COMMANDERS DIARIES  
INSTRUCTIONS

AIM

1. The aim of a Commanders Diary is to provide data on which to base future improvements in Army training, equipment, organization and administration, and to furnish historians with a record of the activities of units and formations in operational and non-operational periods in peace and in war.

GENERAL

2. Entries are to be made daily on AF C 2118 (Adapted) each entry being initialled by the officer detailed to keep it.
3. Commanders Diaries will conform with the rules for drafting orders given in "Staff Duties (Australia)" Chapter 2, Section 12.

RESPONSIBILITY

During Non-operational Periods

4. A Commanders Diary is to be compiled by commanders of all formations.

During Operational Periods (1)

5. A Commanders Diary is to be compiled in duplicate by:
  - a. Commanders of all formations.
  - b. Each branch of the staff at formation headquarters commanded by a brigadier or above.
  - c. Heads of services not below the rank of lieutenant colonel.
  - d. Personal staffs and officers holding special appointments.
  - e. Unit commanders.
  - f. Commanders of a detachment of a unit when so ordered.

COMPILATION

6. Both original and duplicate copies are to consist of:
  - a. Cover (AF C 2119) (Adapted).
  - b. Index as printed on cover.
  - c. Narrative (AF C 2118) (Adapted).
  - d. Annexes as shown in the Index.
7. All details of the unit or formation (if a detachment is concerned, the name of the parent unit), period covered and enclosure numbers of the annexes are to be shown on the cover. If there has been a change of command since the last report, the date of assumption by the new commanding officer is to be included.
8. The annexes are to be assembled in the groups shown on the cover. If there are no enclosures for a particular day, NIL will be entered on the cover. If additional annexes are convenient for a particular headquarters, they are to be included, starting at B.

for operations form Annex "Z", "TOP SECRET" to be entered on the document. It is to be prepared and disposed of as follows:

ANNEXES

- a. Orders (as well as map references), establishment, equipment and personnel orders given.
- b. Reports of the day's fighting, including company movements.
- c. Reports of the commander with regard to equipment, tactics, organization and personnel.
- d. Reports of special importance.
- e. Reports of officers, men and equipment.
- f. Reports of equipment captured.
- g. Reports of personnel employed in the time not accounted for. The type of

and to save work as much information as possible is to be included in the reports issued and received, routine returns, etc. All reports are to be dated and the time of receipt or despatch is to be given.

The annexes, but need not give a precis of any of them.

**DISPOSAL**

13. **Original Commander's Diary.** This is to be forwarded monthly, unless otherwise ordered, by the seventh day of the succeeding month direct to AHQ.

14. **Duplicate Commander's Diary.** This must be clearly marked as a duplicate. It is to be sent separately from the original to AHQ one month after the original has been despatched but not before the former has been acknowledged.

15. When overseas, both copies of diaries are to be sent through the Army Records organization in the overseas theatre but at different times.

16. **TOP SECRET Supplementary Diaries.**

a. The documents referred to in Paragraph 9 together with a list of them made out on AF C 2118 (Adapted) must be placed in separate cover (AF C 2119) (Adapted). All details must be filled in and the cover clearly marked in red: "ANNEX Z — OFFICER ONLY". It may be convenient to group the papers by appendices.

b. Supplementary diaries must be forwarded under the normal rules for TOP SECRET correspondence, to AHQ. The inner envelope must be plainly marked:

1. Enemy initiated activity throughout the Republic continued at a low level of intensity and was characterized by attacks by fire and light ground contacts.

2. I CTZ In MR TTH, enemy initiated activity was again confined to the central Piedmont area and was primarily directed against allied fire support bases. The pattern of enemy activity suggests a possible increase in the tactical posture of 29 NVA Regt of 324B NVA Div. In MR-5, enemy initiated activity continued at a low level as enemy forces continued preparations for Phase Two activities. Elements of 1 VC Regt, 2 NVA Div may once again be tactically committed in their former AO in the HLEP DOC areas.

3. II CTZ In the B-3 Front, the enemy continued to conduct limited offensive activity against allied units and installations in the BEN HET - DAK SEANG area. Captured documents indicate that elements of 95B NVA Regt are planning to conduct increased tactical activity in the vicinity of the BINH CHANG PASS. In MR-5, a captured document revealed that the second phase of the Summer Campaign was to begin on the night 2/3 May. Information from PWs and captured documents during the past two months has confirmed the deactivation of the HQ 22 NVA Regt.

4. III CTZ Elements of the three divisions remain deployed in the Western and Northern border areas of III CTZ. 9 VC Div continued to establish AOs in Western Tay Ninh Province while 7 NVA Div expanded its AO into Eastern War Zone "C" where major elements of 209 NVA Regt were identified. 5 VC Div is probably preparing for increased tactical activity in Phuoc Long Province.

4. IV CTZ Enemy activity continued at a moderate level and was characterized by ABFs and limited ground attacks with the heaviest concentration of activity in the Seven Mountains. The concentration of VC Main Force units in CAI LAY district of Binh Tuong Province poses a substantial threat to that area, while 18 NVA Regt continues to conduct harassing attacks in Southern Base Area 400 in possible preparation for attacks against TRI TON district town. 95 NVA Regt probably continues its southerly movement to Base Area 483.

1 ATF TAOR

1. General. There were 20 contacts during the week for a total of 18 VC KIA (including 4 bodies found from an earlier contact). Three of these contacts were with groups of up to 20 trying to enter DAT DO and HOA LONG.
2. AO PENNY. 7 RAR continued to find bunkers constructed by D445 during that unit's recent attempt to get established in the TAN RU/DAT SET area. Four different positions, all newly constructed, have been identified as recently occupied by sub-units of D445 and C6 D440. The largest was of 22 bunkers at YS585709 previously occupied by HQ and one coy. There were two contacts with C6/D440 at YS571679 on 3 May indicating the continued presence of that coy, although captured documents previously revealed that it had been instructed to return NORTH to BA LONG base area. It is possible that one coy of D445 also remains in AO PENNY in order to continue rice collection for BA LONG.
3. 8 RAR. In operations around DAT DO, APs twice had heavy contacts with large groups of D445 and local guerillas trying to enter the town. Captured documents show identifications of all coys of D445 during the week but it cannot be confirmed that all are actually present in the area of the LONG HAIS. Documents from a contact on the night 3/4 May included a recent sketch map of PHUOC THANH/PHUOC HOA LONG showing a plan of attack against the RDC compound at approx YS488598. There were also detailed instructions on the reconstruction of mine defences in and around the LONG HAIS and on the development of a new track system around the area and into DAT DO. In operations WEST of Route 2 patrols of 8 RAR had a contact with about 20 VC on 30 Apr at YS373756. This was probably a group of D440 but no positive identification was made. On 1 May patrols found the base camp of the BINH BA Guerilla Unit at YS401748 after three contacts with that unit in which 4 VC were killed. One of the KIA was identified as Secretary of Binh Ba Party Chapter, a VC of considerable importance and influence in that area.
4. ENEMY ACTIVITY. Plans were almost certainly made to attack a GVN post in DAT DO during the week, probably the RDC compound at PHUOC THANH, but were frustrated by 8 RAR ambushes. Further attempts will probably be made in the coming week. The expected mine attacks by BA LONG engineers against vehicles on Route 2 and its side roads have been taking place with anti tank mine incidents on the Southern edge of Binh Ba Rubber (YS434735) and in Courtenay (YS445892). Three other mines were found and destroyed in the BINH BA area. This activity is likely to continue in an effort to prevent route construction and land clearing.
5. ENEMY DEPLOYMENTS. D445, or the major part of it, remain in the MINH DAM with C25 and local guerillas. Most activity reported by VR appears to be in the Northern part of the main feature. C6 and possibly one coy of D445 appear to still remain in the TAN RU/DAT SET area.

I CTZ

1. There was no significant activity in the B-5 Front or MRTH, with major enemy dispositions remaining generally unchanged. Allied forces in Quang Ngai Province continued to report sporadic contacts with elements of 2 NVA Div during daylight hours, with moderate to heavy ground attacks during the night. From the 4 May 70 a total of 526 enemy have been killed in the HIEP IUC area. Despite the lack of increased activity in Quang Nam and Quang Tin Provinces, the increased activity in Quang Ngai probably represents the initiation of the enemies 2nd phase of the current campaign.

II CTZ

2. Activity continued at a low level throughout the CTZ. Operation BINH TAY 1 continued in Base Area 702 with light to scattered enemy contact. In Southern Base Area 702 US elements destroyed 2 armoured vehicles and one dump truck. In the NORTH of Base Area 702, US elements found a cache containing 500 tons of polished rice, which has been evacuated by ARVN forces. 82 enemy have been killed in this operation.

III CTZ

3. Enemy initiated activity increased moderately during the early stages of the reporting period. The planned enemy highpoint of 2-3 May was of relatively low intensity, probably due to the fact that the allied operations within communist base areas upset enemy plans. Allied operations in CAMBODIA have spread from the PARROT'S BEAK and FISHHOOK areas and now include base areas 350, 351, 354 and 707. These operations have completely disrupted the enemys normal logistical flow from CAMBODIA. Although the impact of the enemy forces within the interior of the corps will not be immediately noticed, his combat capability should show a marked general decrease prior to the end of the rainy season. Spot reports reveal the following enemy losses: 3,767 KIA, 6,673 individual weapons, 793 crew served weapons, 1,112 tons rice, 859 tons ammunition. Other equipment recovered include: 142 vehicles, 1,555 gallons oil, 1585 gallons petrol, 12 tons medical supplies, 1,100 gas masks.

4. Recently captured documents have indicated that COSVN had issued instructions to relocate from the Cambodian base areas deeper in CAMBODIA. Analysis of these documents completed thus far indicate that these planned relocations were contingency plans rather than reaction to advance intelligence on the allied operations. The plans appear to have been generated as a result of the overthrow of SIHANOUK and the resultant uncertainty which accompanied the coup. There is no information to date which clearly indicates that enemy forces had advance intelligence concerning the allied base area operations.

5. Activity throughout the sub-regions increased with the exceptions of SR 2,3, and 6, these most effected by the Cambodian campaign.

IV CTZ

6. Enemy activity continued at a moderate level with 18 NVA Regt continuing to conduct harassing attacks in Southern Base Area 400. 95 NVA Regt appears to be continuing its Southerly movement to Base Area 483 while other major enemy dispositions remain unaltered.

1 ATF TAOR.

7. There were twelve contacts with small enemy groups in which 6 VC were KIA, these mainly groups trying to enter hamlets on Route 44, DAT DO, LONG DIEN and HOA LONG. There were three mine incidents involving 1 ATF vehicles and three mines were located and destroyed.

8. VC initiated 5 minor attacks by fire against RF/PF at LONG DIEN, PHUOC HAI, HOI MY and SOUI NGHE and set one road block on route 326. 1 VC and 1 PF were killed.

9. The increase in enemy activity planned for this period has not eventuated due primarily to ambushes which have greatly reduced VC freedom of movement, and to the heavy fire which has been directed into and around his base areas in the LONG HAI.

ENEMY INTENTIONS

10. Directives from COSVN to sub-regions contained in recent captured documents reveal that May is considered to be a most important phase of offensive operations, both to negate any increase in GVN capabilities to assume further responsibilities from allied forces, and to exploit weaknesses created by the redeployment of allied and ARVN forces to CAMBODIA. The greatest effort has been called for from MF Regts and LF units to support a special emphasis on widespread sapper and guerilla attacks against RDC, RF/PF, Special Police, the PHOENIX organisation and GVN officials.

11. Documents, however, also reflect concern on the present weakness of the low level VC structure, the strength of which is fundamental to the whole VC organisation, and indicate serious problems of supply and leadership.

12. D445 returned to its base in the MINH DAM, and began to re-develop the mine defences and a new track system, clearly with the intention of remaining for some time and trying to implement this new phase of activity called for by higher HQ.

13. A recent HOI CHANH from C4/D445 states that he overheard an Orders Group held in the LONG HAI at which the CO detailed boys to support local guerillas in operations against LONG DIEN, DAT DO and PHUOC HAI, which is in accordance with COSVN instructions.

ENEMY CAPABILITIES

14. Ambushes so far have prevented attempts to interfere seriously in the villages and the VC will appreciate by now that operations by large groups of 20-30 are very vulnerable.

15. It is probable that while the present pressure on the area is maintained the difficulty of VC movement will be such that no more than very minor harassment of GVN posts will be attempted. D445 morale has been effected by losses and coy strengths now average only about 24 persons. The weapons coy has only one 82mm mortar, 2 x 12.8 HMGs (without tripods) and 1 x 75mm RCL.

16. CHAU DUC is having similar difficulties, and has even less capability in its attempts to operate against HOA LONG and the Route 2 villages. 3 VC killed SW of HOA LONG on the night 9/10 May were identified as members of the sapper/recce platoon which normally provides the scout group for the main body, so this ambush probably prevented another attempt to enter HOA LONG. The strength of C41 (Chau Duc Coy) appears to be about 30.

17. D440 has made no identified attack in its AO along Route 2. There are now only two small coys available and these seem reluctant to commence operations in the DUC THANH district. There have been reported several entries by small groups of VC into SOUI NGHE and DUC MY, one group being fired on by RF on night 9/10 May. These were probably trying to get food supplies. A group of BA LONG Engineers appears to be engaged in laying mines on and near Route 2, and this will continue in an attempt to limit vehicle movement and road construction.

ENEMY LOCATIONS.

18. D445, with LONG DAT District local guerillas, remain in the LONG HAI, principally in the Southern CHAU VIEN feature, as indicated by a HOI CHANH and by VR.

19. CHAU DUC District and C41 are probably located in the CHAU PHA valley or in the NUI DINHS. The BARIA CITY UNIT and a group of VUNG TAU UNIT, associated with CHAU DUC, are probably also in the NUI DINHS. A coy of D67 Engrs usually based in the NUI THI VAIS has not been identified for several months.

20. HQ D440 with two coys, the BINH BA guerillas with about 10 persons and NGAI GIAO guerillas with possibly another 10, are probably located in the general area WEST of NGAI GIAO but frequently move their bases to avoid contact.



1 ATF TAOR

1. There were 12 contacts in which a total of 20 VC were killed. Six of these were with local VC forces attempting to enter villages in DAT DO, LONG DIEN and HOA LONG. The only en initiated action, other than several mine and road block incidents, was the assassination of two VN at BARIA, believed to be police informants, and the attempted assassination of a prominent citizen of LONG HUONG.

2. En plans for offensive ops in this period have not eventuated due to the increased difficulty of penetration of the villages.

En Intentions

3. The mission of D445 to conduct ops against GVN posts in DAT DO and LONG DIEN Districts has probably now been deferred pending a more favourable opportunity. The unit was to remain close to the people and to re-establish its authority by attacking local GVN forces; it is apparent now that this has been prevented. Local guerillas, particularly LONG DAT Dist Unit will probably cont to attempt minor harassment.

4. CHAU IUC similarly has been prevented from conducting ops at HOA LONG and the loss of 7 killed on the 14th by 8 RAR will have a further deterrent effect.

5. D440 has had a mission to attack targets on Route 2 and to sp mining ops by BA LONG Engrs, but little attempt has been made to carry this out. A recent HOI CHANH from HQ D440 stated that the staff were told in a political orientation period between 4-9 May that the unit was soon to attack an Aust post (unspecified). The comd had been away on recce and a coy had stored 1000 litres of rice as unit reserve. If this is correct, then a likely tgt for an attack in the near future would be NDP ELIZABETH.

6. A directive in captured docs issued by BA LONG on 13 Apr 70 instructs local forces to increase anti ac attacks between 16 Apr - 25 May. There have been several attacks by SA fire in this period.

En Capabilities

7. D445 for the time being is in no posn to conduct any serious action, as not only approach to, but wdr from, any of the known tgt areas would pose an unacceptable risk for a large group. There is probably also a shortage of ammo and food sups as a result of ops from the MINH DAM over the past 3 weeks. It is likely therefore that a temp wdr from the base is being considered.

8. Local guerillas assisted by cells within the villages have a capability to continue harassment by mining and assassination of local officials.

9. CHAU IUC will attempt to avoid contact but could infiltrate small parties to sp VCI in HOA LONG and to get food sups.

10. D440 has a capability to conduct an attack by fire but on past performances this would be a brief stand off attack only.

11. Local guerillas could initiate more SA attacks against ac but in gen are reluctant to do so .

En Locs

12. D445 appears still to be op from the CHAU VIEN area of the LONG HAI. Fresh tracks and other evidence of occupation are still being noted daily by VR. LONG MAT and local guerillas are also in the gen area.

13. CHAU IUC are probably based in the SOUI CHAU PHA valley. Regular track activity has been noted west of the stream in the NUI DINH. There is very little or no water in the re-entrants of the mountain and it is likely that the unit would base close to the main stream where it has been ident in the past.

14. D440 will have moved recently as a result of the rallier leaving the HQ; on her ground description the base was in area YS3477 west of the stream. The HQ and two coys have probably moved closer to Route 2 to the west of BINH BA.

I CTZ

1. In the B-5 Front major elements of 27 NVA Regt supported by elements of 84 and 164 NVA Arty Regts remain tactically committed south of the central DMZ. In MR TTH aerial photography has identified two new routes in the A SHAU VALLEY area. In MR5 internal morale problems and allied operations have probably pre-empted the enemy's planned May upsurge in tactical activity.

II CTZ

2. In the B-3 Front the enemy continued to conduct offensive activity against allied units and installations in the north western highlands. Operations Binh Tay 1 and 2 continue in BA 702 and 701 respectively with light enemy contact and the discovery of further enemy equipment, ammo and rice caches. Operation Binh Tay 3 commenced on 20 May in BA 740 with no enemy resistance.

III CTZ

3. A document dated 28 Apr indicates that COSVN anticipated allied cross-border ops with 1 Air Cav Div striking along Route 7 into Cambodia. Contingency plans were being prepared at that time. However allied ops still succeeded in capturing major enemy caches especially in the Fishhook area and in the vicinity of BA 351. A May 12 rallier stated that major elements of COSVN staff sections moved from a permanent base camp 16 km NW of MIMOT to an emergency redeployment site along the CHLONG River prior to an 11 May B-52 strike. The strike killed 151 enemy which was subsequently confirmed by ground recce.

IV CTZ

4. In eastern MR 2 enemy forces inflicted significant losses on friendly units in the Kien Hoa and Dinh Tuong Provinces. Cumulative results were friendly 22 KIA, 39 WIA, 4 MIA and 15 I/wpns lost against enemy losses of 17 KIA, 3 Det and 4 I/wpns captured.

A PW identified areas of SE KAMPOT and southern TAKEO Provinces in Cambodia as logistic base areas for MR 3 .

During the coming week enemy initiated activity is expected to remain at a low level. However the enemy may attempt diversionary activity to relieve allied pressure on enemy forces in Cambodia.

1. ATF TAOR

1. General

- a. There were 18 contacts in which 12 VC were killed (BC) and 5 PW captured.
- b. 820 lbs of rice were captured and a large no of bunkers were found principally those of D445 in AO CATHY and south of DAT DO.
- c. A HOI CHANH from D445 is at present co-op with 7RAR in a search for two caches of ammo and mines apparently known to him in AO CATHY.
- d. There were no en initiated actions of any significance in the province.

2. En Intentions

As reported last week, May was intended by COSVN to be a period of much increased activity in the sub regions, however in BA LONG no increase has been evident. This inactivity is probably due to disruption by allied ops and the apparent reluctance of sub region forces to comply with higher directives. In the immediate future the en will attempt to avoid contact and try to reorg.

3. En Capabilities

Capabilities remain unchanged to conduct minor harassment of GVN admin and forces with a view to preventing the developement of GVN self-reliance for local security. There is a limited capability to disseminate propaganda and to conduct mining and attacks by fire. An increasing difficulty of ammo sup will reduce further this capability in the future.

4. En Locs

- a. D445 as a unit has been so disorganized that individual sub units have to be searched out separately. Each sub unit has its own sup area in DAT DO and LONG DIEN districts and each is designated to sup, different local guerilla gps. Consequently each will try to maint base area conveniently placed for its purposes. At present C2 probably remain in AO CATHY having lost its most recent base, from which it can best approach the northern part of DAT DO. C3 with its normal AO centred on PHUOC HAI probably is in the LIGHT GREEN/LONG GREEN. HQ, C1 and C4 were reported in the LONG HAI (YS471498) on 23 May by a HOI CHANH from the HQ, but there is also evidence that C4 was to undertake a sup base in BA LONG some 10 days ago. C1 has not been ident for several weeks but its area of responsibility is PHUOC HOA LONG so it might well have remained in the LONG HAIS.

b. Part of the VUNG TAU city unit was ident in a contact with W/2 RAR in the southern NUI DINH in which the ZIC of that unit was killed, and two small bunker posn destroyed. This unit has been inactive for some time and probably remains in the NUI DINH where it is normally associated with BARIA city unit.

c. W/2 RAR also attacked a small base on the west of the NUI DINH, ident as used by a gp of CHAU DUC District. Other gps are probably in the western part of the hills. A HOI CHANH from the HQ reported the main HQ base area loc in the NUI DINH at YS346667, subsequently attacked by air. C41 is probably loc in the CHAU PHA valley or in the NUI DINH.

d. There has been no info aval on D440 and no identifiable activity by that unit or its associated local guerillas during the week. Its more usual area is between the SUOI DA DEN and SUOI XOAI but its two coys are likely to move frequently to avoid contact.

THE 'CITY' COMPLEX  
CAMBODIA

1. The 'City' complex was discovered on 4 May by elements of 1 US Cav Div. It is situated at GR XU5221 and covers an area of approximately 3 sq km. The complex consists of two sections: a three part storage area and a training area. The area was laced with interconnecting paths of bamboo matting from 3-8 ft in width.
2. The logistical storage area consisted of 182 storage bunkers containing mixed GI clothing and equipment, food stocks, medical supplies, weapons and munitions. Material was segregated and stored by type. Generally all types of equipment and supplies were in an excellent condition. About 80% of all bunkers were being used for storage and 60% of these were filled to capacity. The storage area was estimated to be 2.5 years old though some sections appeared to have been constructed within the past 6 months.
3. The depot also contained a training area, consisting of one large classroom, a makeshift small arms firing range and mess facilities to support the training area. Also located in the south eastern part of the complex was a small animal farm housing 75 chickens and 10 pigs, apparently supplying fresh meat for the depot personnel and the training school.
4. Attached as Appendices are a diagram of the complex and a list of items recovered.

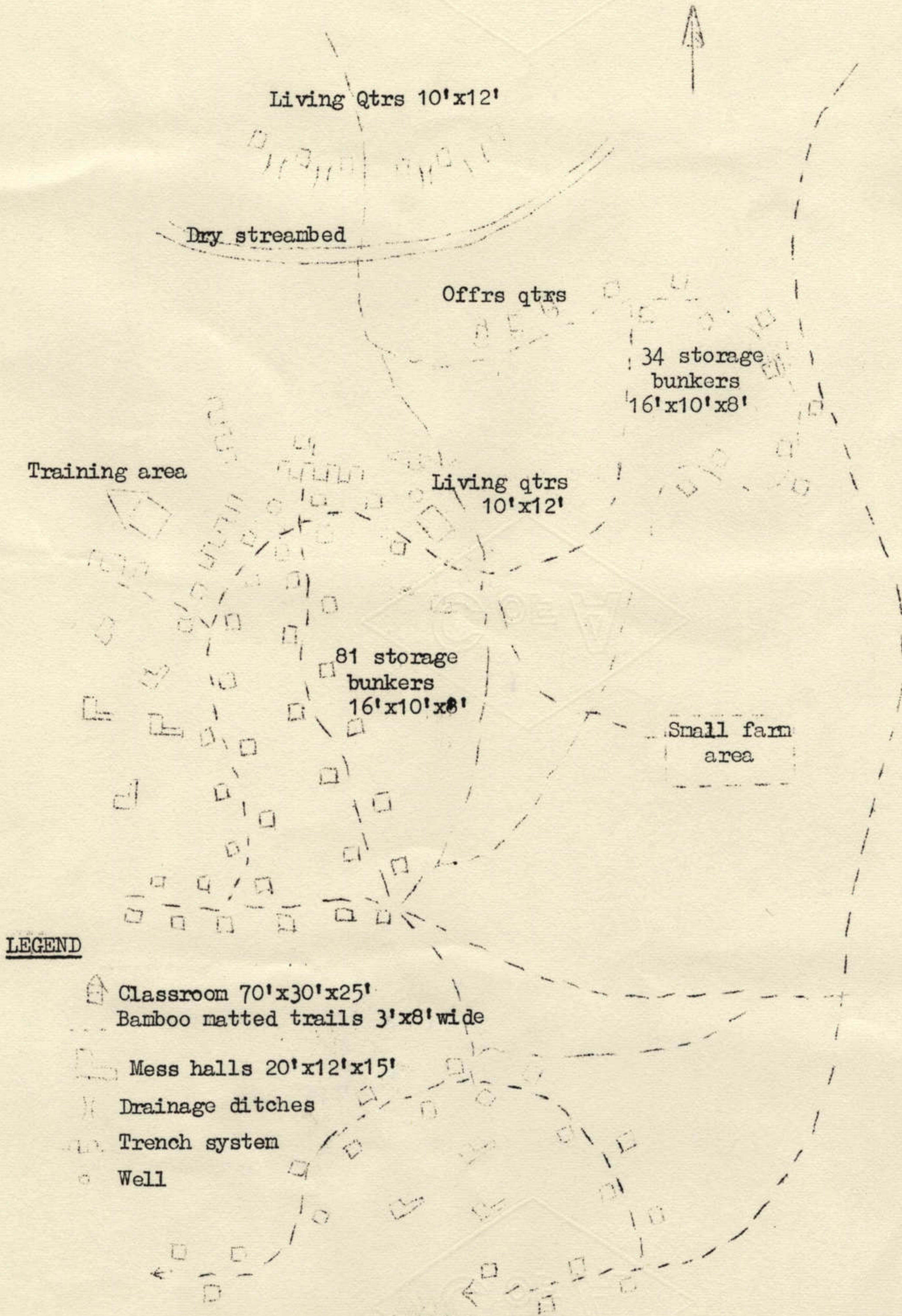

THE 'ROCK ISLAND EAST' CACHE  
CAMBODIA

1. On 8 May elements of 1 US Cav Div made the initial discovery of what has turned out to be the largest munitions cache of the war. Nicknamed 'Rock Island East' the cache totalled 331 tons, predominantly small arms ammo; the remainder consisted of heavy weapons ammo, crew served weapons and misc eqpt.
2. The access roads were broad enough to accomodate truck traffic and the materials were stored in bulk; however there was no drainage and the roads were not hard surface making the site unusable during the rainy season. Additionally the site was quite new; the ground cover had not been beaten down by foot or vehicular traffic, and the munitions boxes showed no sign of weathering. No attempt was made to protect the cache from the weather. There were no permanent structures.
3. The cache was evidently sorted for distribution to units, as each location contained several different items, found throughout the complex; .51 cal ammo was found in all sites. The fact that the materials were concentrated in such a small area and that no protection from the elements was provided indicates that the material was not intended to remain in the area.
4. The following is a list of the items found in the cache and attached as Appendix 1 is a sketch map of the area.





2. Units are to impress upon drivers the need for courteous, careful and alert driving. The difficulties in driving through built-up areas are especially appreciated but every effort must be made to reduce the toll of persons killed or maimed through vehicle accidents. Careless, impatient and reckless driving particularly when it results in an injury or death to Vietnamese nationals, is inhumane, hampers our pacification efforts and lowers our standing with the Vietnamese people.
3. Units are to ensure that disciplinary action is taken promptly when evidence is available that drivers have, through negligence, been instrumental in causing accidents. Subordinate Headquarters are to ensure prompt and effective action is taken by units on receipt of Provost reports. Recovery of costs of damages should be taken whenever warranted.
