RESPONSIBILITY

4. A Commanders Diary is to be compiled by commanders of all formations.

During Operational Periods (1)

- 5. A Commanders Diary is to be compiled in duplicate by:
 - a. Commanders of all formations.
 - b. Each branch of the staff at formation headquarters commanded by a brigadier or above.
 - c. Heads of services not below the rank of lieutenant colonel.
 - d. Personal staffs and officers holding special appointments.
 - e. Unit commanders.
 - f. Commanders of a detachment of a unit when so ordered.

COMPILATION

- 6. Both original and duplicate copies are to consist of:
 - a. Cover (AF C 2119) (Adapted).
 - b. Index as printed on cover.
 - c. Narrative (AF C 2118) (Adapted).
 - d. Annexes as shown in the Index.
- 7. All details of the unit or formation (if a detachment is concerned, the name of the parent unit), period covered and enclosure numbers of the annexes are to be shown on the cover. If there has been a change of command since the last report, the date of assumption by the new commanding officer is to be included.
- 8. The annexes are to be assembled in the groups shown on the cover. If there are no enclosures for an annex NII will be entered on the cover. If additional annexes are convenient for a particular headquarters, starting at B.

Assesment of Future Projects

- 2. A detailed examination is being conducted by the unit in conjunction with CORDS Advisors and SEABEE Team leader on the requirements of the PHUOC LE Province Hospital (Project 197). As several agencies will be involved in this extensive repair and renovation project, careful co-ordination is necessary to ensure a satisfactory completion of the task. Plans for drainage and sewerage have been received from CORDS Engineering Branch 3 CTZ and water reticulation plans are to be produced. Ward toilet renovation, laundry improvement and kitchen reconstruction are likely to be the main Aust CA contibutions to the project.
- 3. The guidelines for the GVN 1969 Pacification and Development Campaign have been received and examined. A Province briefing is scheduled for 3 Jan 69 and the PHUOC TUY Plan is expected to be published late Jan 69 for implimentation in 1 Feb 69. Preparation of the AFV Military Civic Action Plan 1969/70 is subject to requirements and priorities in this GVN Plan.

REMARKS:

- a. During this month, 10 additional MEDCAP Visits were conducted in conjunction with 9 RAR Med Team. These Visits were into contested hamlets in support of the LE LOI Special Pacification Campaign.
- b. This additional work load on the small CA Medical Team caused a suspension of the Personal Hygiene and Sanitation classes for the month.
- c. The high level of 10,000 treatments from 30 Medcaps visits cannot be sustained by this units Medical Team without the assistance from other RAAMC personnel in 1 ATF. Operational commitments involving the RMO's and Medical Assistants attached to units in 1 ATF likely to preclude this assistance on a regular basis.
- d. The services of an additional MO from AFV resources one day per week would permit a regular visit to be made to LONG DIEN MID.a priority area.

MONTHLY REPORT - MISCELLANEOUS

1. PHUOC TUY PROVINCE

- a. Cordon and Search Operations. Assistance was given to 9 RAR during Op KING HIT with the cordon and search of AN NHUT. Members involved:
 - (1) Liaison Detachment 6
 - (2) Medical Detachment 8
- b. Other Operations. An additional 9 vehicles were painted and documented for Op GOLD TOP by members of Liasison Detachment on Dec 69.

c. Liasison Detachment:

- (1) Briefings were given to 1 Aust Reinforcement Unit personnel and visiting CMF Officers on activities of 1 Aust CA Unit, PHUOC TUY Province, and relations with the population.
- (2) Local purchase of bambo and charcoal by Task Force Units was arranged at SUOI NGHE.
- (3) A beach party was conducted at LONG HAI in co-ordination with the Refugee/Social Welfare service for the children of LONG TOAN Hamlet.
- (4) Liaison was effected with 1 ATF units for Xmas Celebrations:
 - (1) 161 Indep Recce Flight beach party for children at BARIA Orphanage.
 - (b) HQ Coy Xmas Party hospital patients at BARIA.
- (5) Commodity Distributions were arranged as per Annex E.

d. Agricultural Detachment

(1) The harvesting of the sorghum crop at SUOI NGHE was completed 400 lbs of seed has been held for distribution to farmers next season. Other grain was distributed at SUOI NGHE.

c. Activities of 1 ATF Units

- (1) Sponsorship of childrens Xmas parties by HQ Coy and 161 Indep Recce Flt.
- (2) * Field Squadron RAE have completed an access road for the Village Office at THAI TIEN during "Op GOODWOOD".
- (3) 9 RAR provided a MEDCAP Team on three occasions during the month in LONG DIEN District.

2. VUNG TAU SPECIAL ZONE

- a. Completed the rock fill platform for three 2100KW generators for VUNG TAU Power grid. Due to the overall assistance in this project by 1 ALSG, installation costs were kept to a minimum and consequently the Electric Authority of Vietnam have been able to provide from their budget, 2 x 60 KW generators for the Thang Nhut Quarter.
- b. 17 Const Sqn have also assisted further on the Back Beach High School project by providing sand fill inside the foundations to floor level.
- c. 55 Engr Wksp and Prk Sqn are providing firewood to the VINH LONG Evacuee Orphanage.
- d. 102 Fd Wksp have serviced a protable generator for the Vietnamese Information Service and completed a maintenance survey of an Australian built front end loader (Moore Scoppmobile) for the Public Works Dept. A list of unserviceable parts has been produced and efforts will be made to obtain these parts from Australia.
- e. 1 Aust FD Hosp gave a Xmas party to children in the NAM BINH area on Sat 14 Dec 68.

- f. 2 AFCU provided a Xmas party to the dependent children at the National Field Force Police Unit in VUNG TAU. 123 Children were each given a toy and Sweets.
- g. ALSG Edn Staff provided Xmas gifts in the form of school commodities to the English class children students at NAM BITH and CAT LO.
- h. Mayor of VUNG TAU's Appeal. In responce to an appeal by the Mayor of VUNG TAU to the FWMAF, 1 ALSG raised a sum of \$209.00. \$100.00 of this sum was used to provide gifts of candy to each of the children of the 270 families constituting this Cadre Staff dependents at the Junior Military Academy. The distribution was made at a special ceremony on the 23 Dec 68, by the Comd 1 ALSG and representatives of units of 1 ALSG. The remainder of this money is to be coupled with \$197.00 raised by US Forces in the Zone, and presented to the Mayor for use in a social welfare project. Decision on the type of project will be made on consultation with the US and Australian CA Officers.
- i. 2 AOD Sgts Mess gave an Xmas party and distributed toys to 36 children patients at the US Army 36 EVAC Hospital on Sunday 15 Dec 68.
