INSTRUCTIONS

AIM

1. The aim of a Commanders Diary is to provide data on which to base future improvements in Army training, equipment, organisation and administration, and to furnish historians with a record of the activities of units and formations in operational and non-operational periods in peace and in war.

GENERAL

2. *Entries will be made daily* on AF C2118, each entry being initialled by the officer detailed to keep it.
3. Commanders Diaries will conform with the rules for drafting orders given in "Staff Duties in the Field", Chapter 5, Section 1.

RESPONSIBILITY

During Non-operational Periods

4. A Commanders Diary will be made by commanders of all formations.

During Operational Periods (see note 1)

5. A Commanders Diary will be made in duplicate by:—
- (a) Commanders of all formations.
 - (b) Each branch of the staff at formation headquarters commanded by a Brigadier or above.
 - (c) Heads of services not below the rank of Lieutenant Colonel.
 - (d) Personal staffs and officers holding special appointments.
 - (e) Unit commanders.
 - (f) Commanders of a detachment of a unit when so ordered.

COMPILATION

6. Both original and duplicate copies will consist of:—
- (a) Cover (AF C2119).
 - (b) Index as printed on cover.
 - (c) Narrative (AF C2118).
 - (d) Annexes as shown in the Index.
7. All details of the unit or formation (if a detachment is concerned, the name of the parent unit), period covered and enclosure numbers of the annexes will be shown on the cover. If there has been a change of command since the last report, the date of assumption by the new commanding officer will be included.
8. The annexes will be assembled in the groups shown on the cover. If there are no enclosures for an Annex NIL will be entered on the cover. If additional annexes are convenient for a particular headquarters, the relevant papers should be grouped as annexes starting at B.

12. The narrative will supplement and connect the annexes but need not give a précis of them.

DISPOSAL

During Non-Operational Periods

13. *Formation Headquarters* will forward the original Commanders Diary annually as at 31st December to reach the War Office Records Centre (through Headquarters Field Records where applicable) as soon as possible after 1st January of the following year. The duplicate will be retained in formation headquarters.

14. *Units* will NOT render a Commanders Diary.

During Operational Periods

15. ORIGINAL COMMANDERS DIARIES

- (a) *Formations and units in the UK* will forward diaries monthly by the seventh day of the succeeding month direct to the War Office (WORC for reports other than medical, AMD 1 for medical reports).
- (b) *Formations and units overseas* will forward diaries monthly by the seventh day of the succeeding month to the OIC Field Records for onward transmission to the War Office.

16. **DUPLICATE COMMANDERS DIARIES.** These will be clearly marked as duplicates and will NOT be sent with the originals. They will be forwarded within two months as follows:—

- (a) *Units in the UK*
To the OIC parent record office.
- (b) *Formation Headquarters in the UK*
To OIC Central Clearing Wing, Infantry Records, Exeter.
- (c) *Units Overseas*
To the OIC Field Records for onward transmission to parent record office.
- (d) *Formation Headquarters Overseas*
To the OIC Field Records for onward transmission to the OIC Central Clearing Wing, Infantry Records, Exeter.

SECURITY

19. The duplicate supplementary diaries will be despatched as in paragraph 16 as soon as receipt of the originals has been acknowledged.

NOTES

1. *Definition of Operational Period.*—The term “operational period” for the purpose of this instruction, means:—
- (a) the period between a declaration of war and the official end of hostilities;
- (b) any period spent in a theatre of operations;
- (c) any period when engaged in any form of military operation.
2. The War Office or headquarters concerned will be responsible for instructing units to submit Commanders Diaries where the conditions of the unit's employment make this necessary. Wherever possible the beginning and end of the period will be clearly stated. Notwithstanding the above, on the outbreak of global war all units and formations which are not at the time submitting these reports will start compiling them with effect from M day and will thereafter render them in accordance with paragraphs 15 and 16.

This form will be enclosed with the annexes in AF C 2119. If this is not available the cover will be prepared in manuscript.

EXERCISE MAYBUG

GENERAL IDEA

1. MALAYA for the purpose of this exercise represents SOUTHLAND, a country which differs greatly from MALAYA in Government and national characteristics.
2. To the NORTH of SOUTHLAND lies VANDALIA, represented by THAILAND. During the past few years, VANDALIA, a Communist satellite, has been helping to organise and train the SOUTHLAND People's Liberation Army (SPLA) which had been defeated in the Communist attempt to seize power in 1960. In 1962 and 1963 it became apparent that Communist infiltration and subversion were increasing rapidly and that well organised and trained SPLA groups were working in the rural areas and gaining a large measure of support from the population.
3. In late Dec 63, SOUTHLAND requested SEATO military assistance in countering the large scale internal threat from Communist insurgents. 28 COMWEL Inf Bde Gp was nominated as the UK/AUST/NZ contribution and was designated Task Force LIMA. TF LIMA moved from its base in MALAYA and was airlanded at the medium range transport airfield at TEMERLOH in SOUTHLAND. (For the purpose of this exercise TEMERLOH is regarded as a Medium Range Transport airfield)
4. TF LIMA launched a vigorous CA and psy war programme and, in conjunction with the ROYAL SOUTHLAND ARMY (RSA), carried out several successful offensive operations. By 1 Apr 64 the base area at TEMERLOH - MENTAKAB was secure and, with the goodwill of the local population, a controlled area had been established surrounding the base to a depth of some 10-15 miles.
5. The complete effectiveness of the programme was marred by the presence of a SPLA regular battalion whose base was located somewhere in the KRAU Game Reserve, 12 miles WEST of KUALA KRAU. The Provincial War Committee decided that this SPLA battalion must be eliminated before any further effort is made to link up and extend controlled areas. TF LIMA has been given this task.

EXERCISE MAYBUG
BACKGROUND OF EVENTS - JAN-MAY 64

POLITICAL

History

1. SOUTHLAND has been subjected to intense Communist infiltration and intrigue during the years 1961 - 63. This matter has been the subject of prolonged discussion in the SEATO Council of Ministers. The authority of the Constitutional Government of SOUTHLAND had deteriorated to such an extent by the end of 1963 that the governments of the member nations of SEATO agreed to a request for military assistance. In Jan 64 a SEATO Field Force (SFF) arrived in SOUTHLAND.

Government and Civil Administration

2. SOUTHLAND is a constitutional monarchy. The Central Government comprises a Lower and Upper house of Parliament.
3. More detailed information is contained in ANNEX C - "Extracts from Country Study - SOUTHLAND".

CIVIL AFFAIRS

General

4. On arrival of SFF in Jan 64, the CA situation was chaotic. Epidemics raged through lack of medical supplies; guerilla activity had produced a grave refugee problem and food shortage. Provincial governments were incapable of coping with this situation.
5. After three months effort by SFF and agencies, the situation in urban areas has been brought almost completely under control. In the rural areas however, the SPLA are in complete control.

Provincial/District War Executive Committees

6. Much of the success in restoring the situation in urban areas has been due to the work of the Provincial War Executive Committees (PWEC) and District War Executive Committees (DWEC) established by CG SFF in Jan 64.
7. The composition and personalities of the relevant PWEC and DWECs are detailed in ANNEX C.

Internal Security

8. During the last three months, the operations of the SFF Task Forces have been two-fold :-
- a. To secure selected centres of population, or controlled areas, against SPLA incursion.
 - b. To re-establish law and order in these areas.

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9. Despite the improvement in the situation in these controlled areas, it is still necessary to guard vulnerable points, installations and VIPs.

MILITARY OPERATIONS

Capability

10. RSA. The military capability and effectiveness of units of the SAF is very limited. Details in ANNEX C.

11. SPLA. Although the activities of the SPLA, in the past, have been restricted to guerilla operations, the receipt of material, assistance by technical advisers, and the more recent arrival of "volunteers", all from VANDALIA, indicates greater capability in the future. Details in ANNEX C.

12. Some of these "volunteers" from the VANDALIAN Air Force have moved into an area in the NORTH of SOUTHLAND which contains an airfield controlled by the SPLA. These "volunteers" have a limited number of jet aircraft and are capable of carrying out sneak raids on SFF forces.

Resume of Operations

13. Task Force INDIA Air landed at BUTTERWORTH. Its area of responsibility extends over the province of PERAK, PENANG and KEDAH. They have secured the major urban areas.

14. Task Force JULIET. Landed at KOTA BAHRU. Its area of responsibility extends over the provinces of KELANTAN and TRENGANNU. They have secured the major urban areas.

15. Task Force KILLO. Air landed at KLUANG. Its area of responsibility extends over the province of JOHORE. They have secured the major urban areas.

16. RSA

a. On arrival of SFF, the Government of SOUTHLAND agreed that its military forces, although under command of CG SFF, should carry out operations as directed by PWECs and DWECs.

b. Apart from the units operating under the direction of PWECs and DWECs in the SFF Task Force areas, RSA was given responsibility for the provinces of SELANGOR, NEGRI SEMBILAN and MALACCA.

17. Task Force LIMA (28 COMWEL Inf Bde Gp)

a. The Task Force air landed at TEMERLOH 5133 with the tasks :

(1) To secure the TEMERLOH - MENTAKAB 4137 area including existing air and rail facilities.

(2) To assist in securing and denying to the SPLA the following additional important centres of population and communications:-

BENTONG
KARAK
KUANTAN

in order to release RSA for operations elsewhere.

- (3) participate in offensive operations against the SPLA by the provision of air support, psychological warfare etc.
- b. Initially TF LIMA secured the TEMERLOH - MENTAKAB area. With the gradual improvement in this controlled area, a battalion group was sent to the BENTONG area and another to the KARAK area. An RSA brigade was given the task of securing the KUANTAN area.
- c. The Task Force Airhead was established at the TEMERLOH MRT airfield with the Brigade Maintenance Area set up in the same area.
- d. SPLA attacks of battalion strength against the controlled areas were successfully repulsed. Although the SPLA suffered heavy casualties in these attacks and were forced to disperse into smaller groups, they still control the rural areas and are continuing intimidation operations.
- e. In early April intelligence sources indicated that an SPLA battalion, which had been withdrawn for retraining and re-indoctrination, was now being deployed in the KRAU game reserve in the general area GUNONG BENONG (1178) - Point 1426 (3780) - BT TAPAH (2354). The tasks allotted to this battalion were :-
- (1) To cut the road, rail and water communications from TEMERLOH - JURANTUT, and
 - (2) To cut road communications BENTONG - TEMERLOH - KUANTAN.
- f. On 22 May, the Protector of Aborigines, PAHANG, informed FWEC that his field officers had reported three SPLA concentrations, of approximately company group size, near KG MENTOH (2877), KG K.PIAN (2873) and KG BALET NYOR (2872). These groups were menacing the villagers and obtaining food and medical supplies from village stocks.
- g. On 23 May the PAHANG FWEC agreed to the re-deployment of SFF and RSA in the area as follows:-
- (i) The move of TF LIMA battalion groups from BENTONG and KARAK controlled areas to TEMERLOH.
 - (2) Two RSA battalions to BENTONG and KARAK controlled areas.
- h. The strain on both MRT and SRT support after four months operations had been considerable and it became apparent that if the area KRAU Game Reserve was to become a focal point for a large scale operation it would be desirable to have an SRT airfield near KUALA KRAU (4464). For reasons of security, work on this project could not commence more than a day before the main operation.
- i. On D-6 it was reported that the road and rail had been cut by demolitions in several places between TEKAL Estate (4657) and KUALA KRAU. Movement by road and rail over this section was impossible. The Senior Public Works Officer advised the FWEC that the damage would be repaired by impressed labour but that he estimated that work would not be complete until D+1.
- j. On D-3 Comd TF LIMA held a conference with his unit Commanders to discuss his plans for operations against the SPLA battalion. In outline his plan was :-
- (1) 1 KOYLI. Based area WEST of MENTAKAB as TF reserve.
 - (2) 3 RAR

 - (b) Provide firm base for advance by 1 RNZIR.
 - (c) Follow up advance and be prepared to assault enemy base when located.

 - (b) Advance from TEKAL Estate - junction S.LOMPAT and S.KRAU (3565) KG BALET NYOR (2972) and locate enemy.
 - (c) Detach company to under command TF LIMA from 0800 hrs D-2.
- (4) Coy 1 RNZIR
- (a) Secure proposed SRT Airfield in map square 4463 by 0800 hrs D-1.
 - (b) Secure 176 Bty RA landing point at KUALA KRAU by 1200 hrs D-1.
- (5) 45 Regt RA
- (a) 176 Bty RA. In direct support 1 RNZIR. Move by water craft on D-1 from KG TEKAL (4954) to KUALA KRAU. In action by 1800 hrs D-1.
 - (b) 102 Field Bty RAA. In direct support 1 KOYLI.
- (6) T Bty 12 Regt RA. Defence of Airhead and BMA.
- (7) 69 Gurkha Indep Field Sqn RE
- (a) Elements of one troop air land (SRT) at map Square 4463 D-1. Prepare SRT Airfield.
 - (b) One troop in support 1 KOYLI.
 - (c) One troop in support 1 RNZIR
 - (d) Sqn less two and one half troops loc BMA

ECONOMIC

20. The rebuilding of the economy of SOUTHLAND is a vital integral part of the rehabilitation programme, and recent directives of HQ SFF have stressed the need for:-
- a. Avoidance of any damage to rubber estates, cultivations and live-stock.
 - b. The minimum disturbance to and restriction of the local population.

SOUTHLAND COUNTRY STUDY
BACKGROUND POLITICAL AND MILITARY SIT
(Based on information up to 1 Apr 64)

PART I

POLITICAL

1. SOUTHLAND is governed by a Central Government which is modelled on Westminster lines, franchise is open to all SOUTHLAND nationals over the age of 21 years. The electorate is largely illiterate and with the exception of the urban areas is mostly indifferent to elections.

2. The present government is led by Mr KUM KUM who has just entered his second year of office. His party, the PEOPLES UNITED PARTY (PUP) enjoys only a marginal majority in Parliament.

3. The opposition consists of the following parties:-

- a. SOUTHLAND LIBERAL PARTY (SLP) - leader Mr HAW LIM.
- b. SOUTHLAND INDIAN CONGRESS PARTY (SICP) - leader Mr NARYANAN
- c. SOUTHLAND DEMOCRATIC PARTY (SDP) - leader Mr KUM SOH FAR.

The SOUTHLAND COMMUNIST PARTY (SCP) was proscribed in 1960 due to its subversive activities, but is believed to continue to operate under cover of the SDP.

4. SOUTHLAND maintains a neutr list policy and is not a member of any treaty organisation.

5. Provincial Government. SOUTHLAND is sub-divided into eight Provinces. Each Province is ruled by a Provincial Government under a Governor appointed by the Central Government. Provincial Governments administer the Provinces through District Officers who in turn control their Districts through village Headmen who are appointed by village elders.

ECONOMIC SITUATION

6. SOUTHLAND in the past has derived most of its revenue from the export of rubber and rice. The major rice-producing areas are in the Provinces of KEDAH and KELANTAN and are now in the hands of the SPLA.

7. Due to guerilla activity rubber estates are short of labour and production over the last year is over 52,000 tons down on the average. The economy of the country is now dependent on outside loans.

PART II
MILITARY

8. SOUTHLAND has no navy. There are a few coastal ptl vessels and fishing protection craft which are the responsibility of the maritime Police.

9. There is a small Air Wing which is administered by the Army. It comprises two air tpt sqns made up of some 40 ac of mixed types, mostly DC 3s of questionable serviceability. There is one GA flt of six METEORS. There are few regular pilots, most aircrew have been conscripted from civil airlines and have very little op experience.

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10. The total strength of RSA is approx 24,000 of which 7,000 are territorial.

a. The regular army consists of:-

- (1) Two inf div HQs
- (2) Five inf regt HQs
- (3) Sixteen inf bns
- (4) Two para bns
- (5) One truck Bn
- (6) Two arty bns.
- (7) One cav sqn
- (8) Svcs

b. The TA consists of:-

- (1) One TA inf div HQ
- (2) Four TA inf regt HQs
- (3) Eleven TA inf bns.

The RSA Order of Battle is given at Appendix 1 to Annex C.

11. SOUTHLAND is divided into 5 Regional Commands. Previously each comd with the exception of HQ Comd had a Div HQ, the comd of which acted as both Div Comd and Regional Comd.

READINESS FOR WAR

12. The standard of trg and morale is low due to the following factors:-

- a. Fmn trg is very rarely carried out.
- b. Senior offrs tend to become chairborne and despise the junior officers who have had the opportunity of attending courses abroad.
- c. Shortage of recruits for tech svcs.
- d. Defections to SPLA.

PART III
SPLA

13. The SPLA has been in constant evolution since the days of its inception. During 1962 this took the form of rapidly transforming a number of independent guerilla bands into a compact organised force.

14. SPLA is now composed of two inf divs which form the main striking force, in addition there are an unknown number of guerilla bands of varying sizes. The regular elm is believed to number about 15,000. Divs comprise two inf regts.

15. The SPLA is still predominantly an inf force, although arty bns are known to exist.

16. Eqpt is varied, either captured RSA eqpt which forms the major part or supplied by the VANDALS.

17. Infantry. The inf regt is the main fighting fmn and its org is detailed at Appendix 2 to Annex C. Inf regts are grouped into divs but div HQs exercise only nominal control due to wide dispersion of units and shortage of of comms eqpt.

18. Armour. There are no armoured units in SPLA, cadres however are known to have received trg in tank warfare from the VANDALS.

19. Arty. Each of the two inf divs has an arty bn. Arty bns now consist of a 25 pr/76 mm how coy, an 82 mm mor coy and a 75 mm recoilless rifle coy.

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20. Engns. There is an engr bn in each div, they are poorly equipped and rely on local materials and coolie labour to a large extent.
21. Signals. Sups of sigs eqpt are particularly short, wrls are provided down to bn level, but coys rarely have wrls and rely mainly on runners.
22. Transport. SPLA rely mainly on captured RSA or civilian vehs, coolies and animals are also extensively employed.
23. Political Directorate. The political directorate is represented at all levels, responsibility for cmd is shared between the military cmd and the political commissar who are of equal status.

The political commissars are particularly responsible for instilling the party line in all ranks, subsidiary tasks are security, propaganda and political education.

In all major units there are pers who are specialists in all kinds of subversive activity.

24. Guerilla Bands. Guerillas op in bands of varying size, each band usually has a cadre of reg SPLA, the remainder are local peasants. They are in the main responsible for subversion and sabotage, but a band once its numbers have increased sufficiently and it has captured or has been supplied with sufficient wpns becomes integrated into a reg unit. Guerillas form the main int screen for regular units.

PART IV
CURRENT OPERATIONS

25. By the end of Mar the SPLA have largely gained control of the rice producing provinces of the North and attacks by both guerilla bands and reg SPLA units are widespread throughout the rural areas of SOUTHLAND.
26. Attacks have been aimed at disruption of rd and rail comms, terrorisation of civ population and harassing of RSA forces, coupled with acts of sabotage and subversion in rear areas.
27. It is believed that the SPLA intend to gain con of SOUTHLAND as far SOUTH as the 30 parallel. The SPLA reg units are op from def base camps on the jungle edges. Attacks are usually made at ni. Raids are frequently deep into RSA territory.

WATER TREATMENT
WATER STERILIZING POWDER (WSP)

GENERAL

1. Water Sterilising Tablets for individual water sterilization will NOT be available for this exercise. As this area is a well known source of LEPTOSPIROSIS, the method of water sterilisation with W.S.P. will be emphasised to all ranks prior to the exercise.

METHOD OF STERILIZATION WITH WSP

2. WATER BOTTLES

a. Requirements. One water bottle marked "Sterilizing Solution" per section.

One 4 oz tin WSP with scoop.

b. Method: (1) AFTER FILTRATION OF WATER THROUGH MILLBANK BAG - add TWO scoops WSP to bottle, quarter fill bottle with water, shake to mix, then fill bottle with water.

(2) Add ONE SCOOPFUL of this mixture to each man's water bottle filled with water.

(3) ALLOW 30 MINUTES contact period before drinking.

3. JERRICANS OR LARGE CONTAINERS

a. Requirements. As above with water bottles.

b. Method (1) Add EIGHT SCOOPS WSP to water bottle, quarter fill bottle with water, shake to mix then fill bottle.

(2) Add one scoopful of this mixture for every gallon of water ie $4\frac{1}{2}$ scoops per Jerrican.

(3) Allow 30 minutes contact period before drinking.

4. WSP

a. Do not wet powder

b. Lid should be kept tightly fixed on when not in use.

c. A tin should not be used longer than one week.

d. WSP will be supplied in 4 oz tins with a scoop inside.

TERENDAK GARRISON WATER SUPPLY

1. The water supply situation in TERENDAK Garrison is now critical. One million gallons of water are consumed each day, which is 29,000 gallons more than can be pumped into the supply system, and works out at a consumption rate of 100 gallons per person per day.
2. Lt R S FREEBAIRN is appointed Unit Water Conservation Officer. His duties are:-
 - a. To inspect CANBERRA Lines at irregular intervals, not less frequently than 4 times a month, to ensure that the restrictions listed in para 3 below, are being carried out, and that no wastage of water is occurring.
 - b. To maintain a record of inspections. This record will also detail action taken to lessen the consumption of water.
 - c. To report any water wastage to the Adjt if he is unable to rectify the situation himself.
3. The following water restrictions are to be effected:-
 - a. Gardens will not be watered by hose.
 - b. Vehicles will not be washed by hose.
 - c. Cook Houses, Ablution areas and Monsoon drains may only be washed by hose if the hose is held.
 - d. Clothing will not be washed under running taps.
 - e. Ablutions will be frequently checked to ensure that no taps are left running.
4. In addition to the above all members of the unit can assist in saving water by reporting leaking taps and other waste.

234. HOSPITAL VISITING

235. LIBRARY - OVERDUE BOOKS

237. CIVILIAN IDENTITY CARDS - FEDERATION OF MALAYA AND SINGAPORE

1. It is clear that the regulations concerning the requirement for all visitors to the Federation of MALAYA and SINGAPORE to be in possession of civilian identity cards are not well known by units and individuals.

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2. To assist sub-units and individuals, these regulations are reproduced below:-

- a. All visitors to the Federation of MALAYA and SINGAPORE for a period of more than one year, require a Civilian Identity Card issued by the Registration Department of both territories. This requirement includes children 12 years of age and over. Members of the Commonwealth Armed Forces do not require Identity Cards in respect of themselves, but they are required for all families and dependants.
- b. Civilian Identity Cards will be obtained within 30 days of arrival in the Federation of MALAYA or SINGAPORE. Identity Cards will also be obtained for a child within 30 days of reaching its 12th birthday.
- c. Failure to comply with the Immigration Laws may result in a civil prosecution.
- d. Civilian Identity Cards will be surrendered to the Issuing Office within 30 days of the departure of the family from the Federation of MALAYA or SINGAPORE.

3. Sub-units will ensure that all new arrivals are warned of their responsibilities in obtaining a Civilian Identity Card. The cost of these Identity cards will be born by the member concerned.

238. CHECKS AT ENTRANCES TO TERENDAK CAMP

1. A member of the ADP was knocked down some time ago, but fortunately not seriously injured, by a car, driven by a Private soldier in plain clothes, which was driven through the main guard room check post at well over 30 mph.
2. As a result of this act and to prevent any further possible injury to duty men at the main gate and at the rear gate ALL vehicles, military and civilian will slow down to 10 mph at each gate and will permit duty ADP adequate facilities for observing and recognising the occupants and driver. This will apply whether those concerned are wearing uniform or not and it will also apply to families.
3. If the 10 mph restriction is not observed no alternative will remain except to stop all vehicles at each guard room, for check purposes.

239. CIVILIAN VEHICLES IN CANBERRA LINES

With immediate effect, no civilian vehicle belonging to service members will proceed past Battalion Headquarters towards company lines, JRC etc, without the permission of the Battalion Orderly Officer.

240. SECURITY - BN HQ

(With immediate effect the following orders apply to Battalion Headquarters Block 12A, containing offices of CO, 2IC, Adjt, Asst Adjt, RSM and Duty Rooms(2):-

- a. The following offices and the verandah fronting them are OUT OF BOUNDS to all ranks below WO2:-
 - (1) CO, 2IC, Adjt, Asst Adjt, RSM
 - (2) Duty Rooms to other than Bn duties and authorised visitors.
- b. No members below the rank of WO2 are permitted to report direct to staff officers/RSM.

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- c. The Bn Orderly Sergeant is responsible for control of visitors other than officers and WOs to Block 12A,
- d. All visitors to Bn HQ below the rank of WO2 other than coy runners will report to the Bn Orderly Sergeant in the Duty Room. The Bn Orderly Sergeant will ascertain their business, whom they wish to see, and contact the appropriate staff officer/RSM. The Duty Rooms may be used as waiting rooms, but visitors will NOT wait on the verandah of Block 12A.
- e. All correspondence for Bn HQ, whether addressed to a particular officer or not (incl classified mail) will be delivered to the Orderly Room.
- f. Sub-units will ensure that the above rules are promulgated and enforced and, in particular, that:-
 - (1) ORs are NOT sent to visit staff officers/RSM without prior arrangement. ORs below Cpl reporting to Bn Orderly Sergeant will be issued with a slip showing the reason for reporting, signed by an officer, CSM, or Coy clerk.
 - (2) Correspondence is NOT addressed directly to staff officers/RSM. All correspondence must be delivered to the Orderly Room but may be marked, "for:....." where a particular officer has asked for it.

241. CLEARANCE OF MAIL FROM BN ORDERLY ROOM

Coys are to ensure that mail is cleared from Coy boxes at the Bn Orderly room at least once every hour beginning 0800 hrs to 1600 hrs every working day including Wednesday afternoons.

1. Married accompanied Personnel in MALAYA are currently provided with domestic help in accordance with an entitlement based on rank and family state. The only exceptions are those families resident in a hotel, hostel etc., where servants are provided by the establishment concerned.
2. With effect from 27 Jun 64, the entitlement for the provision of domestic servants to eligible married accompanied members in MALAYA will cease. From that date, local allowances payable to these members will be increased by an amount approximating the wages currently paid to the servant or servants through existing arrangements with the War Department. Henceforth, members who wish to employ a servant or servants, part or full time, are required to employ and pay such servants under private arrangements. The increase in allowances to eligible married accompanied members will not be conditional on the member employing domestic servants; on the contrary, the employment or otherwise of domestic servants will be to the member's own personal discretion.
3. Those married accompanied members resident in a hotel, hostel etc., will continue to be reimbursed the costs of laundry charges in accordance with Financial Administrative Instruction No 451, para 142.
4. It will be noted that the contents of this Order relates to amahs only; gardeners or kebuns will continue to be provided under existing arrangements.

Implementation of the Change in System

5. On 10 Jun 64, all domestic servants currently employed by eligible married accompanied members in MALAYA received dismissal notices, to be effective at 2359 hours 26 Jun 64.

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6. From 27 Jun 64, the employment of domestic servants, to include engaging and payment will be the responsibility of the member.

7. A servant or servants serving with a family at that date may be engaged privately by a member if so desired.

Responsibilities of the Member

8. When a member desires to engage domestic help under private arrangements, he will be held personally responsible for the following:-

- a. Medical Examination. Members are required to obtain a certificate of medical fitness for the servant before engaging the servant concerned. This medical examination will be carried out at the nearest medical centre at public expense. Arrangements for this medical examination will be the member's responsibility.
- b. Employer's Insurance
 - (1) Members engaging servants are required to protect themselves against claims by their employees for injury, arising out of their employment by means of Employer's Liability Insurances. These policies have an annual premium of approximately eight dollars per servant. The costs of this insurance are included in the increased allowances.
 - (2) Members are to be advised that the Commonwealth of AUSTRALIA will not accept liability for the compensation to a soldier against employee claims.
 - (3) When making application for these increased allowances members will be required to endorse their claim with the following statement:-

"When I employ a domestic servant or servants, I will take out an appropriate Employer's Liability Insurance policy for each servant so employed on or before engaging such servants."
 - (4) Units will advise members on how to take out these insurance policies, if required by the member concerned.
- c. Payment of Servants. Members are responsible for the payment of their servant or servants on a monthly basis, or at a more frequent interval as agreed with the servant. Members are to be instructed that they will maintain a suitable wages book showing payments made to the servant or servants and their signature for receipt. This wages book will be maintained as a record of wages payments only as a safeguard for the member.
- d. Security. Members will ensure that privately employed servants are screened and issued with security passes.

Conditions of Service

9. For guidance to eligible members, the conditions of service for domestic servants in the past are given below:-

- a. Pay of \$120 per month. (Cook amahs in officers employ \$137). Pay is made in arrears.
- b. One day off per week.
- c. Six days paid leave per year.

- d. Fourteen days notice of discharge or fourteen days pay in lieu, with the exception that under serious disciplinary conditions, instant dismissal is possible, without the requirement for fourteen days pay in lieu.

Increases to Allowances (Effective from 27 Jun 64)

10. Allowances will be increased for a married accompanied member in MALAYA, not resident in a hotel, hostel etc., where servants are provided by the establishment concerned. The amount of increase is determined by the members rank and family state. Rates of allowance increases will be notified separately.

11. The allowance will be credited to the member's paybook, on a daily basis, on application on a form MALAYA Pay 3 lodged with Unit Pay Representative. This application will include the member's rank and family state, to allow the grant of the appropriate increase, together with a statement in regards to Employer's Liability Insurance. (See sub para 8b. (3) above).

12. The increased allowances will be credited to an eligible member under the following conditions:-

- a. While resident in MALAYA in other than a hotel, hostel etc. (SINGAPORE and EAST MALAYSIA are non-entitled areas).
- b. If a member is transferred to a non-entitled area, or to a hotel, hostel etc, at such short notice, beyond the control of the member concerned, that it is not possible to give the required notice of dismissal to servants employed by the member, his CO or OC may authorise the payment of the increased allowances for sufficient days to cover the outstanding period. This period will NOT exceed fourteen days.
- c. The increased allowances will be continued during the absence of a member and his family on approved leave up to a maximum of sixty days, subject to his return to the area on completion of leave.
- d. If a member returns to AUSTRALIA in advance of his family to meet service requirements, the additional allowance will be continued while his family remain in MALAYA.

13. Promulgation

Sub units will ensure that details contained herein are promulgated to all members concerned, and are brought to the notice of future reinforcement members, where applicable.

TACTICAL TRAINING REQUIREMENT FOR PROMOTION TO CAPTAIN
IN THE ARA

Reference Promotion Manual Part 1 Sec 6 and Sec 14 - A

1. With a view to improving the tactical training of junior officers and easing the work of Commands, approval has now been given for the tactical training requirements for promotion to captain to be modified as follows:-

(a) Tac 1 courses conducted under Command arrangements in accordance with Reference A are to be discontinued forthwith.

(b) The tactical training requirement for promotion to captain is to be met by the following courses:-

(1) R Aust Inf Officers

Completion of a "Junior Regimental Officers Course" at the Infantry Centre.

(2) All Officers of Corps Other Than R Aust Inf and Those Prescribed by AMR & O 100A

Completion of a "Junior Officers Tactical Course" of 14 days duration at the Jungle Training Centre.

Note: The Corps prescribed by AMR & O 100A are:

R Aust Svy; RAASC (AACS); RAAMC; RA DC;
RAAOC(AAP&S); RAAEC; AACC; RAAPC; AALC;
RAA Pro; AA Psych Corps; RAANC; WRAAC.

2. The new requirement will continue to be known as the "Tac 1" requirement and both courses will be conducted on a teaching basis. The courses will be "non-assessed courses" within the meaning of MBI 252-11, but course reports for both courses will be submitted in accordance with ARO 20/1963.

3. The present requirement to have passed Subjects 1A-Staff Duties and Training and Subject 1B-Administration in the written examination for promotion to captain before attendance at a Tac 1 course is to be retained.

4. Officers who have already passed a Tac 1 Course conducted under Command arrangements are not required to complete the new requirement. Officers who have attended certain courses may be granted exemption from the new requirement; AHQ will publish the names of the officers granted such exemptions as soon as possible.

5. Officers who have not had a reasonable opportunity to qualify in the new requirement by the due date for promotion to captain may be provisionally promoted vide Section 4 of the Promotion Manual Part 1.

2.

The first TAC 1 course for infantry officers is not to be conducted until Jul or Aug 65. AHQ will issue a panel of officers to attend.

7. The new requirements are to be promulgated in AROs and an amendment to the Promotion Manual Part 1 will be issued in due course.

3 RAR REPORT ON "EX MAYBUG"

1. This report covers only two aspects:-
 - a. lessons learnt
 - b. suggestions for future exercises.

It is assumed that the minor points were noted at the Director's critique on 16 Jun 64 and therefore they have not been included in this report.

Lessons Learnt

2.
 - a. Tactics Unless sufficient time is available for the approach march tactics will become subservient to speed and minor tactics will suffer. With the weight of equipment presently carried the infantry soldier cannot travel quickly in mountainous country, be fully alert, and ready to fight instantly.
 - b. Communications
 - (1) VHF can be used effectively in mountainous country provided foresight is used at the outset. An Infantry Battalion requires additional sets for relays as required.
 - (2) Batteries must have a greater operating life. Some batteries used on the exercise operated for less than two hours. Fortunately it was known that the batteries were suspect prior to the exercise and additional batteries were carried. However this added to the already overburdened soldier.
 - c. Intelligence Intelligence must be timely and of value to unit. More intelligence information required before start of exercise especially on topography.
 - d. Movement by MT A risky tactic to use in close country known to be under enemy surveillance and interference. Infantry on foot must clear tracks in the initial stages. Empty convoys require a large protection party in close country.

Suggestions for future exercises

- 3.
- a. Intelligence Provision of either more accurate information on terrain including recent airphotograph or time to be available for units to carry out extensive topographical recce of the area of operations. Normally a unit would have had this information in operations.
 - b. Approach March Longer time be given for the approach march to obtain greatest value in all practical aspects. Exercises could be longer to cater for this important need. Enemy needs to be active during this stage to enable units to test troops and to add to realism.
 - c. Air There is a need for more air support, thus enabling the Infantry to use this medium for training under realistic condition.
 - d. Communications
 - (1) G traffic must have priority on the air in the early morning and late afternoon if the Brigade Staff are to be kept informed of the current situation and act accordingly.
 - (2) There is a need for MAPCODE and nicknames for feature etc to enable more signal traffic to be sent in clear.
 - e. Classification of casualties It is believed that the classification of casualties shown as being evacuated could bear more detailed examination before this aspect of the Brigade Report is compiled. In particular I attach a report and observations on a party of 23 enemy who all were treated as casualties at the ADS and included in the casualty figure.

3 RAR REPORT ON EX "MAYBUG" - EVACUATION
OF CASUALTIES

1. Attached is a copy of statistics, compiled from the ADS Admission and Discharge Book, on the 3 RAR enemy group admitted to the ADS in the Base Maintenance Area.
2. It would seem that, for the majority of the casualties, the ADS acted as an RAP because the enemy group had no other unit to look after their medical needs.
3. It will be readily seen that nearly all cases were admitted to the ADS for one night only and then returned to 3 RAR at CANBERRA LINES, TERENDAK for normal full time duties.
4. With the exception of very few cases the soldiers seen at the ADS would not normally have been evacuated and therefore I am of the opinion that these should not be included in the medical statistics of casualties sustained during Exercise "MAYBUG".

NOTATION FOR COMMANDERS DIARY ONLY

As at 30 Jun 64 no cases of Malaria or Leptosaresis have been reported in 3 RAR as a result of Ex MAYBUG. All other major units have reported some cases.
