COMMANDERS DIARIES
INSTRUCTIONS

AIM

1. The aim of a Commanders Diary is to provide data on which to base future improvements in Army training, equipment, organization and administration, and to furnish historians with a record of the activities of units and formations in operational and non-operational periods in peace and in war.

GENERAL

2. Entries are to be made daily on AF C 2118 (Adapted) each entry being initialled by the officer detailed to keep it.

3. Commanders Diaries will conform with the rules for drafting orders given in "Staff Duties (Australia)" Chapter 2, Section 12.

RESPONSIBILITY

During Non-operational Periods

4. A Commanders Diary is to be compiled by commanders of all formations.

During Operational Periods (1)

5. A Commanders Diary is to be compiled in duplicate by:

- a. Commanders of all formations.
- b. Each branch of the staff at formation headquarters commanded by a brigadier or above.
- c. Heads of services not below the rank of lieutenant colonel.
- d. Personal staffs and officers holding special appointments.
- e. Unit commanders.
- f. Commanders of a detachment of a unit when so ordered.

COMPILATION

6. Both original and duplicate copies are to consist of:

- a. Cover (AF C 2119) (Adapted).
- b. Index as printed on cover.
- c. Narrative (AF C 2118) (Adapted).
- d. Annexes as shown in the Index.

7. All details of the unit or formation (if a detachment is concerned, the name of the parent unit), period covered and enclosure numbers of the annexes are to be shown on the cover. If there has been a change of command since the last report, the date of assumption by the new commanding officer is to be included.

8. The annexes are to be assembled in the groups shown on the cover. If there are no enclosures for an annex NIL will be entered on the cover. If additional annexes are convenient for a particular headquarters, starting at B.

DISPOSAL

13. **Original Commander's Diary.** This is to be forwarded monthly, unless otherwise ordered, by seventh day of the succeeding month direct to AHQ.

14. **Duplicate Commander's Diary.** This must be clearly marked as a duplicate. It is to be sent separately from the original to AHQ one month after the original has been despatched but not before the former has been acknowledged.

15. When overseas, both copies of diaries are to be sent through the Army Records organization in the overseas theatre but at different times.

16. **TOP SECRET Supplementary Diaries.**

a. The documents referred to in Paragraph 9 together with a list of them made out on AF C 2118 (Adapted) must be placed in separate cover (AF C 2119) (Adapted). All details must be filled in and the cover clearly marked in red: "ANNEX Z — OFFICER ONLY". It may be convenient to group the papers by appendices.

b. Supplementary diaries must be forwarded under the normal rules for TOP SECRET correspondence, to AHQ. The inner envelope must be plainly marked:







MR 1

En activity remains at a low level. FSB FULLER and FSB O'REILLY cont to be tgts for ABF's the largest being against FSB FULLER (107 X 120mm mor rds) on 29 Aug. In MRTTH on 29 Aug a security train enroute from DA NANG to PHU LOC det a mine resulting in the train being de-railed. This was the 4th mining incident on this line since Jul and indicates cont emphasis on interdiction of lines of communication. Captured rds have indicated a new type of wpn being used in MR-5. The wpn is poss the D-44(85mm) field gun, range 15,650 mtrs.

MR 2

En activity increased slightly during the week. On 28 Aug a US convoy on Route 19 was ambushed 5Km east of An Khe. En force (prob 6 BN 12 NVA Regt) employed B-40 and SA. The convoy suffered 6 KIA and 26 WIA. On 29 Aug an RF compound SW of SONG CAU received ABF resulting in 11 KIA and 33 WIA. THU TAN hamlet was 85% destroyed. On 30 Aug sappers entered POL tank farm at CAM RANH BAY and detonated 2 satchel charges 460000 gals of aviation fuel were destroyed, 2 hrs later the airbase received 7rds 107mm rkt fire. These were the first such attacks since May - Aug 70.

MR 3

Enemy Activity

1. The very low level of en activity throughout the MR continued during the past week. As expected on 30 Aug there was an increase of terrorism and sabotage in some populated areas incl SAIGON in an attempt to disrupt the senate elections.
2. On 25 Aug a US merchant ship in the LONG TAU channel received 2 hits from RPG causing minor damage only. This brings the total of attacks to 18 since the 1 Jan. Elsewhere in the sub-region there was no major action.

Enemy Locs

3. There have been no real changes in en deployments since the last report. 209 Regt 7 NVA Div was ident a little further west from TAY NINH border and the mov of 141 NVA Regt to the vic of MIMOT indicates that this fm together with other Regts of 7 NVA Div are conc on sup activities in the FISH HOOK area.

En Intentions

4. The very low level of activity, particularly in BINH LONG Province where some offensive action was planned, tends to substantiate HOI CHANH reports that serious food and ammo shortages exist for the maj units as is to be expected throughout MR 3. However in spite of obvious difficulties there are still clear indications of intention to increase tactical activity in the first week of Sep.
5. One example of these intentions was noted in a doc originated from the office of the Chairman PRG, captured near DAU TIENG. This stated that high pt activity was to take place on 2 and 3 Sep and it is to be directed at elimination of rural GVN officials. Other reports from both HOI CHANH and PW indicate tgts such as BIEN HOA, LONG BINH and XUAN LOC but due to the enemies reduced capability it is likely that in those areas attacks would take the form of terrorism against GVN officials and small scale ambushes or attacks by fire on GVN and allied forces.
6. There was therefore an intention to conduct widespread offensive activities to mark the commemorative days 1 and 3 Sep, one of those days being selected as D Day on which all co-ord would be based but the capability to execute such actions is very low.

MR 4

There was a significant increase in the number of ABF's during the week. There were 53 of which all except 1 consisted of 20 rds or less. Frd force was moderate. 16 civs were killed and 90 wounded. 10 ABF's were directed against towns and the remainder RF/PF ops. One ABF succeeded in destroying 150,000 gals of aviation fuel at the KIEN LONG Cement Plant. A PF op 21 Km ESE of VI THANH received an ABF followed by a ground attack which overran the op. 11 frd KIA 8 WIA 12 MIA 20 I/wpns and 2 Radios were lost.

1. STATISTICS FOR REPORTING PERIOD

2. General

There were no enemy initiated incidents and the GVN elections of 30 Aug were conducted without interference by the VC, indicating again the extent of disruption of VCI and district forces.

3. The most important development was the return of D445 from its period of re-trg in BINH TUY to its normal AO in LONG DAT district, after 6 weeks absence. So far there is evidence of HQ and two coys NE of DAT DO and it must be expected that the remainder are present.

4. En Intentions and Capabilities

Throughout MR 3 there have been indications that the en should shortly make a special effort to regain some degree of initiative by conducting a no of small ambushes probably against single vulnerable vehs, and small scale attacks by fire on GVN and allied posts. In MR 7 in particular 274 and 33 Regts retain a capability to conduct such limited ops with sp from 82mm more in BIEN HOA, LONG KHAMH and BINH TUY. However, while it must be expected that similar directives have been given to HQ BA LONG and subordinate units, the capability to manoeuvre and to co-ord activities of district and province forces has become very restricted.

5. The return of D445 during the week to LONG DAT District almost certainly indicates an intention to conduct ops against DAT DO in the near future, this unit has probably improved its state of morale and health and might have aquired stores and ammo, incl 82mm mor ammo, which it has lacked in the past. The trg programme of C2 (incl in docus captured by 7RAR) shows some emphasis on spr trg but also but also incl the practice of coy attacks which it might still consider possible against a GVN post. The subjects covered were elementary and did not indicate any change in gen ability to conduct small scale actions. There is no evidence in rft, which is unliely, and coysters probably remain about 30 men.

6. On the other hand, during the absence of the coys, TF and GVN ops against LONG DAT forces and VCI have contributed to their isolation from local sp so increasing the vulnerability of snr cadres and of sub-units when they commence to op in DAT DO again.

7. Similarly in HOA LONG, the serious damage inflicted on CHAU DUC forces has had its effect both on VC morale and on the authority which the district forces had in HOA LONG. While their dependance on HOA LONG, as the focal pt of their influence, has increased, so also has their vulnerability increased. The survival of the district forces now depends entirely on their ability to penetrate HOA LONG in order to re-estb influence and confidence and to gather sups.

En Locs.

8. a. D445. The return of this unit was indicated on 26 Aug when VR by 161 Flt reported by tracks from the NE made on the ni 25/26, and a ptl of 7 RAR loc a new coy camp under constr at YS 5564. Other attempts to estb. bases were prevented by timely action but it must be expected that further prep of coy bases has begun. the intended deployment of the unit is probably much the same as be fore, dictated by the necessity to cover coy areas of responsibility in LONG DIEN, DAT DO, Route 44, with C2 and C3 operating from east and NE of DAT DO, HQ and C1 in the LONG HAI and C4 used as a gen sp coy for tpt and mor sp. C4 left its only 82mm mor hidden in the LONG HAI previously due to lack of ammo but is possible that it could be brought into use again.

b. LONG DAT. HQ and admin sects remain in NUI CHA VIEN but C25, reported last week in NUI HON THUNG, probably returned to the southern feature after a rallier had compromised its base. A member of C25 was killed by a 7 RAR ambush at YS491520 on 25 Aug which tends to sp this.

c. CHAU DUC. The district HQ with C41 and all its admin sects evac a base at YS336732 on about 26 Aug, subsequently found by 2 RAR. It was intended to estb a new base in the vic of the SUOI SAUI (YS3871) but this was probably changed due to compromise by a rallier. This force will probably try to remain in the CHAU PHA valley north of NUI DINH but some sects might have returned into the hill complex.

d. D65. There has been no ident of HQ and A2 during the week and they have probably wdr into the NUI DINH. As reported las week, A4 appears to have been based in the HAT DICH where recently used tunnels and a base camp at YS334770 were found by 2 RAR and RF ptls. This coy probably remains in the vic of HAT DICH Secret Zone.

e. D440. There has been no evidence of the return of any part of D440 and the coys appear to remain in LONG KHANH. The future emp of the unit west of Route 2 will depend very much on the ability and willingness of hamlet guerrilla forces to sp it and this is unlikely.

9. All BA LONG forces are intended to initiate some form of increased activity, in co-ord with MR-7 plans, against tgts in and around DATDO and HOA LONG in the near future. Any offensive activity will be coupled with attempts at food collection and will be principally for propaganda effect to counteract recent losses and increased isolation from the villages.

1 ATF TAOR

1. Statistics for reporting period.

See ANNEX A.

2. General

There has been no change from the assessment of last week. District forces again failed to attempt any offensive activity, and clearly have no real capability to do so, concentrating only on food supply.

VC Activities

3. a. CHAU DUC cont with sup activity into HOA LONG, getting sufficient to maintain a reduced but adequate individual ration scale of 2/3 litre per day.
- b. D65 cont to avoid contact and still appear to be getting sups primarily from THAI THIEN.
- c. D445, although it cannot yet be estb which sub-units are present (other than HQ and C2 which have been ident) have not attempted any offensive activity. The unit is probably engaged on recce and deployment of new base areas. There is some evidence that infiltration of DAT DO or the hamlets off route 44 has been effected but not to the scale which could provide sups for all sub-units.
- d. LONG DAT Dist cont sup activity only in PHUOC HAI and probably LONG DIEN. This HQ does not appear yet to have been able to est any real co-ord with HQ D445, although a VC killed by 7 RAR NE of DAT DO ident as APO of C25, indicates an attempt to estb liaison.
- e. In the production area of BINH CHUA, where destruction of VC agriculture is now in progress, there is evidence of a well established sup system serving BA LONG Rear Services or 84 RSG. The area provides fish, vegetables and rice for VC agencies to the north.

VC Capabilities and Intentions

4. There is no change from last weeks assessment. There is still no evidence that D445 has been able to improve its capabilities and its main vulnerability still lies on its dependence on local sup. It cannot yet be estb whether the unit has acquired some hvy wpns sp and this must still be considered a possibility.
5. The disruption of D65 base area appears to have prevented that unit's mining activity and it is concerned only with avoiding contact.
6. It is assumed that, despite higher directives to conduct increased offensive activities generally in Phuoc Tuy, as in other provinces, the VC will continue to avoid contact. Sup problems will cont to restrict their ops and will remain their most serious vulnerability.

VC Locs

Again, no change from the last assessment.

- a. Chau Duc agencies have consistently changed locs along the gen line of the Suoi Chau Pha between Nui Dinh and Hat Dich. At least 6 recorded

moves have been made since 18 Aug and present locs are unknown.

b. There was no ident of D65 during the week but there was further evidence of sup. gps moving through AO Mango towards Thai Thien, indicating a base north of, or in the Nui Dinh.

c. HQ Long Dat Dist and its agencies remain in the Long Hais.

d. HQ D445 was reported NE of Dat Do but there has been no ident of sub-units during the week. Lack of any maj track activity after extensive ground recce by 7RAR NE of Dat Do possibly indicates any base areas are likely to be further north in the jungle of the Tan Ru.

Enemy initiated activity generally decreased throughout the country during the week. Major enemy units remain in current locs and are concentrating on resup and trg.

MR 1

In MRTTH FSBs FULLER and CARROLL cont to be focus of en activity. Elsewhere in MR 1 en activity has generally been at a low level with only one significant ABF being reported. In MR 5 on Sep 1 DA NANG airfield received 8 X 122mm Rkts. Results were 2 WIA, 1 PAN AM 707 and a C13 damaged.

MR 2

There were no significant ABFs reported during the week. In BINH THUAN Province on 31 Aug, 4kms west of Luong Son (BN 099387) RF elms spotted an est en coy attempting to cross Route 1. Gunships Tac Air and ARVN reacted and made contact with an est Bn. Results were: Frd - 3 KIA 22 WIA ; En 56 KIA 12 I/Wpns and 9 CS/WPNS CIA.

MR 3

1. In spite of the many int refs to a maj high point in the period 1 - 4 Sep, the gen level of activity throughout MR 3 remained low. There were localised increases on both 30 Aug and 3 Sep, when 12 and 10 ABFs respectively occurred, mainly in TAY NINH, HAU NGHIA and BINH DUONG Provinces.
2. On 31 Aug, an RF compound NE of VO DAT, BINH TUY, received some 80 rds of 60 and 82mm mor fire resulting in 5 friendly forces KIA and 5 WIA. The attacking force was not ident but was probably a unit of 33 NVA Regt.
3. In the sub regions, the low level of activity cont with some lt ABFs and minor ground contacts. No major activity was reported from Sub-Regions 1,4 and 5 and only 1 attempted terrorist incident was reported in SAIGON.

En Locs

4. a. 5 VC Div. Still deployed in CAMBODIA, with possibly some units in Northern BINH LONG and PHUOC LONG. 174 Regt appears to have moved ENE of SNOUL which could indicate some interest in BINH LONG.
- b. 7 NVA Div. Still in CAMBODIA Nth of TAY NINH. 141 Regt ident ESE of MIMOT, 165 Regt probably North of the DOGS HEAD and ENE of KREK, 209 Regt WNW of MIMOT.
- c. 9 NVA Div. Deployed generally in MR 1 and MR 4 of CAMBODIA. The nearest fmn to MR 3 is 95C Regt last ident 31 Aug West of BA 354 (WT 863683)
- d. 33 NVA Regt Still in Eastern BINH TUY Province although two contacts by 2/25 Div indicate a possible move of 3 Bn to SE XUAN LOC, well out of its normal area.

Assessment

5. A no of sources have indicated intentions to attempt high pts on 10 and 15 Sep. However, the constant failure of the enemy to execute many previous plans for high pts is probably a good indication of greatly decreased capability and a lowered state of morale in units of MR 3. During the coming week, en offensive activity will remain at a low level as units cont to avoid major contact and concentrate on their sup problems.

MR 4

The recent high number of ABFs decreased during the past week. There were no significant incidents reported and most of the ABFs were of less than 20 rds with only moderate frd cas being reported.

On PHU QUOC Island (US 930110) 40 VC PW attacked their VNN guards killing one and wounding the other. 2 Gunships in the area reacted and killed 9 PW, 29 escaped and have probably joined local guerrillas.

1 ATF TAOR

Gen

1. Statistics. See Annex A.
2. There were no major contacts and no reported maj incidents in the villages. The gen sit remained much the same as last week with district forces concerned with getting food sups and the Province unit D445 conducting recce of DAT DO area and trying to get re-estb in its AO for future ops.
3. The most important contact was the ambush by a ptl of 7 RAR against the recce sect of D445 under the Bn XO. The gp had a msn to conduct recce of proposed tgts in DAT DO and to procure and store sups for the Bn. The death of the XO and others, the capture of the XO's personal docus have disrupted D445 plans, denied them int and food sups and provided valuable current int and capabilities and intentions of the unit.

En Activities

4. a. CHAU DUC. There was one identified contact with CHAU DUC forces. This was by W Coy at YS253788 where the PO B2/C41 was killed and docus revealed that THAI THIEN is now being used as an altn source of sp due to the interdiction of routes to HOA LONG by 8 RAR. Docus indicate that an attempt to enter HOA LONG on 14 Sep failed and the force has been seriously short of food. However, a gp estb itself near THAI THIEN between 7-14 Sep and has since been able to store and distr sufficient sups to alleviate the problem. It should be noted that with the large no of VC units known to draw sups from THAI THIEN (incl SR4 units, 274 Regt, D65 and CHAU DUC) it is clear that most sups are coming from SAIGON for dist through this area.
 - b. D65. There was no ident during the week and no offensive action by this unit.
 - c. LONG DAT DISTRICTS The security sect was involved in some recce in DAT DO with D445 and liaison between the 2 HQs reported last week indicates co-ord of intended ops against GVN authorities in DAT DO (PHUOC THO). Tgts incl the Police Station and PSDF posts.
 - d. D445 The recce sect under the Bn XO conducted recce of proposed tgts for attack in PHUOC THO during the past 2 weeks, op from a base in map square YS5159 and was responsible also for storage of sups for the unit. The loss of this party will be a serious setback to the units attempt to get re-estb in the area and the failure to procure sups will impose further hardships on sub-units. An attempt must be expected shortly to infiltrate a sup party, but the ident of 4 houses which usually sup VC (from itg of PW) will increase the difficulties.

EN CAPABILITIES AND INTENTIONS

5. Some action was planned by D445 against tgts in DAT DO but that op has now been compromised. Capabilities do not appear to have improved appreciably although it is possible that (as reported independetly by 2 PW) K8, hte hy wps coy of HQ BA LONG, has been att to the unit. It must be assumed also that 82mm mor ammo is now avail and up to 3 mors could be used to sp future ops. On the other hand, C3 appears to have been taken under op con of HQ BA LONG to sp ops in XUAN LOC District, leaving D445 with only two small rifle coys of about 30 men, each with some spr training. Morale generally is probably still low and not improved by the unit's initial failures to estb secure bases and store sups. The units main concern for the near future will be to get food sups.

6. CHAU IUC does not appear to have been able to enter HOA LONG during the week except possibly by courier infiltration. Morale is very low byt the development of an altn source of sup at THAI THIEN could improve their posn. There is also reported a large area of tubers growing in vic of YS366765 which has been an emergency reserve and may now be in use. C41 now has only about 25 str incl HQ staff and the distrct force as a whole has a very low offensive capability with no real prospect of improvement.

7. BA LONG Rear Svcs' large production areas in BINH TUY and easter PHUOC TUY have now been destroyed, denying fresh sups to units in the area of the MAY TAO.

EN LOCS

8. a. LONG DAT agencies remain in the LONG HAI's, ident was made of the security sect in DAT DO in sp of D445 recce and a Hoi Chanh reported that a civil labour gp of about 27 has been placed in sp of D445 to assist with food collection.

b. D445. Apart from the recce sect, the only ident was that of C2 by docus found in a recently used base in map square YS5068, still under constr when loc on 16 Sep. As reported last week it is possible that one sub-unit returned to the LONG HAI's but two or three sub-units are still unloc east or NE of DAT DO.

c. CHAU IUC. The only ident was of a gp involved in sup from THAI THIEN and it is probable that tpt gps are moving NW along the gen line of the SUOI CHAU PHA to collect sups from a cache to the east of that village. The various gps are unloc but probably remain dispersed in the area north of the NUI DINHs with some agencies in the hill complete.

MR 1

Enemy initiated activity remained at a low level. There were no major ground contacts but FSBs O'RIELLY and BARNETT continue to focus of en attention.

On 14 Sep in the vic of FSB O'RIELLY (YD 300240) ARVN elms received an ABF consisting of 100 rds 82mm Mor and 20 CS rds of unk cal. This is the second reported use of CS by the enin MR1 during Sep.

AA document captured on 14 Aug 12kmSSW of TAM KY reveals the extent of the food problem faced by the en in that area. During the first 6 months food production in QUANG TIN Prov totalled only 25.3% of the estab quota.

An NVA Lt captured by ARVN 4km SSW of FSB O'RIELLY on 16 Sep stated that his coy had only 35 men left out of an original 120 and morale was low

MR 2

In B3 front on 13 Sep, 24 km nth of KONTUM CITY (AS803012) ARVN elms discovered a probable en base area, a search of the area revealed 70 chickens, 40 pigs and a .6 ton food cache thus further compounding the already restricted food sups.

An agent in BINH THUAN Prov reported that VC guerrillas and cadre are to contact their relatives and inform them that they must supply food and that any family refusing **will** be abducted for political training. A rallier in the same province stated that his bn has been placed on reduced rations and tactical ops are being affected by this.

MR 3

En Activity

1. En initiated activity remained at a low level again throughout most of MR3 and several known to be planned by VC failed to materialize. However, 5 VC Div appeared to be active in the vicinity of LOC NINH (northern BINH LONG) where CIDG and RF units had several hy contacts.
- 2 A HOI CHANH who rallied from 141 NVA Regt on 8 Sep has reported that his regt had infiltrated TAY NINH Province to conduct attacks along Route 22 for 6 days and that it would then wdr back tp MIMOT. Similar indications were noted with 95C Regt, withdrawing after brief ops, which could indicate difficulty of local logis. support.

3. There has been further evidence of the fragmentation of some regt and bn sized units to provide rft to LF units in SR 1 and SR 5. 268 regt has been redesignated K3 Bn; the QUYET THANG Regt has been reported disbanded as has the DONG NAI Regt of SR5 and their bns are opindependently. This downgrading of selected MF fms has been expected for some time as a measure to increase guerrilla activity but it must be seen as an important retrograde step reflecting the serious damage suffered by sub region forces.

En Locs

4. a. HQ 5 VC Div and subordinates are still deployed in CAMBODIA, northern BINH LONG and PHUOC LONG Provinces. Some units still pose a threat to BUDOP.

b. 7 NVA Div remains in CAMBODIA and during the week all units apparently remained out of contact.

c. 9 VC Div is in CAMBODIA with possibly some units in northern TAY NINH, but no maj contacts were reported by GVN forces.

En Capabilities and Intentions

5. There do not at the moment appear to be any maj ops pending and capabilities remain generally low and aggravated by logistic and morale problems. Last week it was reported that 3/274 Regt appeared to be planning action against posts and tfc on Route 15 but later evidence indicates a postponement due to serious sup difficulties. An NVA Spr Trg BN desinated H-11 has been ident recently, possibly loc in CAMBODIA north of TAY NINH. This could indicate a new capability to improve spr trg which COSVN has been unable to do in the past, despite long stated intentions to concentrate on this fd.

MR 4

RF/PF and other pacification agencies continue to be centre of en attention in MR 4. Indications of the problems facing local VC in KIEN HOA Prov was provided by a rallier who claiied to be Asst Chief Entertainments subsection of Propaganda section and documents captured on 15 Aug. The rallier stated that Red China had offered to send volunteers to SVN after cross border ops began. COSVN however had to turn down the offer as they could not supply enough food. Red China is now however sending US green dollars he stated. Documents captured on 15 Aug (XS669415) contained a directive from HQ VC MR2 ordering all units to conserve wpns, food and ammo. Also beginning in Jun pay and rice rations would be decreased. On 15 Sep in central An Xuyen Prov an RF unit was engaged by an unk size en force using hvy wpns. During the subsequent extraction 10 helicopters were shot down. On night 17/18 Sep Can Tho airfield received 41 x 82mm mor rds resulting in 8 aircrafts damaged.

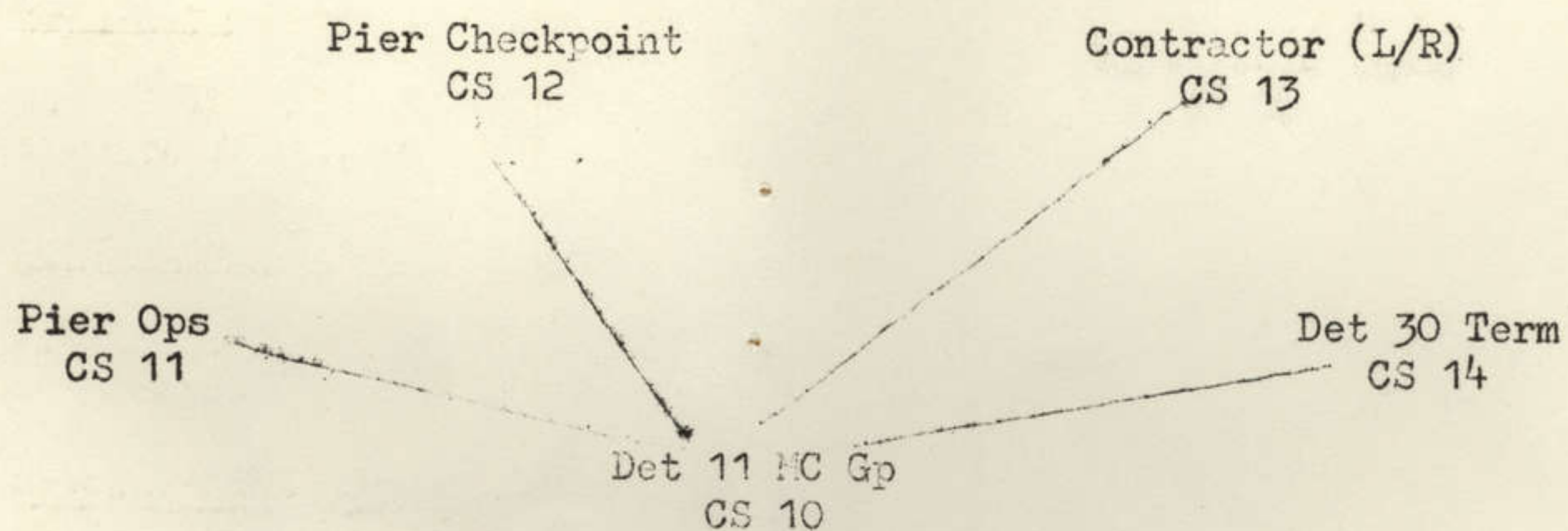

OVERSEAS TELEPHONE SERVICE FOR AFV

1. Approval has been given for the installation of telephones in 1 ALSG which are connected directly to the overseas telephone system.
2. The telephones will be connected to only one overseas circuit and consequently, use will have to be proportioned to the various elements of the force at Vung Tau. The proposed time allocations are detailed in Annex A.
3. The use of this overseas telephone system is to be restricted to calls to Australia and New Zealand on a reverse charge basis. Calls will be booked direct with the Hong Kong or Sydney operator by the person making the call. There will be no AFV monitor on the system; all times and charges will be regulated by the Hong Kong or Sydney operator.
4. Approximate charges will be:
 - a. To anywhere in Australia \$US12 for 3 minutes.
 - b. To anywhere in New Zealand \$US13 for 3 minutes.
5. Planning date for the introduction of the service is 5 Oct 70. However, this is dependent upon the laying of cable from USO to HQ AFV.
6. Telephones will be allocated within 1 ALSG as follows:
 - a. YMCA One handset.
 - b. 1 Aust Fd Hosp. One handset. By the provision of separate outlets within the hospital, the handset can be used in either the intensive care ward, the surgical ward or the Red Cross Annex.
7. Instructions for the control of bookings are attached as Annex B.

23. EMU Switchboard. The new switchboard shelters are expected daily. The present board is barely able to cope with the situation, and major faults develop daily. The installation of the new board will have top priority for work within the squadron.

24. Transmitter Station Vung Tau. We have permission to enter Phase 2 of the programme which is the move of a transmitter from Nui Dat to Vung Tau however this cannot be done until the generator shed is rewired, and a second transmitter antenna is erected.

25. Voice Procedure Practice 10 Sep on 1 ALSG Defence Net

a. There were some glaring errors in procedure and breaches of security during the practice, but the standard of procedure and radio discipline is improving.

b. I must stress that operators who use a radio must know what they are doing, and use correct procedure. STAA Pam 7 is easy to read and understand.

c. All 1 ALSG nets are subject to sample monitoring by 110 Sig Sqn, and breaches of security will be notified to HQ 1 ALSG in future.

26. Radio Comms to HMAS JEPARIT

a. There is no requirement for 110 Sig Sqn to contact HMAS JEPARIT prior to 48 hours before the vessel berths.

b. The SOI's state that JEPARIT will establish comms with 110 Sig Sqn when 48 hours out. This is mainly for the passing of Army traffic. Berthing arrangements are to be passed by Naval Comms.

c. Despite the above, 110 Sig Sqn will be listening out at any time providing JEPARIT advises schedule timings. Previously this has always been done by telegram. On the last voyage the telegram was sent by the ship, but not received at 110 Sig Sqn.

d. CSO AFV has been asked to arrange for JEPARIT to advise Army Movements Sydney of schedules required when she departs Sydney. Movements will then signal 110 Sig Sqn.

27. Refrigeration.

a. There was another power phase failure to 25 Sup Pl refrigeration on 10 Sep 70. All frozen commodities in American refrigerator No. 2 had to be moved into Australian refrigerators still running on emergency power. Some thawing of frozen meats, particularly corned beef and sliced pork occurred and these may have to be condemned. The suspect meats have been issued to 1 ALSG units. Although the meat appears satisfactory, any unit which finds it has deteriorated may return it to 25 Sup Pl for a replacement issue.

b. As this is the second power phase failure which has occurred within seven days, recommendations have been made to reinstate the daily aircraft delivery of fresh vegetables to 1 ATF and to have all Australian refrigeration units placed on emergency power supply.

28. Fresh Fruit and Vegetables. Today's receipt of fresh fruit and vegetables from USADLB consisted of forced issue of Celery, Lettuce Cabbage and Lemons. These items are in poor condition and should be consumed as soon as possible. Some sorting may be necessary by kitchen staff before consumption. In the event of large quantities being unfit for consumption they are to be returned to 25 Sup Pl for timed equivalent replacement issue. USADLB had previously agreed not to issue forced items to Australians. The matter has been reported to DADST HQ AFV.

It appeared that the majority of the members on leave were under the influence of alcohol and committed numerous minor offences, such as shirts completely off or undone down to the waist, diverting civilian traffic, drinking in public, throwing coconuts around the streets and refusing to pay for drinks. Each case was handled by Military Police on the spot without incident. Reports were submitted in serious cases.
- c. On Wed 16 Sep 70 about 2210 hrs a member of 1 ATF made allegations that he had been attacked by a group of Vietnamese nationals near the Cathedral. No serious injuries were sustained and investigations could find no cause for the alleged incident or any other witness to it.
- d. The leave parties conduct since the night of 12/13 Sep has been good. At present C Coy 2 RAR is on leave.
- e. Our Detention Barrack holding today is 18 including 17 from 1 ATF and 1 from 1 ALSG units.
- f. I shall be absent at Da Nang on courier duties and at Long Binh with Comd 18 MP Bde on Tues, Wed and Thurs next week. Capt Collin will look after the unit in my absence.





SECTION 6

SHIPPING OF BER VEHICLES, STORES AND EQUIPMENT
TO PROPERTY DISPOSAL OFFICER LONG BINH

General

6.1 This instruction sets out the arrangements which now apply for the collection and removal to the Property Disposal Officer (PDO) Long Binh of BER vehicles, stores and equipment for realisation of their scrap value.

PDO Requirements

6.2 The major requirements are:

- a. All items should at least have a 90% metallic content.
- b. Must not include live ammunition.
- c. Exclude items which could explode or catch fire in transit.
- d. As far as possible, items of basically different metals be kept separate.

Collection Arrangements

6.3 The 1 ALSG PDO yard is closed and stores and equipment to be sent to Long Binh for disposal are to be held in unit areas until transport can be made available by the US transport agency MCC.

6.4 Units should advise the SCQ Ops whenever they have more than half a semi-trailer load. He will attempt to complete a load from other units and arrange for collection by the US vehicles. The cash realised for scrap metal is very low except for copper, zinc, and brass, thus small quantities should be treated as rubbish and disposed of on the Vung Tau Airbase tip.

6.5 BER vehicles are to be treated in the same way but bids to HQ 1 ALSG should indicate whether equipment other than a semi-trailer is required to move the vehicle.

Documentation

6.6 Documentation required by PDO and MCC will be the responsibility of HQ 1 ALSG.

SECTION 11

RETURN OF SUSPENDED / RESTRICTED AND
UNSERVICEABLE AMMUNITION

General

11.1 This section covers the conditions and procedure for returning suspended or restricted and unserviceable ammunition to the TFMA Ammunition Point (AP).

Documentation and Preparation of Ammunition

11.2 When a unit has a requirement to return ammunition to the TFMA AP, it will submit an AB 108 Packing Note to the Ammunition Technician (AT) Q Branch 1 ATF and an information copy to the SCQ Ops HQ 1 ALSG. The AB 108 is to show nature, quantity, type, lot/batch number and reason for return. In the case of Suspended Ammunition the suspension number is to be shown.

11.3 On receipt of the AB 108 the AT will arrange with the unit to inspect the ammunition in the unit area. Under no circumstances is suspended, restricted or unserviceable ammunition to be returned to TFMA AP until the AT has conducted his inspection.

11.4 Ammunition for return is to be prepared for inspection as follows :

- a. Suspended, restricted and excess holdings of unserviceable ammunition should be in their original packages with unbroken seals.
- b. Open packages or loose items are to be set out in empty 105mm or similar boxes.
 - (1) All Types of Hand or Rifle Grenades. Grenades are to have the safety pins splayed and the striker lever taped to the grenade body.
 - (2) High Explosive. Incendiary, CS Riot, Pyrotechnic Grenades (Smoke, HC, Illuminating, Trip Flare and Coloured Smoke) and WP Smoke Grenades, are to be packed into separate boxes.
 - (3) Grenade M79. Each type to be packed into a separate 105mm or similar box. Bandoliers and loose grenades of the same type may be packed together into one box.
 - (4) Blasting Caps and Claymore Detonators. These are to be packed in sand in a .50 Cal or similar metal box. All electric detonator leads are to be bared and shorted out by twisting the ends of the leads.

- (5) Claymore Mines. Should be kept complete in the satchel for inspection (including leads, firing and test devices) until sentenced by the AT.
- (6) Mortar Rounds. Fused projectiles are to be packed in their original cylinders. Separate fuses and projectiles are to be packed whenever possible , in their original packaging to afford maximum protection.
- (7) Small Arms Ammunition. Packed in its original inner and outer packaging if possible. Loose rounds (unserviceable only) are to be packed by calibre and type in 105mm or similar boxes. Link rounds must be separated from loose rounds. Serviceable, dirty or dusty rounds will not be automatically accepted for return. Such rounds should be cleaned and re-issued for use in training or operations.

Movement of Ammunition to TFMA AP.

11.5 At the time of inspection the AT will advise the unit on the transport requirements for movement to TFMA AP, in particular the number of vehicles required due to incompatibility of ammunition types, and safety requirements. The AT will also advise the SCQ Ops HQ 1 ALSG when the ammunition has been inspected.

11.6 Units will lodge their bids for transport with the SCQ Ops, by 1100 hrs on the day prior to the uplift. Under no circumstances will units request transport direct from 5 Coy RAASC.
