personnel:

- a. Duty Officer HQ 1 ALSG.
- b. The prisoner's Unit Commander or a Unit Officer appointed by the Unit Commander.
- c. A Padre if requested by the prisoner.
- d. A duly appointed Legal Officer or Defending Officer.
- e. A Medical Officer if requested by the prisoner or other wise necessary.

23. Employment Each prisoner is to keep his cell clean and may be given light duties in the Guard Room provided that no danger would result from his being so employed.

24. Release of Persons Committed into Custody The Guard Comd is not to release an officer or soldier committed to the custody of the Guard except on the direction of one of the following authorities:

- a. Comd 1 ALSG, or
- b. DAA & QMG 1 ALSG, or
- c. The person who committed the officer or soldier to custody, or
- d. The OC of the unit or detachment of which the officer or soldier in custody is a member, or
- e. The OC AFV Amenities Unit (if the officer or soldier in custody is normally from a unit outside 1 ALSG but is temporarily a member of AFV Amenities Unit), or
- f. A Military Policeman of AFV Pro Unit (if the officer or soldier was committed by a member of that Unit).

The GPMG

25. The GPMG is to be manned at all times.

26. The weapon is to be "loaded" as defined in 1 ALSG Standing Orders unless otherwise directed by GS02 HQ 1 ALSG:

- a. Breech empty.
- b. Working parts forward.
- c. Safety catch on.
- d. Belt on weapon.

27. Normal 1 ALSG Rules of Engagement apply and are to be placed in view of the person manning the gun.

28. The weapon is to have one belt of 200 rounds on the weapon and 1000 rounds as first line reserve unless otherwise directed by GS02 HQ 1 ALSG.

Tour of Duty

29. Each guard is to mount duty by 0900 hrs for 24 hours. No member of the guard is to do consecutively more than one tour of duty. No member of the guard is to be posted for more than 2 hours at one time.

30. Guard Changeover The outgoing Guard is not to dismount until the incoming Guard Commander has been fully briefed, inspected the Guard Room and accepted the stores on charge and posted sentries have been duly relieved by members of the incoming Guard.

31. Consumption of Liquor No member of the Guard is to be under the influence of alcohol or any other drugs when he mounts duty and no member of the Guard is to consume alcoholic liquor or any other drug during his tour of duty.

Dress

32. All members of the Guard are to be dressed as follows:-

- a. Hat KFF or beret as appropriate to corps or unit.
- b. Clean, starched Shirt and Trousers Drill Green.
- c. Belt Pistol. Blacked with brass polished.
- d. Boots GP.
- e. Lanyard as appropriate to Corps or Units.

33. All members of the Guard are to take the following items of equipment to the Guard House:-

- a. Personal weapon.
- b. Three filled magazines.
- c. Belt Pistol with Pouches Small Arms attached .
- d. One filled water bottle.

- f. Toilet gear.

34. At the conclusion of each tour of duty the Guard Commander is to submit a Report using AAF A18 to the GSM HQ 1 ALSG. This report is to include copies of the following:

- a. Leave Figures as advised by Duty Officer HQ 1 ALSG.
- b. Handover Certificates for persons taken into custody or released from the Cells.
- c. Veh/Pers Log.
- d. Copies of AAF A52 and A300 for personnel AWOL apprehended during the tour of duty.
- e. Guard Offence Reports.



PREFACE

1. These orders are divided into two parts:
 - Part 1 - 1 ALSG Area Standing Orders.
 - Part 2 - 1 ALSG Logistic Operations.
2. These orders include standard operating procedures for HQ 1 ALSG, and are to be used whilst 1 ALSG is operating in the Republic of Vietnam. They are effective from date of issue and supersede those published in January 1968.
3. Part 1 (1 ALSG Area Standing Orders) is divided as follows:
 - Chapter 1 - GS Standing Orders and Standard Operating Procedures.
 - Chapter 2 - Administrative Standing Orders and Standard Operating Procedures (excluding Logistic Operations).
4. In Part 1 the chapters are sub-divided into sections, in Part 2 the division is direct into sections. Annexes are placed at the end of each applicable section.
5. Pages are not numbered. However in both Part 1 and Part 2 paragraphs of Section 1 are numbered 1.1, 1.2 etc. In Section 2 they are numbered 2.1, 2.2 etc. This enables identification of the section when it is opened at any page. Paragraphs of annexes are numbered normally 1, 2 etc, without reference to the section.
6. An amendment sheet is to be placed beneath this page, and the amendment recorded when actioned. The Chief Clerk HQ 1 ALSG is responsible for amending spare copies.
7. Copies are to be handed over to reliefs.




