COMMANDERS DIARIES
INSTRUCTIONS

AIM

1. The aim of a Commanders Diary is to provide data on which to base future improvements in Army training, equipment, organisation and administration, and to furnish historians with a record of the activities of units and formations in operational and non-operational periods in peace and in war.

GENERAL

2. Entries will be made daily on AF C2118, each entry being initialled by the officer detailed to keep it.
3. Commanders Diaries will conform with the rules for drafting orders given in "Staff Duties in the Field", Chapter 2, Section 7.

RESPONSIBILITY

During Non-operational Periods

4. A Commanders Diary will be made by commanders of all formations.

During Operational Periods (see note 1)

5. A Commanders Diary will be made in duplicate by:—
- (a) Commanders of all formations.
 - (b) Each branch of the staff at formation headquarters commanded by a Brigadier or above.
 - (c) Heads of services not below the rank of Lieutenant Colonel.
 - (d) Personal staffs and officers holding special appointments.
 - (e) Unit commanders.
 - (f) Commanders of a detachment of a unit when so ordered.

COMPILATION

6. Both original and duplicate copies will consist of:—
- (a) Cover (AF C2119).
 - (b) Index as printed on cover.
 - (c) Narrative (AF C2118).
 - (d) Annexes as shown in the Index.
7. All details of the unit or formation (if a detachment is concerned, the name of the parent unit), period covered and enclosure numbers of the annexes will be shown on the cover. If there has been a change of command since the last report, the date of assumption by the new commanding officer will be included.
8. The annexes will be assembled in the groups shown on the cover. If there are no enclosures for an Annex NIL will be entered on the cover. If additional annexes are convenient for a particular headquarters, the relevant papers should be grouped as annexes starting at B.
9. Documents concerned with future planning for operations will form Annex "Z", "TOP SECRET" of the formation. It will be prepared and disposed of as

NOTES

1. Definition of Operational Period.—The term "operational period" shall mean:—
- (a) the period between a declaration of war and the cessation of hostilities;
 - (b) any period spent in a theatre of operations;
 - (c) any period when engaged in any form of operations of potential importance.
2. The Ministry of Defence or headquarters concerned shall be clearly stated. Notwithstanding the above, the time submitting these reports will start compilation in accordance with paragraphs 15 and 16. casualties to officers, men and equipment. by equipment captured. it was employed in the time not accounted for. The type of

DISPOSAL

During Non-Operational Periods

13. *Formation Headquarters* will forward the original Commanders Diary annually as at 31st December to reach the Army Records Centre (through Headquarters Field Records where applicable) as soon as possible after 1st January of the following year. The duplicate will be retained in formation headquarters.

14. *Units* will NOT render a Commanders Diary.

During Operational Periods

15. ORIGINAL COMMANDERS DIARIES

(a) *Formations and units in the UK* will forward diaries monthly by the seventh day of the succeeding month direct to the Ministry of Defence (ARC for reports other than medical, AMD 1 for medical reports).

(b) *Formations and units overseas* will forward diaries monthly by the seventh day of the succeeding month to the OIC Field Records for onward transmission to the Ministry of Defence.

16. DUPLICATE COMMANDERS DIARIES. These will be clearly marked as duplicates and will NOT be sent with the originals. They will be forwarded within two months as follows:—

(a) *Units in the UK*
To the OIC parent record office.

(b) *Formation Headquarters in the UK*
To OIC Central Clearing Wing, Infantry Records, Exeter.

(c) *Units Overseas*
To the OIC Field Records for onward transmission to parent record office.

(d) *Formation Headquarters Overseas*
To the OIC Field Records for onward transmission to the OIC Central Clearing Wing, Infantry Records, Exeter.

SECURITY

17. Documents concerned with future operational planning will be listed on AF C2118 and placed in a separate AF C2119. All details will be filled in and the cover will be clearly marked in red:—ANNEX Z—OFFICERS ONLY. It may be convenient to group the papers by annexes.

18. Supplementary diaries will be forwarded in accordance with the normal rules for TOP SECRET correspondence to the Ministry of Defence (ARC). The inner envelope will be clearly marked:—

19. The duplicate supplementary diaries will be despatched as in paragraph 16 as soon as receipt of the originals has been acknowledged.

NOTES

1. *Definition of Operational Period.*—The term "operational period" for the purpose of this instruction, means:—

- (a) the period between a declaration of war and the official end of hostilities;
- (b) any period spent in a theatre of operations;
- (c) any period when engaged in any form of military operation.

2. The Ministry of Defence or headquarters concerned will be responsible for instructing units to submit Commanders' Diaries where the conditions of the unit's employment make this necessary. Wherever possible the beginning and end of the period will be clearly stated. Notwithstanding the above, on the outbreak of global war all units and formations which are not at the time submitting these reports will start compiling them with effect from M day and will thereafter render them in accordance with paragraphs 15 and 16.

BORDER SCOUTS

1. The following is the text of a letter from HQ West Brigade on the subject of Communist penetration of the Border Scout organization.


"2. Special Branch have warned that documents seized in SARIKEI District on 6 Jun 65 included a booklet containing directives and a policy decision of the communist organisation's Divisional Committees of First and Third Divisions. It is stated therein, inter alia, that "...We must....make good use of any advantage we may have: for example... we are converting a number of Natives, currently serving the enemy as Border Scouts, who, while drawing pay from the enemy, will serve us as intelligence agents and in whose areas we will, in the future, set up our bases. This matter has been well organised and the enemy is, as yet unaware".

3. This document is undated so that it is not known whether this preceded a retrenchment of Border Scouts and the elimination of some undesirable characters or not.

4. Border Scouts are obviously important targets for the communist organisation to subvert in their programme of racial work because of their training, access to weapons, relations to other components of the Security Forces and the areas in which they operate. Several communist publications and documents have been sighted which allude to "the armed struggle beginning in the jungles in the border areas".

5. It is possible that the assertions in paragraph 2 have been exaggerated for propaganda purposes. However you are advised to keep watch on possible communist subversion of Border Scouts and if detected take appropriate counter action."

2. There is no evidence to suggest that the Communists have penetrated the Border Scout organization in the BAU District yet, but I want Company Commanders to be alert to the possibility, and to report to Battalion Headquarters any suspicions they might have.

Attacks on Bases

1. Further reports have been received of projected attacks on 3 RAR bases.
 - a. F6. Simultaneous attacks will be made on STASS and KNUCKIE in July with 200 tps to attack each base. They hope that arty will concentrate on one area, leaving the other free.
 - b. F6. A meeting was held at SILUAS on 9 Jun 65 at which a proposed attack on KNUCKIE was discussed. The attack is scheduled for the full moon period in July. Among those attending were Panglima DAGANG, AH KUAN, AH LUN, and AWAT. They were to return for a further meeting on 1 Jul 65. The attack would be made from SIDING and both TNI and TNKU will take part.
 - c. B3. A TNI officer with three stars on his collar (Captain) held a conference on 21 Jun in which he outlined plans for attacks on SF bases during the full moon period of July. At least 250 troops from SIDING will attack KNUCKIE and 250 troops from SILUAS will attack STASS. Both TNI and TNKU will be used.

COMMENT

Reports are received without fail each month that the bases will be attacked during the full moon period.

The B3 source is convinced that his information is accurate. This report coupled with the fact that the TNI have suspended trading at SERIKIN until 25 Jul, presumably to prevent leakage of information, lead to the conclusion that attacks on the bases may well be attempted, probably during the full moon period around 13 Jul.

(2) Owing to sickness and casualties, the strength in the KINDAU/KAIK area was reduced and KAIK has now been abandoned. The TNI live in KINDAU with only a bamboo fence for defence. They steal food from the surrounding farms and are disliked by the local people.

(3) The platoon at BABANG lives in the village and sends 25 men down to KORUH each day. The sergeant who checks traders and makes a levy of goods brought back is Sgt AMIT.

(4) There are field telephones at each camp, but the only radio is in SILUAS.

COMMENT

The mention in one report of elements of 458 Bn is interesting and could be true. The dispositions mentioned agree in general with previous reports. The support weapons in BABANG - KINDAU area appear to be underestimated. It seems unlikely that KAIK has been abandoned.

Report of Mines

3. F2. The source and other villagers from STASS were warned not to go near the border opposite Kpg STASS because the TNI had laid at least two boxes of the mines along the border.

COMMENT

The information is probably true and indicates that at least eight mines are still unlocated on tracks close to the border. (There are six mines to a box of the US M2A3 type).

POERI/SENTIMOE Area

4. C6. SUIP bin SAMI and 100 TNKU were recently sent from SAMBAS to POERI and thence to ULU SENTIMOE. They intend attacking SELAMPIT in the LUNDU district.

H Bn Area

5. a. C2. In mid-June the TNI from SEBUDJIT and G. BABOENG were moved to the SIDING area. There are no TNI left at either of those places. At BOMBONG there were only 2 TNI on 26 Jun 65.

b. C2.

(1) On 15 Jun the troops from G. BABOENG (200 TNI) and SEBUDJIT (12 TNI) were moved to the SIDING area.

- (2) New camps have been established along the Sg KOEMBA between SIDING and SILUAS. All troops and supplies use the Sg KOEMBA supply route to SIDING, and the land route through BOMBONG has been abandoned. The supplies come to SILUAS by road from SANGGAU.
- (3) In BOMBONG there are now only two TNI, both military police. They live in DAGANG's house and question the villagers. They have not been seen to leave BOMBONG.
- (4) Troops from SIDING area patrol along the SIDING-KAPOET track and towards the border near GUMBANG. They have also patrolled to TUPA (an abandoned pelaman in SARAWAK GR 90510435). All patrols are at least 40 strong and probably stay out overnight.
- (5) The river banks are patrolled each day.

e. F2.

- (1) About one month ago the TNI from G. BABOENG (100 men) together with the TNI from SEBODJIT moved to SIDING. The OC was 2lt TOYO.
- (2) There were recent patrols from G. BABOENG to KAPOET. Strengths were 20 - 30 men moving along the Sg KOEMBA banks bunched together and with rifles slung.
- (3) At BOMBONG on 1 Jul he saw no soldiers.

d. C2.

- (1) All the troops from the camps at G. BABOENG and SEBUDJIT have moved to SIDING. From an OP on G. BABOENG, TNI could see SF movements.
- (2) Early in Jun/a Captain came from SIDING to BOMBONG to meet Panglima DAGANG. He told the source that there were 1400 troops in SIDING.

e. C4. A meeting was held in BOMBONG to discuss the issue of weapons to the OPR. Source states that on 9 Jun 65, OPR in BOMBONG were issued with GARRAND's and SMG's.

f. C3. On 18 Jun 65 AH KUAN, AH LUN, AWAT and 10 OPR from SIDING partolled from SIDING to the junction of the PADANG trade thence to PADANG and along the river bank to KAPOET. They returned to BOMBONG on 22 Jun 65. The purpose of the patrol is uncertain.

g. C3.

- (1) On 28 Jun 130 TNI left SILUAS to go upstream by boat. They had four boxes of grenades with them and said that they were going to BOMBONG.
- (2) Between SILUAS and SIDING, approximately half a mile from the SOUTH bank of the Sg KOEMBA there are said to be three camps each accomodating a platoon.

COMMENT

Most of these reports are believed to be substantially true. It is therefore probable that the TNI of H Bn are concentrated along the Sg KOEMBA mostly in the SIDING area with a series of staging posts between SIDING and SILUAS. They probably do regular patrols of the river banks in platoon strength. It is thought unlikely that the OPR have been armed.

1. This instruction details the action required to effect the following aspects of the move:-

- a. Mov of unit stores and vehs;
- b. Closing of Q accounts;
- c. Termination of local contracts/agreements;
- d. Postal
- e. Closing of NAAFI accounts; and
- f. A brief outline of action required on arrival at TERENDAK.

Mov of Unit Stores and Vehs

2. All unit stores other than items on individual issue and steel helmets are to be shipped on the LST. An exception to the above will be certain radio eqpt, e.g. A41 Sets, which will mov with the operators. Precise details concerning the mov of radio eqpt are to be issued by the Sig Offr.

3. Steel Helmets. Where these items are on issue to sub units, for the purpose of the mov only, they will be issued to individuals. Instructions for the disposal of the helmets are to be issued on return to TERENDAK.

4. Return of Unit Stores from Fwd Locs. The tasking of unit stores back to coy echelons is to commence as early as practicable, and must be completed by 25 Jul.

5. Checking, Cleaning and Packing of Stores. Sub units are to check and clean stores before packing. CQMSs are to keep a record of all stores as they are packed. Stores, boxes etc are to be clearly marked with sub unit and unit designation.

6. Hazardous Cargo. Attention is drawn to 3 RAR SOP Sec 5.

- a. Wet Batteries are to be packed as for an air mov;
- b. Petrol Cookers and Jerry Cans. All cookers and jerry cans are to be drained over a period of not less than 72 hrs before packing. Sub units consigning these items are to submit a Certificate of Safety (as per Annex A attached) to the QM by 26 Jul; and

c. General. Sub units are to advise the QM by 19 Jul the type and quantity of any hazardous cargo to be shipped.

7. Loading of Vehs. Normal sub unit transport will be available. Bids for additional space (in terms of 3 ton truck loads) are to be made to the Tpt Offr by 22 Jul. Loading of vehs is to commence at 0800 hrs 26 Jul.

8. Mov of unit Vehs. Firm timings for the mov to KUCHING are yet to be advised and will be consequent upon loading instructions for the LST. LST loading is expected to be either 27 or 28 Jul. A Movement Table will be issued giving full details.

9. Applications for Space. The Tpt Offr is to advise the QM by 20 Jul the number of vehs to be shipped. The QM will submit applications to West Bde by 21 Jul.

10. Kitbags. Kit bags are to be flown from KUCHING airport to HMS ALBION. Details will be promulgated in the Movement Table to be issued.

Closing of Q Accounts

11. Sub Units on Air Supply. The final date for delivery of rats and stores for 3 RAR is 23 Jul. Logreqs placed for succeeding airdrops will be for relieving unit requirements only. Sub accounts are to plan this resupply to allow for the following:-

- a. B COY - Last meal in loc - Evening meal 27 Jul;
- b. C COY - Last meal in loc - Breakfast on 28 Jul;
- c. D COY - Last meal in loc - Breakfast on 28 Jul.

12. Unit Ration Account. This account will close on 28 Jul. The final date for drawing of rats is 26 Jul. Meals required on 28 Jul are breakfast and lunch for all pers at CAMBRAI, BAU and KROKONG. Cut lunches are to be prepared on nt 27 Jul.

13. QM Stores. Final issues of clo, tech stores and expense stores will be on 20 Jul.

14. Workshop Repairs. Unit stores will not be accepted for repair after 14 Jul. Station stores will continue to be repaired as required. Stores in Wksps are to be collected on 20 Jul.

15. POL Accounts. Accounts are to close on 26 Jul. POL issues after 1700 hrs will be made by relieving unit. The monthly Fuel expenditures return is to be submitted to QM by 1800 hrs 26 Jul.

Termination of Local Contracts/Agreements and Fuel Charges

16. Dhobi Agreement. Dhobi is not to be submitted to the contractor after 24 Jul and all items are to be cleared from the contractor by 1200 hrs 26 Jul. Dhobi returns are to be submitted to the QM by 1800 hrs 26 Jul.

17. Conservancy. Bills covering the full month are to be paid by 20 Jul.

18. Refrigeration. All Bills are to be paid by 20 Jul for full period of month. Agreements are to be either cancelled or transferred to the relieving unit.

19. Gas. Bills for cooking gas will be paid by 20 Jul. Bottles will be transferred to relieving unit. Sufficient gas is to be on hand at 20 Jul to cover requirements up to 31 Jul.

20. Water. The monthly bill for KROKONG is to be paid by 20 Jul. The QM will arrange for a reading of the meter at BAU on 27 Jul.

21. Electricity. Meters for BAU and CAMBRAI are to be read on 27 Jul.

POSTAL

22. 3 RAR Post Office at CAMBRAI will close on nt of 25 Jul. It is expected that the relieving unit will maintain normal services as from 25 Jul.

NAAFI

23. All NAAFI accounts are to be settled before the unit departs from SARAWAK. Firm details of the closing of the JRC are to be advised separately.

Action required on Return to TERENDAK

24. Detailed orders are to be issued concerning unit activities at TERENDAK, however the following should be noted as priority tasks:-

- a. 100% check of stores by sub accounts;
- b. The inspection, repair and replacement of unsvc and deficient stores;
- c. 100% REME inspection of vehs, t als, instruments and wpns; and
- d. The parkerizing of Small Arms.

25. Sub unit stores checks are to be completed prior to the stand-down period. All other activities mentioned above must be able to proceed uninterrupted during the period of stand-down.



149. DUTY-FREE CONCESSIONS TO THE FORCES IN BORNEO

1. The NAAFI organisation imports beer, wines, spirits and tobacco into BORNEO free of duty. This is a concession given by the State Governments of SABAH, BRUNEI and SARAWAK for the sole benefit of members of the Forces serving in these territories.

2. Any abuse of this privilege is liable to result in the withdrawal of duty-free concessions. All ranks are reminded that duty-free goods:-

- a. Must not be sold or given away to civilians,
- b. May not be consumed in civilian homes, clubs, hotels, etc.

(HQ LF RO 160/65)

150. DISCIPLINE-SMUGGLING GOODS IN MILITARY VEHICLES

1. A British soldier was recently tried by a civil court on a charge of smuggling goods in a military vehicle across the JOHORE BAHRU Causeway and the vehicle was ordered to be forfeited. Authority for the return of this vehicle was obtained only after prolonged negotiation, as the law holds the owners of the vehicle responsible for the conduct of their drivers.

2. Both the Army and the Civil Authorities take a most serious view of this offence. Army vehicles have in the past been subject to the minimum of inconvenience at customs stations. The Civil Authorities have intimated that these privileges may be discontinued, if military vehicles are again found being used for smuggling.

3. Severe disciplinary action will be taken against military personnel who are involved in misusing military vehicles for the purpose of smuggling.

151. MEDICAL AND HYGIENE - PURCHASE OF FOOD AND DRINK.

- 1. Cases of Dysentery are occurring in troops in this area.
- 2. Outside of services supply, food, other than tinned or packaged brand lines will not be eaten in this area. This includes Kampong food.
- 3. Icecream, and other than sealed bottled drinks, will not be purchases for consumption, particularly from travelling hawkers.



RTA INFORMATION BULLETIN NO 1

General

1. Many details concerning the Relief of 3 RAR in FARELF and the unit's subsequent return to AUSTRALIA are still not yet resolved. The purpose of this bulletin is to make available as much information as is known and "releasable" to all members of the unit, so that they can start planning a certain amount of personal administration for their movements.

MOVEMENT INFORMATION

Aircraft timings

2. It is confirmed that all RTA movement will be by QANTAS 707 charter aircraft. 126 seats will be allocated on each flight. There will be two flights each week commencing on 14 Sep 65.

Aircraft loadings

3. a. Baggage allowance on aircraft. At present the detailed weight allocation to individuals has NOT yet been confirmed but the amounts will NOT be less than the following:-
- (1) Persons over 12 years - 66 lbs; and
 - (2) Persons under 12 years - 44 lbs.
- b. Allocation of personnel and dependants to aircraft. As far as possible families will travel together. A provisional allocation of troops and dependants to aircraft flights has already been made, but will be subject to confirmation when the unit's operational commitments during the relief period are fully resolved. Consolidated flight rolls will be promulgated when these details have been confirmed. In principle, not more than 20 complete families, averaging 35 children between 2 and 12 years and 10 infants (0-2 years) will be allocated to any given flight.
- c. Seating entitlement. Each adult and child over 2 years of age as at 31 Oct 65 will be entitled to one seat on the aircraft. Children under two years as at 31 Oct 65 will be entitled to $\frac{1}{2}$ seat.
- d. Bassinettes. A request has been made to have a number of bassinettes available for infants on all flights to AUSTRALIA.

Pregnant wives

4. The movement of such wives will be effected so that they will NOT travel either six weeks before or four weeks after confinement. In general such wives will be able to travel in the relief period, however a small number of wives who anticipate being confined in mid Oct, will be returned to AUSTRALIA prior to the first flight. This plan is subject to approval, and further details will be advised.

Aircraft routes

5. These details are not yet definite, however the probable route from SINGAPORE will be via PERTH to SYDNEY. All aircraft will use the same route. It is possible that the aircraft may also disembark passengers at ADELAIDE. Further details will be published when known.

Leave

6. Leave policy on RTA has not yet been decided and further details will be advised.

PERSONAL EFFECTS

Movement of Effects from MALAYA to AUSTRALIA Insurance

7. a. Married members. It is the responsibility of individual married members to ensure that their personal effects to be transported at Public expense to AUSTRALIA are adequately covered by insurance. Those members who completed an insurance election prior to leaving AUSTRALIA to cover goods transported at public expense to MALAYA, will possibly find that the value of goods to be transported back to AUSTRALIA, will exceed the original insurance election value. In cases such as this, the commonwealth will reimburse members premium paid on insurance to the value of the original election only, and the balance of the premium is to be borne by the individual.

eg. (1) Original insurance election

(a) To goods held storage Aust £1200
(b) To goods transported MALAYA £800
 £2000

(2) Individual has £2500 worth of goods to be returned to AUST premium on £2500 is paid by soldier - submits claim and is reimbursed for £800 insurance policy.

b. Single and married unaccompanied members. Single and married unaccompanied members have an entitlement of £250 of Commonwealth Indemnified insurance on goods to be brought back from MALAYA to AUSTRALIA at public expense. Reimbursement of the amount paid in insurance premium will be as for married members.

Packing

8. a. Single members. Single members have NO entitlement to have their personal effects packed at public expense.

b. Married Members. Married members are entitled to have their personal HOUSEHOLD effects packed at public expense. Motor Vehicles, motor cycles and outboard motors are NOT household effects.

(1) As the packers are estimated to take approximately five weeks to pack the effects of all families returning to AUSTRALIA it is desirable that the uplift of household and personal effects be completed as early as practicable.

(2) Accordingly, companies are to submit to this HQ by 13 Jul 65 a return listing all married officers and soldiers by name and showing their wish to be placed in one of the following categories:-

Category 1 - Those who wish their date of uplift to be anytime in July.

Category 2 - Those who wish their date of uplift to be between 1 - 16 Aug 65.

Category 3 - Those who wish to have their effects uplifted after 16 Aug 65.

- (3) It is anticipated that the transit time from the date of uplift in MALACCA until the effects are delivered to the new posting in AUSTRALIA will be NOT less than 6 to 8 weeks.
- (4) All families must have their effects ready for uplift by 16 Aug 65 unless they have elected to be removed as categories 1 or 2.
- (5) Inventories. These are NOT required for Army use unless a member was married after arrival in the Theatre, but will be needed for insurance purposes. In addition a complete inventory of each box should be kept to facilitate possible later claims on insurance policies in the event of loss or damage. The existing inventories will be returned to wives by 3 RAR Rear Details on demand.
- (6) Further details will be published by MQI (AUST) incorporating details of Shipment through MFO channels and customs etc.

Movement of effects stored in AUSTRALIA

9.
 - a. Single members. Many single members of 3 RAR elected to place items of personal kit in a Comd kit store prior to embarkation. A return of members so involved will be called for in due course so that the necessary procedure to have the effects consigned to the command of new posting may be taken.
 - b. Married Members. AAF H10 is the authority to release goods held in storage in AUSTRALIA and for their removal to the new station. At present only those members who have received posting orders and are located in a Rear Area (i.e. CAMBRAI BAU or KROKONG Camps and 3 RAR Rear Details) may prepare and submit AAF's H10. Those married soldiers currently located with forward companies are to submit their applications for removal at a later date to be advised. Where details of future addresses and dates of movement etc are NOT known, the words "To be advised" should be used in the relevant paragraph. Elections are not to be included on the form. Action has been taken to have accurate insurance figures taken from the forms H10 submitted for movement to MALACCA. These figures will be inserted on the new AAF's H10.

Baggage entitlements

10.
 - a. Single members. 40 cubic feet.
 - b. Married members.
 - (1) 80 cubic feet per adult.
 - (2) 80 cubic ft per child 12 years and over as at 31 Oct 65.
 - (3) 40 cubic ft per child under 12 yrs as at 31 Oct 65.
 - (4) Only in rare cases will approval be given for goods amounting to an excess of baggage volume be moved at public expense.

Electrical appliances.

11. The Commonwealth requires a certificate of serviceability for all electrical equipment to be removed at public expense. Unlike past procedures when this was an individual's responsibility, the Army has arranged a contractor to inspect and certify all electrical appliances before they are packed. Wives should be informed of this policy.

MISCELLANEOUS

March out of quarters

12. To facilitate the march out procedures on the actual vacation of married quarters, MQI have instituted a system of preliminary stocktakes to ensure that all quarters are up to scale and that all issues are serviceable.

Pending Marriages

13. Information has been received that a number of soldiers wish to marry in MALAYA prior to RTA. Not all of those so intending have complied with the correct procedures and approached Bn HQ for documentation and information. If soldiers wishing to marry in the theatre have NOT made their wish known to Bn HQ by 17 Jul 65 they will be liable to move their wife to AUSTRALIA at their own expense. For information of those concerned, the normal documentation procedures for marriage in this theatre to Asian nationals normally takes up to three months to finalise.

Re-engagement


14. Approval has been sought for those members of the unit taking discharge during the relief period (14 Sep - Oct 65) to return to AUSTRALIA prior to the first flights. Further details will be issued.

Supply and Transport and Customs Handbooks

15. It is hoped that the above named publications will be available for distribution on the basis of one per family for married soldiers, and down to section level for single soldiers.

Conclusion

16. Most of the information contained in this bulletin may be assumed to be definite, and accordingly it is requested that it be given the widest publicity to all ranks. It is realised that many points, such as leave and actual movement timings have not yet been clarified, however this information will be released in due course.

157. POSTAL

1. Numerous complaints of delay in the delivery of mail, both to the UK and elsewhere, have been received as the result of local SARAWAK stamps and Post Offices being used. The local authorities tend to treat such items as surface mail. To prevent this occurring all ranks are strongly advised to use stamps of British issue and to use the Forces Postal services at all times. (BRO 161/65)

158. USE OF MOD VEHICLES IN GROUNDS OF KUCHING GENERAL HOSPITAL

1. There is a speed limit of 10 m.p.h. in the hospital grounds.
2. Only $\frac{1}{4}$ ton vehicles are permitted in the hospital grounds, apart from ambulances. All other vehicles will be parked in a suitable place in Rock Road at least fifty yards from the Hospital entrance. (BRO 56/65)

159. INITIAL TREATMENT OF GUNSHOT WOUNDS

1. The initial treatment of the wounded may rest on the Regimental Officer or soldier. A high standard of First Aid Training is therefore required by all ranks.
2. After initial First Aid Treatment, all wounded who are able to swallow will be given two tablets or capsules (250 mgms) of Tetracycline. If there is any delay in evacuation of the casualty to hospital, one tablet or capsule (125 mgms) will be given every six hours.
3. Tetracycline is available in all medical jungle packs.

4. Morphine will be administered only for the relief of pain. All personnel who carry morphine must appreciate the dangers of giving repeated doses of morphine to a shocked patient.

5. The dose and time administered of all treatments must be recorded and if possible attached to the lapel of the casualty.

160. CARRIAGE OF ACID BATTERIES IN RAF AIRCRAFT

1. RAF air safety regulations preclude the carriage of acid batteries by air unless they are either drained or have rubber vent caps fitted to all the vent plugs.

2. A small quantity of EXIDE Autofil vehicle batteries, which have a 'ganged vent plug system', have recently been introduced into the Theatre as part of the normal maintenance resupply. The 'ganged vent plug system' does not permit the fitting of the rubber vent caps designed to avoid acid spillage; therefore this type of battery is not acceptable for transport by RAF aircraft unless drained.

3. Personnel preparing vehicles for movement on RAF aircraft, either on operations or training, are to ensure that the vehicles concerned are not fitted with batteries incorporating the 'ganged vent plug system'.

161. AMMUNITION - IGNITERS SAFETY FUSE PERCUSSION

1. In future, RAOC Ammunition depots in FARELF will only issue Igniters Safety Fuse Percussion in factory sealed containers.

2. Sub-Units will ensure that sealed liners are NOT opened until the igniters are required for use.

3. When a liner has been open for a period exceeding three months, the contents will be sentenced "Unserviceable", and destroyed.

- b. Return to Terendak was discussed on board HMS ALBION on 24 Jun 65 at a conference attended by CO and Adjt 3 RAR.



NOTICE FOR FAMILIES

MISBEHAVIOUR OF CHILDREN ON WD SCHOOL TRANSPORT

1. Recently a child fell from a moving bus, fortunately no serious injuries were sustained. Investigation of this accident revealed that an emergency door had been tampered with by children on the bus. Parents are requested to remind children of the dangers of misbehaving on school buses.

REFRIGERATOR MOTORS

2. On some models refrigerator motors require bolting down before movement.

If families own such a refrigerator it is their responsibility to supply the holding down bolts to the contractor at the time of inspection. (Normally about 4 days before packing).

RETURN TO AUSTRALIA - INSTRUCTION (As issued to members in BORNEO)

General

5. Many details concerning the Relief of 3 RAR in FARELF and the unit's subsequent return to AUSTRALIA are still not yet resolved. The purpose of this instruction is to make available as much information as is known and "releasable" to all members of the unit, so that they can start planning a certain amount of personal administration for their movements.

Movement Information

Aircraft timings

6. It is confirmed that all RTA movement will be by QANTAS 707 charter aircraft. 126 seats will be allocated on each flight. There will be two flights each week commencing on 14 Sep 65.

Aircraft loadings

7. a. Baggage allowance on aircraft. At present the detailed weight allocation to individuals has NOT yet been confirmed but the amounts will NOT be less than the following :-

- (1) Persons over 12 years - 66 lbs; and
- (2) Persons under 12 years - 44 lbs.

- b. Allocation of personnel and dependants to aircraft. As far as possible families will travel together. A provisional allocation of troops and dependants to aircraft flights has already been made, but will be subject to confirmation when the unit's operational commitments during the relief period are fully resolved. Consolidated flight rolls will be promulgated when these details have been confirmed. In principle, not more than 20 complete families, averaging 35 children between 2 and 12 years and 10 infants (0-2 years) will be allocated to any given flight.
- c. Seating entitlement. Each adult and child over 2 years of age as at 31 Oct 65 will be entitled to one seat on the aircraft. Children under two years as at 31 Oct 65 will be entitled to $\frac{1}{2}$ seat.
- d. Bassinettes. A request has been made to have a number of bassinettes available for infants on all flights to AUSTRALIA.

Pregnant wives

8. The movement of such wives will be effected so that they will NOT travel either six weeks before or four weeks after confinement. In general such wives will be able to travel in the relief period, however a small number of wives who anticipate being confined in mid Oct, will be returned to AUSTRALIA prior to the first flight. This plan is subject to approval, and further details will be advised.

Aircraft routes

9. These details are not yet definite, however the probable route from SINGAPORE will be via PERTH to SYDNEY. All aircraft will use the same route. It is possible that the aircraft may also disembark passengers at ADELAIDE. Further details will be published when known.

Leave

10. Leave policy on RTA has not yet been decided and further details will be advised.

PERSONAL EFFECTS

Movement of Effects from MALAYA to AUSTRALIA Insurance

11. a. Married members. It is the responsibility of individual married members to ensure that their personal effects to be transported at Public expense to AUSTRALIA are adequately covered by insurance. Those members who completed an Insurance election prior to leaving AUSTRALIA to cover goods transported at public expense to MALAYA, will possibly find that the value of goods to be transported back to AUSTRALIA, will exceed the original insurance election value. In cases such as this, the commonwealth will reimburse members premium paid on insurance to the value of the original election only, and the balance of the premium is to be borne by the individual.

eg. (1) Original insurance election.

- (a) To goods held storage Aust £1200
 (b) To goods transported MALAYA £800
£2000

- (2) Individual has £2500 worth of goods to be returned to AUST premium on £2500 is paid by soldier - submits claim and is reimbursed for £800 insurance policy.

- b. Single and married unaccompanied members. Single and married unaccompanied members have an entitlement of £250 of Commonwealth Indemnified insurance on goods to be brought back from MALAYA to AUSTRALIA at public expense. Reimbursement of the amount paid in insurance premium will be as for married members.

Packing

12.

- a. Single members. Single members have NO entitlement to have their personal effects packed at public expense.
- b. Married Members. Married members are entitled to have their personal HOUSEHOLD effects packed at public expense. Motor vehicles, motor cycles and outboard motors are NOT household effects.
- (1) As the packers are estimated to take approximately five weeks to pack the effects of all families returning to AUSTRALIA it is desirable that the uplift of household and personal effects be completed as early as practicable.
- (2) Accordingly, companies are to submit to this HQ by 13 Jul 65 a return listing all married officers and soldiers by name and showing their wish to be placed in one of the following categories :-
- Category: 1 - Those who wish their date of uplift to be anytime in July.
- Category 2 - Those who wish their date of uplift to be between 1 - 16 Aug 65.
- Category 3 - Those who wish to have their effects uplifted after 16 Aug 65.
- (3) It is anticipated that the transit time from the date of uplift in MALACCA until the effects are delivered to the new posting in AUSTRALIA will be NOT less than 6 to 8 weeks.
- (4) All families must have their effects ready for uplift by 16 Aug 65 unless they have elected to be removed as categories 1 or 2.
- (5) Inventories. These are NOT required for army use unless a member was married after arrival in the Theatre, but will be needed for insurance purposes. In addition a complete inventory of each box should be kept to facilitate possible later claims on insurance policies in the event of loss or damage. The existing inventories will be returned to wives by 3 RAR Rear Details on demand.
- (6) Further details will be published by MQI (AUST) incorporating details of Shipment through MFO channels and customs etc.

Movement of effects stored in AUSTRALIA

13.

- a. Single members. Many single members of 3 RAR elected to place items of personal kit in a Comd kit store prior to embarkation. A return of members so involved will be called for in due course so that the necessary procedure to have the effects consigned to the command of new posting may be taken.

4.

- b. Married Members. AAF H10 is the authority to release goods held in storage in AUSTRALIA and for their removal to the new station. At present only those members who have received posting orders and are located in a Rear Area (ie. CAMBRAI BAU or KROKONG Camps and 3 RAR Rear Details) may prepare and submit AAFs H10. Those married soldiers currently located with forward companies are to submit their applications for removal at a later date to be advised. Where details of future addresses and dates for movement etc are NOT known, the words "To be advised" should be used in the relevant paragraph. Elections are not to be included on the form. Action has been taken to have accurate insurance figures taken from the forms H10 submitted for movement to MALACCA. These figures will be inserted on the new AAFs H10.

Baggage entitlements

14. a. Single members. 40 cubic feet.
b. Married Members.
(1) 80 cu ft per adult.
(2) 80 cu ft per child 12 yrs and over as at 31 Oct 65.
(3) 40 cu ft per child under 12 yrs as at 31 Oct 65.
(4) Only in rare cases will approval be given for goods amounting to an excess of baggage volume be moved at public expense.

Electrical Appliances

15. The Commonwealth requires a certificate of serviceability for all electrical equipment to be removed at public expense. Unlike past procedures when this was an individual's responsibility, the Army has arranged a contractor to inspect and certify all electrical appliances before they are packed. Wives should be informed of this policy.

March Out of Quarters

MISCELLANEOUS

16. To facilitate the march out procedures on the actual vacation of married quarters, MQI have instituted a system of preliminary stocktakes to ensure that all quarters are up to scale and that all issues are serviceable.

Supply and Transport and Customs Handbooks

17. It is hoped that the above named publications will, be available for distribution on the basis of one per family for married soldiers, and down to section level for single soldiers.

Conclusion

18. Most of the information contained in this instruction may be assumed to be definite. It is realised that many points, such as leave and actual movement timings have not yet been clarified, however, this information will be released in due course.

MOVE OF FMC TERENDAK

19. The FMC TERENDAK will be closed from midday 17 Jul 65 till 25 Jul 65 inclusive. It will re-open at No 17, Lincoln Circle (just across the road!) on 26 July 1965 at the usual hour.

20. From 19 to 24 Jul 65, the clinics will be held in the Medical Centre 3 RAR. It will be difficult to operate a two doctor clinic here, so, if any dependant thinks she can wait till the following week before seeing the doctor, it would be to the advantage of all concerned for her to do so.

SCHOOL TEACHERS

21. The Chairman of TERENDAK Garrison Welfare and Amenities stated that there was a permanent requirement for a pool of reserve school teachers. These posts are salaried.

175. SMUGGLING

1. There have been FOUR convictions recently involving one BRITISH soldier and three Imperial Malay soldiers. In three of these cases Army Department vehicles were used by the smugglers and were subsequently confiscated.
2. Malaysian authorities have stated that, although reluctant to do so, they will re-institute normal customs control and inspection of ALL Army Department vehicles if any further cases of smuggling occur. Should this threat be implemented all units in SINGAPORE and MALAYA will be subject to much unnecessary work and great inconvenience.
3. HQ Malaya Area have directed that extremely heavy punishment be imposed on British or Malaysian soldiers convicted of smuggling. This principle will also be followed if Australians are convicted of this extremely serious offence irrespective of whether military transport is being used or not.


