COMMANDERS DIARIES
INSTRUCTIONS

AIM

1. The aim of a Commanders Diary is to provide data on which to base future improvements in Army training, equipment, organisation and administration, and to furnish historians with a record of the activities of units and formations in operational and non-operational periods in peace and in war.

GENERAL

2. *Entries will be made daily* on AF C2118, each entry being initialled by the officer detailed to keep it.
3. Commanders Diaries will conform with the rules for drafting orders given in "Staff Duties in the Field", Chapter 2, Section 7.

RESPONSIBILITY

During Non-operational Periods

4. A Commanders Diary will be made by commanders of all formations.

During Operational Periods (see note 1)

5. A Commanders Diary will be made in duplicate by:—
- (a) Commanders of all formations.
 - (b) Each branch of the staff at formation headquarters commanded by a Brigadier or above.
 - (c) Heads of services not below the rank of Lieutenant Colonel.
 - (d) Personal staffs and officers holding special appointments.
 - (e) Unit commanders.
 - (f) Commanders of a detachment of a unit when so ordered.

COMPILATION

6. Both original and duplicate copies will consist of:—
- (a) Cover (AF C2119).
 - (b) Index as printed on cover.
 - (c) Narrative (AF C2118).
 - (d) Annexes as shown in the Index.
7. All details of the unit or formation (if a detachment is concerned, the name of the parent unit), period covered and enclosure numbers of the annexes will be shown on the cover. If there has been a change of command since the last report, the date of assumption by the new commanding officer will be included.
8. The annexes will be assembled in the groups shown on the cover. If there are no enclosures for an Annex NIL will be entered on the cover. If additional annexes are convenient for a particular headquarters, the relevant papers should be grouped as annexes starting at B.
9. Documents concerned with future planning for operations will form Annex "Z", "TOP SECRET Supplementary Diaries" forming the document. It will be prepared and disposed of as

NOTES

1. *Definition of Operational Period.*—The term "operational period" shall mean:—
- (a) the period between a declaration of war and the end of hostilities;
 - (b) any period spent in a theatre of operations;
 - (c) any period when engaged in any form of military operations of potential importance.
2. The Ministry of Defence or headquarters concerned where the conditions of the unit's employment make it necessary to officers, men and equipment. Notwithstanding the above, or the time submitting these reports will start compilation of equipment captured.

12. The narrative will supplement and connect the annexes but need not give a precis of them.

DISPOSAL

During Non-Operational Periods

13. *Formation Headquarters* will forward the original Commanders Diary annually as at 31st December to reach the Army Records Centre (through Headquarters Field Records where applicable) as soon as possible after 1st January of the following year. The duplicate will be retained in formation headquarters.

14. *Units* will NOT render a Commanders Diary.

During Operational Periods

15. ORIGINAL COMMANDERS DIARIES

- (a) *Formations and units in the UK* will forward diaries monthly by the seventh day of the succeeding month direct to the Ministry of Defence (ARC for reports other than medical, AMD 1 for medical reports).
- (b) *Formations and units overseas* will forward diaries monthly by the seventh day of the succeeding month to the OIC Field Records for onward transmission to the Ministry of Defence.

16. **DUPLICATE COMMANDERS DIARIES.** These will be clearly marked as duplicates and will NOT be sent with the originals. They will be forwarded within two months as follows:—

- (a) *Units in the UK*
To the OIC parent record office.
- (b) *Formation Headquarters in the UK*
To OIC Central Clearing Wing, Infantry Records, Exeter.
- (c) *Units Overseas*
To the OIC Field Records for onward transmission to parent record office.
- (d) *Formation Headquarters Overseas*
To the OIC Field Records for onward transmission to the OIC Central Clearing Wing, Infantry Records, Exeter.

SECURITY

17. Documents concerned with future operational planning will be listed on AF C2118 and placed in a separate AF C2119. All details will be filled in and the cover will be clearly marked in red:—ANNEX Z—OFFICERS ONLY. It may be convenient to group the papers by annexes.

18. Supplementary diaries will be forwarded in accordance with the normal rules for TOP SECRET correspondence to the Ministry of Defence (ARC). The inner envelope will be clearly marked:—

19. The duplicate supplementary diaries will be despatched as in paragraph 16 as soon as receipt of the originals has been acknowledged.

NOTES

1. *Definition of Operational Period.*—The term “operational period” for the purpose of this instruction, means:—
 - (a) the period between a declaration of war and the official end of hostilities;
 - (b) any period spent in a theatre of operations;
 - (c) any period when engaged in any form of military operation.
2. The Ministry of Defence or headquarters concerned will be responsible for instructing units to submit Commanders' Diaries where the conditions of the unit's employment make this necessary. Wherever possible the beginning and end of the period will be clearly stated. Notwithstanding the above, on the outbreak of global war all units and formations which are not at the time submitting these reports will start compiling them with effect from M day and will thereafter render them in accordance with paragraphs 15 and 16.

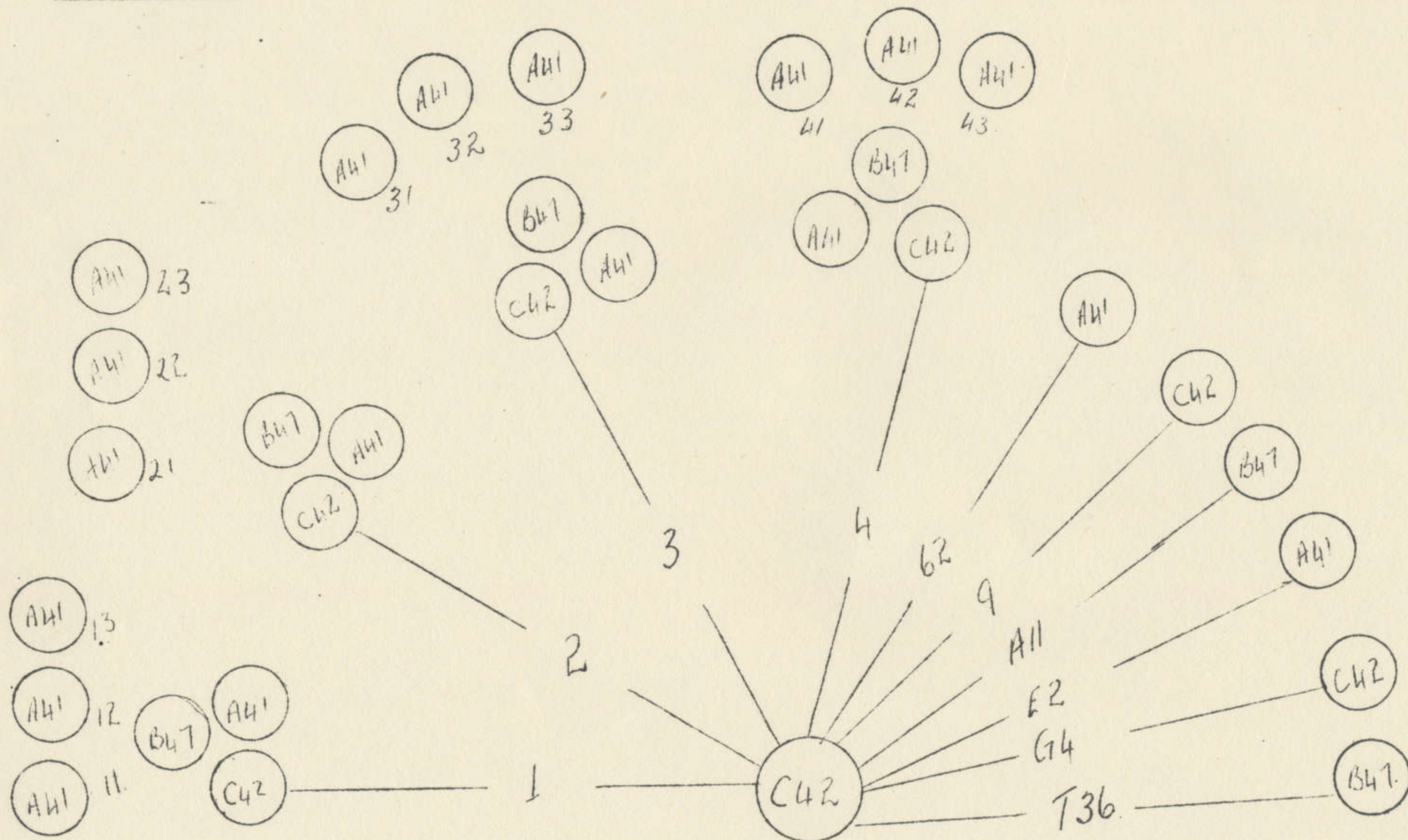

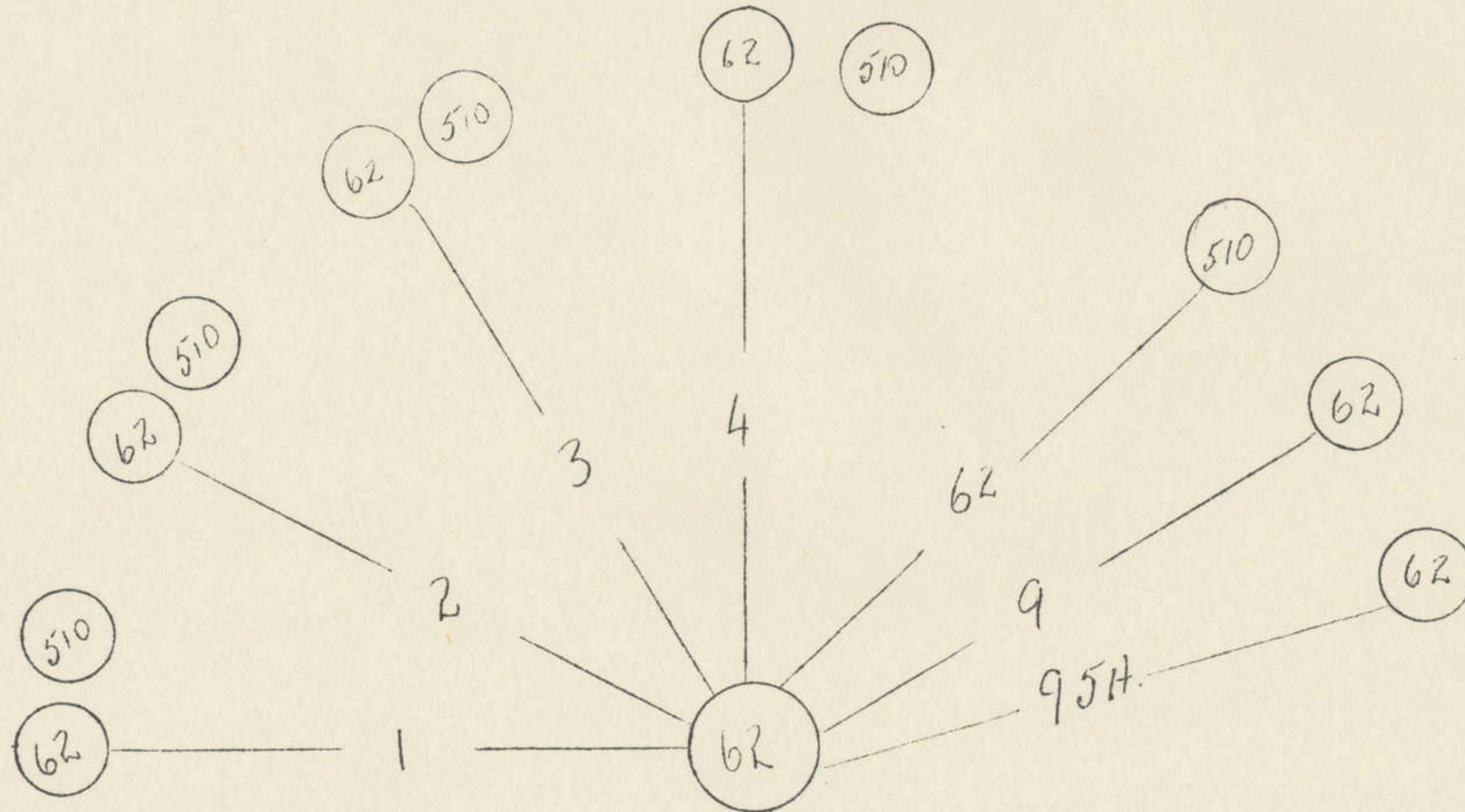



EN TACTICS

Use of 50 mm Mortar Bombs

1. The enemy are now using 50 mm mortar bombs as booby traps/mines. One such device has been found in the 2 GREENJACKETS area. It was rigged to wires but no further details of the method of firing are known yet. When these details are known they will be forwarded.

Mining/Booby Trapping

2. Reports that the enemy are mining and booby trapping their own camp areas, and tracks made by SF have been received.

Attacks - BT KNUCKLE

3. A report that the en is likely to attack either BT KNUCKLE or TRINGGUS during the month of Jun has been received. The en is also said to be probing forward, consolidating and carrying out recce in the BT KNUCKLE area, prior to carrying out the assault.

Mor Fire

4. Enemy mortar HF is said to be used on areas in which SF could be working or have worked. Later it is intended that mortar HF will be directed on SARAWAK side of BORDER on directions of higher HQs.

Conclusions etc

- 5.
- The above information cannot be ignored and Coy Comds are to take positive steps to ensure that this info is known to all troops.
 - Any enemy eqpt found during recce should be treated as though it were booby trapped.
 - Tracks must still be regarded as unsafe even if cleared previously.

BABANG AREA

Changeover of troops (C2)

1. The TNI in the BABANG area are reported to be conducting a changeover of troops in early June. The new troops will also be DIPONEGORO but are said to be aggressive and will probably make attacks. This information is also reported from two other less reliable sources.

2. There is a new officer in BABANG called S. P. RAWOTO. He is reported to be a live wire and has instituted a patrolling programme, usually at night. The source believes that the patrols go to BERUBAY and onto the Gumong JAGOI ridge. This report is graded F3.

Mortar Activity C3

3. The great increase in mortar activity recently is intended purely as a deterrent to our own forces. Our old acquaintance Sgt PA' UTONG has told the kampong people that the TNI are awaiting orders to mortar into SARAWAK. In addition, ambushes are being laid close to where SF footprints have been seen in border areas.

Disaffection in the village (F3)

4. The TNI have been upsetting the people lately by forcing them to do work for the army. The people have been forced to clear around the village, porter goods, and build bridges. In addition the people may be required to complete the road from SANGGAU so that it reaches to BABANG.

KORUH (B3)

5. Ten bashas have been built between KORUH GR 928468 and Sg SKEBANG GR 957456. They are spaced at least 300 yards apart and are not visible from the M1. At each hut there are said to be 2 x No 8 Mortars and 4 x No 5 Mortars. The source did not know the strength of the enemy but a sub source put the figure at about 600.

BOON KUI's house (B3)

6. There are three mortars near BOON KUI's house GR 946461. Two are reported to be No 8 mortars while the third (which has the letters STB stamped into the metal) is larger.

COMMENTS

The changeover of troops may well be the forerunner to a step up in military activity on the BAU front. The people of BABANG are becoming

SECRET

increasingly disenchanted with the Javanese troops and are talking of abandoning the kampong and moving back to Kpg Sg TAKI which they now use sometimes at night instead of going back to BABANG after working in the padi fields. Already KAIK and KINDAU have been abandoned by the people, the KAIK people having come across to STASS and the KINDAU people having moved out onto their farms. The number of troops reported around KORUH is thought to be no more than one company with two 81 mm mortars. The information of the mortars near BOON KUI's house is thought to be correct. It is not known with any certainty how many troops are in that area.

RESUPPLY SYSTEM TO KINDAU AND KAIK (F2)

7. Rations from **SILUAS** are taken about four times a month in six or seven boats along the Sg KOEMBA, up the Sg SEPARAN to KUALA BABANG (GR 8854) which is at the junction of the Sg SEPARAN and Sg BABANG. The rations are then stored under a house on the WEST bank of the river while the escorting soldiers go off to KAIK and KINDAU to collect porters. The boats return downstream and the rations are left unguarded. The soldiers spend the night in the camps near KAIK and KINDAU.

The following morning the soldiers and porters come to KUALA BABANG between 0800 - 0900 and take all the rations to KINDAU. The rations for KAIK are taken there from KINDAU by the soldiers themselves along the KAIK - KINDAU track; soldiers who escort or carry rations are armed with either .45 pistols or SMG's.

COMMENT

This information is considered to be true and it is known that the river supply system is used. Unfortunately, local people are not allowed into the TNI camps at KAIK or KINDAU so we have little information about them.

FURTHER REPORTS OF MINES

8. Four separate reports received recently mention the Indonesian use of mines. One report (B3) states that the mines laid near STASS were planted by Chinese volunteers from CHINA, and that more mines are expected to be laid on the JAGOI. The second report (F3) says that TNI will come from SINGKAWAN in June to start placing AP mines on the JAGOI and BRUNEI ridges. The third report (B3) says that mines have already been laid on the BRUNEI ridge about $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles on the KALIMANTAN side of the border as a TNI defensive measure. The fourth report comes from the SIDING area. The sub - source said that the TNI from H BTP were trying to build up a pattern of Security Force patrolling activity from KNUCKLE and TRINGGUS before laying booby traps. The booby traps are held at present by the TNI but will be laid by specialists from JAKARTA.

COMMENT

The successes which the TNI have had so far with mines have had the anticipated effect, and we can expect to find more of them in border areas. It is impossible to gauge the accuracy of this report that Chinese laid the STASS mines. The report of mines on the BRUNEI ridge comes from a particularly reliable source and confirms a previous report from another source.

INFORMATION FROM REAR AREAS (B3)

9. At RISAU there are said now to be three guns similar to a 105 mm. There are 1000 troops who patrol the slopes of the BRUNEI ridge for two or three days at a time.

10. A Brigadier has been in SILUAS since 16 May 65. He is known as STAP ANGKATAN PERANG which presumably refers to his appointment. There is also reported to be a battalion at SILUAS.

COMMENT

There have been persistent reports of at least one 105 mm gun at RISAU over the last two months although the gun pit at BABANG is still empty. The report of 1000 troops is thought to be considerably exaggerated. The report of the battalion at SILUAS if true, could be connected with the changeover of troops in the forward areas.

SIDING AREA (C6)

11. The TNI in the SIDING area are said to be about to become more aggressive. They will undertake longer patrols and are going to recce new routes to the SF bases at TRINGGUS and KNUCKLE. When the attacks are eventually made, they will be in strength. Villagers from SIDING will act as guides. These will probably be the OPR who are known to be pro - TNI.

12. Strength in the SIDING area is given as 700 and patrols are said to go towards GUMBANG and to the WEST of Sg SOEKAN.


13. Strength in the BOMBONG area is now negligible although there is a major there. Troop concentrations appear to be in SIDING and G. BABOENG as previously reported.

COMMENT This would suggest that the Bn HQ has now moved up to SIDING and that BOMBONG is now only an echelon area. This would tie in with other reports that the enemy in H BTP are closing up on the border.

VOLUNTEER TROOPS (F6)

14. A report from SEBODJIT traders says that a force of black skinned troops described as 'SUKARELAWAN' passed through the kampong recently on their way to PADANG SIDING. The troops were described as being much taller than Javanese. Their leader who was over six feet in height and full bearded was said to be named Capt NEDKELL. He told the villagers that his group was the first of a number of similar volunteer forces from AFRO ASIAN nations which would aid INDONESIA in its struggle against neo-colonialism and the MALAYSIA project. He went on to say that they had been especially encouraged by the recent success of the West Indies cricketers against the Australians.

COMMENT Following as it does a previous report of WEST IRIAN volunteers in the area of KAPOET, this report may indicate a new phase in confrontation.

Results of STASS Ambush

1. A number of low grade reports have been received following the successful ambush of a large Indonesian incursion party on the border near STASS on 15 Jun 65:-

- a. F3. The troops involved in the clash had just arrived at KINDAU and were doing their first patrol in this area.
- b. F6. The TNI had intended to attack Kpg STASS rather than the patrol base which they felt to be too strong for them. The survivors of the clash thought that the STASS locals were also in the ambush assisting SF because they saw what they took to be the marks of shotgun pellets in the trees. They said they will attack the Kampong again sometime. The TNI had three local guides:-

NYONAW from BABANG
TALOY from BABANG
DOLEM from KINDAU (possibly Tua Kampong)

Comment

One of the sources commented that the TNI were unwilling to discuss the clash. The 'shotgun pellets' are probably Claymore pellets which, besides killing three of the enemy, would have left their mark on the trees.

Patrolling in KAIK-KINDAU Area

2.
 - a. B3. Since the clash on 15 Jun 65, patrols from KAIK are ambushing border tracks, while patrols from KINDAU and BABANG are ambushing the tracks leading to their areas.
 - b. B3. Mines are being laid on border crossing points.
 - c. C3. STASS will be attacked by a force of 150 TNI at the end of Jun 65. Reinforcements started arriving at KAIK-KINDAU from 16 Jun 65.

Comment

TNI in this area can be expected to be far more alert than before when they showed carelessness in allowing such a large party to be ambushed in a border area. The talk of an attack on STASS sounds like an attempt to reassure themselves, but should not be discounted altogether, as the TNI ought to be looking for revenge.

Sg SEPARAN Area (Near KAIK)

3. a. F3. Three new TNI posts have been established along the SOUTH bank of the Sg SEPARAN. Each is believed to have a strength of about 50 men. Locs are as fols:-
- (1) KUALA SEPARAN GR787519
 - (2) Sg SEMAYANG unlocated
 - (3) KUALA BABANG GR 8854
- b. C3. Local people from BABANG and KINDAU have been employed to clear the banks of the Sg KOEMBA, Sg SEPARAN and Sg BABANG, and also to clear obstructions from the rivers themselves.
- c. C3. A recent report says that the Sg SEPARAN has now been cleared of obstructions from KAIK to the junction with the Sg KOEMBA.
- d. B3. On 22 Jun 65, fresh DIPONEGORO troops were sent from SAMBAS and deployed along the banks of the Sg SEPARAN between KUALA SEPARAN and KUALA BABANG. They are said to number 1300 men and have with them 30 large mortars. Three of the officers are said to be Eurasians.

Comment

These reports indicate that the TNI have deployed troops into the area between J BTP and I BTP, probably one company in three locations under the command of J BTP. Their locations would indicate TNI dependence on a river supply system. They are well located for incursions into SARAWAK using the G. RAYA approach route. Strengths in para 3 d. above are obviously exaggerated, but the rest of the report could be true.

BABANG Area

4. a. F3. On 15 Jun 65 there was a changeover of troops in the BABANG area. The new troops are also KODAM 7.
- b. B3. On 16 Jun 65 the troops were relieved by other DIPONEGORO troops. The new troops are thought to be still from 449 Bn. There is telephone communication between BABANG, KINDAU, and KAIK, and wireless to SILUAS.
- c. C2. The new troops at BABANG have told the locals to tell the SERIKIN people that the TNI have come to fight the SF, not to harm civilians. They were not trying to shell SERIKIN, but would retaliate by shelling SERIKIN if BABANG were ever hit.
- d. F3. There are only 8 TNI in BABANG itself but many more in the jungle.

Comment

These four reports are believed to be substantially correct.

- a. F3. There are 2 x No 8 mortars close to BABANG.
 - b. B3. On G. TEPOI there are 2 x No 8 mors and 1 x STB mortar.
 - c. B3. There are 4 x No 8 mors in the KORUH pepper garden.
 - d. B3. There is 1 x No 12 Mor in the mor pit in BABANG.
 - e. F3. The 2 x 12.7 HAAMG's on G. TEPOI were removed on 15 Jun 65 and replaced by two larger AA guns the barrels of which are very long and about 3" diameter. They are said to be more powerful than the 12.7's.
 - f. F3. On G. TEPOI there is an AA gun. Size not known.
 - g. B3. The 12.7 HAAMG from G. TEPOI was moved to NYONDAU'S pepper garden at KORUH on 22 Jun 65. Only mortars are left on G. TEPOI.

Comment

A possible actual location list is as fols:-

2 x No 8 mors on the reverse slope of G. TEPOI

2 x No 8 mors in the KORUH pepper garden (one of which fires from a confirmed mor bunker, the other possibly firing from a number of baseplate posns along the M1)

2 x AA wpns on G. TEPOI (possibly 20mm Bofors if the reports of the removal of the 12.7's are true,

1 x 12.7 HAAMG in the KORUH pepper garden.

Trading Restrictions

6. F3. The new troops in BABANG have announced a rule that they will permit only 10 people from each village to cross the border on trading days.

Comment

The locals have taken an independent line and have actually increased the numbers coming to the trading. On 25 Jun 65, 148 people came over the border to the trading.

SIDING Area

- 6.
- a. C3. The TNI have now commenced ambushing along the Sg KOEMBA. Patrols go out for six nights spending two nights in each of three ambush positions. Strengths not known.
 - b. B2. The TNI have begun construction of 3 camps in the Sg SENOYANG area GR 9639, and 3 more in the Sg BATIR area (unlocated). These rivers are tributaries of the Sg KOEMBA and rise on the NORTH side. There are other camps on the Sg KOEMBA as far upstream as SIDING but locations are not known. Work started on the Sg SENOYANG camps on 2 Jun 65.

- c. F3. Troops from PADANG were moved up to SIDING about 16 Jun 65 and there were no TNI left on 23 Jun 65.
- d. F3. About 15 Jun 65 all the TNI at G. BABOENG moved to SIDING after receiving orders from BOMBONG.


The reports of camps along the NORTH bank of the Sg KOEMBA have not yet been confirmed, but there is no doubt that construction has been going on along the KOEMBA between SIDING and PANGONG. It is impossible to judge yet the accuracy of the reports of troops leaving PADANG and G. BABOENG. If true, it is likely that the moves would only be temporary, unless these are the troops to occupy the new camps along the Sg KOEMBA.

SILUAS Area

- 7. a. F3. (1) On 21 Jun 65 the source saw the Bn Comd of J BTP, a major, in SILUAS. The troops in SILUAS wear badges of rank but no other means of identification on their OG uniforms. He saw 4 jeeps there as well.
- (2) Also in SILUAS he saw two guns with barrels 2 fathoms long, approx 4" diameter, with no shield. When in position they are mounted on a tripod. There are said to be three more at RISAU and they are known as S.T.B.

Comment

S.T.B. simply means 'supporting weapon', so that is little help in identification. The weapons may be AA.





297 CIVILIAN IDENTITY CARDS - FEDERATION OF MALAYA AND SINGAPORE

1. It is clear that the regulations concerning the requirement for all visitors to the Federation of Malaya and Singapore to be in possession of civilian identity cards are not well known by units and individuals.
2. To assist sub-units and individuals, these regulations are reproduced below:
 - a. All visitors to the Federation of MALAYA and SINGAPORE for a period of more than one year, require a civilian identity card issued by the Registration Department of both territories. This requirement includes children 12 yrs of age and over. Members of the Commonwealth Armed Forces do not require Identity Cards in respect of themselves, but they are required for all families and dependants.
 - b. Civ Identity Cards will be obtained within 30 days of arrival in the Federation of MALAYA or SINGAPORE. Identity Cards will also be obtained for a child within 30 days of reaching its 12th birthday.
 - c. Failure to comply with the Immigration Laws may result in a civil prosecution.
 - d. Civilian Identity Cards will be surrendered to the Issuing Office within 30 days of the departure of the family from the Federation of MALAYA or SINGAPORE.
3. Sub-units will ensure that all new arrivals are warned of their responsibilities in obtaining a Civilian Identity Card. The cost of these Identity Cards will be borne by the member concerned.

138. DISCIPLINE - SMUGGLING GOODS IN MILITARY VEHICLES

1. A British soldier was recently tried by a civil court on a charge of smuggling goods in a military vehicle across the JOHORE-BAHRU Causeway and the vehicle was ordered to be forfeited. Authority for the return of this vehicle was obtained only after prolonged negotiation, as the law holds the owners of the vehicle responsible for the conduct of their drivers.
2. Both the Army and the Civil Authorities take a most serious view of this offence. Army vehicles have in the past been subject to the minimum of inconvenience at customs stations. The Civil Authorities have intimated that these privileges may be discontinued if military vehicles are again found being used for smuggling.
3. Severe disciplinary action will be taken against military personnel who are involved in misusing military vehicles for the purpose of smuggling.

1. Families are reminded that the smallpox vaccination and the cholera inoculation are ESSENTIAL for international travel. These are required as follows:-

<u>Inoculation</u>	<u>Age</u>	<u>No & Type</u>	<u>Interval Between Doses</u>
Cholera	6 months	As programmed	A weekly intervals (Booster then required every six months after initial course completed)
Smallpox	One yr	As programmed	After primary close Booster every 3 years.

Non Essential Inoculations

2. The following inoculations for Cholera may be carried out after consultation with a doctor at the FMC. The usual course is :-

Polio	3 months	3 Oral Doses	one per month
Triple Antigen: Diphtheria Whooping Cough Tetanus	3 months	3 Injections	one per month

3. It is stressed that families should keep their inoculations and vaccinations current. This can be done through any FMC. IHCs should be up-to-date by 1 Aug 65 so that after this date all entries should be correct when called for during Aug 65 for final checking by the unit Medical Officer.

Prevention of Suffocation - Infants

4. There is a danger that when a very young infant is given a pillow in its cot, it may turn over and, by burying its face in the pillow, die from suffocation.

5. It is strongly recommended that no child should be given a pillow, cushion or similar item on which to sleep until it has reached the age of at least one year.
