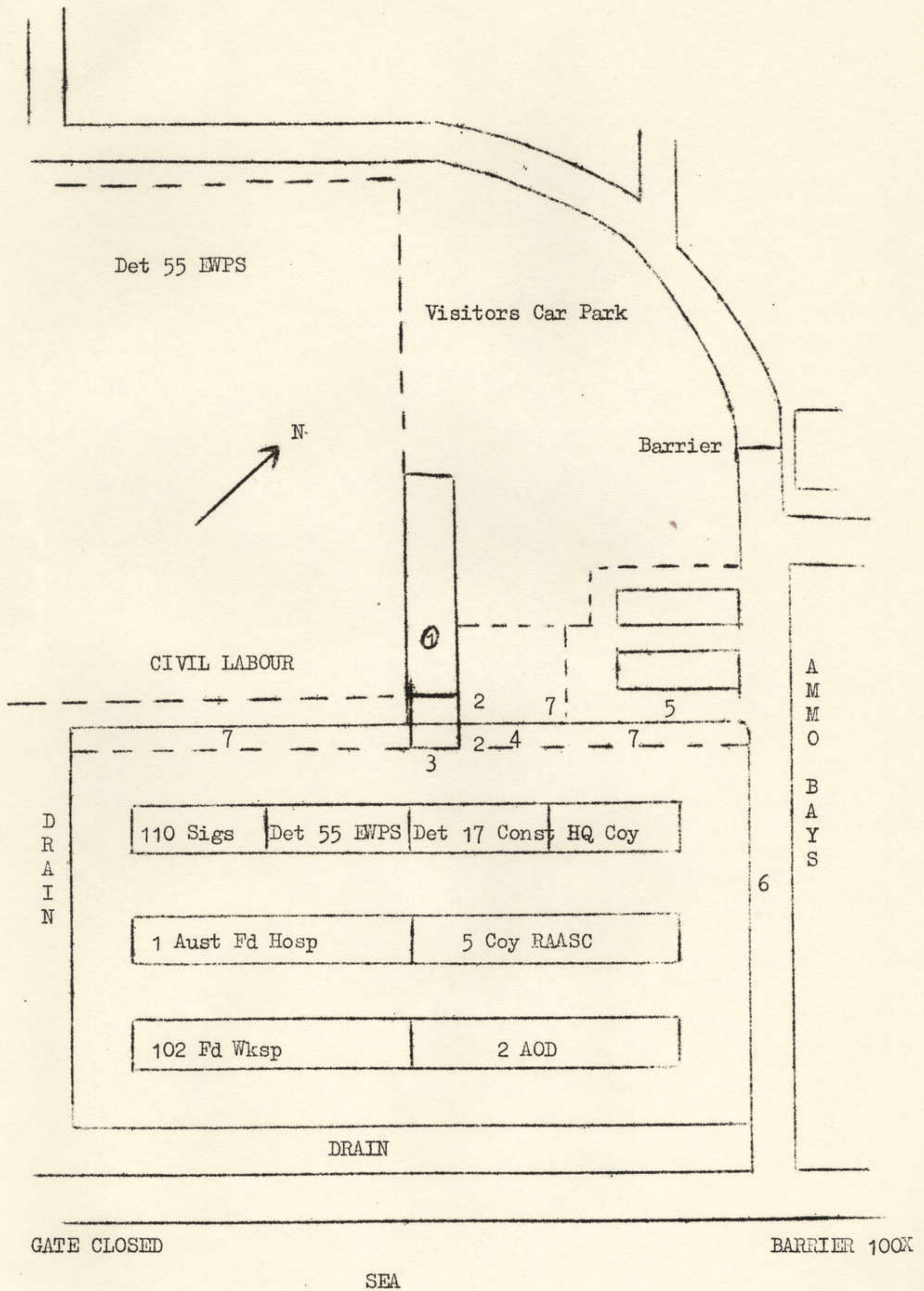

Examination reveals that these employees however have a history of minor offences which **have** never been recorded. On face value however the employee, with a clean record, is being sacked for a minor offence. To obviate this, unit commanders should record all offences.

1. A 1 ALSG def alert exercise will be held on 24/25 Oct 69.

Aim

2. To practice 1 ALSG def alert procedures.

Conduct of Ex

3. During the exercise particular emphasis will be placed upon the following aspects of 1 ALSG def arrangements:-
  - a. Implementation of the new 1 ALSG def plan, in particular the exercise of command and control through the nine sector HQs and deployment of the three Ready Reaction Forces.
  - b. Provision of area illumination using 81mm mortar.
  - c. Evac of civilian employees.
  - d. The continuance of area and unit routine despite the imposition of a particular def alert status.

Ex Duration

4. The ex will commence sometime during the afternoon of 24 Oct 69 and conclude PM 25 Oct 69.

Safety

5. Unit Comds are to ensure that the fol safety instrs are promulgated to and fully understood by all ranks:-
  - a. All pers must be made aware that the ex is in fact a practice alert.
  - b. All weapons must remain 'EMPTY' as defined in 1 ALSG R1000-1-1 of 4 Jun 69 and 1 ALSG Standing Orders Part 1, Chapter 1, Section 4, Annex B.
  - c. All non-ex t/c on either telephones or radio is to be prefixed by the word 'NODUF'.
  - d. Whilst illuminating rounds are fired by the 81mm mortar, all pers are to remain under cover from falling cannister.

DEBRIEF : EX TIGER BLUE - 24/25 OCT 69

- Reference: A. 1 ALSG R256-1-3 of 25 Aug 69.  
 B. 1 ALSG R256-1-3 of 6 Oct 69.

General

1. This paper summarises those points made at the Commander's debrief on EX TIGER BLUE, held at HQ 1 ALSG on 28 Oct 69.

The New 1 ALSG Defence Plan

2. Apart from three minor issues over defence grouping/ boundary changes, the concept of basing defence sectors upon the principle of unit responsibility for unit areas appears to provide most satisfactory security arrangements.

3. The deployments involving the three Ready Reaction Forces were satisfactorily executed. However, the need for all sector CPs to listen continually and intelligently to the 1 ALSG defence net cannot be over-emphasised, if the movement of Ready Reaction Forces is to be clearly understood by those units through whose area the RRF must pass.

Voice Procedure

4. As was highlighted in the previous defence exercise debrief (see Reference A para 4), voice procedure on the 1 ALSG defence net continues to be of a very poor standard. GS Branch HQ 1 ALSG will attempt to remedy this situation by the introduction of weekly voice procedure exercises in which all sub stations on the 1 ALSG defence net will participate. Details of these exercises will be issued separately.

Evacuation of Civilians

5. Contrary to the instruction issued under sub para 3 f. of Reference A, one or two units of 1 ALSG again retained vehicles in unit areas which were required to complete the lift capacity of the civilian evacuation convoys. It is reiterated that under no circumstances are vehicles which are required for the civilian evacuation convoys to be kept in unit areas to transport civil labour to the West Gate area. If necessary, civilian labour will be escorted on foot to the West Gate, or if light vehicles are available, a shuttle service may be run.

The Firing of 81 mm Mortar Illumination

6. Both the procedure for calling for and directing fire and the physical handling of the weapon itself were of an extremely low standard. In an attempt to rectify this situation, appropriate training is to be given to:-

- a. All personnel in 1 ALSG who may be required to call for and direct fire.
- b. The mortar crew plus reserve crewmen.

7. Sufficient courses of instruction will be held in 1 ALSG within the immediate future to meet the training requirement mentioned in para 6 above. Detail will be issued separately.

Damage Control


8. The reporting of availability of the Specialist Damage Control Teams to Damage Control HQ was not carried out in accordance with the requirement given in Reference A, sub para 3 h. Whilst this requirement has not yet been included in a formal amendment to 1 ALSG Standing Orders, its inclusion in Reference A constitutes sufficient authority for it to be observed. A rewrite of Annex G to Section 4, Part 1, Chapter 1 of 1 ALSG Standing Orders, Damage Control, will be issued shortly.

The Introduction of a Defence Alert Warning System

9. It is generally agreed that the present system of passing warnings of defence alerts to Sector HQ over line or radio communications is slow and unreliable and usually prompts only tardy reaction. It is intended that some sort of siren/klaxon warning system be introduced, but until such time as satisfactory equipment is available, the present system of warning will be continued.

Summary

10. Generally defence alert arrangements in 1 ALSG have improved since the last exercise held in Aug 69. However, unit comds must give more attention to the study and promulgation of the various instructions issued by this HQ, either as formal Standing Orders or miscellaneous instructions referring thereto. In addition, continual effort must be made to ensure that newly arrived personnel are made aware of their individual responsibilities in the case of a defence alert.
