COMMANDERS DIARIES
INSTRUCTIONS

AIM

1. The aim of a Commanders Diary is to provide data on which to base future improvements in Army training, equipment, organization and administration, and to furnish historians with a record of the activities of units and formations in operational and non-operational periods in peace and in war.

GENERAL

- 2. Entries are to be made daily on AF C 2118 (Adapted) each entry being initialled by the officer detailed to keep it.
- 3. Commanders Diaries will conform with the rules for drafting orders given in "Staff Duties (Australia)" Chapter 2, Section 12.

RESPONSIBILITY

During Non-operational Periods

4. A Commanders Diary is to be compiled by commanders of all formations.

During Operational Periods (1)

- 5. A Commanders Diary is to be compiled in duplicate by:
 - a. Commanders of all formations.
 - b. Each branch of the staff at formation headquarters commanded by a brigadier or above.
 - c. Heads of services not below the rank of lieutenant colonel.
 - d. Personal staffs and officers holding special appointments.
 - e. Unit commanders.
 - f. Commanders of a detachment of a unit when so ordered.

COMPILATION

- 6. Both original and duplicate copies are to consist of:
 - a. Cover (AF C 2119) (Adapted).
 - b. Index as printed on cover.
 - c. Narrative (AF C 2118) (Adapted).
 - d. Annexes as shown in the Index.
- 7. All details of the unit or formation (if a detachment is concerned, the name of the parent unit), period covered and enclosure numbers of the annexes are to be shown on the cover. If there has been a change of command since the last report, the date of assumption by the new commanding officer is to be included.
- 8. The annexes are to be assembled in the groups shown on the cover. If there are no enclosures for an annex NIL will be entered on the cover. If additional annexes are convenient for a particular headquarters, starting at B.

DISPOSAL DIARIES

13. **Original Commander's Diary.** This is to be forwarded monthly, unless otherwise ordered, by the seventh day of the succeeding month direct to AHQ.

14. **Duplicate Commander's Diary.** This must be clearly marked as a duplicate. It is to be sent separately from the original to AHQ one month after the original has been despatched but not before the former has been acknowledged.

15. When overseas, both copies of diaries are to be sent through the Army Records organization in the overseas theatre but at different times.

16. **TOP SECRET Supplementary Diaries.**

a. The documents referred to in Paragraph 9 together with a list of them made out on AF C 2118 (Adapted) must be placed in separate cover (AF C 2119) (Adapted). All details must be filled in and the cover clearly marked in red: "ANNEX Z — OFFICER ONLY". It may be convenient to group the papers by appendices.

b. Supplementary diaries must be forwarded under the normal rules for TOP SECRET correspondence, to AHQ. The inner envelope must be plainly marked:







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1. SIGNIFICANT ENEMY ACTIVITY INVOLVING 1 ALSG AND 1 ATF FORCES

a. (021730H) At YS606885, D/5 RAR located a cache approx 1 year old. Items recovered: 1 x RPD, 2 x BAR, 1 x PRC 10 radio (incomplete) 31 x 75mm RR rounds, 21 x RPG 7 rounds, 44 x anti tank grenades, 15 x RPG 7 boosters, 11 x RPG 2 boosters, 315 x .30 cal rounds, 2000 feet det cord.

b. (02 Jan 70) At YS525578, LCT located 25-30 pits. Several caches were found in the area. Items recovered: 300 lbs rice, 2 bangalore torpedoes, 5 x claymores, 28 x M79 rounds, 1200 x M16 rounds.

c. (031735H) At YS437905, 11/D/8 RAR located a cache of 72 pairs of trousers, 72 shirts, 420 coloured shots, 100 candles.

2. INTELLIGENCE COMMENTS. Enemy activity has been light during the reporting period, with no significant contacts, although there were numerous engagements with groups of 2 - 4 enemy. Activity should continue at a low level during the coming week as the enemy continues to prepare and plan for forthcoming offensives. The primary target at this stage is RF/PF forces as the enemy attempts to weaken morale and capabilities of GVN forces.

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4. GENERAL SITUATION REPUBLIC VIETNAM

I CTZ

There was generally light activity throughout the CTZ during the reporting period. Captured documents and enemy activity around QUANG NGAI indicate that it may be a primary target in early 1970. Further documents captured indicate the possible employment of CS agents (see 1 ALSG Intrep 11-17 Dec 69).

II CTZ

The current disposition of 3 NVA Div and information provided by a PW suggests that widespread co-ordinated attacks by enemy forces in Binh Dinh Province may occur prior to Tet, (6 Feb). The GVN pacification program appears to be the primary target.

III CTZ

7 NVA Div has recently sustained heavy losses in men and material in Northern Phuoc Long and Binh Long Provinces. 274 VC Regt has apparently received some replacements and supplies and are possibly responsible for attacks against Thai positions in South East Bien Hoa Province. ARVN forces captured a 2.5 ton ammunition cache 13 Km SSE of DAN TIENG.

A document captured on 31 Dec at YT516991 was a message from COSVN to the CO, Rear Services Group 84. It concerned a visit by members of the COSVN Current Affairs Committee and the HQ Envoy to 84 Rear Services Group.

IV CTZ

Major enemy units continue to avoid significant contact, while probably engaged in refitting and retraining activities. There are indications that 101D NVA Regt is infiltrating from CAMBODIA to the Seven Mountains area.

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VC SAPPERS

1. Reports received indicate that the VC will place greater emphasis on sapper attacks in the forthcoming Spring and Tet offensives. These attacks can result in both military and political victories for the enemy.

2. Previous sapper attacks, frequently accompanied by diversionary ground attacks or attacks by fire, have been well planned. The sappers, who are well trained and motivated, make a detailed reconnaissance of the target, some times lasting for more than a week. Rehearsals are then conducted and no effort is spared in making these as realistic as possible.

3. The attack itself is characterized by both speed and violence, the sapper being fully aware of the importance of surprise. A diversionary attack is usually launched on a neighbouring installation or another part of the target installation. During the diversion, the sapper moves through the perimeter using bamboo poles, wire cutters and explosives. When the ground assault begins, enemy indirect fire is lifted and the sappers create explosions in the area using satchel charges, RPGs and grenades. This action is timed to give the defenders the impression that they are still under an indirect fire attack. On penetrating the perimeter, the sappers, in groups of three to five men move to their assigned targets. On completion of their tasks the sappers withdraw quickly, usually along the same routes used for entrance, (see diagram).

4. Sapper attacks usually result in heavy material damage and quite often, heavy casualties. In one attack on a US installation, the property damage was in excess of US\$4,500,000. The installation was on a Grey alert at the time of the attack.

5. Considering the geographical situation of VUNG TAU and the fact that there has been a suspected VC sapper recon unit operating in the area, the possibility of sapper attacks in the VUNG TAU area should not be overlooked.

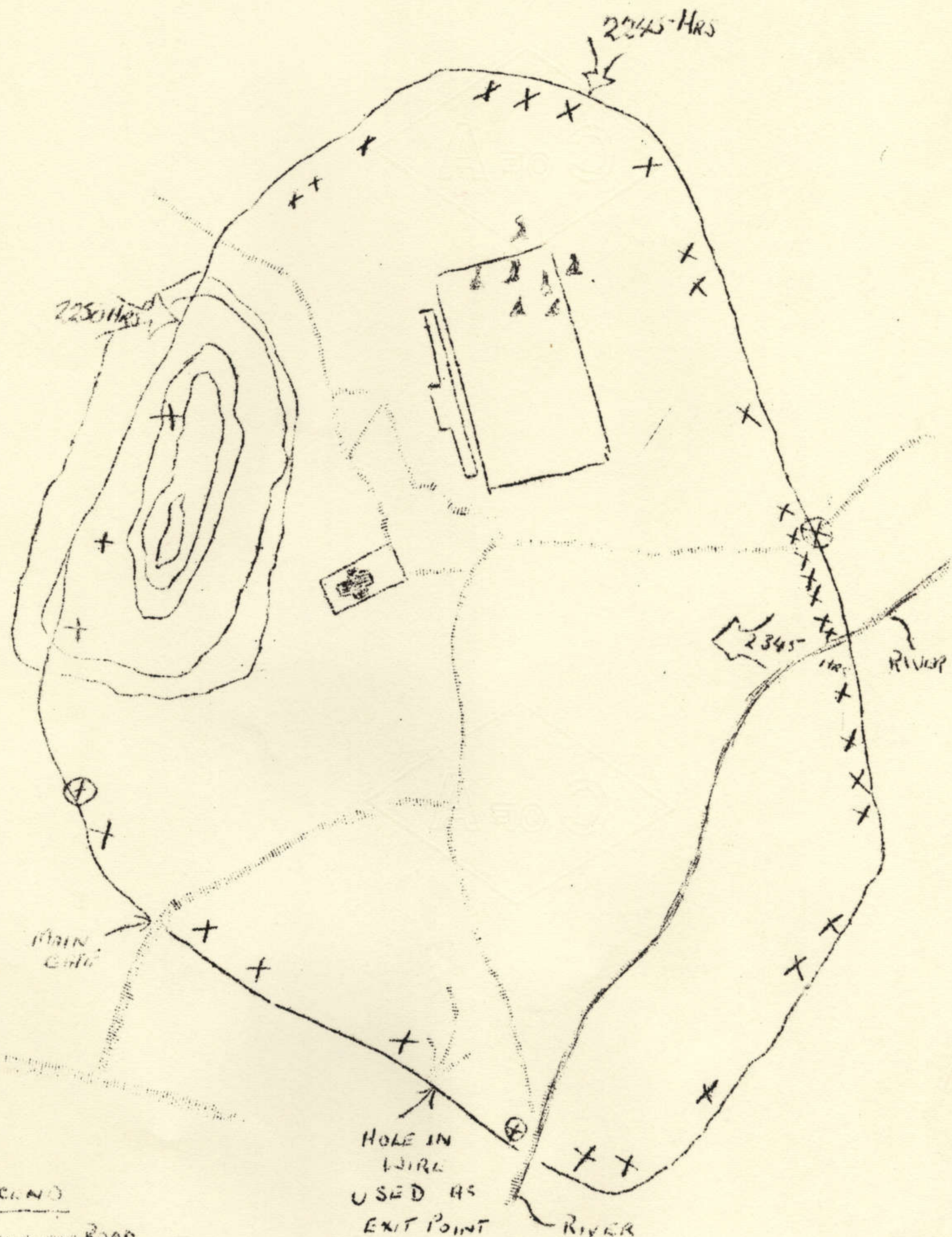
6. The value of an attack on 1 ALSG in comparison to the VUNG TAU Airfield would be minor. However militarily, an attack on 1 ALSG may disrupt 1 ATF operations which have been most successful during the past month. The major victory to the enemy from such an attack would be political and invaluable as propaganda.

7. It is therefore essential that we do not underestimate the capabilities of VC sappers. As stated, they are placing more emphasis on sapper attacks and we should therefore not discount the possibility of such an attack on 1 ALSG.

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1. Sapper attacks usually result in heavy material damage and quite often, heavy casualties. In one attack on a US installation, the property damage was in excess of US\$4,500,000. The installation was on a Grey alert at the time of the attack.

1. ENEMY ACTIVITY IN PHUOC TUY PROVINCE.

Activity throughout the Province has been at a very low level during the reporting period. There has been only two significant contacts with the enemy and no significant caches recovered. A base patrol from 8 RAR contacted an estimated 11 enemy at YS386652 on 13 Jan 70. Results were 8 enemy KIA (BC), 2 WIA (PW), nil friendly casualties. The other contact was again on 13 Jan 70, at YS429868 when 3/C/6 RAR contacted 11-12 enemy. Results, 4 enemy KIA (BC) nil friendly cas. LRRPS from 3 SAS Sqn accounted for 12 enemy KIA from 4 separate incidents during the week.

In general, the enemy appears to be trying to avoid contact, while probably reorganising and resupplying for future offensives.

III CTZ There were two heavy contacts on the slopes of Nui Ba Den in Tay Ninh Province, involving possible elements of 9 VC Div and US forces. Cumulative totals from these contacts were : Enemy 234 KIA, US forces 3 KIA. During the contact both enemy and US forces used CS gas. In the Sub-regions, enemy activity consisted of light scattered attacks by fire.

IV CTZ Enemy initiated activity remained at a reduced level and was characterised by harassing attacks by fire and small scale ground attacks. The primary target appears to be CHAU PHU (CHAU DOC). During the coming week enemy initiated activity is expected to increase slightly while logistical activity continues.

ENEMY REDEPLOYMENT IN PHUOC TAY

1. A police report has indicated that D445 Bn might have redeployed its companies to operate in support of the local companies, C25 (LONG DAT Coy), and C41 (Cau Duc Coy), with C1 and C2 allocated to Route 15 and CHAU DUC district, and C3 and C4 to LONG DIEN - DAT DO area. Reports of a new unit, D510, may be explained by the redesignation of D445 Bn in its new role. If this report is correct, it would support the GSO2 (Int), 1 ATF assessment of a greatly reduced capability of D445 Bn, and the acceptance by the VC of its failure to operate effectively as a unit.

COMMENTS.

2. Attacks by fire and small scale raids on RF/PF are likely to continue, principally in the LONG DAT district, but Route 15 areas of ONG TRINH, PHU MY and PHUOC HOA could also receive attention in accordance with VC directives to attack RF/PF and PSIF. Attacks by fire could also occur against Australian bases and vehicles. While VC activity against Route 2 has been curtailed by recent 1 ATF operations, future harassment may be expected.

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1. ENEMY ACTIVITY - PHUOC TUY PROVINCE.

Activity increased slightly during the reporting period with a total of 22 contacts with the enemy resulting in 17 enemy KIA. These contacts were mainly with small numbers, however there were 3 contacts with 10 - 15 enemy.

The following incidents which occurred during the reporting period are considered to be of some significance:

- a. (161410H) At YS685870, 10/D/5 RAR guided by a Hoi Chanh located a camp believed to be a munitions workshop. The camp consisted of five bunkers, one kitchen, one lecture hut and one furnace. It was used approx. 4 days ago. Ten claymores and a quantity of documents. The documents included a commendation certificate identifying Z301/84 Rear Services Group. Comment: The loss of XUAN LOC worksite to 6 RAR, the disruption of Z300 and its subsequent amalgamation with Z301, and the eventual loss of Z301 to 5 RAR will limit severely the capacity of 84 Rear Services Group to produce munitions, particularly mines and grenades.
- b. (171550H) At YS734892, 9 Pl and Coy HQ b Coy 5 RAR located a medical installation in a network of caves to a depth of 50 feet. In the main cave, which had a subterranean stream running through it, was located an operating table. In another cave was located 12 timber beds. Fresh blood stains on bandages suggested that this system was last used two days previously. Recovered were: 1 x 75mm RCL complete with round and tripod, 2 x 60mm mortars, 1 x SKS rifle, birds (fowls) in a cage, 60 lbs barley and 60 lbs rice. Comment: Probably a dressing station set up for VC casualties previously treated in K76A.
- c. (161050H) At YS562982, B Coy 3 Bde 7 Inf (US) located 7 bunkers. Inside the bunkers were beds and medical supplies. The system had been used by approx 30 people nine days previously. Comment: This was probably K76A hospital as indicated by a Hoi Chanh. The loss of the major hospital K76A and the smaller hospital, K76C, and the loss of large amounts of medical supplies and equipment, will place 274 VC Regt and 33 Regt in a serious position. The 274 Regt Dispensary has little, if any, capacity and C5/84 Rear Services Group appears very short of medical supplies and probably has only one medical assistant. These effects will be felt throughout MR7.

2. INTELLIGENCE COMMENTS

The enemy still appears to be resupplying and reorganising in preparation for the next offensive. From reports received it appears that this offensive will take place late in January in the enemies Winter/ Spring Campaign, with HOA LONG as a prime target. There are no indications at this stage of enemy activity, either in late January or during TET in the Vung Tau Special Zone.

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3. ENEMY IDENTIFICATIONS

Documents recovered from a body (result of contact with D and E Pl, HQ 1 ATF on 16 Jan), identify a platoon 2IC of A2, D67 Engr Bn. As this is the first identification of D67 in Phuoc Tuy for several months, an increase in route interdiction (possibly Route 15) may be expected during the coming offensive.

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GENERAL SITUATION - REPUBLIC VIETNAM

I CTZ

Enemy initiated activity decreased while logistical activity continues in preparation to Phase 3 of the Winter/Spring Campaign. PW and ralliers state that these preparations are to be completed by 25 Jan, and that the GVN Pacification Programme will be the primary target during the coming offensive.

II CTZ

Activity during the reporting period was light and characterized by scattered ABFs and light ground probes. PWs and documents CIA indicate that the GVN Pacification Programme will be the primary target, possibly in late Jan, early Feb. It appears that enemy units are breaking down into company sized units in order to attack New Life Hamlets and associated allied units in an attempt to further disrupt pacification programmes.

III CTZ

Activity was light in III CTZ, with scattered ABFs and limited ground probes. Reports state that the enemies preparation for the Winter/Spring offensive should be almost completed and an increase in tactical activity is likely to occur in late January, early February.

Sideline: A PW captured NW of CAN DUOC and identified as a political officer of 520 Bn, stated that many personnel wanted to Chieu Hoi due to low morale. The PW was in a position to adequately evaluate the morale of the unit, as he was responsible for political indoctrination and motivation.

IV CTZ

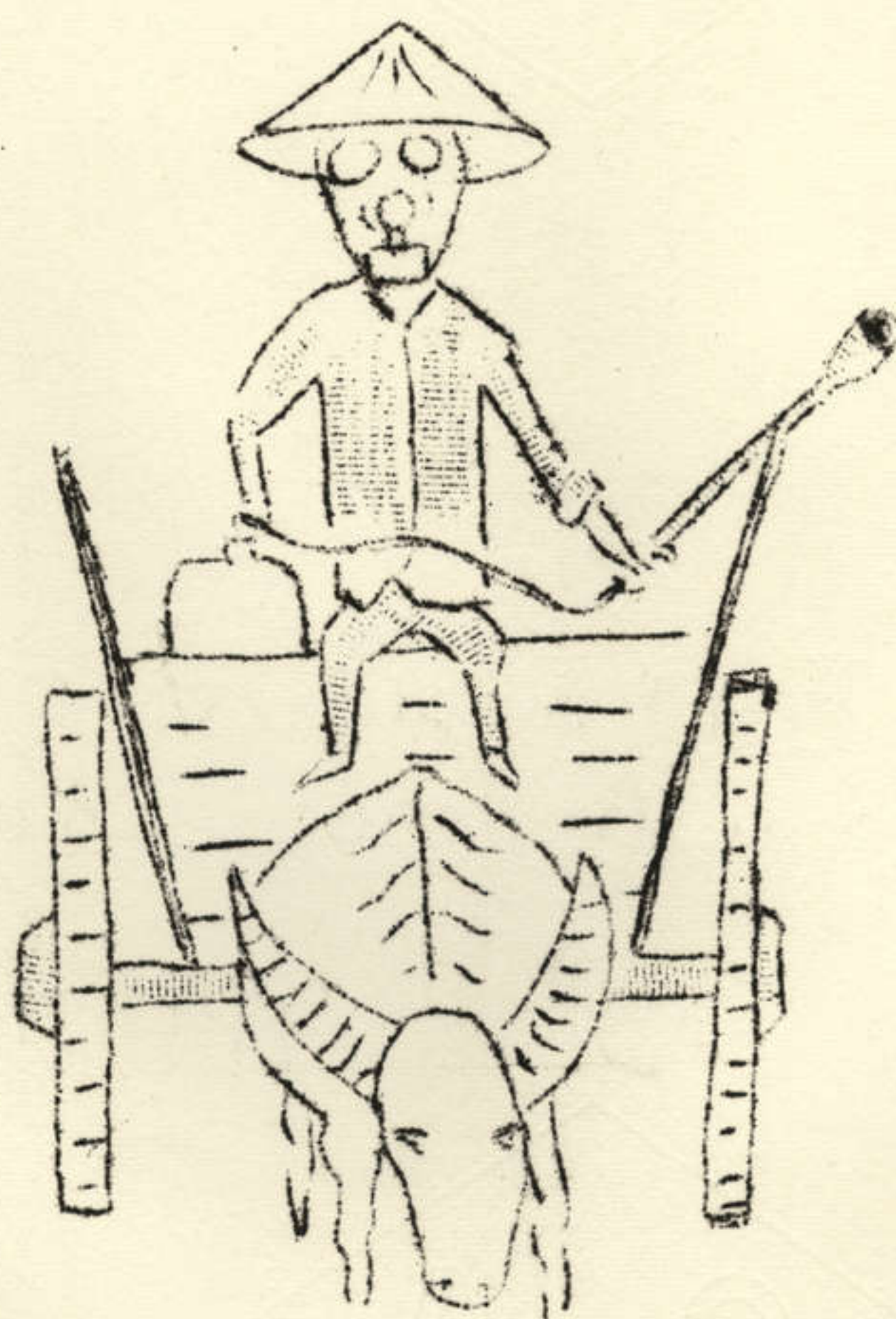
Activity was characterized by ABFs and limited ground probes as major units avoided significant contact, while probably engaged in logistical activity.

INTELLIGENCE COMMENTS

It appears that the Winter/Spring offensive will take place prior to TET (6 Feb), possibly late Jan, with the GVN Pacification Programme as the major target. Terrorist and sapper activity, with co-ordinated ground attacks are likely to occur throughout the Republic, with IV CTZ being the centre of activity. It is unlikely, due to logistical and personnel shortages, that the enemy will launch prolonged ground attacks in any great number. There are, however, two or three cities cited as possible targets of such attacks, these being QUANG TRI in I CTZ and CHAU PHU in IV CTZ. Tay Ninh Province should also be a centre of activity during the offensive. Other centres, such as DA NANG, HUE and SAIGON will probably be targets for terrorist activity with GVN pacification cadre as the object of kidnapping and assassination attempts.

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1. ENEMY ACTIVITY - PHUOC TUY PROVINCE.

Activity was again light during the reporting period, with scattered contact with the enemy, mainly in the NORTH of the Province. There were no significant actions or caches recovered, however, PWs and captured documents give a general indication of the enemies plight in Phuoc Tuy and adjoining provinces. (see Annex A)

2. ENEMY ACTIVITY/OPERATIONS AT TET.

Although having avoided large contacts, while resupplying over the last couple of weeks, enemy activity will be seriously hampered by medical deficiencies, supply shortages and low morale. RF/PF posts appear to be the main target of future enemy attacks, particularly along Route 2 (BINH BA, DUC ME), and the HOA LONG/DAT DO area, with the possibility of route interdiction (Routes 2, 15 and 23). There is no firm indication of the exact date for such attacks, although reports from PWs indicate the possibility of the 29 JAN and 4 Feb as being high points. It seems unlikely that the enemy will risk large scale ground attacks, but will probably rely on attacks by fire and sapper activity in order to minimize casualties. There are still no indications of enemy activity in the Vung Tau Special Zone, however, such activity should not be discounted.

1. The following is a translation of a sealed letter marked "URGENT" from comd of the NLF Committee of BA LONG Province HQ to the Province finance and economy section. The letter was taken from the Adj of the NLF Section, who was killed by D/5 RAR.

"The enemy are still here and we are unable to return. On 18 Jan 70, we organised a meeting intending to go and find you but you were not at the old place. I sent someone to THANG NGHIEP (NFI) to find you to liaise with A1. If you know what is proposed please let us know immediately

We are starving. I went to BAO BINH but was unable to return. We are now all digging for manioc but each day we are finding less and less. NAM MINH asked if you can spare us a few litres of rice temporarily. Yesterday NAM and all the others ground up all the manioc.

K76A and Z301 are both out of food. They came to our base to hunt for meat but were not adequately organized. I don't know the answer. Really, it is very difficult. They are starving but we are unable to assist them because we are also starving.

All the best to you and the other comrades."

1 ATF INTELLIGENCE COMMENTS.

1. It would appear that the VC have endeavoured to re-enter the MAY-TAO complex to get med supplies and probably cached food.
2. BAO BINH, in Long Khanh Province, a major entry/exit point for BA LONG, has been gradually drying up as a food resupply area and addition-ally, from captured documents, the VC have had increasing difficulty entering BAO BINH.
3. Following their forced withdrawal from the MAY TAO area, BA LONG HQ moved west to AP CAM ME and south to NUI LE- NUI SAO area. They subsequently sought re-supply in VIET CUONG and QUANG MINH but were prevented from doing so by 8 RAR.
4. The MAY TAOS, VIET CUONG and QUANG MINH continue to be sealed off to the VC by 5 RAR's and 6 RAR's deployment into those areas with elems of 199 LIB moving in from the north. The sad picture painted in this letter is the result.
5. Continued sealing off of re-supply areas will force an even further collapse of VC morale and capability within 1 ATF T/O to a point of ineffectiveness.



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ENEMY ACTIVITY III CTZ.

1. Enemy activity was less than the previous week and consisted mainly of attacks by fire. There was an increase of such attacks on the night 29-30 Jan but otherwise the enemy has been relatively inactive. War Zone C recorded the highest number of incidents.

ENEMY LOCATIONS.

2. Locations show little change:

a. 9 VC Div : War Zone C.

b. 7 NVA Div: No recent identification but apparently still in BINH LONG and NW PHUOC LONG.

c. 5 VC Div: Initiated some light actions and remain in northern and central PHUOC LONG.

d. MR7:

(1) 33 Regt: DINH QUAN - SW VO DAT.

(2) 274 Regt: HAT DICH - BINH SON.

ASSESSMENT.

3. Throughout the corps there is expected to be an increase in activity in the northern provinces after TET, probably attacks by fire with some ambushes and sapper attacks. The cease fire period is likely to be used for infiltration of small groups for propaganda activity and small scale attacks.

1 ATF TAOR.

4. General

a. There has been no major contact with the enemy and, contrary to last weeks assessment, no offensive operations have been initiated by the enemy for the pre-TET period. It is probable that LF units have been disrupted and delayed in their preparations.

ASSESSMENT.

5. VC intentions for TET were clearly defined by documents and PW. However, the effects of operations have seriously damaged the capabilities of LF units and undoubtedly upset plans. If attempts are made to initiate attacks in the near future they will probably be marked by lack of coordination and lack of enthusiasm. Target areas are likely to be BINH BA/NGAI GIAO and Route 2, and DAT DO/HOA LONG/LONG DIEN areas.



1. Situation. HMAS JEPARIT's ETA Vung Tau is 040001 H. The vessel is carrying 3,335 S tons of cargo for discharge at Vung Tau. On completion of discharge it is to load approx 1000 S tons of cargo for RTA.

2. Mission. To discharge/back load HMAS JEPARIT during the period 4-9 Jan 70.

3. Execution.

a. General Outline. The discharge/back load of HMAS JEPARIT is to be carried out in five (5) phases.



The last 1 ALSG Routine Order Part I published in 1969 was Number 206, Serial 42, on 20 Dec 69.

2. AUSTRALIAN CIVIL SUPPORT FOR MILITARY CIVIC ACTION IN VIETNAM.

1. Australian civilian support for military civic action in Vietnam is co-ordinated by AHQ (DMO and P). Therefore it is essential that organizations and individuals seeking to assist in military civic action deal with AHQ and not direct with members serving in Vietnam. To this end the following orders apply:

a. Any member receiving correspondence containing offers of assistance for military civic action, from any organization (even where the addressee is a member of the organization) or any stranger not known to the addressee, is to confine his reply to:

(1) A courteous acknowledgement of receipt of the correspondence.

(2) A statement that the matter has been referred to AHQ for attention: and,

(3) Advice that any further enquiries should be addressed to the:

Secretary, Department of the Army,
Canberra. ACT.

b. All details of such offers of assistance are to be given by members to their units, which will in turn forward the details through normal channels to HQ AFV.


c. Any member who may have already entered into correspondence with any organization or stranger on military civic action should now inform their correspondent that it is necessary for any further dealings to be made through AHQ to ensure proper co-ordination of the assistance.

d. Further, details of any organization or stranger enquiring of member for details of military civic action are also to be referred to HQ AFV in the same way.

2. This order is not intended to prevent members accepting donations from personal friends and relations, but such persons should be advised that any goods they send addressed to individual members in Vietnam must go through the postal system at the donor's expense. In the past, embarrassment has been caused to the AMF by well meaning persons collecting goods at the request of members and then expecting the AMF to accept the responsibility for forwarding the donations to Vietnam.

3. This Routine Order is to be published quarterly in unit routine orders.

3. WEARING OF FINGER RINGS

Reference: A. Dress Manual 1963, paragraphs 23 and 24.

1. Although approval exists for rings to be worn, soldiers who do so should be aware of the safety hazard involved. There are constant occurrences of injuries caused by rings catching on some protrusion - particularly when handling stores and when mounting/dismounting vehicles. At the best this results in a sore finger, at the worst - no finger.

2. When members are engaged on duties where such hazards exist, they should bind the ring and finger with sticky tape.

3. This order is to be republished in Unit Routine Orders every three calendar months. Routine Order No 123/69 is cancelled.

Published as a Notice to these orders is information on payment under ASCO Pay Plans.

5. TRANSMISSION OF SPIRITUOUS LIQUORS THROUGH THE POST

1. Commonwealth of Australia Postal Regulations prohibit the transmission of inflammable substances (including liquids) having a flash point less than 80 degrees F through the post.
2. Spirituous liquors having a proof rating in excess of 85 Proof or 74 Proof UK come within this category, and are not to be transmitted through the post to Australia. Current rating of spirits available at 2 AFCU is shown at Annex A.
3. The importation of spirituous liquors into Australia under provision of the special defence force concession is strictly prohibited. Spirituous liquor may only be awarded a custom concession when a member brings it with his other effects on RTA.
4. However there is no objection to members posting spirituous liquors to Australia provided:
 - a. The member understands duty may be imposed by the Department of Customs and Excise. (Duty on one bottle of Scotch is about A\$1.85).
 - b. The liquors have a proof rating below the stipulated figure at paragraph 2.
 - c. The bottles are packed safely and in such a manner that damage will not result to other items should the bottles break in the mail.
5. If members send spirituous liquor through the post, they are to pack the bottles as follows:
 - a. Each bottle is to be wrapped in a material which must protect the bottle against shock and absorb the liquor if the bottle breaks. Plastic foam sheeting is a suitable material for this purpose.
 - b. The bottle is then to be sealed in a heavy guage waterproof bag.
 - c. The bottle is then to be placed in an outer container, which is to be securely made of strong and rigid material such as a 105 mm cartridge container.
 - d. The outer container is to be clearly branded "BOTTLES - HANDLE WITH CARE".
6. If a bottle breaks and the contents leak and damage other articles, the members is liable to pay full compensation to the PMG for the damage so caused.

7. The proof rating is normally displayed on the label of most spirituous liquors sold in Vietnam. Where doubt exists, the liquor is not to be sent.

8. Before signing the Certificate of Inspection, Inspecting Officers are to:

a. Check that the proof rating is not in excess of 85 Proof US or 74 Proof UK.

b. Ensure that the bottle is packed in accordance with para 5 above.

c. Delete the words "or essence of wines or spirituous liquor" from the face of the Certificate of Inspection.

9. The contents of paragraphs 1 to 8 of this Routine Order are to be published immediately in all Routine Orders, and are to be republished every three calendar months.

10. 1 ALSG Routine Order No 110/69 is cancelled.

6. PROHIBITED ACTIVITIES

Reference: MACV directive 27-8 dated 2 Nov 69.

1. The reference prescribes a list of prohibited activities for US military personnel and other categories of persons located in SVN.
2. The following extracts are applicable to members of AFV. Non-compliance constitutes an offence and renders offenders liable to disciplinary action.
3. Members of AFV are not to:
 - a. Transfer by sale, gift, loan, exchange, or rental, any merchandise or article purchased in an exchange or canteen, to an individual not having similar privileges, except as allowed by 1 ALSG Admin Instr No 27.
 - b. Possess other than the one ration card issued to him (MACV Form 333 or 334) or possess a ration card which has been altered or modified.
 - c. Transfer a ration card (MACV Form 333 or 334) to another by gift, loan, sale, exchange, or by any other means.
 - d. Possess unreasonable or excessive quantities of exchange or canteen items. The possession of more than 12 cartons cigarettes, 12 bottles of liquor/wine, or 6 cases of beer without appropriate authority is considered unreasonable and is prohibited.
 - e. Transfer any personal identification or privilege card to any other person or permit any other person to use his identification or privilege card. The loss, theft, or disappearance of such a card will be reported immediately to unit headquarters.
 - f. Possess more than one identification or privilege card.
 - g. Possess more MPC than authorized by AFV SOPs.
 - h. Purchase or acquire piastres from any source other than an AFV Cash Office or an authorized United States facility.
 - i. Transfer MPC to a person not authorized to possess MPC.

j. Give MPC as a tip or gratuity to persons not authorized to possess MPC.

k. Possess or use US currency in Vietnam.

l. Possess privately-owned firearms.

4. In addition to the foregoing prohibited acts, members of AFV, unless otherwise authorized, are to:

a. Occupy only their assigned billets.

b. Be in their billets or Australian controlled areas during curfew hours.

c. Not engage in business ventures in Vietnam. The prohibition includes participation in the ownership or management of any privately-owned activity conducted in Vietnam for the purpose of making a profit from the sale of goods or services.

5. Units are to re-publish in unit ROs Part I each 3 months. Routine Order No 188/69 is cancelled.

7. DRESS

Reference: 1 ALSG Admin Instr No 1.

Units are reminded that members are not to wear thongs outside the 1 ALSG area. Units to repeat in ROs each 3 months. Routine Order No 169/69 is cancelled.

8. PETS IN 1 ALSG

1. Pets and mascots are not to be kept in 1 ALSG.

2. Most of the pets which can be obtained locally, (e.g., dogs, cats, birds and monkeys) are carriers of communicable diseases which can have serious effects on humans.

3. This RO is to be repeated in unit ROs quarterly. 1 ALSG RO Number 151/69 is cancelled.

9. BREACHES OF CUSTOMS REGULATIONS

Reference: A. AFV (Army Component) SOPs Part 3 Chap 1
Section 6.
B. AHQ Administrative Instruction No 8.

1. Department of Customs advises that an increasing number of parcels are being sent to Australia through the postal system with misleading declarations attached. A common example is a toy animal with a built in transistor radio being described and valued as a toy and not a radio.
2. A substantial number of parcels are being opened by customs. Members are warned of the implications of making false customs declarations. In addition, certifying officers are to rigidly enforce the provisions of Reference B paras 1131 - 1133.
3. This order is to be promulgated in unit ROs at three monthly intervals. Routine Order No 92/69 is cancelled.

10. AMENDMENT I TO 1 ALSG RO NO 187/69

Paragraph 1. of 1 ALSG Routine Order No 187/69 is amended by deleting the visiting hours shown and inserting the following:

"1400 - 1600 hrs daily
1800 - 2000 hrs daily"

11. ACCESS TO THE BEACHCOMBER CLUB

The "Beachcomber" Club on Back Beach Road is out of bounds to all ranks of the AMF except when personally invited and accompanied by an American serviceman.

12. CASUAL MEALS - R AND C CENTRE

1. The dining room at the R and C Centre is not a restaurant where casual meals may be bought.
2. It is for the use only of those members who are accommodated at the R and C Centre.

13. UNAUTHORISED SLOGANS ON PERSONAL MAIL

1. Instances have been detected where derogatory slogans have been endorsed on personal mail sent to persons in Australia. This practice is expressly forbidden in Post Office Regulations and is to cease forthwith.
2. AFPOs are to return to the sender all letters endorsed with these slogans.

14. CUSTOMS DECLARATIONS

1. Members sending goods to Australia by post under the existing concessions awarded by the Department of Customs and Excise are to accurately complete the Customs Declaration Form.
2. Inspecting officers are to ensure that the provisions of AFV (AMF Comp) SOPs Part 3 paragraphs 1131 - 1133 are complied with.
3. All items sent by mail to Australia are subject to Customs inspection. All members are reminded that breaching Customs Regulations is a serious offence and continued violations could result in a restriction of the generous concessions which personnel serving in SVN now enjoy.

15. RECOVERY OF AUSTRALIAN OWNED WEAPONS

1. The following weapons have been found surplus in units and their loss has not been reported. These weapons are:
 - a. Rifle 7.62 mm L1A1.

 - b. Rifle 5.56 mm M16.
143792
2. Units are to check their records and advise this headquarters if any weapon at paragraph 1 is on their charge. Nil returns are required.

16. SALE OF SPIRITUOUS LIQUORS

1. Spirituous liquors are not to be sold by the bottle in OR Clubs/Canteens is 1 ALSG.

2. If a soldier or junior NCO wishes to purchase a bottle of spirit from 2 AFCU to post or take to Australia he must have a written authority from his unit to do so. This authority is to include the type of liquor. Care must be taken by units to ensure that liquors to be posted are those allowed by 1 ALSG RO 5/70. Officers and Sergeants Messes should also be aware of these provisions.

17. PREVALENT OFFENCES

Offences relating to disturbances in the City of Vung Tau are hereby classified as prevalent offences.

18. WELFARE

Reference: AFV SOPs Part 2 Chapter 2 Section 5.

1. The welfare system can provide timely assistance to soldiers and their dependants with domestic or other problems. The system is not meant to provide a substitute for matters which can be resolved by mail between soldiers and their families; nor is it a ready solution for forwarding personal messages to Australia. The raising of a welfare signal is to be carefully considered. Too many trivial requests will tie up the welfare staffs who are then unable to deal effectively with genuine cases when they arise.

2. The value of the system depends largely upon the reaction time of units and Headquarters when problems are raised. AFV units are to reply by Priority signal to HQ AFV within 24 hours of the receipt of the Information copy of signal advice from a Command Headquarters in Australia. If an answer is not available within that period, because of operational or other circumstances, an interim advice is to be forwarded which is to state when a complete reply will be available. Intermediate Headquarters must be included as an information addressee.

3. When a unit initiates a welfare signal which requests investigation of a problem in Australia the unit is to ensure that sufficient detail of the problem is included so that the investigator has a reasonable background knowledge of the subject before enquiries are started.

19. CHANGES AFFECTING OFFICERS - NOTIFICATION OF DATE OF ASSUMPTION OF DUTY

1. All officers posted to, or attached to units or HQ's of the Army Component, Aust Force Vietnam, are deemed to have assumed duty on the day that they arrive in Vietnam. Therefore there is no need to advise AHQ or CARO of the date officers assume duty.

2. Intra-theatre postings will show date of assumption. The actual date of assumption is to be notified to HQ AFV.

3. An amendment to AFV (Army Component) Standard Operating Procedures may be anticipated.

20.

TRUCK, FORK LIFT, PETTIBONE MULLIKEN, ROUGH TERRAIN - NOISE TORQUE CONVERTER COUPLING

Reference: A. EMEI Engineer Equipment F053-1.

1. Instances have been reported of excessive rattle in the coupling assembly between the engine flywheel and PTO shaft of Pettibone Fork Lift Trucks.

2. Investigations by the manufacturer have established this defect has been caused by incorrect idle speed. If this condition is not corrected, wear in the coupling will result.

3. Units are to check the idle speed of all equipments. Where the idle speed is not 600 RPM, units are to request their RAEME supporting element to adjust the idling speed to the correct setting.



24. IMPORTATION OF PROHIBITED ITEMS INTO AUSTRALIA

Reference: A. AFV SOPs Part 3 Chapter 1 Section 6.
B. AFV SOPs Part 3 Chapter 2 Section 4.

1. An instance has arisen where firearms and ammunition have been found in personal baggage forwarded to Australia through MFO.

2. Members are not to import to Australia by any means whatsoever any narcotic, weapon, explosive, firearm, ammunition or blasphemous or pornographic object, unless the prior consent of the Minister of Customs and Excise, Canberra, has been obtained. Paragraphs 1127-1135 of reference A and paragraphs 2059-2061 of reference B lay down quite clearly the member's responsibilities in this matter, and promulgation of these instructions is to be effected vide para 1136 of reference A. Members are also to be told that violation of these instructions is a very serious offence.

3. Inspecting Officers must realise the importance of their duties, and are to carefully inspect all MFO baggage before signing the Certificate at Annex B to reference B. They are to ensure a copy of the Certificate is placed inside the container on top of the contents, and are to personally supervise the sealing of the container and its transfer to the appropriate on-forwarding staff.

25. SUBMACHINE GUN 9MM F1: BENDING OF MACHINE GUN BODY

1. DIRs have been submitted relative to bends in the bodies of F1s. The bends are in the front of the magazine housing, and are not always apparent to the users. However they cause inaccurate shooting.

2. This damage is caused by careless stowage of the weapons when they are carried in vehicles. It is realised no clamps for F1s are fitted to vehicles, but units are to ensure that the weapons are either laid flat or upright. If practicable the weapons should be held in position by some form of padding.

3. Units are to arrange for all F1s to be inspected by RAEME.

26. CODE 6565C/W2, TRACTOR, WHEELED, INDUSTRIAL, SIZE 5 MASSEY FERGUSON 205 MK II WITH FORKLIFT - TIGHTENING OF FLANGE BOLTS.

Reference: A. RAEME Engineer Equipment C513-1.

1. Instances have occurred of looseness in the two "Allen type" bolts located at nine and three o'clock in the adapter plate supporting the front mounted hydraulic pump. This condition is caused by either the bolts not being tightened on assembly or bottoming in the holes.

2. Units with this equipment are to request RAEME services to inspect the vehicles and repair if required.

27. THEFTS AT BEACHCOMBER CLUB

1. Recently at the 'Beachcomber' club, 3 Australian soldiers moved forward from their table to watch an act on the stage. When they returned to their table, two wallets and a shirt had been stolen. An official of the club stated that similar thefts had occurred on other occasions.
2. All personnel are to be warned of this situation.

28. HANDLING AND DISTRIBUTION OF PERSONAL MAIL

Reference: A. MBI 186-1 (Amdt 2)

1. Units are to ensure that all members responsible for handling personal mail are familiar with the reference, particularly paragraphs 7-9.

29. PREVENTION OF FIRES IN UNIT "CHOOFERS"

1. Many instances have occurred of "Choofers" catching alight. Most of these fires can be attributed to either of two reasons:
 - a. Fuel taps turned full on, filling the bottom of the choofers thus allowing lighted fuel to flow on to the surrounding area.
 - b. Excess sand in the bottom of the Choofers.
2. The means of overcoming the above problems are:
 - a. Turn the fuel tap full on, crimp the end of the fuel line with a pair of pliers until the required flow is achieved.
 - b. (1) Sand should be saucer shaped in the bottom of the choofer to allow a small catchment of excess fuel.
(2) Sand should be replaced periodically as burnt fuel forms a hard shell on the top of the sand after one or two weeks preventing the fuel from soaking into the sand.
(3) Sand should not be used to put out the fire as a build up of sand occurs. Choofers fuel taps should be turned off and the fire allowed to burn out.

d. Add water, and waste engine oil at the rate of one gallon per pan, via the remaining hole, so that the liquid level is brought nearly to the top.

e. Over a period of the next few weeks check daily the fall in the liquid level and keep adding clean fill, preferably sand, until the trench has filled and the liquid disappeared. Ensure each time that the temporary lid is effectively replaced.

f. Close the remaining opening with concrete and inscribe 'foul ground' and the date.
