- (d) Carry out lunches
- (e) Depart KUALA KANGSAR for Minden by 1300 hrs

4. B Coy will

- (a) Move to KUALA KANGSAR in tpt provided by the MTO leaving a party of twelve at SUNGEI SIPUT. The tpt requirement will be given to the MTO by 1600 hrs 3 Oct.
- (b) Time its mov to arrive at KUALA KANGSAR by 1120 hrs
- (c) Report to the RSM at Bn HQ by 1130 hrs
- (d) Return to SUNGEI SIPUT for the midday meal departing KUALA KANGSAR not later than 1215 hrs.

5. C Coy will

- (a) Provide the quarterguard after liaison with the RSM
- (b) Report to the RSM by 1130 hrs at Bn HQ
- (c) Ensure the coy area is in inspection order

6. Sp Coy will

- (a) Move the max no of soldiers to KUALA KANGSAR in the aval tpt. The MTO will advise Sp Coy and the Adjt of the tpt aval by 1200 hrs 5 Oct

INTERSTATE LEAVE ON RTA

1. The leave policy for 1 RAR on RTA is

(a) Soldiers remaining with 1 RAR

- (i) Those moving prior to the MV FLAMINIA with the exception of those soldiers listed at Anx A may proceed on leave.
  - (ii) Those moving on the MV FLAMINIA will not proceed on leave until released by CO 1 RAR
  - (iii) Those moving after the MV FLAMINIA will proceed on leave direct
- (b) Those on posting will proceed on leave direct before assuming new appointments unless individual orders to the contrary are received.

2. Members may elect to proceed at departmental expense with families to state of choice on RTA providing leave has been granted by the commanding officer. For those who elect to do this, the following restrictions will apply

- (a) NO temporary accommodation allowance will be paid at the leave destination.
- (b) Return of the family from leave destination to area of posting is to be at the members expense
- (c) NO temporary accommodation allowance will be payable at the area of posting
- (d) Should the member desire removal of household effects to his leave destination, the cost of the removal to the area of posting only will be at departmental expense. The remainder will be borne by the member if the cost of the removal to the leave destinations exceeds that of the cost of the removal to the area of posting.

3. If married quarters are allotted in the locality of the posting interstate leave cannot be approved at departmental expense. Should the member refuse married quarters he forfeits the right to proceed on interstate leave at departmental expense.

4. In view of the financial implications all members are to be thoroughly briefed before making a decision as to whether they desire to proceed on leave interstate.

5. All sub units will check, and advise the names of soldiers now approved to take leave and electing to travel to destinations other than the area of posting.

6. These returns will be rendered as follows

- (a) Charter flights 3 and 4 will be processed at Dn HQ.
- (b) MV FLAMINIA pers by 1630 hrs 6 Oct

RELIEF OF 1 RAR

General

1. The following information is attached as Annexes A to G:-
  - (a) Annex A - Movement Programme
  - (b) Annex B - Rear Parties Nominal Roll
  - (c) Annex C - Single/Unaccompanied members to return on MV FLAMINIA
  - (d) Annex D - Married/accompanied personnel to return on MV FLAMINIA
  - (e) Annex E - Married/accompanied personnel to return by chartered aircraft from 27 Sep 61 to 13 Oct 61.
  - (f) Annex F - Married/accompanied personnel to return by chartered aircraft after 4 Nov 61
  - (g) Annex G - Personnel NOT allocated.

Baggage and Effects

2. The total weight of baggage and effects, including regimental property, for loading on the MV FLAMINIA if full entitlements are utilised will be as follows:-
  - (a) SINGAPORE - 459 measured tons
  - (b) PENANG - 1879 measured tons
3. The baggage entitlement for a single unaccompanied member, included in the above figures, is 40 cubic feet.

Baggage Priorities

4. Should the tonnage figures given in paragraph 2 above exceed the capacity of the MV FLAMINIA, the following priorities are given for loading at PENANG:-
  - (a) Priority 1 - Baggage and effects of single/unaccompanied personnel
  - (b) Priority 2 - Baggage and effects of married/accompanied personnel
  - (c) Priority 3 - Household effects
  - (d) Priority 4 - Regimental property.

Baggage and Effects

5. Baggage entitlements for accompanied members and dependents is as follows:-
  - (a) 80 cubic feet for each adult and child over 12 years of age

2/.....

- (b) 40 cubic feet for each child 12 years and under.
  - (c) 40 cubic feet for each single/unaccompanied member (includes one cabin trunk metal)
  - (d) Heavy baggage, effects and regimental property, suitably addressed should be packed in crates, trunks and/or cases which are small enough to allow easy handling. Large crates have a high damage potential and as a guide dimensions should not exceed 42" x 24" x 24".
6. The free baggage allowance for personnel and families travelling by air is:-
- (a) Normal civil air services 66 lbs per passenger.
  - (b) Chartered aircraft 100 lbs per seated passenger.
7. No approvals will be granted for the carriage of excess baggage by air at departmental expense.

#### Cabin Luggage

8. As the space in cabins of MV FLAMINIA for baggage is limited the following restrictions are made:-
- (a) Officers, Warrant Officers and dependents may take aboard only one 30" suit case per person as cabin luggage and will have daily access to other luggage wanted on voyage (WOV).
  - (b) Troops will only take kit bags universal, packs, haversacks and equipment into cabins. Troops will not have access to their metal cabin trunks during the voyage.

#### Unit Baggage Officer

9. Lt I C TEAGUE is appointed 1 RAR Baggage Officer. He will control all shipment of unit stores and unit equipment plus personal baggage and equipment.

#### Documentation for baggage on MV FLAMINIA

10. So that Bills of Lading and Baggage Manifests can be prepared 1 RAR is to provide HQ 17 Gurkha Div/OCLF (Q Mov) and HQ Aust Army Force FARELF with the following:-
- (a) Nominal rolls with number of items and description of accompanied baggage.
  - (b) Nominal rolls with number of items and description of unaccompanied baggage.
  - (c) Declaration that baggage and effects contain no prohibited items.

#### Customs

11. (a) Members will be warned that if details of baggage are not available to customs serious delays and inconveniences may be suffered by the individual.
- (b) The contents of each piece of baggage will be itemised. Sub units will forward to unit baggage officer a copy detailing items packed in every piece of baggage. The second copy will be held by the sub-unit and a third copy will be held by the member responsible for his personal baggage/sub-unit stores.

Marking of Baggage

12. (a) All baggage ~~will be marked~~ with members number rank name initials and unit. It will be marked in such a way that the inscription is legible and permanent.
- (b) Kitbags will be stencilled on side and bottom.
- (c) Trunks will be marked as follows:-  
On top of trunks -  
Top panel - Regimental Number  
Second Panel - Rank name and initials  
Third Panel - Company of 1 RAR.
- (d) In addition the members number will be stencilled on each trunk on:-  
(i) The front side (below handle)  
(ii) The left end.
- (e) All baggage ~~will be marked~~ with a 4" colour bar in the following colours:-  
A Coy - Red  
B Coy - Blue  
C Coy - Green  
Sp Coy - White  
Adm Coy - Black  
Bn HQ - Nil.
- (f) The trunk will be marked on diagonally opposite corners eg, top left front corner and ~~bottom~~ right rear corner. The mark will be made diagonally across the three surfaces of the corner to form the corner triangle so that the colour bar is visible from any side.

Cabin Baggage

13. Carried by members.

Hold Baggage

14. (a) Company responsibilities  
(i) Companies will prepare nominal roll in triplicate of members with hold baggage by number rank and name. ONE copy will be submitted to the 1 RAR Baggage Officer. SECOND copy will be given to Company Baggage NCO.  
(ii) Ensure members trunks are correctly marked.  
(iii) Each company will appoint an officer to personally check loading of trunks into vehicles against company copy of nominal rolls.  
(iv) Appointment of Company Senior NCO as Company Baggage NCO.  
(v) Provision of a work party for loading of Company baggage and transfer to PENANG.
- (b) Company Baggage NCOs Responsibilities  
(i) Supervision of loading of baggage in Company.

4/.....

- (ii) Check your copy of nominal roll of trunks loaded against copy held by company baggage officer.
- (iii) On arrival at the ship check company nominal roll of baggage against copy held by unit baggage officer.
- (iv) Under direction of baggage officer supervise transfer of baggage to ship at PENANG and the unloading at SYDNEY.

(c) Unit Baggage Officer's Responsibilities

- (i) Organise transport for movement of baggage to ship.
- (ii) Check your copy of nominal roll for each company against company baggage NCOs copy on arrival of baggage at PENANG.
- (iii) Supervise the loading of hold baggage onto ship at PENANG and its unloading at SYDNEY.

Marking of Cases

15. Each sub unit will be allocated a particular consignment letter series. All cases will be marked on each of the FOUR sides. Consignment series to be used are:-

16. Example- The final marking of case number 4 of the band who have 24 cases would be made by the baggage NCO thus:- BAND/4/24.
17. Items required during the voyage will be clearly marked WOV.
18. To avoid confusion sub units should ensure that all old markings, etc are removed from packing cases.

The Colours

19. Lt H W IRWIN and Lt K H ASPINALL will be responsible for the safe custody of Unit Colours in movement to the ship, storage and subsequent disembarkation.

Hostel/Hotel Accommodation Prior to Departure

20. Whether departing by sea or chartered air flight members will be required to be marched out of their quarters 7 days prior to departure date. Accommodation will be provided in PENANG and SINGAPORE (for MALACCA families) at departmental expense less normal deductions. This is necessary for the following reasons:-

- (a) Allow quartering staff time to move families out of quarters.

- (b) Finalisation of electricity and other accounts including repayment of deposits by local authorities.
- (c) Packing and despatch of household effects.

Preparation of Air/Sea Passengers

21. Preparation will include:-

(a) Checking Inoculations

(i) All persons returning must have a current small pox vaccination certificate. This includes children and there will be NO exceptions.

(ii) Responsibility to check above is:-

<u>Families</u>	-	Family Liaison Officers
<u>Members</u>	-	Units.

(b) Checking Passports and Identity Cards

(i) All children born in MALAYA must be registered with the AUSTRALIAN High Commission, KUALA LUMPUR.

(ii) All children born in SINGAPORE must be registered with the AUSTRALIAN High Commission SINGAPORE.

(iii) The Mother's Passport to be endorsed accordingly. This is an individual responsibility. For details refer to AUSTRALIAN Army Force Administrative Instruction No 9 Part V.

(c) Insurance of Personal and Household Effects - Ref MBI 153/61  
Para 39 (a)

(i) All members should arrange a marine policy on a door to door basis to a residence in AUSTRALIA. If the address is NOT known this should be stated on the policy quote "to be advised" unquote.

(ii) Members should inform the insurance company of address in AUSTRALIA as soon as it is known.

(iii) The Dept of Army will not bear risk at any stage during move of effects from overseas even though effects may be stored for a period under Departmental arrangements.

(iv) Members should therefore not accept a specified time limit on policy.

22. Family Liaison Officers will be:-

(a) Maj J SULLIVAN (DAD Hirings AUST)	PENANG/TAIPING
(b) Capt J W KENNEDY	MALACCA/IPOH
(c) Adm Offr HQ Aust Army Force	SINGAPORE.

23. Ships Army Staff provided by Eastern Command AUSTRALIA will comprise the following:-

- (a) Comdt - Lt Col I HUTCHISON, DSO, OBE, MC, ED
- (b) Adjnt/QM - Lt (QM)(H/Capt) A E A BRADLEY
- (c) Ships WOII and RQMS
- (d) Regt duty personnel including clerks, storemen and provosts.
- (e) Capt RAANC for dependents duty.
- (f) Paymaster.

Dress

24. Dress on MV FLAMINIA will be as follows:-

- (a) Troops may wear civilian clothes during the voyage at the discretion of the ships commandant.
- (b) Troops will NOT wear boots AB during the voyage.

Pay

25. AUSTRALIAN Army Force will provide facilities for pay and currency exchange for members departing by air.

Removal of Household Effects in AUSTRALIA

26. If postings are known members requiring removal of household effects within AUSTRALIA should submit 6 copies of AAF HLO to 1 RAR by 1 Oct 61.

Indulgence Freight

27. No indulgence freight will be carried on the MV FLAMINIA to AUSTRALIA.

28. Movement details of families from NORTH MALAYA to TERENDAK Camp will be advised.

223. GAITERS AND WEB EQUIPMENT

- Authority has been given for the issue of canvas gaiters to all ranks of the Australian Army (regular and CMF) and for the deletion of web anklets from all scales other than those of the Cadet Corps.
- It has been decided that there will be only one colour for canvas gaiters, namely black. Gaiters will be issued in the dark green colour resulting from the rot-proofing process, and will be blackened by individuals using boot polish.
- Web belts and bayonet frogs of the '37 pattern, worn with gaiters will be blackened in the same way. Web rifle slings will not be blackened.
- The United States pattern web equipment about to come into use is dark green in colour, and on no account will this colour be changed. For this reason it will be scrubbed as little as possible.

225. ARMY HEALTH BENEFITS SOCIETY. - SPEECH THERAPY AND PSYCHOLOGIST INTERVIEWS

The following advice has been received from AHQ CANBERRA:-

SPEECH THERAPY AND PSYCHOLOGIST INTERVIEWS

1. The Committee of Management AHBS, has approved of the payment of a therapist and also for interviews with a psychologist provided that such treatment and interviews have been undertaken on the authority and direction of a medical practitioner
2. Benefits will be paid at the rate of 15/- per attendance under the same conditions applicable to physiotherapy (item 2003 page 991 of MBI 131/1961) and applies to Schedules 'M', 'MB' and 'MBX' members only

226. CONTAMINATION OF WATER SUPPLIES BY ARSENIC WEED KILLER

1. The use of sodium arsenite for agricultural and horticultural purposes is legal and is practised in MALAYA:

...../4

- (a) As a spray to kill lallang
- (b) As a paint to kill rubber trees

2. Warning notices are normally put up at the boundaries of treated areas. These should not be moved until the area has been cleansed by a heavy rainfall.

3. In dealing with any poisonous substance accidents can occur and recently contamination of water by arsenic due to spraying with sodium arsenite have been reported.

4. The following points should be noted:-

- (a) Water will not be taken for drinking purposes inside an area where arsenic spraying is being carried out unless it has been certified as free from chemical poison by a Medical Officer.
- (b) On estates where there is a normal bulk water supply ascertain from the manager of the estate where spraying is taking place and the possible danger to the water supply.
- (c) If there is dead lallang on the banks of a stream or if labourers are spraying in the area the water from the stream should not be used for drinking purposes.
- (d) To keep a look out for the notices which state that poisonous spraying is taking place.
- (e) That boiling the water or treating by ordinary means will not remove poisons.

#### 227. DISCIPLINE CARRYING OF FIRE ARMS OR EXPLOSIVES

1. The civil law in the Federation of Malaya in respect of unauthorised carriage or possession of arms, explosives, etc., is as follows:-

Under Sections 4 and 5 of the Carrying of Arms Ordinance, 1947, the death penalty or penal servitude for life may be imposed for carrying and using, or carrying and attempting to use, firearms in the commission of certain offences. It is also an offence, punishable with 10 years penal servitude for a person to be unlawfully in possession of a firearm.

2. All ranks are therefore forbidden:-

- (a) To carry or to be in possession of any private firearm, ammunition or explosives whether serviceable or otherwise unless the possessor holds a current licence granted by the civil authorities for the said firearm, ammunition or explosives.
- (b) To carry or to be in possession of any service firearm, ammunition or explosives of any kind except when or in connection with a specific duty, or when ordered by the appropriate service authority.

RO 193/61 is cancelled.

#### 228. SECURITY OF ARMS AND AMMUNITION

1. Arms and ammunition, once withdrawn from unit or sub unit central custody (e.g., Arms Kote, armoury or Q store) becomes the personal responsibility of the individual to whom they are issued from such central custody until properly returned.

2. Individuals drawing weapons and ammunition from central custody will acknowledge receipt by signature, first ensuring that they have actually drawn the identical weapon and the number of rounds for which they are to sign.

...../4

3. Any member of 1 RAR discovering the loss of arms and/or ammunition on issue to him or to any other member of sub unit, will immediately report the loss by the quickest means to his Company Headquarters.

4. An individual who is responsible for the loss, through negligence, of arms will normally be tried by Court Martial. Loss of ammunition is a less serious offence, provided an immediate report is made. The most stringent action will be taken where unreported losses are subsequently discovered.

5. RO 192/61 is cancelled.

3. CHOLERA VACCINATIONS

Cholera at present limited to HONG KONG, and chance of spread to MALAYA is slight. Mass vaccinations of all troops and dependants is not considered necessary but should they wish to be protected against cholera on a voluntary basis they should consult their Medical Officer. Soldiers whose cholera vaccinations are no longer current will be vaccinated in accordance with arrangements made by the RMO.

4. SERVICES CANTEENS TRUST FUND - EDUCATION AWARDS FOR 1962

The Trustees of the Services Canteens Trust Fund are inviting applications for Education Awards for 1962.

Education Awards - Education Awards range in value from £5 to £200 depending on the nature and cost of the course taken by the child and the circumstances of the family. There is a means test based on the Adjusted Family Income. Education Awards may be granted if the Adjusted Family Income is £500 or less in the case of Orphans and £450 for other children. The Adjusted Family Income is calculated by taking the Gross Income of the family and deducting 10% for each dependant if the Gross Income is less than £1,200; a £120 for each dependant if the Gross Income is over £1,200; a widow is regarded as a dependant. The Awards are designed to contribute towards the expenses of education to help the parents keep their children at school to obtain the benefits of higher education.

Eligibility - Any child coming within the age requirements set out below and whose father or mother served in the Australian Forces on full time paid duty between 3. 9. 39 and 30. 6. 47 is eligible to apply for an Education Award.

Age Requirements - Education Awards commence from the year in which the child turns 15. Where there are exceptional circumstances such as a child who would be deprived of a secondary education if financial help is not available to the parents to send the child to school or where a parent's income is derived solely from old age, invalid or war pension, Awards will be considered for the year in which the child turns 13 or 14. Orphan children may be considered for Awards from the year in which they turn 12.

Applications - Applications for Awards for 1962 should be lodged with the Regional Secretary of the Services Canteens Trust Fund in the State of residence of the parent before the 15th October, 1961.

Post Graduate Scholarships - One Post Graduate Scholarship is awarded each year for study overseas. The value of this Scholarship is £1,000 p.a. for a maximum of three years. Applications close on 1st November, 1961.

Higher Training Education Awards - Higher Training Education Awards may be granted for post-graduate courses in auxiliary services to medicine, welfare or science such as Nursing Occupational Therapy, Speech Therapy, Orthoptic Therapy, Laboratory Technician. Applications close on 1st December, 1961.

215. DFRB - GRATUITIES

1. The following information concerning DFRB Gratuities has been received from AHQ:-

"The Defence Forces Retirement Benefits Act of 1959, which introduced substantial amendments to the Principal Act, has itself been amended in respect of gratuities payable to officers.

2. Full details of the changes are contained in DFRB Act No. 15 of 1961 (assented to 11 May 1961) but a significant amendment is quoted hereunder because of its interest to a number of officers whose retiring gratuities appeared likely to suffer reduction as a result of the new provisions introduced in Dec 1959:-

"Section sixty-two of the Principal (1959) Act is amended -

(a) .....

.....

(b) by omitting paragraph (c) of sub-section (2) and inserting in its stead the following paragraph:-

whichever is the greater of the following amounts:-

(i) an amount equal to the sum of -

(a) one and one - half times the amount of the contributions that became payable to the Fund by the contributor by virtue of section forty-three of this act; and

(b) one half of the amount of any contributions (not including so much of any fortnightly contribution as exceeds Eighteen Shillings) that became payable to the Fund by the contributor by virtue of that section after completion of twelve years' service for pension; or

(ii) an amount calculated at the rate of One hundred and twenty pounds if the contributor is a male, or Sixty pounds if the contributor is a female, for each completed year included in the period of service for pension served by the contributor after the commencing date."

3. The effect of this amendment is to ensure that the retiring gratuities of officers, who do not qualify for pension, shall not be less than the gratuities which they could have expected under the DFRB Act as it was prior to the amendments of Dec 1959."


