**COMMANDERS DIARIES
INSTRUCTIONS**

AIM

1. The aim of a Commanders Diary is to provide data on which to base future improvements in Army training, equipment, organization and administration, and to furnish historians with a record of the activities of units and formations in operational and non-operational periods in peace and in war.

GENERAL

2. Entries are to be made daily on AF C 2118 (Adapted) each entry being initialled by the officer detailed to keep it.
3. Commanders Diaries will conform with the rules for drafting orders given in "Staff Duties (Australia)" Chapter 2, Section 12.

RESPONSIBILITY

During Non-operational Periods

4. A Commanders Diary is to be compiled by commanders of all formations.

During Operational Periods (1)

5. A Commanders Diary is to be compiled in duplicate by:
 - a. Commanders of all formations.
 - b. Each branch of the staff at formation headquarters commanded by a brigadier or above.
 - c. Heads of services not below the rank of lieutenant colonel.
 - d. Personal staffs and officers holding special appointments.
 - e. Unit commanders.
 - f. Commanders of a detachment of a unit when so ordered.

COMPILATION

6. Both original and duplicate copies are to consist of:
 - a. Cover (AF C 2119) (Adapted).
 - b. Index as printed on cover.
 - c. Narrative (AF C 2118) (Adapted).
 - d. Annexes as shown in the Index.
7. All details of the unit or formation (if a detachment is concerned, the name of the parent unit), period covered and enclosure numbers of the annexes are to be shown on the cover. If there has been a change of command since the last report, the date of assumption by the new commanding officer is to be included.
8. The annexes are to be assembled in the groups shown on the cover. If there are no enclosures for an annex NIL will be entered on the cover. If additional annexes are convenient for a particular headquarters, starting at B.

COMMA DISPOSAL DIARIES

13. **Original Commander's Diary.** This is to be forwarded monthly, unless otherwise ordered, by seventh day of the succeeding month direct to AHQ.

14. **Duplicate Commander's Diary.** This must be clearly marked as a duplicate. It is to be sent separately from the original to AHQ one month after the original has been despatched but not before the former has been acknowledged.

15. When overseas, both copies of diaries are to be sent through the Army Records organization in the overseas theatre but at different times.

16. **TOP SECRET Supplementary Diaries.**

a. The documents referred to in Paragraph 9 together with a list of them made out on AF C 2118 (Adapted) must be placed in separate cover (AF C 2119) (Adapted). All details must be filled in and the cover clearly marked in red: "ANNEX Z — OFFICER ONLY". It may be convenient to group the papers by appendices.

b. Supplementary diaries must be forwarded under the normal rules for TOP SECRET correspondence, to AHQ. The inner envelope must be plainly marked:



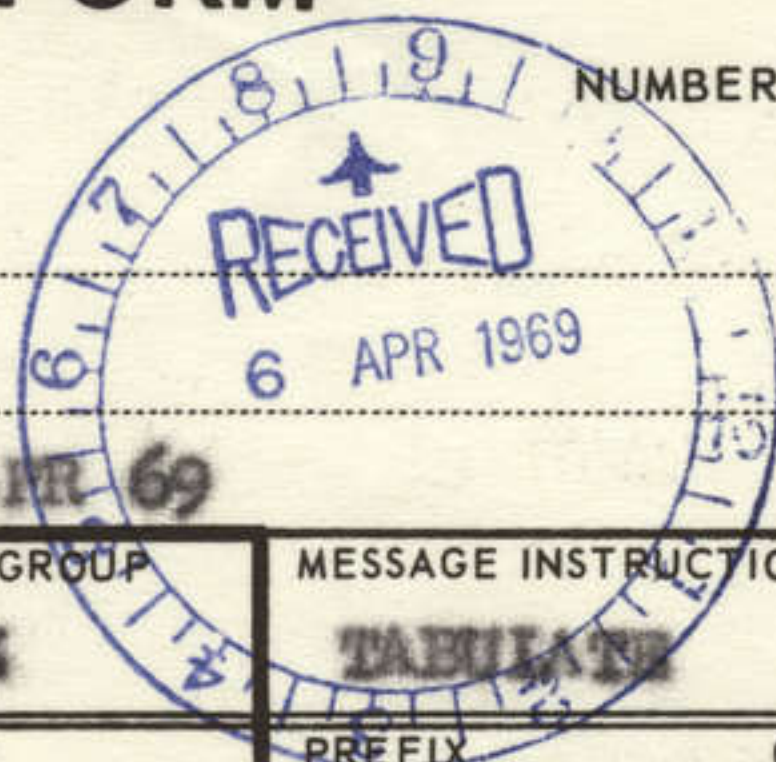

COMMANDER'S BRIEFING
INTELLIGENCE SUMMARY
WEEK ENDING 06 MARCH 1969

1. The following were the incidents that involved the Task Force during the week.

a. FRIDAY, 28 FEB 69.

There were four contacts in AO MAJURA as operations continued. 4 RAR operating in AO BELCONNEN contacted two small groups of enemy, capturing rocket primers and wire from the 1 enemy KIA(BC) at YT186085. The other contact at YT183088 resulted in 2 enemy PW; two M72 (US), 1 RPG2 and 3 rds, and an AK47 were captured. Finds during the day included a home-made Bangalore torpedo which had been recently manufactured. 9 RAR, operating in AO ARANDA, also twice contacted the enemy. At YT155156 C Coy contacted 3 enemy moving EAST with unknown results. At 1600H in the same area C Coy contacted 1-2 enemy resulting in 1 enemy KIA(BC); 1 AK47 CIA and 1 chicom Bangalore torpedo recovered.

b. SATURDAY, 1 MAR 69.

Continuing operations in AO BELCONNEN, 4 RAR contacted 2 groups of enemy at YT192073 and later at YT192074. The former involved only the one enemy who withdrew SOUTH. The latter involved 4 enemy dressed in greens, moving N-S. Results were 4 enemy KIA(BC); 3xAK47s, 10x AK47 mags, one grenade, 200 rds AK47 and a quantity of food. 9 RAR still operating in AO ARANDA made contact at YT143157, where 7/C Coy contacted an enemy squad resulting in 1 enemy KIA(BC). The remainder withdrew, leaving 1 AK47, 3 x chicom grenades, one compass, 200 rds 7.62 short ammo and a quantity of documents. Nearby a cache was found containing 17x 75mm RCL rds and 33 x 82mm mortar rds.

c. SUNDAY, 2 MAR 69

9 RAR operating in AO ARANDA engaged an area, after there were signs of enemy movement on their perimeter, with organic weapons. A sweep revealed the tracks of 6 en who had regrouped 50m to the SOUTH and had then moved off in an Easterly direction. While searching an area in the vic of their contact the day before, C/9 RAR located a large cache at YT142156. The cache revealed 102 x 75mm RCL rds, 331 x 82mm mor rds and 174 tins of increments. Meanwhile D/9 RAR, at YT117168, received a HOI CHANH who was carrying a K54 pistol. The returnee identified himself as LE MINH NGAN, the Coy political Officer of C100/F21 Indep Bn, subordinate to 5 VC DIV.

5 RAR, operating in AO BURREINJUCK, contacted one enemy without result and located a cache and a small camp. The cache at YS394627 contained 3 x 107mm rockets (over cal) and the small camp at Ys432692 was believed to have been occupied in the previous 24hrs. There were no contacts or sightings involving 4 RAR in their AO BELCONNEN, however the discovery of small groups of bunkers and recently vacated harbour areas suggests that parts of 4 RAR's AO had been planned as a forward dumping/ concentration area for 5 DIV elements in their forward approaches to the LONG BINH/BIEN HOA complex.

d. MONDAY, 3 MAR 69.

There were no contacts in AO MAJURA and three contacts in AO BURREINJUCK. At YS 399735, YS375611, and YS343692, B,A, and D Coys 5 RAR respectively, contacted small groups of enemy, with a cumulative total of 3 enemy KIA(BC) and 1 enemy KIA(POSS). Other reports from 1/2 US INF (OPCON TO 1 ATF) locating 4 new bunkers and comms trenches at YT179154 and from SAS, reports of a contact at YS531889 with 6 enemy, resulting in 1 enemy KIA(POSS), completed a quiet day.

e. TUESDAY, 4 MAR 69.

At 2145hrs 9 RAR engaged an area on their perimeter after movement had been detected at YT16176. Claymores, SA and M79 were fired and there were no known results. During the day, there had been only one contact with a single enemy at YT156150, resulting in 1 enemy KIA(BC). 5 RAR however, had a busy day as they continued their operation in AO BURRINJUCK. Several groups of enemy were contacted and were identified as members of C41 LF Coy. At YS375673, A/5 RAR contacted 6 enemy resulting in 5 enemy KIA(BC) and drag marks indicated further enemy casualties. In three small contacts, 5 RAR engaged a total of 11 enemy in three groups, resulting in 1 enemy KIA(BC), 1 x AK47, 1 RPG2 rd CIA. These occurred at YS375671, YS343692, YS343691. Finally at 1630hrs 2/A/5 RAR located the enemy base camp consisting of an extensive tunnel system and kitchen area. Found were quantities of grenades and SAA, medical supplies and food trails. The camp was believed to have been abandoned about 3 days previously.

f. WEDNESDAY, 5 MAR 69.

All three Bns made minor contact with the enemy as 4 and 9 RAR continued operations in AO MAJURA and 5 RAR continued OP TOBRUK. At YT127156 10/D/9 RAR found 5 enemy bodies and 1 x 107mm rocket about 100m NORTH of a rkt launching site that had been engaged by arty and mortars on the night of 23 FEB at YT1215. At YT286064 5/B/9 RAR contacted 3-4 MF enemy who wore greens and carried AW. The enemy had approached from the EAST and they withdrew WEST and then SOUTH, with unknown results. 4 RAR meanwhile, ambushed 7-8 enemy and arty and mortars supported. A sweep conducted the following morning revealed 2 enemy KIA(BC); 1 x AK47 and a quantity of documents captured. 5 RAR also contacted small parties of enemy at YS372675, YS348615, YS357687 and YS342692. There were a total of ten enemy sighted and one enemy was KIA(BC) with a quantity of docs captured.

g. THURSDAY, 6 MAR 69.

W/4 RAR made the only contact of the day at YT163077 where 3 enemy were engaged without result. Tracks were found leading NE away from the contact area. 9 RAR found a rocket launching site at YT146155 and recovered 1 x 107mm rocket round.

2. Comment.

Documents taken from the KIA at YT181089 during the sweep of 4 RAR's contact area, identified LE QUONG CHINH, who was the pl commander of Recce Pl, B3 Bn, Group 74, aka 84A NVA Arty Regt.

3. Incidents NOT involving Task Force elements.

There were only two incidents of significance reported during the week and they are as follows.

(1)(022030H) At YS452740 655 RF Coy received 25 x 82mm mortar rds followed by a coy sized enemy ground attack. Fire was returned with mortars, AW and SA fire. Casualties were 5 ARVN and 2 RF KIA, and the hamlet chief of BINH BA Hamlet assassinated. Enemy casualties are unknown.

(2)(030050H) At YS426656 an RF post received 22 x 82mm mortar rds but there were no casualties.

1. The following were the incidents that involved the Task Force and its OPCON elements during the reporting period.

a. FRIDAY, 7 MAR 69

There were three contacts during the day as OP FEDERAL continued in AO MAJURA. At YT279041, 5/B/9 RAR engaged one enemy who withdrew SW to a bunker system. LFT engaged the area with unknown results. Blood trails indicated the enemy had been WIA. At YT292035, 9/C/9 RAR contacted 6 enemy wearing black and khaki uniforms, resulting in 2 enemy KIA(BC); 1 SKS, 12Ords SAA and a quantity of food. Also located in the area was a 30-40 bunker base camp. 1 AUST was WIA. At 1700hrs 8/C/9 RAR contacted 2 enemy at YT292035 resulting in 1 enemy KIA(BC) and 1 AK47 captured. Meanwhile 4 RAR found 6 pits at YT191083 with 2½ft of OHC, believed to have been built within the previous three days.

b. SATURDAY, 8 MAR 69

At YT279039, B/9 RAR contacted 3 enemy who withdrew with one WIA. There were no further contacts in AO MAJURA during the day; however documents found while searching bunkers at YT267042, identify C7/D3. Although the contents of these documents indicate the presence of an arty unit, no unit identification could be made. In PHUOC TUY a 1 ATF LRRP operating at YS548872, contacted an estimated enemy pl resulting in 1 enemy KIA(BC). The patrol was extracted and the aircraft employed received ground fire without serious damage. There were no casualties.

c. SUNDAY, 9 MAR 69.

There was little to report on Sunday, however at 0045hrs at YT116174, 7/C/9 RAR engaged an unknown number of enemy with unknown results. Elements of Det 1 Div INT Unit detained eleven suspects at HOA LONG (YS4264).

d. MONDAY, TUESDAY, and WEDNESDAY, the 10th, 11th and 12th MAR 69.

There were no significant incidents involving the Task Force or its OPCON elements during the period.

e. THURSDAY, 13 MAR 69

There were two reportworthy incidents during the day but again there were no contacts in AO MAJURA. At YT169095 a patrol from C/4 RAR found a new 60mm mortar bomb possibly abandoned by the enemy in order to avoid contact with the patrol. At 1535hrs two FOSSUM aircraft on VR missions sighted two old tunnel entrances, fresh tracks and personnel. LFT immediately engaged the area resulting in 1 enemy KIA(BC) and 4 enemy KBA (POSS).

2. INCIDENTS NOT INVOLVING THE TASK FORCE ELEMENTS.

a. The following are the incidents of significance that did NOT involve elements of the Task Force during the reporting period.

(1)(072015H) At YS485778, 612 RF Coy was engaged with RPG, AW and SA fire by an unknown size enemy force. The contact was broken at 2045H when the enemy withdrew in an unknown direction. Result: Enemy casualties unknown. Friendly casualties were 3 RF KIA, one AUST KIA, two RF WIA and 3 M16 missing.



- (2)(080840H). At YS 280550, I&R Platoon were engaged with RPG-2, small arms and automatic weapons fire by an estimated enemy squad. Fire was returned and the enemy withdrew NORTH at 0900H with unknown casualties. Friendly losses: Two RF WIA, one MSS agent WIA.
- (3)(081230H). At YS 445728, 626 RF Coy contacted an estimated enemy squad. Small arms and automatic weapon fire was exchanged and the enemy withdrew. The friendly force pursued the enemy and a new contact was initiated. Results: Two enemy KIA(BC), two M-1 rifles captured and two female suspected detained.
- (4)(081940H). At YS 502553, Sector elements contacted an estimated enemy squad. Small arms and automatic weapon fire was exchanged, with 81mm mortar supporting the friendly force. Contact was broken at 1945H when the enemy withdrew WEST with unknown casualties. There were no friendly casualties.
- (5)(112315H) At YS426589, 3/2/48 ARVN were attacked by an estimated enemy Bn(-) who fired 60mm mortar, RPG2, AW and SA at their compound. The friendly force was supported by SPOOKY and flareships. Results: 5 enemy KIA(BC), 2 RPG2 and 6 x rds captured; Friendly casualties were 1 ARVN KIA, eight ARVN WIA and two civilians killed. The enemy withdrew NORTH and WEST.

3. INT COMMENT

Following a two week spell in activity, there is again evidence of the enemy's intention to carry out the second phase of his offensive. Broadly the enemy has 4 manouever divisions deployed in III Corps. 1 Div is now held in the area between NUI BA DEN and DAU TIENG. Using LF and MF regional forces as recce and logistic support, the 1 Div is capable of mounting large scale attacks in TAY NINH Province. 7 Div elements have been identified in attacks against FSPB MAHONE (XT5239) on the 7-8 March and coupled with attacks in the same area by further elements of 7 Div, provides evidence of the 7 NVA Div's interest in the SAIGON River corridor. 9 Div has been reported over large areas of SR2 and TAY NINH Province, between the CAMBODIAN border in the vic of the PARROTS BEAK and CU CHI (XT 6211). Information from a PW reveals 9 Divs plans for the attack on SAIGON. He states that 271 and 272 REGT are targeted for the TAN SON NHUT area and the remaining REGT, 273 together with regional forces are to attack the CHOLON area. The 5 VC DIV, located in NORTHERN BIEN HOA, EASTERN U1 Province and SOUTHERN WAR ZONE 'D' is again showing signs of SOUTHWARD movement. Int reports suggest that 174 VC Regt crossed the DONG NAI River, moving SOUTH, in the vic of YT3026. Supporting this report were contacts at YT255154 involving an estimated enemy Coy and elements of 4/52 ARVN, and contact with 2 Coy of enemy at YT249229 and YT 255215 identifying 95 Regt with recce and medical elements all subordinate to 5 VC Div.

It appears that elements of 5 VC Div are assembling to the NORTH EAST of AO MAJURA. The capture of a plan to attack BAU 3 (YT2710) suggests that these elements could cross route I under cover of this action thus approaching BIEN HOA from the SOUTH EAST or BEARCAT from the NORTH EAST. Post 18 MAR for the conduct of this possible covering attack dovetails with recent intelligence suggesting a renewal of the offensive against the BIEN HOA/LONG BINH complex.

1. The following were the incidents which involved TASK FORCE and its OFCON elements during the reporting period.

a. Friday 14 Mar. Friday saw only moderate activity as operations continued in AO MAJURA. In AO BELCONNEN, 4 RAR had three contacts: the first at 1655 hrs, when at YT 219074 8/C Coy contacted one enemy who withdrew WEST; the second at 1720 hrs, when at YT 215086 7/C Coy contacted three enemy, killing one and capturing an AK47 and a pack containing explosives and detonators; and the third at 1810 hrs, when at YT 219074 8 Pl again came into contact, this time with an unknown number of enemy. The results of this contact were: two enemy KIA, one enemy WIA (blood trail), two AK47s, a pistol, cooking utensils and a quantity of documents and NVA money recovered.

b. Saturday 15 Mar. Once again activity was moderate as Op FEDERAL continued. Charlie Coy 4 RAR had three contacts, and for other TASK FORCE elements the day brought no action. At 0840 hrs 8 Pl contacted two enemy at YT 215071. One enemy was KIA (BC), and two AK47s, two plastic booby traps, a Chicom anti-tank grenade and a quantity of documents were captured. At 1315 8 Pl contacted a further two enemy at YT 211078. One enemy was KIA, and a quantity of documents CIA. Finally at 1400 hrs again at YT 211078 elements of C Coy contacted an estimated squad of enemy, the contact resulting in one enemy KIA (BC), two enemy KIA (poss) and an AK47 and a pack captured. One AUST was WIA.

c. Sunday 16 Mar. The TASK FORCE's one contact of the day once again involved 4 RAR. This time B Coy made the contact, which occurred at 1705 hrs at YT 209078, and was with five enemy. The results were: one enemy KIA(BC), one enemy FW and one 82mm mortar (complete) CIA.

d. Monday 17 Mar. The only incidents of interest on Monday both involved 5 RAR. At YT 140182, two helicopters were seen to be receiving MG fire. Nineteen people in the area were detained and passed to DUC TU Sub-sector. Later at YT 232087 8/C Coy located a possible enemy harbour, two days old, with sleeping bays for fifty men.

d. Tuesday 18 Mar. Tuesday brought only two incidents, which were, however, of some significance, in that they were the first contacts which TASK FORCE elements had made in PHUOC TUY Province in some time. The locations of both were also significant. At YS 407657, at 0120 hrs, 9 RAR elements contacted ten or twelve enemy coming from the direction of HOA LONG. One enemy was KIA(BC), and a carbine and a pack recovered. That afternoon, at YS 285635, an APC of 3/A/3 Cav on convoy escort duty received two rounds of RPG (poss RPG7), fired by an unknown number of enemy, who withdrew when fire was returned and a LFT was employed. One Aust was WIA(evac), and the APC moderately damaged.

e. Wednesday 19 Mar 69. Location by 3/W/4 RAR of a thirty-five bunker base camp relieved an otherwise uneventful day. The camp was found at YT 212073, and contained sixteen 82mm mortar rounds, on optical sight from an RPG7 and a quantity of small-arms ammunition.

f. Thursday 20 Mar 69. Despite continued extensive RIF in the 1 ATF TAORs, there were no contacts. The only incident reported was the detention of three Vietnamese civilians, handed to DUC TU Sub-sector, by elements of 4 RAR at YT149078.

2. The following in brief are the incidents of significance that did NOT involve elements of the Task Force.

a. On 14 Mar at YS413645 an ambush patrol (no further details) was attacked by an estimated enemy company who fired seven RPG-2 rounds, automatic weapons and small arms. Fire was returned and the enemy withdrew WEST. Results: One enemy KIA(BC), one AK-47 captured. Friendly casualties: Two US KIA, three PF KIA, one ARVN KIA, five PF WIA and six PF MIA.


b. The 16 Mar saw three enemy initiated actions the most significant of which was at YS282644, where a convoy from 6 Airborne Bn ARVN received fire from an unknown number of enemy resulting in 1 ARVN WIA. Later that day at YS433544, CIDG elements from MIKE FORCE were engaged by an estimated enemy Pl. The CIDG force withdrew and the area was engaged by 81mm mortars and 155mm arty fire from DAT DO. Enemy casualties are unknown and friendly casualties were 1 CIDG KIA and 1 CIDG WIA. In the early hours of the 16 Mar at YS167915 elements of 2/274 Regt attacked an RTAVF position. The attack lasted 4 hours and although the perimeter was breached the enemy were driven off and a sweep was conducted. As a result of the sweep 65 enemy bodies were located and 3 enemy PW. Blood trails and drag marks indicated a further 35 enemy KIA(POSS). Several enemy crew-served and individual weapons were captured. Friendly casualties were 2 THAI KIA and 23 THAI WIA.

c. At YS 491588, on 17 Mar, civilians detonated two mines, which killed ten and wounded twenty-four.

d. The 613 RF Coy and PF elements, at 0715 hrs on 18 Mar, contacted an estimated company of VC at YS 461794. Mortar and artillery fire from DUC THANH Post, and LFT and airstrikes were used in support. Results were: one RF KIA, six RF WIA, three civilians killed, and five civilians wounded. One VC was KIA(BC).

d. At YS 439599 PRU elements contacted an estimated two platoons of VC at 0030 hrs on 19 Mar. Results were one VC KIA(BC), one VC KIA(poss) and an SKS captured.

3. Intelligence Assessment for PHUOC TUY Province. BA RIA Psywar elements, (Armed Propaganda Teams) have uncovered evidence of elements of 33 NVA Regt around the DUC THANH Sub-sector. It is presumed that elements of either D440 or D445 LF Battalions are being used as guides by 33 NVA Regiment which is in NORTH PHUOC TUY Province and the HAT DICH. In view of the above information, PHUOC TUY Province feels that attacks may be launched on BA RIA on the nights of 22 - 23 Mar 69.

1. ENEMY ACTIVITY INVOLVING 1 ATF ELEMENTS

2. ENEMY ACTIVITY IN PHUOC TUY PROVINCE

(a)(210215- 212000H) At YS498607 an estimated enemy platoon attacked the EASTERN check point at DAT DO and withdrew EAST with unknown losses. At approx 0800H, at YS493597 (SOUTH-EASTERN part of DAT DO) an estimated enemy platoon was contacted by 190 RF Coy which was then reinforced by 612 and 614 RF Coys. The 612 RF Coy subsequently made contact at 1000H and fighting continued sporadic and heavy at times. At approx 2000H the two reinforcement RF Coys were withdrawn. During the contact, approx six 107mm rockets were suspected to have landed in the vic of the DAT DO post. Results: En cas unknown. Friendly losses 4 RF KIA, 10 RF WIA, 2 US WIA (minor).

(b)(260001H) Cluster Bp 33 (a type of JS Navy commando) ambushed 6 en in a sampan at GR YS318597. Results: 4 enemy KIA(BC) 2 enemy KIA(POSS), 1 x M1 2 x M1 carbines and a NVA ID Card belonging to a WO2 and assorted documents captured.

(c) Minor contacts involving enemy and ARVN forces occurred during the reporting period at the following places:

- (i) LONG HAI
- (ii) GR YS461593 (approx half way between DAT DO and LONG DIEN)
- (iii) LONG LE
- (iv) DAT DO
- (v) NGAI GIAO (GR YS4677)

3. ENEMY ACTIVITY IN VUNG TAU SPECIAL ZONE

(a)(212130H) The VTSZ received rocket fire from LONG SON Island vic YS275581. Detail of damage was reported in HQ 1 ALSG INTSUM 70/69. On 24 Mar 69 two enemy bodies approx 3-4 days old were discovered at YS283573 approx one kilometre from the suspected launching site.

(b) Pedlars operating along the Back Beach road, are reported to have VC affiliations. The ARVN Military Security Service is currently investigating their activities.

4. ENEMY FORCES AND ACTIVITY IN THE RUNG SAT SPECIAL ZONE (RSSZ)

See Annex B.

5. VC POLITICAL ACTIVITY

VC Cadres in the major urban areas have been ordered to provide data relating to front organizations existing in their respective areas. It was stated that the reason was to allow an unspecified HQ to make an estimate of the situation in SVN. Information requested was personnel data on membership of front organizations; which overt organizations were already under a degree of VC control; the extent of VC control; size of the overall membership; effectiveness of VC control; and the opportunities to gain more control or recruitment within the organization. They were also asked for the potential of these overt organizations for use in the various demonstrations and political struggles which could lead to eventual direct political confrontations with the GVN. Similar requests were

levied on certain religious groups and organizations throughout SVN. since the VC have stated numerous times that this is the last offensive phase of the war, it is to be expected that COSVN will exhibit an unprecedented interest in the existing front organizations and the VC control of these organizations. It is apparent that the next stage of the war is going to be directed at gaining as much political support as can be mustered in the shortest possible time.

6. INT COMMENT. There is no likelihood of major changes in tactics within PHUOC TUY in the forthcoming week. VC local forces will continue their aggressive pattern inderdicting Highway 15, attacking centres of population and kidnapping civilians to assist in their logistic activities. PW reports indicate that 33 NVA Regt and 274 VC Regt may be assigned missions in the province.

There are **no** firm indications of enemy intentions in the current AOs of 4 ATF.

ENEMY ACTIVITY INVOLVING 1 ATF ELEMENTS

1. 5 RAR operating in AO ARUNDA discovered two significant enemy engineer works on the 25 Mar 69.
 - a. At YT140157 B/5 RAR located an old rocket launching site which had been mortared whilst it was being readied for firing. A 107mm rocket was found in the area which is considered to have been approx a week old.
 - b. At YT282077 A/5 RAR found a coy sized enemy bunker complex consisting some 50 bunkers which extended 200m in an EAST - WEST direction. The camp had not been recently used and was probably about a year old.
2. Again the significant incidents involved 5 RAR as they began operations in AO MANUKA, and continued operations in AO REID.
 - a. (271005H) At YS157937 elements of 5 RAR on route to AO MANUKA by road, struck a mine resulting 7 AUST WIA and 1 US WIA.
 - b. (271535H) At YT318062 6/B/5 RAR forward elements sighted 6 enemy in a bunker system who were carrying a .30 cal MG. The enemy threw a grenade and withdrew SOUTH and WEST without casualties.
 - c. (271605H) At YT289070 elements of 5 RAR found 40 blood stained US rice bags.
 - d. (271650H) At YT353068 9/C/5 RAR located a well constructed bunker complex and two water points. A search revealed quantities of SAA, documents and two chicon grenades.
 - e. (271905H) At YT313065 5/B/5 RAR contacted 2 VC with the result 1 VC KIA(POSS).

ENEMY FORCES AND ACTIVITY
IN THE RUNG SAT SPECIAL ZONE

1. Organization and Mission.

a. The VC have long felt that the RUNG SAT Special Zone is of great importance and thus, in July 66, a special MR was established and designated T10. In Oct 66 the name was changed to Doan (Gp) 10. Doan 10 controls all the MF and LF units in QUANG XUYEN and CAN GOI Districts, the SOUTH and EAST part of NHON TRACH District, and the area WEST of QL15 in PHUOC TUY Province including LONG SON Island. Doan 10 is a regt size unit and is further broken down into Military Areas 'A' and 'B', with Area 'A' being NE of the LONG TAU River and Area 'B' being to the SW of the LONG TAU. Each of these areas has a bn type command group, and 3 MF sapper/inf companies. These coy are composed largely of NVN troops sent to SVN on a three year enlistment. They have been well trained, giving them a formidable strike capability which includes RR, rkts, mortars, light and heavy MGs, and watermines as wps of warfare. A VC village infrastructure with its supporting military arm, the local guerrilla plat, exists for nearly every New Life Village in the RUNG SAT. They are usually situated in a secret base camp within 5 km of the government controlled village.

b. In addition to these indigenous units, other MF units occasionally move into the RUNG SAT to conduct operations. In particular, it is suspected that the area of LONG SON Island is used by elements of the 74 Arty Regt to launch rkt attacks against VUNG TAU.

2. Enemy Capabilities, Vulnerabilities, and Probable Courses of Action.

a. Capabilities:

(I) The enemy is capable of attacking carrying boats and other boats on water ways other than the LONG TAU with command detonated water mines and heavy wps with up to a 2 coy size force or larger if required.

(II) The enemy is capable of attacking and overrunning New Life Village and military outposts in the RUNG SAT Special Zone with up to a bn (3 coy) size force.

(III) The enemy is capable of mortaring and using other indirect wps to hit NHA BE POL storage area, NHA BE Navy Base, VUNG TAU City or other targets in the RSSZ on any night with a force up to 1 bn and up to 150 rds in any one attack.

(IV) The enemy is capable of defending his base areas for up to four hours in daylight and twelve hours in darkness with a coy sized force against any kind of coordinated attack.

(V) The enemy is capable of crossing the LONG TAU and SOI RAP Rivers at night or during rain squalls with up to 10 sampans or junks which could be used for resupply or to move troops.

(VI) The enemy is capable of infiltrating NHA BE Naval Base or the VNN Base and RUNG SAT HQ Compound area and placing claymore or other demolition against a designated target, with the help of indigenous personnel or a sapper squad at night.

cont./ b. Vulnerabilities....

b. Vulnerabilities.

- (I) The enemy is vulnerable to air attack once he has left his base areas or battle areas, where bunkers and prepared positions exist.
- (II) The enemy is vulnerable to being ambushed whenever he moves on small streams.
- (III) The enemy is vulnerable to being detected and captured or destroyed when crossing any large river such as the LONG TAU, SOI RAP or DONG TRANH.
- (IV) The enemy is vulnerable to concentrated search and destroy operations.

c. Probable courses of action:

- (I) The enemy will attempt to interdict the waterways of the area by means of rkt and RR attacks, and the use of watermines. Occasional sniper and claymore attacks against MSB's and PRB's can be expected.
- (II) The enemy will attempt to interdict QL 15 and other roads with roadblocks mines and ambushes.
- (III) The enemy will harrass New Life Villages and outposts with SA/AW/RPG/mor attacks. The duration of these attacks will seldom be more than 20 minutes, and normally no physical penetration of the perimeters will be made.
- (IV) The enemy will probably break contact and disperse when attacked, rather than defend in prepared positions.
- (V) The enemy will move primarily by sampan, using small streams whenever possible. Movement will normally be in pl size or smaller groups.
- (VI) The enemy will conduct RR, mortar, and rkt attacks against the areas of NHA BE and VUNG TAU.

PART I

SIGNIFICANT ENEMY ACTIVITY INVOLVING 1 ALSG AND 1 ATF FORCES

1. Friday 4 Apr 69

There were two significant contacts during the day and four minor ones as the Task Force and its OPCON elements continued to sweep SOUTH and SOUTH-WEST through AOs MANUKA and GOULBURN. At 0500H 4/B/5 RAR contacted 20-30 enemy at YT318020. Results were: 4 enemy KIA(BC), 2 enemy WIA; 1 x AK47, 1 x napcase and a qty of documents, med supplies and food. Later at 0710H A and D Coys were engaged by an estimated enemy squad with claymores, RPG, AW and SA fire at YS316988. The enemy withdrew as an airstrike was called with unknown results. Results: Friendly - 2 AUST KIA, 11 AUST WIA; enemy cas are unknown. Other small groups of enemy were contacted at YT338019, YS318995, YS314921 and at YS315953. A total of 18 enemy were contacted and cumulative results were; 3 enemy KIA(BC), 1 enemy KIA(POSS), 3 enemy WIA; 3 X AK47s CIA.

2. Saturday 5 Apr.

Large numbers of bunkers and pits were located throughout AO HUME as ops continued. At YS324987, 6/B/5 RAR located six bunkers including one command post which was unoccupied but contained a quantity of documents and medical supplies. In the same area 11/D/5 RAR located 29 bunkers, including one command post and a small hospital bunker containing medical supplies, a quantity of food and documents. Also in the vicinity, were 23 new bunkers with false bottoms, concealed in which were quantities of ammunition, explosive and medical supplies. All the bunkers appeared to have been in use for a long time until very recently. At YT393087, elements of 3/A/3 Cav received fire from vicinity of a village to the NORTH. Fire was not returned. At YT335026, 2/A/3 Cav located 150-170 weapon pits, sited in a circular pattern approx 200 metres in diameter. The pits were straight, 'L' shaped, spider holes or small CP type and could have accommodated approx 200 men in an all round defensive position. Some of the pits had been in use less than four days previously and covered a major system through a worked rubber plantation. The installation appeared to be an overnight or holding area. At YT360042, elements of 2/A/3 Cav engaged two enemy groups totalling 20 persons, who were moving from SOUTH to NORTH. Results: 6 enemy KIA(BC), 5 enemy WIA. The enemy withdrew SOUTH-EAST.

INT COMMENT. Documents, equipment and stores captured indicate that elements of the Operations, Intelligence and Rear Service Staffs of HQ MR7 have been forced to withdraw hurriedly from their base camps and caches. The direction of movement of small enemy parties appears to be EAST across Route 2 and SOUTH-WEST to the area SOUTH of the BINH SON Plantation (YS2392). It is considered that the documents lost to 1 ATF would constitute a serious disruption of MR7 operations and that seizure and persistent CS gas contamination of over 600 bunkers since 2 Apr 69 will very seriously affect the capacity of HQ MR7 to continue operations within its present area of responsibility. The dispersal of HQ MR7 elements also upset the coordination of regional force operations and place a heavy strain on other lower headquarters, who will have to accommodate and foster HQ MR7 until it can reorganize and establish a new base camp.

3. Sunday 6 Apr

There were no significant contacts or discoveries during the day, however continued sweeps uncovered more bunkers and weapon pits and continued to contact small groups of enemy, who withdrew before friendly forces leaving small quantities of equipment hidden in caches. At FSPB JILLIAN (YT3306), LE QUONG HONG aka PHUNG DAN) surrendered to HQ 1 ATF. His unit was the Radio Intercept Sec, Intelligence Branch, HQ MR7. The source had no weapon but had one AM PRC 25 Radio, personal effects and propaganda documents. He has been sent to 219 MID at LONG BINH.

INT COMMENT: The remarks of the HOI CHANH from G2 HQ MR7, initial document redouts and ground contacts by elements of 5 RAR and 9 RAR, indicate that HQ MR7 has been expelled from its base area WEST of ONG QUE Plantation (centre of mass YS3698), and has been dispersed throughout 1 ATF AO HUME and probably EASTWARDS across Route 2. Documents found since 1 Apr 69 on bodies of 16 KIA and in 400 bunkers seeded with Persistent CS Gas appear to be original copies which are unlikely to have been copied and therefore represent a serious loss of data needed for planning and intelligence collection, which will take a long time and considerable effort to replace before effective and coordinated operations can be mounted from HQ MR7. Discovery of HQ SR4 documents and movement patterns in the last 3 days (3-6 Apr) from the MR7 Base Camp area to the SOUTH and SOUTH-WEST indicates that SR4 elements have now returned to the HAT DICH area. MR7 elements appear to have moved NORTH and NORTH EAST, as HOI CHANH statements and incidents and contacts reports indicate.

4. Monday 7 Apr

Again on Monday there were no significant enemy movements or activities detected. The four small contacts during the day revealed similar patterns to those of the previous three days. Small groups of enemy and more bunkers continued to be found in AOs MANUKA and GOULBURN.

5. Tuesday 8 Apr

There were no significant enemy operations/activities in AO MARULAN or the SOUTHERN areas of AO MANUKA. Operations in the SOUTHERN area of AO GOULBURN are not attributable to any specific unit but are believed to be with security elements of HQ 274 Regt which has possibly withdrawn from the area to the SOUTH EAST.

6. Wednesday 9 Apr

There were no significant contacts with the enemy however bunkers continue to be located throughout 1 ATF AOs and persistent CS gas contamination is being effected. Numerous contacts in the SOUTHERN areas of AO GOULBURN and in the EASTERN portion of AO MARULAN indicated that 1 ATF was in contact with new enemy elements who act as if they are combat troops. Documents taken from enemy KIA indicates that elements of HQ 274 Regt have been contacted. Most enemy movement appears to be EAST and SOUTH EAST suggesting redeployments perhaps across Route 2 towards MAY TAO or Base Area 302.

7. Thursday 10 Apr

Yesterday proved that the enemy continues to operate in small groups, avoiding contact and generally moved from the WEST to the EAST when contacted. Contacts at YS338878, YS302848, YS407685 and at YS258793 resulted in eight enemy KIA(BC), seven AK-47s, SAA and a qty of documents captured. Two other incidents, the first involving 3/A/3 Cav with elements of D&E Pl and an enemy sampan at YS217803, resulting in 2 enemy KIA(BC), one sampan sunk; the other involving a mining of a tank from B/1 Sqn resulting in minor damage to the vehicle; completed the reporting week.

ENEMY ACTIVITY IN PHUOC TUY PROVINCE
AND THE VUNG TAU SZ

1. There were no significant incidents or enemy activities detected during the week.

The following item is an edited version of a general study on MR T7 produced by 1 ATF in Dec 68. It is published because of the activity in the past week involving 1 ATF and T7 elements.

General

MILITARY REGION T7

1. This study of MR-7 (T7) has been compiled from a Combined Document Exploitation Centre (CDEC) report dated 7 Nov 68 which was produced from documents captured by 1 ATF and RTAFV Forces in Sep and Oct 68.

Activation and Organisation

2. Activation of T7 was begun soon after the Second Phase of the General Offensive, that is between late May and early Jun 68. COSVN apparently saw the need to exert tighter command and control on subregion activities, therefore two new Military Regions were formed. Firstly MR-4 (T4) which controls Subregions 1,2,3 and 5, that is the territory to the WEST and NORTH of SAIGON, and secondly, MR-7 (T7), which controls the territory to the NORTHEAST, EAST and SOUTHEAST of SAIGON.
3. T7 controls the following areas:
 - a. Subregion 4. The area to the EAST and SOUTHEAST of SAIGON.
 - b. Subregion 8. VC U1 Province the portion of GVN BIEN HOA Province, SOUTH of the DONG NAI River including the BIEN HOA/LONG BINH complex.
 - c. Subregion 9. The VC BA LONG Province, which was the old VC BA BIEN Province, comprising GVN PHOUC TUY and LONG KHANH Provinces. BA LONG is a combination of the names BA BIEN and LONG KHANH.
 - d. The Coastal District. The area known as VC DUYEN HAI District, comprising GVN QUANG XUYEN and CAN GIU Districts of GVN BIEN HOA Province, which includes the area known as the RUNG SAT Special Zone.
4. A Chart showing the organisation of forces and activities of T7 is attached as Annex A.

Command Channels

5. T7 comes under the direct command of COSVN and SVNLA HQ. Within the Region there is a HQ (also known as T7 Command) consisting of the Military, Political and Rear Service Staff sections, reinforced with the subordinate units. Under the Region are the Subregions which retain their previous organisational structure.

Military Forces of Region T7

6. Infantry. It is possible that 5 VC li may be subordinate to T7, however at this stage 274 VC Regt is the only Regt confirmed as being subordinate to T7.
7. Artillery. Several artillery units are mentioned as being in support of T7.
 - a. 74 Arty Regt.
 - b. K34 Bn/96 Rocket Regt. This battalion is known to be equipped with 107mm and 122mm rockets. Little is known of its detailed organisation.
 - c. 208 Arty Bn. Although the original documents refer to an infiltrated NVA 208th Arty Bn, there are no further details available from any source.
8. Engineers. There are two Engineer type units subordinate to T7 mentioned in the original documents:
 - a. D67 Engr Bn. This battalion consists of a HQ and two companies, C22 and C24, each company being 50-70 strong. The battalion is currently

operating in WESTERN BA LONG Province or EASTERN SR 4. D67 was formerly subordinate to 5 VC Div.

b. D5 Sapper/Recon Bn. This battalion consisted of companies C5 (Sapper Coy), C23 (Mechanised Coy), C210 (Engr Coy) and C2 (ex Infiltration Group 2004A) and was apparently deactivated in early Oct 68. The four companies were to be formed into three independent companies under the direct command of a Military Staff, probably Subregion 4.

9. Rear Service Elements. T7 obtains rear service support from 81 Rear Service Group which is probably located in War Zone D, and from 84 Rear Service Group currently located in Central BA LONG Province.

Military Forces SR4

10. The following are the forces subordinate to SR4/T7:

a. 1st THU DUC Regt.

b. Group 10 Sapper Bn. This unit (AKA D10 and T10) consists of eight detachments and apparently operates in a sapper type role in the RUNG SAT area.

c. D6 Heavy Weapons Bn. This is a relatively new battalion consisting of K16 Mortar Coy, K17 RR Coy and K18 AA Coy which were originally subordinate to the 1st THU DUC Regt.

d. C240 and C245 LF Coys.

Military Forces of BA LONG Province.

11. The following are the forces subordinate to BA LONG Province/T7.

a. D440 and D445 LF Bns.

b. District Forces. There are a number of District Force units in the BA LONG Province, the ones of immediate interest to 1 ATF being C23 (XUYEN MOC P1), C25 (LONG DAT Coy) and C41 (CHAU DUC Coy).

Military Forces of U1 Province (SR8)

12. The major forces subordinate to U1/T7 are:

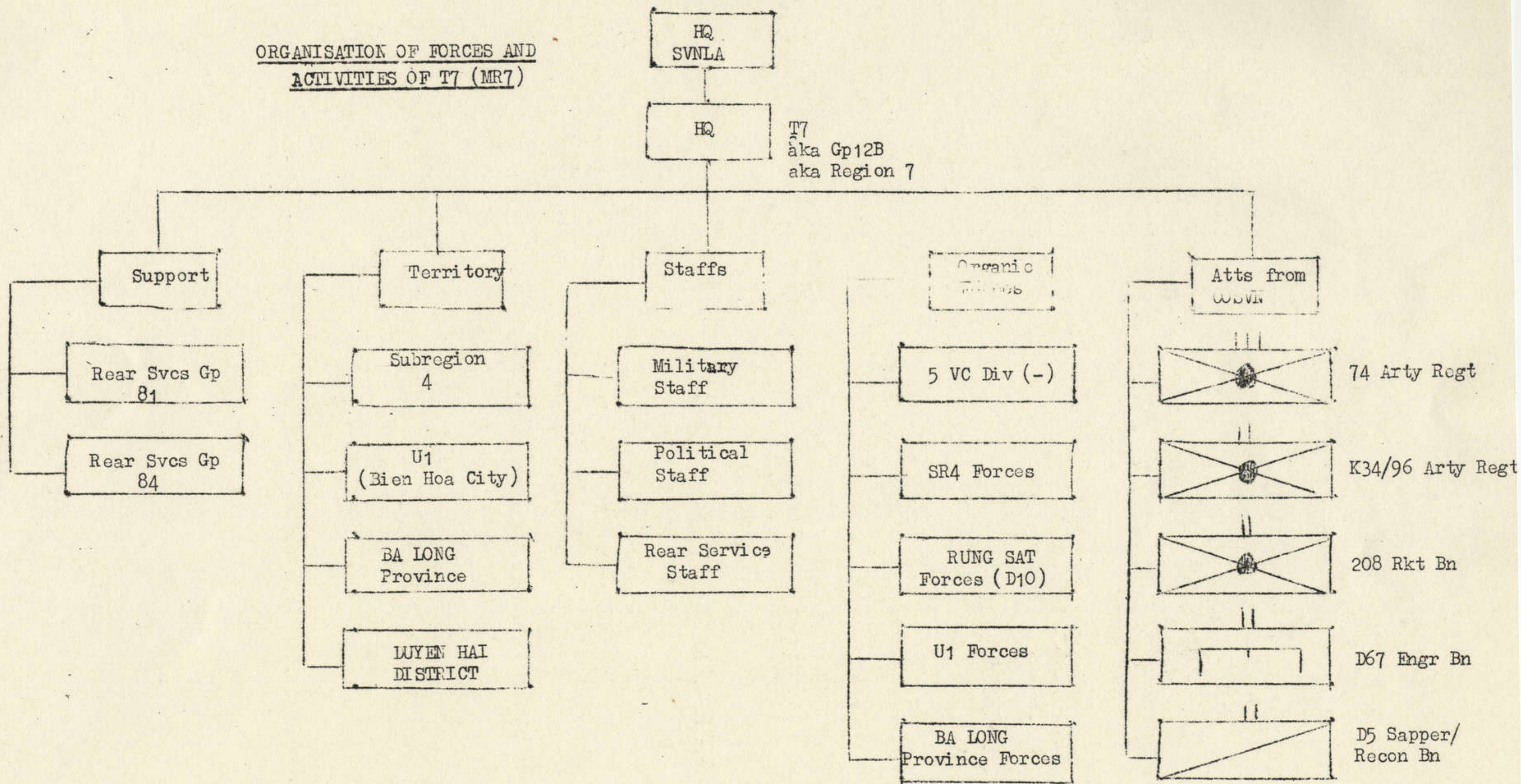

PART I

SIGNIFICANT ENEMY ACTIVITY INVOLVING 1 ALSG and 1 ATF

1. Friday 11 Apr 69. There were a number of minor occurrences in AO HUME, and two others of some importance. V Coy 4 RAR contacted 3 enemy in a camp at YS319846, killing one, wounding 1 and capturing amongst other things, six AK47 grenade launchers (which attach to the AK47 muzzle). This culminates a series of indications that the enemy is being issued this item. The other contact was at YS393639, where B Coy 5 RAR received RPG-2 and SA fire from an unknown number of enemy, inflicting one kill (by BC) and taking moderate casualties; 1 AUST KIA, 2 AUST WIA and 1 ARVN (Interpreter) WIA.
2. Saturday 12 Apr 69. There were a number of finds made in AO HUME resulting in a considerable quantity of foodstuffs and materiel being captured. At YS224834, 5/B/9 RAR wounded two and captured an M1 carbine during a contact with three enemy.
3. Sunday 13 Apr 69. Two kills (by BC) were made by the Task Force. The first was by 4 RAR at YS282840; where one enemy was killed and his AK47 captured; and the second at YS222831, by elements of 9 RAR, the result of a contact with an unknown number of enemy.
4. Monday 14 Apr 69. The Task Force killed three enemy during the day, all of whom were strays.
5. Tuesday 15 Apr 69. A two-part contact was made by V/4 RAR, at 0935 hrs, at YS299794. The NZ Coy ran into an estimated squad of enemy in a bunker system, sustaining 2 NZ WIA. Arty and a tactical airstrike were used in support and at 1245 hrs contact was resumed. Casualties on this occasion were 3 NZ WIA. The enemy casualties for the complete action were unknown.
6. Wednesday 16 Apr 69. There was only one contact with the enemy. At YS594603, 11/D/9 RAR were engaged by an unknown number of enemy who approached from the SOUTH-EAST. Results were 3 AUST WIA and 1 enemy KIA (BC).
7. Thursday 17 Apr 69. Elements of A Sqn 3 Cav detonated a mine causing mod damage to the APC at YS256802. An LAD vehicle moving to assist the APC detonated a further mine causing minor damage at YS255801. Neither mining caused any casualties and both damaged vehicles were recovered to 1 ATF Base. At 1730hrs D Coy 4 RAR, operating in AO BAROSSA, contacted an unknown number of enemy in a bunker complex in vic of YS3984. Results: Friendly casualties 5 AUST WIA; enemy casualties are unknown. In AO GLENELG B Coy 9 RAR sighted three VC in mixed dress. The enemy withdrew SW and W when contacted leaving 1 VC KIA (BC), 1 x AK47 and a pack containing personal items.

ENEMY ACTIVITY IN PHUOC TUY PROVINCE
AND THE VUNG TAU SPECIAL ZONE

1. Friday 11 Apr 69. There were six minor harrassing attacks in southern PHUOC TUY Province during the day, most taking place in the BARIA - LONG DIEN - DAT DO region. The attacks were directed principally against ARVN compounds, and gained the enemy only 2 RF WIA. Conversely, the enemy lost 2 KIA(BC) and two individual weapons.

2. Saturday 12 Apr 69. Omitted.

3. Sunday 13 Apr 69. Omitted.

4. Monday 14 Apr 69. Two PRU soldiers were ambushed by six enemy at YS422587. Results were 2 PRU WIA, with enemy casualties unknown.

5. Tuesday 15 Apr 69. Omitted.

6. Wednesday 16 Apr 69. Omitted.

7. Thursday 17 Apr 69. At 2230hrs The CAT LO Naval Base in VUNG TAU Special Zone recieved 5 x RPG-7 rounds fired from vicinity GR YS 364523. Results were 4 US WIA and minor damage to a barrack building.

INT COMMENT: Enemy activity continues at a low ebb. Nothing has been reported to indicate a serious change in the present pattern.

 - a. (180905H) At YS582586, 11/D/9 RAR sighted four enemy to their SOUTH in an area of a possible enemy rest camp.
 - b. (181255H) At YS580586, 12/D/9 RAR located an old bunker system.
 - c. (181330H) At YS562594 6/B/9 RAR located two tracks, one running NORTH EAST. The tracks had been well used in the previous 4 hours. It is believed the enemy had been drawing water from a B52 bomb crater in this area.
 - d. (181015H) At YS440860, 8/C/4 RAR located an enemy camp complex 100 x 30 metres. It is considered that the camp had been used in the last 24 hours.
 - e. (181128H) At YS473884 V Coy 4 RAR located a cache containing 100 lbs rice, 100 lbs grain, 100 lbs peanuts, 4 gallons of paint, 1 x 105mm shell and a quantity of 105mm fuzes.
 - f. (181210H) At YS448846, 7/C/4 RAR contacted 6 enemy with unknown results. During the sweep of the area 2 civilians were detained in a house where a quantity of stores were located.
 - g. (190955H) At YS602613 Aslt Pnrs/9 RAR located a fresh enemy camp. A landing point and fish traps were also located.
 - h. (190820H) At YS439860 C/4 RAR located nine bunkers and a tunnel system, estimated to have been used in the previous 24 hours.
 - j. (191020H) At YS439860 C/4 RAR found a quantity of documents.
 - k. (191040H) At YS471889 V/4 RAR located a water pump and a five inch pipeline laid as an irrigation system. The pump was driven by a tractor which was evacuated to Bn CP. A US Army water trailer and a water tank were also located in the vicinity. The following were also recovered.
 - (1) Eight gallons SA 30 oil.
 - (2) Four gallons rice wine
 - (3) 20 Lbs rice.
 - (4) 24 sheets of corrugated iron.
 - (5) One tractor also evacuated (total of 2)
 - l. (191455H) At YS472885 V/4 RAR located two bunkers. Recovered were 13 cans axle grease, 50 sticks solder, one bicycle and a quantity of documents.
 - n. (191900H) At YS473884 3/V/4 RAR ambushed two enemy who approached from the NORTH. The enemy returned the fire and withdrew with unknown losses SOUTH EAST. There were no friendly casualties.
 - n. (201530H) At YS557588 elements of B/9 RAR engaged one or two enemy moving NORTH EAST. Results were one enemy KIA(BC).
 - o. (201645H) At YS557588 7/B/9 RAR located an enemy base camp. M26 grenade and a quantity of type were located, both were destroyed with anti-aircraft fire.

- q. (201000H) At YS424768, 2/W/4 RAR located a cache containing 150 lbs rice, and a quantity of other food stuffs and a quantity of cloth.
- r. (211040H) At YS545574, 5/B/9 RAR located a coy sized enemy base camp of 35 bunkers, believed to have been used as a staging area for small groups.
- s. (211100H) At YS547575 5/B/9 RAR located a cache containing 500 lbs of rice and 1 x M-18 claymore complete.
- t. (211428H) At YS395864, 10/D/4 RAR contacted three enemy with unknown results. Recovered were: 160 lbs of rice, 2 grenades, 2 shovels, one water bottle and other misc items.
- u. (211645H) At YS473884, 3/V/4 RAR contacted three enemy with unknown results. The enemy withdrew SOUTH.
- v. (221815H) At YS432853 8/C/4 RAR contacted two enemy with unknown results.
- w. (221415H) At YS660815 3/A/3 Cav Regt sighted a group of enemy who were engaged by mortars by the Support Tp with unknown results.
- x. (201405H) At YS283640 a convoy from 5 Coy RAASC 1 ALSG, were engaged by an unknown number of enemy using grenades and small arms fire. Fire was returned with unknown results; there were no friendly casualties.
- y. (230910H) At YS394646 12/D/4 RAR contacted one enemy moving from the NORTHWEST who withdrew SOUTHWEST when contacted with unknown results.
- z. (231050H) In vic YS4284 4 RAR located a coy sized enemy base camp probably last occupied about three days ago.
- aa (230900H) At YS639613 C/5 RAR located an enemy base camp and a track leading SOUTH. The area had been recently used.
- bb. (231045H) At YS645635 D/5 RAR located an ammo box containing a quantity of documents.
- cc. (231340H) At YS642618 3/A/3 Cav Regt located a quantity of stores, including food, medical supplies and documents.
- dd. (231244H) At YS667604 8/C/5 RAR contacted 2-5 enemy dressed in black moving from the SOUTH to the NORTH. Results were 1 enemy KIA(BC) one SKS rifle and small quantities of SAA and documents.
- ee. (231325H) At YS667604 8/C/5 RAR contacted 2 enemy who withdrew NORTH with unknown losses.
- ff. (231345H) At YS667604 8/C/5 RAR contacted six enemy who withdrew NORTH with unknown results.

INT COMMENT:

It appears that there are no significant enemy forces occupying the LONG GREEN, but that they use it as a staging area and possibly a a ship-to-shore sampan supply point and a L of C to areas NORTH and EAST of XUYEN MOC.

Elements of 274 Regt believed to have been in AO BAROSSA appear to have withdrawn to their traditional sanctuaries approx GR YS 3790.

1. The following were the incidents reported during the reporting period.
 - a. (18 Apr 69) At YS460595, AN NHUT Village, 18 ARVN Div conducted a cordon and search operation which resulted in thirty six suspects being detained.
 - b. (180540H) At YS374629 455 RF Coy contacted an estimated squad of enemy. There were no casualties, 150 kilo bag of rice captured. Enemy withdrew NORTH.
 - c. (190920H) At PHU MY (YS2377) one RPG2 round impacted in the SOUTHERN end of the compound. There were no friendly casualties. Fire was returned with 60mm mortar with unknown results.
 - d. (191600H) At YS437617, elements of MIKE FORCE in a base camp received one round of 82mm mortar fire from a base plate in the vic of YS445540. There were no friendly casualties.
 - e. (Night 19/20 Apr 69.) At YS427597 a 40 year old male (suspected tax collector) was assassinated by an unknown number of enemy.
 - f. (200700H) At YS446578 1/43 ARVN received small arms fire from an estimated enemy squad. Results were 1 ARVN KIA. Enemy losses are unknown but blood trails were observed.
 - g. (210710H) At YS 253745 an unknown number of enemy fired one RPG round into the 771 RF Coy Compound. There were no friendly casualties.
 - h. (212000H) At YS502548, a 1/43 ARVN AP ambushed an estimated enemy platoon with unknown results. Spooky supported. A sweep of the area at first light revealed 3 enemy KIA(BC) and 2 x AK47s and 1 M2 carbine CIA.
 - j. (220035H) At YS420637. An unknown number of enemy fired 1 x RPG-2 round into LONG HOA Village. At YS419635, propaganda leaflets were spread around the school. No casualties were reported.
 - k. (220345H) At YS297568, 12 PF Pl engaged an unknown number of enemy attempting to enter LONG SON Village. The enemy returned fire with SA and RPG-2 fire, broke contact at 220045H and withdrew with unknown losses. Results one PF KIA, 1 PF WIA and 1 civilian WIA.
 - l. (220630H) At YS283630 an unknown number of enemy erected a roadblock and fired on a civilian vehicles. The roadblock contained 5lbs of TNT and was cleared by friendly elements by 220745H. There were no friendly casualties.
 - m. (232020H) At YS487594 SECTOR elements engaged an estimated enemy platoon who withdrew with unknown losses. There were no friendly casualties.

INT COMMENT:

Enemy activity in PHUOC TUY has continued to be at a low level equating with the situation in most of III Corps, where the enemy appears to be reassessing his position and reevaluating his strategy. The forthcoming week should be relatively calm with the enemy making his presence known by limited attacks by fire, harassment and propaganda activity.

PART I

SIGNIFICANT ENEMY ACTIVITY INVOLVING 1 ALSG AND 1 ATF FORCES.

1. The following incidents, which occurred during the reporting period, are considered to be of some significance.
 - a. (241600H) At YS 661601, 7/C/5 RAR located four bunkers.
 - b. (241625H) At YS 6561, 2/A/5 RAR located 25 lbs of Chicom explosive and 300 lbs of rice.
 - c. (251010H) At YS 658611, 3/A/5 RAR located a recently used bunker system. A quantity of 7.62mm SAA, fishing tackle and letters were recovered.
 - d. (251645H) At YS 657610 3/A/5 RAR located a platoon-sized weapon pit complex.
 - e. (251715H) At YS 473884, 3/V/4 RAR contacted nine enemy. Results were: 1 en (NVA) KIA(BC), 1 x AK47, 1 x pack, 2 x sets webbing, and a quantity of documents recovered. (Int Comment. Included in the documents were: a NVA Paybook, some Cambodian currency, and a certificate bearing a unit number:- No 2009. This probably refers to Infiltration Group 2009, which is believed to have arrived in the RVN in Jul 68, and to have been split between 7 NVA and 5 VC Divs.)
 - f. (252135H) At YS 442869 7/C/4 RAR contacted two enemy who approached from the NORTH. Results were: 1 en KIA(BC), 1 en WIA and 1 x rfl recovered.
 - g. (261130H) At YS 438848, C/4 RAR engaged three enemy. Results were: 3 en KIA(BC), 1 x AK47, 1 x RPG2 and 1 x M79 recovered.
 - h. (261850H) At YS 684645, D/5 RAR contacted ten or fifteen enemy who returned fire with RPGs. One Australian was slightly wounded.
 - j. (271050H) At YS 681635, 10/D/5 RAR located an enemy platoon in a defensive position. A tactical air-strike was conducted and the area was engaged by artillery.
 - k. (271240H) At YS 401801, 11/D/4 RAR contacted four enemy approaching from the WEST. Results were: 2 en KIA(BC), 1 x AK47, 1 x PRG2 and 2 x rds recovered.
 - l. (271542H) At YS 445898, 2/V/4 RAR contacted one enemy moving from NE to SW. Results were: 1 en KIA(BC), 1 x gren and 1 x transistor radio recovered.
 - m. (280123H) At YS 452899 and YS 445898, 1 and 2/V/4 RAR contacted eight to ten enemy who came from the NORTH. Results were: 3 en KIA(BC) 1 en WIA(PW), 3 x AK47, 4 x packs and 6 x M79 rds recovered. (Int Comment. The PW was later identified as belonging to HQ 274 VC Regt.)
 - n. (29 Apr) At YS 460598, AN NHUT Village, Det 1 Div Int Unit detained one member of the AN NHUT Propaganda and Proselytising Committee. He was subsequently surrendered to the Provincial Interrogation Centre (PIC).
 - o. (29 Apr) At YS 255746, PHU MY Village, Det 1 Div Int Unit conducted a cordon and search operation, resulting in four detainees.
 - p. (300730H) At YS 411780, 10/D/4 RAR contacted one enemy. Results were: 1 en KIA(BC) and 1 x SKS rfl recovered.

q. (301550H) At YS 556589, 1/A/5 RAR contacted three enemy. Results were: 3 en KIA(BC), 1 x AK47, 1 x pistol (NFI) and 2 x Chicom grenades recovered.

ENEMY ACTIVITY IN PHUOC TUY PROVINCE

AND THE VUNG TAU SPECIAL ZONE

1. The following were the incidents not involving Task Force or 1 ALSG elements, which took place in PHUOC TUY and VUNG TAU during the week.

a. (240505H) An UPTIGHT aircraft sighted sampans at YS 218600, YS 286605 and YS 235638. Enemy in the sampan at YS 235638 fired on the aircraft. No damage was sustained.

b. (252250H) At YS 2073, a patrol boat contacted one sampan moving WEST across the river. Results were: 1 en KIA(BC), 2 en PW, 1 x AK47 recovered and 1 x sampan destroyed.

c. (260615H) At DAT DO, vic YS 4859, elements of 612 RF Coy, returning from an ambush, tripped an enemy M26 grenade at their compound entrance. The enemy then fired RPG, SA and AW into the compound. Results were: 1 RF KIA and 1 RF WIA.

d. (281855H) At YS 501567, 2/48 ARVN compound received twenty to thirty rounds of 60mm mortar fire from an unknown base plate position. Fire ceased at 1905H. Results were 3 Civ wounded.

2. Intelligence Comment. VC Main Force elements continue to avoid major contact with 1 ATF in PHUOC TUY Province. In III Corps area generally, the enemy is disseminating new plans and policies for his next campaign. The dates 1 and 19 May have been mentioned in documents as commemorative dates for increased enemy activity. Reportedly a resolution put out by COSVN reflects a policy of military victory on the battlefield. Although the resolution has probably not reached the troop level as yet, it will in all probability be the basis on which the enemy will mount his Summer-Autumn campaign. Increased enemy activity will probably not occur until 10 - 15 May, when the enemy begins heralding HO'CHI MINH's Birthday, which occurs on 19 May.

General

1. Reference B is cancelled and superseded by this instruction.
2. EIS Inspections in this theatre have revealed that the servicing and inspection of B vehicles are not being carried out on a regular basis. In addition the results of servicing and inspections carried out are not properly recorded.

Aim

3. The aim of this instruction is to detail the procedure to be followed within 1 ALSG for the carrying out and recording of B vehicle servicing.

Definitions

4. Non Technical Inspections. Formal inspections of vehicles carried out by unit supervisory personnel other than RAEME tradesmen at prescribed intervals, in order to determine the standard of maintenance and general condition of the vehicle.
5. Technical Inspections. Formal inspections of vehicles carried out by qualified RAEME technical personnel in conjunction with mileage/periodic servicing of the vehicle by the driver. Technical inspections may be requested by unit CO/OCs at any time.

Servicing System

6. The frequency with which vehicle servicings are to be carried out are as shown hereunder, each corresponding with and replacing respectively the 2000, 4000 and 12000 miles procedure detailed in reference E:

/a. 1 month...

- a. 1 month or 1000 miles.
 - b. 2 months or 2000 miles.
 - c. 6 months or 6000 miles.
7. In each instance the service is to be carried out at the mileage or time period first expiring.
8. To ensure that trailers receive regular servicing they are to be married up with a particular truck and presented for service each time that truck becomes due.
9. The factors requiring attention at the above intervals are to be as detailed in section 4 of reference E except for the following variations:
- a. Air Cleaners
 - (1) Air cleaners are to be serviced not less frequently than fortnightly.
 - (2) The conditions experienced in Vung Tau and Phuoc Tuy Province are such that engine wear will be greatly accelerated if vehicles are operated with an excessive amount of sludge in the cleaner oil bath.
 - b. Transmission oils. If a vehicle has been operating in severe muddy conditions or has been waded, all transmission oils may be changed before servicing is due, at the discretion of the OC of the supporting RAEME element.

Technical Inspections

10. Each time a vehicle is presented to a RAEME repair element for servicing it will be technically inspected and the results recorded in section 2 of the vehicle's AB 417.
11. The extent of these inspections will be:
- a. Monthly or 1000 miles:
 - (1) Safety check.
 - (2) Check of any faults reported by the driver.
 - b. Two monthly or 2000 miles:

/(1) A full...

(1) A full technical inspection to assess the work required to maintain the operational efficiency of the vehicle.

12. At the completion of each two monthly inspection the inspector will classify the vehicle in accordance with EMEI GEN C 051, recording the classification in section 2 of the AB 417.

13. A vehicle is not to be reclassified after a monthly inspection unless it is found unroadworthy.

Non Technical Inspections

14. The following procedure is to be adopted for the conducting of non technical inspections:

a. Inspections are to be carried out fortnightly by a suitably qualified offr/NGO.

b. Vehicles are to be inspected using the appropriate proforma attached as Annexes A and B. These are to be used as a guide for the scope of the inspection.

c. Completed proformas are to be filed and held until inspected by the EIS team. They may then be destroyed.


d. Truck inspections are to be recorded in section 1 (Record of Servicing) of the vehicles AB 416, the entry showing date, vehicle mileage, the words 'non technical inspection' and the inspector's signature. Should Sect 1 to the AB 416 become full, a proforma type duplicate of Sect 1 is to be made and attached to the section.

e. Trailer inspections are to be recorded on the proforma attached as Annex C to this instruction. The proforma is to be stapled to the inside front cover of each trailer AB 417.

15. Units are to establish an adequate "Bring Forward" system to ensure that all vehicles are called forward regularly for servicing and inspections.

Conclusion

16. The importance of regular servicing is stressed. Without it satisfactory mechanical performance cannot be obtained and rapid deterioration will result. Adherence to the procedures detailed in this instruction will ensure a good standard of vehicle operation throughout 1 AISG.

CREDITING OF TAX AND VIETNAM ALLOWANCE

Reference: A. AFV R65-1-19 of 4 Sep 68.

General

Tax and Vietnam allowance adjustments result from the following sequence of action:

- a. Movements advise CARO of members departing Australia.
- b. CARO RO Part 2 to APAC and AFV.
- c. APAC PVA.
- d. Unit PVA action.

2. Some members of AFV have to wait up to eight weeks or more for their income tax and Vietnam allowance to be credited. This often causes hardship to the soldier, and equally important, to his family.

3. The following are the ingredients of the delays:

- a. Slow response by CARO in producing ROs Part 2.
- b. Slow response by APAC in producing the PVA.
- c. Failure by units to notify CARO that ROs Part 2 have not been received.
- d. Failure by units to notify APAC that PVAs have not been received.
- e. Delays in entering PVAs in paybooks and advising the members.

Action on Delays

4. Action designed to speed up the issue of PVAs by APAC has been taken by HQ AFV. The stated aim of COMAFV is that PVAs should be received by units not later than the second pay day after a member arrives in theatre. However units also have responsibilities in relation to this matter and they are to ensure that UPRs:

/a.

- a. Adapt the Paybook Register to record:
 - (1) A member's arrival in Vietnam.
 - (2) The date the PVA is received.
 - (3) The date the CARO RO Part 2 is received.

- b. Review the Register immediately after each pay day for outstanding PVAs and ROs Part 2 and originate signals in respect of members who have been in theatre for two pay day as follows:
 - (1) If neither RO or PVA received. Signal CARO (info APAC "For Admin Offr") advising member's regimental particulars, date of arrival in theatre and stating RO Part 2 not received.
 - (2) If RO received but PVA not received. Signal APAC ("For Admin Offr") regimental particulars of member, requesting PVA and quoting RO number.
 - (3) If PVA received but RO not received. Signal CARO regimental particulars of member, advising date of arrival in theatre and stating RO Part 2 not received.


Returns

5. At the end of each month units are to advise HQ 1 ALSG, as per Annex A to this instruction, of the regimental particulars of personnel who have been in theatre for two pay days or more for whom ROs Part 2 or PVAs have not been received. The return is to show the number of weeks each member named has been in Vietnam and whether or not follow up action, in accordance with para 4b above, has been taken with APAC/CARO. A member's name is to be included on each return until both the PVA and RO have been received.

6. 1 ALSG is to forward unit returns to HQ AFV (for Financial Advisor) without delay.

Anticipation of EVAs

7. Units are reminded of the provisions of Financial Instruction for ARA units No 343. This instruction allows anticipation of the receipt of PVAs, in certain circumstances, so that monies may be made available to the member concerned.



6. Here are some pointers on the storage of WP ammunition:-


- (a) Segregate from other types ammunition if possible.
- (b) Always have a water filled container nearby. The container should be large enough to accomodate a complete box of the WP ammunition you are storing E.G. a 44 gallon drum for gun or mortar ammunition
- (c) Do not stack the ammunition more than three or four cases high, also make sure that every box is readily accessible.
- (d) Should you smell WP or see smoke coming from any package isolate the offending package and place it in water immediately (WP is quite safe when immersed in water), then call for either myself or the ammunition technician with 26Coy RAASC to come and remove it.

It is not pleasant to get burnt by WP, my predecessor can attest to that.

Ammo Point Fire at NUI DAT

7. As was advised in the 22 Feb 69 newsletter units finding any ammunition which was thrown out of the immediate surrounds of the AP as result of the fire/explosions should contact EMPIRE switch and ask for the ATO or the AT. DO NOT ATTEMPT TO MOVE OR OTHERWISE INTERFERE WITH ANY AMMUNITION SO FOUND AS IT MUST BE REGARDED AS HIGHLY DANGEROUS.

Note. One M26 grenade was recovered by me in the 161(Indep) Recce Flt OR's lines which is quite a way from the AP.







- a. If the 2.75in rocket or rocket crated or uncrated is dropped a distance exceeding two feet on a hard surface such as wood, concrete, metal or hard packed earth, reject the rocket or rocket mortar.



Cartridge, 81MM HE, M374, W/FUZE PD M524 A5

a. Whilst moving subject rounds from storage position to a main bunker, one round detonated injuring three and killing two US soldiers. It was reported that at the first storage position, the rounds were in the open out of their containers with the fuze safety pins removed. The fuze must have become armed after the safety pins were removed, since the safety can not be removed if a fuze is in the armed position. The M524 A5 fuze is designed to prevent the removal of the plunger safety pin if the arming mechanism starts to arm. It has been concluded that the accident was not a malfunction of the ammunition but was caused by malpractice, i.e., failure to reinsert safety pin when rounds were not fired.

b. Users are cautioned to follow the following safety precautions when handling the subject item. The pull wire and attached setback and plunger safety pins will not be removed until the cartridge is ready to be fired. If safety pins have been withdrawn and the round is not fired, the pins should be reinserted in reverse order to render the fuze safe. If the plunger safety pin (upper pin) cannot be reinserted, the fuze may be armed. Such a round should not be fired as it may be premature. It should be handled with extreme care and the ATO or an AT called to the firing point.

43. NEW SEALED ROADS - 1 ALSG

1. The cutback asphalt (MC800) used for the sealing of the 1 ALSG internal road system takes up to three (3) months in this climate to cure and harden.

2. During the curing period any sharp turning or sudden braking by vehicles will cut through the double bituminous surface to the base course. The effect of this damage will be greater in the wet season. Water will penetrate the surface course and cause lifting of the surface or failure of the base course.

3. Care on the part of drivers may prevent the need for extensive road reconstruction after the next wet season.

4. Within 1 ALSG, driver are not to:

a. Exceed the 15 mph speed limit.

b. Other than in an emergency, execute sharp turns or brake suddenly.

c. Use sealed roads as test tracks for wheeled or tracked vehicles.

47. OUT OF BOUNDS - AMERICAN R AND R CENTRE

1. The American 'in-country' R and R Centre in VUNG TAU is Out Of Bounds to all Australian personnel. This follows the American policy that the Centre is for US personnel on R and R only, and is not for other US personnel who may be stationed in or visiting VUNG TAU.

48. OUT OF BOUNDS AREA

1. ST KILDA helipad and the associated packing and holding area are declared Out Of Bounds to all ranks, and personnel are not to enter therein.

2. Entry to the area is restricted to those personnel whose duty requires them to move on to the pad or into the packing and holding area.

49. PETS

1. For hygienic reasons and the risk of infection, no animals are to be kept as pets in the 1 ALSG area.

2. This order is to be reprinted in unit Routine Orders Part One.

50. SPEED LIMITS - DE LONG PIER

1. The speed limit for the De Long Pier and compound is 10 MPH.

2. Drivers are not to exceed this limit.

51. BLASPHEMY, INDECENCY AND IMMORAL CONVERSATION (AMR 207)



AUSTRALIAN CIVILIAN SUPPORT FOR MILITARY CIVIC ACTION IN VIETNAM

1. Australian civilian support for military civic action in Vietnam is co-ordinated by AHQ (DMO and P). Therefore it is essential that organizations and individuals seeking to assist in military civic action deal with AHQ and not direct with members serving in Vietnam. To this end the following orders apply:

a. Any member receiving correspondence containing offers of assistance for military civic action, from any organization (even where the addressee is a member of the organization) or any stranger not known to the addressee, is to confine his reply to:

(1) A courteous acknowledgement of receipt of the correspondence.

(2) A statement that the matter has been referred to AHQ for attention: and,

(3) Advice that any further enquiries should be addressed to the:

Secretary, Department of the Army,
Canberra, ACT.

b. All details of such offers of assistance are to be given by members to their units, which will in turn forward the details through normal channels to HQ AFV.

c. Any member who may have already entered into correspondence with any organization or stranger on military civic action should now inform their correspondent that it is necessary for any further dealings to be made through AHQ to ensure proper co-ordination of the assistance.

d. Further, details of any organization or stranger enquiring of member for details of military civic action are also to be referred to HQ AFV in the same way.


2. This order is not intended to prevent members accepting donations from personal friends and relations, but such persons should be advised that any goods they send addressed to individual members in Vietnam must go through the postal system at the donor's expense. In the past, embarrassment has been caused to the AMF by well meaning persons collecting goods at the request of members and then expecting the AMF to accept the responsibility for forwarding the donations to Vietnam.

/3. This...

3. This Routine Order is to be published quarterly in unit routine orders.

58. STORAGE OF CLASSIFIED DOCUMENTS

1. Attention is drawn to Section 3, para 7 of 1 ALSG Standing Orders which details the storage of classified documents.
2. Desks held on inventory, whose drawers can be locked are considered suitable containers for CONFIDENTIAL documents until such time that steel cabinets with combination locks become available.
3. The locking of a building in which classified documents are housed is NOT an adequate security precaution.
4. Classified waste may be stored in postal bags locked by heavy brass padlocks if no other suitable storage space is available.

59. TRANSMISSION OF SPIRITUOUS LIQUORS THROUGH THE POST

Reference: A. R352/5/4.

1. Commonwealth of Australia Postal Regulations prohibit the transmission of inflammable substances (including liquors) having a flash point of less than 80 degrees F. through the post.
2. Investigation has revealed that spirituous liquors having a proof rating in excess of 85 Proof US or 74 UK come within this category and are therefore not to be transmitted by members through the post to Australia.
3. There is no objection, however, to member posting spirituous liquors to Australia provided:

/a. They...

- a. They have a proof rating below the stipulated figure.
 - b. They are packed safely and in such a manner that damage will not result to other posted items should the bottle/bottles break.
 - c. The member is prepared to pay any duty imposed by the Department of Customs and Excise (Customs concessions on spirituous liquors only apply when members are physically arriving in Australia).
4. It should be noted that most spirituous liquors available in SVN are within the approved limits.
5. The proof rating is displayed on the label of most spirituous liquors sold in Vietnam. Where any doubt exists it is to be checked against the PX catalogue held in PX and ASCO establishments.

Promulgation

6. The contents of paragraphs 1 to 5 of this Routine order are to be published immediately in all unit Routine Orders and are to be republished not less than once in every three calendar months.

60. TRUCKS $\frac{3}{4}$ TON TECHNICAL LOADING - CARRIAGE OF PERSONNEL

Reference: A. R746/1/5.

1. It is extremely dangerous to carry passengers on the tray of $\frac{3}{4}$ ton vehicles with platform trays. The maximum number of personnel which may be carried in these vehicles is two, including the driver. Under no circumstances are passengers to be carried on the tray.
2. This order is to be reproduced in unit routine orders.

61. MINISTERIALS

Reference: R639/1/3

1. There was a recent ministerial enquiry, resulting from a request from a senator, on whether or not a soldier could take his R and R leave at a particular time in order to be best man at his brother's wedding. The unit advised that the member had elected to take his R and R in Taipei and that all vacancies to Australia on 31 Mar 69 were filled. This information was relayed to the minister who told the senator. He in turn advised the soldier's parents that their son would be unable to RTA for the wedding. The member then changed his R and R arrangements and attended the wedding. The senator was most embarrassed to read about this in a newspaper. The unit concerned should have realised what had happened and notified HQ AFV.

/2. Ministerials

2. Ministerials are very sensitive and are not to be treated lightly. They are to be investigated thoroughly, accurately and rapidly and the answer forwarded by PRIORITY signal to HQ AFV. A "watching brief" is to be kept on any soldier who is the subject of a ministerial. A suggested method of doing this is to bring forward the relevant files weekly. Any action which is likely to affect the advice which has been sent to the minister is to be reported to HQ AFV.

63. REPORTING OF FAULTS/COMPLAINTS - EMU SWITCHBOARD

1. All telephone faults are to be reported to the Switchboard Supervisor (EMU 234). Reports to other members of Det 110 Sig Sqn will not be acknowledged or actioned.
2. The member reporting the fault is to give his name and the location of the faulty telephone. Once repaired, the line will be checked and reported in order by the Switchboard Supervisor.
3. Complaints are to be directed to 1 ALSG Communications Officer (EMU 233) during duty hours and to the Signals Duty Officer (EMU 236) at other times.

64. SECURITY OF WEAPONS

1. Units are to ensure that weapon racks in their areas are made as secure as possible by virtue of their location and by surveillance.

65. DANGER FROM UNEXPLODED SHELLS AND BOMBS

Reference: A. R1300 - 1 - 7.

1. All personnel are warned of the dangers of driving a vehicle off the road or formed tracks in the 600 metre extension, i.e., that area outside the NORTH and STEPTOE gates immediately north of the main perimeter. This area is thickly strewn with unexploded shells and bombs of various types, and many are in a very dangerous fuze condition.
2. The area is to be used for authorised military purposes only. Any suspicious objects should not be touched, but are to be reported immediately to the ATO, (EMU 166).

66. 16MM PROJECTORS AND FILMS - CARE OF

1. To avoid damage to both 16mm projectors and films, units are to ensure that:
 - a. Trained projectionists only are permitted to operate projection equipment.
 - b. Projectors are properly maintained and adequately protected against moisture, dust and heat. Covers are to be provided and equipment is to be carefully stored when not in use.
 - c. Films are to be returned to the issuing authority, or forwarded as directed immediately on completion of showing.



DFRB PENSIONS AND CONTRIBUTIONS

1. The contributions and pensions of some contributors to the DFRB Fund have altered following the pay rise on 25 Oct 68.
2. Details are contained in ARO 13/69, a copy of which is available for perusal by application to the Orderly Room.
3. The increased contributions - which are consequential upon the increased pensions - are mandatory for members who commenced contributing to the Fund after 13 Dec 59 or who were second lieutenants, RMC cadets, private recruits, or apprentices at that date. No action is required by such personnel who are termed post 1959 contributors. Any adjustment of contribution is effective on and from pay day 7 Nov 68 and will be made by APAC and advised through normal channels.
4. Remaining personnel are known as pre-1959 contributors. Some may elect NOT to contribute for the new pension increase. Others may not be eligible to contribute because of a similar previous election to freeze contributions. Some may be eligible to take up pension increases previously rejected. Details of such elections, and their effects and any election action are contained in paragraphs 16, 17, 21 and 22 of the ARO. Any adjustment of contributions, where applicable, will be made by APAC and advised through the normal channels.
5. Paragraph 23 of the ARO makes provision for a pre 1959 contributor to defer an increase in contributions on the grounds of hardship.
6. Pre 1959 contributors are advised that the exercising of rights of elections is a matter for their personal examination and decision. Care should therefore be taken in studying the position and in ensuring any rights are exercised within the prescribed time limits.

VISITORS TO 1 ALSG AREA

1. For security reasons access to the 1 ALSG area must be controlled. Except on duty or by invitation entry to the area by other than Australian or New Zealand servicemen is prohibited. The exception to this is the access permitted to US servicemen to the PX and Concessionaire shops in accordance with a reciprocal agreement.
2. The requirement for controlled access applies to the Peter Badcoe Club area (including swimming pool) and the beach within the 1 ALSG boundaries. Access to both areas is controlled for security reasons. In addition access to the Peter Badcoe Club area is restricted to prevent overtaxing the limited amenities facilities which are provided to meet the requirements of the Australian Force Vietnam.
3. There is no objection to American visitors being invited into the 1 ALSG area whether it be to the Peter Badcoe Club, beach or unit messes, but at all times visitors are to be accompanied by their host (s). Except in special cases no member is to invite more than two visitors to the Peter Badcoe Club, swimming pool or beach. If special cases arise the necessary authority can be issued by any CO/OC, senior HQ 1 ALSG staff officer or HQ 1 ALSG duty officer to permit access the Peter Badcoe Club/Beach area, but the OC Amenities and Welfare Unit is to be informed accordingly. Some standing invitations to individuals or groups with which HQ 1 ALSG or units work closely will be issued on the authority of the Comd 1 ALSG. In these cases there is no requirement for the visitors to be accompanied by an Australian or New Zealand serviceman.
4. No officers or sergeants mess, or unit club or canteen in the 1 ALSG area is an open mess. Visitors to messes/clubs must be accompanied by their hosts. "Blanket" invitations are not to be issued as these can give the impression that the mess or club is an "open" mess. The restrictions and courtesies regarding informal visits by officers and senior NCOs to unit clubs/canteens and officers to sergeants' messes also apply to visiting American officers and senior NCOs.
5. The previous paragraph is not intended to restrict the normal application of honorary membership to officers and sergeants messes or invitations to official mess and unit functions.

1. Over the past few weeks, Det 11 MG Gp has had many instances of personnel from units contravening AFV SOP's regarding Intra-theatre Air Travel. The most common occurrences are:-
 - a. Personnel arriving late for flights.
 - b. Personnel arriving at CHARLIE RAMP wishing to travel without having made prior booking.
 - c. Units booking personnel direct with Air Movements Section RAAF, without following the correct procedure ie: through Det 11 MG Gp VUNG TAU.
 - d. Personnel failing to report for flights without having notified Det 11 MG Gp.
2. To remedy the present unsatisfactory situation, Units are requested to:-
 - a. Conform to the reference and understand the procedures.
 - b. Check with Det 11 MG Gp VUNG TAU, to be positive that return bookings have been confirmed.
 - c. Inform their personnel to check with Movements at their destination that their return booking has been made.
 - d. Note that the report time for ALL flights is 30 mins prior to departure.
3. AFV Scheduled intra-theatre air services are attached as Annex A to this order.


