COMMANDERS DIARIES INSTRUCTIONS

AIM

1. The aim of a Commanders Diary is to provide data on which to base future improvements in Army training, equipment, organization and administration, and to furnish historians with a record of the activities of units and formations in operational and non-operational periods in peace and in war.

GENERAL

2. Entries are to be made daily on AF C 2118 (Adapted) each entry being initialled by the officer detailed to keep it.
3. Commanders Diaries will conform with the rules for drafting orders given in "Staff Duties (Australia)" Chapter 2, Section 12.

RESPONSIBILITY

During Non-operational Periods

4. A Commanders Diary is to be compiled by commanders of all formations.

During Operational Periods (1)

5. A Commanders Diary is to be compiled in duplicate by:
 - a. Commanders of all formations.
 - b. Each branch of the staff at formation headquarters commanded by a brigadier or above.
 - c. Heads of services not below the rank of lieutenant colonel.
 - d. Personal staffs and officers holding special appointments.
 - e. Unit commanders.
 - f. Commanders of a detachment of a unit when so ordered.

COMPILATION

6. Both original and duplicate copies are to consist of:
 - a. Cover (AF C 2119) (Adapted).
 - b. Index as printed on cover.
 - c. Narrative (AF C 2118) (Adapted).
 - d. Annexes as shown in the Index.

7. All details of the unit or formation (if a detachment is concerned, the name of the parent unit), period covered and enclosure numbers of the annexes are to be shown on the cover. If there has been a change of command since the last report, the date of assumption by the new commanding officer is to be included.

8. The annexes are to be assembled in the groups shown on the cover. If there are no enclosures for an annex, the annexes are convenient for a particular headquarters, starting at B.

DISPOSAL

13. **Original Commander's Diary.** This is to be forwarded monthly, unless otherwise ordered, by the seventh day of the succeeding month direct to AHQ.

14. **Duplicate Commander's Diary.** This must be clearly marked as a duplicate. It is to be sent separately from the original to AHQ one month after the original has been despatched but not before the former has been acknowledged.

15. When overseas, both copies of diaries are to be sent through the Army Records organization in the overseas theatre but at different times.

16. **TOP SECRET Supplementary Diaries.**

a. The documents referred to in Paragraph 9 together with a list of them made out on AF C 2118 (Adapted) must be placed in separate cover (AF C 2119) (Adapted). All details must be filled in and the cover clearly marked in red: "ANNEX Z — OFFICER ONLY". It may be convenient to group the papers by appendices.

b. Supplementary diaries must be forwarded under the normal rules for TOP SECRET correspondence, to AHQ. The inner envelope must be plainly marked:

Assesment of Future Projects

2. It is understood that the stores required for the 11 Windmill installations are due in theatre by air freight and sea resupply during Dec 68. Advice from DES indicates that the procurement of the amended stores lists has been undertaken with SOUTHERN CROSS (Aust). The SUOI NGHE installation has been started with the laying of the underground reticulation system pending the arrival of the pumping components and other stores. The project is expected to be in operation in Jan 69. The remaining installations are to be undertaken, commencing in Feb 69 with an estimated target completion date of Oct 69.
3. It is proposed to review the progress of the 1968-69 AFV CA Programme in Feb 69. CA representatives from VUNG TAU Special Zone, RAAF PHAN RANG and HQ AFV SAIGON are to be invited to attend together with FA HQ AFV.

Estimate of Reaction of Recipients

4. A recent RTT report has been submitted concerning the reaction of villages to the Water Supply system installed at LA VAN, DUC THANH District. The report indicates that such systems are likely to have a considerable effect on the living standards in rural hamlets. As more installations are completed, it is considered that requests for an extension of the programme will be received for agricultural irrigation purposes.

PERSONAL HYGIENE/SANITATION CLASSES HELD 12 ATTENDANCE 800

2. At the request of the new District Chief DUC THANH District, the Medical CA programme was extended to include regular weekly visits to NGAI GIAO Hamlet and BINH BA Village. GVN Health Workers, RD Health workers and RVNAF Medics stationed in these areas are cooperating in this scheme. This expanded programme now cares for 8 hamlets/villages with a total population of 14,000 each week.

3. The detailed hygiene report of SUOI NGHE has been completed.

4. During the month, special MEDCAPS were held at LONG DIEN and AN NHUT in support of the GVN PSYOPS Campaign against contested hamlets in the district. A MEDCAP team from 9 RAR and a DENTCAP Team from 1 RAR assisted the CA Medical team at LONG DIEN MID on 29 Nov 68.

2. SPECIAL TASKS

- a. Preparations for the opening of the library at CHAU VAN TIEP High School are well advanced for a target date in early Jan 69.
- b. A survey of science instruction equipment is being undertaken at CHAU VAN TIEP to enable the new Science Classroom to be fitted out to an acceptable scale and to assist science teaching, currently being undertaken.
- c. Preliminary planning has commenced on 1 Aust CA Unit commitment for additional classroom accommodation at the new DAT DO High School.
- d. Teaching aids (Project No 196) were handed over to the Elementary Education Chief for distribution to schools throughout the Province.

3. COMMENT

- a. CHAU VAN TIEP High School is now operating with both Junior and Senior Classes totalling 1152 students. The teaching staff consists of 12 permanent members, 4 part time emergency teachers and two Australian Army Teachers against an establishment of 27. The Headmaster, Deputy and male teachers undergoing Military Training are expected to resume their duties in early Jan 69.
- b. Because of the critical shortage of trained English Teachers in all secondary schools in this Province, the Education Detachment has undertaken a teacher assistance programme at CHAU VAN TIEP High School, MINH PHUNG High School and the PHUOC LE Technical School. The authorized establishment of the Detachment has been supplemented by two NSM who are qualified teachers. One of these NSM is due to RTA in mid Dec 68 and it is proposed to seek a suitable replacement from within AFV to allow the programme to continue.

MONTHLY REPORT - MISCELLANEOUS

1. PHUOC TUY PROVINCE

a. Liaison

- (1) Briefings were given to 1 Aust Reinforcement Unit personnel and visiting CMF Officers on activities of 1 Aust CA Unit, PHUOC TUY Province and relations with local populace.
- (2) Local Purchases of bamboo and charcoal was arranged at SUOI NGHE.
- (3) Commodity distributions were arranged at HOA LONG, VINH THANH and LONG SON Island.
- (4) Members of the detachment conducted the identification and marking of 46 vehicles in accordance with OPERATION GOLDTOP. This operation was carried out in DUC THANH and CAM MY (LONG KHANH Province)

b. Agricultural Section

- (1) The agricultural section carried out, in conjunction with the Province Agricultural Advisor, a Field Day for Agricultural Service Chiefs, their Cadre and Province Farmers. This was conducted on the Research/Demonstration Area and local farmers areas at SUOI NGHE.
- (2) Harvesting commenced of the grain sorghum. Seed harvested will be used for further seed expansion programmes next season and for distribution to local farmers.
- (3) Reconditioning of Rotor-tillers owned by Refugee Service and Agricultural Service is being carried out in anticipation of their distribution into District Areas by members of the section.

2. VUNG TAU SPECIAL ZONE

- a. 17 Const Sqn has filled and levelled a site for a new Buddhist School in VUNG TAU.
- b. Currently 17 Const Sqn are preparing a rack fill platform for 3 new 2100 KW generators being installed by the Vietnam Power Authority for the VUNG TAU City power supply.
- c. 108 Fd Wksp have completed 11 school desks and forms in a project of supplying 54 such items to the Buddhist School.

INTELLIGENCE

8. On receipt of Op Instr 67/68 on 8 Nov 68, it was found that little accurate information was available on the number and locations of rubber plantations being worked in the area of interest NORTH of NGAI GIAO Village. The operational concept was therefore amended to provide for the collection of this intelligence as a fore-runner to registering and marking the vehicles engaged on legitimate business in the area. This information is recorded at annex A, but is not complete for details of farmers and wood cutters living outside plantation boundaries.

This area is not under effective GVN administrative control either from PHUOC TUY or LONG KHANH Province and a complete population census can only be made by a combined GVN/1 ATF operation of a similar pattern to Op 'AINSLIE' conducted in Aug - Sep 67.

MISSION

9. To arrange for the registration and marking of all motor transport operating from and within the COURTENAY RUBBER Estate.

CONCEPT OF OPERATION

10. Initially 1 Aust CA Unit was to be supported by TANGO FORCE consisting of 1 Tp C Sqn 1 Armd Regt, APC Sec A Sqn 3 Cav Regt and Rifle Pl 3 RAR which was based at DUC THANH District HQ. As a result of liaison with the GVN officials at PHUOC TUY and LONG KUANH Province Headquarters and the District Chiefs DUC THANH and XUAN LOC Districts, the operational concept was amended to the deployment of a CA team to GIAO GIAO village by road and to CAM MY village by RW aircraft on separate days to deal with vehicles and owners concentrated at these locations by the respective District authorities.

RESULTS

12. A total of 46 motor vehicles including 17 wheeled tractors were registered during the operation. Of these 41 have been actually inspected and painted with identification panels and numbers. The remainder are either non-runners on isolated plantations or under repair in SAIGON. Several more vehicles were sighted from the air on 23 Nov 68 in the general area and late applications for registration and marking are likely.

STATUS OF THE VARIOUS PLANTATIONS IN THE AREA

- 13.
- a. Courtenay Rubber Plantation - French ownership and working in the area shown in Annex P. Headquarters CAM MY village XUAN LOC District. 150 plantation workers and 400 villagers in CAM MY.
 - b. NGUYEN HIEP Rubber Planation- Vietnamese ownership and working in area shown Annex P. Headquarters at YS 448879. Total population 47.
 - c. - Hamlet at YS 458884 is occupied by farmers in immediate area. No details of population.
 - d. - Individual farmers are living and working in area of road in YS 4489 and 4589. No details of population.
 - e. KIM LONG Plantation - Vietnamese ownership. Not operating and no people reported working area.
 - f. HA VAN Planation - Vietnamese ownership. Abandoned.
 - g. - Wood cutting area authorised in YS 4684 by DUC THANH HQ. Logging to sawmill LA VAN hamlet.
 - h. HUU DUC Plantation - Vietnamese ownership. Not operating and no people reported in area. Owner is requesting permission to reopen plantation.

- i. LE VAN DONG Coffee Plantation - Vietnamese ownership and operating with local labour living in area.
- j. CAO SU Rubber Plantation - French ownership. Operating and workers live in BINH BA and NGIA GIAO villages. French manager M. BEZART lives at GALLIA Plantation.
- k. GALLIA Rubber Planation - French ownership and working in area shown on ANNEX P. Headquarters DUC THANH Hamlet BINH BA. Plantation workers live in DUC THANH and BINH BA hamlets, population 1755.

ADMINISTRATIVE MATTERS

14. No problems encountered except inability of RAAF RW aircraft to land CA team at CAM MY village on 23 Nov 68. However co-operation of 2 Sqn 11 ACR in providing APC transportation from base at YS 456884 to CAM MY and return allowed mission to be accomplished.

SPECIAL EQUIPMENT AND TECHNIQUES

- 15 The identification panels were painted on cabin roofs and tractor bonnets (as applicable) with Orange DAY-GLO fluorescent paint and the identification numbers overprinted using black paint. Recognition and individual identification should be possible from the air by FAC and VR pilots and under certain circumstances by ground OP's.

LESSONS LEARNT

16. This type of operation involving civilians requires the full co-operation of the appropriate GVN authorities. In this case the problem was made more difficult by having to deal with two Province Administrations down to District Chief level, neither of whom knew very much about the area concerned.

COMMANDERS ANALYSIS

17. This operation was essentially one for the GVN National Police supported by RF military units and reinforced by 1 ATF as necessary. However in the absence of GVN interest and effective control in the area the 1 ATF action succeeded in producing some technical intelligence information and some degree of control over the movements of the inhabitants in the area. I am doubtful of long term benefits from this operation in the absence of any GVN control over the population of this area who apparently come and go at will on Route 2 to SAIGON via LONG KHANH Province. For the same reason the introduction of a clearly defined "specified strike zone" may well be impossible to implement in this area.
