AIM

† 31st December

1. The aim of a Commanders Diary is to provide data on which to base future improvements as soon as training, equipment, organisation and administration, and to furnish historians with a record of the units and formations in operational and non-operational periods in peace and in war.

GENERAL

2. *Entries will be made daily* on AF C2118, each entry being initialled by the officer detailed to keep it.
3. Commanders Diaries will conform with the rules for drafting orders given in "Staff Duties in the Field", Chapter 5, Section 1.

RESPONSIBILITY

During Non-operational Periods

4. A Commanders Diary will be made by commanders of all formations.

During Operational Periods (see note 1)

5. A Commanders Diary will be made in duplicate by:—
 - (a) Commanders of all formations.
 - (b) Each branch of the staff at formation headquarters commanded by a Brigadier or above.
 - (c) Heads of services not below the rank of Lieutenant Colonel.
 - (d) Personal staffs and officers holding special appointments.
 - (e) Unit commanders.
 - (f) Commanders of a detachment of a unit when so ordered.

COMPILATION

6. Both original and duplicate copies will consist of:—
 - (a) Cover (AF C2119).
 - (b) Index as printed on cover.
 - (c) Narrative (AF C2118).
 - (d) Annexes as shown in the Index.

7. All details of the unit or formation (if a detachment is concerned, the name of the parent unit), period covered and enclosure numbers of the annexes will be shown on the cover. If there has been a change of command since the last report, the date of assumption by the new commanding officer will be included.

8. The annexes will be assembled in the groups shown on the cover. If there are no enclosures for an Annex NIL will be entered on the cover. If additional annexes are convenient for a particular headquarters, the relevant papers should be grouped as annexes starting at B.

19. The duplicate supplementary diaries will be prepared for operations will form Annex "Z", "TOP SECRET" and the original document. It will be prepared and disposed of as originals has been acknowledged.

NOTES

1. *Definition of Operational Period.*—The term "operational" means the day's fighting, including company movements.
 - (a) the period between a declaration of war and the commander with regard to equipment, tactics, organisation;
 - (b) any period spent in a theatre of operations;
 - (c) any period when engaged in any form of military operations.
2. The War Office or headquarters concerned will be responsible for the conditions of the unit's employment make this of potential importance. will be clearly stated. Notwithstanding the above, casualties to officers, men and equipment. not at the time submitting these reports will start with equipment captured. them in accordance with paragraphs 15 and 16. equipment was employed in the time not accounted for. 12. The narrative will supplement and connect the annexes but need not give a précis of them.

DISPOSAL

During Non-Operational Periods

13. *Formation Headquarters* will forward the original Commanders Diary annually as at 31st December to reach the War Office Records Centre (through Headquarters Field Records where applicable) as soon as possible after 1st January of the following year. The duplicate will be retained in formation headquarters.

14. *Units* will NOT render a Commanders Diary.

During Operational Periods

15. ORIGINAL COMMANDERS DIARIES

- (a) *Formations and units in the UK* will forward diaries monthly by the seventh day of the succeeding month direct to the War Office (WORC for reports other than medical, AMD 1 for medical reports).
- (b) *Formations and units overseas* will forward diaries monthly by the seventh day of the succeeding month to the OIC Field Records for onward transmission to the War Office.

16. **DUPLICATE COMMANDERS DIARIES.** These will be clearly marked as duplicates and will NOT be sent with the originals. They will be forwarded within two months as follows:—

- (a) *Units in the UK*
To the OIC parent record office.
- (b) *Formation Headquarters in the UK*
To OIC Central Clearing Wing, Infantry Records, Exeter.
- (c) *Units Overseas*
To the OIC Field Records for onward transmission to parent record office.
- (d) *Formation Headquarters Overseas*
To the OIC Field Records for onward transmission to the OIC Central Clearing Wing, Records, Exeter.

SECURITY

17. Documents concerned with future operational planning will be listed on AF C2118 and placed separate AF C2119. All details will be filled in and the cover will be clearly marked in red:—ANNEX Z—OFFICERS ONLY. It may be convenient to group the papers by annexes.

18. Supplementary diaries will be forwarded in accordance with the normal rules for TOP SECRET correspondence to the War Office (WORC). The inner envelope will be clearly marked:—

19. The duplicate supplementary diaries will be despatched as in paragraph 16 as soon as receipt of the originals has been acknowledged.

NOTES

1. *Definition of Operational Period.*—The term “operational period” for the purpose of this instruction, means:—
- (a) the period between a declaration of war and the official end of hostilities;
- (b) any period spent in a theatre of operations;
- (c) any period when engaged in any form of military operation.
2. The War Office or headquarters concerned will be responsible for instructing units to submit Commanders Diaries where the conditions of the unit's employment make this necessary. Wherever possible the beginning and end of the period will be clearly stated. Notwithstanding the above, on the outbreak of global war all units and formations which are not at the time submitting these reports will start compiling them with effect from M day and will thereafter render them in accordance with paragraphs 15 and 16.

This form will be enclosed with the annexes in AF C 2119. If this is not available the cover will be prepared in manuscript.

1. Situation

- a. The Indonesian confrontation of MALAYSIA could lead to Indonesian or Indonesian-inspired attacks against Commonwealth Military camps and installations in MALAYA and SINGAPORE.
- b. Attacks could range from actual assaults on camps and installations to isolated sabotage attempts by individuals or groups against vital or vulnerable points.
- c. Intelligence reports indicate that sabotage would be the most likely form of attack, the aims being:-
 - (1) To disrupt Garrison services
 - (2) To cause maximum inconvenience and confusion
 - (3) To obtain publicity.

2. Mission. To assist in the protection of TEREENDAK Garrison.

3. Execution.

- a. Gen Outline. Protective measures taken at any time will depend upon the estimated threat at that time and have been organised in Stages 1 to 6.
- b. Stage 1
 - (1) Duty coy is to provide special guard No 1 consisting of 1 Sgt 1 Cpl and 18 Ptes from 1600 hrs to 0800 hrs daily, and of 1 Cpl and 6 Ptes from 0800 hrs to 1600 hrs daily, in lieu of the Bn Quarter Guard.
 - (2) Sub-units are to provide armed picquets to sleep in sub-unit arms kotes.
 - (3) Air and naval sighting reports as detailed in 3 RAR IS 31 dated 6 May 64 are to be submitted.
- c. Stage 2. Stage 1 plus:-
 - (1) Duty coy is to provide special guard No 2 consisting of 1 Cpl, 1 L cpl and 12 Ptes, to mount duty from 1600 hrs to 0700 hrs daily.
 - (2) Special guards No 1 and No 2 are to carry out regular searches of vital and vulnerable points for demolition charges. Vital or vulnerable points within 3 RAR's area of responsibility are:-
 - (a) Unit magazine
 - (b) Unit MT compound
 - (c) Offrs' and Sgts' Messes and JRC

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2.

- (d) Commonwealth House
 - (e) Senior & Junior Ranks' Beach Club and the Garrison Sailing Club
- d. Stage 3. Stage 2 (except as amended by this sub para) plus:-
- (1) Duty coy is to provide special guard No 3, consisting of 1 Sgt, 1 Cpl and 15 Ptes and 1 Pte Wrls Op. This guard will be stationed on the beach below Commonwealth House (GR978763) from 1830 hrs to 0700 hrs.
 - (2) Special guard No 2 is to be reduced to 1 Cpl and 6 Ptes.
 - (3) Members of Special guard No 1 and No 2 not on patrol or guarding duties at any particular time are to be available to reinforce special guard No 3 if necessary.
 - (4) Bn HQ is to roster 1 Offr to co-ord and supervise activities of all special guards. This offr is to be referred to as Special Guard Orderly Offr.
- e. Stage 4. Stage 3 plus the org of stand-by sub-units. Further instrs to be issued if nec.
- f. Stage 5. Stage 4 plus the deployment of armed bodies of tps to protect vital and vulnerable points, married quarters, community centres etc against attack. OpO to be issued if this stage is reached.
- g. Stage 6. The deployment of the bn to def positions. OpO to be issued if this stage is reached.
- h. Co-Ord Instrs
- (1) Prevention of sabotage - See Annex A.
 - (2) Duties of special guards and duties. - To be issued separately to guards and relevant duties.
 - (3) Security of arms and ammo - See Annex B.
 - (4) Orders for opening fire - See Annex C.
 - (5) Bounds - The Terendak Camp and SUNGEI UDANG beaches are out of bounds to everyone except patrols from 1900 hrs to 0700 hrs daily.
 - (6) Access to CANBERRA LINES
 - (a) Taxis are to be denied entrance to CANBERRA Lines. Passengers are to dismount at the main entrance. Unidentified passengers are to be escorted to the Guard room for checking and if doubt as to identity continues to exist, the orderly offr will be info. Clearance will not be given to taxi passengers to enter CANBERRA Lines until their task has been cleared as legitimate. They will then be escorted to and from their place of business.
 - (b) Further restrictions on entrance to CANBERRA Lines will not be imposed at this time.

4. Administration and Logistics.

a. Stage 1

- (1) Each man in special guard No 1 and of arms kote picquets is to be armed with SLR and 1 magazine of 20 rounds ball ammo.

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(2) Dress special guard No 1:-

- (a) No 1 by day
- (b) No 2 by night

(3) Dress Arms Kote picquets - Work dress.

b. Stage 2

- (1) Special guard No 2 to be armed as per special guard No 1 and to wear No 2 dress.
- (2) Special guard No 2 is to sleep in lecture room near the unit PO. They will use own eqpt as bedding.
- (3) MTO is to provide 1 x $\frac{1}{4}$ ton veh and dvr at Bn HQ from 1600 hrs to 0700 hrs daily. The dvr will sleep with special guard no 2 and is referred to as special guard duty dvr.

c. Stage 3

- (1) Special guard No 3 will wear jungle green, basic order, bush hat and jungle boots. Bedding will be taken to their base. They will be armed as per special guard No 1. Duty coy will issue 2 pairs of binoculars to the guard.
- (2) MTO is to provide 1 x 3 ton veh in lieu of 1 x $\frac{1}{4}$ ton veh referred to in sub para 4b (3) above.

5. Command and Signal

a. Stages 1 and 2. Incidents to be reported to Bn Orderly Officer who will inform the adjutant and report details to the Brigade Staff Duty Officer on Phone extension 205.

b. Stages 3 and 4

- (1) Sig offr to estb wireless comms within special guard No 3 and from the guard to the Bn Orderly Offr. Detailed orders will be issued separately in unit comms instr.
- (2) Incidents will be reported to the Bn Orderly Officer who will inform the Adjutant and report details to the Bde Ops Room on Ext. 213 or 202.

c. General

a. Comms instr is to be issued by 208 COMWEL Sig Sqn. A unit instr will then be issued.

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Annex A to 3 RAR OpO No 4

PREVENTION OF SABOTAGE

Techniques

1. Sabotage techniques likely to be used are standard demolition charges with:-
 - a. Charges in one pound blocks
 - b. Initiation by improvised electrical/time circuits, probably using modified wrist watches/clocks
 - c. Anti-handling devices fitted. (Such devices are extremely sensitive.)

Search

2. Guard and picquets will be specifically ordered to search for sabotage attempts, however all members of the unit are to be informed of the technique likely to be used and of action to be taken if sabotage is suspected.

Action to be taken if sabotage is suspected

3. The Bn Orderly Offr will be informed immediately. He will inform the Adjutant and report details to the Bde Staff Duty Offr.
4. If a demolition charge is found:-
 - a. It will not be disturbed
 - b. Buildings if occupied will be cleared of people
 - c. A guard will be left on the demolition charge and the matter reported as per para 3 above.

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Annex B to 3 RAR OpO No 4

SECURITY OF ARMS AND AMMO

1. Precautions for the security of arms and ammo will be in accordance with unit Standing Orders Part 3 Section 1, with the following variations which may be anticipated as amendments to Standing Orders:-

- a. Page 301 Para 32 a (3): After "Guards" insert "See Instrs contained in paras 48 to 49 below."
- b. Para 302 para 34: Insert new sub-para g.
 - "g. Ensure that any ammo which is issued for the protection of Arms Kote is retained by him in charged magazines which will be carried on his person. He will not transfer ammo to relieving picquets direct, but will return it to the issuing authority for proper re-issue."
- c. Page 305 para 46A: After "Kotes" insert:-

"except when authorised for issue to Arms Kote Sentries for the protection of weapons. In this case ammo will be carried in a charged magazines which will be retained on the sentry's person at all times. The magazines will not be placed on the weapon unless it is intended to fire."
- d. Page 305 para 46 c: Delete existing sub-para. Insert following:-

"ammo is not to be kept in weapon magazines and charged magazines are not to be accepted by Arms Kote Sentries, except in the circumstances described in sub para a above".
- e. Page 305: Insert new para 48 as follows:-

"48. Arms on issue to Guards

 - a. Weapons issued to guards from Coy Arms Kotes will be the responsibility of the individuals to whom they are issued until they are properly returned to the Arms Kote in accordance with these Orders.
 - b. Weapons will not be left unattended at any time, however when sleeping, guards may deposit their weapons with the Guard Commander for temporary custody.
 - c. The Guard Commander will ensure that adequate precautions are taken for the security of weapons deposited, in accordance with sub para b above. He will have the weapons centrally located in the most secure place available at the guard's location and will post an armed sentry on them. Ammo will not be held in the same room as these weapons unless it is on issue to the guard, in which case it will be in a charged magazine carried on the person of the guard.
 - d. The Guard Commander will report to Bn HQ, any weaknesses which he considers exist in the control of weapon security."
- f. Page 305: Insert new para 49 as follows:-

"49. Ammo on issue to Guards

 - a. Ammo to be issued to Guards will be personally signed for by the Guard Commander when it is drawn in bulk from the RSM or his appointed representative.

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- b. Ammo is to be re-issued to individual sentries on signature, individual rounds being accounted for.
- c. Sentries will carry ammo in charged magazines which will be retained on their person at all times.
- d. Under no circumstances will ammo be held in the same room as weapons unless carried in a charged magazine on the person of the sentry.
- e. Charged magazines will not be placed on weapons unless it is intended to open fire.
- f. On completion of Guard duty each sentry will return ammo on issue to him, to the Guard Commander. Individual rounds will be counted and a signature given for quantities returned. Any discrepancies will be immediately reported to Bn HQ. The Guard Commander will return the ammo to the RSM or his nominated representative.
- g. During his tour of duty the Guard Commander will carry out checks to ensure that adequate precautions are being taken for the security of ammo and the safety of personnel. Any discrepancy will be rectified immediately and also mentioned in his Guard Report.

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Annex C to 3 RAR OpO No 4

ORDERS FOR OPENING FIRE

1. Orders for guards and picquets will include the following.

"Guards, picquets, patrols etc are to open fire only after a challenge is given and refused, and then only when it becomes necessary to:-

- a. Defend themselves against attack.
- b. Defend friendly forces (including families, servants and civilian employees)
- c. Apprehend persons specifically identified as engaged in sabotage and attempting to escape.

When fire is opened up great care must be taken to avoid causing casualties to own troops or garrison residents".

2. All members are to be informed of the fact that sentries have orders to open fire under the above circumstances. Under no circumstances must any member act in a manner likely to cause suspicion of sabotage attempts.

GENERAL IDEA

MAPS: MALAYA 1958, 1 : 500,000.

1. The year is 1964. There are three mythical countries in South East Asia, SILO which is a member of SEATO, AGAG a neutralist country on her Northern Border and LILLIPUT a militant Communist Country whose forces are VANDAL trained and equipped. The geographical limits of these countries are shown in Annex P.
2. During the first part of 1964 there was a build-up of LILLIPUTIAN forces and an increase in anti-SILO propaganda. Intelligence reports suggest that however delicate AGAG treads, a LILLIPUTIAN incursion is likely in the second half of Jul 64, to coincide with the gathering of the rice harvest. This incursion may penetrate as far as SILO. LILLIPUT has an ex-guerilla army and would not normally risk conventional overt aggression but it appears that, with the distractions of the American Presidential Election, British General Election, the Olympic Games and the England-Australian test series LILLIPUT may take a calculated risk that SEATO reactions will be slow.
3. The SILO government has not yet called for the proffered SEATO help because they:
 - a. Do not want to provoke attack.
 - b. Do not want to be branded as Neo-Colonialists.
4. In the event of a LILLIPUTIAN incursion into neutral AGAG, SILO will certainly call for SEATO help. There is a contingency plan, involving 28 Bde, which is designed to:
 - a. Prevent any violation of the frontier.
 - b. Quell any LILLIPUT inspired insurgency.
 - c. Drive back an incursion should the sit deteriorate to this extent.
5. This contingency plan is similar to that foreseen in 28 Bde's SOPs.
6. It is known that the long term LILLIPUTIAN aim is to dominate the whole of South East Asia.
7. Further details about SILO, AGAG and LILLIPUT are given in the GHQ INTSUM which is at Annex A.
8. HQ 3 Cdo Bde RM INTSUM dated 30 Jun 64 is at Annex B.

PART 1

SILO

Political

1. SILO is ruled by a military junta which, since the last coup in Jan 64, has been led by Field Marshal NO SYDKYK. Real power is held by the army. A small committee of military men, which organised the overthrow of the last President, makes the decision.
2. The population, who have little interest in politics, have accepted the change except in the urban areas where the extremist left wing element is still active. The Communist Party has been banned since 1961 but continues to operate under cover and, in spite of NO SYDKYK's purge in Jan 64, is still an effective org.
3. Field Marshal NO SYDKYK has appointed governors to administer the provinces of JOHORE, MALACCA, SELANGOR, NEGRI SEMBILAN and SOUTH PAHANG. These are all Army officers most of whom are related to the Field Marshal. However, little power is decentralised to these provinces because the Field Marshal will not let any possible rival become too powerful. Within the provinces the local Military Commander acts as a District Officer and controls his district through the village headmen.

Economic Situation

4. SILO is a country rich in rubber, rice and timber. However, the people are indolent and see no sense in producing more than they need for their own use. The economy is stable. SILO receives aid for development projects.

Military

5. Navy. The SILO Navy consists of four patrol boats and some motor launches which are manned by the Navy but used by the police.

6. Patrol boats are used primarily on anti piracy duty.

It is considered that the main use of the SILO Army is for IS and dealing with minor raids.

8. The Army is not an efficient force because:
 - a. No fmn and little unit or sub-unit trg is carried out
 - b. Junior officers are reluctant to take even the most minor decisions.
 - c. There is an acute shortage of technicians.
 - d. There is complete lack of field experience in the higher ranks.
 - e. The people of SILO are not a martial race.

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9. Air Force. The air force consists of the following:

- a. 2 sqns of fighter ground attack ac.
- b. 1 sqn of light bombers.
- c. 30 miscellaneous transport and trg ac.

10. There are few regular pilots and these have little operational experience. The main problem is maintenance as SILO is short of trained maintenance crews and has inadequate spares backing. Consequently the air effort tends to fall off rapidly.

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PART 2

AGAG

Political

11. AGAG has been the centre of world power politics and has for several years been a neutral country in which an uneasy peace has been carefully maintained by the neutralist leader who has kept the balance between the rival pro-communist and pro-western factions.

12. The government of AGAG has been increasingly aware of the growing strength of communist LILLIPUT on her border. The pro-communists have drawn strength both from this and the physical aid they have been receiving. In short, AGAG is a thoroughly unstable country and one which is being anxiously watched by the Great Powers.

Economic Situation

13. This is chaotic because of constant internal troubles. The country is supported by outside loans and grants.

Military Situation

14. The armed forces of AGAG, like GAUL, are in three parts and are too busy fighting amongst themselves to defend the country against an aggressor. The following factions are present:

- a. Pro-Communist
- b. Pro-Western
- c. Neutralist.

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PART 3

LILLIPUT

Political

15. LILLIPUT is a communist country which has been growing in strength and is now pursuing the active expansion policy. The leader, WOT CHER, who is a hero of the anti-colonialist struggle, is a communist style dictator. He has been trained and educated in VANDALIA. Although LILLIPUT looks to VANDALIA for support, FANTASIA is also trying to exert her influence. It appears that WOT CHER an astute politician, is likely to make the most of the uncertainties and indecisions forced on the Western world by the US Presidential and the British General elections.

Economic Situation

16. Except for the coastal plain, the country is mountainous and, although it used to be self supporting in food, a rising birth rate combined with a poor harvest and heavy expenditure on military equipment, has caused an economic crisis.

17. Aid from VANDALIA has been erratic in the past but in 1964 it has been generous in terms of military equipment.

18. LILLIPUT sees the rich rice, rubber and timber producing areas of SILO as the long term solution to her economic problems.

Military

19. General. The LILLIPUTIANS are little men with big reputations. They have an enormous appetite for rice which is grown in quantity in the lush KLUANG Plain. It is to satisfy this voracious appetite that LILLIPUT wants eventually to control SILO. Their forces have been VANDAL trained and equipped and there are a number of VANDAL advisors in the Army and Air Force.

20. Navy. LILLIPUT has no regular Navy but can call on a number of coastal craft and merchant ships to lift troops.

21. Army. This consists of three infantry divisions which have arty and limited armour. Dispositions are given in Annex P. Infantry divisions are similar to VANDAL infantry divisions except that:

- a. There is no howitzer battalion in the division.
- b. One tank coy (10 x T34s) are under command of each regiment.

22. Air Force. The Air Force consists of 24 MIG fighter ground attack aircraft and a number of recce aircraft. LILLIPUT has maintenance and spares problems so it is considered that the fighter ground attack effort will be largely expended six days after any incursion into AGAG, but the recce effort can be maintained for several weeks.

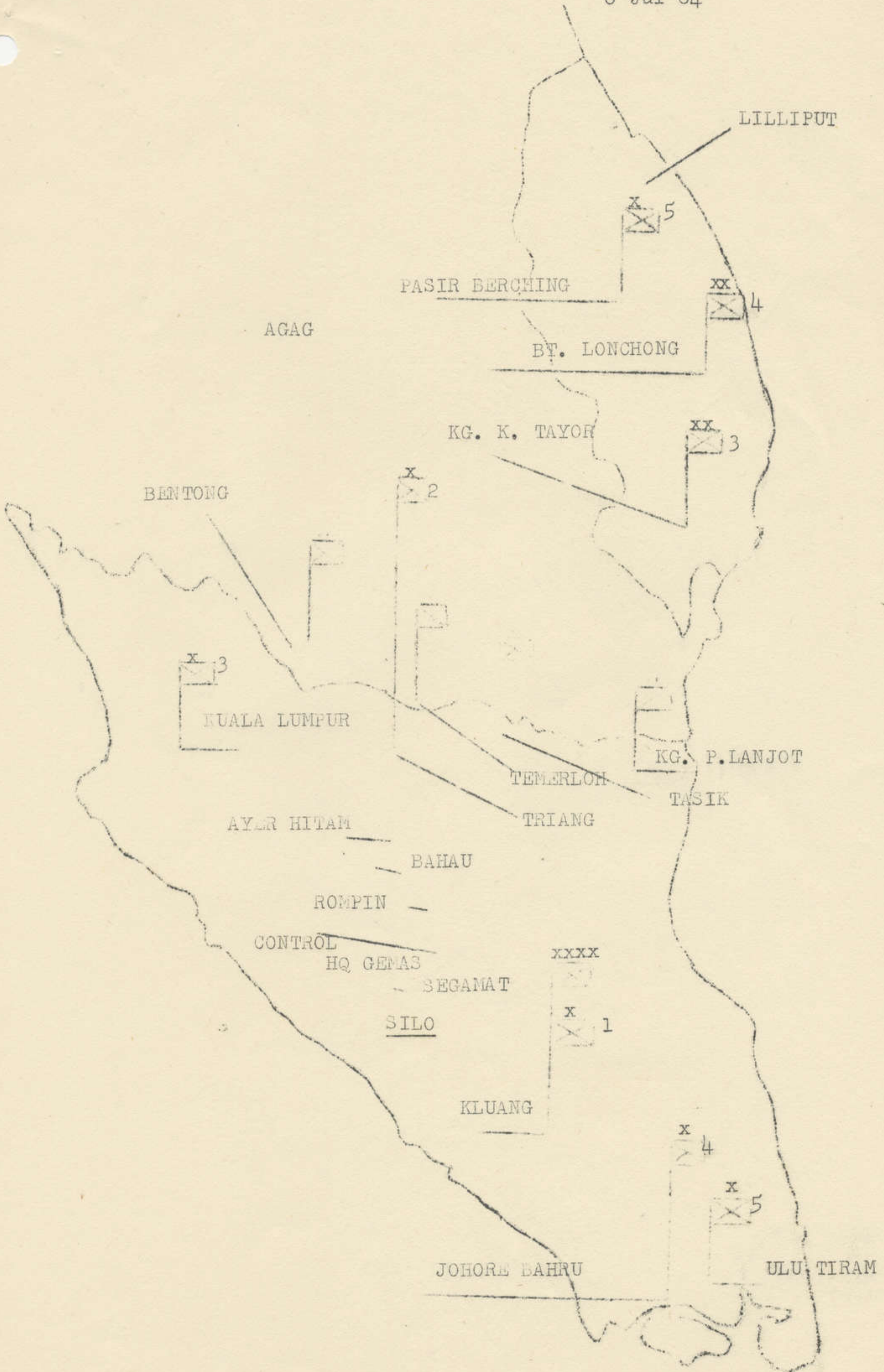
SILO

1. General. The situation on the AGAG-LILLIPUT border is being watched anxiously particularly as there has been an increase of anti SILO propaganda emanating from radio LILLIPUT, together with a steady build up of LILLIPUT forces on the AGAG border.
2. Communist Party. A number of incidents have been reported over the past 2 weeks of loyal government supporters being threatened and, in two instances, murdered. This process of intimidation is becoming increasingly effective and the morale of local government officers is low.
3. An arms cache has been found in a rubber estate 3 miles NE of ROMPIN. The arms are of VANDAL origin and the Special Branch estimate that further supplies have been smuggled in ready for an armed insurrection.
4. Black Communist Areas. These are:
 - a. JOHORE BAHRU
 - b. KLUANG
 - c. Area enclosed by the 45 Northing - 80 Easting and the ROMPIN-GEMAS rd.
5. No further information has been received on the JOHORE, BAHAU and KLUANG Areas.
6. GEMAS/ROMPIN. It appears that NINEL directs the underground communist organisations for the whole of SILO, from this area. He is believed to be ready for armed revolt and it is estimated that he has about 500 men in the area who are armed and who have been training secretly. It is thought that they op in groups of about 30 with an extensive supply organisation run on MIN YUEN lines.
7. NINEL.
 - a. Age 45.
 - b. Born in GEMAS.
 - c. Educated in the local Chinese School.
 - d. Moved to LILLIPUT in 1942 and joined a resistance group against the JAPANESE.
 - e. Fought against the FRENCH 1950-53 and is believe to have spent about a year in CHINA.
 - f. Known to advise and to have studied the writings of MAO TSE TUNG.
 - g. Known to be an ardent communist and a ruthless and efficient leader. Sees himself as the future ruler of SILO.

Distribution BelowTECHNICAL INSPECTION OF SA, MG & MORTARS

1. The above inspection will be conducted for 3 RAR commencing 5 Aug 64 in accordance with the schedule at Annex 'A'.
2. To ensure that the weapons are in good inspection order the following requirements will be met:-
 - a. All wpns free from oil and thoroughly clean ie weapons must be dry.
 - b. All registered nos of wpns correspond ie body, butt group, breech block, piston, barrels, etc.
 - c. During preparation of wpns particular attention should be paid to the cleaning of:-
 - (1) Bores, gas regulators, gas cylinders
 - (2) Rear swivel loops and holes in butt plate
 - (3) Piston head, to ensure the removal of carbon. Do NOT use any abrasive material to achieve this
 - (4) Magazines and ancillary stores in arms kotes thoroughly cleaned and laid out. Coys will ensure that hold all spare parts wallets, and all contents are thoroughly cleaned. Stores should be prepared for inspection and laid out in an orderly fashion on tables outside the arms kote at the time required by the REME inspection team.
 - (5) Patch painting to be carried out as required.
3. Rifles 7.62 mm will be the first eqpt to be inspected and will be inspected at the rate of approx 40 per day. Coys will contact the unit armourer direct to ascertain the number of wpns required on a particular day; these wpns will then be prepared for inspection. The remaining wpns will not be "dry" until required by the inspection team.
4. Arms Kotes attendant together with the CQMS or Storeman will be in attendance throughout the inspection to assist the armourer. Either the CQMS or Storeman will assist the armourer with minor clerical duties, should this prove impracticable an additional soldier will be provided for clerical duties.

5 Coys will provide a strong FS table for use as a work bench by the inspection team. The Arms Kote will be cleared of any unnecessary stores and the table placed in the Arms Kote.

6. A list will be prepared in duplicate of all wpns by type, showing registered numbers and unit numbers of each piece of eqpt, approx 12 wpns per page, spaced equally down the left hand side of the page allowing ample space for remarks. Each page to be headed with the type and mark of the eqpt page one (1) of each type of eqpt to show unit holding.

7. The unit and bde armourers are avail to advise Coys on any problems in connection with the inspection. Coys to contact the unit armourer direct.

8. It is imperative that our SA, MG and Mors be presented in as good condition as possible and then maintained in that condition. To this end Coys will ensure that the maximum effort is applied to the preparations for the inspection.

DISTRIBUTION BELOW

PROTECTION AGAINST CHOLERA

NOTE: These precautions apply to service personnel and their families who are residing in States and Towns which have been declared "infected local areas" by The Civil Health Authorities. The precautions below which are underlined should be observed at all times in the tropics and especially when there is cholera about.

PRECAUTIONS

1. "You can drink Cholera and you can eat Cholera but you can't catch Cholera". The disease is acquired from the stools and vomit of the sick either by dirty hands or by contaminated food and drink.

RELIABLE PROTECTIVE MEASURES

2. a. WATER

(1) Water which is provided by the WD is safe unless declared otherwise by the military authorities.

Municipal water supply is safe except in a declared "local infected area" or declared NOT SAFE by the military and civil authorities.

All other sources of water supply (wells, rivers etc) are NOT SAFE.

(2) Water which is NOT SAFE should be BOILED before being used for

Drinking
Cleaning the teeth
Washing-up
Making ice
Adding to dried milk or soft drinks

(3) DO NOT put ice in drinks unless it is made from safe water and not touched by hand

(4) Bathing in the sea should be discontinued. Bathing in a properly pumped swimming bath is safe.

b. FOOD

(1) Food which is cooked and served with clean hands is safe.

(2) Dangerous foodstuffs are those locally produced and normally eaten raw. This included ice cream in "local infected areas". Frozen and imported foods of this kind are safe provided they are purchased from a reputable firm and washed in pure water before being eaten. DO NOT buy from hawkers, in the street, or in dirty shops and markets. Cut fruit is especially dangerous. The treatment of uncooked vegetables and fruit is given in the Appendix to these notes.

(3) It is wise when cholera is about not to eat out unless you are confident that the place where you eat and drink produces its meals hygienically. In "local infected areas" you should NOT eat out.

7 (4) Food should be protected from FLIES which should be killed by every available means.

c. FOOD HANDLING

Cleanliness of the hands particularly of people who prepare food, is essential. They should always wash their hands immediately after they use the latrine/WC and before they touch food.

d. REPORTING SICK

Everyone, and particularly food handlers, who develop diarrhoea or vomiting should report immediately to a medical officer and should stop any work in connection with the handling of food.

e. MOVEMENTS

Avoid entering a "local infected area" except on duty.

f. VACCINATION

(1) Vaccination gives a limited degree of protection against cholera and only for a few months. Protection is not at its maximum until 6 days after vaccination at which time the International Certificate of Vaccination becomes valid for 6 months.

(2) Vaccination is being given by one injection to certain priority groups (infants under one year of age are not being vaccinated against cholera).

(3) Vaccination will not be refused to anyone who asks for it but mass vaccination is not indicated now, if ever.

g. Precautions Terendak MALACCA

(1) Drinking water in Terendak need NOT be boiled pending further instructions.

(2) Water drawn from the MALACCA water supply should be boiled.

(3) Durians should NOT be eaten.

GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS

Reference: A MALAYA, 1958, 1:500,000.

General

1. 28 Comwel Inf Bde Gp with associated air sp will take part in an ex in MALAYA. The ex will take place from 13-21 Jul and will be preceded by pre-stocking of the Bde AMA from approximately 9 Jul.
2. Ex RAVEN is a one sided exercise with a controlled enemy, designed to exercise 28 Bde in its SEATO role by:
 - a. Conc the Bde Gp at a simulated forward air head.
 - b. Moving the Bde Gp from a forward air head with limited tpt to an area of op.
 - c. Ex the Bde Gp, using offensive air sp, in the fol phases of war:
 - (1) Adv to contact.
 - (2) Def.
 - (3) Attack
3. The Phases of the exercise will be:
 - a. Phase 1. Pre stocking of the Bde AMA at ASAHAN.
 - b. Phase 2. Mov of Bde Gp to the simulated forward air head at ASAHAN.
 - c. Phase 3. Main ex.

Ex Concept

4. There is a SEATO contingency plan which envisages 28 Bde moving on air portable scales, to go to the assistance of SILO, a mythical country in SE Asia threatened by communist insurgents. The states of readiness for this contingency plan are:
 - a. Ex RAVEN YELLOW - Op considered likely.
 - b. Ex RAVEN GREEN - 28 Bde conc in TERENDAK
 - c. Ex RAVEN RED - 28 Bde to move to SILO
5. The geographical layout of the countries involved will be issued separately.
6. On receipt of Ex RAVEN RED, 28 Bde will simulate a fly in and conc at an LRT Air head at ASAHAN. Details at Annex A. The Bde will then receive orders for future ops from Force HQ (HQ 3 Cdo Bde RM) which will be located non tactically throughout the ex at GEMAS. The contingency plan anticipates the Bde Gp being deployed in the GEMAS, ROMPIN area. For ex reasons the fly in will take only 2 days and the "sea tail" will be brought in by road in E + 2.
7. Periodic INTSUMS will be issued before the ex starts.
8. The Bde will be maint from stocks flown in to the LRT Air head.

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9. Aim. To ex 28 Comwel Inf Bde Gp, with offensive air sp, in its SEATO role.
10. Ex en. See Annex B for composition. En will be con.
11. Umpires. The Chief Umpire will be the CO, QRIH. Umpires will be att to and rationed by 3 RAR and other units participating in the ex.
12. Units and Formations Participating. At Annex B.
13. Dress and Ident of Forces
 - a. Units being ex. At air portable scales with no other ident.
 - b. Ex En.
 - (1) Dress. Air portable scales with a red band round jungle hats. Jungle hats are to be converted to a "peaked cap" by turning the brim underneath the crown.
 - (2) Vehicles. A red cross 12" x 12" will be displayed on the passenger side of the windscreen and a red pennant is to be flown by each vehicle.
 - c. Umpires, Con Staff and Spectators.
 - (1) Dress. Normal with white arm band on right sleeve.
 - (2) Vehicles. A white pennant will be flown by each vehicle.
14. Battle Simulation. An issue of blank ammo and pyrotechnics will be made to the ex en prior to the ex. Live ammo will NOT be carried.

Safety

15. Blank and pyrotechnics will not be discharged in kampongs, towns or other centres of habitation, nor will they be discharged in the immediate vicinity of any houses or tfe. Normal safety precautions will be observed in ac.
16. Actual physical contact between opposing forces will be avoided. In this respect, umpires are to see that any fighting or rough play is checked immediately and treated as a serious disciplinary offence. All troops are to be briefed to this effect. Bayonets will not be fixed and blank will not be fired at anybody at close range.
17. NO "panjis" will be set up by either side.
18. PW. PW may be taken, and after capture may be interrogated, but any such interrogation will be limited to "Question and Answer". No form of "third degree" is to be used, nor will any questioning be prolonged for more than two hours. PW are not to be evacuated to the rear of Bn HQ. Umpires will organise return to parent units. Wpns and pers eqpt will not be removed from PW.
19. Ex Cas. Ex cas will be inflicted by Umpires to ex the admin of 28 Bde. After evac, cas will be returned to 3 RAR as rfts. Wpns and pers eqpt will not be removed from ex cas.
20. Damage to Pte Property. The greatest care will be taken by all ranks to avoid damage to pte property. No dwelling will be entered. Should any damage occur it will be reported by the fastest means to Bn HQ, the msg being prefixed by "SHORTEN SAIL". The fol rules are to be observed.
 - a. All ranks are to be warned of fire hazard and full precautions against fire are to be taken.
 - b. There is to be no deliberate or malicious damage to rubber trees or banana. (eg cutting trees for cam).

- c. Litter (particularly tins and bottles) are to be removed from the area after occupation and NOT buried.

21. Damage to WD Property. It is probable that eqpt and stores will be captured. Any stores which the capturing unit is not able to evac will be left intact, in situ, under a guard, and reported. On no account will any eqpt or stores be deliberately abandoned or destroyed.

22. Admin and Log. To be issued.

b. SEATO procedures will be used.
c. Ex msg's will be prefixed by "EX RAVEN"

SIMULATED FLY IN OF 28 (COMWEL) INF BDE GP

1. Aim. The aim is to move 3 RAR as part of 28 COMWEL Inf Bde Gp by road from TERENDAK to ASAHAN on 13/14 Jul, simulating as closely as possible the airlift.
2. Simulation.
 - a. Simulated chawks, timings and aircraft, will be arranged.
 - b. Serials may be delayed or deleted in order to simulate aircraft break down.
 - c. Full air move documentation is to be completed.
 - d. The move is to be non-tactical to the extent that vehicles will not be attacked en route.
3. Procedure
 - a. See 3 RAR SOP for air portable operations.
 - b. The Sea Tail may be ordered to leave TERENDAK.
4. Mobilization
 - a. 3 RAR will be mobilized during the latter part of the week commencing 6 Jul 64. Following completion of mobilization the unit may be "stood down" from mobilization readiness on orders from the Commanding Officer, until the time of move to ASAHAN. This "stand down" will represent the period of time normally spent staging in SINGAPORE
 - b. The CO and SUEO's party will be unavailable to 3 RAR from 0800 hrs on mobilization day, representing their departure from SINGAPORE which would normally occur.
 - c. The following conferences will be held:-
 - (1) Bde briefing conference attended by the CO at the Bde Conference Room at 1400 hrs on mobilization day.
 - (2) The movement planning conference at the Bde Presentation Hall attended by the SUEO, at 1400 hrs on mobilization day.
 - (3) Unit Conference as called and co-ordinated by SUEO in order to plan air movement.
5. Appointments
 - a. Capt RUSSELL-SMITH is appointed SUEO for Ex RAVEN. He will ensure that up to date staff tables and a staff table for the Sea Tail are available when needed.
 - b. Coys will ensure that UEOs and Loading and Lashing Teams, in accordance with 3 RAR SOP for Air portable Operations are appointed and available.
 - c. SUEO and UEOs will be required to work over the week-end 11/12 Jul finalizing air movement documentation.

277. EXEMPTION FROM AD VALOREM REGISTRATION TAX ON PRIVATE MOTOR VEHICLES

1. Since MALAYSIA Day 16 September, 1963, certain provisions of the Anglo Malayan Defence Agreement are to apply to both SINGAPORE and MALAYA.
2. Under paragraph 4 Section 6 of Annex 3 of the Defence Agreement, exemption from the Ad Valorem Registration tax, payable when a vehicle is licenced, on private motor vehicles may be claimed by any member of the Commonwealth Naval Land and Air Forces, or by component of such forces. No claim may be made by any member of the Malaysian Armed Forces or by citizens of MALAYA or SINGAPORE employed by the forces.
3. The regulations permit the importation of a new and unregistered motor vehicle or the initial registration of a motor vehicle purchased in SINGAPORE or MALAYA without payment of this tax.
4. Claims for exemption or refund of tax already paid must be submitted within three months of the applicant's first arrival in SINGAPORE or MALAYA. Claims should be submitted, on a proforma as at Annex 'A' to this order. r

5. Claims for exemption need not be related to a specific car which the claimant intends to buy. A claimant who does not intend to buy a car for say 6 months or a year after arrival, may put in for exemption within 3 months of arrival, and use such exemption at a later date when a car is actually bought.
6. Should a member of the overseas Commonwealth Forces, or the civilian component, wish to sell or transfer a vehicle on which exemption has been granted, the exemption continues if the vehicle is disposed of to another member of such Forces or civilian component who has not previously been granted a similar exemption and who has applied for and been granted this exemption in the usual manner but has not yet acquired a vehicle. However, if the vehicle is to be disposed of to any other person the vehicle will become liable to ad valorem registration fees assessed on the value of the vehicle at the time of disposal."

- (f) Could lemon be served with fish. Lemon is NOT on the scale and is too dear to purchase.
- (g) Could the menu be placed on a blackboard for each mess. The messing Officer considered this would have more drawbacks than advantages.
- (h) Late meals are NOT being kept for duty personnel. This is a matter for CSM's to investigate what their orderly corporals are doing.

LOCAL PURCHASE - ORDNANCE STORES

1. There have been several recent incidents of units locally purchasing Ordnance Stores without first obtaining the necessary authority. Neither HQ 3 RAR nor HQ 28 Bde have financial delegation to authorise local purchase of Ordnance Stores.

2. CRAOC Malaya area has a delegation to spend a maximum of £25 on any one purchase. Approval for such local purchase is subject to the following conditions.

- a. That the unit/coy is authorised to hold the item,
- b. That the item is NOT currently available through normal channels.
- c. The urgency of the requirement must be justified in that the item is essential for operational needs or the efficient functioning of the unit, and the supply through normal channels cannot meet this requirement.
- d. The item is available locally and the cost known.

3. Coys will ensure that all prospective purchases are submitted to the QM. The QM will submit the application together with his recommendations to the 2IC for further recommendation. Approval will then be sought through DADOS HQ 28 Bde.

4. When advised of the approval to purchase locally, and NOT beforehand the QM will obtain the required item/s from the supplier together with an invoice/bill, and obtain the suppliers signature on Army Form P1922. The QM is to complete AF P1922 quoting RV No, and account on the reverse of the form for non expendable items.

5. The QM is to send the completed AF P1922 with the original copy of the suppliers invoice to CRAOC Malaya area as quickly as possible for payment.

6. Items locally purchased are NOT to be paid for by individuals, PRI or any other Regimental funds.

296.

FIRE PRECAUTIONS - PRIVATELY LEASED ACCOMMODATION

1. Occupants of privately leased accommodation are warned of the risk attached to the installation of unguarded electric light bulbs as dryers in wardrobes and clothes cupboards.

2. They are also advised, in their own interests, that a clause placing the responsibility for insurance of the property against fire is written in their agreement of lease with the landlord. An extract from the agreement used in the case of Army hirings is quoted below as a guide:

"The Landlord agrees with the tenant

3. To insure and keep insured the property from loss or damage by fire. Other risks normally covered by a householders policy up to the full value thereof and in the case of damage or destruction to the full value thereof and in the case of damage or destruction to rebuild and reinstate the same forthwith". 308. EMERGENCY LEAVE.

1. Emergency leave and free travel to AUSTRALIA may be granted by the Military Board in exceptional circumstances connected with domestic affairs. A guide to the circumstances under which emergency leave may be approved is attached as Annex A.

2. Application will be processed as follows:-

a. Emergency Circumstances Notified to a HQ Command in AUSTRALIA

HQ Command in AUSTRALIA investigates and signals a recommendation together with details of the case to AHQ CANBERRA. A copy of this signal is forwarded to HQ Aust Army Force FARELF. AHQ advises both HQs by signal of the decision given.

b. Emergency Circumstances Notified to Unit Overseas

In all cases where it is considered that emergency leave should be granted, the unit is to send an OP IMMEDIATE signal to HQ Aust Army Force, FARELF, (copy to formation etc., headquarters) requesting that the circumstances be investigated. The signal should contain the following information:-

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- (1) Outline circumstances of the case.
- (2) Name, relationship, address and phone number of any person in AUSTRALIA who could be interviewed regarding the circumstances of the case.
- (3) Any other relevant information to include ARL credits of the member concerned.
- (4) The units recommendation stating whether:
 - (a) it is considered the member should be returned to AUSTRALIA for Emergency Leave only; or
 - (b) he should be returned for leave and reposting in AUSTRALIA.

3. On receipt of a signal requesting emergency leave, HQ Aust Army Force FARELF will send an OP IMMEDIATE signal to the appropriate HQ Comd in AUSTRALIA for investigation. AHQ CANBERRA will be included as an information addressee in this signal.

4. When the unit receives information that emergency leave has been approved they will immediately advise HQ Aust Army Force FARELF by the quickest means of the date and time the member is available to be moved.

5. All 3 RAR members are to be advised to inform their relatives, in cases of emergency, to contact the HQ of the Comd in which they reside. The conditions under which emergency leave to AUSTRALIA is normally approved will be brought to the attention of all 3 RAR members.

AMMUNITION AND EXPLOSIVES REGULATIONS (L.S.)

1. The following amendment to A and E R Pamphlet 2 is notified for information and action as necessary. No action will be taken to amend the pamphlet until printed amendment is received, but the revised instructions will be implemented forthwith.

Part 7, delete para 6 and all detail

Substitute new para:-

"6. Examination of fragments by experts may provide vital information regarding the cause of the premature or accident. It is therefore most important that no attempt is made to clean or coat with preservative any fragments of ammunition found in the area of the incident. All fragments of ammunition should be left untouched until the ATO has completed his investigation. Weapon fragments and damaged barrels will not be cleaned or coated with preservative if REME investigation is necessary. Small arms weapons will not be dismantled for cleaning or preservative action but a small quantity of oil should be poured down the barrel as an anti-corrosion measure, If it is necessary to remove fragments their position in relation to the weapon must first be carefully recorded."

UNAUTHORISED COMMUNICATION OF INFORMATION

1. All ranks are required at all times to conform with the following extracts from the Australian Military Regulations and Orders and the Military board instructions:-

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- a. AMR & O 309 (1). "It is an offence against DA 73A for any member of the Military Forces to communicate to any person, otherwise than in the course of his official duty, any plan, document or information relating to any fort, battery, field work, fortification, or defence work, or to any defence of the Commonwealth or to any factory or any other Naval or Military information". Communication to the press falls within DA 73A.
- b. MBI 13/61 - para 4. "Members are prohibited from contributing letters to the press on political and military matters except with the prior approval of AHQ".

2. Statements will not be made to the Press, Radio or any other agency on matters of Government Policy.

3. Any member contravening this order is liable to be charged with an offence.

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GUIDE TO CONDITIONS UNDER WHICH EMERGENCY LEAVE MAY NORMALLY BE
GRANTED TO AMF PERSONNEL SERVING OVERSEAS

1.

CATEGORY	EXAMPLE
a. Illness of wife	(1) Wife dangerously ill or dying. (2) Presence of husband may assist recovery. (3) Wife has become mentally unstable. (4) There are children under 16 needing care and wife is seriously ill.
b. Illness of parent or other person in loco parentis	(1) Either parent dangerously ill and no suitable relative is available. (2) The return of the individual is necessary to save life or reason. (3) Either parent dying and expectation of life is short. In this case leave will not be granted if the soldier's presence is desired for sentimental reasons, but only when some positive good can be achieved by the soldier's presence, such as care of the sick parent or putting in order the parent's affairs where no other close relative is available to do so.
c. Illness of child	(1) The parent's presence is essential to save life or reason. (2) The child is dangerously ill or dying and expectation of life is short.
<p><u>NOTE:</u> A member granted emergency leave with free travel because of illness of a child, may transfer the free travel to his wife provided both the following conditions apply:-</p>	
a. The wife has been removed to the overseas post at Commonwealth expense.	
b. Emergency Leave has been granted in respect of a child of the marriage who had been left in AUSTRALIA and the member himself is prevented by the exigencies of the Service from taking the emergency leave or prefers that his wife should take his place.	
d. Death of Wife	Return of husband is essential to provide care for children.
e. Death of parent or other person in loco parentis	The other parent is destitute or aged and infirm, and no other relative is available.

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7.

- f. Death of child
- (1) Mental stability of child's mother seriously affected.
 - (2) Death of only child.
-

- g. Dangerously ill or dying brother or sister.
- The dangerously ill brother or sister has no parents, is unmarried and has no sisters or brothers, other than the individual serving overseas.
-

- h. Domestic hardships
- (1) Serious criminal charge against wife.
 - (2) Wife has become morally unstable and/or neglects children.
-

2. It is stressed that the above schedule is a guide only and each case must be investigated and Military Board approval granted before the member can be given emergency leave with free travel.

3. In certain cases, where Military Board approval has NOT been given, Comd Aust Army Force FARELF may, if the member so desires, permit him to proceed on leave to AUSTRALIA at his own expense. In this case, emergency leave plus ARL at credit may be granted.

4. No provision has been made for emergency leave to UK with free travel to be granted. Application should only be made for permission for the member concerned to travel to UK at his own expense in accordance with MBI 128-1 (Prov).


