COMMANDERS DIARIES INSTRUCTIONS

AIM

1. The aim of a Commanders Diary is to provide data on which to base future improvements in Army training, equipment, organization and administration, and to furnish historians with a record of the activities of units and formations in operational and non-operational periods in peace and in war.

GENERAL

- 2. Entries are to be made daily on AF C 2118 (Adapted) each entry being initialled by the officer detailed to keep it.
- 3. Commanders Diaries will conform with the rules for drafting orders given in "Staff Duties (Australia)" Chapter 2, Section 12.

RESPONSIBILITY

During Non-operational Periods

4. A Commanders Diary is to be compiled by commanders of all formations.

During Operational Periods (1)

- 5. A Commanders Diary is to be compiled in duplicate by:
 - a. Commanders of all formations.
 - b. Each branch of the staff at formation headquarters commanded by a brigadier or above.
 - c. Heads of services not below the rank of lieutenant colonel.
 - d. Personal staffs and officers holding special appointments.
 - e. Unit commanders.
 - f. Commanders of a detachment of a unit when so ordered.

COMPILATION

- 6. Both original and duplicate copies are to consist of:
 - a. Cover (AF C 2119) (Adapted).
 - b. Index as printed on cover.
 - c. Narrative (AF C 2118) (Adapted).
 - d. Annexes as shown in the Index.
- 7. All details of the unit or formation (if a detachment is concerned, the name of the parent unit), period covered and enclosure numbers of the annexes are to be shown on the cover. If there has been a change of command since the last report, the date of assumption by the new commanding officer is to be included.
- 8. The annexes are to be assembled in the groups shown on the cover. If there are no enclosures for an annex NIL will be entered on the cover. If additional annexes are convenient for a particular headquarters, the relevant papers should be grouped as annexes starting at B.
- 9. Documents concerned with future planning for operations form Annex "Z", "TOP SECRET Supplementary Diary" of the formation originating the document. It is to be prepared and disposed of as shown in Paragraph 16.

CONTENTS

- 10. The diary is to contain:
 - a. Changes in command, (giving place names as well as map references), establishment, equipment and organization.
 - b. Information received, decisions made and orders given.
 - c. Where applicable, a short summary of the day's fighting, including company movements.
 - d. Opinions and recommendations of the commander with regard to equipment, tactics, organization and morale.
 - e. Progress of defensive works.
 - f. Weapon state.
 - g. Weather and ground conditions, if of potential importance.
 - h. Major causes and number of casualties to officers, men and equipment.
 - i. A note of all prisoners and enemy equipment captured.
 - j. A statement showing how the unit was employed in the time not accounted for. The type of training, etc, should be specified.
- 11. In order to ensure accuracy and completeness and to save work as much information as possible is to be included in annexes consisting of copies of documents issued and received, routine returns, etc. All annexes are to be referred to in the column provided and the time of receipt or despatch is to be given.
- 12. The narrative is to supplement and connect the annexes, but need not give a precis of any of them.

DISPOSAL

- 13. Original Commander's Diary. This is to be forwarded monthly, unless otherwise ordered, by seventh day of the succeeding month direct to AHQ.
- 14. Duplicate Commander's Diary. This must be clearly marked as a duplicate. It is to be sent separately from the original to AHQ one month after the original has been despatched but not before the former has been acknowledged.
- 15. When overseas, both copies of diaries are to be sent through the Army Records organization in the overseas theatre but at different times.
- 16. TOP SECRET Supplementary Diaries.
 - a. The documents referred to in Paragraph 9 together with a list of them made out on AF C 2118 (Adapted) must be placed in separate cover (AF C 2119) (Adapted). All details must be filled in and the cover clearly marked in red: "ANNEX Z OFFICER ONLY". It may be convenient to group the papers by appendices.
 - b. Supplementary diaries must be forwarded under the normal rules for TOP SECRET correspondence, to AHQ. The inner envelope must be plainly marked:

1 AUST CA UNIT MONTHLY REPORT

70 - PHUOC TUY PROVINCE

AND VUNG TAU MUNICIPALITY

General

1. This report covers Civil Affairs activities throughout the Province for the month of Oct 70.

Projects

- A list of Projects under construction and completed is at Annex A. A report on the Military Dependant Housing Project (Project 399) is at Annex B.
- 3. AP SUOI NGHE Water Reticulation. Efforts to find a suitable source for water within the village failed. The windmill has been dismantled and returned to Store. It appears that a solution to the problem of water reticulation is only possible if an internal combustion pump is used to pump water from a source outside the Hamlet. Such a solution will of course involve the Hamlet in maintenance and operating charges. An approach is being made to the Hamlet through District Officials to ascertain if this solution is acceptable to the villagers.
- 4. AP SUOI NGHE Irrigation System. The design for the system has been prepared by 198 Wks Section and has been discussed in principle only. It would appear that to proceed with the system now could be wasteful of our effort. There are doubts as to whether the farmers are sufficiently adept at production methods for irrigation farming or are at present sufficiently motivated to utilise fully an irrigation system. In view of this doubt, it is intended during the next dry seasons to:
 - a. Encourage some farmers with land along the water course to undertake farming using simple irrigation systems. Our assistance will be limited to provision of pumps on loan initially to selected farmers.
 - b. Gathering further data on the water availability throughout the dry season to assist with final design.
- 5. The Pilot Irrigation System at present envisaged will not be constructed until early 1972 dependent of course on the results of this years' activities.
- 6. Minor Roads DAT DO. 1 Fd Sqn Minor Roads Team completed work at DAT DO late in Oct 70 and is now preparing a works programme for work in the Hoa Long Village.

- 7. Future Projects. Possible projects as listed below are at present ng examined for validity and feasibility:
 - a. DAT DO High School. This joint project (GVN contribution \$VN 1,250,000) has advanced to the satge where validity has been checked and final building plans are being mutually examined. The Project should be submitted for approval early Dec 70.
 - b. Surfacing LONG DIEN Market surrounds. This was part of the task originally agreed for the joint effort to upgrade facilities in this market area. However, cost in providing cement for the surface proved excessive. Investigations with RIK have succested that Hot Mix could be made available for surfacing and investigations are now proceeding with the District Officials and Village Officials to ascertain their reactions to the proposal.
 - c. Extensions to DAT DO Water Supply. A proposal for a co-operative effort to expand DAT DO Water Supply is under investigation. The outline envisages 1 Aust CA Unit assisting with the provision of the reticulation into one hamlet PHUOC HOA LONG.
 - d. Provision of Water Reticulation to LONG HUONG. This will be another joint project in co-operation with the Public Works Department. Extension of the existing BARIA water reticulation across the SONG DINH into the village is planned. Validity and feasibility checks are being carried out now.
 - e. LE LOI Hospital -Provision of a Maternity Ward. Validity checks and plans for the building have been completed. Tenders are being called to establish costs to allow the Project Application to be completed. It is hoped that the proposal will be forwarded to HQ AFV either late Nov or early Dec 70.
 - f. DUC THAMH Youth and Sports Centre. Validity checks have been completed. Design and costing is now being processed for preparation of Project Application.
 - g. BINH GIA Market. This is a joint project with the villagers providing \$VN 600,000. Design has been completed and investigations are now proceeding in the field of costs to permit the submission of an application for project approval.
 - h. Provision of a Water Reticulation System at LONG CAT is being investigated. The system will involve the use of one of the two windmills remaining in stock. It is proposed to incorporate a pilot irrigation system. The village is small (100 families) and attention is being paid to the reticulation of water to selected areas to allow for the watering of vegeta le crops during the dry. It is intended that the windmill be erected by the villagers.
 - i. The provision of a windmill to the RD National Training Centre at VUNG TAU is being investigated. This mill will again be installed by the centre and if the proposal for LONG CAT eventuate will exhaust present stocks of windmills.

Health

- 8. A detailed report by RMO 1 Aust CA Unit is at Annex C.
- 9. The Province Chief of Medicine continues to take an active interest in the conduct of Medcaps and during the past month has been present at 9 Medcaps.

- Construction at BARIA Hospital continues. The Sewage Pump has been 10. received from Australia and 17 Const Sqn are now able to complete this portion of the project. Provision of a crane on loan from MIK to install the tanks on he tank stands delays 17 Const Son in the completion of the water reticulation portion of the project.
- The BARIA Hospital is to be upgraded in the new year to a Teaching Hospital (One of five in SOUTH VIETNAM),

Education

- 12. A report on Education Activities during the month of Oct 70 is at Annex D.
- Efforts are being made to increase participation by the Province Teachers in the Colloquial English lessons taught at present. There will be some problems; the main one being toucher availability. It is hoped to progressively decrease the Australian participation in this education by increasing Vietnamese input and using the Australian instructor only as a voice model. As an aid to this programme, the possibility of conducting seminars with teachers is being investigated within the Province.

Agriculture

- 14. The Chicken Project is proceeding slowly with the major problem in this area still the shortage and expense of good quality chickens.
- 15. The Pig Project is progressing. Five sties have been constructed and stores are held for a further five sties. It is hoped to arrange with the Province Animal Husbandry Service for the issue of these stores to the few selected farmers. The first swine will be provided to farmers in Nov 70.
- 16. A visit to KUYEN MOC District with the Province Agriculture Chief was made during the month. It appears that scope does exist in this area for crop extensions and farmer education. It is intended to follow up this visit and pay regular visits to XUYEN MOC area with representatives of the Agriculture Service, At XUYEN MOC, the old problems of the alleged effects of Aerial Spray on crops was raised. Samples of alleged damage were taken for analysis to SAIGON.
- The Crop Husbandry work carried out is beginning to gather enthusiasm amongst farmers in limited areas. Cash returns for crops (young sweet corn and string bean) have exceeded the farmers expectations. Unfortunately the unit did become involved in the marketing of the young sweet corn in SAIGON. It is hoped as a result of the farmers enthusiasm in the area of BINH BA to encourage them to develop a small co-operative (10 farmers) for marketing purposes in future,
- 18. Project HEGARI referred to in previous reports is limited by lack of suitable sites. Three sites only have been planted and a further two sites were selected during the visit to XUYEN MOC. Whilst there may be further individual sites selected, it is thought that Project HEGARI will fall well short of its target of 35 Pilot Plots this year,
- 19. Care is being taken to ensure that the Province Agricultural Service is not overshadowed by our efforts. This is a difficult aspect and will always be with us.

- 21. The Youth and Sports Service held a Sports Carnival on 30/31 Oct 70. The carnival was successful despite inclement weather. It was interesting to note that XUYEN MOC had representatives competing in the carnival for the first time on record.
- 22. Youth and Sports Activities appear to be receiving more emphasis within the Province at Present. A Province meeting will be held 4 Nov 70 with all districts represented and will elect a Province Youth and Sports Chairman. It would appear that Province authorities are considering the establishment of Village Youth and Sports Centres.

MILITARY DEPENDANT HOUSING

General

- 1. At 31 October 70, this project was 10.4 percent complete.
- 2. To obtain an increase in the rate of construction and the level of participation by Vietnamese priority of effort is being given to preparing additional sites so that each District may become involved as soon as possible. At present construction has been commenced on four sites, with the fifth site being prepared as rapidly as the poor weather permits.

Sites

- 3. The site situation as at 1 Nov 70 was:
 - a. Sector HQ 50 houses Area YS382613 30 houses Area YS378614
 - b. Long Dien District 10 houses Area YS427596
 70 houses Area YS465598
 30 houses Area Site to be confirmed
 - c. Dat Do District. The area originally approved for 110 houses was found to be partly private land. Only 60 houses can now be constructed at this site at YS464779. The site for the remaining 50 houses for this District is not yet decided.
 - d. Duc Thanh District 20 houses Area YS464773 60 houses Area YS464779
 - e. Long Le District. Several sites suggested by District HQ for houses in this District have been rejected by Province. Current proposals not yet confirmed are:
 - 40 houses Area YS258682
 40 houses Area YS381617 with a possibility of increasing to 80 houses subject to survey for space and fill required. As construction has not yet started in this District, priority is being given to confirmation of one of these sites.

Works Progress

- 4. A works programme for completion of this project has been prepared for consideration during the next week. Limiting factors which must be agreed are:
 - a. Number of Vietnamese Soldiers involved. The prepared programme requires a maximum of 206 men in Jan, Feb 1971.
 - b. Availability of stores from Australia. The December voyage of Jeparit may be a critical limitation if the space limits delivery of stores previously requested for delivery on.
- As at 1 Nov the progress on house construction is:
 - a. Sector HQ's (Two Sites)

- Slabs complete for 67 houses
- Brickwork complete for 30 houses, with a further 10 almost complete and work commenced on another 10.
- Roofing and doors and windows complete for 20 houses.
- b. Long Dien.

 - Slabs complete for 32 houses. Brickwork commenced on 10 houses.
- Dat Do C.
 - Slabs complete for 10 houses
 - Preparation of slabs for next 10 houses in progress

Brickwork to commence shortly.

Duc Thanh. Site preparation for 20 houses has begun but is being shortly delayed by wet weather.

Stores Situation

- Completion of the initial houses for Sector HQ's has been delayed because of non-availability of stores. When it is known exactly what stores arrived on Jeparit 33 or HMAS Sydney, a review of the additional items needed to complete construction of the first 50 houses will be made. Local purchase or delivery by air of small items will then be considered so that handover of houses can be made as soon as possible.
- Cement. To date over 8000 bags of cement have been borrowed to allow work to continue. Immediate problems have been overcome by delivery of 236 tons of Colourcrete from Australia and local purchase of 7200 bags from US sources. However, early delivery of cement from Singapore is still required to repay loans and permit further construction.
- Indents for the next delivery of stores will be prepared when the 8. overall works programme is approved.

MEDICAL CIVIC ACTION REPORT-OCT 70

- Medical Civic Action projects continued to be conducted during October. Medcap teams of 2 RAR, 7 RAR and 1 SAS Sqn have been withdrawn from participation in the programme in order to comply with the wishes of the Province Medical Chief to decrease medical activities in certain areas of the province.
- 2. A joint programme was prepared with the Province Medical Chief. The Province Medical Chief participated in nine (9) medcaps.
- 3. The Province Medical Chief has instructed the Rural Health Chief to initiate a mobile health team which is to be supported by 1 Aust CA Unit if necessary.
- 4. The Province Medical Chief has requested that Medcap activities be discontinued in certain areas in order to encourage local population to utilize the central health facilities at Baria.
- 5. 1 Aust CA Unit arranged a briefing regarding the Province Health Service to the medics of AATTV teams in Phuoc Tuy. The briefing, followed by a tour of Baria Hospital was given by the Province Medical Chief.
- OENTCAPS at Baria Hospital and Dat Do MID. The Province Medical Chief has requested them to discontinue Medcaps at Dat Do MID.
- 7. MO 1 Aust CA Unit continues to conduct a weekly outpatients clinic at Baria Hospital.
- 8. MO 1 Aust CA Unit has begun orientation at the Baria Hospital Obstetrics ward in preparation for refresher lectures which will be given to the midwives of the District MID's.

EDUCATION REPORT

Primary Education

- 1. Three classrooms and an office built by 1 Aust CA at Phuoc Hoa Long Dat Do are now under the control of the Education Service.
 - b. Work has begun on three new Elementary classrooms at Thanh Tan hamlet Dat Do. These should be completed during November.
 - c. School supplies (pencils, exercise books, rulers etc) arrived from Australia and were delivered to Elementary schools throughout the Province.
 - d. Playground equipment was delivered to Phuoc Trinh school by 106 Fd Wksps.

Secondary Education

- a. Chau Van Tiep High School Baria has requested our assistance in the painting of 13 classrooms and the building of a new bicycle shed. The school will supply 40,000\$VN towards costs and all labour, while our contribution will be paint and advice on construction. It is hoped that this project will be undertaken during November.
 - b. Huynh Tinh Cua semi public High School is at present renovating two USAID store houses at Long Dien which will be used as classrooms. The school has requested our assistance in providing fill for the site.
 - c. Library books were again delivered to Chau Van Tiep High School on behalf of the USAID mission. In addition, school supplies from Australia were delivered to this school & to Dat Do High School.
 - d. The English teaching program as outlined in the Education Report for September continues. English instruction was taught to 950 students in 88 lessons.

Adult Education

3. The Teacher Training College in Baria is now fully operational. This unit has provided the college with furniture and a number of aids. It is hoped that we will later be able to assist in the teaching of the trainees.

VUNG TAU MUNICIPALITY MONTH OF OCT 70

Construction

- 1. <u>V206-(V180) Construction of Basketball Court and Drains Vung Tau</u>. This project is now complete and preparations are in hand for a ceremony to officially present the court to the RVN Dept of Youth and Sport.
- 2. Financial approval has been granted for the following projects:
 - a. V168 Construction of a Natural Sciences and Physics Block at Back Beach High School Vung Tau. Foundation blast rock has been placed and levelled. RD stores for the construction have been drawn and a contract let. Progress at this date is satisfactory.
 - b. <u>V209</u> Renovation of the Australian Built Dept of Health and Sanitation Dispensary at Thang Tam Vung Tau. Local procurement of timber suitable to the roofing structure is causing a problem. This may be resolved by purchasing in Phuoc Tuy Province in liew of Vung Tau.

 - a. V207 Construction of a aternity Ward at Le Loi Hospital, Vung Tau. The plan is now firm and financial approval has been applied for. RD stores are issuable and authorities to draw these are in hand.
 - b. V208 Construction of Roads, Drains and Paths in the Dept of Veterans' Affairs Village Vung Tau. Plans are in hand for stage 1 and RD stores have been approved for issue. The detail of further stages is being assessed by 1 Aust CA Unit. It should be noted that in several instances translations of Vietnamese documents has produced the word "sewerage" when "drains" were originally intended. The drainage concerned is storm-water drainage only. There is no requirement nor any request by the sponsoring Provincial Authority for the inclusion of sewerage in this project.

- 7. English instruction at the Vietnamese Allies Cultural Association of Vung Tau and the Chinese High continues.
- 8. Preliminary enquiries have been made by the Deputy Minister for Education RVN regarding the possibility of some English instructors being made available at High Schools in Vung Tau.
