COMMANDERS DIARIES INSTRUCTIONS

AIM

1. The aim of a Commanders Diary is to provide data on which to base future improvements in Army training, equipment, organisation and administration, and to furnish historians with a record of the activities of units and formations in operational and non-operational periods in peace and in war.

GENERAL

- 2. Entries will be made daily on AF C2118, each entry being initialled by the officer detailed to keep it.
- 3. Commanders Diaries will conform with the rules for drafting orders given in "Staff Duties in the Field", Chapter 2, Section 7.

RESPONSIBILITY

During Non-operational Periods

4. A Commanders Diary will be made by commanders of all formations.

During Operational Periods (see note 1)

- 5. A Commanders Diary will be made in duplicate by:-
 - (a) Commanders of all formations.
 - (b) Each branch of the staff at formation headquarters commanded by a Brigadier or above.
 - (c) Heads of services not below the rank of Lieutenant Colonel.
 - (d) Personal staffs and officers holding special appointments.
 - (e) Unit commanders.
 - (f) Commanders of a detachment of a unit when so ordered.

COMPILATION

- 6. Both original and duplicate copies will consist of:—
 - (a) Cover (AF C2119).
 - (b) Index as printed on cover.
 - (c) Narrative (AF C2118).
 - (d) Annexes as shown in the Index.
- 7. All details of the unit or formation (if a detachment is concerned, the name of the parent unit), period covered and enclosure numbers of the annexes will be shown on the cover. If there has been a change of command since the last report, the date of assumption by the new commanding officer will be included.
- 8. The annexes will be assembled in the groups shown on the cover. If there are no enclosures for an Annex NIL will be entered on the cover. If additional annexes are convenient for a particular headquarters, the relevant papers should be grouped as annexes starting at B.
 - 9. Documents concerned with future planning for operations will form Annex "Z", "TOP SECRET ing the document. It will be prepared and disposed of as

11. In order to ensure accuracy and completeness and to save work as much information as possible will be included in annexes consisting of copies of documents issued and received, routine returns etc. All annexes will be referred to in the column provided and the time of receipt or despatch will be given.

12. The narrative will supplement and connect the annexes but need not give precis of them.

During Non-Operational Periods

13. Formation Headquarters will forward the original Commanders Diary annually as at 31st December to reach the War Office Records Contre (through Headquarters Field Records where applicable) as soon as possible after 1st January of the following year. The duplicate will be retained in formation headquarters.

14. Units will NOT render a Commanders Diary.

During Operational Periods.

135. ORIGINAL COMMANDERS DIARIES

(a) Formations and units in the UK will forward diaries monthly by the seventh day of the succeeding month direct to the War Office (WORC for reports other than medical, AMD 1 for medical reports).

(b) Formations and units overseas will forward diaries monthly by the seventh day of the succeeding month to the OIC Field Records for onward transmission to the War

Office.

16. DUPLICATE COMMANDERS DIARIES. These will be clearly marked as duplicates and will NOT be sent with the originals. They will be forwarded within two months as follows:-

(a) Units in the UK

To the OIC parent record office (b) Formation Headquarters in the UK

To OIC Central Clearing Wing, Infantzy Records, Exeter.

(c) Units Overseas

To the OIC Field Records for onward transmission to parent record office.

(d) Formation Headquarters Overseas

To the OIC Field Records for onward transmission to the OIC Central Clearing Wing, Infantry Records, Exeter.

SECURITY

17. Documents concerned with future operational planning will be listed on AF C2118 and placed in a separate AF C2119. All details will be filled in and the cover will be clearly marked in red: - ANNEX Z - OFFICERS ONLY. It may be convenient to group the papers by annexes.

18. Supplementary diaries will be forwarded in accordance with the normal rules for TOP SECRET correspondence to the War Office (WORG). The inner envelope will be clearly marked:-


19. The duplicate supplementary diaries will be despatched as in paragraph 16 as soon as receipt of the originals has been acknowledged.

Notes 1. Definition of Operational Period - The term "operational period" for the purpose of this instruction, means:-

(a) the period between a declaration of war and the official end of hostilities (b) any period spent in a theatre of operations

(c) any period when engaged in any form of military operation.

2. The War Office or headquarters concerned will be responsible for instructing units to submit Commanders Diaries where the conditions of the unit's employment make this necessary. Wherever possible the beginning and end of the period will be clearly stated. Notwithstanding the above, on the outbreak of global war all units and formations which are not at the time submitting these reports will start compiling them with effect from M day and will thereafter render them in accordance with paragraphs 15 and 16.



- 9. HMS ALBION is due at TERENDAK on 31 Jul 65. At this stage it is expected to anchor at about 0600 hrs approx 2 miles off-shore.
- 10. It is planned that disembarkation will commence at 0800 hrs using Landing Crafts to bring the soldiers ashore at the Hard Standing near The Yacht Club. Groups of 120 soldiers will land with about 45 minute period between groups. Soldiers will return to unit lines on unit transport.
- Il. Families are welcome to watch the landing but are requested to park their cars near the Junior Ranks Beach Club and remain behind the safety fence. On landing it is hoped to allow soldiers about 10 minutes to see their families (behind the safety fence) before moving them back to unit lines.
- In the event of rough seas disembarkation will be by helicopter onto the unit ovals. It is regretted that families will be unable to enter unit lines if this method has to be used.



OP BURGAN

POWERS OF SEARCH AND ARREST

Arrest

You may arrest any person:-

- a. Carrying a firearm without lawful authority
- b. Accompanying anyone carrying a firearm without authority.
- c. Possessing any supplies which you suspect are intended for the use of a terrorist.
- d. Assisting terrorists to avoid arrest.
- e. Breaking a curfew imposed in your area.

You may use reasonable force to overcome resistance offered by a person you are trying to arrest. You must NOT open fire except as a last resort.

Warn any person you arrest that he will be shot at if he tries to escape.

You must hand over any person arrested to the civil police as soon as possible.

Search

You may search any vehicle, bout or person you suspect to be carrying:-

- a. Arms, ammunition or explosives.
- b. Supplies for the use of terrorists.

The Public

You are NOT authorised to interfere with members of the public generally, unless you suspect an offence is being committed. You are NOT to prevent members of the public moving about unless a curfew has been imposed.

RESTRICTED-TERHAD

Annex 'F' to 3 RAR 49 dated Aug 65

OFDERS FOR OPENING FIRE

- 1. Troops are NOT to open fire on sight. They will be instructed that they open fire on the following occasions only:
 - a. When they are are attacked or in imminent danger of their lives.
 - b. When they are unable to apprehend an infiltrator who is recognised as such i.e. wearing uniform and carrying a weapon in a security area.
 - c. To overcome forcible reistance offered by any person to arrest.
 - d. To prevent the escape from arrest or the rescue of any person arrested.
- 2. Although the area has been proclaimed a security area it is still possible that civilians are still unaware of the proclamation. Instructions are to be issued to the troops that they should challenge if in doubt.
- 3. Every precaution should be taken to ensure that innocent civilians are not harmed.
- 4. In the case of watercraft approaching constwatching posts:
 - a. Watercraft will be challenged and ordered to halt in appropriate languages.
 - b. When a boat fails to stop, warning shows will be fired into the water not closer than 100 yards from the boat.
 - c. When a boat fails to stop after warning shots have been fired they will be engaged using minimum force.





365. FEDERAL ESTATE DUTY CONCESSION

- There is a special provision in the Estate Duty Law which provides a special deduction of £5,000 from the estate where the estate passes to a widow, children, grandchildren, parents, brothers, sisters, nephews or nieces, where a soldier or member of the Forces dies as a result of disease or injury contracted or received if the death takes place during his term of service or within three years afterwards.
- 2. This deduction applies, broadly, to any operations overseas that are covered by the Repatriation provisions it would therefore apply to servicemen in MALAYSIA and VIETNAM.
- The deduction is additional to the ordinary deduction, which applies to any estate, of the first £10,000 of the estate (up to £50,000). Therefore, the total deduction from a "normal sized" estate of servicemen coming within the provisions would be £15,000.

366. OUT OF BOUNDS AREA (VEHICLES)

It has been reported that vehs are driving across the hardstanding and sealed area of the new helicopter hangers, pads etc and that this is causing rapid deterioration. With effect from the date of this order NO veh will drive onto the pads or sealed area but will keep to the roads.

367. JELLY FISH STINGS

Swimming in seawater at MALACCA will almost certainly result in JELLY FISH STINGS particularly at this time of the year. The stings can be fatal and certainly incapacitate the victim for 48 hours. All members indulging in activities, such as water skiing or sailing where immersion in seawater is possible are to wear a protective jacket and long trousers.

General

- This instruction details the action required to effect the move of baggage and stores to SINGAPORE for onward movement to AUSTRALIA. following categories of stores are involved:
 - a. Members' unaccompanied sea baggage.
 - b. Unit stores, as follows:
 - (1) 3 RAR Band Stores (Ord Issue).
 - (2) 3 RAR Colours.
 - c. Regt Property.
 - Offrs Mess Property.
 - Sgts Mess Property.
 - f. Unit Filos.

Method of Movement

- 2. a. Terendak to Singapore: Road.
 - a. Singapore to Australia: Air and Sea.

Limitations Imposed

- Air Freight. Boxes are NOT to exceed 150 lbs weight, and must 3. be within the following dimensions:
 - a. 36" x 66" x 50", or
 - b. 72" x 32" x 50", or
 - c. 48" x 4" x 144".
- 4. Sea Freight. NOT applicable.

Stores to be moved by Air

- 5. The following stores are to be moved by air:
 - a. Regt Property (except items exceeding limitation).

Band

- b. Band Stores (except items exceeding limitation).
- c. Offrs Mess Property (except items exceeding limitations).
- d. Sgts Mess Property (except items exceeding limitations).
- e. 3 RAR Colours.
- f. Unit Files

Stores to be moved by Sea

- 6. The following stores are to be moved by sea:
 - a. All unaccompanied sea baggage.
 - b. Sgts Moss Property.
 - c. Regt Property, which cannot be moved by air (eg., piano, boat, motor, and refrigerator).
 - d. Offrs Mess Property which cannot be moved by air.

Packing and marking of Freight

- 7. Unaccompanied Sea Baggage. Instructions for the packing and marking of baggage are contained in forms AAF F4 which have been issued to companies.
- 8. Regt Property, Offrs and Sgts Mess Property. Seperate instructions have been issued covering these stores.
- 9. Band Stores. Boxes are to be marked as follows:
 - a. 3 RAR Band
 WOODSIDE Camp
 C/- MFO ADELAIDE.
 - b. Each box is to be allotted a consignment number, and
 - c. Separate consignment numbers are to be used for sea and air freight.
- 10. 3 RAR Colours. An officer nominated by the Adjt is to escort the Colours to WOODSIDE. Prior to departure he will take charge of the Colours and obtain necessary documents from the QM.

Documentation

- 11. Stores moving by Sea.
 - a. Forms AAF F4. These are to be completed as follows:
 - (1) Unaccompanied Sea Baggage. By the owner of the baggage. Coys are to ensure that forms are correctly completed.
 - (2) Unit stores and Mess Property. By the officers/NCOs in charge of stores and property.
 - b. Summary of AAF F4. Coys are to prepare a summary of F4 for each draft. A copy of the proforma to be used is attached as Annex B. Proformas are available from the QM. Two copies are required to be delivered together with supporting AAF F4s where baggage is delivered to the QM.

/ Stores

Stores to be moved by Air

- 12. Manifests. Four copies of Air Freight Manifests are required by the QM. Manifests are to be prepared on the proforma shown at Annex C.
- 13. Customs Declarations. Two copies to be attached to Manifests.

Delivery of Stores to QM

- 14. The timings for delivery of stores/bagage and documents to the QM are detailed at Annex A. The following points apply:
 - a. Sub units are responsible for the delivery of documents and baggage to the QM.
 - b. Only the baggage and covering documents for the serial involved are required on the date shown.
