4. A Commanders Diary is to be compiled by commanders of all formations.

# During Operational Periods (1)

- 5. A Commanders Diary is to be compiled in duplicate by:
  - a. Commanders of all formations.
  - b. Each branch of the staff at formation headquarters commanded by a brigadier or above.
  - c. Heads of services not below the rank of lieutenant colonel.
  - d. Personal staffs and officers holding special appointments.
  - e. Unit commanders.
  - f. Commanders of a detachment of a unit when so ordered.

#### COMPILATION

- 6. Both original and duplicate copies are to consist of:
  - a. Cover (AF C 2119) (Adapted).
  - b. Index as printed on cover.
  - c. Narrative (AF C 2118) (Adapted).
  - d. Annexes as shown in the Index.
- 7. All details of the unit or formation (if a detachment is concerned, the name of the parent unit), period covered and enclosure numbers of the annexes are to be shown on the cover. If there has been a change of command since the last report, the date of assumption by the new commanding officer is to be included.

# CIVIC ACTION 1 AUST CA UNIT MONTHLY REPORT - AUG 69 PHUOC TUY PROVINCE AND VUNG TAU MUNICIPALITY

# General

- 1. The monthly report for Aug 69 is submitted covering the following:
  - a. External Affairs Project Report Annex A
  - b. Medical Civic Action Report Annex B
  - c. Monthly Education Report 'Annex C
  - d. Commodity Distribution Phuoc Tuy Provinces Annex D
  - e. Liaison and Agriculture Annex E

# Construction

- Work proceeded well in all projects during the month. The Chau Van Tiep High School extension, and the Long Thanh Elementary School were completed and handed over. Work on the Dat Do High School was delayed because of the death of the contractor, but has now been resumed and should be finished in September.
- The Province Rice Warehouse is proceeding very slowly as CB ("SEABEE") team could only deploy one man on the project for most of the month. To finish this job in reasonable time, it may be necessary to supplement the CB effort with Australian engineers.
- 4. The windmill programme continues satisfactorily. 17 Const Sqn has almost completed construction of the mill and tank in Phuoc Loi and will then move into the An Nhut mill, after which all mills now held in country will be erected. The people in Phuoc Loi have been very slow in playing their part in the project (digging the pipe ditches). This may be for fear of VC retribution. The Suoi Nghe mill is still not functioning and it may be necessary to put down another bore. Recce is in progress at present for a bore and windmill site on Long Son Island. The recce is being done as a three day operation with security by 1 ATF D and E Pl.
- Detailed investigation has been completed on the following projects in support of village self development. Subject to AFV approval work should start during September. All projects are joint Australian/Vietnamese efforts.
  - a. Baria Hospital Renovations
  - b. Construction of a Maternity Dispensary on Long Son Island
  - c. Renovation of Long Dien Market
  - d. Renovation to An Ngai Market
  - e. Construction of a toilet at Tam Phuoc School

- f. Construction of Hoa Long High School (Project 258)
  (not village Self Development)
- Major development work by 1 ATF Engineers continued. The main project was widening and resurfacing of Route 23 from Baria to Dat Do. Work proceeded well helped by an unusually dry period towards the end of the month and is 50% complete. Minor road repairs have been done in many areas, particularly Route 23 between Dat Do and Xuyen Moc and in the crea of Hoi My.

# MEDCAPS AND ICAPS

7. The routine MEDCAP programme was expanded considerably and included assistance by the RMOs from 1 Fd Regt and the Infantry battalions. The ICAP programme was intensified by holding the majority at night, rather than in the late afternoon. The numbers of people attending (600 in La Van) indicate the great impact of these projects. In addition in most areas the District Chief and his staff have attended and used the occasion to personally address and mingle with the people. The high impact warrants the security risk involved, and the programme will be continued during September.

# General Comments

8. Progress for the month continues to be satisfactory. The civic action projects continue to be fully integrated with the 1 ATF Pacification Plan and form a very important complement to other parts of the plan. With the improvement on overall security in the Province, it has been possible to expand the civic action effort, and this trend should continue.

# Medical

1. During the month of August the expanded MEDCAP Programme has continued smoothly. The MOs involved have been co-operative and have developed an interest in this work. One mirror difficulty has been lack of Vietnamese interpreters. The new Province Medical Chief has expressed satisfaction with the expanded programme. MEDCAPS for the month as follows:

- 3. The new Province Medicin Chef Dr Nguyen Ty Vong assumed duty in mid August.
- 4. There were no major conflicts or natural disasters involving the civil population during August.

# Dental

5. DENTCAPS continue to be conducted by 33 Dental Unit and USS CORPUS CHRISTIE BAY in Phuoc Tuy. There has been no change in frequency.

# Health, Hygiene and Sanitation

- 5. The outbreak of malaria in Long Hai has been confined to the US Special Forces camp and there has been no incidence in the adjacent civil population.
- 7. 1 ATF Hygiene Detachment has continued spraying activities in the Province and at present devotes two half days per week to spraying in the Baria Gaol and Long Dien Village.



7. Continued.

Sixteen garbage bins have been delivered to Thuoc Le Market as part of a sanitation project in the market. The delivery of wet garbage to Hoa Long for the pigs has been discontinued.

8. The incidence of malaria in the civil population has continued to increase during August but is still well under control. The mimor Dengue Fever outbreak in the Province has now subsided.



# MONTHLY EDUCATION REPORT - AUG 69

# Primary Education

# 1. New School Year

- a. School year 1969-70 began 18 Aug 69
- b. Enrolment statistics are not yet to hand, the estimated increase in enrolements is 6% overall of last years enrol-ments.
- c. Most of the 55 Elementary schools in Phuoc Tuy Province were in sufficiently good repair to begin functioning at the commencement of school year. Exceptions are:
  - (1) Binh Ba Repairs to war damage delayed pending processing of claim for compensation lodged by plant-ation management against GVN.
  - (2) Kim Hoi, in Ap Long Cat. Damaged by VC and repaired, then by RF/PF. There are few children to warrant priority repair and the children are to attend schools within 1 km either way on Route 15.
  - (3) Suoi Nghe Staffing dificulties expected to be resolved in one or two weeks.
- 2. Staffing The Province Education Service (Primary) conducted a training course from which 37 trainees graduated as Hamlet Teachers on 29 Aug 69. No immediate difficulties are foreseen in meeting the staffing requirements of Primary schools in Phuoc Tuy Province.

## 3. Projects

# a. Constructions

- (1) A new three classroom school at Long Thanh to replace the original school was completed and handed over on 23 Aug 69.
- (2) Proposals to build two classroom schools at both Ngai Giao and Vin Thanh using "illage Self Development Programme funds were ratified by Phuoc Tuy Province Administration.

# b. Maintenance

- (1) Approval has been sought for an EA project to provide replacement/repair of school furniture at a cost of 250,000 \$VN.
- (2) Approval has been sought for an EA project to effect minor repairs to primary schools at a cost of 200,000 \$VN.
- (3) Approval has been sought for an EA project to provide teaching aids to primary schools at a cost of 200,000 \$VN.

# Secondary Education

4. a. High schools' long vacation continued through Aug 69.

b. High schools begin School Year 1969-70 about 17 Sep 69. The actual date depends on when staff return from their present role administering Baccalaureate (Public Secondary) examinations.

# Construction

- 5. a. The three classrooms built as a 1 Aust CA Unit project for the Chau Van Tiep High School, Baria are complete and will be handed over to the Province Education Service (Secondary) as soon as the complement of furniture is installed.
  - b. Four classrooms built as a 1 Aust CA Unit project for 1 Dat Do High School should be ready to hand over before School Year 1969-70 begins.

## Projects

- a. It is proposed that a three classroom High School be built as an EA project at Hoa Long. Preparation and the application for approval is in hand.
  - b. Approval has been requested for an EA project to provide a Box Libary to serve three smaller High Schools in Phuoc Tuy Province.

## English Language Classes

7. English language classes for Secondary school students ("Summer" school classes) involved 1 instructor teaching, for 24 hrs, a total of 350 students.

## RSAR Gift Fund

8. A rotary ink duplicator was purchased for Dat Do High School from the \$A300 donated by RSAR. Thismachine will be handed over with appropriate publicity when the school re-opens in mid Sep 69.

## Adult Education

9. English Language Classes. Three instructors (including a volunteer from 161 Recce Flt) spent a total of 94 hrs instructing a total of 27 employees of Province Government Departments, in English Language.

  - d. Liaison between 1 ATF units carrying out CA tasks and Vietnamese Government Agencies.
  - e. Liaison and co-ordination of Australian CA operations with US Agencies engaged in CA and Development activities in Phuoc Tuy Province.
  - f. Co-ordination of Australian CA support of the Village Self Development Programme with other US and GVN agencies involved with the Programme.
  - g. Part time advisory duties with the Province Refugee and Social Welfare Department.
  - h. Briefings on CA to 1 ARU.
  - i. Briefings of 1 ATF Infantry elements on the civilian population and civilian administration in their areas of operation.
- 2. Agriculture Detachment During the reporting period Spr J. Bywater joined the detachment to replace Cpl J. Kohnke (MEDEVAC to Australia in June). Activities of the detachment during the reported period included:
  - a. Cultivation of experimental plots at Suoi Nghe Hamlet, including application of fertilizers and insecticides.
  - b. A survey of the pig industry in Suoi Nghe Hamlet, with a view to improving the industry.
  - c. Posign of deep litter chicken house for use in demonstration projects.
  - d. Construction of feeders and "cold" brooders for demonstration chicken houses.
  - e. Interview of possible future managers of demonstration poultry houses.
  - f. Growing and provision of hibiscus and bamboo for 1 ATF unit area beautification projects.
