COMMANDERS DIARIES
INSTRUCTIONS

AIM

1. The aim of a Commanders Diary is to provide data on which to base future improvements in Army training, equipment, organization and administration, and to furnish historians with a record of the activities of units and formations in operational and non-operational periods in peace and in war.

GENERAL

2. Entries are to be made daily on AF C 2118 (Adapted) each entry being initialled by the officer detailed to keep it.
3. Commanders Diaries will conform with the rules for drafting orders given in "Staff Duties (Australia)" Chapter 2, Section 12.

RESPONSIBILITY

During Non-operational Periods

4. A Commanders Diary is to be compiled by commanders of all formations.

During Operational Periods (1)

5. A Commanders Diary is to be compiled in duplicate by:
 - a. Commanders of all formations.
 - b. Each branch of the staff at formation headquarters commanded by a brigadier or above.
 - c. Heads of services not below the rank of lieutenant colonel.
 - d. Personal staffs and officers holding special appointments.
 - e. Unit commanders.
 - f. Commanders of a detachment of a unit when so ordered.

COMPILATION

6. Both original and duplicate copies are to consist of:
 - a. Cover (AF C 2119) (Adapted).
 - b. Index as printed on cover.
 - c. Narrative (AF C 2118) (Adapted).
 - d. Annexes as shown in the Index.
7. All details of the unit or formation (if a detachment is concerned, the name of the parent unit), period covered and enclosure numbers of the annexes are to be shown on the cover. If there has been a change of command since the last report, the date of assumption by the new commanding officer is to be included.
8. The annexes are to be assembled in the groups shown on the cover. If there are no enclosures for an annex NIL will be entered on the cover. If additional annexes are convenient for a particular headquarters, the relevant starting at B.

COMBAT DIARIES DISPOSAL

13. **Original Commander's Diary.** This is to be forwarded monthly, unless otherwise ordered, by seventh day of the succeeding month direct to AHQ.

14. **Duplicate Commander's Diary.** This must be clearly marked as a duplicate. It is to be sent separately from the original to AHQ one month after the original has been despatched but not before the former has been acknowledged.

15. When overseas, both copies of diaries are to be sent through the Army Records organization in the overseas theatre but at different times.

16. **TOP SECRET Supplementary Diaries.**

a. The documents referred to in Paragraph 9 together with a list of them made out on AF C 2118 (Adapted) must be placed in separate cover (AF C 2119) (Adapted). All details must be filled in and the cover clearly marked in red: "ANNEX Z — OFFICER ONLY". It may be convenient to group the papers by appendices.

b. Supplementary diaries must be forwarded under the normal rules for TOP SECRET correspondence, to AHQ. The inner envelope must be plainly marked:

c. The duplicate supplementary diaries must be despatched as shown in Paragraph 14 as soon as receipt of the original has been acknowledged.



SECURITY OF INFORMATION

1. The following is an excerpt from a US Intelligence publication.
 - a. " On 15 Apr 69 two Vietnamese employees of a large US construction company were apprehended at the Binh Thuy Helicopter Maintenance Facility with documents entitled " UNCLASSIFIED, FOR OFFICIAL USE ONLY " in their possession. These documents, consisting of training manuals for the Army HU-1 helicopter, Navy OV-10 aircraft, and various communications equipment, were found intermingled with old newspapers and trash. A third Vietnamese employee of the Construction Firm was also apprehended while attempting to push approximately twenty pounds of similar publications under the perimeter fence. One of the employees admitted to the Military Security Service (MSS) that he had been contacted by local Viet Cong and instructed to collect documents. He was told he would be killed if he refused, and paid \$20,000VN (approx \$170.US) if he obtained valid information. Further investigation revealed that the publications were taken from trash bins located outside the Aviation Administration Building. Army Intelligence at Phu Bai Combat Base also reported incidents similar to the foregoing. On two occasions in mid-March, MP discovered Air Force and Marine Corps forms, computer printouts, various technical manuals, and nine documents marked " FOR OFFICIAL USE " during vehicle inspections. However, the Vietnamese involved in these incidents appeared to be refuse collectors."
2. This report is merely one more in a long chain of indications that the enemy is vitally interested in obtaining virtually all and any official service documents, many of which would appear to our eyes to be of little or no value to him.
3. All Unit Security Officers of addressee units are to ensure that current methods of disposal of paper waste are adequate to preclude the possibility of any useful material falling into the hands of the enemy.

SIGNIFICANT ENEMY ACTIVITY INVOLVING 1 ALSG AND 1 ATF FORCES

1. The following incidents, which occurred during the reporting period, are considered to be of some significance.

a. (221700H) At YS283722 1/V/6 RAR reported contents of a cache found as: 560 lbs rice, 4 gallons kerosene, 20 lbs Sodium Nitrate, quantity of cloth.

b. (221955H). At YS630620, an APC from B/3 Cav Regt struck a mine. Results: Two AUST WIA (evac).

c. (231625H) At YS3652, 7/C/5 RAR contacted six enemy. Results: One enemy KIA (BC), one enemy KIA (POSS), one AK47 captured. While conducting sweep, after initial contact, 7 Pl was fired on by possible RPG fire at YS333654. No further contact was made. 7 Pl withdrew, because of darkness.

d. (231045H) At YS732672, B/1 Armed Regt contacted a carrying party of seven to eight enemy. Results: Two enemy WIA, six packs and a large batch of documents captured.

e. (241105H). At Ys331647 9/C/5 RAR contacted one enemy. Results: one enemy WIA (bloodtrail), one pack, containing clothes and documents, captured. The bloodtrail was followed to an enemy camp at YS330648, where the wounded enemy and two others were sighted. The enemy then withdrew SOUTH. A further camp was located at YS332652; it had been used in the previous two hours, was three weeks old and had sleeping caves for 15 men.

i. (251155H). At YS499588, D/9RAR located 6000 lbs of rice in a house. The rice in excess of 100 lbs was backloaded to Sector elements who also detained one suspect.

j. (251245H) At YS501589, elements of 12/D/9 RAR detonated an M16 mine resulting in three AUST WIA. Two other M-16 mines were also recovered.

k. (251225H) At YS457562, elements of 4/B/9 RAR detonated one M-16 mine resulting in two AUST WIA.

 (261830H). At HOA LONG (YS4659) -3.
- n. (271345H). At YS312699, 4/B/5 RAR located a cache of medical supplies, 90 LBS rice, three anti tank grenades, five RPG boosters one AK47, 400 7.62mm short rounds and 1000 5.56mm rounds.
- o. (271516H). At YS288772, 2/A/5 RAR contacted six enemy. Results Three enemy KIA (BC), Two enemy WIA (blood trail), one armalite captured.
- p. (270700H). At YS466884, elements of B/1 Armd Regt located a rubber processing plant. It is considered the area was occupied by 30-40 enemy in the last seven days.
- q. (271805H). At YS466884, elements of B/1 Armd Regt and D and E platoon contacted twenty enemy. Results. One enemy KIA (BC), six enemy WIA (bloodtrails), two AK47, 2000 AK47 rounds and two anti tank chicom grenades captured.
- r. (271655H) At YS745677, 2/B/3 Cav detonated an enemy mine. Results. Four Aust WIA, vehicle heavily damaged.
- s. (281235H) At YS461558, 6/B/9 RAR and engr elements in enemy camp were engaged by est four enemy who fired RPG and S/A. Results: One Aust KIA, three Aust WIA, One enemy WIA. Enemy withdrew west.
- t. (281200H). At Ph uoc Hai (YS5153) Det 1 Div Int Unit detained two suspected VC..

INT COMMENT. ALFA. Enemy reaction to 1 ATF operations in and around the populated areas of Phouc Tuy has been marked by a significant increase in small scale harrassing attacks directed against the civil population, especially RD Cadre posts in Long Dien, Dat Do and Hoa Long. This increase indicates that 1 ATF pacification operations are creating difficulties for the VC and are forcing him to react to demonstrate to the civilian population his ability to retaliate despite the military operations mounted against him.

BRAVO. The large numbers of enemy, including many WIA persons, moving East and West along the Phouc Tuy- Long Khanh Provincial Boundary suggests that a multi-Battalion redeployment is in progress. This movement is possibly associated with the reported heavy casualties inflicted on 33 NVA Regiment, South West of Xuan Loc by B52 raids forcing that formation to withdraw through secure areas to its old base in Southern Long Khanh Province. The reported heavy casualties received by 274 VC Regt in recent contacts with RT AVF elements in the Binh Son Plantation area could also be the cause of this movement pattern.

CHARLIE. There is no firm intelligence to support the reports of a PW WIA in Vung Tau area on 22-23 May 69 that an attack on 1 ATF Base at Nui Dat including rocket and Mortar ABF is to be mounted on 23 May 69. ABF on the populated areas of the province are more likely to fit in with the general trend of enemy operations in the TAOR.

1. The following were the incidents not involving 1 ATF or 1 ALSG ELEMENTS, which took place in Phuoc Tuy and Vung Tau during the week.
 - a. (220200H) At Hoa Long (YS4264) the compound received received small arms fire. Fire was returned with unknown results.
 - b. (220500H) At YS30627, I & R Platoon contacted an estimated enemy force of two platoons. Results: One enemy KIA (BC), one AK-47 captured.
 - c. (221900H) At YS417647, 609 RF Company contacted an estimated enemy squad. Results: One enemy WIA and captured, one M-16 captured.
 - d. (230125H) At vic YS3049, De Long Pier area, a party of 4 or 5 enemy swimmers/sappers attempted to sabotage the SS HEREDIA and the LSM USS HICKMAN COUNTY. MP patrol from the 560th MP Coy US and FBR engaged the swimmers with SA fire and concussion grenades. Results: 1 enemy PW, 1 enemy WIA (PW), 1 x Russian Limpet mine and 1 x VC water mine (misfired) recovered by Aust EOD Team.
 - e. (241550) At YS325024, 11 ACR elements contacted an unknown number of enemy. Results: six enemy KIA (BC), one .50 cal MG captured.
 - f. (271735H) At YS330510, members of 3 CDF RAN (Aust EOD Team) recovered a Russian Limpet mine, attached to a small flotation device, thought to be the one cut loose by one of the swimmers mentioned in sub para d. above.

LATE ENTRY. YS230700. There is a VC Rear Service base located vicinity above coords. The base is used to supply elements of the E-5 Main Force Regiment. The supplies come from Vung Tau, by means of waterways or from the Thai Thien area (YS222800) by means of the Rach Nuoc Lon and then the Thi Vai River. At the time of observation, there was approximately 150 men from the K-10 unit providing security for the base camp. The VC set up sub-Rear Service offices at unspecified local residents to buy food supplies for them. The supplies are delivered one time per week to the Ban Thach area (YS230700). Source: 525 MI GP. EVAL: US F-3, S-2 Adv F-3.

3. MSS REPORT ON FWS CAPTURED IN VUNG TAU NIGHT OF 22/23 MAY 69.

a. (Quote) On the night of 22/23/5/69, US Forces defending the New Port at RACH DIA (YS303492) had captured 2 NVA (infiltration) communist cadre soldiers, while they were carrying out acts of sabotage.

1. Cadre soldier NGUYEN VAN CAN of Coy C3/Engineers, NVA (infiltration), together with 4 other members, had moved by boat from PHUOC TUY Province mainland to YS291495. Here, CAN, together with another member, waded across the river with intentions of carrying out sabotage missions. The subject was captured at 0100 hrs with about 12 kg of TNT. The others had managed to escape. The subject further stated that Coy C3/engineers had already despatched a lot of missions cells, a number of which had infiltrated PHUOC TUY Province for preparations for an attack on this Province starting on 24-5/69. There is one main force battalion supported by guerilla elements.

2. Cadre soldier NGUYEN VAN BON, of Coy C19/Recce NVA (infiltration), went on the mission with a cell leader. They were carried on a motorized sampan by a peoples' agent called ONG GIA NAM (old man NAM) at 0100 hrs to YS308512. Here ONG GIA NAM left the two communists cadre soldiers and promised to return on the night of the 23 May 69. Cadre soldier BON waded across the river to do recce and was captured at 0400 hrs at YS305495. The cell leader had stayed up at CU LAO ((TN probably means tall grass on river)).

Comments by VUNG TAU MSS: the cadre soldiers seemed to be sincere. It is probable that:

1. The VC will attack PHUOC TUY Province as planned.

2. It is possible that the Recce Cell leader is still up at the "CU LAO" and that the Peoples' agent ONG GIA NAM will bring the sampan back on the night of 23 May 69 as promised.

Further Interrogation reports will be disseminated.

4. INT COMMENT. C3 and C19 are usually used as designators for

Third Inf Coy 1st Bn, any regt and Engr Coy, any regt; respectively. One of each of these type of companies are held against the ORBAT of 274 VC Regt, and the FW are stated to have come from PHUOC TUY Province, in the NW corner of which 274 VC Regt is currently held. The connection, however, is tenuous at best, and it should not be assumed that 274 VC Regt is necessarily the parent unit.

a. The following is an extract from MACV DISUM 137-79 dated 17 May 69.

PW (NGUYEN VAN CHUYEN) captured on 6 May 69 in Southern BIEN HOA Province (YS152745), provides information concerning his unit, the 10th Sapper Group which operates in the RSSZ. He states amongst other things that the 10th is subordinate to MR7 and shares its mission to interdict the movement of supplies over its areas of operation specifically the LONG TAU Channel and Route 15. According to the PW MR7 has been ordered to concentrate on destroying allied POL and munitions. The PW states that these missions will be carried out in a Summer Campaign of several Phases and that preparations for this campaign was completed at the end of April.

b. Current holding for this unit (Group 10 River Sappers) show that the enemy have some 600 in this unit and as a Regimental sized group, is broken down into Military Areas A and B. Area A being NE of the LONG TAU Channel and Area B, SW of the LONG TAU. Each area has a bn type command gp, and three MF sapper/inf coys. These coys are composed largely of NVA and are well trained and well armed. The enemy is also known to have a swimmer capacity.

Comment: Other Intelligence Factors.

- a. The enemy plans a country wide Summer Offensive.
- b. The target of the enemy's Summer Offensive is US and Allied logistic and base areas.
- c. There has been an increase in enemy activity in the vicinity of LONG SON Island. The enemy have established several base camps in the mangrove swamps to the West and North of LONG SON.
- d. It has been reported that the enemy has infiltrated and cached some 24 x 122mm rockets on LONG SON.
- e. With the coming of the Wet Season, allied operations are severely hampered in the RUNG SAT.
- f. It is expected that the enemy will make the holiday period 15th to 20th May a high point in their activity.

Assessment: The enemy has always had the capability of limited attacks by fire against the VUNG TAU Special Zone. At present, indications are that there is a distinct possibility that the enemy will conduct limited attacks by fire against VUNG TAU and against Allied shipping in the area.

1. The following incidents, which occurred during the reporting period, are considered to be of some significance.
 - a. (150830H) In DAT DO, vic YS 4859, a 1 ATF reaction force moved with 9 RAR to support RF, PF and ARVN elements which had been in contact with an estimated company of enemy since 150405H. By 151435H, the enemy were contained within an area bounded by YS 485598, YS 488598, YS 485594 and YS 488594.
 - b. (160850H) The consolidated results from the DAT DO incident reported in sub-para a. above were: 7 ARVN KIA, 26 ARVN WIA, 12 ARVN MIA and 12 x M16 rifles missing, for a score of 2 en KIA 1 x M2 Carbine and 1 x pistol recovered.
 - c. (162230H) At YS 563914, a SAS LRRP contacted 26 enemy. The results were 3 en KIA. At YS 562911 a SAS LRRP contacted 9 enemy armed with mortars, RPGs and wheeled MGs. One enemy was KIA(BC).
 - d. (191305H) At YS 478562, 12/D/9 RAR contacted 2 enemy. The results were: 1 AUST WIA, 1 en WIA(BT) and six bunkers located.
 - e. (191900H) At YS 482547, 1/A/9 RAR contacted three enemy. Results were: 2 en KIA.
 - f. (192020H) At YS 474542, 2/A/9 RAR contacted an estimated squad of enemy. The enemy used 60mm mortars in support. Results were: 2 en KIA(BC).
 - g. (200840H) At YT 177119, an APC of 3/3/B/3 Cav Sqn struck a pressure-type PE mine. APC was moderately damaged, there were 3 AUST WIA (slight).
 - h. (211040H) At YS 463563, 5/B/9 RAR found an enemy base camp consisting of six bunkers and a kitchen. Recovered were: 300 x .30 cal rds, 3 x M16 mines, 5lbs TNT, 2 x RPG2 rds, 1 x Chicom claymore, 5 x M14 mags, 1 x BAR mag, 1 x Primus stove and 30 ft of insulated cable.
 - j. (211925H) At YS 488548, 3/W/6 RAR contacted three enemy moving EAST. Results were: 1 en KIA(BC) and 1 x AK47 recovered.

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PART II

ENEMY ACTIVITY IN PHUOC TUY PROVINCE
AND THE VUNG TAU SPECIAL ZONE

1. The following were the incidents not involving 1 ALSG or 1 ATF elements, which took place in PHUOC TUY and VUNG TAU during the week.
 - a. (172035H) At YS 377583, a US soldier was killed by enemy sniper fire. The area was engaged with SA and AW fire, with unknown results.
 - b. (172230H) At YS 254736, an enemy party abducted a number of civilians from the village for a meeting. The enemy fled when the area was illuminated, and were engaged with mortar and .50 cal MG fire; with unknown results.
 - c. (180100H) At YT 4509, 18 ARVN Div HQ XUAN LOC received 15 to 20 mortar rounds, followed by a ground attack from an estimated battalion plus enemy force. The enemy captured two bunkers and part of the road through XUAN LOC came under their control. As at 180845H, results were 5 ARVN KIA, 30 ARVN WIA, 5 US WIA and a 105mm gun destroyed. Five enemy were KIA, and a .50 cal MG recovered.

PART I

SIGNIFICANT ENEMY ACTIVITY INVOLVING 1 ALSG AND 1 ATF FORCES

1. The following incidents, which occurred during the reporting period, are considered to be of some significance.
 - a. (011225H) At YS 554586, A/5 RAR located a platform, on which was found a cache of 3,500 lbs of rice.
 - b. (011520H) At YS 555581, 3/A/5 RAR contacted three or four enemy, who fired AW and RPG. A bush fire, started by the RPG, forced 3 Pl to withdraw. Arty and a LFT engaged the area, but a subsequent revealed no results.
 - c. (041055H) At YS 575905, an aircraft of 161 Recce Flt observed ten enemy on an EAST - WEST track. A LFT engaged the enemy, with unknown results. Whilst marking the target, the VR aircraft received approximately twelve rounds of AW fire, but no hits were taken.
 - d. (041200H) At YS 748697, 1/A/3 Cav located an enemy base which been very recently occupied. Two bunkers were destroyed. A quantity of medical supplies were located and destroyed, and a personal letter was recovered.
 - e. (041345H) At YS 420760, B/1 Armd located seventy trenches with overhead cover, which were subsequently destroyed. Forty of the trenches were approximately ten days old, the remainder were much older.
 - f. (050625H) At YS 314725, 1/A/5 RAR contacted three enemy. The results of this contact were: 2 en KIA(BC), 1 x AK47 and 1 x French grenade recovered, together with a quantity of foodstuffs.
 - g. (050830H) At YS 314725, 1/A/5 RAR contacted an estimated squad of enemy, who were moving SOUTH to NORTH. Results were: 1 en KIA(BC), 1 en KIA(Poas) and 1 en WIA. Additionally, 2 x M1 Carbines were recovered.
 - h. (051525H) At YS 313724, 1/A/5 RAR contacted three enemy. Results were: 2 en KIA(BC), 1 en WIA, 1 x AK47, 1 x RPG2, 3 x RPG2 rds and 1 x compass recovered.
 - j. (051915H) At YS 4574, BINH BA Village, Det 1 Div Int Unit detained LE VAN HANG, a liason and supply operative, who was subsequently handed to the Province Interrogation Centre, PHUOC TUY Province.
 - k. (060835H) At YS 436574, a Land Clearance Team bulldozer was lightly damaged by a mine, thought to be a M16.
 - l. (061335H) At YS 313724, a patrol from 1/A/5 RAR contacted two enemy moving SOUTH. Results were: 1 en KIA(BC), 1 x AK47 and 4 x AK 47 mags recovered.
 - m. (071405H) At YS 445576, whilst engaged in a land clearing operation, C/S T24B struck a mine. Three hours later, at the same GR, C/S T24 was hit by RPG7 fire. Both tanks were damaged, and there were 2 AUST WIA(Evac).

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PART II

ENEMY ACTIVITY IN PHUOC TUY PROVINCE
AND THE VUNG TAU SPECIAL ZONE

1. The following were the incidents not involving 1 ATF or 1 ALSG elements, which took place in PHUOC TUY and VUNG TAU during the week.
 - a. (Late Entry) (270640H) At YS 253745, two VC, LAM CONG MINH and NGUYEN VAN FONG, of C24 Coy D67 Engr Bn, CHIEU HOIed to PHU MY OP. They revealed that the coy has three platoons, B1, B2 and B3. B1 Pl is employed on transportation/logistic tasks, whilst the mission of B2 Pl and B3 Pl is the interdiction of Route QL 15. The Coy is 56 strong, and has its base camp at YS 306714.
 - b. (Late Entry) (011400H) At CAT LO Naval Base, a C3 report was received, stating that ten 122mm rockets had been transported on two motor junks, under an escort of one platoon, from the RSSZ, and cached in the DONG ONG BINH section of LONG SON Island (vic YS 272-565).
 - c. (020810H) At YS 493676, a RAAF aircraft sighted four ox-carts and eight persons moving SW. At 0830H a further five ox-carts joined the first four. A total of twenty persons were sighted in the area, and the ox-carts were last seen moving towards the road.
 - d. (5 May) At YS 435917 and YS 458901, road-blocks were sighted on LTL 2.
2. Int Comment. The agent report given in Para 1b above can be linked with a similar report from the same source concerning a shipment of 122mm rockets on 9 Apr. If both of these reports are accurate, there are now some twenty-five 122mm rockets stored on LONG SON, presenting a considerable threat to the VUNG TAU Air Base and the CAT LO Naval Base. An S2 Comment from BARIA suggests that the VUNG TAU City Unit, to date held at YS 4555, may have been dissolved and absorbed into other units in the vicinity, however there is as yet no confirmation of this.




