

316. AUSTRALIAN CURRENCY

1. Transmission of Australian Currency to MALAYA/SINGAPORE

- (a) It is a contravention of Australian Currency Regulations to forward Australian currency to SINGAPORE/MALAYA through the post.
- (b) Should any member desire to transfer credit from AUSTRALIA he should either:-
 - (i) Arrange the transfer through a bank; or
 - (ii) Arrange for the money to be paid to any Command Paymaster in AUSTRALIA. The Command Paymaster receiving the money will issue a receipt to the person paying it in and arrange for an equivalent amount to be credited in the soldier's paybook.
- (c) Either of these alternative procedures should take approximately fourteen days. Bank charges are not payable if money is forwarded through a Command Paymaster.

Crediting Money to Paybook

- (a) When a member pays money to a unit pay representative for crediting in his paybook he must insist upon an official receipt being given at the time the money is paid in.
- (b) Under no circumstances will a member accept other than an official receipt.

294. ANTI MALARIAL PRECAUTIONS

1. Paludrine will be taken daily by all ranks. The following is an extract from 1 RAR SO MALAYA Part III HEALTH "Paludrine will be taken daily under the platoon or patrol commander's personal supervision and then recorded in the Health Book. Leave and Stand down personnel will be issued with sufficient paludrine to last them until RTU. Soldiers returning to AUSTRALIA will be issued with sufficient paludrine to last them four weeks after arrival. The platoon/patrol commander will ensure that the tablets are ACTUALLY SWALLOWED."
2. Between 1900 hrs and reveille the following anti malarial precautions will be observed:-
 - (a) Shirts will be tucked into long trousers, socks and shoes or boots will be worn. Singlets and T shirts are NOT to be worn in place of shirts.
 - (b) When wearing uniform sleeves will be rolled down.

/(c) Badminton may be

- (c) Badminton may be played at night provided that, when not actually playing, soldiers wear long trousers and shirts over their shorts and singlets.
 - (d) All ranks will shower before 1900 hrs. However if duty or night sport necessitate late showering all ranks will wear clothes or dressing gowns to and from the showers.
 - (e) Mosquito nets will be placed down and tucked in by 1900 hrs daily. All ranks will sleep under mosquito nets unless the operational situation prevents the use of nets.
 - (f) On operations and on night duty mosquito repellant will be rubbed on exposed skin.
- 3. Sub units will amend camp standing orders at once and forward copies of amendments to Bn HQ.
 - 4. This routine order in no way alters 1 RAR SO for Dress.

289. INCOME TAX, SPECIAL ALLOWANCE PAYABLE TO MEMBERS IN MALAYA

1. The Department of the Treasury has advised that Malaya allowance is assessable income within the meaning of the Income and Special Services Contribution Act 1938/1959 and as such must be disclosed on income tax returns.

2. Although Malaya allowance must be included in personal returns of income, the Treasury has advised that under extra-statutory powers a special remission of tax will be authorised for the amount of Malaya allowance.

3. For this purpose the Commissioner of Taxation requires that amounts received in the nature of Malaya allowance be shown on page 2 of Income Tax returns, immediately below Item 4 as Item 4 (a) - "Malaya Allowance - subject to special remission of tax". The amount so disclosed is to be carried into the column headed "Gross Income" and included in Total Income.

4. The amount received by way of Malaya allowance will appear in Column 3 of Members' Taxation Group Certificate.

5. To establish taxable income in these cases the Taxation Department will calculate, separately, tax payable with Malaya allowance included and excluded to determine the amount due for remission. With this in mind members so affected need not complete the Calculation of Tax by Taxpayer" on page 1 of income tax returns.

6. This order will be promulgated and explained to all Australian troops as soon as possible to enable them to submit their Personal Returns of Income in such a way that they will obtain the benefit of the special remission of tax on Malaya Allowance.


